

## Brittanys...

This column originally appeared in the January 2001 issue of the AKC Gazette and is reprinted with permission. This Breed Column is written by Dorothy Macdonald.

#### **Brittany Temperament**

Independent, maybe even pigheaded. Intelligent and manipulative. Such a challenge! To train a Brittany requires tremendous patience and a good sense of humor — and even some cunning.

First, convince the Brittany that what it wants to do is what you had in mind. Then convince the dog that it was its idea in the first place. If what you had in mind was to go hunting and find birds, you should have no trouble. But what happens when the Brittany clearly knows what is wanted, and equally clearly ignores it?

Well, it is a fine line. A Brittany will take correction and shrug it off, but if a trainer pushes too hard, the Brittany will quit and go find something else to do. For example, while the breed is bird crazy, it doesn't always like to waste time backing its bracemate. I had a dog that would actually close his eyes as he turned away from seeing his bracemate on point. as if his attitude was, "What I don't see I do not have to honor." He was, in fact, thrown out of several trials.

Brittanys are not always easy to show, as they get bored rather easily. Getting them to keep their ears up where they belong and show animation is often a challenge. The Brittany is usually unpredictable. Perfect today – who knows about tomorrow?

A great example of this unpredictability occurred at the recent AKC Advanced Sporting Institute. This was a weeklong training session for judges coming into or studying additional breeds in the Sporting Group. Besides the hands-on lecturing on each of the breeds in the Sporting Group, one day was spent watching field-and show-titled dogs from every breed perform in the field – pointing, flushing and retrieving.

The field experience is of tremendous value in not only learning the physical attributes needed for function, but also in understanding the quite different temperaments of the varying breeds. In many cases, the performances belie the accepted thinking regarding a breed. The Curly-Coated Retriever's performance epitomized the stubbornness of the breed; this is surely the most adamant of all the sporting breeds. The Cocker Spaniel handling a winged cock pheasant with aplomb was the delightful picture of a champion. One could observe the surprise of the gunners in the blind, asking "What breed is that?" as a standard Poodle, in modified show trim, marked well and made a speedy water retrieve to hand. And note the contrast of the close-working Spinone Italiano and the high-style, dashing Pointer. All of these showed their breed characteristics, as did the through-cover Clumber Spaniel and the over-cover English Springer Spaniel – and yet again the outstanding job by a Chesapeake Bay Retriever on a triple, and the fast work of the dual-purpose American Water Spaniel.

This demonstration by all of the breeds offered the judges a great chance to learn to read the eyes, ears and body language of each breed — nothing generic here.

## - Reflections -

We as Brittany People are in the business of promoting good public relations in order to bring new people into the sports we participate in whether it be field trials, shows, agility, rally, obedience, hunt tests, companion dogs, etc. While the reprinted article below talks solely of disciplining dogs in field trials, it could apply to any of our activities. There are many, many ways to promote good public relations. One of the first things that comes to mind that is different today from the 1950's is the internet chat lists. While "old-timers" argue and discuss the various issues, do we stop and think that new comers might not understand how people who propose to be united can say such hateful things to one another whether it be about dogs, breeding, rules, etc. We need to weigh our words carefully and think how someone who doesn't know us personally might react to our statements. Some of us often say, "Consider the Source" and move on, but a new comer will probably not be able to think in those terms.

I watched Jim Chase take a new club member this week and show him the ropes of a field trial. As it turned out, the man's dog placed 4th in the Derby. He had never been to a trial before, never handled or trained his dog off horseback, and yet with careful directions, Ralph was successful. I don't know who had the biggest smile, Jim or the handler.

We had also gifted this man a membership last year so he could read the magazine and see what we are all about.

Little things at an event foster good relations. Be friendly. Introduce yourself. Offer to help, loan someone a horse or a gun. Our club particularly likes to feed people. Coffee breaks have free soda, water, goodies, and the most requested boiled eggs at the morning break. We've found we can feed 40 people a steak dinner more economically than we can take 10 judges out for an evening meal. This gives people time to get acquainted, talk, and see each other in a social atmosphere that goes a long way to fostering good public relations. Everyone brought so many goodies to a happy hour at the Quail Classic that none of us went out to eat afterwards.

If there is a rule of thumb, I think it would be to treat visitors or even club members at your events as you would like to be treated if you were new to the sport or club.

I know we are busy, but a little "public relations" goes a long way to involve and keep people participating in our events..

#### **PUBLIC RELATIONS**

"Public Relations" is a term that expresses the maintaining of good will or favorable relations between the public and whatever is represented whether it is an industry, a profession, a nation or an individual. Business firms employ corps of public relations experts. In the political picture, be it local or international, a considerable amount of time and money is spent on keeping good public relations.

The manufacturer not only wants to sell his product, he also wants the public to look favorably on his way of doing business all along the line. The truck driver who shows courtesy on the road is creating good public relations for the company his truck represents.

Each one of us in field trials is there because we think it's a wonderful sport, because we love dogs and the outdoors and we like the kind of people we meet and get to know through this most interesting of hobbies. And whenever anyone enjoys a sport or hobby he usually wants to have others come into it, too. We want the public to know about our trials, we want them to come to see our trials, like them and

buy a dog and join the fun.

So, in a way, each of us does a public relations job for the field trials.


The person who attends a trial for the first time is there because he is interested. Otherwise he wouldn't be there. He comes to see what it's like... and if he likes what he sees we have another convert. When we have a gallery at a field trial we are before the public and that is where we create public relations... good or, unfortunately, sometimes bad.

At one of the trials there was the sorry sight of a man giving a sound thrashing to his dog in the bird field. The gallery sat in shocked silence at first, then there were rumblings of disapproval and disgust and several people left the grounds. What were the thoughts of the persons who were attending their first field trial? They can well be imagined.

We all know that a certain amount of disciplining goes with the training of a bird dog but a field trial is not the place to train dogs.

We are suggesting that some kind of ruling should be made so that anyone who puts on a training act at a field trial would be banned from trials for a ,set period of time. The North Jersey Brittany Club, at its May 6th meeting, went on record to that effect.

## In Slemoriam



Thad Cwik, past president of the American Brittany Club and leader in real estate died on May 11, 2007 at age 86.

He became acquainted with the Brittany breed after overhearing a fellow passenger on the commuter train that went from Flemington, NJ to New York City. He was anxious to hear more and sat next to that passenger the next day. He and Ade Nemeth became good friends who shared their love of hunting and raising Brittanys for many years.

Thad was a member of the North Jersey Brittany Club and helped establish other clubs in the Northeast. He ran his dogs in field trials, judged several, and served as chairman of the field trial committee for NJBC. He attended the National Trials in Carbondale, IL for many years. He was president of the American Brittany Club in 1961.

Thad owned Thad S. Cwik Realty in Flemington, NJ. His leadership was evident in the profession of real estate as well. He was Hunterdon County Board of Realtors president in 1960-61, NJ State President in 1970, National President of the Realtor Land Institute in 1974 and in 1984 received the prestigious Distinguished Service Award from the National Association of Realtors. He was a national director until the time of his death.

He and his wife, Willa, moved to Townville, SC in 1990 after selling his business in NJ. They continued to raise Brittanys.

#### Purina Parent Club Partnership Program Earnings Update

The American Brittany Club, Inc. through its participation in the Purina Parent Club Partnership (PPCP) Program has a great opportunity to enhance the health and well-being of the Brittany. Like the 162 other clubs participating in the program, the American Brittany Club, Inc. earns funding for important canine health studies, education efforts and rescue programs when Purina Pro Club, members declare the American Brittany Club, Inc. to receive matching funds and submit their weight circles.

As of 9/30/07 the American Brittany Club, Inc. has 882 members declared for the Purina Parent Club Partnership Program. From January 1, 2007 through September 30, 2007, 281 members have submitted weight circles resulting in a total of \$5,299.73 accumulated thus far for the 2007 Program.

The best way to increase the earnings is by spreading the word.

To Club members who are already Pro Club, members: Encourage them to declare for the Purina Parent Club Partnership Program by calling 1-877-776-2582 and encourage them to submit weight circles to the Purina Pro Club.

To Club Members who feed Purina but are NOT members of Pro Club: Make them aware of the Purina Parent Club Partnership program and encourage them to join Pro Club, declare for their breed and submit weight circles to the Purina Pro Club.

Each new person who declares participation in the PPCP Program and submits weight circles or who joins Pro Club, and declares and submits weight circles will only help to increase the earnings for 2007. ## ABC 2007 Chairmen Reports & Agenda Items



2007 Report of the ABC President - Ron Zook September 3, 2007

2007 is the American Brittany Clubs twenty-first year at the Blue Mountain Wild Life Management Area. Continued development and improvement of this area makes us very appreciative of the efforts of those who envisioned and worked through the initial development of this excellent facility.

Earlier in the year Larry McAnaly, Arkansas Game and Fish Area Manager sent an email that detailed the improvements to the facility completed this year. The horse corrals to the right of the entrance have been replaced with 12 new corrals [20x20 feet each], with a drive way in the back so the horses can be cared for. The old office has been removed and the new office is in operation. Twelve culverts are in the process of being changed out and gravel is being added. Upgrading of the dog boxes and kennels is being planned

The successful increased bird release program will be repeated again for the third year.

The future of sporting dog activities is clouded by repeated attempts at constraining legislation that will place unworkable burdens on our activities. Our problems are compounded by the efforts of some State Wildlife Agencies and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to eliminate horseback field trials

Show sites have experienced negative local regulatory laws. We do not have enough suitable grounds to meet the needs of our regional and championship trials in some areas. I continue to be puzzled by the selective attitude of some state DNRs, their revenues are based on hunting license fees which are declining each year, yet they persist in defining field trials as not being a compatible part of hunting.

#### 2007Annual Report of 1st Vice President - Tom White Summary

This is my first year and report for the position of 1st Vice President, with the primary duty being officer in charge of The American Brittany Club National All Age Championships (Amateur and Open). [Change to Policy Book to reflect the actual duties]. I take over a Championship Series that is well organized and procedurally well established to select our National All Age champions, this to the credit of Tom Milam who chaired the event for the last 7 years. It has gotten better every year due to the leadership of Tom and Ron Zook.

The primary thing I am looking for in the conduct of the Championship is the best all age bird dogs to represent the Brittany breed. This takes a proper venue, the best judges we can find, adequate birds on the grounds at the time of the event, and a level playing field for all participants

Most of us participate in the sport of field trialing for the love of seeing the Brittany perform as a bird dog and it's crucial that we have a good time doing it. This is why it is also important that the Nationals be an event that is pleasurable in all aspects. Therefore, vendors and facilities to support several hundred people are a must.

It is my understanding the Nationals used to rotate venues in order to present the different environments our dogs perform in during the year. Nationally we have woods, tree lined fields plains, mountains, deserts, and every combination to test our dogs. ABC has chosen Booneville, Arkansas to compete our dogs based on several practical criteria. The grounds are not "home grounds" to any particular club, they are an equitable distance from most parts of the country, the facilities on the grounds are excellent, the staff responds to most of our needs, and the support of the town of Booneville is outstanding. There have been complaints in the past regarding the condition of the grounds but in my experience the last several years have exhibited tremendous improvements in the course paths/roads, clearing of brush and general grooming for bird hunting.

Last year (2006 Nationals) the expense to run each dog was \$239.93 (113 dogs) while the entry fee was \$175.00. The Auction "saved the bacon" producing just under \$7,000 and this yielded an event profit of \$4,786. Expenses from 2005 to 2006 increased 6.65%, I suspect primarily due to fuel costs. I anticipate the 2007 expense increase will be in the same range, corresponding to this year's fuel costs over last year

The annual increase in expenses can be covered by an increase in entry fees or alternatively an increase in other revenue from sponsors or fund raising activities. I suggest we explore other sponsors that don't conflict with the present sponsors. Also, I propose we investigate the viability of a raffle fundraiser that extends beyond the Brittany community with a major "non dog oriented" item(s) such as an ATV or Horse Trailer. An internet

based sales approach would allow us to reach groups that would not normally be part of the field trial community such as hunting, horse oriented, friends, or business associates.

**Operations Issues** 

The Booneville field trial grounds have been improving annually. The following excerpt from a letter from Larry McAnally (Area Manager of Blue Mountain WMA for the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission) outlines the most current improvements

This is a short list of improvements for the grounds this year.

- 1) The horse corrals to the right of entrance have been replaced with 12 new corrals. They look very nice, (12 corrals measuring 20X20 feet each.) with a drive way in the back of the corrals where horses can be cared for. This is a great improvement.
- 2) The old office trailer has been removed and we are in the new office after some 20 years! (Of course I can't find anything now, after the move.)
- 3) We are in the planning stage of changing out the old metal doghouses and replacing them with plastic barrels and making other improvements to the kennels.
- 4) We are in the process of changing out 12 culverts, hauling shale to fill in the potholes and placing 800 tons of SB 2 gravel on roadway.
- 5) Most of the 100 plus food plots and 4 miles of strips have been planted. In about a month we will be starting on the vegetation control and preparing the Quail release sites for
- 6) The quail have been ordered for this coming season from Wheeler Quail Farms in Minter, AI. First delivery will be 2000 birds second week in September, 1000 birds November 16, 2007 and 1100 birds last week in February, 2008.

During the summer of 2007, I proposed to the field trial committee that we use special tracking collars supplied by Tracker Radio for use in the Nationals. A motion was made to delay implementation of the plan and initiate further study. The proposed collars are the same collars that Tracker markets commercially in the US. The only difference is their operating frequency. No UŚ receiver would work with them. (The National Championship at Ames Plantation has been using this equipment for several years without any known issues.) The use of this equipment would greatly reduce any possibility for "gamesmanship", misuse, or inadvertent rules violations regarding tracking collars. The AKC is very specific regarding which tracking collars are approved while the AFTCA is less specific, preferring to state a total weight restriction. For those trialers that use tracking receivers other than Tracker Radio, the mandated use of the championship series is an issue that must be balanced with the benefit of a secure system. During the 2007 Nationals I will note the number of non-Tracker receivers to measure the issue.

#### Recommendations

Examine ways to fund the increase in expenses, including additional sponsors and/or a broad base raffle

Continue the discussion of the use of a championship series tracking collar.

2nd Vice President's Report - Marilynne Little September 2007

**EXISTING REGIONAL CLUB'S REPORT:** Wasatch Front Brittany Club - Utah

WFBC has been struggling with one member (who lives in Idaho) for the past few years. During 2007, renewed interest sparked and the Club has gained some active new members. They have a new

WFBC has AKC approval to host a licensed Hunt Test on October 13-14, 2007. They have applied to AKC for approval to host a fall Field Trial on November 10-11, 2007.

