



RAISING AND TRAINING THE NEW PUPPY

So you just got your new Brittany puppy. It is, of course, the best puppy that ever was and will grow up to be the greatest Brittany in breed history. It will be a national winner in both field and show – the ultimate dual champion.

Well maybe so, but even if it falls short of these high expectations every Brittany can and should become your best companion and hunting partner. And believe me, this is a bond that cannot be beat.

But there are a few things that can help in bringing up a Brittany puppy. First, remember that it is a puppy, and its training should be slow and easy. Besides its physical needs, a puppy also requires love and security. It needs to bond with you and have a positive exposure to the world at large. A critical learning period for a puppy is from 8 to 12 weeks, but at this early age be sure that all sessions are very short in duration.

Training your young Brittany to move with the natural, flowing gait of the breed is important if it is to have a career in the show ring. Start out a Brittany puppy with a small, soft, favorite toy in his mouth while he gaits beside you on a *loose* lead. Make the session fun; don't jerk or drag the lead. You can thus establish a way of going and a naturally elegant head carriage that will put him in good stead in later years. Nothing looks worse than a Brittany running around the ring too fast on a tight leash with his head pulled back over his shoulder, causing him to flail his front legs.

Remember it is much easier to train the right way of doing this

than it is to correct it later.

Puppies must learn to think for themselves. We must carefully expose them to their world and then allow them to build up the self-confidence so critical to a good bird dog.

Brittanys can be started running afield at a very early age. Again, make the early sessions short, and *never* put a very small puppy down in heavy cover. Start with the lawn or a mowed field, and try to keep the puppy in front of you and having fun investigating the great outdoors. If he gets scared, bored, or overtired, he could develop a dislike for what should be his greatest fun adventure. As he grows bigger and gains both muscles and security, expand his horizons. Go slow-it will be better for him in the long run.

It is best to first expose a young – puppy to game birds with only a bird's wing on a fishing line. Then progress to live birds. His interest in birds will develop as he grows up.

A Brittany puppy can be taught to retrieve at an early age. Remember, make it a short distance and only a few throws at anyone time. Always quit before he is bored or tired.

Do not teach a Brittany puppy to sit. Teaching a pointing breed to sit as a youngster invariably causes trouble down the road when a confused Derby sits on point. If you want to compete in obedience competition, don't begin training the *sit* command until your Brittany has been well introduced to birds and locks up on point staunchly.

Please don't be in too much of a hurry for your Brittany to grow up. Puppyhood is both a challenge and a delight. Enjoy it.

ABC Hall of Fame Inductees

Wade Haines



Wade Haines of Ohio was elected in 2006 and inducted in 2007 into the American Brittany Club Hall of Fame. Wade is a member of the Buckeye Brittany Club and an associate of the Illinois Brittany Club. He is also a member of the Michigan and Illinois Championship Associations. Wade is one of those individuals who is the epitome of a true gentleman of the sport of field trialing. He can be found riding almost every brace at a field trial and usually, if not handling his own dog, will be scouting for someone else. When any club needs a helping hand, Wade is there to offer help. His after trial "medicine" has become a tradition and some think the secret for health and longevity.

Wade has long been an avid Grouse hunter. He first joined the ABC in 1972. His most notable dog was FC Missouri Magic. He has owned 5 field champions and trials on a regular basis in the East Central, Central, and Midwest Regions.

Wade is one of those quiet individuals who for many years has served not only regional clubs and championship associations but has also served the National Club as the East Central Dates Coordinator. While not relying on a computer but still using his typewriter, Wade is always the first to supply the ABC with his date schedule, always giving not only the current season but the one to follow. Each time a change is made, he sends out a newly revised schedule for those concerned without any prompting from anyone else. His method is an example for all dates coordinators to follow. He has kept conflicts to a minimum but has been able to coordinate with clubs whose grounds problems have arisen. He has earned the respect of all those who work with him in his capacity as a dates coordinator as well as those who are privileged to trial with him throughout the year.

Dr. Gordon Theilen



A few years ago one of the top field trial Pointers died as a result of cancer. He was 8 years old. This year, 2006-2007, that Pointer was elected to the Field Trial Hall of Fame. Dr. Gordon Theilen has been one of the leading disciples of the study of small animal oncology. He has studied veterinary oncology, taught at UC Davis, and is the author of leading texts on veterinary oncology. He is known throughout the country for this work. The work goes on! Gordon is "part of an effort to find solutions to better understand and prevent leading inherited defects, cancer and other genetic diseases through DNA studies." We cannot afford to lose such good young dogs! These studies have the promise that the future will be brighter than the past. Gordon was an initiator of the multi-million dollar UC Center for Companion Animal Health. This center is "committed to being an internationally recognized center for health studies of companion animals."

In 2004 Gordon and the Marv Nelson family established the Nelson Endowment Fund for DNA studies to be conducted at UC Davis. "This fund is intended to be used for research on health and genetics problems of Brittanys and results will be distributed through the Center for Companion Animal Health."

As a field trialer, Gordon founded the Western Brittany All-Age Championship in 1999. Subsequently, he helped organize the Western Region Gun Dog Championship. He has judged many field trials, including the Weimaraner and Irish Setter Nationals, and 2003 ABC Gun Dog Championship. Gordon embodies the betterment of bird dogs through his contributions to field trialing, breed selection, and research in health and genetics. For over 30 years he has spent countless hours guiding and advising hundreds of persons both new and established, in breeding, training, and trialing dogs.

Joan Donnell



Joan Donnell was elected to the ABC Hall of Fame in 2006. Due to her husband's Bob's illness, she was unable to be at the awarding of her plague at the 2007 nationals.

She has been a member of the ABC since 1966, first as a member of the Washington Club and after living for a time in Pennsylvania returned to the West Coast and joined the Whid Isle club of which she is still an active member.

In 1967, she chaired the first sanctioned Match for the WBC and the club begin holding licensed shows after their seconded sanctioned match. While in the WBC, husband Bob was secretary-treasurer for most of the next 2 years

during which time she was able to learn the ins and outs of the Brittany world with lots of help from Nicky Bissell, ABC Secretary. Life in the Brittany world continued on with many activities being chaired by either herself or Bob.

In 1976, Bob was sent to the Boeing Plant in PA for 3 years. During this time

she reports that they were lucky enough to have a dog win the OAA Nationals at Ardmore. Knowing very few folks in Pennsylvania, their celebration was taking their bottle of wine to the Blue Goose Inn a mile or so down the road. Fortunately we had friends on the West Coast who had not forgotten them and the phone rang until 2 AM the next morning. She says, "We happened to own the first West Coast Brittany that was bred, owned, trained and campaigned on the left coast."

Since 1980, she has been Secretary-Treasurer of the Whid Isle Club with just a couple of years off during the 80's. Since that also entailed being Field Trial and Hunt Test Secretary, life has not been boring. They have bred a few litters but do not consider themselves breeders. The Dual Ch they owned produced 2 litters with a total of 7 field champions, one of which was also a Dual.

On a national level, Joan has helped with some of the West Coast Futurities and has been Secretary of the Chukar Classic. She has served on the National Auction Committee and the Nominating Committee for National Directors. She has always been on hand to help count ballots, work with the auction, or lend assistance with the activities on the Dog Wagon at Booneville. She has served on the Statistics

Committee for the ABC and contributed to the National Yearbook. She has worked with the North West Field Trial Council and has been a participant at Sports Shows helping to recruit new members for both the Whid Isle Club and the ABC. Thank you Joan for over 40 years of service to the ABC.

He was truly a great all age Brittany with 26 one-hour placements including 10 firsts. With 60 total placements, he defeated over 1400 dogs while being campaigned by Chad Holman. His record of performance and production are outstanding. Ajax had a reputation for his powerful, wide ranging ground race and intense style on his game. His run was smooth, consistent and reliable. Ajax was always competitive and the stake was never over until Ajax ran. He passed a lot of these wonderful traits to his get along with an incredible temperament.

