- Reflections -

Having been a devoted fan of the Olympics this summer, I was drawn to the article by an unknown author in a 1960 Brittany magazine. I watched on TV as commentators discussed how Michael Phelps body was such that it promoted his swimming excellence and allowed him to become a champion in his field.

The following is an excerpt from a longer article, "What to Expect of the Brittany" which talks about the various classes in field trials. This excerpt deals with what is a field trial dog. We know that bench champions become that because their bodies, gait, etc. are as close to what we as breeders have defined as The Standard for the Brittany.

Field Trials do have rules and each class, puppy, derby, all age, gun dog have their standards as outlined in AKC and American Field Rules. Often times, we disagree as to the dog the judges have named as champion or winner. This article points out that in addition to those set rules such as steady to wing and shot, we also have the additional subjective elements of "class & style". We often hear the term "extreme expresser" of the breed. He notes that appreciation of "class & style" often come slowly to the observer of field trials. Your dog did everything according to the book. Why then did he not win and another did? Perhaps, in the judges' eves, the winner had those attributes the author discusses as "class & style" that made him sit up in the saddle to watch, the dog excited him, the dog was a thing of beauty. The winner was the epitome of the Olympic Champion, the one you want to trial, the one you want to breed to. He is the one that would make the Olvmpic Team. Not all trials will have that kind of winner but, rest assured, that is what the judges are looking for especially in our National Championship to be run this month in Booneville, AR. Good Luck to all!

THE FIELD TRIAL DOG

(Reprinted in part from an article in *The American Brittany*, Vol. XI, No. 12, December 1960, page 8)

Field trials are essentially the proving grounds for breeders. The bench show is the place where breeders place their dogs in competition with a mythical dog that perfectly meets the standards set down for the breed. In so doing he hopes to arrive at a dog, and breeds for a dog, that is as close as possible to the "Dog of the Standards".

Field Trials are in the same way, a test of the ability of the dog. The best dogs are then kept and bred by the owners and the breed is continually improved. The Brittany owner may then well ask, "What is a Field Trial Dog? What makes him different from a shooting dog?"

Good questions, and difficult to answer. But again let us pursue a middle of the road course, and attempt a general description.

The field trial dog must have the ability to consistently show what he can do in a set period of time, 30 to 60 minutes. He must have the ability to look good and make no mistakes through everyone of these limited minutes. He cannot start slow, finish slow or sag in the middle.

Soft spots, that in a days hunting are erased by a later beautiful point or a nice retrieve, cannot be overlooked in a thirty minute stake. The trial dog must then be consistent and must also have that hard to define thing known as **class and style**.

The appreciation of class in style comes to the observer of field trials slowly. Probably the same is true of devotees of boxing or horse racing. There is a little something extra in some competitors that makes them more of a thrill to watch. With bird dogs it may be a little more snap, a little more animation of movement. It includes style on point, head high, chest seeming to swell continuously as one watches. All of these things and probably a little showmanship go into the definition of class.

The trial dog with his consistency and class must however, perform in the same general way as our perfect all age hunting dog.

The difference then, is more a matter of degree. The same things are expected, but the manner in which they are done is a little different. As a poor simile, there are many who can swim, get from one place to the next and not drown, but only a few make the Olympic team.



ABC 2008 Chairmen Reports & Agenda Items

2008 Report of the ABC President - Hank Hartnek

2008 has been another year of varied challenges primary of which was getting me up to speed as president. The directors, officers, and committees at the national level as well as the many regional club officers and workers worked very hard this year and are to be com-mended for their efforts. We could not maintain a viable level of activity in our shows, field trials, agility, futurity and other activities without the dedicated efforts of these members. I would urge each of you to say "Thank You" to those in charge of the next event that you attend.

The Magazine under the direction of Managing Editor, Dee Hempfield improves in content as well as schedule. Mary Jo Trimble, Execu-tive Secretary provides valuable assistance in many areas including the magazine and the membership database that is ably handled by Linda Langford. The database is a difficult task because of the continual changes in membership status and addresses. The web site continues to improve with the efforts of Steve Ralph.

The American Brittany Club signed a new three year sponsorship agreement with Tri-Tronics that was implemented this year. I was contacted early in the year by Tri-Tronics regarding the possibility of working out the new agreement. Again, we were able to achieve a generous agreement. We should continue to pursue other corporate sponsorship agreements.

Other challenges included severe flooding at the grounds at Blue Mountain Wildlife Area, continued efforts by anti-dog groups to limit dog ownership and the high costs of travel particularly fuel costs.

2008 marks The American Brittany Club's twenty-second year at Blue Mountain Wild Life Area. This year has been one of just keeping things on an even keel as severe flooding hampered continued development and improvement of the area. We are very appreciative of the efforts of those who were able to maintain these excellent facilities.

In speaking with Larry McAnaly, Arkansas Game and Fish Area Manager earlier this year, he wanted to remind us of the improve-ments made last year. These included:

- 1. Replacement of horse corrals to the right of the entrance with 12 new corrals [20x20 feet each], with a drive way in the back so the horses can be cared for.
- 2. Removal of the old office and construction of a new office which is now in operation.
- 3. Replacement of twelve culverts with gravel is being added.
- Upgrading of the dog boxes and kennels. 4.
- 5. The successful increased bird release program will be repeated again for the third year.

Also this year, we have moved the site of our National Specialty Show from the Holiday Inn to Howard Johnson's. This move will help reduce costs of putting on our National Show.

The future of sporting dog activities is clouded by repeated attempts at constraining legislation that will place unworkable burdens on our activities. Our problems are compounded by the efforts of some State Wildlife Agencies and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to eliminate horseback field trials. We do not have enough suitable grounds to meet the needs of our regional and championship trials in some areas. I continue to be puzzled by the selective attitude of some state DNRs, their revenues are based on hunting license fees which are declining each year, yet they persist in defining field trials as not being a compatible part of hunting. Also show sites have experienced negative local regulatory laws. The American Brittany Club must continue to oppose each and every one of these pieces of legislation if we want our sport to continue.

Action Items:

- 1. Qualifications for the 2009 Championships
- Continue holding the All Age Championships at Booneville 2009, 2. 2010.2011
- 3. While not an action item to be voted on by the BOD, I strongly suggest each officer and committee chairman review their section of the policy book and make revisions to meaning, grammar and punctuation. I further suggest this recommendation be done in sections and be voted on by the BOD during 2009 so as not to have to put all the changes in the agenda book and review and approve all the changes at next year's board meeting.

ABC Club Membership Development

Most of the committee members' thoughts regarding methods, ideas and incentives for ways to increase regional club memberships were very similar. The Committee sincerely hopes the following suggestions are helpful:

- Basic Suggestions to Increase Regional Club Membership:
- Host a club booth at a local 2-3 Sportsman Show.
- Host a Club Fun Day/Picnic Day
- Obtain ABC Brittany information in advance from ABC Executive Secretary for handouts.
- Ask a local Pro to donate 1-2 hours for a brief seminar/ demonstration of Field Training.
- Mini show grooming and handling seminar.
- Wading pool with water for Hot Dogs bobbing for the dogs. Grasshopper stake for puppies.
- Existing members mentor the new members.
- Existing club members offer to give mini summer training sessions hosted by several current members or with another local pointing dog club. The cooperation between the Clubs helps both recruit and retain members and also creates a larger network of pointing dog lovers
- Local raffle or auction.
- One of the Committee members, David Smith, East Coast ABC Director, has spent considerable time, thought and effort into developing a package proposing a Membership Breeders Puppy Program to increase regional club membership. I would like to have David Smith explain this program to the BOD in further detail

Activities Committee American Brittany Club Membership Breeders Puppy Program

- 1) All ABC Membership Breeders will be assigned a number at their request
- 2) When a puppy is sold to a non-ABC member, a new membership is given to the purchaser by the breeder for 1/2 price (now \$15.00). The breeder pays \$15.00 to ABC and ABC foregoes the other \$15.00 normally due. Only one, 1/2 price membership will be granted for each puppy sold.
- 3) The new member is assigned a membership number incorporating the breeder's number, the year joined, and the Regional Club to which he/she is assigned. This will be for tracking purposes.
- At their request, all participating breeders, in any ad they purchase in the American Brittany Magazine, will have the following added
- to their ad at no extra cost:
- American Brittany Club Membership Breeder
- 5) Lists of the Membership Breeders shall be made available to all Regional Directors. Regional Directors shall endeavor to refer potential buyers to Membership Breeders in their area.
- Records of all new members shall be kept from year to year in the Membership Breeders Puppy Program.
- At the end of the second calendar year, following the first year of membership, all memberships resulting from the Membership Breeders Puppy Program shall be reviewed. For the two Membership Breeders who have the highest percentage of renewals, each shall receive \$250.00 from ABC National. For the two Regional Clubs which have the highest percentage of renewals shall each also receive \$250.00 from ABC National. To qualify, each potential recipient must be directly involved in 5 or more Membership Breeders Puppy Program new members.
- 8) All puppies sold to existing ABC members are not in the pool for figuring percentages.
- This **Membership** Breeders Puppy **Program** shall be effective for the calendar **year of** 2009, and continuing indefinitely until changed or terminated **by the** ABC Board of Directors. 9)

There should be minimal extra expense to service this program.

To work efficiently and cost effectively, this program is predicated on our computer system being able to accommodate the proposed.

Third Vice-President's Report - Nancy Anderson

Things for the 2008 show are being finalized. I have been to the show site again as well as to the hotel. I will be checking in with them again when I attend the Ft. Smith Kennel Club show in two weeks.

I mailed the AKC application for the 2009 show to Mary Jo about 2 weeks ago after getting a confirmation from the sweepstakes judge. I have contracts now for everything for the 2009 show except for the photographer, and a confirmation from the show vet and getting people to help with the various responsibilities of the show such as trophies, hospitality, steward, juniors, etc.

Whoever is selected as the new third vice-president needs to come to the show prepared to take home the things I have for him/her. I will be taking nothing home with me to store.

It has been an interesting adventure and I have appreciated the trust the Board of Directors and other officers and members have placed in me. I truly appreciate those of the club who have worked so hard on the various show committees and been so willing to give of their time and themselves to "put on" our national specialties.

Fourth Vice President's Report – Brian Hendrickson No Report.

Executive Secretary Agenda Report - Mary Jo Trimble

This year has been one, once again, of spending a lot of time monitoring the **Legislative** Chat Lists and trying to keep our members advised of bad legislation in their states. More details are outlined in my AKC Legislative Liaison Report.

ABC has had **committees** working on updating their sections of the policy book The futurity committee, a dual dog committee, and a judges education committee have been working on changes. These should be available for membership review in this years agenda report. We are going to be asking each officer, director, committee chair to take a look at the policy book regarding the parts they are involved with and see what sections are outdated and/or need revisions.

The most recent troubling situation regards AKC's Eligibility Requirements to Hold Future Dog Shows. The number of requirements are based on where clubs hold their Events with AKC seemingly wanting these events to be held within a 10 mile territory. Anyone involved with Field Trial Clubs knows that most of our members do not live Within a 10 mile radius of a central point and thus are activities are usually more than 10 miles from a center that may well have been established by AKC 20 to 30 years ago when some of the clubs were started. We were told if the Parent Club, ABC, met these requirements, then our regional clubs would fall under our umbrella. This turns out to not be the stance AKC is taking today so we are trying to help regional clubs meet the qualifications if they do hold shows. I have spoken with Bobby Birdsong, AKC Event Director and President Hartnek will be in touch with him next week. If we cannot come to some reasonable explanation or expansion of territory, then I fear the number of Specialty Show giving clubs in ABC will decline in the near future which puts our Dual Dog concept in jeopardy and serves no benefit to AKC and their declining registrations as well. This seems to be typical philosophy of the AKC Club Relations Department who does not have a clear grasp of how territory has different meanings for show clubs vs performance/show clubs. It is this territorial issue that has kept the hardworking Heart of Dixie group from being recognized by AKC. We now have Event Department folks questioning how clubs can hold field trials outside their Territory. Unfortunately, the AKC Departments do not have an understandings of other AKC Departments and how circumstances are different. But, you've heard this from me before.

Other AKC news includes a reminder that additional entries in field trials which right Now are \$1.50 will raise to \$3.00 effective January 1, 2009.

I was nominated for the 2009 AKC Lifetime Achievement Award for Performance Events and did make the Final three candidates for consideration by AKC Member Clubs. I appreciate the nomination and am honored to have made the final group. Final announcement of the recipients has not yet been announced.

On a positive note, I would like to thank Performance Director Doug Lunigren and Connie Thomas, who handles our field trial approvals, with their excellent & open lines of communications and help to me throughout the year when I have issues or questions.

ACTION ITEMS for 2008 BOD Meeting

 Last year the BOD asked me to review and suggest changes for the way Agenda Items are submitted to them for consideration. I am suggesting the following as a starting point for discussion and a change for the policy book.

Current Policy, page 77, # 4: Items must be submitted six (6) weeks prior to the board meeting. Items must be from an ABC officer or Committee heard, or from a Board member or Regional Club Items from individual members must be supported by ten (10) members' signatures." Suggested Change to replace # 4: Items must be submitted six (6) weeks prior to the board meeting. Items must be from an ABC officer, committee chair, a Board member, or a Regional Club who has first voted on the item by that club's members. Items from individual members should first be discussed with one or more of that person's Regional Directors before being submitted. The individual's item should be supported by five (5) actual signatures from each of the five (5) ABC Regions for a total of 25 signatures. Since agenda items need to be presented by someone to the board, it is best to have one of the regional directors sign on and present the Agenda item to the Board.

- Ed Tillson has asked that the BOD remove the Southern New Mexico Club as an ABC Regional Club due to lack of members. I've attached his email in this regard to this agenda report.
- 3. I believe that the Board should add a **Dual Dog Chairman** to the list of Single Appointments by the President, page 28 of the Policy Book. This person is needed to track the winner/winners of the Dual Dog Awards, order trophies, maintain records of winners, etc. After the Policy Book is revised this year by the temporary Dual Dog Committee, I believe that this would be easily handled by one person as opposed to a full committee.

Treasurer's Report - Janet Chase

To All Directors and Officers

5 YEAR COMPARATIVE INCOME SUMMARY

A 5-year comparison of income and expense is included for your information. We continue to be very strong financially. Net income increased significantly in 2007, primarily as a result of:

- National open and amateur championships had a significantly larger surplus in 2007, resulting from 2nd and 3rd place dogs in the open championship not being sold in the Calcutta and ABC retained that portion of the purse as well as there was an increase in the # of entries in 2007.
- Interest income increased as we were able to obtain higher rates
- on our certificates of deposit in 2007. Income from yearbook ads and sales increased and we were able
- to reduce printing costs in 2007. Magazine postage decreased in 2007 as we used a credit balance
- Magazine postage decreased in 2007 as we used a credit datance in our postage account resulting from fewer copies being mailed in prior months.
- Our AKC delegate was unable to attend some of the meetings in 2007, thus reducing those costs.

Also, note that magazine printing costs increased at a greater rate than advertising income in 2007; this resulted from more pages being printed as well as the use of more colored pages in 2007. This has been addressed by the magazine editor and changes implemented in 2008.

2008 OPERATING RESULTS

Financial statements at June 30, 2008 are included with this report. Key variances in operating results for the first six months of 2008 compared to 2007 are:

- Magazine advertising income in 2008 has decreased from prior years with a corresponding decrease in magazine printing costs. This information has been provided to the magazine editor for her review.
- Magazine printing costs in 2008 reflect a 3½% increase by the Marshfield office. This is the first increase we have had in many years. ABC has absorbed the annual increase of approximately \$1300; I do not believe a dues increase to cover these costs is needed.
- Expenses for executive secretary, membership data chair and ABC webmaster reflect increases approved by the Board of Directors, effective 1/1/08. Expense for the magazine managing editor was effective July 1, 2008.

The attached financial statements include results of the regional futurities. We continue to experience difficulty with some futurity host clubs submitting their requests for expense reimbursement – either lateness, lack of documentation for expenses or expenses that appear to be greater than anticipated. The futurity chairman is addressing this matter.

FUTURE GROUNDS AND BREED ISSUES FUND

The future grounds fund includes \$25/dog from the national championships and ½ of the increase in recording fees. The balance at June 30, 2008 is \$79802. Once this balance reaches \$100,000, the Board should make a determination whether or not to continue further additions to this fund. We should reach \$100,000 in this fund late in 2009 or early in 2010. The breed issues fund includes ½ of the increase in recording fees. The balance at June 30, 2008 is \$18544. We have targeted a balance of \$10000 in this account as a contingency for matters that may arise during the year. Detail of transactions in these funds is included with this report. I have also enclosed a computation of the estimated amount available for additional disbursements in 2008 if the Board wishes to do so. 2009 BUDGET

I will prepare a budget for submission with my updated report for the Board meeting in November. That budget will consider the impact of the economy on participation in field trials and shows – both recording fees and nationals entries for gun dog and all age championships as well as the national specialty show. The economy may also explain part of the drop in magazine advertising in 2008. ACTION ITEMS

- The Board should review the current level of disbursements being made from the breed issues fund to determine if any changes are to be made in 2008. See next page for details.
- Regional futurities I will defer to the futurity chairman as to how to address the problems we have with expense reimbursements for the running of the regional futurities. This may or may not result in an additional action item.

