This is Part III of The Sport of Field Trialing from the 1962 American Brittany. This article points out where the early ABC rules were both official and un-official. As you read this article, you will see that we have kept to and been joined by AKC of some of our un-official rules such as "no flushing whips allowed" and adapted to change by joining the "horseback handling" concept. Rules are an ongoing process. Every five years, the AKC holds a Pointing Breed Advisory Committee Meeting to review current rules and Parent Clubs may suggest changes or new rules. Some we as a club have liked, some we have opposed but learned to live with. With gasoline costs as they are presently and grounds more difficult to obtain, we will probably see more and more revisions. We have seen rules regarding judges tightened to improve the quality of judges but as it becomes more and more difficult to find available judges, we wonder when this may come under scrutiny once again. Mature judgments will always be important in looking at and/or revising rules as the author states. No matter what changes we develop over the years, our first and primary thought must be that we are doing what is best for the Brittany Breed and not to satisfy individual whims or preferences for ourselves or others. The American Brittany Club exists to promote and protect the breed.

Part III BRITTANY FIELD TRIAL RULES From the Beginning to Confusion

(Reprinted from *The American Brittany*, Vol. XIV, No. 4, April 1962, pages 11-12)

Whenever there is a trial – whenever Brittany people get together – and a discussion on rules comes up, there is almost certain to be disagreement on what can, or cannot be done.

This amount of disagreement is hard for the old field trial hand to understand. To the newcomer it must be an almost impassable river of confusion between him and field trials.

So much comes down through the years only in part, or by way of memory of what was heard long ago, that it may not be possible to arrive at a truly factual sequence of events. Without attempting to be absolutely correct, this article will attempt to show how this state of confusion arrived on the Brittany scene.

One of the deep causes of confusion and disagreement stems from the very newness of the Brittany Field Trial.

A.B.C. member trials are run under A.K.C. license and A.K.C. rules.

A goodly number of the older Brittany owners, and many of the new, as well as most of the professional handlers, were brought up on pointer and setter trials.

These are run under the rules of the Amateur Field Trial Clubs of America, or under the rules of the American Field Dog Stud Book. These were the rules that these gentlemen first learned, and although at first glance, a field trial, these well learned rules differ in many places from the A.K.C. rules. This would be like learning the alphabet; once learned, it is hard to believe that anything else could take the place of A.B.C. From this comes a firmness of conviction that is hard to dispute, and to the pointer and setter man, it is hard not to believe that anything else could be so.

Allow now for this bit of confusion, understand why it is there, and then let us go on to the strictly A.K.C. rules as they apply to Brittany Spaniels.

At the time when the Brittany first appeared on the scene, he had trouble getting into any field trial. He appeared to be truly a bastard breed. The pointer and setter people saw him as a spaniel, and so could not accept him as a pointing dog to compete with the time honored pointer and setter. Even though he carried the name "spaniel", he was not a flushing dog, so his owners were reluctant to enter him in spaniel trials.

He did make his way into a few pointer and setter trials – and just to make this worse, had the audacity to look good, and even made a few placements which did not endear him to these trial clubs.

Faced with this rather dreary future, the earlier Brittany fathers turned to AKC. At about this same time the other lesser pointing breeds were also approaching AKC with the same thought in mind.

In due time a meeting took place. At this meeting representatives of these various breeds sat down together to work out a set of rules that would generally, and as nearly as possible, be good for all these breeds.

Out of this meeting came a compromise set of rules. And as always is the case, this compromise was not to the best interest of any one of the particular member breeds represented. Each breed gave a little to get a little.

And so a set of rules with minor breed exceptions was set down for all of the pointing breeds to be run under AKC License.

Time and conditions are of importance too. And so rules were made to allow for conditions present then, that did change in the future.

This set of rules is almost exactly the rules that we run under at the present time.

Rules are written – but custom and precedent become important, and become more firmly locked in the minds of men as time goes on.

The early Brittany people had very definite ideas – likes, and dislikes. Their reasons were good, and only time can tell us whether or not their conclusions were good.

However for these reasons, and because of these conclusions, certain understandings were reached on procedures that were never a part of the written and official rules.

Some of these unofficial rules became so strongly believed in that at one time they were even printed and distributed as American Brittany Club rules.

Some of the major "Rules, as understood" are worthy of note, as are the reasons for their being.