To his credit are his wins at the 1995 ABC Pheasant Classic, 1997 Lee Holman Classic, 1997 International Brittany Championship, 1997 Jim Holman Classic, 1998 Illinois Brittany Championship, 1998 Lee Holman Classic, 1998 Michigan Brittany Championship and 2002 Illinois Brittany Championship. He was Runner-Up at the 1996 Lee Holman Classic, 1997 Prairie State Amateur Championship, 1997 Prairie State Open Championship, 1998 International Amateur Brittany Championship, 2001 Michigan Brittany Championship and 2002 ABC Quail Classic.

Over the years Ajax was bred to many exceptional bitches. Their progeny are carrying on the Ajax legacy, the most notable being 5xCH/4xRU/FC/AFC Lane's End Bowtie Annie with 15 one-hour placements and 6 firsts. His record of production will continue to expand in future years as youngsters are up and coming.

He has sired to date: 7 American Field Champions, 6 Runner-Up American Field Champions, 15 Field Champions, 8 Amateur Field Champions, 3 Dual Champions, 6 Show Champions, 14 one-hour winners with a total of 73 one-hour placements, 44 field winners with over 645 total placements. TJ demonstrated that he was an extraordinary, intelligent All Age Bird Dog with exceptional endurance and an outstanding temperament, who is passing these traits on to his offspring. TJ racked up some very impressive wins throughout his career, taking Runner-Up in the prestigious Victoire Nationale, winning the 1997 US Open and taking Runner-Up there in 1996 & 2000, winning the 1997 ABC National Championship and taking Runner-Up in 2001, on his way to accumulate 26 All Age Hour wins (record holder at retirement), with 11 first place wins and over 110 field trial placements. He won or placed in the ABC Pheasant, Chicken, and Quail Championships, and also won the IAMS and Kasco Awards, presented to the #1 All Age Brittany in the nation. In addition to all this, TJ completed his Dual Champion title by going Winners Dog at the American Brittany Club summer specialty show in 1999, at nine years of age.

TJ passed on his best qualities to his offspring, as is shown through their performances, win records, and recognition of their talents and natural abilities. One can hardly pick up an American Brittany magazine without coming across one of his offspring placing in a championship or major stake. With TJ's competitive sons & daughters ranging in age from 11 down to 5 years of age as of this writing, what he has done for the Brittany world is not yet fully realized. Through February 2008 he has sired one National Field Champion, one National Amateur Field Champion, one Runner-Up National Field Champion, 6 Dual Champions, 25 Field/Amateur Field Champions, 10 American Field Champions and an additional 3 American Field Runner-Up Champions, 10 Show Champions and 22 dogs with over 150 hour wins to their credit. Fully 1/3 of the 60 field winners sired by TJ went on to win in hour stakes, and of his 25 Field Champion offspring, 21 have most or all of their wins in All Age stakes.

How to Export A Brittany

By E. W. Averill

While most of us have heard how hard it is to get a Brittany into this country from France, I'll bet very few realize how difficult it is to get one OUT of this country, at least into a Scandinavian country. I know I didn't and I thought I would write it up since somebody else might want to do it sometime and the rest of you may be amused, anyway.

It all started last February when a gentleman name Hugo Mowinckel Nilsen, of Bergen, Norway, wrote to me asking if I could get him a few Brittanies so he could get the breed started in Norway. He was barred from buying them in Europe by a rigid embargo, due to rabies. It seemed to him, reading about the breed, that they would be ideal for Artic Grouse and for Ptarmigan. I answered him, giving him prices and saying that they ought to be as good a breed as any for the birds he mentioned (not that I ever saw one... but a Brittany can do anything) and I would be happy to get some for him. He wrote back saying that they wanted three Brittanies, two bitches and a male, unrelated, so that they could start a breeding program – BUT – the Norwegian Department of Finance would under no circumstances give them dollar exchange for such a ridiculous enterprise. Would be mind being paid off in Norwegian Elkhounds, or Norwegian Bu-Hounds, or in Kroner, or something?

I read his letter to members of the Michigan Brittany Club and nobody jumped at the chance to swap a Brittany for an Elkhound so Henry Hollyoak and I agreed that we would donate three dogs to the Norwegians, as part of the Good Neighbor Policy. Henry would give a stud dog from that wonderful breeding of his that has come through so often and I would donate a couple of bitches from my

stock – for nothing. (What would we do with three Bu-Hounds, anyway? They don't point!)

So, eventually, I selected a stud-fee bitch that turned out very well. Nice markings, perfect temperament, birdy as hell; well, as good as they get, as pups. Then I phoned around and found another just as good, from entirely different bloodlines, and made a swap with the owner for one of any other stud-fee pups. So I had two good bitches, almost completely unrelated, and I thought that I had my part of the deal sewed up. But I reckned without the various government agencies involved.

First – I had to get the dogs to the vet for a physical checkup and give them their various shots and obtain an official Canine Health Certificate. Then, a Notary Public had to witness the vet's signature to prove that he really signed it. Then I had to go to the County Clerk to get a blue slip (everything in triplicate, of course) saying that the Notary really is a Notary. Then to the Norwegian Consulate for a piece of paper saying that the Count Clerk really is the County Clerk; then to the Immigration Office for a Shipper's Export Declaration Form; then to the Department of Commerce for a number to designate Live Dogs for Breeding Purposes. By now, I was fit to be tied and badly in need of a quick one on-the-rocks; but I still had one more call to make - to the Scandanavian Airlines System Offices, reservations having been made previously, to have all of the papers confirmed so that there would be no hitch at the airport.

Armed with about two pounds of papers, we showed up at the airport with our crate containing two Brittany pups and there was more red tape to go through. Northwest Airlines, which would fly the pups to Idlewild to catch the Scandanavian Airlines plane for Oslo, had to get in their share of fun. After weighing the crate with the pups inside the man had to figure out the fee (in Kroner and dollars both) and write up the list of papers attached and make, not three, but TWELVE copies of the papers. After signing my life away (by now), I was no longer reading the papers they gave me to sign) I did manage to get onto the field for free and see the pups loaded on the Stratocruiser. Ordinary people have to pay a dime to see this.

Anyway, it was a novel experience, but I'm glad it is all over. On the other hand, if Mr. Nilsen gets one-tenth as much fun out of his new Brittanies as I got out of my first Brittanies, all my time and expense will be well repaid. If he does, I know darn well that Norway will be as well-populated with Brittanies, a decade or so hence, as this country is now. After all, when I got my first one, there were just 15 registered Brits in the country. Now, there are thousands. And, one thing, the Norwegians will be starting with darn sight better specimens than the first ones sent to this continent. If they are careful, they ought to have some pretty special dogs not too many years hence. Might be worth our trouble to visit them and see how it turned out.

Minimum Age for Judges of Performance Events

We were able to enjoy a dinner with food and drink indigenous to the State of Washington. With dancing into the wee hours it was an exciting evening for all. The rest of the week was open in the evenings with dinner being served at the clubhouse by The Bearcat Too crew.



THE RUNNING:

With light rain ending after midnight the morning broke with cloudy skies, a light mist at 44 degrees.

HAVAPAL'S RENEGADE BILLY BOY, Burchette and KT'S ARTIC GLADIATOR, Holman. Both dogs started working the edges, popping to the front. At 34' Billy pointed at the edge of a treeline in the sumac. Birds were put to flight with all in order. Max worked throughout the hour but was not rewarded with any game.