Currently National Breeder Referral inquiries have dropped to an average total of 5-10 e-mails and phone calls a month. 100% are looking for pet homes. I have received no inquiries for competition dogs — either show or field.

Today most all breeders have web sites or are listed on a kennel/ breeder website. Most all litters that are advertised on the various web lists will only sell to competition homes only. Many families who are looking for pets have reported less than desirable experiences dealing with those breeders. These elitist attitudes drive the average pet owner to the backyard breeders who are more than willing to supply their needs.

Currently there are 42 Brittany litters listed on the AKC Classified Web Site. Only six breeders claim to be members of the ABC

ABC National Breeder Referral has basically become a position Brittany Breed education. Many contact me who have found a breeder/litter locally and want to know if I know of the breeder and/or their reputation. In that process I have encountered a potentially huge issue of suspected puppy brokering. In larger metropolitan areas where established breeders can sell their pupples for \$800-\$1000 people are buying puppies from distressed backyard breeders who are unable to sell puppies. They are selling the females for profits and the less desirable males are surrendered to shelters. Some are filtered down to the various rescue groups while others are sold through shelters

AKC Delegate Report – Judith Tighe I appreciate the vote of confidence from the Board for the position of AKC Delegate to represent The American Brittany Club. As I advised president Hank Hartnek, I would not be able to attend the September meeting due to a prior commitment but have already booked for the December meeting in Long Beach, CA.

I have been busy with a question that came up about AKC Compliances for Regional Club Specialty Shows. Apparently the "Compliances" had been misinterpreted and show giving Clubs though they fell under the Parent Club's Judges Education. This is not correct unless the Club were hosting the ABC Summer Specialty. Dee Hempfield, who first brought this to my attention, is printing the list of AKC Compliances and application form in The American Brittany magazine. Mary Jo and Steve Ralph posted the AKC Specialty Show Compliances on the ABC Website and the different internet Brittany Lists. With the assistance of Mary Jo Trimble and Hank Hartnek, numerous negative responses have been sent to The American Kennel Club. I have attached the "Compliance" notice as to what AKC is now requiring for Regional Specialty Club approval.

Part of AKC's problem is spelled out in the September Delegate Meeting Report. The declining registration numbers are severely impacting AKC's core revenue and alternative revenue. Their competitors' financial incentive tactics are causing significant losses in revenue. The number of litters registered with AKC is declining. Fewer registerable dogs equates to fewer registrations, fewer pedigrees, fewer transfers, and less of a pool of newcomers for our sport. Less and less core revenue from pet registration shifts the financial burden directly to clubs and its members. There are at least 30 all-breed registries in addition to the AKC. Since 1992 there has been a 53% decline in AKC registrations.

AKC would like clubs to reach at least 200,000 people with advertising. Two websites are recommended: demandAKCpapers. com/.org/.net and puppybuyerinfo.com/.org/.net directing buyers to learn about the value of AKC papers and registered puppies. The websites advise how to recognize the false claims of scam artists or non-AKC registerable puppies. I recommend this information be part of the ABC website.

I will hopefully have more information for the Board by the Nationals

To all Specialty Show Chairmen and Specialty Show giving Clubs. I confirmed specialty show compliance with Mike LaVallee in Show Operations at AKC. The way show compliance works is this:

- A. Regional Brittany Clubs holding either an independent specialty or having it with an all breed club MUST complete ONE (1) of the following activities within 10 miles of the Club territory:
 - 1 Independent AKC Sanctioned Match
 - 2. AKC Educational Match
 - AKC CGC Test
 - 4. Active Public Education Program 5. Other Educational/Outreach Programs

They must complete TWO (2) if activity is outside the 10 miles of the Club territory.

- B. Every show-giving club is required to conduct and document at least TWO (2) of the following eleven activities in its area within the calendar year to be approved for the next calendar year's show(s).
 - 1. Conformation and/or Obedience/Rally or Agility training classes
 - 2 Breeder Referral Service
 - 2 Educational Programs for Club members & the public or 3. Formal Judges Education.
 - 4 Dog Show Tours
 - Registered Handler Seminars or Workshops 5
 - 6. New Exhibitor Briefing
 - 7. Opportunities for Provisional Judges AKC Show Committee Seminars
 - 8.
 - 9 **Disaster Planning**
 - Meet the Breed 10.
- **Health Clinics** 11.

FOUR (4) of these category B activities are required if the club's shows are held beyond 10 miles from the club's territory.

I asked Mike about Southeastern Brittany Club (we have no show but used as an example) and stated we consider the whole State our territory. He said we were listed as Pinehurst and it would only encompass 10 miles outside of Pinehurst. He stated they would not yank shows from clubs that did not meet ALL the requirements but encourages everyone to try to comply.

The form, Statement of Compliance, is to be submitted with the application for a future show and is now posted on the ABC website. Dee Hempfield will also publish the form and particulars in the Brittany Magazine

Now, the statement "Parent and Regional Club Judges Education Program" under eligibility requirements applies only to a Regional Club hosting the ABC Summer Specialty only. It does NOT cover their club's own independent specialty or specialty with an allbreed club.

I personally feel it is good relations in some respects but stretches our overworked volunteers that already put in many hours.

One last thing. Even if the independent club is with an all breed club, they must still comply,

Judge's Education Committee Report – Diana Kubitz, Judge's Education Coordinator

At the direction of the board, I purchased a Dell Projector that can be hooked to a laptop to do the Judge's Education Presentations. I got Dell to throw in a hard case and I purchased a three year replacement warranty – total cost \$797.81. It was a little over our projected cost so I ran this past Hank Hartnek before purchasing the projector. Hank told me to go ahead with the purchase. Since the purpose was to be able to send the projector where needed for the presentations, I needed to be sure that it would arrive safely and that we could replace it if it were damaged.

This was an exciting year for our committee. Linda Elbert, Jessica Carlson and I worked hard to get the Judge's Education Presentation upgraded before the summer specialty. Linda Elbert burnt the midnight oils to accomplish this for us. Agnes Rodrigues presented judges education and a breeder's seminar at the Summer Specialty in California. It was well attended and the comments from the participants were all favorable. Agnes, thank you for a job very well done!

Hal Engel saw the presentation just before that upgrade in a presentation Linda Elbert did in Louisville. He commented that we had taken what Jodi had started and moved it to a new level. That was our goal and we continue to make improvements as we notice things that need to be tweaked. Jessica is masterful at finding exactly the right photo when we explain what we want and that helps the efforts considerably. Linda Elbert's computer expertise helps make changes quickly and efficiently. We have done one update since the Summer Specialty. I gave that presentation at the Ontario Brittany Spaniel Club's 30th Anniversary celebration and it was very well received. Linda and I plan to get together for one more possible update before the nationals.

I contacted AKC about the boards approval of my recommendation to have judge's take judge's education every five years. I spoke to Mr. Peter Gaeta. He said that he doubted that the AKC board would approve it, but asked that I write a letter to him that he could take to the board. (Letter included)

I was then contacted by a gal on the AKC staff and asked to write an article for the judge's newsletter – standard's edition. I contacted committee members and included Hank Hartnek and Mary Jo Trimble. Each contributed a thought or idea for the article. I got to work armed with all their comments and completed the article. I sent it to the committee and after a minor clarification, sent it to AKC. was contacted almost immediately about the article and told how good it was. I was then told that AKC had to adhere to parent club wishes and if the ABC wanted judge's to have judge's education every Write years, so be it. We have yet to know if that will actually come in writing from them, but my recommendation is that club's only hire judge's that meet the criteria for specialty shows,

the Summer Specialty and the National Specialty. If there is a judge that is chosen that does not meet the criteria, they can be asked to contact me and I'll arrange for them to see the presentation prior to the event. I sent the article I wrote to Dee and she published it in the ABC magazine. (Included)

Our "glitch" for the year came when we tried to implement the Judge's Ringside Mentoring criteria. My committee and I had no part in coming up with the criteria, but we tried to work within its parameters. Since there were no instructions from either the author or AKC, we were rather fumbling in the dark. When contacting AKC and the author, we didn't get any clarification that was any help. The implementation was a disaster and we scrapped the entire program to begin anew.

I wrote a series of articles for the magazine to enlighten members about mentoring and its criteria. I also plan to have a meeting of mentors and potential mentors at the nationals. We need everyone who undertakes mentoring of judges to be on the same page - ABC's continuing belief in the Brittany as a dual dog.

Our committee has functioned well, with everyone contributing ideas and photos when asked. I'm proud of our accomplishments in 2008 and look forward to two events that are already scheduled for 2009!

I'd like to personally thank the board for their support of the Judge's education committee. We are striving to keep up with the responsibility of keeping the breed "forever a dual dog." If you haven't seen the new presentation, please make an effort to do so. I think you will be pleasantly surprised. We start with the standard, show a good example, a bad example and then a field photo to show why the standard is written as it is. When I did the breeder's seminars at the nationals last year, we got lots of great comments and enthusiasm for the presentation. It is my hope that everyone will recognize the work that has gone into this presentation and think we are continuing to improve the presentation. We will also be working with Steve Ralph to have our own page on the ABC link where we will have the new presentation and other supporting materials.

Ringside Mentoring: after doing research from other breeds, we have decided that the ABC list of Ringside Mentors should be by invitation only. The committee will have the criteria at hand and recommend people from around the country that they know meet the criteria. In addition AKC provides that anyone who has been in the breed for twelve years or is a breeder judge may also mentor. Action Item: We would like board approval for the new ABC ringside Mentor Criteria.

Action Item: We would like board approval to have ABC's list of Ringside Mentors be by invitation from the judge's education committee. They would be added to the mentors already approved by the committee.

Action Item: We would like board approval to ask regional clubs to hire judges who meet the five years judge's education criteria. We feel that ABC will need to police this as much as possible ourselves until we are sure that AKC will implement this policy.

Action Item: We would like the board approval that judges for the Summer Specialty and National Specialty meet the five year judge's education requirement. Arrangements can be made to insure that a judge has completed the requirement by contacting the chairman.

Judges' Education Criteria for ABC Mentors The ABC Breeder Mentor requirements are meant to be a guide in selecting mentors. The Judge's Education Committee will be responsible for selecting individuals in their areas of the country that meet these criteria; individuals they feel would be good representatives of the American Brittany Club. The names of those people will be sent to the Judge's Education Chairman. The Chair will review those chosen and then invite those individuals to join the ABC Ringside Mentors. According to AKC anyone having twelve years experience may mentor and sign mentor's slips, so if someone is not chosen to be an ABC mentor, it does not eliminate them from mentoring. AKC does check credentials on individuals mentoring to be sure they have twelve years experience.

1. A full member in good standing of the American Brittany Club for the past 12 years.

- 2. A full member of a regional Brittany Club for the past 12 years. 3. Having bred, whelped, and raised Brittany litters in accordance
- with the ABC Code of Ethics would be considered helpful. 4. Having attended at least 5 ABC National Events that include both

conformation and performance (field trials). (5 Total) 5. The applicant, to be effective, should:

- · Be well versed in the history of the Brittany,
- · Be knowledgeable about the Brittany Conformation Standard,

- Be willing to have prospective judges come to their home or kennel to observe and discuss Brittanys,
- Attend any classes or meeting for mentors when possible.
- · Realize that their conduct reflects on the ABC at all times,
- Should be unbiased.
- · Adhere to Brittany standard and it's quest to keep the breed "forever dual" in keeping with the ABC Mission Statement.

We thank judges for taking the time to attend Brittany events judge's education and turning to the American Brittany club for ringside mentoring. AKC's requirements for becoming a judge are lengthy and costly, so we appreciate your efforts on our behalf

Last month you had the opportunity to read AKC's criteria for ringside mentoring. These articles are designed to help everyone understand what mentoring entails.

Several years ago AKC designed new criteria for judges to apply to judge breeds. One of the things required was mentoring. At that time the judge could ask another judge already approved for a breed if they could observe in the ring while judging was taking place.

It became apparent all too quickly that this caused more problems than it was worth. It was time consuming and bogged down the judging process. Many judges didn't want to be bothered by having someone in the ring with them, thus having to justify their selections.

AKC came up with ringiside mentoring to replace this procedure. Each parent club was asked to come up with a criterion for the mentors in their breed and submit it to AKC. The Brittany criterion was authored by Karen Stout and Dee Hempfield. Then it was handed off to the Judge's Education Committee.

Some months before the criteria had been sent to me, I had selected mentors from among my committee members and other Brittany exhibitors that had helped with presentations in the past that I knew I could count on to step up to the plate when asked

I feel that mentoring a prospective judge is as important as our judge's education presentation. In the presentation we are illustrating our standard and implanting the idea in their minds that this is a "dual" breed. During the ringside mentoring process we have an opportunity to reinforce those ideals.

Our objective in mentoring is not to pick apart dogs being shown on a given day. It is instead to point out those good qualities we can show them and answer their questions. As an example, many times judges will ask why that dog is "paddling" or "high stepping". Mentors need to know that it is generally caused by a short upper arm. In our breed we are looking for reach, which is a forward motion, not an up and down motion, which would make a dog tire quickly in the field. The fluid reach of a dog is demonstrated in the breakaway at a trial or when you loose a don for burting. when you loose a dog for hunting.

The judge's education committee feels that it is necessary for someone mentoring to have a background in both show and field events in our breed so that they may better answer questions on form and function. We very often get a question on head of a Brittany. It's important that we emphasize that what's on the end of it that head is most important in a we emphasize that what of the end of it that head is most important - it's nose! The nose leads them around the field seeking game. The eyes are deeply set to prevent injury in heavy cover and the lids are tight to preventing weed seeds from entering the eye.

In our new presentation we are showcasing the standard, followed by good and bad examples of that particular part of the standard. Following that we try to put in examples from the field that demonstrate that function. We have Jessica Carlson, camera in hand, at field trials looking for the exact photo that we need. Linda Elbert has re-ordered the presentation following the criteria

just mentioned.

Most exciting is the fact that we have enlisted the help of Robin Tomasi in editing. Robin has obtained new software that will let us combine still photos with video portions. Instead of having a presentation CD and two field DVD's; the entire presentation will be on one disc. Linda Elbert has a fancy new burner that stamps the ABC logo on the front of each disc for a more professional effect. This will make our presentations much easier, more professional and we'll have the added ease of distributing one disc to the judges that ask for them for their records.

All prospective mentors will be required to view the judge's education presentation regularly as it is always a work in progress. Being familiar with the presentation will enable the mentor to answer questions in the manner necessary to have consistency of information distributed. Everyone needs to be on the same page with what we are telling the judges. In addition to the ABC and AKC criteria for mentors, a mentor must have

line, but rather disseminating information on behalf of the American Brittany Club. That's a heavy load of responsibility and can not be taken lighty.

A mentor might be asked by a judge if there is a possibility of visiting some kennels of Brittanys and will assume the responsibility for setting up those visits. We always have high hopes that a judge will want to go to a field trial to observe and should that blessed event occur the mentor would be responsible for setting that visit up.

At this point ABC is not paying expenses for mentors or presenters. This makes In cases you have a for paying expenses to harmons of presented a mits makes in cacessary that we have enough mentions to cover the country in all regions when they are needed. Sometimes a show club contacts me and asks me to arrange for a mentor at their show. Sometimes they contact a person in the breed in their area. AKC has asked each breed club to provide a list of approved mentors. Only those people on the list will be accepted by AKC as an official mentor. There are forms available on the AKC website that judges will usually have with them and after completing the mentoring assignment, you would fill out the judge's form and sign it. They will be responsible for getting the form to AKC

Norm of ARC. Recently a Brittany exhibitor was asked by a judge outside the ring if she would mentor her. The exhibitor assured the judge that she hadn't been in Brittanys that long and couldn't mentor. The judge said; "on, well AKC will just have to live with it, sign the sheet." When this was reported to me, I confirmed the report and then contacted AKC. They said that they would not accept the form when it was submitted to them and that the entry at that show had not been large exound the quelific annuer. I was at a dog show last year in Monroe and the chairman of the specialty

I was at a dog show last year in Monroe and the chairman of the specialty asked if I could mentor as she had three judges requesting mentoring. I agreed to mentor them. One just wanted me to sign her sheet as she had another breed to go watch. I wouldn't sign and she was peeved, but that would have defeated the purpose of mentoring. The other two candidates were there for the rest of the classes and Best of Breed. I was delighted to find out that they had taken judge's education and were preparing to apply for Brittanys. They both have a good eye for our breed and I'll look forward to seeing their names on a list of approved Brittany judges. My point with this story is that, in order to mentor you must know the rules and follow them. No matter how many dogs you've owned, finished or bred, there will always be something new to learn about our breed or purebred doos in general. Mentoring

Something new to learn about our breed or purebred dogs in general. Mentoring is an awesome responsibility because as I stated earlier, you are representing our breed and the American Brittany Club, Since our mission statement clearly states that we want it to remain a breed that is "forever dual," we need to instill that importance into our judges. The dual dog rests in the hands of the show judges so it's our job to make sure they are well educated about what the American Brittany club expects of them.

