## In Slemoriam



#### John G. Hancock

August 4, 1946 - December 8, 2008

It is with a heavy heart that I report the passing of my dear friend, John Hancock. When John missed his brace at a local trial on Saturday morning, September 27, 2008, we were concerned. John was reliable. Whatever you needed, you could count on him - especially at a field trial. John's absence this perfect fall morning

was the result of a severe stroke. John fought hard, and was making slow but steady progress when he suffered additional complications, and finally succumbed on December 8, 2008.

John proudly served his country in the U.S. Air Force for twenty-eight years, retiring at the rank of Major. While serving in Great Britain, John met and married his wife Bridget. During his time in the military he was awarded many medals and commendations, including the Air Force Longevity Service Award ribbon. Upon retirement from the military, he continued to serve the public for another 15 years as Court Services Manager for Kenosha County.

John is survived by his wife Bridget of Trevor WI, daughter Stephanie (Ken) Nurczyk of Elmhurst IL, sister Clarene (Eugene) Pertula of North Adams MI, a niece and three nephews, Lisa (Phil) Todd (Karen) Eric (Sarah) Dan and many great nieces and nephews, a grandson Ryan and a granddaughter on the way.

John was passionate about his dogs and field trialing. He brought home his first Britt, Freckles of Springville, over 20 years ago, and joined the Southern Illinois Brittany Club. When John moved to Wisconsin, he became an active member of the Greater Milwaukee Brittany Club. He has served GMBC in various positions, including Field Trial Chairman and Secretary. He trained, campaigned and finished FC Sandy River Duster, and FC/AFC Sandy River Sunshine. Sunny was also awarded the Badger Brittany Club Gun Dog of the Year in 2007. John also finished two of his dogs in the show ring, CH Sandy River Sally, and most recently CH Sandy River Maggie. John loved trialing, and was always ready to lend a helping hand - at GMBC events, and anyone else's. His fondness for happy hour celebrations on Saturday night, and his ability to be up bright, early and smilling on Sunday morning, were legendary.

Sadly, the stroke that took him from us occurred just as John had worked his last full week before retiring. John loved the outdoors, and was looking forward to the time he would be able to enjoy gardening, working with his dogs and horse, and mowing the grounds at Bong. He still had much to offer, and would have enjoyed the opportunity to share many more leisurely hours with his family, particularly his grandson Ryan.

Those who knew John remember him for his kindness and his dedication to his family, friends and country. John was a gentle man, as well as a gentleman. His easy, confident manner and gift for storytelling made him welcome at any gathering. I will especially miss him, as he had become my reliable field trial companion, and will leave the shotgun seat noticeably vacant. Will Rogers once said, "If there are no dogs in Heaven, then when I die I want to go where they went." I have no doubt that John AND his dogs are in Heaven, that the fall sky is a brilliant blue, and that they've taken the lead on a breakaway!

## - Reflections -

### H.S.U.S. Bombards Country with Breeder Bills CALL TO ACTION

The Reflections column this month certainly has a different twist. While we need to learn from the past, there are times we must consider the present and look to the future. I feel very strongly that if we are to have a future as field trailers, hunters, dog breeders and show exhibitors, we must take action to defend our interests. Please read the following and give it your best to fight those who seek to end our way of life. I don't want someone years from now reading this article and saying, "I wonder if people tried to end the insanity that curtailed dog ownership, field trials, shows, and left us with a few long tailed Brittanys."

During the days of the Illinois' Conservation Congress when I represented Field Trial Clubs of Illinois, we always had proposals to eradicate non-native and invasive species creeping into Illinois. The Responsible pet owners and breeders of Illinois and many, many other states in the Union are currently faced with a similar situation with the invasion of H.S.U.S., Humane Society of the United States, into the legislative process of our individual states.

H.S.U.S. has set an agenda to pass what they are calling "Puppy Mills" bills in 34 states this year. Pictures are painted of overcrowded kennels and cages of dogs with matted hair, and malnourished dogs living in their own feces. None of us wish to tolerate those conditions imposed by irresponsible breeders or hoarders. Unfortunately, the laws being proposed do not just go after the irresponsible breeder but will touch everyone who has a certain number of intact dogs. In Illinois, the number for being licensed as a Dog Breeder would be 6 intact females (already used in Illinois for license) and 30 intact males. These numbers vary in different states from lower to higher.

The cap on intact dogs is a provision that field trialers and dog breeders should never tolerate. Once these limits are written into law, they will be able to try and lower the numbers year after year as some of their H.S.U.S. trainers have elaborated in their training sessions. After H.S.U.S. finishes with dog breeders, what will come next? Will it be the number of horses, sheep, cows, swine, and rabbits? We are all aware of the H.S.U.S. desire to end all hunting in the United States as well as curtail the breeding of purebred dogs. Are we going to fight back or will we let this happen?

In addition to the cap provision of these bills, we find engineering standards that will put many hobby breeders out of business due to the high costs to comply. The Illinois SB 53 has been revised twice with some changes being made to try and make the bill more palatable to dog breeders.

Pennsylvania recently passed a similar bill which is currently being challenged in a federal civil suit filed by The Professional Dog Breeders Advisory Council, Inc. against the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Dept. of Agriculture. Among several constitutional complaints, one complaint alleges that Act 119 targets and singles out commercial kennels for treatment and scrutiny far different from all other kennels that are also regulated. In Illinois, Engineering Standards would not apply to a licensed animal shelter, licensed Animal Control facility, Veterinary Clinic, humane society, animal welfare society or in some cases kennel operators. One would think legislators would want to table or turn down similar breeder bills until the constitutionality issue is settled in Pennsylvania rather than have similar actions filed throughout the U.S. These laws are written to limit breeders under the guise of promoting animal welfare.

Some of these rules include Engineering Standards that will put the average dog breeder, whose motive is not profit, out of business and actually increase the number of "for profit", large breeder operations. Some of these provisions include: primary enclosure must be impervious to moisture and must be able to be sanitized with water or steam spray at 185 degrees. Primary enclosure (cages included) must allow the dog to lie down while fully extended without the dog's head, tail, legs, face or feet touching any side of enclosure or any other dog in the cage. Cages must be 30" above the floor and may not be stacked on top of each other. Runs shall be surfaced with concrete or other impervious material. Indoor kennels must maintain 85 degree temperature, however, a vet could exempt certain breeds from that requirement. Little mention in the Illinois bills refer to dogs maintained in outdoor runs which leaves one to wonder what would or would not apply to those facilities. Fines start at \$200 a day up to \$200 per violation for a first offense up to \$5000 for the 4th violation and a 12 month suspension.

These bills call for potable water that is not frozen and free from debris AT ALL TIMES. This is a overzealous Animal Rights person's dream provision and the type of phrase that the unsuspecting will not notice as being something bad as we all know dogs need water. Animal welfare laws should avoid specific terminology that could lead to misdemeanor violations and result in fines and suspension of licenses.

The Illinois bill allows a person 10 days to call for a hearing if charged with violations. If they do not, they must surrender their dogs to a shelter, animal control, or have them euthanized by a veterinarian. If the purpose of these bills is to protect dogs, proposals like this one certainly do not further their so called goals and are actually inhumane.

By exempting rescue shelters, kennel operators, vets and other such groups, the bills divide fancy in their rejection of the proposals. The term "puppy mill" conjures up a mental image as described above, but this is not a term defined by law. If the limits are set at 3 or 6 intact females or 20 or 30 intact dogs in your kennel, you become a "puppy mill" given the way these bills are promoted.

We have faced bad dog legislation before, but 2009 promises to be the worst in the history of the United States. PLEASE, get involved. Have your regional or local clubs write letters to committees hearing the bills. You write your legislators or call them. Make sure they know who you are before the need arises. Pack the committee rooms to show your opposition. Monitor email sites which will alert you to bad legislation. Make sure someone is watching the introduction of new bills in your state. There are many organizations working to fight this bombardment of anti-breeding legislation. You may not come under the bills as a breeder, but this is just the beginning. We need to unite and stop this movement in its tracks. The time for keeping our heads in the sand is over, and we have a lot of work to do. LEGISLATION -

#### **KNOW YOUR RIGHTS**

Recently, we've had a number of horrendous incidents around the country, with people being intimidated and not knowing their rights.