At present, the Club has a small membership, however, they are determined to revitalize Wasatch Front BC and hold Hunt Tests &Field Trials. I'm confident they will succeed

Cajun Country Brittany Club - Louisiana

Bryce Novotny contacted Mary Jo & I regarding the status of the CCBC to hold licensed events. Per AKC, CCBC was approved and assigned an AKC club number five years ago. The Club is approved to hold their "Plan A" Field Trials. Two "Plan A" field regional status. "Plan A" field trials are sanctioned by AKC, but not licensed. No AKC points are awarded to placing dogs at "Plan A" events. CCBC is still in process of re-grouping and hopes to host a "Plan A" field trial/hunt test in the future.

NEW CLUBS IN PROCESS REPORT:

Rick Crites, President and I received confirmation on April 17, 2007 that Black Prairie Brittany Club would be granted AKC

provisional club status once BPBC incorporated two minor corrections to their Presentation package. AKC requested they change their name since there is a "Black Prairie" in both Mississippi and Alabama. The second correction is minor wording in the Club's By-Laws. Both changes should be an easy fix. As of this writing, I have had no response to my August letter, September email & September phone call requesting information regarding their status.

Montana Brittany Club - Montana

Todd Breitenfelt contacted me regarding the ABC & AKC rules and process for forming a Brittany Club in Montana. I sent the New Club packet and requirements to Todd in time for their first meeting this past April. I have not received a response from Todd. However, I did receive a response from David DeCan in Western MT. The club has been meeting. They have drafted their By-Laws and are planning a fun day and a future hunt test. It seems as if there is a pretty good group of Brittany people coming together and overcoming the vast distance between them. I hope to be able to present their Presentation Notebook next year to the

#### Third Vice-President's Report - Nancy Anderson for Sept. 2006 to Sept. 2007

This year things have gone a little more smoothly as I have learned more about my responsibilities.

The trophy chairpersons, Tom and Sandy Schrank, have done a wonderful job with the selection of trophies. Last year, they selected a hand-tossed pottery. This year, we will be using the same trophies, only in a different color. They have been able to acquire a number of other special trophies at reasonable prices as well. So far, most of the trophies have been sponsored for this year's show. We will have the "book" available at the trophy desk again this year for those who want to reserve trophies for the 2008 show; we will also take money for 2008 trophy sponsorships at that time. We have also encouraged clubs to sponsor field trophies along with show trophies. At the last accounting only about 4 clubs have chosen to sponsor trophies for the show; I don't know how many have sponsored field trophies. We will continue to encourage clubs to sponsor both field and show trophies. This reduces the costs of the events to the national club.

I was able to get the contracts for the hotel and the show superintendent in a reasonable manner this year. Purina has finally given us a name and person with whom we have direct contact for contracts and trophies. The problem with the dog food coupons for the 2006 show has been resolved and anticipate having them on hand for the 2007 show. The cost of the ballroom went up only slightly after negotiations; the cost of the sleeping rooms went up \$5 and the pet fee went up to \$50 because the entire hotel has been remodeled. The staff seems willing to work with us to keep the show at the same location. The contracts for the hotel and superintendent for 2008 have been signed and returned so I can begin working on the paperwork for the 2008 show. I will be contacting Purina this week in order to get their contract signed prior to the 2007 show so that part can also be "checked off" as completed.

The judges selection committee has almost finished their responsibility for the 2008 and 2009 shows. I need responses from 2 people in order to complete the list. My computer modem "died" and I had to get a new computer and then get programs loaded on it so I can finish this job. I have contacted the judge for the 2008 obedience and rally; she is checking her schedule and will get back to me. I hope to have the judges finalized and approved by AKC by the show, if possible.

I will be going to Ft. Smith for a show in early October. I am always looking for alternative sites for the show and will be checking out two places that were mentioned to me. It also makes negotiations a little better if I have alternate places

Tom and I plan to go to Ft. Smith prior to the show to take trophies and purchase some of the supplies we need so they will be on hand when we all arrive on Thanksgiving Day so the grounds committee can "hang" plastic that evening.

The problem with the disallowment of a placement by AKC has been resolved as far as I know. It is a private matter that the owners of the dog can explain if and when they see fit.

We will no longer have a Pictures and Pedigrees Party. It was too expensive for people and the food was not good for the price. Many people complained and so I have dropped it completely.

Instead, Diana and her committee will be having a breeders' seminar after she completes the judges' seminar. This will also help us take care of one of the things we must do by 2009 in order to continue holding our specialty show. We are already doing most of the things we have to accomplish in order to hold our show. Adding the Canine Good Citizen test along with the Therapy Dog International test two years ago was a good idea since it helps us meet the requirements.

The juniors' parents have planned workshops for the juniors along with a junior/adult showmanship challenge and a party afterwards on Friday night. We were pleased to have 15 juniors

entered last year and hope there will be more this year. The junior traveling trophy will be presented in the ring during the noon hour on Sunday in order to recognize our best junior handler.

I know that there is a petition out there to move rally and obedience to only the summer specialty. I don't think that is fair to those who participate in those events. We should be trying to include more people at the National Specialty, not eliminating them. A number of people who participate in these events also participate in the specialty show itself and appreciate opportunities to do more things at the National Specialty. I would still like to add agility, but we haven't found an affordable location or someone who will "run" the event. It is more complicated than a conformation show or rally or obedience. I have talked to a number of national clubs and they run events such as this as all-breed events which make them more affordable and some even make a nice profit. However, we are a "ways off" from doing something like that

I have worked on the third vice-president portion of the policy book and made some improvements and additions if the Board passes them. There is still work that can be done to improve that portion of the policy book which will make the job easier for anyone taking this position. I have looked at policy books for other national specialties, and, believe it or not, ours is one of the least complicated.

The placement markers have been located and I hope they will be available at the specialty. I haven't seen them so I don't know what kind of shape they are in.

I am very pleased at the willingness of people to work. Our biggest need - as with all events run by volunteers - is more volunteers willing to help at the event itself. Without those willing to give of themselves and their time, we would not be able to hold this event and I am very thankful for their help.

Things are just about finished for 2007 and are well underway for 2008. I don't anticipate any major changes for the 2008 show at this time.

#### Action Items for "Duties of the 3rd Vice President"

Change 2.A. to read:

The 3rd Vice President shall serve as the Show Chairman for the National Specialty Show.

Rational: This is the primary responsibility of the 3rd Vice President

E. Eliminate Part 1 and 2 and renumber parts 3, 4, 5, 6. Rationale: Redundant. These items are part of the application required by AKC for holding the specialty.

G. Change part 1 to read as follows:

- 1. Send the properly completed application and application for approval of judges, special events, disaster plans and other forms required for the national specialty show to the executive secretary for the signature of the executive secretary who will then forward the properly completed and signed application(s) to the proper department(s) of AKC. These forms must be received by AKC no later than six months prior to the National Specialty Show.
- 2. Eliminate this section except:

Neither the show nor judges can be advertised until AKC has approved the show and the judges.

Rational: Parts 1 and 2 are addressed in the application which will be sent to the executive secretary for her signature. According the AKC, the third vice president is not recognized as being able to sign any applications for the show. AKC only recognized the president, 1st and 2nd vice presidents, executive secretary and treasure as being able to sign any applications.

Change 1 to read as follows

The 3rd Vice President shall then send a contract of acceptance of the judging assignment to the selected judges for their signatures prior to sending the applications to the executive secretary and shall retain the signed copies in the show files.

Rational: This is required by AKC; the show chairman must have signed contracts "in hand" prior to applying for approval of judges by AKC.

Rearrange and renumber for clarity the following:

Move all parts of #3 to #26.

Rational: This deals specifically with the Summer Specialty and where it is located is in the middle of the National Specialty information.

Eliminate 0, page and replace it with #12 on page 37.

Rational: Redundant

Add S, page 35:

The 3rd Vice President (Show Chairman) shall appoint the following chairpersons for the National Specialty: Obedience/ Rally, Auction/Raffle, Chief Ring Steward, Specialty Trophies, Booths, Hospitality, Equipment and Set-up, Ribbons, Juniors, and Agility (when offered by ABC at the National Specialty).

Reword #17 and 18 for clarity as follow:

17. At the National Specialty Show and the Summer Specialty Show the following classes are required: Field Trial Classes (dogs and bitches), Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class, Veterans Classes (dogs and bitches).

In addition to the above:

At the National Specialty Show ONLY the following classes are required:

Dual Champion Classes and National Qualifier Classes.

Qualifications for Field Trial Classes shall be one field trial

placement during the immediate past year or be a field champion or an amateur field champion of record with AKC.

Qualifications for Dual Champion Classes shall be Dual Champion of record with AKC.

Qualifications for National Qualifiers Classes shall be limited to dogs and bitches who have qualified to run in the American Brittany Club National Gun Dog Championship Field Trial, American Brittany Club National Amateur Gun Dog Championship Field Trial, American Brittany Club National Amateur All-Age Championship Field Trial and the American Brittany Club Open All-Age Championship Field Trial for the current and preceding years only. Dogs and bitches who qualify after the show's closing date will be eligible to show the next year only and those that qualify prior to the closing date shall be eligible for that current year and the following year. Dogs and bitches have only to be qualified to run in the National Field Trial events, not actually compete.

Dogs and bitches placing first in the Field Trial Classes, Dual Champion Classes and National Qualifiers Classes shall be eligible to compete in the Best of Breed competition.

(NOTE: The addition of the Dual Champion Classes and National Qualifiers Classes will be pending if approved by the Board of Directors until approved also by AKC.)

Rational: Since we are promoting the dual dog concept, I feel that we need special classes at the National Specialty in order to showcase these dogs. We presently have dual sweepstakes, but they are not a part of the regular show. These last four classes will only be offered at the National Specialty Show.

Dual Champions are just that - Dual Champions National Qualifiers are just that - National Qualifiers

#18 Change it to read:

Regional club shows shall conform to the National Specialty requirements with regard to offering field trial classes. They are not required to offer stud dog and brood bitch classes. Regional clubs are not permitted to offer Dual Champion or National Qualifier classes.

Rational: Clarification of responsibility of regional clubs with regard to additional classes

#### 2007 4th Vice President's Report - Delmar McCallister

The 2006 combined Open/Amateur Gun Dog Nationals drew 61 Open entries and 42 Amateur entries. (See Janet Chase's Financial Report for details.)

In 2007 the Open Gun Dog Nationals are set to begin on October 23, 2007 with the Amateur immediately following the conclusion of the Open.

I think combining these two stakes into one event in the fall is the correct course of action at this point in time, with traveling expenses being what they are today. The weather was much more agreeable than spring.

#### 2007 Executive Secretary/Secretary Agenda Report – Mary Jo Trimble

Much of this year was spent monitoring legislation throughout the United States which would have imposed mandatory spay and neuter. Residents of California succeeded in delaying consideration by the CA legislature of such legislation that would have been imposed on dogs over 4 months of age. (See Legislative Report)

We are still getting used to the new ABC Classic/Championships and following the guidelines established at last years meeting. I urge all clubs to refer to this guide before, during, and after conducting such an event. The guidelines can be found on the ABC website. If I could ask, beg, request, implore clubs, I would request that the ABC/AKC Reporting Form be used in order to correctly identify which events are ABC Classic/Championships. The same applies to clubs running trials sanctioned by the American Field as well as ABC. Please use white paper and make sure the print is legible and dark enough to withstand scanning. Dates Coordinators need to make sure these ABC Classics are included on their Regional Dates Schedules.

We continue to always have date conflicts. Many years ago, the BOD said that Regional Dates Coordinators had the power to determine if conflicts could be allowed. This has never been formally written into the policy book. Dates Coordinators have followed an unofficial policy of requesting permission of clubs to allow another club to conflict. This may be the polite way to do things, but the overall best interests of the breed are not always served. I ask that the BOD put into the Policy Book the statement that Dates Coordinators may approve trial conflict dates. Appeal procedures are already in place. Some clubs will never agree to another conflict no matter how far away the conflicting trial may be. Grounds and dates are scarce and we must work to overcome these hardships.

We have seen some real advances in scheduling upcoming ABC events such as the Futurities and Summer Specialties. I applaud those new committees for their cooperative and energetic spirit. This is a giant step toward improving those events. Steve Ralph has certainly done a great job of adding the history section to our website which is the most up to date source of information for the ABC as it can be updated immediately.

I urge clubs to determine who has authority to schedule trials. We had a couple of incidents this year where a FT Chairman or Secretary has made a determination and then that has been overruled by someone else in the club. Rather than make a written rule as to who we will look to for official applications, I have advised Regional Dates Coordinators when this happens to seek input from the Club President rather than make a determination themselves as to who has the authority to act for an individual club. These disputes should be settled internally by the regional club and not the national club.

It has been my pleasure the last 8 years to work hand-in-hand with President Ron Zook. He leaves big shoes to fill. I have never worked with anyone who was as open to listen to all sides, think deeply about controversial issues, and present a calm and effective voice for the ABC. Thank you Ron for being such a great

I have ordered ABC Logo Patches and Decals to help promote the ABC to the public. Patches will sell for \$3. Price of Decals is

I would like to advise all clubs to make themselves aware that AKC will be adding fees for multiple entries in AKC events. Previously, only the first entry of a dog was "taxed". Starting in January 2008, multiple entries will be an extra \$1.50. This will need to be added to the Policy Book. No BOD action required to do so.

William "Bill" Speck has retired as AKC Vice President in charge of Performance Events. Mr. Doug Ljungren has been named as his replacement. I have enjoyed the cooperation and speed with which Bill Speck worked with me when I had questions and/or problems to solve. I look forward to working with Mr. Ljungren. We are fortunate that AKC appointed someone from the pointing dog world who has an understanding of the issues and problems we face. My best wishes to both of these fine gentlemen.

#### **Action Items**

- Add line to policy book, page 23, stating: Regional Dates Coordinators have the authority to determine field trial conflicts within their region without a conflicting club's permission. This should become item #5 with the rest of page to be renumbered.
- 2. I would ask the BOD to review item #4, page 78 regarding Agenda Reports. In this day and age of the Internet, you may want to reconsider the wording on this section either increasing the number of signatures required or requiring actual signatures on the document being submitted to the BOD for consideration.
- 3. In my last phone conversation with Bill Speck, he asked why we did not also make the Derby Stakes run in conjunction with the ABC American Field Classic/Championships also a recognized AKC stake. At the present time, these stakes are considered non-regular stakes under AKC because we have not asked that they be recognized. If we were to do so, they would serve as qualifying stakes for the AKC Limited Stakes. I point this out for the Board's consideration.
- 4. If any emergency items pop up between now and the meeting, I will notify you by email, post on the website, and formally present at the meeting for consideration.

#### Treasurer's Report - Janet Chase August 21, 2007

#### TO ALL DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS 5-YEAR COMPARATIVE INCOME SUMMARY

A 5-year comparison of income and expense is included for your information. Although dues have been increased to \$30, the number of members has continued to decline slightly, thereby offsetting the impact of the dues increase. This has also resulted in fewer magazines being printed and mailed, thus reducing those costs. Corporate sponsor income in 2005 and 2006 includes \$2000 from Tri-Tronics that we did not have in prior years.