JUST CALL ME ROY, Lorensen and GUNRUNNER'S LADY'S MAN, Berneathy. Away on course two, Roy was the stronger of the pair. Lute ran to the likely places for birds. We started out of the horseshoe with the handler and Lute turning right. Point was then called for Lute as he stood in a feed strip just off to our right. A nice covey was flushed with good manners. Along the woods edge on our right we see Roy standing, riding to him he moves on through the woods. Lute stopped at the beginning of the thicket where he had 2 birds flushed for him at 41'. At 46' Roy pointed in the treeline at the edge of old 109 with Lute backing. After flushing, Roy was relocated. He pinned the covey, birds flushed and was fired over. At 50' Roy pointed at the edge of a mott with Lute backing. Birds left from the far side. Both dogs exhibited good manners. At 58' point was called for Lute at the edge of the woods coming out of the 540 loop. Extensive flushing and relocation could not produce birds.

TERRA'S CABO WABO, Doiron and KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER, John. Away from the bridge with a flourish. At 5' the judge sited Lester standing high and tight in the brushy finger on our left. Birds were flushed and he stood rock solid. Sammy was making a forward move along the treeline on our right. Shortly, handler called point. He stood at the edge of the cover. Handler thrashed through the cover to flush game. Sammy maintained his composure throughout. Going to the front we see Lester on the right in a feed strip just before the creek crossing. Handler flushed a single from the cover with Lester's manners tip

top. Both dogs are headed toward the beaver dam, each being a handful and out of pocket. Sammy returned in the "big sandy" meadow just before time. Lester was returned in the grace period.

After lunch the mist has long disappeared and we even saw the sun briefly. Most of the afternoon stayed overcast with temperature in the low 50's and a light to moderate breeze.

STARLIGHT'S BLAZING SIRIUS, Burchette and T & W'S DIAMOND JIM, Wild. Each dog took to the edges off the breakaway. At 6' both dogs are traveling along the fence line to our left front. Jim was caught knocking birds, then the other dog was sighted standing in the cover. Sy was shot over and taken on. At 11' he pointed at the end of a brushy mott on our right just before the little creek crossing. A covey was flushed with all in order. He went to a hunting mode and was leashed just before we entered the cotton fields.

JENNY TWO SHOES MARJOS, Tracy and SHADY'S BEANSTALK, Berneathy. Riding across the cotton fields and looking to the left at the fence line Jenny's handler called point. We ride to her and see that she is standing high and tight. A nice sized covey is flushed and she didn't move a muscle. Jack has continued his moderate race. Jenny has run the edge on the left where we last see her. Nearing the last turn toward the bridge Jack is healed to the bridge where he is leashed. Jenny's handler has called for the tracking collar to end this brace.

WHITE MOUNTAIN SMOKE, Holman and TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO. Dorion. Crossing the bridge to course two where we break away the last brace of the day. Both dogs forward and leaning to the right hand side. Bud comes across the field and through the cut and turns left. Handler calls point as he stands in the feed strip. A nice covey is flushed as he maintains his manners. Emme is sighted pointing on our left at 9' just across the road that the dog wagon travels. She is stylish as her handler flushes birds and fires. Crossing old 109 Emme takes the left edge of the old fence line. Shortly, her handler calls point. She is standing well back from the briar thicket. Handler had difficulty getting through the cover to flush birds. This activity was viewed "up close and personal" by the dog wagon passengers. Both dogs are in and out of pocket as we travel through the horseshoe and across the parish field. At 43' point is called for Bud as he stands in the tree line at the edge of old 109, Emme is backing nicely from a distance. Birds are flushed with very good manners by both dogs. Traveling through the 540 loop, passing the bridge and the old combine, the hour ended in the second meadow along the river.

Posted dogs Day One: KT'S ARTIC GLADIATOR, GUNRUNNER'S LADY'S MAN, KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER, TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO

TEE-BONE, Lincoln and TC'S MATCH BOKS RACER, Downing. We were delayed from the eight o'clock start time. Sitting at the breakaway we watched the fog move out and just as quickly move back in. It was just another chance to visit and to tell the "remember when" stories. We left at 8:41 AM with both dogs using the outside edges of the course. We traveled along the road toward the barking dog house when the judges decided to stop the clock at 19' and gather the dogs because the fog had settled in again. We move across Lick Creek, had an early coffee break to watch the fog again move in and out. Those that had this experience a number of years ago, one of which was the current judge Ken Ruff stated that "we'll go when we can see that tall tree way up there". About 9:25 am the shout was heard. Away through the cotton fields and headed toward the Ryan field turn. Both dogs were in the cover. Tee showed on our right, went forward to cross right to left



at the far tree line. Rob worked the cover making some nice moves. We are almost to the last turn to the bridge when point is called by Tee's scout. Handler and judges ride through a long cut in the tree line headed toward the river. Tee is standing at the edge of the mowed area, pointing into taller bluestem. Handler approaches and a large covey is flushed as Tee maintained excellent manners throughout. We pass the nearby feed strip on our way back to the front. Rob has made a cast to the right just before the bridge, headed back along the river. He had no game contact in the hour. Tee has crossed toward the river and both dogs are gathered up forward along the tree line at time.

MAKE MY DAY DUDE, Tillson and DAKOTA ALLEY CAT, Tracy, Away on course two, both dogs went to the right and traveled down the woods edge on our right. Dude was methodically working the cover and Tiger was headed to the far objective. We crossed old 109 with both dogs gathered. Tiger worked on our right. He became birdy in the brushy finger. Birds had been flushed several times along here in the amateur event. He worked up the ditch toward the water hole. A small hawk was spooked from the cover carrying a quail off. Tiger stopped just short of the water hole at 24' and pointed. Handler stepped down and a single flew off. Tiger was fired over and taken on. We traveled through the horseshoe and out. Point was called for Dude at 38' as he stood in the feed strip on our right. A covey was flushed with all in order. He was released and traveled along the woods line and established point at 41'. The covey was flushed from the cover at the edge of a small thicket. Tiger has traveled along the woods edge toward old 109 making another wide reaching cast. Handler sang him through the woods between us and the bridge. He comes forward through the woods and traveled to the front through the bluestem. Dude continues his consistent race through the 540 loop. Tiger is sighted standing in thick cover on our left. Flushing throughout the small mott produced nothing. The dog is intense so the handler taps for a relocation. Tiger moves with purpose through the cover heading across the mowed area toward the tree line. He locks up in thick cover again where a small covey is put to flight as he maintains his rock solid manners to end the hour.

BLUEWATER PINK, Down and ORTHO ACRES BOOKER T, Tracy. Both dogs were energetic off the breakaway with Pink settling into a moderate race. Booker was wide from the get go requiring some scouting. He was out of pocket at 18' near Mario's Hill returning a bit later. Booker was last seen at the gas well turn. Pink pointed birds at 38'. Fired over, handler elected to leash the dog. The tracking device was called for at 40' for Booker.



SMARTEYES-JOKER, John was moved down to run with MEGASMOKE LIMITED EDITION, Doiron when the bracemates were scratched. After the morning fog delay the normal 1:00 pm breakaway was scheduled for 1:30 pm. Both dogs were using the edges, working through the meadows and along the tree lines. Ted was using the country, he had taken a tree line to the right, ridden for and returned to the front, where point was called by the handler. Ted stood rock solid at the edge of a feed strip on our right. Birds were put to flight from the heavy cover with all in order. Jordan made some nice moves along the edges occasionally returning to the handler. At 51' he pointed in the cover on our left just before the last turn toward the bridge. He was asked to relocate but nothing was produced. Ted was ridden for so that he could make the turn at the bridge. Jordan was leashed at the next tree line just before time. Ted continued forward as the hour ended.

TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD, Tillson and TEQUILA DYNAMITE, Burchette. Away on course two they took to the cover. At 17' point was called for Mike where we had to ride back to the Riblin knoll before the first old 109 crossing. A lengthy search could not produce any game. Returning to the front, we lost the forward party as the gallery remained unusually quite and hidden at the woods at the horseshoe. Blizzard was leashed and Mike was also taken to the truck at that time.