One example of aggressive animal control tactics is occurring in Louisville, Kentucky, where Metro Animal Services officers are poring over newspaper and online pet ads, then calling unlicensed breeders to set up sales. Those tactics are being criticized by local dog club members, dog owners and lawyers, who argue that what Animal Services is doing is improper, deceitful and wrong. They contend that the animal-control officers posing as buyers are not immediately identifying themselves, entering homes without warrants and altering the animals they seize, without any recourse for the owners... Animal Services officials say they're simply trying to crack down on unscrupulous breeders and puppy mills, including those who deal in aggressive breeds such as pit bulls.

To help dog owners cope in this era of anti-dog legislation, the American Dog Owners Association has issued advice on reacting to visits by animal control officers and/or police. The following information is drawn from the ADOA website.

How to Respond When a Dog Law Enforcer Comes to Your Home Familiarize yourself with your community's dog laws. Read carefully the details of any licenses you must have before signing; if you have questions get legal advice. Keep your rabies certificates and licenses in a safe place, readily available to you.

ADOA advises these tips are legal and based upon your rights under the U.S. Constitution.

**Personal Investigation** If confronted with an official demanding to investigate your property, you should ask to see the badge, get the number, the official's full name and phone number, supervisor's full name and phone number, the agency represented, reason for the visit, whether there is a complaint, who made it and whether there is a search warrant (which is unlikely). If the answer is "yes," ask to see it. Do not answer any questions; politely request they be sent or delivered in writing. Have a notebook handy and write down all answers you get.

If you feel that a search of your home might lead to threatened confiscation of your dog or to a criminal complaint, refuse entry unless the sheriff or police are present with a search warrant. Be polite. Call your attorney immediately.

You do not have to let anyone into your house or onto your property without a properly executed search warrant issued by a judge.

You should not be threatened with seizure of your dog(s) without a court hearing or court order . If threatened get the names of all officials involved. Property seizure without due process is unconstitutional; this should include a court hearing at every step. If officials seize a dog they may not destroy or harm it until a judge rules that you are in violation; this requires a full hearing. If threatened with seizure do not answer any questions and call an attorney immediately. Offer no explanations; what you say will be used against you. Do not volunteer any dogs or other property.

Write down everything that is said and done as it happens. Stay calm and avoid violence.

**Telephone Inquiries Or Threats** You may get phone inquiries about the number of dogs you own and whether any dogs orpuppies are for sale. If someone claims to be interested in a puppy get the name, address and phone number. Say that you or another responsible breeder will call back at a more convenient time. If the caller seems

genuinely interested invite them to see your puppies, but do not say you are selling them and do not quote a price.

If you think the caller represents an official body, get the full name, title, phone number, agency's name, supervisor's name, nature of the inquiry, why it is being made and how your name and number were obtained. Ask that all future questions be submitted to you in writing.

If this advice seems to be an over-reaction, remember that dog owners and ethical breeders are increasingly being targeted. Be aware, be cautious and *know your rights*.

As with all issues concerning your legal rights, you should check your local, state and Federal laws and always seek the advice of compelent legal counsel to avoid placing yourself in unnecessary legal jeopardy.

### MEETING COMPLIANCE ANOTHER WAY

Clubs are always searching for ways to meet the compliance mandate from AKC and it is sometimes difficult to fulfill the obligations. Club members should always be looking for unique and different ways to get the necessary components of compliance in place. Compliance that involves educating the public is extremely beneficial.

Recently a touring Pet Expo came to the Meadowlands Expo Center in Secaucus, New Jersey, and asked for kennel club support in exposing the public to different breeds of dogs. The Kennel Club of Northern New Jersey reached out and asked owners of AKC breeds to come and spend some time with the folks on Saturday or Sunday. Anyone who volunteered to bring their dog was entitled to free admission and one guest admission. This proved to be a very nice benefit because we could walk around and see the exhibits, other animals, and the vendors who were in attendance. The exhibits were varied and interesting and included alpacas, goats, elephants, reptiles and wolf hybrids. There was even a cat show in one area — no dogs allowed there. The vendors had many of the items we normally see at dog shows, but some unique products as well. Folks seemed enthralled with Sugar Gliders and were buying them at \$395 each. These little creatures look like chipmunks and "glide" like flying squirrels.

Rescue groups were out in force, too, and I saw parrot rescue, ferret rescue, and dog rescue groups all attracting attention, which is a good thing.

At an announced time, our dogs lined up and waited for their chance to take a turn around a large ring. An announcer provided commentary on each breed as we gaited our dogs one at a time. The public was invited back to our booth where we displayed literature provided by AKC as well as the participating breed clubs. Quite a few people stopped by, but by far our best PR came when we walked our dogs through the crowds and stopped for people to pet them and ask questions. Parents seemed especially happy to have their children interact with the dogs.

It was a positive experience for those of us who were involved. We had the benefit of socializing our dogs, meeting and discussing pure bred dogs with the public, and seeing some interesting exhibits.

The final plus: the participating clubs received compliance credit towards their 2009 show approvals.

#### To: POINTING BREED HUNTING TEST CLUBS

Pointing Breed Hunting Tests Continue to Grow Despite the economic difficulties facing us in 2008, the Hunting Test program continued to grow, with the number of events up 4%. This says a lot about the pleasure of watching a dog do what it was bred to do and the friendly, inviting environment found by new participants. Congratulations to the Clubs that work so hard to host these events.

Clubs in "Remote" Areas Can Hold Up To Six **Tests** - Performance Events has received requests from clubs located in "remote" areas asking if they can hold an additional weekend of hunting tests. (Currently a club is limited to 4 tests per calendar year.) With the increase in fuel costs, these requests are understandable. In February the AKC Board approved a Department recommendation that will allow a club to hold up to six events per year if they are located more than 100 miles from the nearest club holding hunting tests. Please call Connie Thomas (919-816-3907 in N.C.) for more details if your club is interested. This exception would be granted one year at a time in order to not stifle the development of new clubs. A note requesting an exception should accompany the application for the events that a club considers its 5th and 6th tests.

**Introduction to Pointing Breed Hunting Test** Brochure - The AKC has produced a new brochure explaining the basics of the Pointing Breed Hunting Test program. The brochure is meant to allow new participants to become familiar and more comfortable with the event before giving it a try. It is ideal as a handout at sportsman shows, information for new club members or part of a package provided to puppy buyers. The brochure can be viewed and downloaded on-line at www. akc.org/events/hunting tests/pointing breeds/. They are available for shipping in wrapped bundles containing 25 brochures. There is a shipping charge of \$5.00 per bundle. They can be ordered by calling the Performance Events Department at (919) 816-3900 or emailing huntingtests@akc. org.

Don't "Run Out" of Hunt Test Judges - The Hunting Test Advisory Committee that met in early 2007 recommended changes to the judging eligibility requirements including the requirements for existing judges to maintain their eligibility. Starting 1/1/10, all Hunt Test judges must have attended a seminar or passed a written test within the past five years of the date of their judging assignment. #### **US Live Animal Air Shipping Policy Changes**

Date of Article: February 26, 2009

A new directive regarding transporting live animals by air into/through the United States has been put into effect by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). Effective February 1, 2009, the directive requires that all animals, including dogs, coming into the United States from overseas airports booked as manifest cargo – that is, not accompanied by a ticked passenger – must be tendered at their foreign origin airport by a "Regulated Agent" or "IATA-Approved Agent".

#### Parties **NOT AFFECTED** include:

- Within the US, people (breeders, owners, etc.) either shipping their pets as cargo (i.e., not accompanied by a ticketed passenger) or traveling with their pets as excess luggage or in-cabin.
- People <u>traveling</u> with their <u>pets</u> as excess luggage or in-cabin <u>into the US</u> from overseas airports.
- People shipping their pets from the US to a foreign country.

#### **AFFECTED** parties include:

- People shipping pets as cargo not accompanied by a ticketed passenger into the US.
- Individuals living overseas who want to send their pets back to the US as cargo not accompanied by a ticketed passenger.

These affected parties must now use the services of a registered/licensed shipping/cargo/freight agent or broker. Such agents are easy-to-find, as there are usually a number of them near major airports.

As always, individuals flying with a dog into the US should check with their airline to confirm its policies on live animals as excess baggage.

Developed after the tragic events of September 11, 2001, the TSA is responsible for the security of all systems of transportation in the US. The new directive is part of the Department of Homeland Security's efforts to secure all unaccompanied cargo coming into the US. TSA is part of the Department of Homeland Security.