The judge's education committee takes mentoring very seriously. As I stated in a previous article, it's just as important as the judge attending a presentation. During the presentation they see the standard illustrating form and function and it is emphasized that ours is a "dual" breed.

In addition to the formal presentation, we have bags of beans to represent the weight of birds, a photo board of game birds and cutouts of 17½ and 20½ inch silhouettes. These visual aids help those judges who might not be familiar with field activities.

The cutouts represent the 3 inch difference in our standard and gives us a chance to remind the judges that the height standard is the same for both sexes. At the very end we have a "hands on portion where we have individuals bring in their dogs for the judges to go over. When necessary we instruct judges how to measure a Brittany properly in the ring.

In the past we tried to get some of the top ten Brittanys in for the hands on portion of the presentation. Today we get them if we can, but we work hard to get different color representations and to make sure that the judges get to feel a field hardened dog.

Mentors take up the challenge then to watch breed judging with the prospective judges, answering questions and pointing out things to look for when judging. It's the next opportunity to explain to them that the American Brittany Club and its members take our "dual" dog concept very seriously. They say that everyone needs to hear things three times in order to remember it. In judge's education we believe that you just can't say it too much.

We aren't asking the judges to put up field dogs just because they are field dogs. We are asking them to use field conditioned dogs that have merit and meet the standard of our breed. Some judges just ignore those dogs no matter how fine the quality might be, because the minute they feel those muscles or hear the word whoa, they will not use the dog.

Then there is the hair issue. Field dogs by virtue of their everyday life in the field and their handlers, who should never be allowed to hold a pair of clippers, usually have much less coat than a dog that is primarily shown. No matter how many times we tell them that collar marks are acceptable, they still penalize those dogs with collar marks and lack of coat. I'm sure the phrase judges hate to hear the most is; "too little is preferable to too much." At times the presentation script even adds the words "and we really mean it."

This intensity of feeling wouldn't be necessary if everyone showed their dogs according to our standard. We've all heard someone say that they have to have coat in order to be competitive in Best of Breed or Group. But what would happen if they never saw that length of coat again. What if from this moment on, everyone groomed their dog according to our standard? "Too little is preferable to too much' wouldn't need to have such emphasis.

A mentor will be faced with difficult questions at times. Which is more important, type or movement? My answer might be that if they are the correct type, they will generally have correct movement. O that this is a "dual"dog who must be able to hunt all day long, so correct movement is all important. What might your answer be?

In November we will schedule a meeting during the show weekend for mentors and prospective mentors. We'll throw out questions and ideas and maybe do a little role playing to make everyone comfortable with being a mentor. My experience is that when Brittany people come together for a common goal, very good things usually result. What better goal could any of us have, then keeping our wonderful breed as it was meant to be.

Judging The Brittany

In an early article in *The American Brittany*, Vol 6, No. 11, June 1955, Dr. Allen Truex, M.D. stated:

"Whenever Brittany people gather, the discussion invariably includes "dual purpose dogs." The dictionary states that dual is, an adjective meaning, "composed or consisting of two parts; twofold." Then the dual purpose dog is one that is proficient at two different things. We are now the proud owners of the greatest "dual champion" of all times – she can eat more and sleep more than anything on four legs! However, this is not the twofold purpose we usually desire. Rather it is that the dog has the ability to perform well and also looks good. The dog's general appearance should appeal to the owner's eye for canine beauty. Not many of us would desire a sway back, bowlegged dog. Neither would the hunter knowingly purchase a blinking, trailing or gun shy dog. So the dual dog we desire is one that looks good, or has the proper conformation, and can also do a creditable job in any type of field work for which we wish to train him."

Today the discussion has not changed and when Brittany folks gather the question is still asked; "How do we keep our breed dual?" We have more dual champions than any other breed and we would like it to stay that way.

In September of 2007 I submitted my yearly report to the American Brittany Club's Board of Directors. In it I recommended that we tell AKC that we want judges to take our Brittany seminar at least every five years. It passed unanimously.

You might ask the reason for the recommendation and it is quite simple. Today, tomorrow and forever, The American Brittany Club wants the Brittany to be a "Dual Dog." Part of that is in the hands of the breeders who must adhere to the standard when breeding. After that it's in the hands of the judges, show and field.

In the field the dogs are asked to find birds, point them with style and as adult dogs to be "steady to wing and shot." So part of that process is in the handler's hands and is dependent on the quality of his training. The other portion is up to the dog. If they point the bird and all is in order, the judges must then decide which of the dogs run that day should place.

Similarly in the show ring, the handler trains the dog and it's up to the dog to perform on a given day. In this article I will be discussing the standard and the show judge's responsibility in helping us keep our breed dual.

Our judge's education committee has come up with many new and innovative ways to explain what the Brittany is asked to do in the field and we would like to share this information with judges. Some of you may have received a CD in the mail asking you to watch it and give us your opinion. Hopefully many of you will be taking a seminar in the near future and will able to see the field portions we have added to our presentation. Understanding what our dogs are asked to do in the field should make understanding the function of the dog as it applies in the ring easier.

When judging a Brittany you must never forget the "function" of the dog. It must move quickly over all types of terrain, through all types of cover in an efficient "ground covering" manner, seeking game. Every part of the Brittany standard is written with this in mind. The properties to another the game. He group devices the second set of the secon open nostrils to smell the game, the eyes well set to prevent eye injury in heavy cover, etc.

Too often, we see judges choosing a dog with a pretty coat over a dog with better structure and sound movement. Judges need to look past the coat color and coat condition, and look at the structure and soundness of the dog underneath. A coat can be trimmed to enhance the outline of a dog; therefore, you need to feel the dog to ensure that there is sufficient substance under the coat. Some judges see coat color, coat condition and head as "type and completely miss the dog's overall soundness and utility as opposed to simply considering how attractive the dog looks standing.

Our mantra about coat is "too little is preferable to too much." We repeat it often because we mean it. Profuse coat will never be seen in a dog that is worked in the field, because it would require hours of grooming to pick out burrs and other debris. On the flip side, a Brittany should not be over groomed with a scissored outline, back brushed legs, or a coat full of product.

Brittanys may not always show enthusiasm at a show, finding birds and playing with the family is more fun, but they should NEVER be timid or mean. A bird dog, while it can be gentle, must be bold and sound in mind and body.

Shoulders should be sloping and set correctly. Today we see straight shoulders set too far forward. It makes for a pretty Topline, but it is not correct. Similarly we are seeing feet too flat. We've come up with new ways to make comparisons with good and bad examples in our newest presentation for judges.

Our standard emphasizes side movement and the ability of the doo to cover ground efficiently; it does not mean that the down and back movement can be discarded. We are concerned because we see far too many hackney gaits or "flipping fronts" (caused by too short an upper arm), being put up over sounds dogs with proper movement. Our standard calls for "reach and drive." Reach is when the front foot moves well forward, not up. The upward motion is not efficient in the field and will even cause injury to the dog in some cases. At the very least the dog will not show the stamina a dog with correct movement will exhibit. We are looking for a well balanced dog that moves well. When you find that, you will find the "type" we look for in the Brittany world.

A friend and mentor of mine was a Standard Poodle breeder. Every time I visited her she would be "roading" her Poodles from her bicycle. One day I asked her why. She explained that conditioning was part of conformation and that no dog in the ring should be overweight or move with a rolling gait. She went further to say that since I owned a sporting dog, conditioning was even more important. Every time I see an over- weight Brittany whose sides roll as they move, I cringe. I know the handler didn't do their homework and their dog is not in proper condition to show and could not perform the breed's function as it was meant to do. Judges please don't reward this lack of condition

I would be remiss if I didn't make some mention of size. If you find a sound dog with good movement in your ring and you think it might be too small or too tall, please measure it. Our standard for males and females is the same - 17%" to 20%". Far too many judges decide a dog is too big and do not use it. Again, please measure

Brittanys come in a variety of colors, orange and white, liver and white, orange roan, liver roan and tri-color. No black is acceptable in nose or coat. Tri colors are acceptable, but not preferable. A Tri must be a liver and white, which exhibit classic orange markings specifically described in the standard; no less and no more. If you find a mis-marked Tri, you need to make a reference in your judges book that it is mis-marked and please do not use it.

Again Dr. Truex says: "So the dual dog we desire is one that looks good, or has the proper conformation, and can also do a creditable job in any type of field work for which we wish to train him." They may be asked to do that for six hours, 30 minutes, or anything in between.

I have only touched on a few examples of things we have tried to clarify in our new judge's education presentation. We look forward to meeting you and getting your opinions on what we have done A judge's education program is always a work in progress for any breed, but technology has enabled us to do things not possible before. We look forward to many more improvements in the future, hence the "every five years" request. We'll try to make that as easy as possible for judges. Whenever we are asked to present at a judge's institute or do a presentation anywhere, we answer a resounding YES!

In November 2007, I asked the Board of Directors of the American Brittany Club to approve a plan for continuing education of AKC judges judging Brittanys. The Board approved my proposal

We propose to AKC that judges need continuing education in our breed. To that end, we would like them to take our judge's education seminar at least every five years. We now have field footage available that helps us explain form and function in our breed.

We have had ever increasing complaints about judges and after checking into the matter I find that most of the complaints are legitimate and not sour grapes. Somehow AKC has given the judges the impression that type should take precedents over movement. Nothing could be further from the truth. If we are to keep our breed DUAL, this misconception needs to be remedied... Keeping the Brittany "forever dual" is part of the mission statement of the American Brittany Club and we are requesting AKC's help to insure that show judges understand how important this is to it's membership.

As the parent club we feel passionately that in order for our breed to remain dual, judges need to be reminded regularly that our breed's to improve our presentation, finding new ways to explain our standard and the reasons for each point within our standard. All things point back to the field to emphasize the function of our breed.

AKC Legislative Liasion Agenda Report – Mary Jo Trimble The buzz word for 2008 has certainly been "Mandatory Spay &

Neuter'

If it hasn't hit your state, just wait, it's coming. We (dog owners) nationwide have been putting out fires from HSUS & PETA throughout the United States during all of 2008. Major fights have taken place with Assemblyman L. Levine's AB 1634 mandatory spay & neuter legislation in California. After much watering down, the bill was finally killed for at least the time being. It is un-believable the amount of time and energy that had to be put into that effort by people not only in California but nationwide. Part of the difficulty on a bill like this one is that each time it has an amendment, new letters of opposition have to be written or your name is dropped from the list. I wrote several letters on behalf of the ABC Board of Directors.

Similar proposals are now on the table for the city of Chicago, IL. TV personality Bob Barker has been making the rounds trying to influence the mandatory spay and neuter proposals. I believe Houston, TX is also looking at similar proposals.

Another buzz word with no real definition is "Puppy Mill". We need to exercise caution in using that term ourselves. I always thought a puppy mill was a huge operation with no regard for sanitation or genetic studies of pedigrees. To animal rights activists, a puppy mill might well mean you as a breeder of more than one litter a year. While most of us would like to see commercial breeders regulated (which they are almost everywhere), we have to be alert that cage and space requirements and license fees for non-neutered dogs do not put the home breeder totally out of business. Pennsylvania is still fighting for equitable regulations and a bill was quickly withdrawn this last week in Michigan which would have really hurt anyone who bred more than one litter in a year.

One of my main concerns is the failure of dog groups who oppose bad legislation to work together rather than pointing fingers at who copies who, who is doing what, etc. I try and post alerts to the internet chat lists. Even doing that opens the door for criticism from people as to what is 100% factual and what is speculation. I guess my philosophy is that I'd rather post the information and let the locals weed out the details than to sit back and wait until it is too late to take action.

I am happy to report that Anne Short of the Central Maine Brittany Club represented the ABC at the National Animal Interest Alliance (NAIA) Conference this year and will be sharing that training and information with us.

PLEASE: EVERY CLUB NEEDS AT LEAST ONE PERSON TO MONITOR LEGISLATION IN THEIR STATE. This is a job that needs constant vigilance and help from each of the Regional Clubs if we are to stay on top of things and protect our ability to enjoy our Brittanys.

AKC Pointing Breed Advisory Committee Report – Ray Trimble The AKC Pointing Breed Field Trial Advisory Committee last met in Boise, Idaho, on 22 April 2005. This committee normally meets every 5 years with the next meeting not likely until around 2010.

The new Director for Performance Events is Doug Liungren, Doug comes to this job with a background in pointing dog field trials. Doug has hit the ground running and with a background in pointing dog field trials has a knowledgeable and common sense approach to most problems that can and do plague field trials. Doug is a former member of the Pointing Breed Advisory Committee as well.

American Field Liaison Agenda Report – Ray Trimble During the last few years the American Brittany Club has been trying to increase the number of regional trials that advertise their events in the American Field in order to make sure that dogs running in the ABC National Championships and Classics are qualified to receive the title of Champion or Runner-Up Champion if they would win one of our national stakes. A derby placement in an American Field sponsored event qualifies a dog for life as does an adult placement. Regional Clubs that are members of the AFTCA will have win certificates issued to their Amateur handled winners which qualifies them to receive AFTCA Championship titles.

The ABC Secretary has asked clubs to indicate if their regional trials are also American Field sponsored on the ABC Field Trial application blank. The ABC trial reporting form has a place to check if results are also being sent to the AFTCA as well as the AF and AKC. Not as many clubs are members of AFTCA as are now running their trials under the American Field.

A larger proportion of the events not run under the AF are Walking I rials which does hurt people trying to get win certificates or placements that would make the dog eligible to receive an AF/AFTCA Gun Dog National Champion Title. They still get the AKC National title but not the American Field or AFTCA ones.

- D. The Gun Dog Classic/Championship was hosted by the Iowa Brittany Club, 29 September 2 October 2008, at the Union County Ranch, Thaver, IA.
- E. The Grouse/Woodcock Classic/Championship was hosted by the three Michigan Brittany Clubs, 30 September 2 October, at Meredith, MI.
- F. The Quail Classic/Championship was hosted by the Missouri Brittany Club, 6-10 October 2008, at Union County Ranch, Thayer, IA.

ABC Dual Award Committee Report - The Dual Dog Award **Committee 2008**

Committee Chair: Robert Rankin, Midwest Director (Northern Oklahoma Brittany Club/Midwest)

Committee Members: Ron Auten (Michigan Brittany Club/East Central), Hank Hartnek, ABC President, (Sahuaro & San Diego Brittany Clubs/West - Ex-Officio Member), Diane Hedstrom (Minnesota and St. Croix Valley Brittany Clubs/Central), Diana Kubitz (Western Michigan Brittany Clubs/West East Central), Linda Langford (California & Bama Brittany Clubs/West & Feet Central), Linda Langford (California & Bama Brittany Clubs/West & East Central), Linda Langford (California & Bama Brittany Clubs/West & East Central), Teresa Richmond (LaSalle Brittany Club/Central) – Did not participate, Sharon Van Wieren (Hoosier and LaSalle Brittany Club/Central & East Central

This Dual Award Committee set out with the intent to propose necessary changes to the Dual Award point schedule that would clarify ambiguous wording and include a point schedule that would include points for the Amateur Gun Dog Nationals winners During the course of our interaction, this committee has identified some key concerns that have hindered us from rendering a single unanimous recommendation to the board. We have submitted two separate proposals, and have highlighted the issues that have been addressed

The debate began with the <u>issue of point allocation between</u> the Open All Age and Open Gun Dog placements. In 1995, when the Gun Dog Champion first earned points toward the dual award, there was a 2 point difference in points earned between the Open All Age winners and the Open Gun Dog winners (See Exhibit 1). An early tabulation of the committee revealed a preference for equal point allocation, with Rankin, Auten, Kubitz and Hedstrom in favor, Van Wieren and Langford opposed, and Richmond positions unknown at that time. After some discussion, a proposal was submitted (See Exhibit 2) which would "split the difference" and change the point differential between the Open All Age and the Open Gun dog winners to 1 point, recognizing the fact that the Open All Age dogs are the only dogs which still have to complete the performance events after the bench show. The debate over this issue caused three of the six voting members of the committee to propose splitting the existing award into two awards (See Exhibit 3 below).