#### 2006 OPERATING RESULTS

Updated information through 10/31/07 will be submitted for the Board meeting in November.

Net income for the first six months of 2007 has increased over the same period in 2006. Individual variances are as follows:

- · Interest income has increased as interest rates and available cash for investment have increased.
- · Magazine advertising income includes some late collections of 2006 ads as well as payment for colored inserts
- · Magazine printing costs have increased slightly, reflecting more pages printed as well as the cost of the colored inserts.
- · The decrease in magazine postage reflects a credit balance resulting from fewer copies being mailed. Once the credit balance is used up later this year, monthly postage costs for mailing the magazine will be approximately \$800.
- Miscellaneous expense includes \$858 for printing of brochures for the dog registration program. Also included are credit card fees totaling \$645 for credit card receipts of dues and magazine advertising income.

All three regional futurities resulted in a profit and in accordance with the board's decision, half of the profit has been split with the host club.

#### FUTURE GROUNDS FUND AND BREED ISSUES FUND

The future grounds fund includes \$25/dog from the national championships and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the increase in recording fees, The balance at June 30, 2007 is \$66386. The breed issues fund includes ½ of the increase in recording fees. The balance at June 30, 2007 is \$18578. This does not yet reflect any contributions to be made in 2007. We have targeted a balance of \$10000 in this account as a contingency for matters that may arise during the year. Detail of transactions in each of these funds from inception is included with this report.

#### 2008 BUDGET

I will prepare a budget for submission with my updated report for the board meeting.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

- ACTION ITEMS

  1. The board should review the current level of contributions being made from the breed issues fund to determine if any changes are to be made in 2007.

  2. I will ask David Smith, East Coast Director, to review current cash investments with me and determine if any changes are to be made. This may or may not result in any required board action.

2007 Annual ABC Breeder Referral Report – Pennie Peterson
Since the AKC instituted their Breeder Classifieds on their web site in 2005, breeder referral inquiries have dropped to an average of only 4 or 5 inquires a month. Their web site is just one of many that list puppies for sale. Many local Brittany clubs have their own web sites where they list breeder/litter availability for their memberships. Those are in addition to the many Brittany breeders who have their own web sites where they advertise puppies for sale.

ABC National Breeder Referral has become one of Brittany Breed education. Many contact me who have found a breeder/litter locally and want to know if I know of the breeder and/or their reputation. Most all inquiries are for pet homes, a few hunter/pet homes and basically competition inquiries.

#### AKC Delegate's Report 2007 - Karen Stout

Several noteworthy changes took place in 2007. They are listed below in no certain order.

- . The Legislative Committee headed by Walter Bebout, AKC staff, asked for a networking effort from performance clubs, conformation clubs, and parent clubs to oppose anti-dog legislation. The AKC is concerned about irresponsible dog owners, irresponsible breeding, and inadequate animal control, however mandatory spay/neuter is ineffective because the main problem is irresponsible ownership.
- When a dog is disqualified for attacking, a letter from the Performance Department goes out to the owners telling them that this dog has been disqualified. The Performance Department agreed it will also send a copy of the letter to the Parent Club. A request needs to be sent to the Performance Department on Official Club stationery by the club president or secretary. After the request is received, any dog of your breed that is disqualified for having attacked an individual or another dog will be reported to the Parent Club by carbon copy of
- New Eligibility Requirements are being proposed for holding shows in 2009. Examples include, public education programs, training classes, breeder referral, judges' education, disaster planning, Meet the Breeds booths, health clinics, legislative activity, activities to promote function of the breed like hunt tests and field trials, or ringside mentoring. Parent Club and Regional Club Judges' Education Program and National or Regional Specialty satisfy Parent Club and regional Club education requirements.
- The Parent Club conference was held July 20-22, 2007 in Peachtree City, Ga. The American Brittany Club was represented by Linda Langford and Sandra Leavens.
- Based on a recent survey, the AKC has developed a list of likely parameters that a proposed 'Mixed Breed Listing' would include:
  - · dog would be listed, not registered
  - dog identified as "mixed breed"
  - dog only eligible for Agility, Obedience, Rally, and Tracking
  - dog must be spayed or neutered
  - dog must be in separate classes
  - dog not eligible for Championships or Invitationals.
- The AKC Board reviewed a request from the American Brittany Club to modify the current Qualifications to participate in all their National Championships. The new qualifications are – Brittanys which have placed in any AA or GD hour stake held by a Brittany club in which the following dogs started: 1st place with 13 starters, 2nd place with 15 starters, 3rd place with 17 starters or 4th place with 20 starters be approved to participate in all the National Championships
- AKC has provided breeders with new services and programs in 2007. Online Record Keeping was launched in March. This web-based service will help breeders better manage their records of litters and track their dogs' registrations. AKC puppy folders for breeders provide yet another resource for AKC breeders that will improve their ability to give the new puppy buyer all the information they need to take home.
- In 2006, AKC's event expenses exceeded revenues from events by over ten million dollars. In order to decrease AKC's subsidy for events and to create a more simplistic and consistent fee structure for all AKC sports, the event service fees will increase from \$1.50 per first entry to \$3.00 for each applicable sport. Additional entries of the same dog will be increased to \$3.00 recording and/or event service fee as applicable in all AKC licensed and member events held after January 1, 2008. The exception will be Field Trials and Hunting Tests. For Field trials and Hunting Tests, the Event Service fee for additional entries of the same dog is to be \$1.50, effective January 1, 2008 and \$3.00 effective January 1, 2009.

#### 2007 Judges Education Report – Diana Kubitz, Judge's Education Coordinator

We did a number of presentations in 2007:

- · Oklahoma Wayne Fessenden
- · Pennsylvania Sue Lehosky
- Georgia Judy Tighe/Valerie Dombrowski
- Oregon Dianne Kroll/Marilynne Little (upcoming)
- National Specialty Diana Kubitz/Linda Elbert (upcoming)

The Okalahoma, Pennsylvania, Georgia and Oregon presentation were judge's institutes. This continues to be a great way to reach the largest number of potential judges. Thanks to all these great folks for stepping up to do these presentations at their own expense.

In May at the Summer Specialty, Linda and I introduced some new items to our presentation. Linda had been able to do 17.5 and 20.5 cutouts of Brittanys. It was a wonderful visual presentation to see the huge difference those 3 inches makes. It also gave us an opportunity to address the fact that in our breed there is not a difference in height standard between males and females.

The next thing we introduced was the most exciting to me as we fulfilled one of our goals. Julie Romence put together a DVD of the 2006 National Gun Dog Championship. I purchased one and then asked if she could edit it to provide us with a shorter version that could be used for judge's education. Julie came up with a 20 minute version of the DVD that is excellent. We used this for the first time at the Summer Specialty.

In addition Mike that is our videographer for the National Specialty came to the grounds the first

morning of the running the Open Championship and filmed. We edited this and we also have this DVD to show. It's about 15 minutes. The expense for this video was one nights motel stay - a bargain by anybody's standard! Mike has plans to do video this year as well and then we'll do an edit combining both years.

We accomplished another goal in 2007 with the help of Steve Ralph. The judge's education presentation is now on-line on the ABC website. It's exciting because we can direct judges and Brittany folks to this website without sending out CD's, saving time and money

I'm personally very excited that we've been able to accomplish the field video and the on-line presentation, because they were the two things that Jodi Engel wanted for the presentation. I hope that when breeder's seminars are offered this year at the nationals, we'll have some folks show up to see the new additions to the presentation so they can judge for themselves how effective they are. At the Summer Specialty presentation one of the judges said that although Brittanys weren't her breed, she had gotten goose bumps watching the videos. That's the reaction we were hoping for! Through these videos we will be giving the judges a taste of what our breed is expected to do in the field and the types of terrain and cover they are asked to run through.

Through judge's education we hope to be able to help the ABC mission statement of "keeping the breed forever dual." We place a lot of emphasis on the field work of the breed and the videos help us to explain "form and function." We hope to continue and improve on these DVD's in the future.

In 2007 we were asked to provide criteria for "mentors" for the judges at ringside. Karen Stout as our AKC delegate asked Dee Hempfield's help in coming up with the criteria. I approved the criteria and sent it on the AKC with our list of approved mentors. Throughout the year I have been asked by other breed clubs to send our criteria so they could pattern theirs after ours. Big thanks to Karen and Dee for their diligence in this matter.

The judge's education committee worked well this year. Any time I asked for their input, they were prompt to respond and that is a huge help to a coordinator. Linda Elbert and Jessica Carlson continue to be my two biggest helpers with computer expertise and photos. They make my job much easier Thanks gals!

#### **Action Items:**

- Raise budget from current \$500 to \$700.00. With the increase in postage and copying expenses, Janet Chase suggested the increase to keep pace with these expens
- I would like the American Brittany Club to propose to the AKC that judges need continuing education in our breed. To that end we'd like them to have judges take the judge's education seminar at least every 5 years. This is especially important now with the new field DVD's available. We've had an ever increasing number of complaints about judges in the past year and after checking into the matter I find that most of the complaints are legitimate and not sour grapes. Somehow the AKC has given the judges the impression that type should take precedents over movement. If we are to keep our breed dual, this misconception needs to be remedied. We had one Live and White Brittany DQ'd for being black. The dog has since been reinstated, but obviously more education is needed in those judges that are all ready approved to judge our breed.
- I'm asking that money be set aside to purchase a projector for a laptop to be used for presentations. When we do judge's institutes these are available most of the time. When we do seminars for the ABC at the summer specialty and nationals, we have to borrow one, rent one or have everyone bring in their laptops. The Holiday Inn was ready to rent us one for \$500 for one day. The prices of these projectors have come down considerably and I feel we can now purchase one for \$500.00 - \$600.00. We would have the advantage of doing presentations at any time in any location with electricity.

- 7. The applicant, to be effective, should:
- · Be comfortable talking to prospective judges,
- · Be well versed in the history of the Brittany,
- Be knowledgeable about the Brittany Conformation Standard,
- · Understand the Brittany Performance Standard,
- · Have experience with the process of judging in conformation and performance,
- Be willing to have prospective judges come to their home or kennel to observe and discuss Brittanys

2007 ABC/AKC Legislative Liaison Agenda Report – Mary Jo Trimble
2007 has been a rough year as far as fighting bad legislation for dogs and animals. California, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Ohio have been particularly bad hit. What we are seeing in these states is sure to find its way to your state in the near future unless we stay on guard and closely monitor and fight these movements.

California's Senator Levine sponsored CA AB 1634 which would have required mandatory spay and neuter of dogs over 4 months of age. Exemptions to this were vague and could have required large registration fees of non-neutered or spayed dogs and cats. This legislation did not make it to the floor for a vote but was withdrawn by Senator Levine who faced strong opposition from dog and cat breeders, AKC, and others. ABC wrote letters to committee members each time the legislation was amended. Levine has promised to re-introduce similar legislation in January. This fight is not over.

Pennsylvania's Governor submitted Administrative Rules to be used to enforce regulations on dog kennels, trainers, and breeders. These rules included detailed rules for housing, crate sizes, and lots of paperwork to discourage commercial operations but which would have affected many of our members as well. Cindy Miller, ABC Member, sits on the commission dealing with these regulations but faced a lonely job in trying to bring about change to them. ABC joined with AKC & Sportsmen's Alliance in a postcard campaign to get members to write their legislators. Right now, the regulations have been curtailed for the moment but look for them to surface again in another form.

San Antonio, Texas and Huntington Beach, CA, communities are currently facing laws and/or regulations similar to those proposed in CA AB 1634. If the AR folks meet defeat on national and/or state levels, then they promptly turn their attention to local levels where it is much harder to garner opposition on a national basis. ABC will be writing letters to Council Members of San Antonia regarding their proposals.

US Fish & Wildlife and Ohio DNR have raised the ugly head of the Pittman-Robertson Act and have announced the closure of 2 field trial grounds in that state, one of which is the famed Killdeer Plains Wildlife Area. We understand that after April 2008, no trials will be permitted. These same regulations are what cost us grounds in Illinois and Indiana. Illinois has gotten new grounds in Southern Illinois but Indiana is yet to find any suitable for trials. ABC President Ron Zook and the Ohio Field Trial Association are trying to get an extension on the date so other grounds can be located, but things look bleak. Unfortunately, some organizations have written this off as a lost cause and support is not as strong for field trialers as it was during the Illinois and Indiana crisis. For over 40 years, field trials were permitted on Pittman-Robertson purchased or maintained lands. Now they say, field trialing is not hunting, dogs and horses disturb wildlife, buildings such as clubhouses and barns do not further the wildlife effort, Pro handlers make money by running dogs on the grounds, etc., etc. in my opinion, if we are ever going to end this distorted notion of field trials, we are either going to have to take this issue to court or have legislation passed or added to the Pittman-Robertson Act that spells out that field trials are acceptable use of the grounds.

Every year, I ask each club to appoint someone to monitor legislation in your club's state. If we do not remain pro-active, make political contacts, know what legislation we are facing, we will not be able to breed our dogs or field trial with horses in the very near future. PLEASE, don't turn your back and leave it to someone else. I applaud our members in California, Texas, Pennsylvania, and Ohio who have worked so hard this year to kill bad legislation. They need help and support from each of us.

2007 AKC Poining Breed Advisory Committee Agenda Report – Ray Trimble
The AKC Pointing Breed Field Trial Advisory Committee last met in Boise, Idaho, on 22 April 2005. This committee normally meets every 5 years with the next meeting not likely until around 2010.

AKC Vice President for Performance, Bill Speck, has retired. The new Director is Doug Ljungren. Doug comes to this job with a background in pointing dog field trials. We wish Bill a successful retirement running his dogs and Doug a successful career representing the interests of performance organizations

2007 American Field Liaison Agenda Report - Ray Trimble

During the last few years the American Brittany Club has been trying to increase the number of regional trials that advertise their events in the American Field in order to make sure that dogs running

in the ABC National Championships and Classics are qualified to receive the title of Champion or Runner-Up Champion if they would win one of our national stakes. A derby placement in an American Field sponsored event qualifies a dog for life as does an adult placement. Regional Clubs that are members of the AFTCA will have win certificates issued to their Amateur handled winners which qualifies them to receive AFTCA Championship titles.

The ABC Secretary has asked clubs to indicate if their regional trials are also American Field sponsored on the ABC Field Trial application blank. The ABC trial reporting form has a place to check if results are also being sent to the AFTCA as well as the AF and AKC. Not as many clubs are members of AFTCA as are now running their trials under the American Field.

A larger proportion of the events not run under the AF are Walking trials which does hurt people trying to get win certificates or placements that would make the dog eligible to receive an AF/ AFTCA Gun Dog National Champion Title. They still get the AKC National title but not the American Field or AFTCA ones.

I would like propose the following change for the Board to consider the allocation of raffle proceeds be split evenly between the five national venues: Open All Age, Amateur All Age, Open Gun Dog, Amateur Gun Dog and the Specialty Show.