RAMBLIN MAN, Gorrow and REBEL JAC'S HAMMERING DANDY, Holman. We went into the open meadow of the back loop with both dogs hitting the far edge on our right. Randy came to the front and apparently Jac went through the woods. Randy didn't seem to have his running shoes on and was leashed. Jac showed at the exit from the horseshoe. He had to be ridden for and turned to the front. He was out of pocket at the old 109 crossing. We passed through the 540 loop when the dog returned in the bluestem field just before the bridge crossing. Jac was watered and sent on along the tree line on our left. That was the last time he was seen. The tracker was called for at 53' just before Mario's Hill.

Tuesday's posted dogs: TEE-BONE, DAKOTA ALLEY CAT, MEGASMOKE LIMITED EDITION.

Weather am... No fog so we were away at the scheduled time. It was a clear morning with the temperature about 38 degrees warming through the morning. After the rain, there are some mud puddles on the path and we begin to see the dust return.

BLUERIDGE SERGEANT AT ARMS, Wild and BRETON'S GOLD RUFFIAN, Tillson. Both dogs started at moderate range with Sarg gaining momen-

tum. Ruffy hunted the most likely places for birds, making a few nice moves along the way. He was leashed at 50'. Sarg was out of pocket before the turn at the Ryan field. The tracker was called for at the bridge.

SHADY'S TIA MARIA, Berneathy and JAKES ACRES IN DISQUISH, Gorrow. Away on course two, both dogs went to the front. Tia was checking to the handler and Jake was making stronger moves. At 29' Tia came from the front as we started off the meadow in the horseshoe. She traveled to the right back along the edge where she pointed. A small covey was flushed with all in order. The tracker was called for Jake midway through the hour. Out of the horseshoe and on toward the woods line, again point was called at 39' Tia stood at the edge of the old fence line. After a lengthy relocation nothing was produced. Around the meadow toward old 109 she traveled. Tia had another covey find and 48' along the old road with all in order. The hour ended just before the bridge.

MARJO'S RED RUM, Luisi and BRETON'S CASTLE ROCKET, John. Both dogs started with gusto. Point was called for Johnny at 5'. He was in the thicket on our left... but not for long after the birds were put to flight. Rocket was out of pocket at Mario's

Hill and returned at the creek crossing. He then gain momentum and was not returned to judgment after gas well hill.

HI PROOF WHIZKI, Gorrow and EARLY TIMES, Tracy, It has been a beautiful day for people and dogs. Sunshine, puddles on the ground and birds. This pair left the breakaway with intent. Crossing the small creek and beyond, point is called by the scout for Earl. Extensive flushing did not produce any game. Both dogs have taken to the outside edges. At 29' points is called by Whiz's scout, but we find Earl standing in the middle of a mowed strip apparently backing as the handler takes a closer look he sees his dog Whiz standing in the cover. A brief flushing attempt and the handler elects to take the dog on. At 36' point is called by Whiz's scout, along the tree line on our left. A nice covey is flushed with Whiz standing staunchly. At 37' in the tree line off to the right Earl has a find. He stood nicely through flush and shot and then his posture suffered and he was leashed. Whiz traveled along the fence line at the Balkman place where he spun and pointed at 45'. A covey was flushed from the heavy cover. Passing along the Hayden camp we see a covey lift from the end of an old feed strip at 53' Upon approach the dog did not appear to be involved as he came out of the cover near the river. Being sent on he worked the cover around the deadfall. Handler called point as Whiz stood in the very heavy cover at 56'. The hour ended with Whiz headed forward along the woods line on our right before the last turn to the bridge.

ELEETS COLORADO BLUE, Stonehouse and BLUEWATER GUNS-A-BLAZEN, Down. We last saw Blue when we went through the cut in the first tree line on course two. Blaze has started at a moderate range hunting the cover. We crossed old 109 near the third bridge, parallel to the road. Blue's handler has called for the tracking device. Blaze is still in a hunting mode and is leashed.

We have a short break near old 109. Then LINVEL'S ACE OF DIAMONDS, Tracy and PANCHA'S PRINCE EDWARD, Wild are turned loose. At 3' on our right birds lift but it is unclear if the dogs were involved. They were sent on toward the turn into the horseshoe. Ace is out of pocket at this time and not returned to judgment. We traveled out of the horseshoe, headed toward the woods line. At the edge of the cover, point is called for Eddie. Flushing could not produce game and he was asked to relocate. A lengthy relocation finally pinned the birds. A covey flushed very near the dog, his posture slacked and he was leashed.

Wednesday's posted dogs: SHADY'S TIA MARIA and HI PROOF WHIZKI.

Thursday weather- Another sunny day. The temperature was 34 degrees with frost on the ground. TRADEMARK'S ICEMAN, Holman and KB'S SHADOW DANCER, John. They left the breakaway with purpose, both dogs hitting the edges, but shortly both settled into a moderate race. There wasn't any bird work during their time on the ground and they were leashed at 50' near the bridge.

SHADY'S THE PRICE IS RIGHT, Dorion and PERFECT TIMING, Holman. Away on course two, both dogs took to the cover. Ty was pointed out to the front. At 20' Steele had a find on a single. This area has held birds for many days but the hawks also have located the spot and are working it with regularity. Steele was sent on and worked at moderate range. Ty has made some nice casts using the country, he was not rewarded in his hour that ended across the bridge and up the river.

BELLE'S BEAU MAX, Carrington and BOUNCIN BETTY, Gorrow. We left the bridge and Betty headed to the right in the heavy cover. She was out of pocket for a short time. At 15' Max stood in the bluestem on our left but nothing was produced. Max was last seen just before the creek crossing. Betty had settled into a moderate range. We had traveled down the gas well hill where both dogs were taken up at 35'.

ANNITIME SOON, Holman and MO DAN'S "BELIEVER", Cross. With sunshine, light breeze and temperatures in the 50's it was the start of a pretty afternoon. Both dogs worked the cover, checking likely places for birds. At 32' point was called by the scouts, at the far fence line on our right. Upon arrival Buddy has moved on and Soo is asked to relocate. With no game found he was taken to the front. Buddy was pointed at the end of the fence line at 37'. Extensive flushing and lengthy relocation through the briars finally put birds to flight. Both dogs continued on. We neared the dog wagon U-turn and Soo was leashed. Buddy continued on to the bridge where the brace ended.

SAINT JOSEPH ORI, Ori and DAKOTA LUKE, Wild. Luke was bold off the breakaway having lots of steam. Joey checked all the likely places for birds. Luke was out of pocket before the old 109 crossing. Joey stopped at the end of the brushy finger at the turn to the horseshoe. Flushing and relocation could not produce any game. Luke had not returned to judgment and Joey was taken to the wagon.

We broke away in the meadow at the start of the horseshoe turn on course two. TEQUILA JACK II, John and GAMBLER'S JAZZ-N IT UP, Holman. Jack began his reaching casts early. Jazz methodically worked the cover. At 7' she had a find near the pond. Out of the horseshoe, point is called for her at 12' at the edge of the fence line on our right. Handler flushed in the trees and briars. Birds lifted out of the blue stem directly behind her. She was fired over and taken on. Along old 109, Jazz worked along the edge. Scout called point at 18'. She stood in the blue stem. Flushing and relocations could not produce anything. Up ahead Jack had taken the fence line on the left along old 109 and traveled to the end. Point was called at 24' but nothing could be produced. Jack was out of pocket before the bridge crossing, judges waited and shortly he returned. Jazz was up shortly after the bridge crossing. Jack was out of pocket before Lick Creek crossing and not returned within time.

Thursday's posted dog: PERFECT TIMING

COOPER'S OZARK TRAVELER, Doherty and THE ROCK II, Tracy. The sky was overcast, 42 degrees and a light breeze. These dogs ran to the right places looking for birds. At 24' Rock spun and pointed staunchly. A nice covey was flushed with all in order. At 27' he pointed at the end of a large briar thicket, relocated, nothing could be produced. Coop has continued his forward race showing in front of us from time to time. Rock pointed in the tree line to our right, relocated, nothing could be produced and he was taken to the truck. Coop continued toward the Ryan field and along the river, handling kindly. Point was called at 50'. He stood high and tight with the covey well pinned. Birds flushed from the tall

cover a good distance in front of him. He finished the hour with ease.