## Lobby Day at the Maine State House

Augusta, Maine - The Federation of Maine Dog Clubs recently gathered at The Maine State House for it's first Lobby Day. The location itself, the historical "Hall of Flags", provided an impressive backdrop for those there to represent responsible dog owners. Delegates of member clubs, independent dog owners, friends and families had a purpose for Lobby Day. They intended to clearly communicate their fears and concerns to legislators surrounding the unyielding onslaught of ever invasive and restrictive dog laws. Regretfully, Maine has earned the dubious "honor" of having some of the "best animal welfare laws" in the country, according to several animal rights organizations. What many animal owners do not understand is how this 'honor' affronts their rights to own, care for, love and enjoy their animals. In Maine, if a dog has fleas, you may risk losing your dog. No kidding.

Maine Governor John Baldacci and his wife Karen each took time from their busy schedule to visit with delegates along with their "First pets" Mia and Sam. The two English Springer Spaniels, enjoyed dog treats supplied by Federation members. Mia and Sam were awarded the first ever blue ribbon for "Best In Legislature" dogs.

Chair of the Federations Legislative Committee, Mr. Jay Kitchener, was responsible for the organization of Lobby Day. AKC provided a wealth of materials from their Government Affairs Department. The Downeast Sled Dog Club's display included a DVD presentation of 'mushing'; members shared their 'braggin' rights' through dog show photo albums, show ribbons, and framed pictures; Penobscot

Valley Kennel Club distributed a portfolio containing factual information including the brochure from National Animal Interest Alliance "If it walks like a duck, quacks like a duck, it is probably an animal rights fanatic." Representation from several other Maine dog clubs included the Central Maine Brittany Club.

John and Ann Short of the Central Maine Brittany Club specifically wanted to reach out to legislators who hunt. Hunters are often the target of animal rights groups. The club's display included many laminated photos of Brittanys actively hunting. Many legislators took the time to browse through the club's 30th Anniversary Photo Album with pictures of Brittanys in the field, ring, agility, flyball, and of course, as a well loved family pet. Pictures of Frank and Donna Pride at the 2008 Hall of Fame Ceremony at the Bird Dog Hall of Fame in Grand Junction, Tennessee was a conversation piece. Complimentary copies of the American Brittany magazine and the Upland Almanac were given out and legislators signed the clubs perennial guest book. The entire display was a miniature version of the club's 2007 Meet The Breed.

The Short's had a smaller exhibit representing responsible dog breeders. One highlight was a laminated journal of whelping a litter and photographs documenting the first 8 weeks of puppy development and socialization, including introduction to birds. Other items in the breeders display

were OFA database booklets, AKC Rules and Regulations pertaining to record keeping, Breeder Code of Ethics, and NAIA information on responsible breeding.

In an effort to build bridges with legislators and discover what common ground they share, the Shorts spoke honestly from a position comfortable for them, in their own words. The Shorts quickly realized Maine legislators already sympathize with and understand what hunters face. A great number of Senators and Representatives hunt and many are Maine guides. Most important, the large majority of Maine legislators own and love dogs. One legislator shared his experiences of handling his show dog as well as enjoying the hunt!

John (CMBC president) enjoyed listening to hunting stories. Ann (CMBC director) was pleased for an opportunity to personally use information gleaned from the 2008 National Animal Interest Alliance Conference where she represented the American Brittany Club. The Shorts candidly shared their views on current legislation. Many legislators offered assistance, sincere as they asked what the main concerns were. They genuinely offered to do what they could to "keep legislature sensible" concerning the "flood of animal rights bills." The Shorts, optimistic of new bridges built on behalf of all dog and animal owners in Maine, recommend that other Brittany clubs and Federations organize a Lobby Day at their own State House.

## 2008 National Animal Interest Alliance Annual Conference Report to the American Brittany Club

In August 2008 the National Animal Interest Alliance Conference was held in Windsor CT. To fully appreciate this conference report first envision a large gathering of professional and amateur individuals committed to preserving the bond between humans and animals. Consider the measureless amount of experience and knowledge present in one place as judges, trainers, owners, shelter and rescue representatives, legislators, veterinarians, lawyers, lobbyists, exhibitors, breeders and all manner of animal enthusiasts commit to work with together. By imagining the planning and passion poured into the NAIA Conference is to comprehend the depths of it's purpose.

For three days conference attendees learned from presenters such as: Jon Fleischaker, Esquire and lead counsel in Louisville KC's lawsuit challenging the Louisville dog ordinance; Richard Earle, a Cause Marketing & Branding expert with 30 years experience, who explained how to use advertising to influence personal behavior and public policy (remember the "Keep America Beautiful" campaign, with the Native American sitting on a horse weeping? That was Mr. Earles' creation); Phil Guidry, Legislative Analyst of Government Relations at the American Kennel Club reported information relative to the 800 bill and ordinances impacting the rights of dog owners handled to date; Marsha Kelly, media consultant and communications expert, conducted a media training session and Kristine Phillips, NAIA Executive Director and public policy expert, lead a workshop on how to frame the issues and advocate for pets and their owners. There were additional topics and workshops presented by many other experts in their respective fields.

Founded in 1991, the NAIA supports and promotes responsible animal ownership and use, and animal welfare. They oppose animal rights extremists. The membership includes thousands of members from diverse backgrounds. Many serve on local, state, and national task force bodies and committees. NAIA works to provide the public with factual information about animal issues, especially those that are complex, misunderstood or controversial.

All responsible animal owners (translated here to mean BRITTANY OWNERS) must recognize, be concerned with, and remain current about the ongoing, aggressive animal rights movement. It is extremely important to understand the meaning behind particular words used when 'animal rights' and/or 'animal welfare' is discussed. Often used interchangeably, these terms can be poles apart.

For our purposes here, "animal rights" typically is a term used to describe a political, radical movement opposing the use of ALL animals for ANY purpose. Although the AR (animal rights) movement attempts to lower the status of human beings to the same level of animals by giving "rights" to animals, 1it is an extreme movement with an ulterior motive, "the extinction of domestic animals."

The AR movement is active in each state, persuading legislators to create new animal welfare laws and ordinances, often empowering local, state and federal government to intrude into the lives of responsible animal owners. Although states already have existing animal welfare laws in place, many of the new laws are invasive and often dictate to responsible animal owners the

manner in which they MUST care for the animals they own or that are in their care.

The term "Animal Welfare" most often clarifies for citizens the right to provide responsible care for an animal humanely and supports existing animal welfare laws. Primarily, animal welfare preserves the constitutional rights of the American citizen to own an animal and to make responsible decisions for their proper care and well-being without local, state, or federal intervention. In general, advocates of animal welfare know laws preventing cruelty, abuse, or neglect of animals are absolutely necessary and all want to see animals treated humanely. On the other hand, animal welfare advocates strongly oppose the progression of increasingly restrictive laws for animal owners:

- · Rabies vaccine requirements/reported to the State
- · Mandated age of rabies vaccine
- · Basic Leash Laws
- Anti-Cruelty Laws
- Zoning/Nuisance Ordinances
- Breeding Permits
- · Ownership limits
- Guardianship vs. Ownership
- · Consumer protection/animal 'lemon laws'

List of the progression of restrictive laws continued:

- Breed Specific Laws/Dangerous Dog ordinances
- · Anti-tethering, anti-crating
- · Prohibition of dogs left in cars, etc.
- · Anti-breeding laws
- · Mandatory spay and neuter laws
- · Regulated/specific amounts of daily exercise
- · Size of kennels, materials used in construction
- · State mandated veterinary care

Often, at first glance, such laws and ordinances appear to be written with a genuine concern for the welfare of animals. And perhaps they are. On the surface, responsible animal owners and legislators could easily agree with any given 'concept.' Unfortunately, this is a problem. Most states already have existing animal welfare laws in effect. New 'concept' type laws are a duplication of current law but with strict and insidious implications. Often, incomplete and vaguely written laws and ordinances are presented "in concept". State officials then are heavily lobbied by the AR movement. The true 'experts' (responsible and experienced animal owners, trainers, breeders, handlers, etc.) are rarely consulted to explain why the new laws are unfair and unmerited. A quick glance at recent issues in California, Kentucky, Maine, Pennsylvania, Ohio etc. confirms this reality.

The political arm of the Animal Rights agenda is extending itself state by state. New vague 'concept' drafts, proposals, ordinances etc. are introduced with alarming frequency. Even more alarming is the speed in which the new laws become effective. Unaware citizens who are responsible animal owners suddenly find they are not in compliance with these laws. In many cases, people are not even aware of them.