The evils that were seen in the pointer and setter trials at that time by the Brittany founding fathers were thought to be due to certain things.

Money prizes were seen as a deterrent to good sportsmanship. The desire for the prize might tempt one to reach a little, while a trophy would not be as great a temptation. So money prizes were not given in Brittany trials.

The horse and the scout were seen as means to push a dog out, and because the Brittany is a foot hunting dog, and they intended to keep him so, all handling was done on foot.

Since the Brittany is a "softer" dog than the pointer and setter – and much loved by his owner, the "means of intimidation" clause as stated in the AKC rules, was carried a little further. Flushing whips were forbidden in the field.

There were other rules of this sort that were never official, but were "understood".

However, only the official rules, could be enforced. And from this, stems most of the present day difficulty.

As we get older, we learn; we become more mature. This is true of us as individuals, and should be true of us as an organization. An outline of rules in a more specific way will follow in the next section of **"The Sport of Field Trialing"**. (No author given)

Mary Jo Trimble Receives AKC Performance Events Lifetime Achievement Award

Introduction given by Doug Ljungren at Delegate Luncheon on December 15, 2008

In the category of Performance our recipient is Mary Jo Trimble. Mary Jo has been involved with Brittanys since the mid-1960s. She was a charter member of the Sahuaro Brittany Club in Arizona and the Illinois Brittany Championship Association. She is currently Treasurer for the Illinois Brittany Club, a member of the Crab Orchard Kennel club, and has served as the Executive Secretary of the American Brittany Club since 1998. Mary Jo is an American Brittany Club Hall of Fame recipient and was recently elected to the Field Trial Clubs of Illinois Honor Roll.

Her dogs have won numerous AKC Field Championship titles, including the National Open Brittany Champion and 4 times Runner-Up Amateur National Champion. One of her dogs was crowned the IAMS All-Age Dog of the Year. And one has been elected to the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame.

Mary Jo is the American Brittany club's Legislative Liaison and a Director in the Illinois Federation for Outdoor Resources, representing the interests of field trial clubs in Illinois. She has written many articles concerning the impact of legislation. The Illinois General Assembly declared May 28, 2006 as Trimble Day to recognize Mary Jo's and her husband Ray's contribution to the sport of field trialing and for their efforts to acquire 16,000 acres of new public land for the creation of Pyramid State Park. Many field trials are now being run on this property. Ray won AKC's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000, making the Trimbles the first couple to win this award.

Our sports are successful due to the efforts of volunteers. We need them, we thank them, the future depends on them. Please join me in expressing our appreciation to Mary Jo Trimble.

Edward J. Sawicki Sr. passes away, peacefully at home.

Family and Field Trial community have lost, a husband, father, grandfather and true friend. Ed Sawicki passed away peacefully in his home in Somers Connecticut on November 22, 2008. It is a sad day that we know Ed is not here on earth with us but a day to rejoice in the memories of the years gone by, the days shared, the dogs watched and run and trained together and in the memories made after the sun set on each of those days.

Ed was born October 11, 1939 in New Haven, Connecticut and came from a big family with 7 brothers and sisters. As a teenager he served the United States in both the Army and



the Navy. After leaving the military he became a member of the Glazer's Local 1333 and remained for 49 years. His first work was for The New Haven Glass Company and later in life, after working 26 years for Chandler Architect Products in Springfield, Ma. Ed retired.

Ed was a big man, not only in stature, but in his respect for all. He was a truly loving husband to Lucille, his wife of more then 49 years. These two made a wonderful team, taking care of each other and always respectful of the others feelings. Both Ed and Lucille spoke of children and grandchildren all of the time when you were with them and over the last few years you could see Ed with Samantha, his teenage granddaughter together riding at the trials. Ed's face was never more proud as he watched her ride and enjoy something with him that was so close to his heart.

Ed came to watch dogs and enjoyed any good performance, regardless of who ran the dog and no matter who the dogs were or what breed they were... he enjoyed watching and running a good birddog. You could tell Ed was excited when he sat a little extra tall in the saddle and maybe his horse was a little faster paced to stay near the front or ahead of the gallery. He would do this as he had a special appreciation of a dog that was out front doing what he should naturally. His greatest love was that of the all age dog when it came to seeing a dog glide across the far reaches of the front and when gone from site, be found standing tall on birds. He would get that excited look in his eyes and that smile and you could tell he was loving every moment of this dog, his or somebody else's.