BILLY'S RANDOM TASK, Holman and CELEBRATIONS TWO OF HEARTS, McGee. Across the bridge on course two this pair was turned loose. Each using the edges. At 21' Billy stood at the edge of the brushy finger. Handler approached, tapped to relocate. After a short search and he was taken on. Deuce was out of pocket before the 109 crossing. The tracking device was called for at the turn into the horseshoe and Billy was taken to the truck.

REDLINE'S TEQUILA SMOKER, Doiron and TEQUILA JOKER'S JOSE CUERVO, Berneathy. We left the meadow at the start of the horseshoe on course two. Around the horseshoe, through the Parrish field and across 109. Both dogs were out of pocket going into the 540 loop. Jose caught the front shortly. Smokey was still absent as we crossed the bridge and not returned to judgment. Handler called point for Jose on his left. He stood with lax posture at the edge of a feed strip. Flushing and relocating could not produce any game. We crossed Lick Creek with Jose going to the right. Just up the tree line point is called at 53'. He stood near a large brush pile without intensity. Birds were called by the gallery. He was fired over and sent on. His hour ended at gas well hill.

GAMBLER'S GOOD DEAL, Holman and SAWTOOTH SAM'S IV RUNNER, Tillson. The day has continued with overcast skies and cool temperatures. Billi started strong from the breakaway, getting wider with each move. Runner has a snappy way of going, moving through the cover. Billi was out of pocket ant 25' and not returned to judgment. Runner came from the pond on our left and moved into the thick feed strip where point was called at 41'. A nice sized covey was flushed with all in order. He made the left turn at the bridge and ran along the outside of the wide feed strip. We saw a large covey of birds lift from the strip, a single came out on our side followed by Runner.

RU-JEM'S A TOUCH OF BOURBON, McGee and BRISCO'S MR STUB, Trimble. Across the bridge we watched the dogs bend to the right and go forward. They methodically check the places where birds may be. At 19' Stub spun and pointed near a feeding area. Relocated, nothing could be produced. We moved along the area where the hawks had been working scattering the birds. Stub went in the last feed strip before we turn into the horseshoe. Extensive flushing and relocation could not find the wily birds and he was leashed. The gallery watched as Chug came out of the horseshoe and turned right. He stopped, looked and moved up. Handler spotted him and called point at 34'. The "reliable" covey was home and promptly flushed. Chug maintained good manners throughout. His hour finished passed the bridge.

JAYHAWKER'S TEQUILA WITH A TWIST, Tillson and HARLINGS BRETON SMITH, Holman. Taryn was the wider of the pair. She traveled along the edges, appearing in a timely fashion. Brett worked the cover thoroughly as he moved forward. We crossed Lick Creek and up ahead both handlers called point at 19'. Taryn was standing high and tight at the edge of a sumac thicket and Brett was nearby pointing in taller cover. Birds flushed in front of both dogs, handlers fired and sent the dogs on. Taryn continued to use the country. Brett was moving through the blue stem on our left as we headed toward the beaver dam. Point was called by the handler. Handler flushed, asked the dog to relocate but nothing could be produced. We traveled around the beaver slough, through the woods. Turning back up the tree line on our right. Brett was nearby on the left and Taryn was well forward when time was called.

Friday's posted dogs: COOPER'S OZARK TRAVELER, TEQUILA JOKER'S JOSE CUERVO, and JAYHAWKER'S TEQUILA WITH A TWIST.

MAXWELL'S WHITE SPIRIT, Loren son and CHIEF'S GUNNER, Jones. The skies again were overcast with temperature in the mid 40's with a threat of rain. This pair was fast off the breakaway. Butch being the stronger of the pair. Just across the little creek Gunner was sighted in the blue

stem off to our right at 19'. Flushing and relocation could not produce any game. We crossed Lick Creek and point was called for Butch by the gallery. He stood in a small thicket on the right. A single was put to flight with all in order. Each dog was forward and working the cover. Butch made some strong forward moves. He was out of pocket at the turn to the Ryan field. Shortly, both scouts call point. We ride toward the end of the feed strip on our left, that one is waved off. The other scout is still calling from the river's edge. As we ride to the find we see a bird lift and then more. Butch had a guilty look on his face and was leashed. Gunner made the left turn at the bridge, went into the tall, wide feed strip. Point was called. It was tough to flush in the tangled cover. During the lengthy relocation Gunner released himself and was leashed.

LANE'S END WE-BE CLEAN, Holman and SNIKSOH, CORKY, Burchette. On course two We-Be went straight to the front and Corky turned right and then forward. Both dogs worked the blue stem. We-Be went though the cut where a single flushed. As the handler approached the rest of the covey lifted. He was shot over and taken on. Corky was out of pocket. We-Be pointed at 13' in the feed strip on our left just before the 109 crossing. A small covey was put to flight as he maintained good manners. We crossed 109 where Corky had caught the front and both dogs turned to the right along the river edge. Point was called for Corky at 15' in the tree line. Searching and relocation could not produce game and he was sent on. We-Be went through the wooded area to the front. Through the horseshoe We-Be was forward. Corky was again out of pocket. At 39' We-Be stood at the woods edge on the right side of the Parish field. A covey was put to flight with all in order. Corky caught the front in the Parish field without the handler. We crossed 109 and into the 540 loop before the handler and judge returned. Corky made another wide swing and was not returned to judgment. We-Be was taken across the bridge and turned right along the river for a strong finish toward the Haydan camp area to end the hour.

TJ'S THUNDER, John and BLUERIDGE MAJOR ADVENTURE, Downing. Away from the bridge, these dogs went left along the river and to the front. At 4' Thunder was credited with a stop to flush at another "stay at home" covey. He stood rock solid for the shot. We crossed Lick Creek, both dogs took to the cover. Point was called for Thunder at 22'. He stood at the cut in the long tree line on our right. Extensive flushing and relocation could not produce game. The turn off gas well hill took both dogs to the right. Point was called for both dogs half way down to the meadow. Thunder was pointed with Major honoring. A huge covey was flushed with both dogs maintaining stylish manners. They were fired over and taken on. Across the beaver dam and through the Big Sandy, we turned up a tree line where point was called for Major. He stood at the edge of a very thick and "over the handlers head" food plot. Major was relocated but could not produce any game to end the hour. Thunder was returned in the grace period.

After lunch the sky was cloudy and temperatures had hovered around 60 degrees. GRAND JUNCTION JAKE, Holman and DOGWOOD'S GEM NICOLE, Johnson. Jake was stronger of the pair off the breakaway. Nikki methodically hunted the cover. Crossing Lick Creek and making the turn, point is called for Jake at the end of the brushy finger on our left. He moved up, a singled lifted. Nikki came into the thicket and stopped. Jake made another pass and moved more birds. Nikki maintained her composure throughout, she was fired over. The brace ended and we moved on to the property corner going into the cotton fields.

THE FARSIDE'S KID AMEE, Gorrow and CLYDE'S MICRO-BREEZE, Tracy. Headed into the cotton fields, both dogs worked a lot of cover. We made the turn toward the bridge where Mike appeared along the tree line on our left. He work in the cover then pointing at 29'. A small covey was pointed with all in order. Crossing the bridge and beyond the next tree

line the dogs are working the cover. Shortly, along the woods edge the handler is summoned . Mike has an apparent injury to a leg and is taken to the truck. Amee continued across 109 still hunting the cover where she was leashed. We rode to the clubhouse to await the announcements.