For example, John Q. Public, wishing to be a law abiding citizen will submit to a unwarranted "inspection" of his home and property by a government official. Based on how the "official" interprets the [hypothetical] new law, John Q. Public is at risk

of his animals being seized as a result of the 'inspection.' The new law includes regulating the type of water bucket, size and materials of leash/collar to be used, and which materials are permissible to use in constructing a dog house/kennel. The state official discovers the responsible dog owner has not cared for his animals in the manner in which the new law/ordinance dictates. The owner is charged with animal abuse and neglect. His dogs are removed from his property.

Responsible dog owners often are unaware the Animal Rights movement would like to **stop the breeding of purebred dogs**. <sup>1</sup>ALL BREEDING. One group promotes 'anti breeding workshops' and their goal is to make the public think of breeding dogs and cats in the same way they look at drunk driving. An extreme analogy, but AR extremists are entrenched in the political process and are often well established with state officials, thus appearing as credible sources.

Make no mistake, as the emphasis to eliminate breeding and animal ownership continues, division among breeders, shelters, rescue groups, local humane societies, dog fanciers, sportsmen, etc. (those who should be united) will intensify. The AR movement has already had great success. Likewise, hearts of many dog owners appear full of indifference and lack of concern. This obvious apathy must be overcome, but how? Animal owners face a "clear and present danger" far greater than the threat of losing the right to own and care for animals. Although a very real threat, it is simply a poster child for the complete AR agenda. A sense of alarm is felt within the hearts of those who understand the reality of what lies ahead. The AR movement cannot be overpowered unless animal owners unite to face the danger head on, draw a line in the sand declaring "not one step further."

It begins as each person becomes familiar with existing animal welfare laws in their state of residence. The learning experience continues by knowing what new concepts and amendments are under consideration for introduction to the state legislature. Each state legislature has a governmental website with a link on it that can be used to monitor upcoming legislation. By quickly searching for key words access is easily gained to state documents etc. pertaining to issues of concern to responsible animal owners. Individuals can gather information for themselves. They can then disseminate information to other interested parties.

Local and regional dog clubs exist within most states with a wide and diverse membership. Interests range from hunting, agility, field trials, obedience, sledding, tracking, showing, etc. In many states a Federation of Dog Clubs work together to communicate information. This is a great place to give and receive information. The AKC website lists the contact information for these state Federations of Dog Clubs. Likewise breed clubs often work together to heighten awareness among members who may be oblivious to the severity of the AR movement.

It is important to know how local, state, and federal representatives and senators stand on animal rights vs. animal welfare issues as defined here, and to be accountable to better educate them. Sometimes, because they have only heard one side, well intentioned legislators unknowingly support a bill that will hurt responsible animal owners. Most often, legislators are easily accessible, and want to hear from their constituents. The true "experts" are owners with years of experience and legislators will view them as credible resources with factual information.

In addition to legislators, the local media can benefit from factual data based on our real life experiences. Opinion Educational (op-ed) pieces can be submitted along with Letters

to the Editor relative to these issues. Learn the ins and outs, and successful methods of getting something written or published. Contact reporters personally and invite them to sit down with you and discuss your *reasonable concerns*. As we begin to be taken seriously, it is important to remember not to discredit ourselves by demonizing the enemy publicly.

Responsible animal owners (BRITTANY OWNERS) can learn to promote the message of animal welfare to it's essence, to it's most basic form in a credible, professional, respectful manner. While we absolutely do care deeply about the issues of animal welfare we must refuse to join in with the radical extremism of animal rights while explaining the reasons for our opposition to specific legislation articulately. It is possible to present factual information about the bond between humans and animals, to appeal to others through a sincere love and concern of the animals we own and use in our lives. We already KNOW how to care for animals and will always seek to improve upon their welfare. But without the state intervention that ARA so desperately ask for.

The animal rights movement uses emotionalism and sensationalism to promote their agenda, to influence media, legislators, and others, and that speaks for itself. Everyone agrees and accepts without hesitation real animal cruelty and abuse exists but it will never be eradicated by following the AR agenda.

This is a new and proactive era for animal welfare advocates. A positive and time honored message about the benefits and experiences of owning animals is a reality. Many well-defined and documented facts exist to support our concerns, which are no longer noise in the background, easily ignored or dismissed as irrational. Instead, voices rise up clearly as voices of logic, common sense, and unity.

From Maine to California, numbers grow as hundreds of responsible animal owners embrace once again the authenticity of the unique bond that has always existed between people and the animals they love. In most cases, the very best care is already afforded them. It is time all Brittany owners, breeders, rescue groups, fanciers, etc. unite together on this bandwagon regardless of our differences. No more compromises.

In closing, I am extremely impressed by the National Animal Interest Alliance leadership team and the professionals they are aligned with. I will long remember this conference which offered new skills, tools and wealth of factual, significant knowledge. I was encouraged when Patti Strand, NAIA National Director, told me the American Brittany Club has provided loyal support for quite some time. All members should be proud of that fact. I personally thank you for the honor of representing the American Brittany Club and the privilege of attending the conference.

Subject: SPORTSMANSHIP

One of the great traditions of Pointing Breed field events is sportsmanship. Indeed it can be argued that good sportsmanship is a factor that has contributed to the sports long term strength and popularity. Recently an increasing number of participants have expressed concern about what is happening to the culture of sportsmanship. It is worthwhile to periodically re-visit the importance of sportsmanship to the future of the sport.

Sportsmanship is expressed in the nature of one's conduct while associated with a sport. Good sportsmanship includes not only abiding by the rules but also conducting oneself with proper consideration for fairness, ethics and respect for other participants, officials, and those hosting the event, as well as respect for the traditional conventions of the sport. Good sportsmanship expresses an aspiration that the sport should be enjoyed for its own sake.

Sportsmanship is closely related to character. Character refers to one's dispositions, values and habits that determine the manner in which a person responds to desires, fears, challenges, opportunities, failures and successes. A person with a strong, positive character will usually conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner.

There is an additional, more subtle side to sportsmanship. Studies refer to it as "full commitment to participation." This means more than just running your dog. It means embracing the sport in a broader sense through a willingness to contribute time and effort to the sport's success. We all know individuals who participate but never contribute. They are often the first to complain when something goes wrong. This is a subtle form of poor sportsmanship.

The significance of sportsmanship is that it feeds on itself. Good sportsmanship contributes to the pleasure one experiences at an event and helps build support for the sport in general. The lack of sportsmanship works to undermine support for the sport. The experienced participant realizes the vagaries of an event may sometimes result in a less than desired performance. Never the less, if he feels he was given a fair chance and was treated respectfully, he will leave anxious to try again another day. If a participant leaves feeling he was not treated fairly or with respect, he will question if he should enter that event again.

For the enjoyment of everyone involved and the future interest of the sport, please consider the importance of sportsmanship and demonstrate it through your actions and words. We would all do well to remember the words posted in the Branched Oak, Nebraska, clubhouse – "To brag little, to lose well, to crow gently if in luck, to pay up, to own up, to shut up if beaten. These are the virtues of a sporting man." Oliver Wendell Holmes

This years running of the ABC National Field Championship boasted a draw of 66 dogs with 65 coming to the line beginning December 1 to compete for the title of 2008 National Field Trial Champion!

#### FC REBEL JAC'S A HAMMERING DANDY "JAC" NAMED 2008 NATIONAL FIELD CHAMPION

This years winner was bottom dog in Brace 20, FC REBEL JAC'S A HAMMERING DANDY "Jac" a stout, athletic 7 year old white and orange male handled adeptly by Chad Holman and owned by Ron Harling. Jac is a second generation NFC out of NFC/FC Rebel Jac's Hammering Hank and Hi Tail Lakota. Jac bested the field by rolling though Course 2 with a far flung forward race. In addition to his excellent ground race he exhibited intelligence, style and intensity on his bird contacts. Jac was handled quietly which enabled all his natural abilities to shine through. Chad is a third generation national winning handler, with this being his sixth National Open All Age win, the most for any handler to date.

Runner up Champion was bottom dog in Brace 24, CH SHADOW ATTACK "Tack", a well built flashy 3 year old liver and white male handled by Ed Tillson and owned by Phil Dangerfield. Tack is the product of two amazing all age Champions NFC/FC/AFC Shambo's Dark Shadow and FC/AFC The Prairie Tornado. Tack garnered the RU position by running a fast forward race on Course 3. His youth was belied by the maturity he exhibited on his birds and his stamina at the finish all combined to cinch the runner up position. Tack's participation in the National Specialty Show combined with his RU placement earned him the 2008 W. E. Stevenson Sr. Memorial ABC National Dual Award.