Reason to support this request: Raffle tickets are distributed to all club secretaries and directors requesting that they sell tickets on behalf of the ABC National Raffle committee, however, the proceeds only benefit the National Open and Amateur All Age events. To insure that the total membership takes a vested interest in the sale of these tickets, we should help offset some of the other venues expenses by dividing the revenue received from the sale of said tickets equally to all five venues, not just two.

All three received the necessary votes on the first ballot to advance to the second ballot. The second ballot was mailed to the Board of Directors. The second and final vote will be taken in the Board of Directors meeting at Booneville as required by the Policy Book.

#### 2007 Report of Health Aspects and Genetic Defects Committee – Committee members: Jane Bjork, Bill Dierberg DVM, Hal Engle DVM, Ron Harling DVM, Margret Horstmeyer DVM, Micheal Siegel PhD, Julianne Stout Womack MD and Gordon Theilen DVM, Chair.

The Health Aspects and Genetic Defects Committee (HAGDC) was active in Brittany DNA Studies; conducted at UCD, School of Veterinary Medicine and Section on Genetics under the direction of Dr. Mark Neff, an internationally known canine geneticist.

- 1) The main effort has continued to be collection of DNA Samples of which Brittany owners and members of Am. Brittany Club have in just over a year's time collected in part and submitted nearly 1,000 DNA samples.
  - Hip dysplasia, epilepsy, diabetes insipidus (water diabetes), orthopedic problems, infertility and genetics of traits are given
- 2) For ease of communication with the Canine Genetics Laboratory at UCD a web site was established, < http://www.vgl.ucdavis. edu/research/canine/projects/brittany>.
- 3) A promotional brochure was produced as background general information about Brittany DNA Studies and importance for the breed. These can be requested from the UCD development office, see web site for details.
- A bi-yearly update on activities was published in the American Brittany Magazine.
- A questionnaire about Acute Cruciate Ligament Tears (ACL) was submitted to the ABC Magazine, co-authored by committee member, Dr. Michael Siegel.
- 6) Gordon Theilen attended the AKC Health Foundation Symposium in St Louis representing the American Brittany Club on October 19th-21st, 2007. The symposium was sponsored in part by Nestle Purina Foundation.
- 7) Over 300 letters were sent to ABC members updating the Marvin D Nelson Jr. Memorial Fund and requesting consideration for annual donations to help support Brittany DNA Studies. The Fund now has approximately \$50,000 in the principle account. It is noteworthy that there has been amazing support from ABC, numerous regional clubs, ABC members and including the UCD School of Vet. Med., Section on Genetics (VGL). The VGL has contributed over \$50,000 in additional support for these studies. This along with matching funds to the Marvin D Nelson Jr. Memorial Fund, that has been available for a number of months, has allowed for research and collection of samples to go forward. The UCD laboratory is the only place where the entire genome of a species is being investigated, quite unique.
- 8) An update on the rationale about Brittany DNA Studies and origin of the Memorial Fund was published in July 2007 issue of the Purina Pro Plan Newsletter; wonderful publicity for the Brittany DNA Cause and the ABC Committee on HAGD and the American Brittany Club in general.
- 9) It has been arranged to collect DNA samples at various specialty shows, classics and The Nationals, with an effort to establish a special category of Brittany Champions, another first for Brittany DNA Studies

Emphasis and acknowledgment is given that successes are largely result of tremendous help and collection of samples made available by numerous ABC members nationally and Canada. Janet Mosher from Virginia, Marvin Nelson Mr.'s cousin, a Portuguese's Water Dog owner and exhibitor herself, and Larry Hagedorn of Southern Kansas Brittany Club have been very helpful in various aspects of Brittany DNA Studies moving forward at such a good pace.

#### 2007 Insurance Report – Dave Smith INSURANCE

For the current year, we maintained all the same policies and coverage that we have had in the past. The only non-routine happening was with the Holmes-Murphy Agency that handles our G/AC Accident Indemnity policy that is underwritten by the Hartford. Through our agent, Judy Aldrich, I renewed this policy in 2006 for a three-year term with annual payments of \$750.00. The prior policy had the same term and the same annual payment. In September 2007, I received a telephone call from Judy Aldrich advising that Holmes-Murphy could no longer handle our business (after I had received their invoice for the next year premium). In that I am the customer contact on the account and have a New Hampshire address, a Hartford policy must now be written by an agent licensed to do business in New Hampshire. I contacted the party Judy told me to call to handle the situation. He did not know what I was talking about.

I subsequently called Judy Aldrich and told her that we are a club, run by volunteers. Their agency, Holmes-Murphy has handled this policy for over 25 years. For us it is more important that we have support people working for us who know who we are and what our needs are. I told her to tell the Hartford that we wanted her to continue to service the American Brittany Club with this policy. And is she could not, we may very well look for another underwriter.

I have instructed Treasurer Chase to pay the current Holmes-Murphy bill, which is for next year. This is all happening now and I hopefully will have additional information to report in Booneville. Depending on how things go, an action item may have to be offered from the floor at our annual meeting.

#### 2007 Report Of The Magazine Committee - Ron Zook, Chair. September 3, 2007

The quality content and format of the American Brittany are excellent and continue to improve, however the schedule of delivery of the publication to the membership continues to be extremely late. This has been an on going problem for a number of years.

The Managing Editor and the Publishing Editor are making strong efforts to over come this problem. Recent in depth review of external pressures, data processing, communications, adherence to deadlines, additional help and upgrading of technical equipment reveal some opportunities for improving the delivery schedule.

Processing results from field trials, shows and hunt tests continue to be a major problem, some clubs fail to use the standard reporting form, hand writing is often illegible both of which make the job of accurate type setting more difficult. Further, some reports are incomplete, which requires more time. These things compound the amount of effort required to produce acceptable publication copy.

The Magazine Committee is also committed to providing advice and assistance where ever possible. Anyone wanting to volunteer to help should contact the Managing Editor.

The membership should expect a more aggressive approach from Editors with regard to compliance on submission deadlines, accuracy and completeness. The membership should expect to provide assistance in these areas to the Managing Editor, the Publishing Editor and the Executive Secretary.

Collectively, we hope to have the magazine back on schedule by December and have identified and implemented sufficient improvements to keep it there in the future.

Report from the Managing Editor - Dee Hempfield
The August issue was mailed September 12th and the September issue will be shipped to the Publishers on September 18th, with the October issue following on October 2nd, November on October 23rd, December on November 20th and January on December 18th at which time I would like my first agenda item (listed below) to take effect.

I have had very little time to check into a program to make processing the field trial results simpler, hopefully we can make better progress with that this coming year, as our biggest challenge remains getting field trial results on a timely manner for

insertion into each issue.

I want to thank those of you that have helped with the magazine and contributed articles for publication, those that have not been used are on file to be used. Short stories or articles can always be submitted for use. I would also like to thank Kristi Anglen for offering her time in securing the specialty results and proofing whatever content I send her way in a timely manner, Kristi has also been very supportive in submitting some fresh new articles over this past year.

Rational: With the current deadline of the 1st of the month prior, I only have 24 days to get the issue completed and to the Publisher, often a lot of copy comes in between the 24th and 1st and what work I have started often needs re-worked because of new/ additional content that came in by the deadline, which to me is time wasted. With this change I will have a full month between issues and it will allow the issues to be mailed earlier and arrive in members homes earlier.

We feel it's a magazine that any dog club would be proud of.

Through the years we have become friends with several members of the ABC and we consider that an honor. Yours is a fine club with many great people involved and our desire is to do our part to print and deliver a magazine that each member can look forward to receiving each month in a timely manner. #### 2007 Abc Purina Program Agenda Report - Ray Trimble, **Purina Coordinator**

- Eighteen hundred sixty four (1854) entries competed in Field and Show Events supported by Nestle-Purina Pet Care over the period of September 06 through May 07. This number included both show and field events with 593 show entries and 1271 field entries. The number of national ABC events (24) had a total of 1329 entries, specialty and field events, while the non-ABC events had a total of 535 entries.
- "Glitches" in the Purina Accounting Department causing slowness in clubs receiving monetary support, have mostly disappeared and little trouble is expected in the future. This year, support was provided to two regional club specialty shows. Two shows per year are supported by a random drawing from clubs submitting applications. In 2006/2007, approximately 40 events are expected to be supported.
- Clubs whose events are sponsored by Nestle-Purina must furnish an FEIN or Social Security number before Purina

will issue the funds. Along with this requirement, Clubs must also furnish the Coordinator a copy of the event ad and a signed copy of the judges' sheets. Ads, entry blanks or premiums, brace sheets, and write-ups should include the Purina Logo or otherwise give credit to them as a sponsor. Some reporters are not aware of this and the field trial committee should make sure they know to do so. We can add a Thank-You to the ABC Magazine reports if a club fails to acknowledge Purina, but we do not see the ones you send to the American Field before they are published. Funds will not be requested from Purina for your club if this info is not included with the "Orange Form" submitted after completion

#### 2007 Trophy Report ABC National Specialty -Sandy & Tom Schrank, Trophy Co-Chair

TROPHY ITEMS FOR 2007:

This year we will again offer Stoneware pottery for the majority of our class places, with some as mid level trophies, as well Framed prints will be offered to six major trophy winners. New this year are watercolor portraits offered to BOB & BOS, and Highest Scoring & Highest Combined dog/bitch winners. Purina is again generously contributing. Several of our traveling trophies have been rebuilt, and refurbished for 07.

The Trophy Co-Chair wish to report that to Sept 24, we have had sponsors contribute, and have forwarded \$3,065 to the ABC Treasurer. These have been sent in six batches of checks, batch 7 has \$255, in it, and we are expecting to add over \$600 more, in the next day or so - from 3 sponsors. We have a small number of other Trophy Sponsors, who have not sent in their pledges, which could amount to \$300 - 400, or more, these should be here by Oct 10th. We have had the following sponsors this year:

- 1. 3 Regional Brittany Club sponsors with full class
- 2. 5 ABC Clubs sponsoring one, two or more places in
- 3. 1 All breed Kennel Club with a Trophy
- 4. 1 Brittany Rescue Org, multiple place sponsors
- 5. 3 Australian individual sponsors
- 6. Many individual ABC member sponsors

If we collect all outstanding sponsor pledges, (last year we had 100%), we should have a total of \$1,155 (est.). Together with the \$3,065, already sent in, this will result in a Grand Total of \$4,220. for 2007

EXPENSE:

The only ABC outlay to date is for Deneen Pottery, for the glaze engraved pottery items needed for 07 trophies, in the amount of \$2,781. There may be additional charges for any excess or overruns delivered after the production runs. The reason for this low figure is due to the number of unfilled class places for 06, and unclaimed prizes last year, combined with our using the same pottery as in 06, also. Steve Ralph is personally transporting all these trophies to the Nationals this year, from Minnesota. (An amount of just over \$200 from 2006 is owed Deneen, which is a reduced balance, agreed to with them, and will be paid soon.)

The artist doing portraits for ABC's top 4 Trophles will receive a check for \$430; for two full dog watercolors, and two watercolor busts, of the winning dogs/bitches. This is under the trophy amount for each of these Trophies, which will be brought to that level, for each, by giving a small check to each winner to assist with their respective framing costs. These checks will add \$70, for a \$500 grand total. We will display examples of her work at

Other items, to be reimbursed to the Schranks, are for expenses, for purchase of prints & framing, purchase of items for Jr's Trophy Baskets & Jr's Participation Bags. Nancy A. will also have trophy items for reimbursement. These will be itemized and submitted to the Show Chair, and the ABC Treasurer, and will be referenced in the supplement to this report, to be given as a handout, at the BOD meeting at the Nationals, together with the final income tally, and any noteworthy developments.

SUGGESTIONS Your Trophy Co-Chair will put into effect several measures for 2008 which will streamline, and make much more efficient the tallying and collection of Trophy Sponsorships. These will be done only after consulting with and agreement by the Show Chair. To date, we have put into use the posting and updating of a list of

'Un-Reserved Trophies' on the ABC Website, with the help of our Webmaster. This has resulted in a serious reduction of the 'What's available?', inquiries of the past. We still expend considerable time in following up, and collecting Sponsor pledges, but are working with Nancy Anderson on some ideas for 2008. I move to add additional classes to be held only at the National Specialty Show held during the fall of each year

DUAL CHAMPION dog and bitch classes: qualifications shall be Dual Champion of record with AKC prior to the entry closing date of the National Specialty Show. These classes will be held only at the American Brittany Club National Specialty Show.

NATIONAL QUALIFIER dog and bitch classes: entry of these classes shall be limited to dogs and bitches who have qualified to run in the American Brittany Club National Gun Dog Championship Field Trial, American Brittany Club National Amateur Gun Dog Championship Field Trial, American Brittany Club National Amateur Championship Field Trial, Affect Brittany Club National Annateur
All-Age Championship Field Trial and the American Brittany
Club Open All-Age Championship Field Trial for the current and
preceding years only. Dogs and bitches who qualify after the show
closing date will be eligible to show the next year only, and those that qualify before the closing date will be eligible for two years. Dogs and bitches have to only be qualified to run in the National Field Trial events, not actually compete. These classes will be held only at the American Brittany Club National Specialty Show

Dogs and bitches placing first in these four classes shall be eligible to compete in the Best of Breed competition.

RATIONALE: This will in no way affect the field trial dog/bitch classes or the qualifications for those classes. The changes for the field trial classes will be proposed as an action item for the BOD meeting in Nov. The above needs approval now for these classes to be added to this year's show. This has nothing to do with changes to the Dual Dog Award to be proposed at the upcoming BOD meeting in Nov.

We don't limit the Parade of National Qualifiers only to those who run, so any dog or bitch who qualifies will be eligible to compete in these classes.

The above proposal only adds four additional classes to the National Specialty Show held in the fall, and this gives the National Qualifiers and Dual Champion Dogs their own classes in which to be showcased.

#### Action Item #1 - Yearbooks for All

Distribute the American Brittany Club yearbook to all ABC members, and cover all printing & mailing costs by a \$5 increase in annual dues.

A firm quote was solicited from an established printer. Cost A firm quote was solicited from an established printer. Cost decreased from \$6/book to \$3/book, by increasing quantity from 200 to 2800. (A competitive bid process would further reduce costs.) Total cost for 2800 books =\$8400. Advertising brings in \$3200+ as profit for the club (# of ads in the 2006 book, at the 2007 rates, not including color ad premium). Maximum USPS rate for "Bound Printed Matter" is \$1.96 to \$2.46 per parcel, discounts (i.e. for pre-sorted mailings) will further reduce that cost

OR - make the January or February issue of the ABC magazine, the "yearbook". Include the results of the National Specialty Show and field trials, the Gun Dog Nationals, and the Futurities.