American Brittany Rescue Takes Part in DNA Sampling Study with the University of California Davis

Rescue group also identifies a need for care for more senior-aged Brittanys

CENTERVILLE, MD—American Brittany Rescue, Inc. (ABR) is working with the Canine Genetics and Genomics Group at the UC Davis Center for Veterinary Genetics to collecting as many DNAs as possible from Brittany dogs for several, synergistic research efforts. The samples are being gathered by ABR volunteers across the country, from Brittanys the organization has rescued, and from the volunteers' own Brittanys as well. The study was spearheaded by Gordon Theilen, Director of the American Brittany Club (ABC).

The DNA sampling project actually began in August 2006 with the first batch of 450 DNA cheek swab kits. The DNA testing coordinator had to place a second order of kits, because of an overwhelming response from Brittany owners across the country. The swab kits have been free to the owners. Sampling has taken less than five minutes per dog, with four swabs being taken per dog.

There will be a time in the future where ABR's efforts in the collection of DNA for the UC Davis Brittany DNA Study will help eliminate inherited health issues in the Brittany breed. Numerous samples are the key to successful DNA studies with the continuous submission of new pups and non-sampled dogs.

Besides the DNA study, ABR is also actively working on solutions for senior Brittanys who need new homes. The first of two solutions is the Senior Companion Program: Active adopters aged 65 years and older, who are willing to adopt a senior Brittany, aged 8 years and older, would have their adoption fee waived. Younger adopters are encouraged to adopt these wonderful seniors too, but they will be asked to make a donation which generally covers the dog's expenses while in foster care.

ABR believes the Senior Companion Program can benefit not only our older rescued dogs, but also older owners who want to provide companionship and a home for one of these special dogs. Foster space is always at a premium. Senior dogs (eight years and older) may stay in foster care for a long time; sometimes spending the remainder of their days in foster care, which may mean losing a space that could

be available to other dogs. We believe that matching older adopters with older dogs can only benefit them both, and it's a way to continue to save more Brittanys that might otherwise not find forever homes.

In 1999, the *Journal of the American Geriatrics Society* published a study, demonstrating that seniors that have pets tend to have better physical health and mental well being than those that do not.

They're more active, cope better with stress, and have better overall health. A 1997 study showed that elderly pet owners had a significantly lower blood pressure overall than their contemporaries without pets.

These senior dogs can offer years of companionship and happy memories. They're calmer, and often just as active as their younger counterparts. The average lifespan of a Brittany is 12-13 years. The second solution for seniors is the Senior Brittany Retreat. This retreat has long been a goal of ABR. In 2007, the Senior Retreat Committee has set a five year goal for creation of the retreat. The committee consists of three state coordinators, a builder, an architect, a grant writer, a financial analyst, an attorney and 2 business consultants.

ABR plans to have a location where senior Brittanys can come when there is no available foster space for them. Some will still be available for forever homes, while other will spend their remaining days at the retreat. Some of these senior dogs will be qualified as "Therapy Dogs." 





The Brittany world has lost another good friend.

Long time Hall of Fame Brittany enthusiast, Ella

Conable, passed away February 16, 2008. Ella had been in declining health in recent months and her passing was not unexpected.

Ella and her husband, Lloyd, got their first Brittany in 1957 and shortly thereafter began participating in Brittany events. Their dog, Elcon's Shotgun Smoke, won the Brittany National Specialty Show in 1967 and was the first liver-colored dog to do so. Chip Britt Jill, handled by Jim Holman, won the National Open Brittany Field Championship in 1975 and Ella handled Ranbo's Royal Rebecca to win the Brittany Pheasant Classic at Green River and the Illinois Open Championship at Rend Lake in the 1980's. Ella won the American Brittany Club's woman handler award twice. She served as ABC treasurer for sixteen years and

also served as ABC magazine editor and futurity secretary, as well as reporter for ABC Classics and National Championships. The Conables were members of Niagara Frontier and Pennsylvania Brittany Clubs as well as the Illinois Brittany Championship Association.

Ella was truly a special lady. Before Lloyd retired, she was known to drive by herself from their home in Orchard Park, NY, horse trailer in tow, to Burwell, NE, to participate in the ABC Chicken Classic and then later to the Pony Express grounds to ride and report the ABC Quail Classic in almost impossible weather of rain and snow. She commented that she could travel from coast to coast and always be within range of a Brittany person that she knew. Ella was a fixture at the ABC nationals for many, many years and was usually first in line to introduce herself to a first time attendee and make them feel welcome.

In recognition of her accomplishments and contributions, Ella was elected a life member of the ABC, a member of the ABC Hall of Fame and a member of the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame in Grand Junction, TN. She will be missed by all.

The 2007 American Brittany Club Grouse and Woodcock Classic was held on October 10 –11 in the Eau Claire County Forest near Augusta, WI. Hosted by Badger Brittany Club, this was the 21st running since being re-started with woodcock as a named bird. The story goes that a bottle of scotch was sacrificed in the brainstorming session to offset the 10-year grouse cycle.

The six one-hour courses have been developed since 1986 and adjusted as logging and nature have modified the grounds. The courses weave along the beautiful Eau Claire River, going from the river bottoms to the uplands. The cover has consistently held grouse and woodcock ranges from the damp tag alder areas to young aspens to older aspen stands to hardwood and pines of various ages and hazel brush of various densities throughout the courses.

With the grouse cycle on the upswing, woodcock plentiful, and the weather near perfect for running dogs, a great time was had by all. This year's event drew dogs and handlers from PA, NH, IL, MI, WI and RI. Some people were unable to attend and were greatly missed: Jane Hopper, Bob Powell, Chuck and Theda Langstaff and Chuck Alff. New to this type of field trail were Chris Sennott, Jim Breece, Rick Stuttgen and Barry Steinmetz.

Jack Wichita and Rod Lein brought the knowledge and passion of 30-plus years of handling, hunting and judging cover dogs. Badger was proud to be able to get such a great judging team and their efforts were well received by all. Badger was also lucky to have the help of all attending – special thanks to Myron Lloyd, Rick Stuttgen, John Hancock and Bill Zwettler for their efforts preparing a great lunch and shuffling vehicles from one course to another. Thanks to Larry Davidson for taking time to help marshal. Thanks goes to PURINA for its continued support (product, hats and monetary) of this event.

The night before the Classic a number of the group were able to renew old friendships and met new members of this special fraternity. We shared stories and remembrances of fine dogs and people of the past.

The sky was overcast, temp in the mid-40's and wind light as we met up at Wilson Park. We then drove down Hamilton Falls Rd. to the first breakaway near the pipeline. Dogs were at the line at 8:05.

THE RUNNING

Brace 1 FC/AFC WRIGLEY'S FIRST DANCE (Hopper/Hopper) and FC/AFC SYLVIA'S BIG BIRTHDAY BASH (Habecker/Gorman) — Both dogs charged forward into the young aspen stand of the breakaway. Basher went to the edge of bell range and was seen at 6. Jazz worked a little closer and handily hit likely places. Both reached the tag alders at 16 and continued to demonstrate good forward ground speed. The cover opened up after crossing the road and so did the dogs. The course then swung south at the river and both dogs chose to hunt the high ground parallel to the river.

Jazz was located on point at 40. Gil's flush produced a woodcock. Jazz's manners were impeccable throughout. She was sent forward. She finished the hour hunting to the front with good ground speed.

Basher was found standing after an extended absence at 49. Ray attempted a prolonged flush and relocation with no success. At 56, he pointed again. Ray produced a woodcock in front him with 30 seconds remaining.

Brace 2 WRIGLEY'S REWED-UP CUB (Steinmetz/Hopper) and CASCO BAY JASPER (Mazzagila/McPherson) – The dogs were broken away in the river bottom and enthusiastically raced ahead. The course took the handlers out of the bottom and up hill to an aspen stand. Jasper was found standing to the left and a grouse was heard leaving the general area. Jasper was sent on. Japser's bell went silent at 13. Roger located him about 30 yards to the right of the trail. Jasper displayed a stylish point and excellent manners as Roger produced two woodcock in front of him. All was in order after the shot and he was sent on. He continued to hunt forward at the farthest edge of the bell. Roger tried to reel him in before crossing the road at 53 with no success. Jasper was out of pocket at time.