In third place was bottom dog in Brace 16, DC/AFC TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO, "Emme" a precocious 7 year old orange and white female handled by Paul Doiron and owned by Tom White and Margaret Horstmeyer. Emme is no stranger to the National Field Championship having been named Runner Up Champion in 2006. Emme was the lone pup out of a breeding between two great NFC Champions, NFC/DC/AFC Tequila's Joker and NFC/DC/AFC Microchips of Nutmeg. Emme ran a snappy forward race over Course 1 and was well extended and strong at the finish. She was an easy handle and

showed exceptional style and intensity on her multiple bird contacts. Emme earned the 2008 Christy's Feather Duster "Best Bitch" Award for being the highest placing bitch in this year's National trial.

Finishing in fourth place from the top position in Brace 12 was FC/AFC KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER "Lester", a handsome 7 year old orange roan male handled by Jim John and owned by Ken Seivert. Lester is out of FC/AFC Blaze Dakota Trucker and Can DC Kinwashkly Crash Test Dummy. Lester's performance can be described as far reaching covering all the likely spots on Course 3. Lester had an exceptional limb find which he handled with intelligence and style. Lester never let up for a minute and finished forward going away.

To just qualify for the National Field Championship is an honor for the dogs, handlers and owners. An event occurred at this years Nationals that is worthy of special mention. The bottom dog in brace 28, DC/AFC Jayhawker Tequila With A Twist, was awarded 2008 National Best of Breed at the National Specialty Show in Fort Smith on Sunday, November 30. Taryn is the first Field Champion in 29 years to win National Best of Breed and the first Dual Champion bitch to ever win the National Specialty Show. Not just a pretty face Tarvn boasts 17 hour career placements to date "Tarvn" is no stranger to the National Field Championship having placed 4th twice as well as earning the W. E. Stevenson Sr. Memorial ABC National Dual Award in 2005 and 2007. This 6 year old orange and white female out of NFC/DC/AFC Tequila's Joker and Princess Haley II is handled in the field by Ed Tillson with owner Jessica Carlson stepping in for Amateur stakes. There were a total of 12 Dual Champions competing in the 2008 National Field Championship with DC/AFC TJ's Single Shot of Scipio, "Emme" earning 3rd place. 11 Dual Champions came to the line in the 2008 National Amateur All Age Championship with DC/AFC Shady's "Tia" Maria taking 3rd place. Another 22 Dual Champions competed at the National Specialty Show with Taryn coming out on top. That we have this large a number of Dual Champions competing and winning at our National Events is proof positive that the dual dog is alive and well in the Brittany world.

A special tribute goes to the seven veteran dogs over the age of 10 competing in this year's National Field Championship. These grand old champions, whose accomplishments would fill an entire page, showed us the tremendous heart, experience and intelligence that has earned them a place of respect in Brittany history. It was inspiring to watch them compete in what was to be the final competition runs for most of them before easing into a well earned retirement.

Judges for this years National Field Championship were Howard Burback from Missouri, Ray Calkins from Oregon and David Taylor from Iowa. The list of National bird dog events these gentlemen have judged is impressive and the depth of their experience and knowledge showed through as they carefully observed, evaluated and discussed each dog's individual performance. They were united in their preference for true all age performances from dogs with a ton of natural bird dog ability that didn't need a lot of direction from the handler to get the job done.

The following dogs met the judge's criteria and made the posting board during this years running:

Brace 12b NFC/DC/AFC Shady's "Tia" Maria; handler Jimmy Berneathy, owners Clem and Marilynne Little

Brace 16a FC "Trace" of Time; handler Chad Holman, owner William Thomson

Brace 16b DC/AFC TJ's Single Shot of Scipio "Emme"; handler Paul Doiron, owners Tom White and Margaret Horstmeyer

Brace 20b FC Rebel Jac's A Hammering Dandy "Jac"; handler Chad Holman, owner Ronald Harling

Brace 24b CH Shadow Attack, handler Ed Tillson, owner Phil Dangerfield.

The American Brittany Club Nationals doesn't just happen by chance. This year Mary Jo was able to send alerts for two dogs that ventured onto the pavement. It is a priceless

service Mary Jo provides looking out for the safety of our field trial Britts. Hot and cold liquids and delicious pastries/cookies were provided by friendly volunteers who never complained no matter how cold it got. A huge thanks to Will Langley of Bottom Creek Farms for providing first class gaited horses for officials and spectators.

Everyone is beholden to grounds keepers Larry McAnally and Red Bailey who groom and clear these grounds all year as well as release the birds before hand to provide optimum bird finding opportunity for all competing dogs. Larry and Red then drive the dog wagon all day throughout the National Field Championship.

Sponsors of this years National Field Championship included Purina who has been providing financial support as well as Pro Plan dog food to the winners and participants for many years. Also the City of Booneville and its friendly merchants extend every courtesy and service to the Brittany crowd and we thank each and every one of them.

#### **EVENTS**

On Sunday, November 30 the National Specialty Show concluded in Fort Smith and the National Field Championship activities got rolling at the clubhouse with dinner followed by the spirited Open Calcutta.

Monday morning, December 1 the Championship running began at 8 am. Monday's dinner at the clubhouse was followed by an interesting and informative Tri Tronics presentation by Hank Hartnek.

Tuesday brought the second day of the NATIONAL FIELD Championship running, but all day Judy and Tom Robin and their able assistants had been preparing the clubhouse for the National Open Party honoring their 2007 National Field Champion NFC/FC/AFC LANE'S END WE-BE CLEAN. What a grand event Judy and Tom presented. The elegant hors d'oeuvre table featured delicious finger foods and the festive table dressings, complete with engraved We-Be shot glasses and all kinds of chocolate, provided the perfect setting for the scrumptious buffet dinner which everyone ate with relish all the while visiting the mind boggling libations tables featuring exotic liquors with unusual names and a powerful punch! After dinner those still able to stand danced to the tunes of the talented local C&W Band. Everything was first cabin and we all reveled in We-Be's celebration. A huge congrats and thanks to Judy and Tom for making it a night to remember!

Wednesday was steak night at the clubhouse! The steaks and accompanying side dishes were delicious and much appreciated after a full day in the saddle.

Breakfast, lunch and dinner continued to be served through the completion of the Championship and once again thanks to Jake and the Bearcat Too crew for making these meals so enjoyable.

#### THE RUNNING:

Day One: It was a frosty 28 degrees the first morning of the National Field Championship, some 8 degrees lower than normal, and I'm wondering where the heck is global warming when you need it? The morning began with a moment of silence for Ed Sawicki who passed November 23, 2008. Ed was a lifelong member of The American Brittany Club, American Field, and Southern New England Brittany Club. He had a deep rooted passion for hunting and field trialing and will be greatly missed by the Brittany community. The dog wagon was loaded with warmly bundled field trial junkies with their flasks full of frostbite remedies. The gallery contained 30+ energized trialers and their frisky steeds awaiting the start of the 2008 ABC National Field Championship.

Brace 1 FC/AFC HANGING JAZE HOWLALEWYA AMEN "Slick", Ed Tillson and DC/AFC TERRAS CABO WABO "Sammy", Paul Doiron. The dogs released in this first brace appeared invigorated by the 28 degree temperatures as both broke fast for the heavy cover on the right. Both reappeared far to the front running the right tree line at the first turn. Just past the barking dog house Slick was found on point in heavy cover. Birds were put to flight with the dog standing tall and tight through the flush and shot. Both dogs moved through the Lick Creek Crossing when Slick ran over some birds, failed to stop and was collared. Sammy almost simultaneously slammed to a stylish point in this same general vicinity. A covey was produced with all in order and Sammy was moved on. Sammy continued hunting hard and was rewarded with a series of finds in the Cotton Field cover at 35, 40 and 45. All of his birdwork was

impeccable and he finished out the hour hunting hard mixing some nice long casts with some shorter work.

**Brace 2** NFC/FC/AFC LANE'S END "**WE-BE**" CLEAN, Chad Holman and FC/AFC DAKOTA ALLEY CAT "**Tiger**", Tom Tracy Jr. Off in the second brace was the 2007 NFC We-Be and bracemate Tiger. We-Be immediately claimed the front and was seen moving forward at all age speed and distance throughout the hour. Tiger ran a fast steady race to the front and had a nice find in Parish Field at 34. The bird was worked with no complications and Tiger was moved on. Tiger continued to work steadily forward at a fast pace until time was called. We-Be was seen going into thick cover at 52 and was not visible when time was called. Judge Calkins was with handler Holman in the cover and observed We-Be swap ends after time had elapsed. True to form We-Be put down a fast forward all age run showing consistently at likely objectives and always to the front but ended up without birds on this occasion.