The annual yearbook (\$12 in Booneville, \$15 if ordered later) includes many items of interest not found in the magazine, yet these things are a vital part of the history of the ABC. Pedigrees of National Qualifiers, the entire National Specialty Show Catalog, biographies of National Field and Show Specialty winners, listings of Hall of Fame members (people and dogs), breeder and kennel advertising, and a myriad of photos; all are of interest to the entire

And... per ABC Policy (page 81 "National Championship Yearbook", next to last paragraph, starting on line 3) "It is the responsibility of the 1st, 3rd, and 4th Vice-President, the Championship Secretary, the Show Secretary, and the ABC Secretary or their designates, for the distribution and collection of sales receipts. Appropriate records shall be maintained and all receipts delivered to the ABC Treasurer" (1979)

Per the 2006 ABC Financial statements, income from "Yearbooks and Patches" was reported as \$220; less than 19 books!!! Changes need to be made - the current practice appears to provide "free" books for some (many?) members. Or, is money being taken from the envelope in the box by the door in the clubhouse?? Either way - the policy is not being followed, and the current distribution method does not adequately serve the membership.

#### Action Item #2 - Waiting Period for Implementation of **Approved Dues Changes**

Amend Article III of the club by-laws, to eliminate the "waiting period" for approved changes to annual membership dues to be

implemented. (This would allow Action Item #1 to be implemented for the 2008 yearbook.)

Current wording for Article III is, "<u>Dues</u>: Annual dues for both Active Members and Associate Members shall be payable in advance in the amount established by the Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors, annually, in the second preceding year to the effective date of such dues. By a second preceding year to the Board of Directors prior to August 1 of any year immediately preceding the January 1 effective date, such dues may be modified by increase or decrease as the financial circumstances of the Club dictate. If a member enrolled in a Regional Club chooses to receive full privileges of the American Brittany Club, the Board of Directors shall determine the amount of the annual dues to be deposited with the Parent Club.

Does anyone really know what that means?? (This passage is rated 28.5 on the Flesch Reading Ease Index. Ratings under 30 are best understood by college graduates. In comparison Reader's Digest magazine has a readability index of about 52, the Harvard Law Review in the low 30's.)

My friends, we are not talking about TAXES! Do we really need up to two years advance notice of a dues increase that in all likelihood, is less than the cost of ONE bird used at a field trial???? We're all members of this club because we choose to be, and no one needs to renew their membership if the cost exceeds the value

The current wording actually hurts the membership and the organization, by unnecessarily delaying the receipt of the incremental dues income after an increase is approved by the

I would suggest that even if you have an email petition that what you submit to the Directors contain 10 actual signatures of full members if you want to make sure it is considered. Another thing to consider, even if this is passed, it will take almost 2 years before the dues can be raised as per policy.

Do we really need another hoop to jump thru to have our voices heard? If not for thousands and thousands of signatures on petitions submitted "online" to our elected local and state government officials related to California's infamous AB1634 (the "anti-pet bill", including mandatory spay/neuter by 4 months), it is very likely this ill-conceived bill may have been passed!

An electronic signature is a valid signature for hundreds of things that used to be signed "in person" (i.e. online purchases of services and merchandise with credit cards), registering software, titling your car or paying vehicle registration fees or taxes, enrolling in college or college courses, etc. The ABC has nothing to lose and everything to gain by being open to communication from the general membership in the form of support for Agenda Items thru emails and ePetitions.

#### Action Item #4 - Written Petition = Email Petition/

Conduct a referendum vote by mail, to clarify the wording of Article IV in the ABC Constitution to define "Written Petition" to include "Email" or "Online" Petition, and "Mail" to include

This is similar to #3, but important to distinguish on it's own as it applies to Amendments to the ABC Constitution and By-laws. Article IV, Section 1 states: The Articles of Constitution may be amended by a referendum vote by mail, (a) when authorized by the Board of Directors or (b) when authorized by a written petition addressed to the Secretary and signed by at least 25 members in good standing, no more than 5 being members of the same regional member club."

This means, that any Agenda Item can be put to a MAIL vote by the ABC General Membership, if just 25 members sign such

Also, how great would it be, if Mary Jo (or other ABC Secretary) could email the entire ABC membership, who could then VOTE on any proposed changes to the ABC Constitution and By-laws? This could be so easy without getting too technical - post a PDF ballot on the ABC web site so members can download, print, and VOTE; then MAIL. FAX. or even Email their scanned ballot to be counted. Ballots must be signed to be counted - that's already "in the rules' (no secrets here).

(If we wanted to take advantage of all the technology offered by the Internet, we could even VOTE and tabulate results online... but the above scenario goes a long way towards improving the archaic system currently in place.)

This recommendation saves an enormous amount of money, makes it EASY for the membership to VOTE, and would INCREASE the # of votes cast. Our elected Board Members have been voting by email for some time - why not the general membership, too?

#### Action Item #5 - Officer and Director Posts to Dualbrittanys, Brittany-L, etc

Stipulate that all email communication from any ABC Officer, Director, or Webmaster, to any group email list (i.e. Dualbrittanys or Brittany-L) be identified in the subject line by the prefix "ABC OFFICIAL BUSINESS" vs. "PERSONAL".

Many ABC members are on one or more Brittany email lists, and receive from 2-20+ Brittany emails a day. Due to the volume of emails we all receive, some people delete messages without reading, and may inadvertently delete something ABC related, posted by the ABC Secretary (or other officer or director). A notation "ABC News", "ABC Important", "ABC Business", etc. in the subject line of messages sent by ABC officers or directors for those items that are club related, would insure that these messages can be distinguished easily, and would help all recipients know whether the writer is speaking from a personal standpoint, or as an officer or director of the club.

This would greatly facilitate the rapid dissemination and receipt of official ABC communication, and would allow officers and directors to speak freely on any list, as either an individual, or as an officer or director, with no confusion among the recipients of these messages

Action Item #6 - Obedience and Rally at the National Specialty Show

Eliminate Obedience and Rally competition from the National Specialty Show, and instead, offer those events in conjunction with the ABC Summer Specialty.

Rally events were added to the Nat'l Specialty Show in 2005. At that time, it was necessary to add Friday as an official "show day", which hinders conformation exhibitors from setting up while these events are going on. Rally and Obedience require significant additional expenses; a separate judge (expenses include transportation, lodging, meals, fees, etc.), and they also require additional expenses for ribbons and trophies. The 2007 budget for Obedience and Rally trophies is over \$1350. In 2006 there were nine (9) members with 15 total Obedience entries, and six (6) members with eight (8) Rally entries. An examination of entries over the past 10 years, shows very few individuals participating

Regardless of how much we might personally support the

efforts of these individuals and their dogs, the significant costs of including Rally and Obedience at the Nat'l Specialty Show are being absorbed by the ABC as entries have never come close to meeting associated expenses. For 2007, the entry fees for Rally and Obedience were actually decreased, for dogs entering multiple events.

The stated mission and purpose of the ABC is focused on "field and show" and the "dual dog", and makes no mention of Obedience and Rally. These events are a costly distraction to the Nat'l Specialty Show, and are supported by only a few exhibitors.

By moving Rally and Obedience to the ABC Summer Specialty show in a revolving region of the country, the excess costs of these events will not be paid for by the ABC. The all-breed shows associated with the ABC Summer Specialty are already set up for Rally and Obedience. Moving Rally and Obedience to the summer will also make it possible to add Agility events, which cannot be accommodated at the Holiday Inn - Fort Smith, home of the ABC Nat'l Specialty Show since 1996.

#### Action Item #7

#### Eliminate Associate Memberships and add a Family or "Household" Membership.

Associate Members are not allowed to vote, and do not receive the monthly magazine. Those few individuals with "Associate" memberships gain nothing for their \$3 annual fee, that is not already available to them as participants in the sport. Differentiating between a Full & Associate Member at regional or local events is impossible. Non-members are as welcome as Associate Members to participate fully in AKC Brittany field trials or Specialty shows, (or is someone checking ID's at the door of the clubhouse in Booneville this year?).

For \$3 a year per person (\$1 of that goes to the regional club) it is not worth the trouble of the Membership Secretary to maintain separate membership lists, write checks, and mail associated payments to the regional clubs.

This is an antiquated membership category that has no place in a modern sporting dog breed club.

On the other hand, recognizing that there are many individual ABC members with spouses and/or children who support club activities and events, a Family Membership option can include everyone in the family. Suggestion - a Family Membership can be offered at \$50, and includes ONE vote. (A comment from a member on the signature page suggests that Family Memberships receive TWO votes. That would allow couples who currently have two memberships, to both retain their rights to vote.)

#### Action Item #9 - Brittany Rescue

Recognize the National Brittany Rescue and Adoption Network (www.nbran.org) as a "full-service" Brittany Rescue organization, on par with American Brittany Rescue. All references in official ABC publications and communications shall include NBRAN and ABR, with preference given to neither as a "preferred" or "endorsed" rescue organization. Both shall be "supported" equally by the American Brittany Club, to the extent determined by the BOD and/ or the general membership.

The National Brittany Rescue and Adoption Network was incorporated as a 501(c3) non-profit organization in 1999. Since then, NBRAN volunteers have rescued, fostered, provided medical treatment and care, and placed over 1000 Brittanys in "forever" homes. Many NBRAN volunteers are former American Brittany Rescue (ABR) volunteers. Some volunteers support both

organizations.

The mission statement of NBRAN (www.nbran.org) is:

"National Brittany Rescue & Adoption Network (NBRAN) is an alliance of dedicated Brittany rescue volunteers who share a deep love for the breed and who will work to rescue, rehabilitate and re-home Brittanys in need, whether abandoned, lost, stray or surrendered to rescue for placement. As volunteers united in a common cause, we are committed to the care of these dogs in foster homes, and providing for their physical and emotional needs. We are committed in our endeavor to help them with all the resources we have available.

We pledge to maintain a community of volunteers who treat each other, and the dogs they rescue, with respect, courtesy, kindness and love. We will seek always to lend encouragement and to support one another, and to facilitate friendly collaboration and cooperation between our volunteers. We believe that by building a supportive, dog-centered organization founded on respect, honesty and integrity, we will always remain focused on the welfare of the Brittanys entrusted to our care and hold their interests uppermost in our hearts and minds. Our mission is to place these dogs in safe, loving and permanent homes with approved applicants, and to provide a supportive network for our volunteers, who after all, make our goals possible."

There is a perception among the public, that ABR is the officially endorsed by the ABC, yet the ABC Policy book specifically states that "The American Brittany Rescue is a separate legal entity and there are no legal affiliations between the American Brittany Club and American Brittany Rescue." It is unknown when information about ABR was added to the ABC Policy Book and the above declaration made, but at that time, NBRAN did not exist.

The American Brittany Club should not give the appearance of sanction or endorsement of one national rescue organization over any other, and should treat all national breed rescue organizations as equal, provided the organization is a verified 501(c3) organization.

Enclosed are the signatures of 10 ABC members in favor of a change of the date of the National Specialty Show to the weekend before Thanksgiving for your consideration at your next board meeting. I propose to the ABC Board of Directors that in the year 2009 that our National Specialty Date be changed to the weekend before Thanksgiving for various reasons to follow. It is with much hope that you look into this with great consideration as more signatures will follow.

I have been attending the National Specialty since November of 1987. Since, I have noticed the number of dogs entered have declined. Taking a quick look through my year books the number are as follows: 1999 entries were 282 dogs with 496 entries, 2005 entries were 181 dogs with 295 entries, 2006 227 dogs with 365 (please note that rally had been added for the last two years). Much of the decline we feel is in part due to the economy and people not being able to travel due to the Thanksgiving holiday. Last year my total expenses to fly myself and to have my three dogs driven out was just over \$1500.00. If I had the time to drive with out the worry of leaving a family home alone during the holiday I would have saved close to \$1000.00. Yes, this was my choice, never the less how many other people due to the economy and holiday were not able to do the same?

The advantages of having the National Specialty the first weekend of the National are as follows:

- Your entries will increase because people aren't forced to decide between leaving their family on Thanksgiving to attend the National.
- Economics. This will allow more people to drive to the National instead of flying or just not attending. It is more cost effective to dr without the worry of leaving your family on Thanksgiving in order to attend the National.
- Safer time for all to travel. Thanksgiving is the most traveled holiday.
- 4. The dogs that are entered in the National Trial don't have to be re-bathed after running in the trial. They can travel clean and be clean for the show well in advance. Less stress for those attempting the Dual Award.

In closing, it is with great hope that you will consider moving the date to the first weekend of The National. Thanks you for your careful consideration.

#### News from AKC...

REVISIONS to AKC POINTING BREED HUNTING TEST REGULATIONS Passed by the AKC Board of Directors, Effective January 1, 2008

#### **FOREWARD**

New: Purpose: The purpose of the Pointing Breed Hunting Test program is to afford an opportunity for a person to demonstrate a dog's ability to perform the task for which they were originally bred. Testing gauges the dog's natural hunting ability and training against these standards of performance — Junior Hunter, Senior Hunter and Master Hunter.

The AKC Pointing Breed Hunting Test program started in April 1986.

#### CHAPTER 1, GENERAL REGULATIONS Section 6. Judges' Eligibility and Approval.

Anyone in good standing with The American Kennel Club may be approved to judge a Hunting Test subject to the qualification requirements in force at the time.

In order to Apprentice Judge (after 1/1/08):

- Must attend one AKC Pointing Breed Hunt Test Seminar.
- Must handle a dog to at least one qualifying leg at the level to be judged or higher.

In order to be an approved Judge (applies to new judges after 1/1/08):

- Must apprentice judge twice at the level to be judged or higher.
- Must pass an AKC Hunting Test written test.
- Must handle a dog to at least three qualifying legs at the level to be judged or higher.
- Approved pointing breed field trial judges are exempt from the "handled in three qualifying legs" requirement, but must still apprentice judge twice and pass the written test prior to judging pointing breed hunt tests.

In order to Maintain Judging Eligibility (applies to all judges):

 By 12/31//2009 – all judges must have attended a seminar or passed a written test within the last 5 years of the date of the assignment.

Judges Panel Qualifications (after 1/1/08)

 The proposed judges of each level must have a combined record of having judged at least 8 previous licensed tests, with at least 4 assignments at the same test level or higher.

Section 7. Judges' Responsibility. A Judge of a Hunting Test shall be familiar with all the Rules, Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the type of Test being conducted. Judges shall be thoroughly familiar with the applicable Standards, and shall be responsible for judging in compliance with the Regulations, Standards and Guidelines.

Section 9. AKC Publications. All clubs holding Hunting Tests are required to have available copies of the latest editions of these: <u>Regulations for AKC Hunting Tests for Pointing Breeds</u>, <u>Rules Applying to Registration and Dealing with Misconduct</u>.

Section 13. Premium Lists. The following information shall be included in the premium list for a licensed or member club Huhting Test: name of club, location with directions and date, names and addresses of officers, time judging will commence, entry fees, Tests offered, names and addresses of Judges together with their specific assignments, name, address and telephone number of Hunting Test Secretary, date and time of closing and drawing of entries, and the official AKC entry form.