Turbo had a non-productive at 16. At 22, he was found on point at the edge of the high line opening. Gil's flush attempt was rewarded with the first grouse. Turbo maintained high intensity through wing and shot. With all in order, Gil sent him on. Turbo hunted cover with an efficient, forward pattern. He had a non-productive at 55 in the river bottom. He finished the hour hunting forward.

After a coffee break with great Racine kringles, we packed up and moved to the canoe landing for brace 3 and 4.

Brace 3 FC/AFC HY STEPPIN MAGGIE (Sennott) and FC/

AFC SANDY RIVER SUNSHINE (Hancock/Hopper) — This course earned the nickname "Crash" because of the number of dogs that have been taken out on it. The dogs began forward at close to moderate range. Maggie was more adventurous in the thick hazel brush and aspen cover. Maggie was found at 10 30 yards left of the trail where the hazel brush thinned. As Chris moved into flush, Maggie could not resist the temptation to get a closer look. The move encouraged the woodcock to take flight. Score one for the course.

Sonny had gotten more comfortable with the cover and worked at moderate range. At 19, he established point to the right of the trail. Gil was able to produce a grouse and shot. All in order, Gil sent him on. At 30, Sonny was observed pursuing a woodcock. A second victim of the course claimed.

Lunch had been set up at the trucks under the supervision of Brent Lloyd's father, Myron. Brats with the fixings, baked beans, cheese, venison sausage and refreshments were served al fresco.

Brace 4 FC/AFC CJB'S SCOOBY-DOOBY DOO (Brigham) and FC COOS RYLEE (Gorman) – We broke away just on the other side of the road from the lunch area on the course nicknamed the "Dishpan". This round older growth aspen choked valley is always exciting. Rylee and Scooby broke away exuberantly to the front. Rylee's bell was silent at 5. He was located with difficulty in the thick hazel brush to the left of

the trail. Ray had to fight his way to Rylee and produced a woodcock in front of a stylish point. Ray and Rylee fought through the brush and back to the trail. Rylee was moved on. He exhibited excellent ground speed as he hunted the edges of thick cover on the side of the "Dishpan". He worked forward on both sides of the trail. His bell was silent at 22 and he was found standing 60 yards to the right of the trail in a draw that sloped to the river. A woodcock was flushed and he remained stylish throughout. All in order, Ray sent him on. At 40, the cover opened up with larger trees dominant and Rylee extended his range. He continued to hunt forward with great ground speed at time.

some prickly ash. Both dogs exploded forward upon release. Trace had a stop to flush on a woodcock at 13 with Ray firing. All in order, he was led from the cover to the trail and sent on. Trace had a non-productive at 18 after a flushing attempt and relocation failed.

At 20, a grouse independently flew over the gallery. Both dogs were forward and at the edge of bell range. At 25 Taz could not be heard. At 27 Trace was no longer heard but Taz appeared on course and forward.

Trace was found on point in cover about 30 yards off the trail at 33. The young dog showed intensity and manners while Ray flushed a woodcock and fired. An excited Trace shot forward upon release. At 35 the enthusiastic Trace bumped a woodcock and he was leashed.

Taz worked likely cover, kept forward and had a strong run. He had non-productives at 35, 58 and 59.

We all climbed out of the bowel and joined our rides to the "Yellow Gate" course. If run the other direction, the old timers have called it "Woodcock Haven". We dropped about 80-ft down off the east side of the gate and made a loop then back up to the gate and down the other side and headed west. Finishing at Channey Road.

Brace 6 FC SUEMAC'S BODACIOUS PRIDE (McPherson) and POWELL'S MR. BO JANGLES (Lloyd) – Breaking away down hill, Bo (M) was more intent on putting distance from the handlers than Bo (L). At 1,

Bo (L) went on point about 20 yards off to the left in an opening among a thin stand of aspens. Brent attempted a flush, nothing produced and Bo (L) was released and continued to hunt the area before moving on.

Scooby worked the course

at moderate range and

speed, finishing the hour

At 4, Roger flushed two woodcock in front of a stylish Bo (M). He displayed intensity and impeccable manners as the birds left and Roger fired. He was released and shot to the front.

Bo (L) was crossing the trail at 17 and hit the breaks. Brent produced a woodcock from a small depression and he fired. Bo (L) remained stylish and intense. Sent on,

he continued to work at moderate range and steady pace. Bo (M) continued to demonstrate a quicker and more animated pace with a more forward race.

At 30, we are out of the bottom and are headed down on the other side of the gate. A river bottom accented by tag alders with pines along the hillside greeted us. Bo (L) crossed from the river edge and carried forward up a small hill. Nearing the top, he went on point just to the right of the trail at 38. Brent moved up to flush, a woodcock popped over Bo's (L) head. As he turned to mark the flight, another woodcock exploded from between Bo's (L) front feet. This proved too much, steps were taken and he was leashed.

Bo (M) continued his forward race, searching likely cover in the undulating terrain. At 43, he was working in some thick hazel brush and stopped as a woodcock left the area. He showed great style and manners as Roger fired. Roger then struggled through the thick tangle to get to Bo (M) and bring him out to the trail. He was released and accelerated forward and into cover.

At 50, he was found standing in a tag alder finger 30 yards right of the trail. Roger made a cautious flush attempt and then relocated Bo (M). He continued to hunt the area at a methodical pace out of the bottom and up the hill until establishing point at 55 with great style and intensity. Roger was able finally to flush the elusive grouse about 20 feet ahead of Bo (M) as he stood confidently. Shot fired and all in order. Dog, handler, judges and gallery all savored an excellent demonstration of bird work. Bo (M) was moved on and charged forward. He finished the hour with good ground speed and forward range.

Brace 7 FC/AFC ZWETTLER'S GOOD GOLLY MISS MOLLY (Zwettler) and RU-JEM'S PRAIRIE WIN (Hopper) — The weather was clear and cool with light wind as we met at Wilson Park and traveled to Course 1 breakaway. Breaking away at 8:10, both dogs were really excited and charged into the heavy aspen cover.

At 5, Molly could be heard in the pine-aspen mix wide and right of the trail. Meanwhile, Win was working to the left and forward. At 15, we heard barking to the left and become concerned. That was the area that Win's bell had occasionally been heard. Gil tried to gather him up to get him back on course but the bell seemed (when heard) to bounce forward and then back deep in the cover. Gil finally pulled out the tracker and Win was found heading back to the breakaway.

Molly continued working to the right and forward. She crossed the road at 20 and headed along the trail. About 30 feet, she found herself nose to beak with a woodcock. Bill moved in to flush but the temptation was too much. Her run was ended at 21.

Brace 8 SUEMAC'S BLAZEN BIBI (McPherson) - Roger released

BiBi and she made a nice forward move into cover. The bell went silent at 2 and she was found standing about 75 yards right of the trail. An attempt to flush and relocation was not productive and she was moved on.

We crossed a creek that flowed to the river and the cover changed to older clumps of aspens and tag alders. BiBi's bell was heard in cover forward with good hunting range and pace. The course brought us closer to the river and BiBi's bell went silent. At 19, she was found standing with impressive style about 45 yards right of the trail. As Roger moved in, a grouse left the area. Shot fired, she remained steady

and Roger sent her on. She charged forward and at 20 stopped to the flush of a woodcock. Roger fired and as he walked to her another woodcock left. Her manners were flawless and she was sent on.

A grouse flushed wild at 21 and another at 22. BiBi was in cover forward and off the trail. Her bell was silent at 24. She was found standing with great style; a woodcock was flushed, shot fired, all in order. As Roger collared her back to the trail, a grouse flushed in front of them.