**Brace 3** FC/AFC SMARTEYES-JOKER "**Jordan**"; Jim John and NFC/2xNAFC/FC/AFC JUST CALL ME "**ROY**", Ben Lorenson. The third brace featured the first 10+ year old veteran Jordan and his 9 year old NFC/NAFC bracemate Roy. These dogs blew out to the front after being released on Course 3. They both go missing with Jordan finally returning to the front at 20 where he began handling and staying closer. He logged a nice find near Mario's Hill and the bird was put to flight with the dog exhibiting good style and excellent manners. After being sent on Jordan was unable to get into his normal all age running gear so the handler picked him up at 40. From the start Roy was a handful with many extended absences. This pattern continued and the tracker came out at 50 when Roy was officially declared gone.

The afternoon braces began with low 40 degree temps and overcast skies.

Brace 4 FC/AFC CLYDE'S MICRO BREEZE "Mike", Tom Tracy Jr. and DC/AFC EMME'S "CABO" DE SCIPIO, Paul Doiron. Mike and Cabo took off in a foot race down the road with Mike peeling off to the right while Cabo went left. Cabo was discovered pointing at 11 in a clump of scrubby trees in the White Post Field. Cabo stood tall and tight through the covey flush and shot. Mike continued moving forward at a medium pace. Cabo pointed again at 15 in the area of the Barking Dog House but no birds were found so he was sent on. At 25 Cabo had a second non productive in the Cotton Fields and was picked up by the handler. Mike continued at a medium pace moving forward searching the likely objectives and found what he was looking for at 50 where he pointed in heavy cover along the Upper Woods Crossing. As the birds were flushed, Mike got a little footsy but was moved on and finished out the hour at a moderate pace.

**Brace 5** SHAMROCK'S SIRIUS **"SI"**, Chad Holman and FC/AFC TJ'S PRAIRIE **"BLIZZARD"**, Ed Tillson. Both dogs blasted off hanging a left running strong through the horseshoe bend, then crossed over taking different sides, hunting hard for the elusive birds on Course 2. Both exhibited strong forward races at the beginning, shortened up in the middle and finished at a medium pace. SI was found on point at 35 in the tree line in Pine Tree Meadow but no birds were produced. Both dogs finished the hour moving ever forward at a medium pace but neither had bird contact.

**Brace 6** FC/AFC MEGASMOKE LIMITED EDITION "**Ted**", Paul Doiron and PANCHA'S PRINCE EDWARD "**Eddie**", Ed Wild. These two were away in a dash moving quickly along the right edge to the front on Course 3. Ted crossed to the left and pointed at 13 in a brushy area. Ted looked good and showed nice manners through the flush and shot. Both dogs navigated Mario's hill and Ted was found on point shortly thereafter along the tree line at 25. Birds were not produced so he was moved on. Eddie entered the big meadow after Lick Crossing #3 and pointed into a large mott at 29. As the handler kicked around in the heavy cover, Eddie self released and was leashed. We regained the front and found Ted hunting hard at a medium pace through the tighter part of Course 3. He was rewarded at 55 with another covey find in a brushy area just past Lovers Bend. Ted looked good through the flush and shot and finished his hour moving at a medium pace through the Beaver Pond area.

**Day Two** – Tuesday dawns crisp and cold with clear skies and a temperature of 23 degrees. There are fewer people on the wagon and it is feared by those in the Gallery the frostbite remedies might be in low supply today.

**Brace 7** TRADEMARK'S ICEMAN "Timmy", Chad Holman and DC/AFC BLUERIDGE "MAJOR" ADVENTURE, David Downing. Major, who has just turned 10, was running in his last field trial competition this morning. Both dogs break away fast to the right and the scouts are sent out. The dogs were pointed out by the handlers running to the front and reappear for viewing at 20. Major pointed at 28 in the feed plot after Lick Crossing. Major stood tall thru the flush and shot and was gathered up and sent on his way. Timmy continued to hunt hard to the front but never encountered birds. Major finished the hour with an inconsistent but forward race. Major has had a remarkable career and his legacy will continue in the careers of his up and coming offspring.

Brace 8 DC HI PROOF "WHIZKI", AI Gorrow and FC/AFC TJ'S APACHE "BANDIT", Ed Tillson. Both dogs take off with a bang and quickly gain Parish Field showing far to the front. Whizki presents himself beautifully and the

handler lets him make his own way feeling no need to direct his every move as Whizki consistently showed to the front in all the right places exhibiting great foot speed and intent. Bandit, another 10 year old highly experienced veteran, also put down an exciting all age performance. Bandit ate up the course with confidence and intelligence moving always to the far front with the handler singing encouragingly. Both dogs logged non productives along the way and there was great disappointment among all of us witnessing this brace that no birds were encountered. Always seen moving fast forward either dog could have changed the placements with a find.

**Brace 9** DC/AFC RU-JEM'S A TOUCH OF BOURBON "**Chug**", Jerry McGee and FC WIMBERLEY JIM "**DANDY**", Scott Johnson. Chug and Dandy take off on Course 3 hunting hard at a moderate pace and range. Chug logged a non productive at 23 just past Mario's Hill. On the front end of the course Dandy was a tough handle running lateral and coming from behind but finally got going forward and just after Lick Creek Crossing # 3 had a nice covey find at 33 which he handled with style and class. Chug continued moving forward and established point near a mott by the Gas Well. The birds could not be found so Chug was relocated and in his enthusiasm bumped the birds and was collared at 50. Dandy finished the hour running to the front at a medium range and pace.

The afternoon warmed to 60 which made it more comfortable for all the spectators.

Brace 10 FC KB'S SHADOW "DANCER", Jim John and DC QUAIL ROCK TOUGH ENOUGH "KING", Paul Doiron. The dogs cast to the right off the breakaway and reappeared on the tree line at the first turn. At 13 point was called on the left for Dancer and on the right for King. No birds were produced for Dancer and he was sent on. A single was flushed for King after a relocate with all in order. Both dogs continued moving to the front through the Lick Creek Crossing #1. Dancer carded another non-productive at 26 in the Cotton Fields and was picked up. King's performance became tenuous and was not meeting the handler's expectations so he was picked up at 32.

**Brace 11** FC/AFC DAKOTA "**LUKE**", Ed Wild and TRADEMARK'S ATM "**CASH**", Chad Holman. These two were released intent on finding birds. Cash's first bird encounter occurred at 8 with a nice covey find. He was mannerly through the flush and shot and moved forward at a moderate pace. Luke made a few nice casts but worked close for the most part. Luke went on point at 40 in the Horton Pond Field, was relocated but the birds could not be found so he was moved on. The dogs continued moderately down the course with Cash pointing again at 50. He stood tight while the covey was flushed and the shot fired. Both dogs shortened up and finished the hour at a slower pace.

Brace 12 FC/AFC KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER "Lester", Jim John and NFC/DC/AFC SHADY'S "TIA" MARIA, Jimmy Berneathy. Both dogs blow out at the start with fast, animated intent. Tia was found buried up in a line of short trees on the left at 9. Birds were produced and Tia stood tall and mannerly through the flush and shot. As the dogs moved forward both were spotted on point in a heavily treed area at 25. No birds were produced for Lester and he was moved on. Judges and handler got off their horses and moved into the thick tangled underbrush looking for Tia's birds. Handler went down a slope when he yelled birds up and fired. Neither judge was able to see the handler or hear the birds rise in the thick cover. Like the pro she is Tia ignored the drama and remained intense throughout the long ordeal. When everyone became disentangled Tia was moved on without further ado. At 38 point was called for Lester by the scout way the heck off the beaten path. The handler, Judges and a few more of us finally arrived in a lather to find Lester waiting patiently and intently in a feed plot near the old corral. He stood tall and tight through the flush and shot and a long fast gallop was required to regain the front. Both dogs continued running strong and forward through the tight area of Course 3. Tia carded another find at 57 which she handled with style and class. Both dogs finished out the hour with strong forward movements.

**Day Three** – At 33 degrees it's about 10 degrees warmer this morning with only a few clouds.

Brace 13 FC THE "ROCK" II, Tom Tracy Jr. and FC ROYAL REVEREND "Luke", Ben Lorenson. Both dogs break to the left running hard and pushing forward. Point was called for Rock at 15 and a covey was produced with all in order through the flush and shot. Luke pointed at 24 in a hedgerow but no birds were produced. Both dogs ran the edges through the Cotton Fields with Rock pointing at 31. Birds came up with all in order and the dog was moved on. Both dogs were found standing at 38 in a hedgerow in the Cotton Fields. Rock was credited with the point and Luke the honor. A covey was produced with both dogs exhibiting excellent manners. Luke moved only a short distance before slamming on point at 41. Birds were produced with Luke standing tall and mannerly. Rock ran a strong all age race but coming down the stretch he was seen chasing birds and ordered up at 48. Luke finished the hour running forward along the edges on the right side.