Over the years Ed used a number of professional trainers, Lee Holman, Rick Smith, Bruce Jacobs, Jim Holman and Chad Holman. Ed enjoyed success with his dogs over the years as a breeder, owner, handler and amateur trainer. Ed and Lucille's Hi Brittany's Kennel was known amongst Brittany owners all over the United States. A few of the dogs that were known from their kennel were Hi Brittany's Sir Chris, Hopeful Barney, Hope's Perseverance, and Buddy Jac. It was 2004 that Buddy Jac, with his hour championship and classic wins was awarded the Purina All Age Dog of the Year honors for the American Brittany Club. Ed and Lucille were both very proud of his accomplishments.

Ed was a judge that looked for the good in a dog and had a high standard of what it took to earn that Championship title and was not one to take his judging assignments lightly. He loved a true hour dog but also appreciated the efforts of all of the dogs and their handler's at the regional trials. His judging assignments covered the landscape of events with regional trials and championships, both AKC and American Field. You knew he was good as he was sought after time and time again to sit in that judge's saddle.

Ed was a founding member of the Southern New England Brittany Club and staunch supporter of that club and all of the clubs of the American Brittany Club. You could see Ed doing any job that needed done and doing it with a smile. He had been President, Vice President, Field Trial Chairman, Dog Show Committee member and worker, and Co-Chairman of the Eastern Futurity Field Trial Committee. Ed was a person that the clubs could count on, whether it was to work or judge or just to come support a function and be there to help when needed. Ed was a person we could all count on regardless of the day or task. He was generous with time, talent and whatever else was needed. In addition to all of the titled jobs, one that Ed seemed to enjoy was that of helping others learn to be better at this adventure of being a handler or trainer of a field trial or hunting dog. Ed seemed to understand those that needed help and was always willing to ride along and, when asked, to give advice on what might be a better way for the dog to show his talent or the handler to do what was needed easier, for the dog's benefit.

In addition to all of this with the dogs, it must be said that without any of it Ed would have been a friend, regardless of what happened in life, he was a loyal and good friend to all that came with a good heart and kind way. He expected much and gave more and in the end, I know he will be missed by us all as he made every place he went a place with more smiles, more good words and a place of great expectations. Ride long and fast my friend, hunt with those old dogs that now run like you with no pain in the joints, heads high and in fields with cool breezes and cloudless skies, where birds are found and dogs earn them just like you love to watch. We are all better for having known you and your family.

Ionia's grounds are some of the best gun dog courses in the country and they had been wonderfully groomed. There were still some breath-taking displays of beautiful yellows, golds and reds in some of the trees while others were already laid bear. By the end of the stake I don't think there was a doubt in anyone's mind that winter was just around the corner. A new group of spectators appeared in the gallery on Saturday morning to join the stalwarts who came to watch both championships. Rumor had it they were there for the party! After a rousing calcutta at the welcome pizza party on Friday night a fabulous party was held on Saturday night in honor of 2x NAGDC Clyde's Double Trouble hosted by Kevin and Sandra Remmers. They had a terrific fish dinner and plenty of libations. Many thanks!

This year's NAGDC, DC/AFC Triumphant's To Hot To Handle, is a marvel to his owners, Jeff and Gina Currier of Zionsville, PA. He is a cobby white and orange 7 year old dog. At eight weeks old, when Jeff decided on a call name for him, he was told with a name like Nitro he better turn out to be something special and special he is. At six months old Nitro was severely cut on some old roofing metal on a Friday evening, as Jeff was getting the birds to head to a hunt test. Fortunately, Jeff was able to get him to the vet just as they were closing. His concern at the time besides hoping for a full recovery was whether he would be able to be shown in the conformation ring. Nitro did go on to show with many great accomplishments including being ranked the number 5 show Brittany in 2005. Jeff's love has always been the field and after much prodding by a close friend he finally took Nitro to the field at 4 years old. First earning his JH and then working towards the elusive DC. Nitro had been at the championship before, but this year he was as ready as he would ever be. After many long hours of work by Jeff this past summer they showed up to run the first brace of the championship highly motivated. The "best dog" was what the judges were looking for and he appeared in the first brace laying down the race of his life. The gauntlet was thrown and he was going to be hard to surpass. Nitro was what the judges were looking for and is the true epitome and essence of the Brittany; A DUAL DOG.