- 1. The W.E. Stevenson Sr. Memorial Award to remain in place for the dual dog participating in the concurrent running of the Trials in Booneville and the show in Fort Smith, and
- 2. A new memorial (possibly in memory of Ron Zook) to be offered for the dual dog participating in the Gun Dog Nationals in Ionia in October as well as the National Show in Fort Smith.

The two award proposal would eliminate the issue about how to allocate points between All Age Dogs and Gun Dogs, and opens the door to the ABC awarding more than one dual dog in a single year. For the first time, however, this proposal will be introducing language that qualifies the way we recognize our duals, by adding a categorization to differentiate a Gun Dog Dual from an All Age Dual. Some members of the committee expressed concerns about the long term effect this may have. (In favor of Split awards: Rankin, Kubitz & Auten. Opposed: Hedstrom, Van Wieren, & Langford).

The second key issue was concerned with the allocation of points between the Open and the Amateur Stakes. Again, the committee seemed to be split with 4 members (*Rankin, Hedstrom, Kubiz & Auten*) in favor of Amateur stakes earning same number of points Auter) in rayor of Antacebraits states earning same minuter of point as the Open counterpart, and 2 (Langford, VanWieren) in favor of Amateur stakes earning one point less than the Open counterpart. (Historical notation: When the Dual Dog Award was first introduced in 1943, equal points were awarded for Open and Amateur Stakes, and lesser points for Futurity winners. In 1963, when the W.E. Stevenson Sr. Memorial replaced the original award, the Futurity Dual Award had been separated out, and the All Age winner and Best of Breed points were increased from 5 to 6 points.)

A third critical issue debated was the <u>tie breaker language</u>. This committee entertained proposals from a) no tie breaker language, allowing ABC to declare multiple dogs as winners in the event of a tie, to b) counting the number of dogs defeated in the field to determine the tie breaker, and lastly, c) in the event of a tie, preference will be given to the Open placement. In the end the committee seemed unanimously willing to accept the wording that in the event of a tie, preference will be to the Open Placement.

The clarification of the wording for the 3 point rule seems to be generally agreed upon

- Bench Champions entered and shown in Best of Breed competition or in any non-regular classes with single dog entries (such as Veteran's, Field Trial Class, etc) shall receive an automatic 3 points toward the Dual Award, however no additional points are to be accumulated for placements in non-regular classes.
- No points are awarded for participation in Parade of Champions, Stud Dog or Brood Bitch, or any other non-regular classes with multiple dog entries.
- The single highest point value earned in the show will be the one used in calculating the award.

One final issue that was suggested was the addition of 3 points to any <u>dog who earns an Award of Merit in the Bench</u> Competition. This primarily allows a dog who is not a bench champion, but earns an Award of Merit from a non-regular class involving a single dog entry, to earn equivalent points to Winners and/or an existing bench champions

As a result of our deliberations, this committee has agreed to present two separate proposals to the Board for their discussion and review. Below, you will find the following three exhibits:

Exhibit 1: Existing point system for the dual award.

Exhibit 2: Proposal for a single dual award, where the Open Gun Dog points equal the Amateur All Age points, which are one point higher than the Amateur Walking Gun Dog and one point lower than the Open All Age.

This proposal most closely represents the historical Dual Dog Point schedule, with minimal change.

Supporters of this proposal are Van Wieren, Langford.

Exhibit 3: Proposal for separate Dual Awards, returning the W.E. Stevenson Sr. Memorial Award to the All Age competitors and introducing a new Ron Zook Memorial for the Gun Dog Competitors.

The two award proposal was developed to avoid the conveyance of preference for one field stake over another. This proposal separates the Dual Winners into All Age and Gun Dog categories, and eliminates the 1 point difference between Open and Amateur stakes that has been in existence since 1963.

This proposal has the slight majority, with supporters Rankin, Hedstrom, Kubitz and Auten.

Our proposed systems follow, and whichever is approved, will update page 67 of the ABC Policy Book.

Exhibit 1: EXISTING POINT SYSTEM FOR THE DUAL AWARD

Extracted from the ABC Policy Book, (as published on ABC website as of 9/4/2008)

The ABC may designate Dual Dog of the Annual Show and Trial to any dog that has amassed the most points for his or her

performance in the National Specialty Show and Field Trials. In case of a tie, preference will be given to the Open All Age Championship, then the Amateur All Age Championship then to the Open Gun Dog Championship. The points upon which the dog is to be chosen shall be based on the following scales for field trials and bench show performance and the points obtained in each shall be totaled. Dogs must win points from both the show and field. Only the higher show placements will be considered but all field placements shall be allowed in the final tabulation. (1995) The Amateur Gun Dog

The Futurity continues to receive support from a core group of Dual minded ABC members. This is the only ABC National event which combines a field trial with a show event at the same time and place other than the ABC National All Age Championships. Combining the opportunity to run in a trial and compete in a show is one of the opportunity to run in a trial and compete in a show is one of the hallmarks of the ABC Futurity. The largest group of exhibitors is Breeder/Owner/Handlers of their nominated dogs. The Gun Dog Trial entries show strong support. The All Age Trial Dogs are not as well represented as the Gun Dogs. The majority of the show entries are also run in the field trials emphasizing the Dual Dog which is a large part of the Futurity.

Communication between the Futurity Chairman, the Secretaries, the ABC Treasurer, and the ABC Executive Secretary has been constantly to find ways to improve the futurity.

The Futurity Committee has worked to improve communications with the sponsoring clubs and exhibitors. Communicating with a new committee in each region every year continues to be a frustrating experience. Finding Regional Clubs willing to sponsor a Futurity and procuring grounds continues to be a problem. We are making progress toward the goal of finding future hosts before nominations are due

The Futurity is a Breeder's stake. It is their opportunity after the planning, breeding, whelping, raising, evaluating, and training the pups, to demonstrate the results. This is not a game for financial gain. ABC members who value the Futurity know that the experience of showing and trialing after spending two years with pups from the planning process is the challenge of a breeding program.

Since the inception of the 50% split of profits between ABC and the Regional clubs, regional clubs have mostly kept their costs within the available entry fees. In 2006 & 2007 the Net Profit from the entry fees of \$6183 provided \$3092 to ABC. The ABC 10% share of the Nomination Forfeits of \$2482 added to the profits from entry fees has generated \$5574 to the ABC for those two years

The Futurity continues to present challenges to the committee

- · A dwindling pool of breeders and exhibitors impacts the available entries
- A shrinking pool of viable clubs with grounds, schedules, and available workers to successfully host a regional futurity.
- Problems with host clubs regarding :
- * Developing budgets and holding costs within a budget.
 - * Understanding show and field procedures
 - * Getting field and show write ups and pictures to the ABC Futurity Secretary in a timely manner
- Providing the ABC Treasurer with expenses and appropriate documentation for settlement in a timely manner.

The ABC Board of Directors may be asked to consider alternatives in the future which may include:

- · Allowing host clubs to retain all entry fees, eliminating the need for documentation of expenses and information now required developing the profit split with ABC.
- Resume the Futurity Run Off, possibly incorporated with the ABC Gun Dog Championships
- Return to a single Futurity if numbers continue to decline. Reducing the overhead required by multiple host clubs. ACTION ITEMS:

A revision to the ABC Policy Book which up dates the Futurity

Policy is included in this report for your consideration Rational: The policy book has not been updated for many years.

The revisions mostly update the policy to reflect the operational aspects of the Futurity, and incorporate the addition of the Gun Dog Standard of Performance.

The 2008 ABC Futurity Secretary Report is included in this report below:

2008 ABC Futurity Final Report – Judy Graves, Futurity Secretary In 2006, we started the program with a total of 144 litters nominated, producing 480 males and 456 females eligible to participate. Every owner and breeder of this class of 2008 was sent a final forfeit form, due back to the ABC in September of 2007. A total 353 forfeits were paid for 194 dogs, representing 99 of those original 144 litters or 68.75%. The total resulting purse from this process was \$13,757. This represents the litter nominations and forfeits; less ABC's operating costs (\$2,994) of the program. Each section was given 1/3 of the nomination fees (net of expenses) plus their prorated share of the forfeits paid by section. Prize money is then broken down into 2/3 to the owners and 1/3 to the breeder.

In total, 184 field forfeits and 169 show forfeits were paid for 194 different dogs. Each owner of a nominated dog was sent an entry form for the section indicated on their forfeit form. 132 dogs were entered in the three sections from the original 194 (68%). A breakdown by section is as follows:

The concept of the dual dog is definitely carried out in the Futurity program, as over 50% of the forfeits paid were for dual entries. 22% entered only in the show ring, while 28% entered only in the field. However, once the actual event entry forms were due the participation dropped to only 41% for dual dogs, with field only dogs increasing to 31% show only dogs remaining at 28%.

Participation by section indicated the Central region as the largest with 92 entries from 65 dogs. Eastern had 66 entries from 49 dogs and the Western section hosted 60 entries from 40 dogs. In total, 218 and the Western section nosted ou entries from 40 dogs. In total, 218 entries were recorded with 154 dogs participating in the program. We had 22 dogs entered in more than one section. There was only one show dog and one field dog to win money placements in the Eastern and Central sections. The breakout by region is as follows:

In the 2007 whelping year, only 108 litters were nominated producing 653 pups. If the % of participation holds as above, we could expect to see approximately 130 dogs or only 246 total forfeits. American Brittany Club Futurity

All dogs must be owned by members of the ABC or their immediate family as described by the AKC.

The ABC Futurities are established for the purpose of encouraging and benefiting breeders and owners of Brittanys.

The trials and shows were inaugurated by the ABC and are conducted under their rules.

The following rules have been adopted by the Board of Directors of the ABC and are distributed to those making entries in the futurity through printing on the reverse side of all futurity entry forms **Conditions and Rules**

Prior to 1/1/2004, nominations of the dam were to be made within 30 days after the bitch was bred, at which time the first \$10 forfeit was paid. A second \$10 forfeit was then to be paid before the litter reached 30 days of age.

Beginning 1/1/2004, the first and second forfeits are to be combined into a single "first forfeit" fee which must be paid within 30 days (judged by postmark) after whelping date. This simplifies record keeping for both the ABC and the litter owner. It also eliminates any confusion caused by "failure to whelp". The ABC Board of Directors will set the fees.

Litter Forfeits

Each ABC futurity shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and all her progeny whelped on or after January 1st of any given year Bitches must be owned, co-owned or leased by a member of the ABC or by a member of is the immediate family.

All dams nominated and all stud dogs used must be registered in a recognized stud book or be eligible for registration (2008) (*Must be registered at time bred*). Only dogs registered in a registry recognized by ABC will be eligible. (2008) (*precludes registries not recognized by ABC*)

Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the pups have been whelped, at which time the forfeit must be paid. Payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC futurities (field [all age or gun dog]) and/or bench upon fulfiliment of requirements below. The current fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors and can be found on the futurity form in "The American Brittany" magazine. (2003)

Late litter nominations will be accepted as late as 90 days from whelping. Late fees are \$30.00 for 31-60 days, an additional \$30.00 for 61-90 days. Nominations will not be accepted after 90 days from whelping. Additional late fees may be imposed from time to time by the ABC Board of Directors. (2008) (defines late fees, provides for all litters to have the same amount of time within the penalty) The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations. (2003)

Trial and Show

The trials and shows shall be held at such time and place as may be determined by the ABC, and shall be announced at least 60 days before the day set for the commencement.

Entries for each ABC Futurity shall close October 29th for the current year's futurity. (Delete, no longer applies)

On or before Final Forfeit forms postmarked on or before September 15th of the year following a pup's birth year those members owners expecting to start dogs must describe their entries on blanks furnished free of eherge by the ABC and pay on each a forfeit for each trial and for each show in which it is planned to participate. The September forfeit forms shall emphasize the advantage to nominate futurity prospects for both the All Age and the Gun Dog field event s at the September forfeit date. (2008) (deleted, confusing, not required) On the final field entry you must declare either all age or gun dog. Current fees are set by the Board of Directors and will be found on the forms provided. In addition, a starting fee, set by the ABC Board of Directors, must be paid before the start of the events. No dog may participate until its registration number has been received by the ABC. (2000)(2001) All dogs must be owned by members of the American Brittany Club (ABC) or their immediate family as described by the AKC. (2008) (added to set member criteria)

For those not meeting the September 15th deadline, a late fee of \$100.00 \$50.00 for each field and \$50.00 for each show entry (plus the regular forfeit fees) may be paid before December 31. (2000) Any subsequent deadline changes must be approved by the ABC Board of Directors. (2008) (changes from \$100.00 per dog to \$50.00 per entry, adds BOD Approval)

Show classes shall be divided by sex. Senior classes shall be for dogs whelped January – April, Intermediate classes shall be for dogs whelped May – August and Junior classes shall be for dogs whelped September – December.

Purse

The litter forfeits, less all expenses incurred up to the closing of entries on Sept 15th, will be divided equally between the sections holding futurities. The forfeits due on September 15 shall be allocated to the designated section and event for which paid and added to the base amount above. This, after the deduction of 10% for the ABC will constitute the purse for that section. All expenses for the preparation and running of the events will be covered by the starting fees. (2000-2001)

The base purse will be divided in the following manner: 1/3 all age, 1/3 gun dog, 1/3 show. 2/3 of the entire purse (Base and September forfeits) will go to the owners of record of the winners at the time the event is held, with 1/3 to the breeders of the winners. to be paid to the recipients by the national futurity secretary Prize funds will be paid to the recipients by the National ABC Treasurer after verification by the ABC Futurity Secretary. (2008) (*Revised* wording)

In the field the division of the purse shall be 40% for first, 25% for second, 20% for third and 15% for fourth.

In the show the division of the purse shall be: Best in Futurity 40%, Best of Opposite Sex 30%, 2nd place male (and female) 10%, 3rd place male (and female) 5%.

Any winnings designated and not awarded shall revert to the ABC.

Dual Futurity

The dual futurity winner in each section will receive 5% of the gross-purse for that section, divided 2/3 to the owner and 1/3 to the breeder. The owner's winnings must be paid to the registered owner. If no dual futurity winner is named the 5% will revert to the ABC.

The dual futurity winner must have placed in both field and show and the winners will be determined by the point schedule. Points must be won in both bench and field futurity events for a dog to be eligible for that sectional futurity dual dog award. (see Dual Dog point Schedule). (2008) (*reworded*)

Any winnings designated above and not awarded shall revert to the ABC. (2008) (reference to Dual Award, same as other winnings)

Auction

All ABC sponsored events i.e. Futurities, Summer Specialty Show, National Specialty Show, Open All Age Championship, Amateur All Age Championship, Gun Dog National Championships, and Classics or any other events as may arise, coordinate activities related to fund raising with the National Auction Committee and submit all anticipated and contacted solicitation and donor lists to the chairman of that committee. (2000) Vendors will not be allowed to conduct auctions and/or raffles at ABC events. (2000) Exception: Brittany (Rescue Organizations) (2002)

15. If an ABC futurity host club requires a cash advance, this advance must be approved by the futurity

chairman and cannot exceed the ABC/s share of the futurity purse. (ABC/s share of the purse is 10% of the forfeits less expenses) (2008) (moved to "Budget Area")

Futurity Organization

The following are recommended guidelines for those in charge of running various futurity stakes and shows. They should be followed as closely as possible. Those guidelines that state "must" must be followed as directed here. CHAIN OF RESPONSIBILITY

General Procedures

An official application form must be submitted to either the ABC Futurity Secretary or the ABC Futurity Chairman.

Forms are available from the Futurity Secretary or on the ABC Web Site. Request should be made as early as possible, preferably at least a year in advance so that prospective participants can plan their travel schedules. The Futurity Chair will review the application and distribute to the ABC Futurity Committee for discussion. (2008) (Added directive)

Forms necessary for participation in the Futurity will be available on the ABC Web Site. (2008)

The trial must be planned with the following in mind and each decision must be made with the thought of what will make the best trial and show for the most people in the area.

Grounds

The locations should be as well distributed as possible. The eastern futurity includes the east coast and east central regions, the central is for central and Midwest regions and the western for the west coast region. It is not advisable to have the eastern on the west side of the area the same year the central is held on the east edge of their territory.

Ideally The grounds should have enough continuous courses so that no ground shall be covered more than twice a day.

Native birds should be available enough to allow for proper running of continuous courses, if possible. They may be supplemented with released birds in such an approved manner as to reasonably insure birds on every course and in as natural a condition as possible. Birds cannot be hobbled or shackled. Should the bird population prove too low for proper judging, a second series with planted birds may be run at the discretion of the judges.

See duties of the chairman and section manager for procedures for obtaining and approving grounds.