Section 15. Bye-Dogs, Change of Level, Incomplete Braces, Attacking Dog. Whenever a bracemate is not available in the same test level, the Judges must select a suitable bracemate. A suitable bracemate is one that closely matches the expectations of the testing level. Care should be taken when using a bracemate from a lower level, so as not to place the testing dog at an unfair disadvantage. If necessary, the bracemate can be a dog not entered in the event.

Section 17. Submission of Records. The Hunting Test

Secretary shall forward to the American Kennel Club the Official Catalog or Judges Book marked to indicate dogs that received qualifying score. Certified and signed by the Judges and the Hunting Test Secretary. The complete Hunting Test Secretary's Report of the Hunting Test must be sent to The American Kennel Club so as to reach its office within seven (7) days after the close of the event. All entry forms are to be retained by the Club for a period of one year following the conclusion of the event.

#### CHAPTER 2, QUALIFYING SCORES, AWARDING OF TITLES

Section 3. Senior Hunter Title (SH). In order to be recorded as a Senior Hunter, a dog must be registered in the AKC Stud Book, and must have a record of having acquired Qualifying scores in the Senior Hunting Test at five (5) AKC-licensed or —member club Hunting Tests, or, in the case of a dog that has been recorded by AKC as a Junior Hunter, that dog will be recorded as a Senior Hunter after having acquired Qualifying score in the Senior Hunting Test at four (4) AKC-licensed or —member cub Hunting Tests. Except that a German Wirehaired Pointer shall not be recorded a Senior Hunter unless it has also been certified by two approved field trial or hunting test judges to have passed an AKC Water Test at a licensed or member field trial or hunting test.

Section 4. Master Hunter Title (MH). In order to be recorded as a Master Hunter, a dog must be registered in the AKC Stud Book, and must have a record of having acquired Qualifying scores at the Master Hunting Test at six (6) AKC-licensed or — member club Hunting Tests, or, in the case of a dog that has been recorded by AKC as a Senior Hunter, that dog will be recorded as a Master Hunter after having acquired Qualifying score in the Master Hunting Test at five (5) AKC-licensed or —member club Hunting Tests. Except that a German Wirehaired Pointer shall not be recorded a Master Hunter unless it has also been certified by two approved field trial or hunting test judges to have passed an AKC Water Test at a licensed or member field trial or hunting test.

#### WATER TEST

If a club wished to hold a Water Test in conjunction with its licensed or member field trial, hunting test or as a "stand alone" event, request for approval of the Water Test must be included on the application for the event. If approved, the Water Test must be specified on the questionnaire form and announced in the premium list. The Water Test shall be judged by two approved field trial or hunting test Judges. The dog shall retrieve a dead game bird from the water after a swim of about 20 yards to the bird. The handler shall stand (6) six feet from the water, and the dog must demonstrate its willingness to enter the water, to swim, and to retrieve, at the direction of its handler without being touched or intimidated. Style shall not be considered. The dogs shall not be placed, but shall either pass or fail. The Judges shall certify on the judging sheets the particulars of each dog that passed the test.

The "stand alone" test will not count against the number of annual field trials/hunting tests that a club is allowed to hold.

#### CHAPTER 3, INSTRUCTIONS FOR HUNTING TEST COMMITTEE

Section 2. Courses. Dogs shall be tested on a single course with or without a bird field. A bird field must not be less than five acres, and larger than five acres is strongly recommended. A bird field must have sufficient cover to hold birds and must be of adequate size to permit a dog to hunt naturally without excessive hacking. If a bird field is used, a minimum of 6 minutes in the bird field is required for the junior hunting test and a minimum of 8 minutes is required for the senior and master hunting test.

No one shall be permitted in the bird field at anytime during the running of the dogs except for the Judges, the <u>Apprentice Judges</u>, the handlers of the working dogs, the Official Guns and <u>AKC Field Representatives</u>.

Section 3. Birds. Birds should, if possible, be released in natural cover rather than in artificially created cover. They should not be placed in holes nor in such cover as will impede their ability to fly or run. Birds may be rocked or

dizzied but not to such an extent as to affect their ability to fly. Game Stewards and bird planters should wear gloves and should not hold birds against their bodies.

In all test levels, a minimum of two birds shall be released for each brace, either before the start of, or during the running of each brace.

In a Test run on a single course without a bird field, the birds <u>must</u> be released at suitable places along the course. Whenever a bird field is used (either alone or with a course), the minimum of two birds per brace must be released in the bird field.

Regardless of which course or bird field option might be used, it is mandatory to plant the back course and to maintain a consistent number of birds both there and in the bird field throughout the event.

Birds may be liberated from horseback and/or All Terrain Vehicles on the back course, as long as it can be done without interference to the working dogs. With the exception of ATV's, motorized vehicles are prohibited. ATV's may be used for the sole purpose of liberating birds on course. ATV's must meet all applicable state and federal government requirements. ATV's are not allowed in bird fields, but may be driven around their perimeters.

Section 4. Running Time. A minimum of 15 minutes is required for each brace in the Junior Hunting Test, and at least 30 minutes allowed for each brace in Senior and Master Hunting Tests. Failure to meet the required times will result in no qualification being awarded.

A Test-giving club may extend the minimum time allowed for braces (but not to exceed 30 minutes in Junior or 45 minutes in Senior and Master) provided the extended running time is published in the premium list. If extended time is advertised it must be adhered to.

The duty of having a dog ready in place when required for judging rests solely with its handler or owner. All dogs should be ready on the grounds well in advance of the scheduled times for their braces so that the Judges will not be held up in case of an absent brace. If a dog is not present at the place where it is to start within 5 minutes after it is called for by the Judges to run in any test, it should be disqualified. The Judges are responsible for keeping the time.

**Section 5. Horses.** In testing for Junior, Senior, Master Hunting Tests, all handling must be on foot. Horses may be used only by the Judges, <u>Apprentice Judge</u>, the Judge's Marshall and the bird liberator.

#### CHAPTER 4, INSTRUCTIONS FOR HUNTING TEST COMMITTEES

Section 1. Junior Hunting Test. A Junior hunting dog must show a keen desire to hunt, be bold and independent, have a fast, yet attractive, manner of hunting, and demonstrate not only intelligence in seeking objectives, but also the ability to find game. A Junior hunting dog must establish point on at least fifty (50) percent of the birds it encounters, but no additional credit shall be given for steadiness to wing and shot. If the handler is within reasonable gun range of a bird which has been flushed after a point, a blank cartridge must be fired by the handler. Junior hunting dogs must hold point until the handler gets within normal gunshot range. This requirement should be tempered by practical considerations such as the dog's distance from the handler when it finds a bird. Junior hunting dogs must also show reasonable obedience to their handler's commands.

Section 2. Senior Hunting Test. A Senior hunting dog must show all of the attributes of a Junior hunting dog. In addition, the Senior hunting dog must be stead to wing on all pointed birds and must remain in position until the shot or they are released. A Senior hunting dog must retrieve. All birds that are pointed by the Senior dog in a bird field must be shot where safety allows. If gunning is being done on course, all birds pointed on course must be shot where safety allows. A legitimate attempt to retrieve all downed birds must be made. Conditions such as the type of cover where the bird landed, the terrain, and the condition of the downed bird, sometimes make a retrieve impossible and this should not reflect negatively on the score of the Senior dog. Whenever it encounters its bracemate on point, it must honor. A dog that steals its bracemate's point

cannot receive a Qualifying score.

Section 3. Master Hunting Test. A Master hunting dog must positively demonstrate its steadiness to wing and shot. All birds that are pointed by the Master dog in a bird field must be shot where safety allows. If gunning is being done on course, all birds pointed on course must be shot where safety allows. Gunning must be done by Official Guns only. A legitimate attempt to retrieve all downed birds must be made. Conditions such as the type of cover, where the birds landed, the terrain, and the condition of the downed bird, sometimes make a retrieve impossible and this should not reflect negatively on the score of the Master dog. All killed birds must be retrieved promptly, tenderly and absolutely to hand. The handler shall not command or signal the dog to retrieve until positive steadiness has been demonstrated.

#### CHAPTER 5, TEST REQUIREMENTS AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR JUDGES

Section 1. General Requirements and Instructions.
(F) Belled collars are permissible. Electronic devices, including beeper or dummy electronic devices, as well as pinch or choke-type collars shall not be worn by a dog while it is being run in a Hunting Test.

(G) Special Training Collars used to control and train dogs including but not limited to collars with prongs, electronic collars used with transmitters, muzzles and head collars may not be used on dogs at AKC events, except as allowed in the AKC Rules, Regulations, and Policies.

New Paragraph (H): The use of tracking collars at recognized hunting tests are at the sole discretion of the host club. The hunting test premium list shall state if tracking collars are allowed. If the premium list does not specifically state tracking collars are allowed, they are then prohibited.

- (H) Moves to (I): A handler is permitted to pick up his or her dog during the running of a brace in any test level, but may do so only with the permission of the Judges.
- (I) Moves to (J): It is the prerogative of the Judges to order up a dog at any time.

Section 2. Instructions and Test Requirements for Junior Hunting Test. (1) HUNTING: A dog is scored from "0" to "10" on the basis of whether or not it evidences a keen desire to hunt, boldness and independence, and a fast, yet useful pattern of running. A dog that lacks independence to the extent that it seldom leaves its handler's side, needs constant direction as to where to hunt or is directed into a bird(s) has not demonstrated adequate hunting ability and cannot receive a qualifying score.

Section 3. Instructions and Test Requirements for Senior Hunting Test. (3) POINTING: A Senior hunting dog must be steady to wing on all pointed birds and remain until the shot or they are released.

(4) RETRIEVING: The Judges shall call back any dog that did not have an opportunity to retrieve during the running of its brace in order to score the dog's Retrieving ability. The call backs to demonstrate Retrieving ability shall be limited to those dogs whose scores in the other abilities would otherwise enable them to receive a Qualifying score.

(6) HONORING: In order to receive a Qualifying score, a Senior hunting dog must honor; a handler may give a dog a verbal command to honor. In order to receive a Qualifying score, a Senior hunting dog must <u>see or</u> acknowledge that its bracemate is on point before it has been cautioned to honor. A dog that steals its bracemate's point cannot receive a Qualifying score.

Section 4. Instructions and Test Requirements for Master Hunting Test. (3) POINTING: It is permissible for the handler to caution a master hunting dog on point. Cautioning, if any, is expected to be quiet and infrequent. No intimidation or physical restraint shall be permitted.

(4) RETRIEVING: As in the Senior Hunting Test, a Master hunting dog must be given the opportunity to demonstrate Retrieving ability, either during the time its brace is running, or in a call back situation. The Judges may call back only those dogs whose scores in the other abilities would otherwise permit them to receive a Qualifying score.

(5) TRAINABILITY: Both handlers shall carry an empty

shotgun or an "imitation" long barreled gun at all times during the running of the brace. In those instances where the use of live ammunition is not permitted on the back course, blank pistols must be fired.

A Master hunting dog must stop on a wild flushed bird without being given a command to do so. A dog that fails to do so, or a dog requiring a command to stop cannot receive a qualifying score. A blank shall be fired on a stop-to-flush bird.

When a game bird is flushed, following a point, the handler of the pointing dog must shoulder an empty shotgun or an "imitation" long barreled gun, and with both hands on the gun, follow the flight of the bird as if a shot were to be fired at it.

(6) HONORING: A Master hunting dog must honor <u>but shall</u> not be commanded to do so. A dog requiring restraint, either physical or verbal, while establishing an honor cannot receive a Qualifying score. A dog that steals its bracemate's point cannot receive a Qualifying score.

A Master dog may be called into the vicinity of the pointing dog to demonstrate an honor.

Once a dog has established an honor, the handler is permitted to give a quiet verbal caution, but may not use loud vocal or physical restraint. <u>Cautioning, if any, is expected to be quiet and infrequent.</u> No intimidation or physical restraint shall be permitted.

As in the Senior Hunting Test, a Master hunting dog must be given an opportunity to honor, either during the time its brace is running, or in a callback situation. The Judges may call back only those dogs whose scores in the other abilities would otherwise permit them to receive a Qualifying score.

#### GUIDELINES FOR POINTING BREED HUNTING TESTS PART 1, INTRODUCTION

Shooting: Only blank pistols are permitted, except for the empty shotguns or "imitation" long barreled guns that are carried by handlers in Master. All live shooting in Senior and Master is done only by Official Guns. A blank pistol is clearly defined in Chapter 3, Section 6 of the Regulations as being one that is incapable of discharging live ammunition.

#### PART II, HUNTING TEST CATEGORIES

3. Pointing: Flagging (lack of staunchness) on game is generally a fault and should be reflected in the score of any dog. This could be a dog which has only stopped with a soft stance on a bird. A dog with a low stance should not be scored lower than a dog with a high stance if it demonstrates staunchness and intensity, particularly in difficult pointing situations. Some breeds may not carry as high a head and tail as others, and this should be weighed in determining a score.

A flash point is generally a point in which the dog stops only momentarily before chasing the bird. The question arises as to how much longer than "momentarily" the dog must remain on point. The Regulations state that a Junior dog must hold point until the handler gets within normal quinshot range.

This requirement should be tempered by practical considerations such as the dogs distance from the handler when it finds a bird.

A Senior <u>hunting</u> dog must <u>be steady to wing on all pointed birds and remain until the shot or they are released. A dog which breaks before the shot cannot receive a Qualifying score. A Senior dog must be steady to flush, but not to shot.</u>

A Master hunting dog must demonstrate steadiness to wing and shot on all birds and cannot receive a Qualifying score if it breaks. The handler may caution a Master dog after it has established point. <u>Cautioning, if any, is expected to be quiet and infrequent. No intimidation or physical restraint shall be permitted.</u> The dog cannot be commanded to retrieve until positive steadiness has been demonstrated. A handler may send his dog to retrieve after the bird has hit the ground and the dog is seen to remain in position. A dog that breaks at any time before it is commanded to retrieve cannot receive a Qualifying score...

5. Retrieving: Some unusual situations can occur in the retrieve. For instance, the gunner fires a shot and the bird goes down. When the dog is sent for the retrieve, the

bird flies away. Some Judges say that if a command is given to retrieve, the dog must come back with the bird or the Retrieving score will be 0. In this circumstance, the attempt should not be scored and the Judges should give a dog a chance to retrieve another bird. The dog can continue on course for another find, or a callback could be used. Two Official Gunners must be used whenever a dog is called back to retrieve. Tracking collars are not allowed to be used in a call back situation.

6. Honoring: If a dog is given an opportunity to honor and refuses, it cannot receive a Qualifying score. If the dog does not have an opportunity to honor, it should be called back at the conclusion of the brace or the end of the test to demonstrate its willingness to honor and its style. Style can be compared to that discussed under the Pointing category. Tracking collars are not allowed to be used in a call back situation.