Brace 14 GRAND JUNCTION "JAKE", Chad Holman and FC/AFC MTB CABO

"RITA" DE SCIPIO, Paul Doiron. Jake and Rita had a fast forward breakaway. Jake put down a nicely executed race, moving forward through all the likely objectives along Course 2 but never had bird contact. Rita had a fast snappy style at the beginning with extended forward casts. At 40 she had a non-productive and at 50 she was not working to the handler's satisfaction so he picked her up.

Brace 15 DC STARLIGHT'S BLAZING SIRIUS "Sy", Bob Burchett and BOUDREAUX'S "JJ" JOHNSON, Scott Johnson. Both dogs take off on Course 3 pushing hard to the front. Sy made a big lateral cast and appeared back to the front. JJ had an extended absence but reappeared to the front at 20. Sy had a non productive at 30 and had to be urged to move on by the handler. When he finally got going he was never seen again and the tracker was requested at 45. JJ pointed at 33 with the birds being produced while JJ stood tall and mannerly through the flush and shot. JJ had a non productive at 42 near the gas well but at 47 he pointed again and this time birds were produced with everything in order and he was sent on. JJ continued running moderately to the front past the Beaver Pond making a nice cast along the tree line. Birds were observed in the air but it was unclear if the dog was involved so JJ finished out the hour moving forward at a moderate pace.

It has really warmed up for the afternoon braces with a temperature a very warm 71 degrees.

Brace 16 FC "TRACE" OF TIME, Chad Holman and DC/AFC TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO "Emme", Paul Doiron. These dogs break away fast and forward intent on just "gittin 'ur done". This was a brace that had the gallery sitting forward in their saddles as the dogs both ran consistently fast and forward. Both handlers kept it simple allowing the dogs to work independently through all the likely objectives on Course 1. Emme first pointed birds at 15 and looked like a million bucks through the flush and shot. Trace pointed at 18 but the birds could not be located so he was moved on. Both dogs roared through the Lick Creek Crossing #1 into the Cotton Fields. Trace pointed in the feed plot at 25 and stood tall and tight as the birds were flushed and the shot fired. At 32 both dogs were found separately on point in the Upper Woods area. Birds were produced for Trace with no complications and he was sent forward. Emme was relocated but her birds could not be found so she was moved on. As Hayden Camp was approached Trace was working the right line and Emme the left line. Emme pointed at 53 in tall grass. The birds were flushed and the shot fired with Emme standing picture perfect. Both dogs used up all of Course 1 and continued down the river edge where they disappeared into the heavy cover. Trace popped out far to the front as time was called and Emme was observed farther down the same edge gaining momentum for a strong finish.

Brace 17 FC TEQUILA DYNAMITE "Mike", Bob Burchett and FC TEQUILA JOKER'S "JOSE" CUERVO, Jimmy Berneathy. Like a shot both dogs head for the corner to the right running the tree line in a fast forward race. They shoot thru the middle casting back to the left for Mike while Jose remained on the right tree line. Point was called for Mike at 24 along the tree line in Parish Field. While the handler attempted to locate the birds Mike self released and was collared at 25. While galloping to regain the front we observed Jose making a monster move around the fish hook moving forward with great speed and intent. As we round the corner catching up to the front we see Jose on the handler's saddle. The 70 degree temperature combined with high humidity had given the handler cause to be concerned for 10-1/2 year old Jose's overheated condition. Having only his well being in mind the decision was made to pick up this grand old champion. In this his last race Jose showed the stuff true champions are made of. Happy retirement Old Man.

**Brace 18** FC LINVEL'S "ACE" OF DIAMONDS, Tom Tracy Jr and BRETON'S GOLD RUN RUFFIAN "RUNNER", Ed Tillson. In the last brace of the day Ace and Runner blew out the front at the start with Ace immediately going missing. Ace was brought into the gallery by the scout at 25 only to find the handler was missing. Ace then proceeded to make a giant left hand turn the wrong way and left the area with the scout in pursuit. The handler was found shortly thereafter and advised his dog had been declared MIA at 30. Runner was unable to move consistently forward logging multiple show ups from the back so the handler elected to pick him up at 28.

**Day Four** – The temps have dropped again and we begin the morning braces with a chilly 25 degree reading under clear skies. Only about 6 people are brave enough to ride the dog wagon this morning.

Brace 19 FC "Jake" ACRES IN DISGUISH, AI Corrow and MAXWELL'S GUN SMOKE "Pete", Ben Lorenson. These dogs immediately disappeared down the right side not to be seen again until they both appeared crossing the road at 12. At 13 Jake bumped the birds that had consistently been in the feed plot on the right side of the road and was picked up. Pete was still no where to be seen when the scout got the message from Mary Jo that he was on the pavement. The scout and handler got him through the road gate and he showed to the front through Lick Creek Crossing #1 but was gone again at 20. At 40 the dog was declared officially gone and the tracker came out.

Brace 20 FC/AFC MEGASMOKE GRAND FINALE "AI", Paul Doiron and REBEL JAC'S A HAMMERING DANDY "Jac". This brace began at the cut off for Course 3 but continued onto Course 2 through the marshy field. Both dogs ran forward thru the marshy field towards the Upper Woods Crossing. Point was called for Al at 5 in the tree line to the right of the Lower Woods Crossing. The bird was produced with AI standing tall with good manners. As we continued handler Holman made a giant cast down the left tree line only to hear POINT called for Jac who was standing tall and tight along the same tree line at 7. Birds were produced with the dog exhibiting good manners and style. Al ran an animated moderate race but the handler expected more so picked him up at 40. Jac continued to run a fast forward all age race running strong to the front. At 38 point was called for Jac but no birds were produced so he was moved on. As we approached the old corral area the birds that were hanging out there took to flight, Jac froze, the shot was fired and a stop to flush was logged. At 53 birds again took flight with the dog standing rigid to the stop to flush. A shot was fired and he was moved forward. Jac was handled quietly throughout the race and finished the hour moving forward at an extended range.

**Brace 21** FC/AFC THE FAR SIDE'S KID "Amee", Al Gorrow and KD'S SLIP AND SLIDE "**Splash**", Ed Tillson. Both of these dogs broke away in stealth mode. Splash was seen crossing the road at 5 but did not resurface so the tracker was requested at 38. Amee, another 10-1/2 year old veteran, was zipping around invisibly until she uncloaked long enough to allow us to watch her work the area around Mario's Hill before going missing again. At 58 her handler called for the tracker so she was officially declared missing at time. Amee exhibited a tremendous amount of spunk for a veteran and was exciting to watch when we got the chance to see her.

The afternoon braces are run in bright sunshine with a temperature around 46 degrees. About six people are on the dog wagon to enjoy the activities.

Brace 22 FC T & W'S DIAMOND "JIM", Ed Wild and HARLING'S BRETON SMITH "Brett", Chad Holman. The dogs broke fast to the front before Jim peeled to the right and Brett dove into the trees on the left. Jim was seen under birds at 9 and ordered up. These particular birds were the demise of a few other competitors and were consistently hanging out in this feed plot in the Big Oak Field. A non productive was carded for Brett at 19 and he just never got going to his handlers liking after that so he was picked at 22.

Brace 23 DC TC'S MATCH BOKS RACER "Rob", David Downing and BRISCO'S MR. "STUB", Ray Trimble. These dogs were put down just after the Lick Creek Crossing #1 and almost immediately after their release Stub went on point in some tall grass on the right side. No birds were produced even with a relocate effort so Stub was moved on. Both dogs continued to move forward at a medium pace hitting the edges. At 20 the handler spotted Stub buried up in some tall thick brush. Birds were produced with the dog exhibiting good style and nice manners. At 32 while making our way back to the front birds took flight and Stub slammed on the brakes and was credited with a nice stop to flush. At 34 Stub had another non productive so the handler picked him up. Rob continued to work steadily to the front edges at a moderate range but never had bird contact.