Dates

The futurities may are to be held during the week, just before a regional trial, or **immediately** following a regional trial **during the spring season**. (2008) Both field events (all age and gun dog) will be offered. They may be run simultaneously or to follow at the host clubs discretion.

It should be kept in mind that some amateur handlers involved may find mid -week trialing impossible. The futurity may be held during the fall or the spring.

The choice of dates should hinge on the time the best grounds can be obtained, the optimum conditions for trialing and the time that will draw the best entry. Dates for the futurities are subject to approval of the futurity committee.

Judges

Judges should be carefully selected and the choice made of top judges in your area or in the adjoining areas if the budget can be stretched that far. The "Standard of Performance for Brittany Futurity" shall be sent to the selected judges for the field trial and the trial shall be judged according to those criteria. Judges should be those who recognize a class dog because in this event dogs with future potential to improve the breed should be selected. A judge who has agreed to judge one futurity may do a second stake in the same futurity except that a person may judge field in one event and the show in the same or another region.⁴ Two judges shall be allowed used in the field. No judge may officiate in more than one sectional of the field and /or show in the same year. However the same person may judge the field (all age, gun dog, or both) event in one section and the show in another. If qualified, the same judge may be used for the field and show event in the same sectional. (2008) (Revised language)

No judge should have an interest in the stake by virtue of ownership or an involved stud. Breeders of eligible litters may not be selected. See SHOW PROCEDURES for points on the selection of a show judge. The choice of judges may must be approved by the futurity committee. (2008) (redefines approval)

*It is preferable to have separate judges for All Age and Gun Dog field events, however, in the case of very few entries and limited entry fees to pay expenses the same judges may judge both the All Age and Gun Dog Field Events. Budget

You MUST run your trial and show from the entry fees received.

Your budget shall be based on the current fees established by the board of directors for each field entry and each show entry. The amount should be estimated by taking 60% of the number of those who pay the September 15th forfeit, which shall be supplied by the futurity secretary and/or the treasurer-soon after entries close on that date. You are requested to budget your funds carefully and, under NO circumstances, go over your budget without clearing it with the futurity chairman. (2000)(2001)

The Amerian Field ad, trophies, judges gifts, and premium printing/mailing costs paid by ABC will be included in the final settlement. The sectional host club shall submit a claim for the expenses to the ABC Treasurer for reimbursement. Major expenses such as Judges Expenses, Grounds and show site rental, Horse rental for Judges, Birds, etc, must be documented by a receipt or other appropriate documentation. The host club shall use their own club checks and be reimbursed for expenditures by the ABC Treasurer. Any advance will be included in the final settlement between the host club and the ABC. (2008) (defines expenses)

If an ABC futurity host club requires a cash advance, this advance must be approved by the futurity chairman and cannot exceed the ABC's share of the futurity purse. (ABC's share of the purse is 10% of the forfeits less expenses)

Reporter: The reporter is generally paid for his horse.

Judges

Both field and show judges should be paid travel expenses to and from the futurity, if the budget will allow. (2008) (added budget reference) It has always been the judge's decision as to method of travel with the club picking up air fare or if driving give them the option of reimbursement of actual expense (gas, lodging, meals) or mileage (last set price of \$.25 a mile). Horse rental for the field judges is also an appropriate expenses. (2008) (added horse rental) Some show judges set a flat rate that covers travel as well as the fee. and/or If the field or show judges selected are on the grounds to judge the regional trial trial or show, before or after the futurity, travel and judges expenses should be pro-rated. (2008) (Added prorated expenses)

Section manager, Show and Field Trial Secretaries: These all fall into the same category, they should be left to the various individuals for reimbursement. They should be reimbursed for out of pocket expenses if they request it.

Printing, postage, telephone are the basic expenses. No personal expenses.

Procedures (2008)

Effective with the running in 2006 ABC will go 50/50 on the profit made by clubs hosting the ABC Futurities. ABC will absorb reasonable losses based on the guidelines listed. (2005) (Reinstated in 2008) (*inadvertently left out of policy book*) ABC will absorb losses only in the event of extenuating circumstances, such as weather problems, requiring the Futurity to be run on an additional day. Regional costs are not extenuating circumstances. (2008) (*Defines ABC exposure to losses*) The ABC Futurity Chairman must approve expenditures prior to final settlement with the host clubs by the ABC Treasurer. (2008) (*Adds Chair approval over settlement and losses*) Final settlement with regional clubs will not be forwarded by the ABC Treasurer until all write ups, pictures, and expense documentation have been received and approved. (2008)

Nominal costs of running a trial and show with in the entry fees are acceptable expenses. Regional host clubs must provide their own insurance. (2008) (Added to define costs)

The futurity entry fee monies are deposited by the sectional secretary as directed by the treasurer. The section manager or section secretary signature shall be on the futurity account and that person will be responsible for paying all (local) expenses incurred in the running using checks supplied by the treasurer. The futurity entry fee monies are to be mailed to the ABC Treasurer at the closing of entries for the event. (2008) (Removes reference to writing checks on the futurity account by the section secretary, adds clarification)

The ABC futurity secretary is responsible for the payment of the "American Field" listing, printing and mailing of entry forms, eatalog printing (2008) (deleted from Secretary duties, catalog is responsibility of the regional club.) and patches as well as judges gifts (2008), (added to insure equality between sections) and these amounts will be charged against your budget. There is no AKC license fee nor any recording fees to pay to the ABC. There is no charge for any publicity you might desire in "The American Brittany", nor for ads in that publication. You should submit requests directly to the magazine.

Upon receipt of the marked catalog, checks for the winners and breeders will be made out by the treasurer and sent to the ABC futurity secretary, who will deliver them in person or by mail, to the recipients of the awards. In a case where the recipient of the award cannot be located, the award shall revert to ABC. (Added in case recipient cannot be located) The ABC Treasurer shall pay for Futurity expenses billed directly to ABC (such as American Field ad, trophies, judges gifts, etc.). (Judges gifts added to insure equality between sections) All owner's checks, field, show and dual, are made to the OWNER OF THE DOG. A copy of the purse payment schedule will be supplied by the treasurer and should be posted in a prominent place at both the show and field trial.

Under no circumstance is a purse payment to be made other than as described here.

No detailed budget is suggested due to variance in expenses from area to area. Host club(s) should prepare a proposed budget and submit it to the Futurity Chairman for approval. (2008) (added chairman approval) but remember to stay within your budget. Remember to try and make the trial and show worthy of the classification of a National ABC event.

Trophies

The national futurity final running secretary is responsible for acquiring all trophies and ribbons and they shall be uniform for all sectional futurities. (1989)

Field

Rosettes for four places, the usual colors, without the AKC seal, and a trophy for each place.

Show

Purple and gold rosette for BEST IN FUTURITY Red and white rosette for BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX.

- Green rosette for DUAL FUTURITY
- Six sets of ribbons (or rosettes) 1st thru 4th, regular colors: blue, red, yellow and white

Purple and white ribbon (or rosette) for 2nd place male Purple and white ribbon (or rosette) for 2nd place female Purple and white ribbon (or rosette) for 3rd place male

- Purple and white ribbon (or rosette) for 3rd place female
- Any futurity trophies not awarded should be kept in a safe place and the ABC futurity secretary notified of the location.

Duties of Futurity Chairman

The chairman shall be appointed by the President, and shall be responsible to the Board of Directors for his actions and decisions. He shall act at all times to protect the interests of the ABC and see that the events are run in accordance with the ABC standards and rules **1st Year**

- The chairman shall make all decisions on the acceptance or rejection of irregular forfeits.
- 2. He shall act as advisor to the 1st year secretary in the acceptance of litter forfeits and to the futurity secretary in the acceptance of entries.
- He shall keep records from the figures supplied by the secretary of the number of litters nominated, whelped and of the fail-towhelps (deleted, no longer required) and report them to the club at the annual membership meeting.
- During the late summer the chairman must poll his committee for the selection of futurity managers for each stake to be held the following year. The sectional managers must send their choice of grounds and dates to the chairman as soon as possible.
- 5. The chairman shall coordinate the dates and locations so that a futurity event shall be available to as many members as possible. Before dates and locations are finalized they must receive approval of the futurity committee.
- 6. The chairman shall then clear the dates with the regional field trial dates committees.
- The futurity chairman must then receive approval of dates from the national field trial dates chairman. The grounds and dates should be firmed by the end of the year in order that the schedule for the field trials may be built around them.
- As soon as the dates and grounds are finally accepted they shall be sent to the editor to be listed in "The American Brittany".

2nd Year

- The chairman shall act as an advisor to the futurity secretary in the acceptance of entries.
- 2. He shall poll the futurity committee to obtain the approval of the judges selected by the various managers.
- 3. He must be able to act in an advisory capacity to the sectional managers
- 4. He must keep in touch and be sure the sectional managers are
- following scheduled procedures as closely as possible.
- 5. He must submit a report at the conclusion of the events to the board of directors and to the annual membership meeting.

Duties of the Futurity Secretary The ABC Secretary shall act as the 1st year (litter nominations) The President may appoint an assistant for the 1st year secretary. The Litter Nomination Secretary shall be concerned with duties for the 1st year of a nominated litter.

The President shall appoint the Final Running Secretary to be concerned with duties for the 2nd year of a nominated litter. The President shall appoint an American Brittany Club Futurity Secretary to handle the duties of the Futurity. He may appoint a Litter Nominations Secretary to serve as an assistant to the ABC Futurity Secretary. (2008) (*Removes Executive Secretary Responsibility, redefines Presidential appointment*) 1st Year - Litter Nominations Secretary

- 1. The futurity secretary shall see to the printing of all necessary litter forms.
- 2. He/she shall receive and acknowledge all litter forfeits.
- 3. She must refer any irregular entries to the chairman for his decisions, presenting them in an anonymous manner so that all decisions may be made without bias. At no time may the secretary make decisions on irregular entries or policies.
- 4. The futurity secretary shall report to the chairman on a regular basis the forfeits received and which payments are made by transfer of credits. Deleted, not required.
- 5. She shall see that all money is deposited as directed by the treasurer.

The Executive Futurity Secretary shall keep a record of the number of litters nominated, the number of litters whelped, and the number of litters failed to whelp (deleted, no longer required) and send them to the futurity chairman.

2nd Year - Final Running Secretary ABC Futurity Secretary

- The futurity secretary must prepare a list of eligible litters for publication in the June or July "The American Brittany" magazine.
- 2. About July 15 she must mail to each breeder of an eligible litter some entry forms and a cover letter requesting him to notify all interested persons who purchased a pup from his litter. Entry forms should also be mailed to all who have requested them and notice made in "The American Brittany" that forms are now

- available from the Futurity Secretary. Deleted, not required This mailing must include the criteria for judging the field futurities
- 3. The futurity secretary shall receive all September forfeits. (2000)
- 4. The money received shall be deposited as directed by the ABC treasurer.
- 5. The entries should be checked for eligibility consulting with the membership data chairperson to be sure all dogs are owned by members.
- 6. All non-members shall be notified of the membership requirement.
- 7. Entry fees shall be returned to those who do not choose to join
- All entries received without individual registration numbers shall be accepted as conditional and owners should be notified that the dogs may not compete unless numbers are received prior to the opening of the show-or the drawing for the trial. Individual registration in any recognized stud book is adequate but litter registration is not.
- 9. No refunds shall be made for dogs that the owners fail to register in time.

Duties of the Sectional Futurity Secretary

- 1. The sectional futurity secretary shall receive the final entries and fees. Entries shall close uniformly a week before the event is held
- 2. All entries must be checked for eligibility with the listing supplied by the futurity secretary.
- 3. Any irregular entries should be checked with the chairman and/ or futurity secretary.
- Any entries sent in error to the futurity secretary shall be honored if received before the closing date.
- 5. The sectional futurity secretary shall send checks for deposit The section and the section of the section deposition deposition deposition to the treasurer as soon after receipt as practical, using transmittal forms supplied by the treasurer or futurity secretary.
 At the time of closing of entries the sectional futurity secretary shall send an account of the number of show and field entries and the section of the deposition of the deposition of the deposition.
- and the balance of the checks for deposit in the futurity fund as directed by the treasurer. In case any checks are returned, entries involved may not compete without payment in case or the form of a certified check. (Revised 2008)
- 7. The sectional futurity secretary shall send all checks to the treasurer for deposit

The sectional futurity secretary shall develop the show catalog from the current information provided by the ABC Futurity Secretary. (2008) (added to insure catalog conforms to current guidelines)

- 8. When the show and trial begin, the sectional futurity secretary shall perform such duties as normally fail to a field trial and/or show secretary.
- Within one week of the completion of the trial all entry forms, a 10. list of field winners and two marked copies of the show judge's book must be sent to the futurity secretary. Be absolutely sure the correct owners' names are given on all money winners, show and field.
- 11. Send a marked catalog with field and show placements to the treasurer.
- 12. Send a full financial report to the ABC Futurity Final Running Secretary at the end of the trial. (The treasurer will furnish you with a sample to follow in submitting this report.)
- Within one week of completion of the trial send the ABC futurity 13. secretary your write-up and pictures for both the field and show. The **ABC** futurity secretary will be responsible for sending the write-up to the managing editor of "The American Brittany" magazine and the "American Field"
- 14. The sponsoring club is responsible for sending results photos and write-up to the ABC final running secretary. After 20 days, a \$25.00 penalty plus \$1.00 a day after 20 days will be assessed the sponsoring club.

Other clubs may assist, but one club will be held accountable for the regional futurities. Therefore, it might be prudent for the sectional futurity secretary to be a member of the sponsoring club

IMPORTANT things to remember: Be sure you have the correct name of the owner on all money winners, show and field. 15. Remember to check the registration number on all dogs that are listed by the futurity secretary as needing numbers. Under NO CIRCUMSTANCES may any of these dogs start without a registration number. It shall be your duty to watch these things; do them correctly yourself or check that the sectional manager does them properly.

If there is a tie, the highest placing field dog shall be declared the winner. (replaced with) in case of a Tie, Multiple Dual awards will be presented. Dual award prize money will be split between the winners and an additional trophy and ribbon will be provided at a later date. (2008) (Adds, duplicate award, instead of tie breaker)

Points must be won in both bench and field futurity events for a dog to be eligible for that sectional futurity dual award.

Remember A dog cannot win points for getting a ribbon in a class toward the dual dog award-unless he defeats at least one dog in the field and the show. (2008) (revises language) **Reporters**

It is important that a full report of the trial and show be sent to the futurity secretary within one week of the completion of the trial and

show. The sponsoring club is responsible for sending results and snow. The sponsoring club is responsible for senaing results and write-up to the ABC futurity secretary. Be sure to include photos with the write-up. After 20 days, a \$25.00 penalty plus \$1.00 a day after 20 days will be assessed the sponsoring club. Other clubs may assist, but one club will be held accountable for the regional futurity

Checks

The purse shall be figured by the ABC treasurer and checks shall be made o ut for the correct amounts for the various winners. All checks for the owners of the winners are signed by the treasurer and sent to the national futurity secretary for distribution.

Trial Procedure

The stakes is are not recognized by the AKC but is run under the ABC and the American Field. It shall be judged on the "Standard of performance" adopted by the ABC Board of Directors. Braces shall be 1/2 hour; if a second series is necessary, it is at the judges' discretion as to the length of time and the use of wild or planted birds. Since this is not an AKC event, the five minute out of judgment rule does not have to be applied, and the judges so advised.

The drawing may be conducted as a straight from the hat procedure if you desire with the following exceptions. All bitches in heat should be declared before the drawing. The rest of the field is drawn and then the bitches in heat are drawn. If an uneven number should require that the fist bitch be run with the last dog from the regular draw, and such dog is a male, that male shall be switched with the last female in the regular draw. If this should result in handler conflict the next to the last female in the regular draw shall be switched instead. etc.

In the case of scratches, the field trial committee shall determine and announce before the running whether dogs shall be run alone or moved down to the next incomplete brace. In the case of bitches that come in heat after the stake has commenced, they shall be dropped down to the last brace. In case of any places being withheld, the money awards for those places shall revert to The ABC's general fund.

There shall be four places awarded. Placements should be awarded to the "BEST DOGS" in the stake.

Finding birds on the course should be primary concern, however as these field events are conducted under rules of the American Field and not AKC a placement with out birdwork on the course is permissible. (2008) As such the five minute out of judgement rule does not have to be applied and the judges so advised.

Standard of Performance for Brittany Futurity

ALL-AGE (Optional Horseback)

Futurity dogs shall be judged as to their potential for developing into championship All Age Brittanys. They shall hunt the forward limits of the course with intelligence, eagerness, and desire with the obvious intention of finding birds.

The dog must locate and point birds staunchly and with style. No extra credit shall be given for steadiness to wing and shot, but they shall be judged for their intelligence in finding and pointing birds in an unfinished All Age manner.