In Senior, the Regulations state that the handler may give a dog a verbal command to honor but the dog must see or acknowledge that its bracemate is on point before it has been cautioned to honor. A dog cannot be heeled into its honor. Once the dog has established its honor, the handler may collar the dog to prevent interference with the pointing dog when the bird is flushed. But, remember, the dog must clearly demonstrate its honoring before it can be collared.

In Master hunting tests, the Regulations state that "a dog requiring restraint, either physical or verbal, while establishing an honor cannot receive a Qualifying score."

In a callback for an honor, the Judges should also make every effort to use as the pointing dog one which was entered in the test being judged. Ideally, a dog that requires a retrieve in order to complete the test level should be used to point and retrieve in front of another dog that requires an honor. In the event there is no dog that requires a retrieve, a "set up dog" must be selected to point and retrieve. This dog shall not be considered under judgment. This may not always be possible and, in those cases where it is impossible, the Judges must select a suitable dog.

#### APPENDIX, TRACKING COLLARS

New Page 38. The use of the tracking collar at a recognized hunting test at the sole discretion of the host club. The hunting test premium shall state if tracking collars are allowed. If the premium list does not specifically state tracking collars are allowed, they are then prohibited.

Only AKC – approved models may be used. The owner/ handler is responsible for providing the tracking collar if he or she wishes to use a tracking device.

The regulations for the use of a tracking collar are as follows:

- The radio transmitter placed on the dog is to weigh no more than five (5) ounces.
- If a handler elects to use the transmitting collar on his or her dog, only one other identification — type collar is permitted to be on the dog. The tracking collar shall remain on the dog during the entire heat; if a handler elects to remove the tracking collar, that dog shall be considered out of judgment.
- The handheld receiver shall be kept in the possession of the judges or the marshall only.
- The handheld locating receiver can only be used after the dog is determined to be out of judgment.
- The use of the tracking collar is elective and for no reason should the running be held up due to the lack of available equipment.
- Tracking collars are not allowed in a call back for a retrieve or honor.
- Any person using a locating receiver to locate a dog currently in judgment and prior to official authorization of its use by one of the judges, shall disqualify the dog in that stake and the offenders shall be disqualified from that hunting test.
- Special Training Collars used to control and train dogs including but not limited to collars with prongs, electronic collars used with transmitters, muzzles and head collars may not be used on dogs at AKC events, except as allowed in the AKC Rules, Regulations, and Policies.

#### Raising Event Service Fees Frequently Asked Questions

#### Q: Why is the AKC raising Event Service Fees again?

**A:** In 2002, the AKC Board of Director's Business Committee began an analysis of AKC's financial health which included hiring independent consultants to review our operations. The consultants concluded that departments involved with sanctioning AKC events were not self-sufficient and as a result a huge drain on the bottom line. They recommended increasing the fees for these events from \$.50 – where it had been for decades – to \$3. However, the cost of administering events entails much more that recording results.

After consultation with the Delegates, it was decided to phase in the recommended increase in stages rather than have such a large increase all at once thus placing a huge burden on exhibitors. As a result, a new \$1.50 Event Service Fee was instituted in addition to the existing \$.50 Recording Fee. The new Event Service Fee went into effect in January 2004.

Since that time, there have been no further increases. However, the overall cost to sanction events has cost AKC approximately \$10 million each year for the past two years alone. During the October 2006 meeting, the Board discussed raising the Event Service Fee in 2008 to keep pace with inflation as well as move towards the recommended \$3 fee. This increase has now been approved, effective January 1, 2008.

#### Q: What's the difference between the Recording Fee and the Event Service Fee?

**A:** Historically, all AKC events had only a Recording Fee per first entry. The first Recording Fee of \$.25 per entry was instituted in 1949. In 1983, a second increase was made raising the Recording Fee per first entry to \$.50. Neither of these fees kept pace with inflation and so in 2004, the new Event Service Fee of \$1.50 was added to only those events which had a \$.50 Recording Fee.

#### Q: Why can't AKC continue to subsidize events?

A: In the past, a majority of this subsidy came from registration income. Registrations are still declining and even with the \$5 increase in the registration fee earlier this year, it will not be enough to offset the current events operation shortfall. In order to maintain the financial health of the AKC, and remain competitive in today's climate of competing registries, nearly 30 to date, we no longer have the luxury of depending on registration dollars to subsidize events. These events will still be heavily subsidized, just not to the same degree as they have been in the past.

#### Q: Are there any entries that will not require a recording fee or event service fee?

**A:** Any entry that is not recorded towards a title will not carry a recording fee or event service fee. There is no recording fee or event service fee for junior showmanship classes, sweepstakes entries, futurities, brace/team, multi-dog classes, nor for any special attractions. Obedience non-regular classes are not recorded and as such require no recording fee/event service fee.

#### Q: What events will now have a higher Event Service Fee?

**A:** Effective January 1, 2008 Event Service Fees on all AKC events will be \$3 for the first entry and \$3 for each additional entry, except for second entries in Field Trials and Hunting Tests, which will be \$1.50 as of January 1, 2008 and \$3 as of January 1, 2009. This will be in addition to the existing \$.50 Recording Fee. Events with a \$3.00 Recording Fee will not have a first entry increase. See chart below for further explanation.

Currently, the Recording Fee for Agility is \$3 for the first entry and \$1 for each additional entry. The \$1 Recording Fee per additional entry in Agility will be replaced with a \$3 Event Service Fee per additional entry. Coonhound, Rally, Earthdog and Lure Coursing events currently have a \$3 Recording Fee for the first entry. All remaining AKC events have a \$.50 Recording Fee for the first entry.

## **Finding Finey**

The Idaho Field trials are held at grounds high in the Owyhee region - a remote expanse sprawling over nearly 9 million acres where Idaho, Nevada and Oregon join. Named for some natives of Hawaii who perished there during a fur trapping expedition in 1819, Owyhee is an early spelling of Hawaii. The land consists of rugged rim rock ridges, snowcapped mountains, deep rhyolite canyons and vast areas of sage and grasslands. The area is home to deer, elk, bighorn sheep, coyotes, cougar and rattlesnakes. In the fall, the area turns cold and winds how! through the rim rock.

It was a cool, damp, breezy morning on September 29th at the Idaho Brittany Club's (IBC) Fall 2007 field trial held at Mile Marker 9 in Marsing, Idaho. The weather was perfect for dogs, handlers and horses alike when the Open All Age stake started. In the seventh brace, FC/AFC Jalo's Running Josephine (Chick's Blaze'n Sawtooth Sam x Top Knot Annie Ban-Dee) was poised to put down another memorable performance, having many wins on these grounds over the past decade. Owner/handler Jim House was contemplating retiring the 10 year old "Finey" (pronounced Fee Nee) after the trial. At the break away, Finey put down her usual spectacular race running far to the front and high up on the hill where she knew chukars could be found. At approximately 7 minutes she was seen near the top of the mountain to the east. Instead of returning to the course, she continued over the top and was not seen again. At past events, Finey had run off in similar fashion, and later returned to camp after being judged out of contention. Everyone thought that this would be the outcome this time. Finey was wearing a Tracker collar, and Jim and others were able to pick up the signal from high points on the grounds.

By late afternoon on Saturday, Finey had not returned. Roger Borine and Jim Hammett drove the area adjacent to the course to try to recover her on horseback and by vehicle. They could pick up the signal from her tracking collar but she was in a remote area and attempts to recover her failed. Tom White, working independently, searched the canyons in the area north along Highway 95. Although he received a weak signal to the east from near the Field trail grounds, his search in the canyons to the north, and along the southern perimeter, were not successful.

By the Sunday morning break away, Finey still had not returned and attempts to pick up the signal from the tracking collar now were unsuccessful. Steve Ball, Ron Dunagan and others drove to high points but no signal from the tracking collar was received. Finey was now seriously lost and the weather report was not encouraging. High winds, cold temperatures and heavy rain were expected and Sunday night the weather hit.

Sunday evening, Ron Dunagan made contact with Ken Barber, President of Tracker Radio Systems, and asked for his assistance. Ken is a member and past President of IBC. He packed up receivers, antennas and other communications gear plus an ATV to aid in the search on Monday.

Arriving at 8:00 AM to consult with Jim House, Larry Sandusky, Ron Dunagan and David Kirk, Ken found the weather to be a major concern. It was cold, damp and enough rain had fallen to make all but the best roads impassable. Ken and Larry drove to the Mile Marker 7 road and covered the area to the South to see if they could pick up a signal. They

stopped at several spots along the road, and Ken took the ATV to the top of Flat Top Butte (5828') to no avail.

The two returned to camp, and a crestfallen Jim House made the tough decision to return home to Oregon to monitor his phone should someone pick up the dog and try to contact him. Larry and Ron hauled club equipment and their gear home and agreed to search on Tuesday if there was no success on Monday afternoon.


Ken contacted David Kirk and they decided to spend the afternoon searching to the north. After driving around for several hours on all the passable roads they could find, Ken and David reviewed the maps and determined that her most likely location was the West Fork of Squaw Creek and Little Hardtrigger Creek drainages. Late in the afternoon they separated. David spent the remainder of the time trying to find roads into the area as well as searching some additional new area on the Hardtrigger drainage. No signal from the collar was heard.

While unsuccessful in hearing the collar, the Monday search activities did rule out the area to the south, west and north of the grounds. This left the area to the East of the Mile Marker 9 grounds to be searched. In setting a plan of action for Tuesday, Larry, Ron and David decided to split up to access the area from two different points. Armed with David's Tracker Maxima (standard issue) and a second Maxima with a long range antenna, provided by Tracker, they put their plan in motion.

Tuesday morning the weather was much improved, and the rugged roads that were "gumbo" the day before were now passable but still extremely rugged. The search crew formulated a communication plan to ensure that their efforts were coordinated and hopefully narrowing the search area. David planned to enter from the North and Larry and Ron from the North East. The group agreed to talk every 30 minutes either by cell phone or FRS radio.

David received a weak signal at 10:45 AM and tried to contact Larry and Ron — leaving a message on Larry's cell phone. At 11:45 AM, Larry and Ron working together were elated to receive a weak signal from the collar from a high point. Later, as they converged, Ron called on the radio saying that they could see David's truck. They agreed to meet up to search together. While the searchers were encouraged by the presence of a strong signal they were also concerned that the collar was now in low battery mode and the dog appeared to be stationary much of the time. Could a coyote or cougar be dragging her or was she just tired and resting? Clearly they had to act quickly before the battery totally died and they had no way to track her.

After comparing the bearings they received, the group decided to proceed south along a muddy, rugged road through the Shares Basin into the West Fork of Squaw Creek, a narrow creek bottom between two ridges rising roughly 3,500 feet above the searchers. As tensions grew they continued tracking and were encouraged by getting a stronger and stronger signal from the collar. Soon they were proceeding along the rugged Squaw Creek stream bed. At one point David stopped as the signal bearing indicated that the collar was directly above

him on the hill. Larry and Ron continued on but turned back abruptly after they realized that they were getting further away.

David started climbing the hill with leash in hand as well as his Tracker receiver. He called and whistled for her, but no dog appeared. After clearing a small bluff he had an open view of the hillside and the signal was so strong that David turned off the receiver and started searching visually. Soon he saw a small white object on the sage covered slope about 200 yards above him. David called and whistled but got no movement. He then climbed the steep slope, and soon could make out the orange and white coat. Finey sat there watching him with a scared look until he reached his hands around her and she broke into a Brittany wiggle with her tail beating furiously. David checked her for injuries but found only very raw paw pads. He gave her a dog biscuit, which she wolfed down, and radioed to Larry that he "got her."

David carried her down the steep hill and met up with Larry and Ron on the way to the truck. Once at the vehicle, they gave her some food and water and headed for home, excited to spread the word that Finey had been found.

David called Jim House to give him the good news. Jim was elated, and said that he had lost hope that he would see Finey again when he left on Monday. The good news spread quickly through the Oregon and Idaho Brittany Clubs and calls were coming in from members thanking the searchers for their success and persistence. That night at the IBC monthly meeting, there were high fives all around as the club celebrated the recovery of a rare dog of phenomenal ability.

Several of the searchers had additional motivation. Ron and Ken own dogs that are also out of DC Chick's Blaze'n Sawtooth Sam and David's puppy (Riley) is out of Finey. Recovering Riley's mom was very special for David and his wife Arlette.

In commenting about the search, Tracker President, Ken Barber, reviewed the factors that contributed to its success. "First and foremost, there was a good plan. There was heavy use of maps, and areas that were covered without hearing the collar were eliminated from the search. That made it much easier to concentrate on the remaining area. Secondly, several of the team members had considerable experience with tracking, and one member (Ron Dunagan) had Search and Rescue experience as a career Paramedic.

Finally, they were persistent — not willing to give up until Finey was recovered." Others pointed out that the only way Finey was found is that her owner was diligent in putting a tracking collar on her, even though she was running on familiar grounds.

Jim called all the searchers to thank them for their effort. "I owe a debt of gratitude to everyone that helped in this recovery and also to Tracker that provided equipment and assistance looking for my dog." For the Oregon Brittany Club, Roger Borine offered "Tenacity and Tracker saved Finey. Those Idaho guys had a plan, equipment and a no quit attitude. My hat is off to them."

Jim House confirmed that Finey is "officially" retired. She can now pass the rest of her days in the company of a relieved owner. Furthermore, her many admirers and supporters will not have to remember her as the dog that never returned from her last field trial.

#### Tips for finding a lost dog

Do you have a plan to find your dog if/when it becomes lost?

#### **Equipment:**

Detailed maps of the area

Radios/Cell phones

Several available tracking receivers (assuming the dog has a tracking collar)

A long range antenna may be helpful if searching in remote or mountainous areas

Dog food, water, leash, first aid kit

#### 10 Step Search procedure:

A tracking collar on your dog is the best insurance you have to find your dog. Rather than being left to guess what your dog may be doing or thinking, you can perform a systematic search, and hone in on his or her location.

- If the signal is not heard from camp, form a search crew, consult maps and devise your plan.
- Break up into several groups, each with a tracking receiver, cell phone or radio, and start covering the area by horseback, vehicle, ATV or foot.
- 3. Develop a communication plan with numbers or radio channels and when to report.
- 4. Have volunteers search allotted areas and report back.
- Seek high points, such as hilltops to "listen" for the collar.
- When checking for the transmitter signal, keep in mind the potential for frequency drift. Check

above and below the labeled collar frequency.

- 7. Eliminate areas where no signal is heard from your search.
- 8. Focus additional searches (if no signal is heard) in areas not covered.
- Once the signal is heard take bearings from multiple locations (triangulation) to reduce search area.
- io. Continue to refine the search until the dog is found.

# 2007 Western Brittany All Age Championship

An oft-used expression in Idaho is that "if you don't like the weather, just stick around and it will change". So went the 2007 Brittany All Age Championship, which enjoyed a 23-dog field on magnificent high desert country with highly variable weather.