At 30, the course swung from the river and towards the upland aspen stand and some larger timber. It then crossed the road and took us into the river bottom. BiBi had been working cover with a nice forward race, adjusting to the winding course. Her bell went silent at 44. She was found standing with little intensity in an aspen bottom. Roger sent her on. At 52, she was found pointing a small thicket. When Roger flushed, the woodcock went right at her. Shot fired, good manners throughout, Roger sent her on. BiBi had another woodcock find at 54. Again, the bird flew over her head as Roger flushed. She marked the flight at shot and again displayed good manners. She was released and finished the hour hunting to the front with good speed and enthusiasm.

With all dogs run, everyone re-grouped at Wilson Park for brunch, awards, congratulations and good-byes.

GUN DOGS AND ALL-AGE DOGS

On one of the e-mail "lists" the question was asked, "What is a gun dog."

Here was my answer as near as I can remember it. Regardless of the AKC, American Field, or AFTCA standards as written I think it is fairly simple.

An all-age dog is independent, runs big, and needs more handling and a great scout. A gun dog is much less independent, does not run to the outer limits, and should not require a great deal of handling, and very little scouting. (By the way if a gun dog can't negotiate some tight cover, it is not a gun dog.) Either type of Brittany should be bold and seek the same kind of objectives, but not necessarily the same objectives on a given course. Now read the AKC, American Field, and the AFTCA standards they will sound "something" like what I said.

After many years and having hunted, guided, and/ or field trailed in the following states: Il, Wis., IA., Mich., Ohio, N.Y., Ky., Tenn., Ks., Neb., S.D., Mo., Ind., it has led me to a better understanding of what we should expect and be looking for in gun dogs and all age dogs. Actually, the more I think about it, it is not necessarily the state but what part of a state you are in and what kind of game birds are available and their habitat. That applies to not only private property but to state or federally owned property and how it is maintained. As an example the wonderful ground of Ionia in Michigan where the Gun Dog Championships are held used to be 30 years ago terrible to run all-age dogs on in the fall. However during my recent visits there they are extremely suitable for running any stake because of how they are maintained. I have heard people complain because they are too well manicured now. What was it that Abe Lincoln said, "You can please all of the some the time. You can please some of the people all of the time. But you can't please all of the people all of the time." President Lincoln must have seen the field trial people coming.

So what about the field trial gun dog versus an all age dog? Given the dog can be trained, staunch and steady, it is a matter of what kind of land you have to train on and the dog's inherited attitude. Remember you can always bring a dog in closer but you can't push them out. If you do push them out and it not a natural thing for the dog and all you get is a "whiprun" dog and failure. I believe a dog, like water, will seek its own level. No matter the destiny of a dog they should become bird dogs first. They need to be hunted and exposed to as many birds, wild, released, or planted, that is possible. In Ben O. Williams perfect world we would all train only on wild birds. Of course that is the ideal situation. I remember my first trip to train in the Nebraska sand hills believing I would

have a summer of training on a multitude of wild birds only to find wild birds scarce in my particular camp and visiting other trainers' camps they had penraised birds in their possession. Well I was young and dumb.

Too many field trial people believe that getting a dog to "run" is the priority when the dogs are young. All this produces are runners without purpose. Most of us do not have vast expanses of land with wild birds to help us achieve our objective. Many of us have smaller tracks of land possibly holding some wild birds. Of course we can simulate a good training and hunting venue by using recall pens or feeder stations. This takes resources and effort. Some of us can use DNR public grounds or pay a handsome fees to belong to hunting and/or training clubs. There are a variety of options including sending our dogs to a good pro trainer that has plenty of acreage with plenty of wild birds

If the dog ranges reasonably for a foot or horseback handler and is reliably biddable, checks in with the handler form time to time on its own, can handle multiple finds without breaking you have a field trial gun dog. If you have a dog that given its head, is very independent, requires aggressive handling and scouting, and that can range depending on the venue several hundreds of yards, seeks game birds, constantly stays to the front and is staunch and steady you have an all-age dog. From personal experience I can honestly tell you that a dog can progress from a gun dog to an all-age dog. I am not talking about a "tweener," but a full-blown all-age dog. A good friend of mine has pointed out, "if a dog is a tweener, it is not a good gun dog or a good all-age dog.' Now can you hunt an all-age dog? YES! And if you can't you don't have a bird dog. I would rather have an all-dog to hunt on the prairies or wide open land if you will. They will cover more ground and find more birds. I would rather have a field trial gun dog to hunt pheasant and quail in some of the tight, small coverts here in central Illinois. Having said that let us give dogs a lot of credit for knowing the circumstances. I HAVE successfully hunted and guided over all-age dogs, one was a runner-up National OAA Champion. Take out the shotgun, foot hunt and they adapt very well. I have a gun dog and all-age dog right now. I do not worry about losing the gun dog but I do the allage dog in the small, heavy cover grounds we have. Both are big runners for their respective classes, but the gun dog is more likely to check in with me voluntarily.

Personally I like a combination of field trial gun dogs and field trial all-age dogs on most venues when hunting. This gives us a combination of dogs covering all the ground. I remember once, I was showing off, I had 5 dogs on the ground guiding a hunt. Two of the dogs were all-age dogs and three of them were gun dogs. I and my hunting party came around a little thicket. Pointing and/or backing were all five dogs. This was before beepers and trackers and none were wearing an e-collar at the time. That was mighty impressive for my clients. All of the Brittanys were field trial winners. One was the 200th Brittany dual champion. Another had qualified for the OAA Nationals that year also. One had placements in AKC, American Field, and NSTRA trials. Good dogs, good Brittanys are just GOOD.

Pick the stakes you like and find a dog that will fit you. If you like to handle a field trial dog on foot you need a gun dog. If you like to ride at a leisurely pace and not sing to your dog you want a gun dog. If you do not want to worry about losing your dog most of the time you need a gun dog. However, if you like to see your dog way out there you need an all-age dog. If you like to ride at a substantial pace you need an all-age dog. If you have friends that are fearless horsemen and know bird dogs and will scout on a regular basis you need an all-age dog.

I have a friend that says he does not like to "play" the all-age game. Hey, not a problem.

However, I like to point out to him that field trials

ARE a game, a simulation of hunting. It is recreation, choose your court. If you like the AKC or American Field formats that are in large part a blank only, "no kill" trials then that is your game. All hunting dog trials are games. The shoot-to-kill-to-retrieve trials are a game. I watched a "National Bird Hunting Dog Challenge Championship" on Direct TV the other day. It was interesting to watch, entertaining, and humorous. One handler-shooter, one dog and it was timed/judged on how many birds (0-3), how many shots, how many retrieves. The handlers-shooters were nearly running! Hey, that's how I always foot hunted-running. There are plenty of games you can play with your Brittany if that is what you chose. Why not have a Brittany to be a DOCK DOG. Wouldn't it be great to see our Brittanys flying through the air after a retrieving dummy and landing 20 feet out in a tank of water!

Bird dogs must be just that, bird dogs. They must have an insatiable appetite and brains to find birds. Match your dogs to your preference. Good Brittanys are great no matter whether they are classed as gun dogs or all-age dogs. Fit the dogs to your style of hunting or field trialing. No matter the classification of your field trial Brittany, if you can't hunt them, they are not what they were intended for from the beginning. A well bred Brittany wants to hunt birds and it is shame if they are not!




- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and all her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- . Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- · All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- . Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped. A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.
- Late nominations subject to a \$30.00 penalty, in addition to the \$30.00 nomination fee. Applications WILL NOT be accepted after 90 days of whelp.
- . Nominations of dams may be made on or after January 1 of any year and shall close positively on December 31st of that same year.
- . Dogs will be eligible to run in the designated futurity to be held in the Spring of the second year following the year of whelping.
- . A final nomination fee will be due by September 15th of the year following whelping and entry fees will be paid prior to each futurity field or bench event the dog enters (to be paid by owner of puppy.)