The dog must respond to the handler but shall not be penalized for being more independent than an adult dog. A dog that handles at the extreme edges of the course shall be preferred over one that needs a scout to keep him on course, but both shall be preferred over a dog that does not have sufficient range for an All Age dog.

GUN DOG (FOOT HANDLED ONLY) (2008) (added Gun Dog Stake

Performance Standard) Futurity dogs shall be judged as to their potential for developing into championship Gun Dog Brittanys. They exhibit a keen desire to hunt, a bold attractive style, intelligence in quartering and seeking objectives, eagerness, and desire with the obvious intention of finding birds.

The dog must locate and point birds staunchly and with style. No extra credit shall be given for steadiness to wing and shot, but they shall be judged for their intelligence and consistency of application in finding and pointing birds in an unfinished manner indicating their future potential as a high class Gun Dog.

The dog must hunt for it's handler at all times at a range suitable for a handler on foot. It must cover adequate ground, but range out of sight for a length of time that would detract from it's usefulness as a class hunting dog.

Futurity Show

It is recommended that the person in charge of the show should have conducted an AKC licensed specialty show, held in conjunction with a field trial.

An AKC licensed judge does not need to be used. Most licensed judges charge more than can be afforded and many will not judge an event that is not AKC approved. It has been the custom to use a Brittany person who is an AKC licensed judge, a professional show handler who has shown quite a few Brittanys, or a breeder who has had experience judging sanction matches. The choice of a judge must be approved by the futurity committee. The judge should be

instructed not to penalize dogs for being in field shape. He should be instructed to choose dogs he feels are the correct size for their age, not on future show potential. (deleted) (2008) No dogs are to be measured in the futurity show.

The futurity show should be held in conjunction with the trial. It may be indoors or on the trial grounds, wherever appropriate space is available

Stewards

Two persons are needed, one to check dogs into the ring and one to pass out armbands, round up participants and answer questions Classes

Junior Males Intermediate Males Senior Males

Males born September/December Males born May/August Males born January/April

Winners: The winners of the three (3) preceding classes are judged against each other and the best male is chosen, then the second best (chosen like reserve winner at a regular show) and then third best (chosen like a second reserve winner). The rule to follow is that after the judge chooses his winner, the dog that placed next below the winner is brought into the ring to compete with the two unplaced dogs. There shall always be three (3) dogs in competition. The three (3) top males receive money prizes.

Bitches: Are judged in the same order as the males were judged. Best in Futurity: The best male and best bitch compete for this award

Be sure the judge marks his book and that absentees are crossed out (or marked "ABS" or "DNS") and all winners noted.

The show judge shall be provided with a copy of the "Judging Procedure" in order to ensure correct class and money placement. (2008) (added to insure correct judging procedure)

This has been another year of improvement for the American

Brittany. Thanks to the continued hard work of Dee Hempfield and other members of the magazine committee, the quality content and format of the American Brittany are excellent and continue to improve and the schedule of delivery of the publication to the membership has improved markedly.

While the Managing Editor and the Publishing Editor continue to make every effort to ensure the publication is sent out in a timely manner, review of external pressures, data processing, communications, adherence to deadlines, additional help and upgrading of technical equipment reveal opportunities for improving the delivery schedule.

Processing results from field trials, shows and hunt tests continue to be a major problem. Some clubs fail to use the standard reporting form and hand writing is often illegible. Both of these make the job of accurate type setting very difficult. Further, some reports are incomplete, which requires more time. These things compound the amount of effort required to produce quality and timely publication copy. The membership should expect a more aggressive approach from Editors with regard to compliance on submission deadlines, accuracy and completeness. The membership should expect to provide assistance in these areas to the Managing Editor, the

Debilishing Editor and the Executive Secretary. Dee Hempfield, Mary Jo Trimble and Linda Langford continue to work well as a team. Their functions are interrelated and sharing information makes things go smoothly and provide better service to the membership. Also, the staff support at the publishers is improving although Dee keeps a close watch on the activities and schedules.

During the next year, the magazine committee should again review the magazine portion of the policy book and submit any revisions for Board of Directors approval.

Collectively, we hope to continue to improve the content and timeliness of the magazine.

2008 National Championship Grounds Liaison - Tom Milam (Booneville)

Last year a number of improvements to the Booneville facilities were made. These included new dog kennels, new corrals, new barn front and new roof on the club house

This year it's going to be a matter of survival. Extremely high water in March, April and May has made things difficult. According to Larry water was 20 feet over the bridge. It has all receded to within the banks of the creek but it's still wet in some areas. Any remaining quail have been pushed out of their typical habitat. So there will definitely have to be birds planted for this fall trials. Larry said they planned to release 2,000 birds about September 1st with another 1,000 birds just before our Nationals.

Costs for birds will be going up due to increased transportation costs. Last year 11 week old birds were \$2.85 with transportation costs of \$600. This year birds will be at least \$3.00 with transportation costs up as well but undetermined at the time of the meeting. Also bird feed costs will be going up from about \$3.00 to about \$5.00. This is also due to increasing fuel costs. The BMCA authorized up to \$5,000 to cover feed expenses for the year.

Even though the grounds are wet in some low areas, grasses are coming back and there is lots of growth in some areas. Mowing has started in the drier areas and will continue in all areas once things dry out more

Food plots in the drier areas are ready for planting. Plots in the wetter areas won't be ready for about two weeks. Due to higher transportation costs, costs for seed will be going up somewhat this

Larry reported there is continued encroachment of trees into the open areas along the courses and in the areas of the food plots. Tom Milam suggested looking into a tree cutter. He mentioned they had used one on the grounds in his area with great success. Tom will provide information on a 10 inch tree cutter to Larry. Costs are estimated at \$6,000 and will be split between BMCA and AR state

ABC Policy Book Agenda Report - Dee Hartnek

I modified the Policy Book during March to reflect changes approved by the Board in 2007 and the latest version of the Policy Book was posted on the ABC website in March.

When I took over the responsibilities of maintaining the Policy Book, the only version available was in PDF format. The PDF file was converted to a Word file, but the conversion process is not exact. The resulting conversion put most of the existing text into random text boxes and many of the numbered items were converted to tables. These conversion quirks make editing much more time consuming and difficult than it would be in a true Word document. In addition, some of the text does not come through exactly as originally typed so misspellings and other text issues are created by the process. Further, there are multiple font styles, varying indentations and other inconsistencies throughout the book.

This year, it has been my mission to remove all text boxes and unintended tables to create a "true" Word document in order to correct the disparity of text styles, paragraphs and other formatting problems that exist in the Policy Book. This has been a very lengthy and tedious process, especially since I do not want to change any page numbers at this time to avoid confusion. However, I expect to have it completed by the 2008 Nationals. At that time, the Policy Book will be consistent as to style and format. Typos and grammatical errors will also be addressed during this process and should be largely eliminated before the Board Meeting.

The Policy Book Committee has concurred with the President's recommendation that the entire manual be reviewed and revised during 2009. Therefore, I anticipate substantial revisions to the Policy Book during the next year. The groundwork I have laid this year will greatly assist with changes required in 2009 and into the future so that future editing can be accomplished much more guickly and easily.



ABC Purina Program Report - Ray Trimble, Purina Coordinator

- 1. Two thousand eighty-nine (2089) entries competed in Field and Show Events supported by Nestle-Purina Pet Care over the period of September 07 through May 08. This number included both show and field events with 691 show entries and 1398 field entries. The number of National ABC events (27) had a total of 1647 entries, specialty and field events, while the non-ABC (9) events had a total of 442 entries. Field entries showed an increase of 127, while show entries showed an increase of 98 over 2007.
- 2. "Glitches" in the Purina Accounting Department causing slowness in clubs receiving monetary support, have mostly disappeared. This year, support was provided to two regional club specialty shows. Two shows per year are supported by a random drawing from clubs submitting applications. In 2007/2008, approximately 40 events are expected to be supported.
- 3. Clubs whose events are sponsored by Nestle-Purina must furnish an FEIN or Social Security number before Purina will issue the funds. Along with this requirement, Clubs must also furnish the Coordinator a signed copy of the judges' sheets. Ads, entry blanks or premiums, brace sheets, and write-ups should include the Purina Logo or otherwise give credit to them as a sponsor. Some reporters are not aware of this and the field trial committee should make sure they know to do so. We can add a Thank-You to the ABC Magazine reports if a club fails to acknowledge Purina, but we do not see the ones you send to the American Field before they are published. Funds will not be requested from Purina for your club if this info is not included with the "Orange Form" submitted after completion of the event.

Statistics Committee Agenda Report – Mary Karbiner, Chairperson P. Baird, R. Cartmell, J. Donnell, and M. Stout

Carryover item 2007: The field event report form. In the SPRING 08 season there were 88 regional field events reported (not including classics, national all age & gun dog or futurities) Nineteen of the forms were on the old blue sheets from AKC. Of those, three were computer generated without FDSB #'s. So, compared to a year ago (30 reports on old form) we made progress in getting most of the field event secretaries to convert to the new form

Continued Goals:

- To reach all event secretaries and encourage those not already using he new form to do so.
- For Secretaries to complete these reports with more accuracy and legibility by proof reading.
- · To keep those statistics that will aid various committees to complete their assigned tasks.
- Page 129 of the Policy Notebook re: Statistics Committee, item #7

Since the currently the statistics chairman does not do the qualifications for the National Open/Amateur Gun Dog Championships - they are compiled by the national gun dog secretary.

MOTION: The ABC statistician is to compile the list of qualified dogs for the National Open and Amateur All Age Championships. In addition, the National Open and Amateur Gun Dog Secretary shall compile the list of qualified dogs for those stakes. Those reports being sent to the Webmaster for posting at the appropriate times prior to the respective championships.

Summer Specialty Show Report - Barbara Dayton, Chairperson The 2008 ABC Summer Specialty show was hosted by the California BC. Best of Breed was Ch Triumphant's The Heat Is On. The CBC did a great job of hosting the show, providing unique prizes and wonderful hospitality. A BIG THANK YOU to CBC for the 2008 Summer Specialty

The 2009 Summer Specialty will be held in Greeley Colorado and hosted by the Skyline BC. There will be an Independent Specialty held on Friday August 21, 2009, put on by Skyline BC. Saturday August 22, 2009 will be the ABC Summer Specialty held in conjunction with Greeley KC. Sunday August 23, 2009, there is another All Breed show by Greeley KC. There is obedience offered at the All Breed shows as well. Elud Archuleta Cressler is the contact person. I have been to the Summer Specialty in Colorado before and it is gorgeous there and the Skyline BC put on a fantastic weekend for Brittany fans. There are also All Breed shows on August 15 and 16, 2009, the Buckhorn KC shows, and those shows are less than a half hour from Greeley. It would make for a great summer vacation to do both weekends and see the beautiful area in between.

2010 ABC Summer Specialty will be hosted by Central New England BC and held in conjunction with Farmington Valley KC in West Springfield, MA. There will be a total of 5 shows with specialties. The shows will be Wednesday through Sunday of 4th of July week 2010. There will be obedience and rally at the All Breed show. Dorothy Boyatze is the contact person. The CNEBC is working with the all breed clubs to assure a great week of shows and social time for Brittany fans. I understand it is beautiful out east in the summer. It's a perfect destination for a summer vacation that you can combine with shows

2011 ABC Summer Specialty will be held in South Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Host club is the Greater Milwaukee BC. The Summer Specialty will be held in conjunction with Cudahy KC. There will be 3 All Breed shows and the GMBC Specialty. The ABC Summer Specialty will be held August 13, 2011. Tom Jagielski and Deb Connell are the contact persons. The shows are close to Milwaukee and a reasonable distance from Chicago. There is lots to see and do in that area as well as doing the 2011 Summer Specialty.

I am working on securing a club to host 2012 and will have that on the agenda items for the 2009 Meeting. There are no agenda items for the 2008 meeting.

Trophy (Field) Report - Kathy Gluembo, Chair.

The trophies will be on site at the beginning of each of the Nationals. I have no action items.

Trophy (National Specialty) Report - Tom Schrank, Chairman

Trophy donations are down this year. I sent off a list of unreserved trophies to Steve Ralph, our ABC webmaster, to post as of Aug 20. It is the same list as July 7, except is has one MORE unreserved trophy on it, because a sponsor cancelled one of her 2 - 1st place sponsorships. \$27-less.

In most of June, and all of July, and to date in August, we have had NO Contacts from anyone about sponsoring any trophy or class

I am really concerned that if things don't pick up, ABC will really be in trouble with this years trophy portion of the show budget. Last year, Sandy & I sent in over \$4200. To date this year it has been only \$900, with only a \$27 check dated June 30 waiting to go in as batch #3.

As of today I have sponsor pledges from 6 individual members or families, totaling about \$550. (I emailed all, again today, asking for checks) If I recall, last year at this time we had over \$2500 into the Treasurer, and had pledges of another \$1000, at least. Only Texas Coastal Brittany Club has sponsored a class. No other regional club has even inquired about sponsoring.

Perhaps the Board of Directors has ideas of how we can STIR THINGS UP, to get some sponsors. I am sending out another mass email to all clubs and many of the supporters from the last several years, but don't hold out much hope for results.

We think maybe our economy is in a very tough place right now, but still can't understand why we are running such a tremendously reduced rate of sponsorships this year. WE would hate to see the trophy expenses become a burden to the show budget

WE are waiting to hear from Deneen as to Pottery order total, and will advise you when we email Janet Chase for check to Deneen, as to total of that portion of Trophies. We have all but 2 or 3 of all other items purchased, and will put together a list of our expenses for your review and approval, and sending onto Janet. WE have one Jr. Basket Sponsor, \$15 to date.

An updated list of un-reserved trophies was posted on the ABC website. Today we posted a reminder on the Brittany L-list.

We have picked up several Regional clubs and several individuals, in the last week. With only a month to go for sponsors to be included in the published list of sponsors, contributions are still way behind over last year, at this time. Total of \$4,220 for 2007

Sportsmen's Alliance Report No Report.

ABC Web Site Report - Steve Ralph

This year I completed the HISTORY project for the ABC Web Site, which now includes 1949 - 2007. This is includes write-ups on Championships and all National events for ABC. I will continue to update with the current year as it becomes available. I hope that this is something that becomes valuable to others. I also continue to try and gather and post all Regional Club and ABC premiums as they become available. Hopefully this will help advertise events and gather new members at these events.

National (All Age) Field Trial Secretary Report – Steve Ralph This year we have had to order new "welcome" badges for the Nationals, due to our stock becoming depleted. We ordered 250 to get a price break from the company. Futurity and National patches didn't need to be ordered as they were ordered in 2006 and cover up to 2010. Other than that, all other duties are up to date and we look forward to another quality National Championship.

ABC Yearbook Committee Report - Jessica Carlson

The 2007 Yearbook was well received and advertising plus book sales resulted in a small profit. The Committee has four requests for amendments to the ABC Policy Book regarding the Yearbook:

- 1. Amend the line stating "One copy of such program may be forwarded without charge to each advertiser in that year's edition.
 - Since several advertisers purchase more than one page of advertising, we would like to amend this line to state: "One copy of the Yearbook per full-page ad purchased may be forwarded without charge to each advertiser in that year's edition.
- 2. Amend the line stating "No unpaid or gratis advertising shall appear in such program, in effect, at the cost of the ABC.

We do allow for full-page ads for the official ABC Sponsors (Purina, TriTronics, Tracker, Christie) as well as for our Wrangler and Cover Artist. We would also like to allow advertising for significant donors to the Nationals, so our suggested amendment would read: "Fullpage black & white ads shall be offered to all official Sponsors of the ABC Nationals, the Wrangler, and the Cover Artist for the Yearbook. Companies or individuals donating \$300-499 worth of goods to the National events may be offered a half-page black & white ad in the Yearbook at no cost, and those donating \$500 or more may be offered a full-page black & white ad.'

- 3. Amend the next to last paragraph, regarding distribution and sales, to read: "The distribution and sales shall be as follows: On the first day of the Nationals, prior to commencement of the drawing, if possible, all printed copies (less those to be provided each paid advertiser without charge) shall be delivered to the site headquarters for the National All Age Championships. Sufficient copies shall be made available for sale at the National Specialty Show site where it shall be the responsibility of the Show Chairman, Show Secretary, or their designates to distribute and sell copies of the Yearbook and record the number of sales. All other sales and distribution shall be the responsibility of the Yearbook Chairman, ABC Secretary, or their designates. Appropriate records shall be maintained and all receipts for printing and related expenses delivered to the ABC Treasurer.
- Delete the last line, stating "One copy of the Championship Program Yearbook should be mailed to each club secretary each year. (1992)"

This has not been done in several years and since club secretaries cannot or do not make the book available to their entire membership, we view this as an unnecessary expense for ABC.