Brace 24 BELLE'S BEAU "Max", Vic Carrington and CH SHADOW ATTACK "Tack", Ed Tillson. These guys hit the ground running strong to the front. Max slammed on point at 3 in the tree line at the Lower Woods Crossing. The dog looked terrific through the flush and as he was gathered up Tack was found standing just down the line. Birds were not produced for Tack so both dogs move boldly forward making some really nice all age casts and eating up the course. At 38 Tack was pointing into heavy cover just off the horse trail in the old corral area. Max came in and honored with style. The birds were not found during the first kick around so the handler relocated Tack. At this time Max was moved on by his handler. Tack quickly but intelligently pinned the running covey and they were put to flight with Tack standing tall and mannerly. After the shot the dog was moved forward rapidly to regain the front. At 52 Max was found standing near a mott of trees on the right side of the horse trail and simultaneously Tack was pointing with a great deal of intensity into another mott of trees on the left side. A large covey was produced for Tack which he handled with perfect manners. No birds were found for Max so both dogs were moved forward. Tack finished out the hour looking strong and moving ever forward. Max set a more moderate race toward the finish.

Day Five - Today is heavily overcast but slightly warmer at 26 degrees.

Brace 25 DC HAVAPAL'S RENEGADE "BILLY" BOY, Bob Burchett and TRAVELER'S NEW TWIST "Trait", Paul Doiron. These guys hit the ground and were immediately gone on the right. At 22 Mary Jo advised Billy was on the pavement and the handler went to get him back on course. He was brought through the road gate and rejoined Trait who had just reappeared on the horse trail at 25. Both dogs move rapidly to the front through Lick Creek Crossing #1. Trait went on point at 30 and a nice covey was flushed and fired over. Everything was in order and Trait was moved on. Trait found more birds at 34 which he handled with nice manners. At 56 Billy went on point along the river

bank but no birds were produced. Billy finished the hour with no bird contact. Trait finished to the front still hunting hard.

**Brace 26** MUSTANG "SALLY" VIII, Tom Tracy Jr. and FC MICRO T "Mike", Scott Johnson. This pair broke away enthusiastically. Sally hit the cover and went missing early on. At 34 she was officially gone and the tracker was requested. Mike moved forward through the course hitting likely objectives but handling a little rough. Shortly after entering Parish Field Mike goes on point but as the handler approached he bumped the birds and was leashed at 44.

Brace 27 DC/AFC REDLINE'S TEQUILA SMOKER "Smokey", Paul Doiron and NAFC/FC/AFC MAXWELL'S WHITE SPIRIT "Butch", Ben Lorenson. As they broke away from the horse bridge on Course 3 Butch took off with a bang to the right while the veteran Smokey made a big cast to the left through the Lower Woods Crossing where he got hung up in a heavily treed area behind him. The handler finally got him turned forward and they were back on course at 10. Butch made some really nice moves along the right side and at 20 is found pointing near Mario's Hill. No birds were found and Butch was released to hunt some more. Butch pointed again at 35 in heavy cover along the horse trail. As he began his relocation the running birds were ridden up by someone's horse so the handler fired with Butch handling the crowded area in a mannerly fashion. At 28 near the pavilion Smokey appeared to be favoring his left shoulder so the handler picked up the old man. Smokey will now retire but his legacy will leave an impression, not only through his own successes but through the successes of his offspring who are now competing in events across the country. Butch continued to make some terrific all age moves hitting all the far objectives and finishing out his hour along the heavily treed river area.

The afternoon warmed up to about 46 degrees with light cloud coverage.

Brace 28 FC/AFC WHITE MOUNTAIN SMOKE "Bud", Chad Holman and DC/AFC JAYHAWKER TEQUILA WITH A TWIST "Taryn", Ed Tillson. This brace featured the newly crowned National Best of Breed Taryn and her bracemate Bud. Off they went both dogs making long wide casts to the right into the woods. They were seen sporadically mostly running together to the front before they checked in at 22 as they move through the Lick Creek Crossing #1. At 28 Taryn established point at the site of many covey finds on the right side of the horse path near the Old Corral. Bud came in and backed politely. When Taryn was relocated Bud was moved on. No birds were found so Taryn was sent on her way. In the area of the Twin Ponds both dogs weren't making any moves that were particularly appealing so both handlers elected to pick them up at 40.

**Brace 29** ROCKLAN'S WHIZZLE STOP "Whiz", Bob Burchett and FC/AFC GUN RUNNER'S LADY'S MAN "Lute", Jimmy Berneathy. The minute these guys were turned loose you got the feeling they had one thing on their mind and that was to find some birds. Lute was the first to accomplish this mission with a nice covey find at 6. The birds were flushed and the shot fired with Lute standing tall and tight. Next Whiz coveys up at 20. He looked great on the birds and exhibited excellent manners to the flush and shot. Both dogs continued down the course with Whiz making fast forward moves while Lute worked at a more moderate pace and range. At 50 Whiz had another find and as the birds were flushed he took a few steps and was picked up. The veteran Lute finished out his hour moving forward at a reduced pace.

Brace 30 FC EARLY TIMES "Earl", Tom Tracy Jr and FC/AFC RU-JEM'S STOP N WATCH "Quill", Jerry McGee. These dogs had a spirited breakaway on Course 3 moving quickly though the Lower Woods Crossing. Earl established point at 10 and looked terrific as the birds were flushed and the shot fired. Quill pointed along a tree line at 18 with great intensity. The birds were flushed and the shot fired with everything orderly and he was moved on. Quill pointed again at 22 with no birds produced. Earl slowed down the pace and at 40 the handler picked him up. Quill finished out the hour moving forward at a modest pace and range.

Day Six - Final day of competition is frosty at 26 with very light clouds.

Brace 31 FC/AFC HARLAN COUNTY "COWBOY" and NAFC/FC/AFC MAXWELL'S BLEW BY YOU "Chuck", Terry Maxwell. Cowboy scratched and Chuck was released solo. This years NAFC took off to the right and was seen running the left tree line at 9. Chuck worked through Licks Crossing #1 showing boldly to the front. Chuck entered the Cotton Fields at 28 where he spent a little too much time circling the same mott and revisiting the same tree line. He disappeared shortly thereafter and at time had not been seen for a while. Chuck was found on point in the feed strip at the end of Course 1 during the grace period. Several birds were produced with Chuck standing tall and tight through the flush and shot. The judges had seen all they needed to see so we headed to start the next brace.

Brace 32 CHIEF'S "GUNNER", Dave Jones and FC SHADY'S THE PRICE IS RIGHT "Steele", Paul Doiron. The dogs were released on Course 2 and both ran straight towards the horseshoe bend. Steele came through the crossing at 5 but Gunner got hung up and didn't reappear until 24 when the scout brought

him forward. Steele continued a moderate race moving forward through the course hunting hard and looking fresh. Handler Jones continued singing a melodious tune for Gunner who was very unresponsive. Gunner was brought forward again at 56 and was picked up. Steele continued moving forward to finish out the hour at a snappy pace but had no bird contact.

Brace 33 FC TSUNAMI "Sue", Scott Johnson and TRUCKER'S WILD RIDE "Rider", Ray Trimble. These dogs took off on Course 3 and at 1 Sue was pointing in the feed strip right after the crossing. She looked terrific on point and stood tall and tight thru the flush and shot. At 11 both dogs were standing on the right in the Lower Woods Crossing tree line. As we got closer it became apparent Sue was pointing and Rider was honoring. The bird was produced with both dogs mannerly to the flush and shot. At 27 Rider was found pointing in tall grass just past Mario's Hill. No birds were found on the relocate so Rider was moved on. Sue logged a non productive at 34 and a stop to flush at 40. At 46 Sue pointed in a grassy strip in the area of the Gas Well. A covey was flushed with Sue exhibiting nice style and excellent manners. Rider had another non productive at 50 so he was picked up. Sue continued her quick snappy forward race through Beaver Pond Slough. With six minutes remaining Sue dove into the heavily treed river bottom area and headed backwards. She was brought out five minutes later by the handler. This little excursion might have cost her a piece of this Championship because up to that point she had executed a snappy forward all age race with a ton of stylish impeccably executed bird work.

The running was now completed and we all headed back to the clubhouse to wait for the announcements.

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- · Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped. A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.
- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:
   Late fees are: \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for any nomination received more than 90 days after whelping. No nominations will be accepted past 180 days of whelping. Additional late fees may be imposed from time to time by the ABC Board of Directors. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
- Dogs will be eligible to run in the designated futurity to be held in the Spring of the second year following the year of whelping.
- A final nomination fee will be due by September 15th of the year following whelping.
   Entry fees will be paid by the owner of the puppy for each Sectional Futurity field or bench event the dog enters.

## AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- · Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- · Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