The course itself breaks away on rolling sagebrush flats, with the dogs quickly heading towards desert rim rock which rises about 1200 feet from the breakaway. Cover is primarily basalt rock, sagebrush, bunchgrass, wild rye and cheat grass, with occasional stands of bitterbrush. Some rock formations are 100 to 150 feet tall with little vegetation, a favorite of climbing chukars. It's tough country and a challenge for horses, even if they're in good shape. Judges June McConnell and Bob Showalter brought 4 good solid horses and needed them. Bird planting required at least 3 horses per day.

#### THE WINNERS

The Champion SHADY'S TIA MARIA, handled by Jimmy Berneathy gave an exceptional all age performance with a limb find at the very top of the mountain, located by her scout. Her intensity, style and form were described by the judge as magnificent. Her find was a scene of beauty in itself, with the dog showing against blue sky among red rocks.

Runner-Up Champion TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO, handled by Tom White, also delivered an exceptional all age performance, and also had a limb find in high rocks located by the scout. Her intensity, style and form were described as perfect and her manners exemplary. The top two dogs were braced together and ran in warm weather, delivering an exceptional race despite the temperature.

3rd Place - BLUE WATER GUNS A BLAZEN, handled by Wayne Down, put down another exceptional all age performance, described the judges as of a caliber than could garner a Championship title on any given day.

4th Place - TERRA'S CABO WABO, also handled by Tom White, gave a consistently forward race with notable casts in the last half that garnered the respect of the judges, and he displayed impeccable manners on his birds.

The Judges also awarded a Judges' Award of Merit to SAWTOOTH SAM'S IV RUNNER.

The Idaho Brittany Club congratulates the placed dogs and thanks all who participated in the 2007 Western Brittany All Age Championship. The grounds are challenging and the weather was highly variable, but spirits remained high throughout and sportsmanship prevailed throughout. We are particularly grateful to judges June McConnell and Bob Showalter for their high level of expertise and expert performance under often adverse conditions.

Both dogs break to the left toward the mountain in a brisk wind, clear skies and very green scenery. A somewhat slow start for both dogs, they split to left and right to the front. As we work our way up just below the first rocky benches, Jose is briefly lost but found on point at 15 and is though clean. At 20, Jimmy calls point and waits for Judge McConnell, as Jose stands amid mixed sage & rock; bird is flushed

with thrown hat, handled nicely. At 24 River is called on point and handles a single chukar cleanly. At 25 Jose's scout Brandon Jones is sent to rim rock to search while Ed is working well to the front as River runs the rocky hillside. Jose is spotted by Marilynne Little standing point in heavy sage and Jimmy is directed to Jose. Extended search is declared nonproductive, with Clem Little believing he saw wild quail go out earlier. At 35, on a strong forward cast, Jose found on point again, handling the bird nicely. Jose missed 2 water tanks, so is watered from the horse and then runs somewhat shorter than earlier. At 42, well to the front, River has a second bird and after handling it cleanly, breaches manners and is picked up. Jose makes a good cast at 45, after visiting water, has an excellent finish on a rocky knob in Big Valley, and time is called as he is brought to hand.

Brace 2: FC LANE'S END JESS N TIME (Wayne Down) & ROCKING RM JOSE'S RED BALL (Paul Doiron)

Cast away with good breeze and both dogs out of sight quickly. Scouts Roger Borine & Peggy Doiron sent uphill at 6, as neither dog has been spotted since shortly after breakaway. Wayne points out Paul's dog standing stylishly at 7. The bird is flushed, Red handles it nicely and is collared away. Although the temperature is rising, we're still benefiting from cloud cover and both handlers are working hard with these dogs. Neither handler in contact with dogs at 25, scouts are dispersed widely, working thru mostly sage and headed for rocky canyons with no dogs in sight. Contact reestablished with bottom dog, at 30, running big & hard in flat area. Takes Wild quail are ridden up by gallery, not far from Jose's earlier nonproductive. Wayne's dog has been declared lost. Red breaks strongly up to the right, then cuts very quickly to front at 43, posing a challenge to handler and scout. Red is seen again at the top of the next ridge and recovered right at time.

Brace 3: DC/AFC/2xAmFld CH REDLINE'S TEQUILA SMOKER (Paul Doiron) & HIDEAWAY HANK (Roger Borine)

Cast away into steady wind with the overcast clearing and temperatures rising, so we need a steady wind. Both dogs off to a good start, and out of sight. As we climb into the lower rocks, Hank is out of sight at 25. After a good start, Smokey slows and is picked up at 35. Hank is covering a lot of ground and being spotted only occasionally, but is observed sweeping down a big rocky ridge at top speed, leaving scout Joe Waitman behind in rough rocks. At 50, Wayne's lost dog Jess turns up, happy to be relocated. Hank makes a big move to the top of the West ridge at Big Valley, and scout Joe has yet another big climb before finding him making an impressive cast off the top and into the valley at 60, when time was called without bird contact.

Brace 4: FC KOLICKO'S CUERVO JOKER (Jimmy Berneathy) & FC/AFC TJ'S APACHE (Ed Tillson)

Both dogs break away straight to the front and at 8 both scouts are out to the right, with Jessica Carlson returning at 9. Four sage grouse fly overhead at 10, flushed by scout Brandon Jones. Bandit comes downhill at the front at high speed, a move duplicated seconds later by CJ. Ed dismounts at 14 to water Bandit as temperatures continue to rise under clear skies. CJ hits a water barrel at 19 and continues with Jimmy. At 25 we lose much of our breeze and conditions get much warmer. Bandit is seen headed for Ed and water at 32, near the dry pond. At 35 Jimmy rides up higher on the mountain, and calls his dog out to the front. Bandit slows and is watered again at 40. At 44 a bird is ridden up accidentally, but Bandit handles a 2nd bird fine. Both dogs make big casts across flats, with CJ going way out and before he is recovered at time, his horse stumbles with Brandon Jones, who sustains a sprained ankle, but is otherwise ok.

Brace 5: TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD (Ed Tillson) & CHIEF'S GUNNER (Brandon Jones)

Strong cast away after lunch with good breeze and slightly cooler conditions than last brace. Blizzard moves strongly uphill & to the front, gaining a ridge on us by 15, as Ed calls him out crossing the top. Blizzard is watered at 20, as Gunner runs well to the front, moving

uphill. Blizzard slows, then moves crisply to the top of the same hill. Gunner is watered at 25, and at 26 the recorder's big horse eases Marilynne's out of the way as the trail narrows, with mild verbal assault following. Gunner moves to rocks well above handler, heads back away and opts to ignore handler for a time. Blizzard takes water again while Gunner breaks for the rim rock, sending Scout Jimmy on a long, rocky ride. Blizzard goes forward at reduced range, while Brandon works very hard to pull Gunner forward before he makes a good move forward in the 2nd tier of high rocks. Blizzard is picked up at 46. Gunner makes some very big casts, but control is elusive and he finishes a considerable distance away, nearing the Oregon border. Judge Showalter summarizes that it was pretty, but the string broke at 29.

Brace 6: NFC/DC/AFC 5xAmFld CH SHADY'S TIA MARIA (Jimmy Berneathy) & DC/AFC TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO (Tom White)

As we cast away it is warm, but a steady breeze is developing and both dogs break to the left, into the sagebrush and over the ridge. Emme is observed moving hard to the left, Tia wide right and at the top. The wind increases at the ridge top and Tia crosses to the left and back again. Emme is not in sight, and as Tom rides forward off a steep area, scout Margaret calls point at 8 on the summit. At the very top in rocks and bitterbrush, Emme has a beautiful find in high style. 4 chukars are flushed and Emme displays excellent intensity and confidence. Meantime, Tia has moved rapidly to the front and is establishing the pace. Emme casts away strongly down the hill and crosses the bottom at 11. We ride quite some time between sightings of these two competitors, but both show periodically and Tia is observed well forward at 12:00 running very hard and going up into high rim rock, forcing Jimmy and Brandon to ride up. Emme then makes her move into the rim rock at her first opportunity, also forcing Tom & Margaret up. Scouts are widely dispersed at 35, Emme being found on point by her scout at 39. After a clean relocation, a single bird is flushed to exemplary style and steadiness. At 43, Tia is found on point by her scout at the top of the mountain, and after a long climb, Jimmy's horse slows and he walks the last 100 yards. Judge McConnell joins and is struck by Tia's beautiful style against the red rock and blue sky. The bird is flushed cleanly and after a short breather, Tia is cast away downhill. As the cloud cover increases, the last part of this brace is favored with cooling conditions. Tia and Emme both move powerfully to the front, Emme remaining high and Tia dropping lower. Tia is again called on point at 58, handling a pair of chukars with style, and Emme is pulled off the high ridge as time is called.

#### DAY TWO

Brace 7: DC/AFC TERRA'S CABO WABO (Tom White) & TUCALOTA'S RUNNING REVA (Ed Mayhew)

Weather conditions are cool, with overcast, a very light rain, and breeze, overall much better conditions than yesterday. Sammy and Reva break away to the front, going up the first rise crisply and working uphill. Ed calls Reva into water barrel at 12. Both dogs are watered at 18, then go toward the ridge at the front on strong casts. Under light rain, Reva moves along well under the rim rock, Sam moves very quickly downhill. Sam out of sight at 25, and scout Margaret works ridgeline for its good view. Sam located in sagebrush flats, and Tom brings toward hillside. Both dogs spotted on low ridge at 28, then Sam observed running in lower areas again at 32. Reva uphill strongly at 40, turned by Ed. Sammy clears midcourse road and found on point at 42, where a pair of chukars are flushed cleanly in continuing rain. Sam is found on point again at 50, near dry creek bed and handles the bird with style. The chukar flies near Reva, whose breach of manners ends her brace early. Sam is cast away toward the last uphill portion of the course, and is out of sight very quickly. After a strong run, Sam is still out of sight at 59, to the worry of many, but is finally pulled in right after time is called.

Brace 8: SHADY'S THE PRICE IS RIGHT (Paul Doiron) & SHADY'S BEANSTALK (Jimmy Berneathy)

The rain has stopped, overcast remains as the dogs break away, Steele over the ridge and Jack taking time to cross the creek. At 7 minutes both dogs are out front as the gallery passes the first water tank. At 14 jack is called on point partway up the hill and the bird is handled well and with style. Heading toward the steeper hills on course, both dogs are to the front and both handlers in control. Steele is out of sight at 24, is then spotted by scout Peggy and is handled forward. A quiet brace with occasional sightings of the two dogs take us to the 41 minute mark, where Steele makes a huge move downhill and out into sagebrush flats at about 600 yards while Jack works the hillside at about 150 yards. Steele is observed at 48 on a stop to flush on a lower ridge. Jack is called on point at 51, as he waits for the judge to arrive. After an extended attempt, Jack relocates nicely, but no bird can be produced and Jimmy elects to take a nonproductive at 55. Steele finishes high on the ridge as time is called.

Brace 9: REDLINE'S TEQUILA MOON (Paul Doiron) & FC GUNRUNNER'S LADY'S MAN (Jimmy Berneathy)

Both dogs break straight to the front and the Taq makes big cast to the left, forcing Paul to pull him to the front at 5. Loot found at point at 8 on a chukar in mixed sage & rock on the hillside, handling it beautifully. The brace continues forward through the lower rocks with Loot being seen periodically, but no contact with Taq for an extended period of time. Taq deemed lost at 28. At 35 Loot is seen ahead of handler, running shorter than earlier before making a move up over the ridge top and eluding Jimmy and Brandon. Loot is finally located at 50, on a distant ridge that requires considerable riding on the scout's part and causes him to fall behind. He's brought forward as time is called. Bird planter reports his high cast had netted a point, but no one found him until after the bird had moved on, sadly. Taq was found later during brace 12, tired and wet but ok.

Brace 10: FC BLUEWATER GUNS A BLAZEN (Wayne Down) & FC/AFC MEGASMOKE LIMITED EDITION (Paul Doiron)

The dogs are off to a big start as Gunner breaks straight out and Ted is partially concealed by sagebrush as crosses in front. At 2, Gunner breaks to the right, running quite big and going out of sight until the scout locates him and he clears the top of the hill and runs down through the Big Valley aiming for the next hill, putting him at least one ridge away from us. Ted has not shown since early. The wind is at our backs this brace unlike the last one, where the rain was in our faces. Paul rides high on the hilltop in search of Ted at 11. Gunner crosses another ridge and goes out of sight, into the wind, a handling challenge. Gunner is observed well to the front, moving left to right at 13, and Wayne works hard to keep him going forward instead of directly into the wind. At 17 Gunner pulls off a big lateral, makes a good move forward and again flirts with the wind before sweeping forward in a very big move at 20. Ted declared lost and both judges follow Gunner at 25. Gunner observed running downhill and shoots forward on a big move to the front at 30. At 42 Wayne calls point uphill after Ed Tillson points out his dog in a gesture of sportsmanship. A long attempt at flushing the bird shows the dog is very steady with excellent style and intensity. Gunner is cast away, and after some lateral work makes a good move forward, running down a ridgeline at 50, was then observed running the top at 55 and finished to the front. Ted was found during the next brace.

Brace 11: REDLINES TEQUILA TWIST (Paul Doiron) & FC BLUEWATER PINK (Wayne Down)

Both dogs are cast away in the rain and then pulled forward from big left lateral casts, are back out in front at 10 and working uphill. Pink is picked up at 15 after a modest run. Twister makes a strong move up into the rocks, and once located returns nearly all the way to Paul, follows him briefly and then casts back uphill again. Twister is pulled in for water at 18. At 25, Twister is seen at 25 in gun dog range, makes a move into the rocks and is watered again at 26, then picked up. The rain increases sharply as we cross midpoint of the course, headed for

the End and the dog wagon, then suddenly turns to painful hail. On wet and unhappy horses, we are finally grateful for mere rain and for the last brace.

Brace 12: FC SAWTOOTH SAM'S IV RUNNER MH (Ed Tillson)

Runner broke away in rain straight to the front on a strong start and into the wind. The rain increases steadily, making it a very wet brace which Runner doesn't seem to notice. A very crisp performance has Runner popping into view 3 times along the first ridgeline, about every couple of minutes. He makes a big move to the front at 8, attacking the next ridge and is observed running the top, to the front, at 16. Runner is seen at 12:00, running a lower ridge, clearing it and turning straight to the front at 20. This pattern is repeated at the next big ridgeline at 25, a beautiful piece of work. At 30 Runner is observed uphill, working higher rock ledges before going out of sight. At 38 Runner is seen again on a forward ridgeline. The rain starts to let up at 40, mercifully. Under challenging conditions, Runner is delivering with heart and courage, and then is found on point at 48. With excellent style, Runner stands the first bird and then steps forward to watch a second bird fly. Cast off at 50, Runner finishes strongly to the front when time is called.