AKC Specialty Show Compliance Requirements

To All Specialty Show Chairmen and Specialty Show giving clubs.

This has been confirmed with Mike LaVallee in Show Operations at AKC. The way show compliance works is this:

- A. Regional Brittany Clubs holding either an Independent Specialty or having it with an all breed club MUST complete ONE (1) of the following activities within 10 miles of the Club territory:
 - 1. Independent AKC Sanctioned Match
 - 2. AKC Educational Match
 - 3. AKC CGC Test
 - 4. Active Public Education Program
 - 5. Other Educational/Outreach Programs

They must complete TWO (2) if activity is outside the 10 miles of the Club territory.

B. Every show-giving club is required to conduct and document at least TWO (2) of the following eleven activities in its area within the calendar year to be approved for the next calendar year's show(s).

- 1. Conformation and/or Obedience/Rally or Agility training classes
- 2. Breeder Referral Service
- 3. Two Educational Programs for Club members & the public or Formal Judges Education.
- 4. Dog Show Tours
- 5. Registered Handler Seminars or Workshops
- 6. New Exhibitor Briefing
- 7. Opportunities for Provisional Judges
- 8. AKC Show Committee Seminars
- 9. Disaster Planning
- 10. Meet the Breed
- 11. Health Clinics

FOUR (4) of these category B activities are required if the club's shows are held beyond 10 miles from the club's territory.

I asked Mike about Southeastern Brittany Club (we have no show but used as an example) and stated we consider the whole State our territory. He said we were listed as Pinehurst and it would only encompass 10 miles outside of Pinehurst. He stated they would not yank shows from clubs that did not meet ALL the requirements but encourages everyone to try to comply.

The form, Statement of Compliance, is to be submitted with the application for a future show and is now posted on the ABC website and included in this issue of the Brittany Magazine, pages 17-18.

Now, the statement "Parent and Regional Club Judges Education Program" under eligibility requirements applies only to a Regional Club hosting the ABC Summer Specialty only. It does NOT cover their own Independent Specialty.

I personally feel it is good relations in some respects but stretches our overworked volunteers that already put in many hours.

One last thing. Even if the independent club is with an all breed club, they must still comply.

If anyone wishes to e-mail me with their comments, please feel free to do so. I may not respond but would like to keep them on file. Please endeavor to be polite as we attract more flys with honey rather than vinegar.



The American Kennel Club® announced the winners of the 2009 AKC® Lifetime Achievement Awards. The awards, engraved Tiffany and Co. sterling silver bowls, will be presented to the recipients on Tuesday, December 16, 2008 at the AKC Delegates luncheon held in conjunction with the AKC/ Eukanuba National Championship in Long Beach, California. A larger version of the Tiffany and Co. bowl, engraved with the names of all recipients past and present, is on permanent display at the headquarters of The American Kennel Club in New York City.

The AKC Lifetime Achievement Awards were created to honor those individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the sport of purebred dogs on a national level. The recipients were selected from votes cast by AKC member clubs for nominees in each of the following categories: Conformation, Companion Events and Performance.

The 2009 recipient for the Performance category is **Mary Jo Trimble**, Carterville, Illinois. Mary Jo has been involved with Brittanys since the mid-1960s. She was a charter member of the Sahuaro Brittany Club in Arizona and the Illinois Brittany Championship Association. She is Treasurer for the Illinois Brittany Club and has served as Executive Secretary of the American Brittany Club (ABC) since 1998.

Mary Jo is a Hall of Fame recipient and was recently elected to the Field Trial Clubs of Illinois Honor Roll for her service to that organization. Her dogs have won numerous AKC Championships, including the National Open Brittany Championship, and awards such as the IAMS All-Age Dog of the Year, and inducted into the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame.

Mary Jo is the ABC's AKC Legislative Liaison and a Director and Legislative Committee Chair for the Field Trial Clubs of Illinois. She attended the first AKC Parent Club Conference as a presenter and has twice been invited to attend AKC's Lobby Day in Washington, D.C. *The American Field, The American Brittany Magazine* and *AKC Afield* have published her articles on legislation.

The Illinois General Assembly declared May 28, 2006 as Trimble Day, to recognize Mary Jo and her husband Ray's contribution to the sport of field trialing and for their efforts to help acquire 16,000 acres of new public land, including two new championship-type field trial areas in Pyramid State Park. With Ray having won the AKC Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000, the Trimble's are the first couple to win this prestigious award.

Purina Parent Club Partnership Program Earnings Update

The American Brittany Club, Inc. through its participation in the Purina Parent Club Partnership (PPCP) Program is enhancing the health and well-being of the Brittany. Like the 166 other clubs now participating in the program, the American Brittany Club, Inc. earns funding for important canine health studies, education efforts and rescue programs when Purina Pro Club members declare the American Brittany Club, Inc. to receive matching funds and submit their weight circles.

As of August 31, 2008, the American Brittany Club, Inc. has 970 members declared for the Purina Parent Club Partnership Program. From January 1, 2008 through August 31, 2008, 266 members have submitted weight circles resulting in a total of \$4,631.00 accumulated thus far for the 2008 Program.

If all 970 Pro Club members declared for the American Brittany Club, Inc. submitted weight circles at the same rate as the 266 members currently submitting, the earnings through August 31st may have potentially been \$16,887.50.

The best way to increase the earnings and close the gap on the potential earnings is by spreading the word:







On September 15, 2008, Nolan Huffman had to make one of the hardest choices for a little dog that had brought him so much. After some illness, 14-year-old Buddy was laid to rest. Whelped June 17, 1994, Nolan's Last Bullet, aka Buddy, was only seven weeks old when Nolan brought him home. Buddy did not stop there; he also sired 4 NSTRA National Champions and around 20 - 2x and 1x NSTRA Champions, including 15x Beeline Bullet Bravado; 12x Beeline Wink--the first to attain a NSTRA Championship under two years old; 8x Split Creek's Emma; Split Creek's Medicine Man, Cusick's Bodacious Bullet; 7x Beeline Bullets Proof; 4x Beeline Captain Bert, Buddy Buster II, Gambles Little Joe; 3x K Nine's Blazin Bullet and he has also sired some AKC FC's AFC's and Show champions.

For a little dog, Buddy made a big mark, touching the lives of many and putting Brittany's on the map of the bird dog world where pointers and setters had once dominated.



The inaugural running of the Ed Powell Memorial Open Limited Gun Dog hour stake was held on the grounds of the Union County Bird Dog Ranch at Thayer, Iowa on April 7 and 8, 2008. Judges were Cindy Findley, who handled her dog to the 2005 Gordon Setter National Amateur Championship win, and David Taylor, whose judging credentials include the American Pointer Club's 2000 National Field Trial Championships and the 2003 AFTCA Region 11 Open Championships, as well as the

Mid-America and Nebraska Brittany Championships. Seventeen dogs vied for the honors, with 4 year old RUFFWOOD'S ALGONQUIN INDIGO emerging as the winner. She ran in the third brace and exhibited a forward, snappy race, handled kindly, and scored 3 well-spaced finds during her hour. Bird work for this stake was abundant; every dog had at least one contact with game.

The event honors the memory of Ed Powell, a steadfast member of the Iowa Brittany Club for over two decades. Ed and his wife Joyce bred Brittanys under the name of Shoshone Kennels. Ed was an avid conservationist and worked tirelessly for the betterment of the Brittany breed and for the preservation of land and game where the Brittany can show its natural abilities. He was one of the original members of individuals who secured the grounds at Thayer and spend many hours improving them for bird dog trials. It is fitting that the winner of this inaugural event, as well as the fourth place dog. trace their lineage back to Ed's breedings. This was a quality stake and we hope to continue to hold it on an annual basis.

Many thanks to all who participated in the planning and execution of this event. Thanks go especially to Julie Condron for providing the beautiful traveling trophy that goes to the winner each year. We hope this will remain a lasting tribute to a wonderful individual and dear friend.

The Running:

Brace 1: FC COVEY RISE'S RAMBO JR (JR) - Chuck Schaefer: DC/AFC COUNTRY ROAD'S NAVIGATOR (Andv) - Bob Burchett. Brace 1 cast off from the regular all age breakaway at 8:00 under mostly sunny skies with the temperature right around the freezing point. Both dogs went forward toward the left side and over the ridge toward the hedgerow. JR was seen standing in the cut as riders crested the ridge, but he left and both dogs were observed making game in the area. At 4, Andy established point at the place JR had occupied, and JR came up into a back. Handlers dismounted and a small covey was produced. Both dogs turned to mark the flight, but JR was a bit overanxious in following them, thus ending his bid early. Andy continued on and scored finds at 6 by the terrace feeder, at 14 in the south feed strip, at 15 in the willows along the ravine, at 20 along the feed strip north of the ravine, at 23 at the feeder by Karbiner Crossing, and at 27 at the hedgerow feeder. We crossed the road onto the north course at 34 as Andy continued to hunt the feed strips and other edges. At 39, he was making game, then pointed just as the handler rode up a hen pheasant. He was released and went on point again at 41 at the feeder along the south edge of the "hedge and honey locust orchard." His tenth and final find came at the feeder at the end of the finger north of the double crossing. He continued his searching pattern until the end of the hour.

Brace 2: DC RICOCHET MAGGIE'S JAC (Jac) - Julie Condron; FC TOLKA-BELLE O KID RUSTY'S PRO (Rusty) Bob Burchett. Dogs were released at the water tanks on the northwest corner of the grounds and headed southeast. Jac pointed at 1 at the fence corner. After a relocation, a bird was produced and Jac was sent on. He had his second find at 4 less than 100 yards from the first with all in order. From there, he ran the edge of the field and turned along the N-S fence to the west crossing. Meanwhile, Rusty established point near the orchard feeder at 5, then had a second find at 9 along a feed strip south of the "red cedar forest." Jac caught the front shortly after Rusty's second find and both dogs crossed the road back onto the south course and headed toward the hedgerow. Bob called point at 22 on the south side of the hedgerow. Both dogs were found standing. Bob flushed and fired; Julie settled for a back. Both dogs were sent on and Jac scored another find at the terrace feeder at 25. Meanwhile, Rusty had moved ahead and had a find along the south feed strip at 29. Reunited after Rusty's release, both dogs continued west along the south end of the course. Point was called as riders topped the ridge west of the crossing. Both dogs were standing, apparently on separate birds. Julie produced a single and took Jac on. Bob was unable to produce game. Hunting separately, both dogs had

finds at 38 at different locations along feed strip on the south side of the west ravine. Still separated, Jac scored another find at 40 along the north side of the ravine and again at 45 on a single that had flown onto the mowed portion of the course. Meanwhile, Rusty scored finds at 43 at the feeder on the long finger coming up from the creek and at 47 at the hedgerow feeder. Released from his last find, Jac topped the ridge, then roaded into a point at the finger feeder at 49. Julie made a prolonged flushing attempt, combined with an extended relocation effort by Jac, but no bird could be produced. Jac continued on to the hedgerow where he scored his final find at 59.

Brace 3: SPEEDING TICKET'S RADAR GUN (Radar) Jim John; RUFFWOOD'S ALGONQUIN INDIGO (Indigo) - Bob Burchett. Dogs were released across the road on the north course and both went to work searching for game. Both had snappy runs, with Indigo being the more forward of the two. The pair went through the orchard and onto the north end of the course, then back around the west side. At 30, Indigo scored a find at the orchard feeder. Radar established point in a thick area just off the course where it turns back east at the south end of the north course. Jim was unable to produce game and Radar was sent on. (A nesting woodcock was produced in this area in a later brace). Radar crossed the road at 40 and made the front at 44 as Bob called point for Indigo on the hedgerow. Radar had a find at the terrace feeder at 46 with all in order. After Radar made the front once again, both dogs hunted the bottom area of the south course. Indigo caught the south feeder strip and rimmed it all the way to where it turns back north along the ravine, then slammed on point at 54 with Radar backing. One bird was produced with all in order and we finished the brace, then broke for lunch.

Brace 4: TNT'S LITTLE PHEASANT FINDER (Cody) - Tom Thomas; DC BARNEY'S HI PROOF RONRICO (Rico) - Bob Burchett. The first brace after lunch was released behind the pines on the north course. The temperature for the afternoon braces was generally warmer than in the morning, but varied considerably as clouds alternately covered and uncovered the sun. Rico suffered a breach of manners at 4 near the orchard feeder, ending his day early. Cody continued on course, running a generally forward but somewhat short race. She pointed at 14

at the end of the feed strip near the old barn site, but Tommy moved her on when all he found was a pile of feathers. She stopped again at 22 near the hay bales on the west end of the alfalfa field, but moved up and inspected the remains of an old deer carcass. She again established point along the fence south of the alfalfa field at 27 and a bird was produced. She

continued south and crossed the road at 44, then pointed at the hedgerow at 50 where two birds were produced. She continued on and finished the hour at the south end of the course.

Brace 5: FC TEQUILA'S DYNAMITE (Mike) - Chris Burchett; DC RICOCHET HEMI BARACUDA (Buck) - Bob Burchett. Dogs were released south of the pond and headed west. Mike swung north along the middle ditch and rimmed the feed strip south of the ravine where he went on point at 3. Chris rode up, but Mike had already flushed the birds before she could dismount. Buck continued on alone without bird contact until he crossed the road onto the north course. He was credited with a stop-to-flush near the orchard feeder, then had a find at 29 along the ravine north of the double crossing. Up to this point, Buck had been running into a moderately stiff wind, which seemed to affect his range and pattern. After a brief excursion with deer, Buck came around and headed downwind, at which time his range lengthened. He established point at 48 in thick sumac and brambles where the orchard meets the red cedar forest. No bird was produced. Continuing on, he had a find at 52 along the south fence of the red cedar forest. Two birds were produced with all in order.

Buck rimmed the west edge of the field north of the pines. then swung east and rimmed the north edge of the dogleg north of the road crossing. He went into the woods and was gone at time, but reappeared shortly on his own.

Brace 6: FC W-HAVEN'S MOOSE AND DIXIE'S KIM (Kim) - Chris Burchett; TRU'S POISE N IVY (Ivy) - Bob Burchett. The final brace of the day was released at the all age breakaway. Both dogs headed toward the hedgerow and Bob found lvy standing at 4. Kim came around and backed from approximately 80 yards. Ivy grew impatient with Bob's flushing attempt and moved in to help, ending her race. Kim continued on alone, but seemed distracted on this day. She scored a find at 20 near Karbiner Crossing with all in order. She crossed on to the north course at 31, then established point at 33 in the same thicket where Radar had previously suffered a non-productive. Chris could not produce a bird on the first attempt and had Kim relocate. She re-established point and Chris saw a nesting woodcock, which she finally coaxed into flying. Kim was sent on and pointed again near the orchard feeder at 40. No bird was produced and Chris elected to pick up at this point.

Brace 7: CSB JL SULLIVAN (Sully) - Chris Burchett; UPLAND ACRES OVERLAND EXPRESS (Zip) - Bob Burchett. The first brace of the second day was released at the all age breakaway in a light, but persistent rain with the temperature hovering near 40 degrees. Chris called point for Sully at 4 south of the hedgerow. A bird was flushed, and all seemed well until the bird flew into a low-hanging limb. This caused it to flutter conspicuously as it regained its equilibrium, then turned and flew directly over Sully's head. The excitement was too much for Sully, ending his day early. Zip continued on and scored a find at the terrace feeder at 5 with all in order. He disappeared at 10 behind the feed strip in the Church Corner and scout was dispatched. Scout called point at 12 and we rode to find Zip standing on point along the wood's edge. A bird was produced and Zip was sent on. He later suffered a non-productive at 18 under a cedar tree south of the old pond and a find at 25 along the hedgerow. His race was inconsistent today, however, and handler elected to pick up at 35 when we reached the road crossing.

Brace 8: DC COUNTRY ROAD'S ROUGH RIDER (Cooper) - Bob Burchett; Bye. Cooper broke away north of the

road and went on point near the woodcock nest. Bob was unable to produce a bird, however. Cooper made a big move through the next field, making long casts along feed strips and scored a find at 8 near the orchard feeder. He continued through the orchard and into the north field. He had a great ground race and rimmed the far eastern feed strip near Kermit's Pasture, took the edge

all the way to the end, and crossed over to the alfalfa field, still eating up ground. He was found on point at 29 along the feed strip south of the alfalfa field, but was unable to resist chasing the bird at the flush, ending a strong bid for the win.

Brace 9: CH MAGIC YOU CAN BE MY WINGMAN (Jake H.) - Bob Burchett; Bye. Jake was turned loose by the water tanks west of the alfalfa field. He headed across country and made a huge cast to the right and along the tree line. He crossed to the left and deer were seen in the same vicinity. He was called off and taken through the orchard where he scored a find at the south feeder. He rimmed the field between the orchard and the pines, then crossed over and took the tree line all the way around the dogleg, then disappeared into the woods. He was collected up on the road by Bob, then crossed over to the south course. Jake scored his second find in the hedgerow at 24, with all in order. He proceeded to smoke the course from that point on, making a huge cast into the Church Corner and coming out along the downwind side of the south feed strip. Midway along this feed strip, he suddenly turned and appeared to be making game when a quail flew. Jake stopped, then proceeded to follow the bird, ending what was shaping up to be a spectacular performance.

Brace 10: JAZZ'S SWEETEST LITTLE SECRET (Karo) - Bob Burchett; Bye. Karo broke away below the pond and headed west. Her youthful exuberance was evident as she ran the course, crossing the ravine and into the west field. She was on the long finger at 4 when a quail flew and she stopped to the flush. Handler dismounted and fired and all was in order. She was sent on and ran to Karbiner Crossing where she encountered more quail at 11. She initially pointed, then broke and disappeared into the heavy cover. She returned with her trophy, ending the stake.

The 2008 Nebraska Brittany Championship was contested April 14 – 16 at Branched Oak Field Trial Area, near Raymond Nebraska. This year's renewal featured 36 of the top All Age Brittanys from throughout the Midwest. From this field the winner emerged in TEQUILA WITH A TWIST, who had a forward, hard running hour and carded 4 finds, spaced nicely throughout her time. The Runner-up title was bestowed on THE FARSIDE KID AMEE who impressed all with her ability to take an edge, and one high quality find.

Spring was late coming to Nebraska this year. The vegetation had yet to green up and the rain from the past weekend had left some mud to remember it by. Our trial was to endure heat, cold, wind, and some good weather before we were finished.

As has been the case in the past, most of the Midwest professionals were in attendance. Al Gorrow and Pam Baird, Bob and Chris Burchett, Jim John, Scott Johnson, Ed Tillison, and the man from Texas, David Downing were on hand to test their charges. Phil Dangerfield, Ginger and John Gay were on hand to cheer on their dogs and favorites. Last, but certainly not least, two of our friends from Texas, Wes and Mary Felt were there, I think to make sure no one got out of line. The great following this event has had is a positive statement on the quality event this championship has become.

Fair and experienced judges always have been the mandate for this stake, this year was no exception. We were fortunate in being able to secure the services of two very knowledgeable and affable gentlemen to assume the judicial responsibilities. Rob Rohner of Burchard, NE. and David Taylor of Neola IA filled the judicial saddles. Rob, a retired Brittany professional trainer with National wins to his credit and David, a pointer enthusiast that has judged many Championship stakes and has successfully handled pointers on the major Shooting Dog circuit, were watchful in their task. They both know what an All Age dog should do and their decisions were well received. They are class gentlemen and a pleasure to work with.

Stan and Claudia Truksa, Chairman and Secretary, respectively, head this event. They are first class people that work hard to make sure this is the kind of trial that people want to come compete at. Claudia is one of the best dog wagon drivers anywhere. She is right where she needs to be, when she needs to be. She was always ready with supplies when the mid-morning or mid-afternoon break. But as anyone who has held the secretary position can attest, she did so much more than just drive. She makes sure all the details are done and makes it look easy. Missing from our group this year was Bill Cockrum. His wife had a short stay in the hospital and he was unable to attend. I am happy to report that Julie is much better and Bill will be back at our next event.



Purina is our partner in staging this event. They contributed both funds to help make this event financially possible, and bags of their fine product for the winners. Without their help, this and many other Championship events could not be held. For this commitment to our sport we can not say thank you often enough. We should all support them as they do us.

This year's winner, TEQUILA WITH A TWIST (Taryn), is a 5 year old orange and white female that is owned by Jessica Carlson of Boise, ID and was handled by Ed Tillison. Taryn has been a consistent performer that has made her presence well known during her relatively short career. She is a daughter of the fine performer, and exceptional producer, Tequila's Joker. She certainly carries on his tradition of winning with style. She appeared in the second brace of the event. The weather was cool with the temperature in the lower 30's, a clear sky, and with very little breeze. Released in the Southeast corner of the course, from the start Tayrn was forward and fast. She wisely hunted the east course, staying forward throughout the turns and hills. At 24 minutes she was found pointing, with great style, in a tree line before the concrete bridge. She demonstrated excellent manners and style for the flush and shot. Her next find was at 36 minutes along a line of trees, that at one time had been an old fence line. Here she was backed by her brace mate making a pretty picture in the morning sun. Again, she displayed unquestionable demeanor on her game. She tore away from this turn putting on a show of her all age ability. At 53 minutes her scout called point for her in the tree moot, on the west course. She had her game well located and she stood tall and mannerly for the shot. Nearing the end of the hour, as we crossed the ditch and climbed the hill above the clubhouse, she was once again found pointing, facing into a plum thicket with her brace mate backing. At the flush, a bird flew back over her head with Tayrn only turning her head to mark the flight of her quarry.

Runner-up, THE FARSIDE'S KID AMEE has done very well on these grounds. She was nearing her 10th birthday as she came to the line. Owned by Burton and Sara Wise of Creve Couer, MO and handled by Al Gorrow. She appeared in the 11th brace, under conditions that made running dogs seem futile. The temperature was 77 degrees with wind gusts to close to 50 MPH. It seemed that no one should even try to run a dog in that wind but run she did! Amee was to impress all watching with her ability to take an edge to the end. Her entire hour was spent skillfully navigating the course, seldom anywhere but to the front. She was released from the club house going east across the wooden bridge. At 6 minutes, as we were entering the big gundog bottom, she naturally backed her bracemate. She was found pointing at 38 minutes, into a tree line, near the concrete bridge. The covey was put to flight and her manners were excellent. The remainder of her hour was spent in high gear. She carded an honest stop to flush at 47 minutes. She finished strong with a cast where she again got on a line and "took it".

The Running:

 CAROLIÑA RANGER/Johnson & COUNTRY ROAD'S ROUGH RIDER/Burchett – Rider had a short appearance after a mishandling of a bird. Ranger had a nice race. He recorded a stop to flush at 35 minutes on a covey of birds in a plum thicket, south of the clubhouse, and a find at 57 minutes that required a relocation to pin the running birds.

 SMARTEYE'S JOKER/John & TEQUILA WITH A TWIST/Tillison –Taryn was named Champion and her story has been related earlier in this report.

Smarteye's Joker put in a good hour. His scout was busy with this big running male. Twice he backed his bracemate with great style. He also had a find of his own find at 57 minutes near the frog pond. This was a stylish, well handled find.

3) STARLIGHT'S BLAZING SIRIUS/Burchett & BRETON GOLD RUN RUFFIAN/Tillison - Both dogs were away sharply. At 12 minutes Sirius was found standing, pointing into a large, tree lined draw with Ruffian backing. As Sirius's handler approached he noticed that the dog had lost his intensity and elected to go on without a flushing attempt. From this point both dogs were eating up ground. After a very showy cast around the lake edge into the southeast field, Sirius was found pointing, looking very good, with Ruff backing nicely. Both dogs were mannerly for the flush and shot. Released, both dogs were doing a nice job hunting the cover and staying to the front. At 48 minutes Sirius's handler raised his hat and rode to his dog at the end of a tree line before the concrete bridge. His handler was to fire as soon as he arrived at his dog, but the birds and pointing dog were not officially observed. Both dogs slowed some after the concrete bridge and both finished their hour.

4) TEQUILA JACK II/John & ROCKLAN'S KID ROWDY/ Burchett – Away form the clubhouse, both dogs had on their running shoes. At 11 minutes both handlers had their hats in the air, but as the judges approached both dogs were moving. Just 2 minutes later, Kid was to have bird contact that was not desirable. Jack continued to use up the course covering a lot of ground and making his handler and scout work hard to keep contact. After crossing the dam, at 45 minutes, Jack was out of pocket and was not returned by time.

5) BREN'S FUN ON THE RUN/Johnson & TC'S MATCH BOKS RACER/Downing – This next pair broke away from the clubhouse, headed toward the wooden bridge. Fun on the Run was having fun today but his handler was not. His handler was not pleased with his charge and ended his bid at 36 minutes. Racer had a strong early race. He stayed to the front as he handily negotiated the course. His only stand on game was barren. He finished the hour.

6) JO-LOCKAPEX DARK ROUX GUMBO/Lincoln & BLUERIDGE MAJOR ADVENTURE/Downing – The day had turned out to be a top ten day, 60 degrees, a light breeze, and nearly cloudless as the final brace of the day was released. Breaking away nicely, both dogs were powerful in the early minutes. Major took a wrong turn as we headed to the bridge and was lost. Roux impressed with his fluid gait and speed. He made several nice casts that were "take it to the end" type casts. He would record only a non-productive for his effort.

7) HI PROOF WHIZKI/Gorrow & ROCKLAN'S WHIZZLE STOP/Burchett – Day two began clear and cool with a light breeze that would grow to +45-mph gusts before the day was through. Whizki and Whiz broke away from the clubhouse on the normal all age course. Whizki was seen little early on until the call of point at 9 minutes. On the edge of the big draw, before the first rock crossing, he had a small covey pinned. He followed this with another good find, on the west tree line, at 17 minutes. On both pieces of bird work he stood tall and mannerly for the flush and shot. His hour was impressive to watch. He covered the ground well and was able to maintain the desired range. His effort would challenge the winners. Whizzle also is an attractive dog to watch run. He had a very nice find where he displayed his grand style at 31 minutes but would also record non productives at 14 and 53 minutes, the second ending his day.

8) WIMBERLY JIM DANDY/Johnson & COUNTRY ROAD'S FREE FOR ALL/Burchett – Free was up early. Jim ran an all age hour. He impressed us all with an opening cast to the lake, following the lake edge, and bringing it right to the front. It took his handler some effort to get Jim around the course. He recorded a good find at 16 minutes, showing his good training. At 43 minutes, his scout called point for him buried in a plum thicket with his birds right in front of him, all in order. He finished the hour to the front. His hour also impressed the judges.

 LEGRAND TANK DU FAYETTE/Gorrow & J&B GENTLEMAN JACK OF AUTEN/Johnson – This brace was only 15 minutes as both dogs were up early.

10) BRETON'S CASTLE ROCKET/John & SHADOW ATTACK/Tillison – The day had begun to warm up considerably, working its way to 77 degrees. The wind also had picked up with reported gusts to 49 MPH, under a cloudless sky. Neither of these contestants were handling the temperature or the wind well. At 37 minutes both were up.

11) THE FAR SIDE'S KID AMEE/Gorrow & RENO'S RETURN/Lincoln – Amee was the Runner-up and her effort has been recorded earlier. Return had a nice find at 6 minutes as we entered the Gun Dog Bottom. Return took a couple steps at the flush and his day was done.

12) MICRO TEE/Johnson & HAVAPAL'S RENEGADE BILLY BOY/Burchett – Tee took a wrong turn early and the call for the tracker came at 15 minutes. Billy laid done a strong all age race. He toured the country well as he stayed "up where you can see 'em". His time would end at 45 minutes when he took too many steps with the flush of a bird.

13) BOUNCIN BETTY/Gorrow & TJ'S THUNDER/John – Day three looked much better to man and beast alike. The temperature started at 54 degrees, with just a light wind was a welcome change from the day before. Away at 8 AM sharp, Thunder was on a bird finding mission. He would record finds at 8, 14, 17, and 30 minutes. On each he displayed high style and good manners. He was running well and had everyone looking. At 38 minutes, as we approached a group of trees, south of the clubhouse, he got to close to a covey of birds and was up. Betty, with her proud owner Bill Burton along for the ride, put in a workman like effort. She ran forward for her hour and recorded a good find at 58 minutes, in the south east corner of the course.

14) BUFORD'S BADA BING/Gorrow & KB'S SHADOW DANCER/John – Away from the east fish camp, both dogs were eating up ground. Both are fast dogs that seemed to like to stay to the front. At 8 minutes Dancer was found pointing, with great style, his bracemate backing. Both dogs mannerly for the flush and shot. Bing had a find at 30 minutes that ended his bid. Dancer recorded another good find where his great style on display. He ran and hunted hard. At 57 minutes he was found pointing, again with great style, in a big draw south of camp. Despite a good flushing effort and relocation, no birds were produced.

15) RAMBLIN MAN/Gorrow & TSUNAMI/Johnson - An approaching cold front had turned the breeze into a cold 20-MPH wind from the northwest, although the sky remained mainly clear. Released going east from the clubhouse, both dogs required rounding up to make the first bridge. Randy ran well, and he is a fast dog. His day was short as he took too many steps on his first find. At 11 minutes Tsunami was found pointing in the gundog bottom. He showed nice style. Even with a thorough relocation, no bird could be produced. He made a very nice move down around the lake edge where he dug deep into the cover and was not seen for a bit, but then showed to the front. He had a good find at 25 minutes, again with good style, and well mannered for the flush and shot. Despite a good try, he was not challenging the top dogs, and was up at 44 minutes.

16) JAKES ACRES IN DISGUIST/Gorrow & KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER/John – The first brace of the afternoon felt the full effect of the cold front, with clouds moving in and the wind feeling quite cold. Jake would have a short day, he was up at 9 minutes for an indiscretion. Lester, last years Champion, started strongly with a nice cast that took him to the lake edge and around all of Hudkins Bottom. This was quite showy. He would also be up early after carding two non-productives in the first 30 minutes.

17) HANGIN JAZE HALLALEW AMEN/Tillison & ROKLANS MISTY ALLIE T-BEAR/Burchett – Both of these dogs were off very quickly. T-Bear was very quick on his feet and not afraid to run. He was making a cast that had us all watching when a group of about 6 pheasants came out of from a group of trees was approaching, and proved to be a great temptation. One would think this young dog has a promising future. Jaze was not seen much between the breakaway and the 16-minute mark. He then settled in to a very good pattern that featured several eye-catching moves. He had a non-productive at 33 minutes and a good find at 38. His manners were good for the flush and the shot. He finished, still going away.

18) TUB-O-TEE/Lincoln & TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD/ Tillison – Blizzards, who was last year's Runner-up, took a wrong turn early, and was not returned to judgement. Tee, had finds at 7, 15, and 38 minutes. All of these were handled with style. His day ended after his last find, as his handler did not think he was not challenging the leaders.

2008 Mid America Brittany Championships by Jack Higgins

The Branched Oak Dog Trial Area near Raymond, Nebraska, was the place to be for the Mid America Brittany Championship hosted by the Missouri Valley Brittany Club. The grounds, maintained by Nebraska Game & Parks Wildlife Division, were in excellent condition to showcase all age performances. FC/AFC THE FARSIDES KID AMEE, nine year old female, owned by Burton & Sara Wice and handled by Al Gorrow found the course to her liking and warmed up by winning the clubs Open All Age in the preceding trial.

The Championship utilizes the full 864 acres and Amee hit every edge and corner of the course. Cast off from Amateur Hill in the third brace, she and her bracemate, BLUERIDGE MAJOR ADVENTURE/Downing, were seen only briefly running the edges towards the lake in Area 9. After crossing the concrete bridge, the meadow below the clubhouse and passing through the keyhole, Amee was found silhouhetted against the sky on a hilltop pointing a covey of quail with great style. She carded a second find in the tree then ran the west and south boundaries of the course adding a third find near the pond above the rock crossing. Her bracemate who had shown well was excused at midpoint. It was apparent to all present that the bar had been set very high. Runner-up K-B'S SHADOW DANCER, 6 year old male owned by Herb Rea and handled by Jim John, ran in the first brace. Starting from headquarters, Dancer ran a pleasing race that required only minimal handling. He carded three finds showing great maturity and his birds were pointed with great style from a distance.

3rd place was earned by DC HAVAPAL'S RENEGADE BILLY BOY, owned by Tom Thomas and handled by Bob Burchett. Billy ran as a bye in the last brace and proved once again that "it ain't over till it's over". He ran to the ront and required some had riding to keep him from crossing the wooden bridge to run the east course a second time. He had two class finds, one in the mott and the second in the west finger.

4th place went to DC COUNTRY ROAD'S ROUGH RIDER (Cooper) owned by Karen Stout and handled by Bob Burchett. Cooper stayed to the front and impressed the judges with his classy high head and tail on point. He carded one find and had an unproductive.

A big "thanks" goes to Purina whose sponsorship made this trial possible.

Judges Stan Truksa and Richard Brewington are well known in the Brittany world and their decisions were well received.

The unanimous choice for the "Trooper Award" goes to pro Ed Tillson. Ed slipped in the mud on day one of the regional and broke a bone in his leg. He toughed it out the full six days and ran four of the five entries in the championship. We wish Ed a speedy recovery.

Quail were plentiful throughout the trial and many dogs had multiple finds. There were two pheasant encounters in the three days the pheasants won them both.