The Running Saturday, October 25, 2008

Brace 1 – Bullet's Renegade Miss Megan (Megan) Jim Carter and DC/AFC Triumphant's To Hot To Handle (Nitro) Jeff Currier- Nitro broke wide to the right with Megan heading up the horse path and then bearing to the right. Megan checked across in front of handler and headed to the left. Nitro checked in and headed back out with a stylish head and tail high find on the right edge at 7 with a single bird flying directly over his head. Both dogs were hunting forward with Megan ahead because of Nitro's find. Nitro took a huge cast down the right edge that is the border of Hire's field crossing the gap in front of the gallery to swap ends and slam on point. It took Jeff 4 minutes to get to him where birds were successfully flushed. In the meantime Megan had a find in a small group of trees to the left mid-way down Hires field. Jim moved Megan on and she had another find going up the left edge. Nitro came along and pointed in the same grouping of trees. I suspected he would have a non-productive because Megan's find had flushed the birds from the area, but another bird was produced for him. In the next field Megan worked to the right and was on point under the apple tree. Nitro also came in to point from a different direction and a divided find was carded. Both dogs moved out extremely well working hard to the front. They were out of sight for a couple of minutes. Last seen to the left both scouts went out with Megan's scout calling point for both dogs. They were pointing deep in some very thick cover. Two judges got off their horses and headed in with the handlers where birds were produced for another divided find. Dogs were watered and guns reloaded before moving on. Megan then hunted the inside the woods edge and Nitro rimmed the field heading over the hill. Just before the boy scout bridge Megan hunted back along the right wood edge. Her scout called point at 55 and Jim headed back over the bridge to take charge of Megan's find. At 57 Nitro pointed a small covey to the right along the wood edge after crossing the bridge and the first fencerow. Meanwhile, a shot and a loud whoa was heard ending Megan's strong attempt to claim a piece of this championship. Nitro's style on this and every other find was high, tight and all class. He finished his hour going up and over cardiac hill.

Brace 2 – DC/AFC Sweetwater Billy Tucker (Tucker) Larry Bates and FC R & J's Buzz Cut (Buzz) Tom Jagelski- Breakaway was heading backwards on the derby course heading for the creek. Both dogs broke left up the hedgerow. At the end of the line at 1:15 Buzz went on point and Tucker came in for a stylish back. Buzz points with great style and Tom was able to successfully flush birds for him. What a nice way to start a brace. Both dogs were moved forward towards the creek with Buzz breaking up the knoll to the left. He disappeared in a thicket halfway up the hill. Point was called and after a lengthy flushing attempt Buzz was relocated. After hunting hard, much to Tom's despair, birds lifted from another thicket close by with Buzz going with them and he was up at 12. Tucker had headed to the creek crossing As he entered the orchard, he had a find at 17. He had two more finds in guick succession with all manners in order. He hunted the orchard thoroughly and had another find at the right in the hedgerow before you enter the shotgun range field. He broke right and ran the fence line and as he broke off and came back across to the handler he took the time to say hello to a hunter and then worked the island of oaks. He was rewarded with a find on the right edge of the island at 32. After a flushing attempt Larry chose to relocate. Tucker took 2 steps and he pointed again. After watering he broke along the hedgerow in front and worked up the hill at the end of the field dropping back down in front of Larry. He hunted the cover fairly close to the handler before the dyke. He worked the cover to the right after crossing the dyke. Upon going through gap he was found standing to the left on his 6th find. His style was nice and all was in order. He was moved on through another field and was found standing through the right of a gap. All in order, again! He moved on and headed to the left where he was found at 57 standing off the hedgerow a good distance from his birds. Again all was in order for his 8th find. This dog can find birds and I bet Larry sure was glad he found his gun!! All of this was done after he had just ran and placed the day before in the open championship.

Brace 3 – FC/AFC Coos Rylee (Rylee) Roger McPherson and FC Prairie Creek Dan (Dan) John Henderson-30 seconds into the brace Dan went on point on the side of a high grassy area opposite the handler. After attempting to flush, John chose to relocate. Birds were flushed and all was in order. Dan caught the front and took the right edge. Dan went on point and Rylee backed. John again relocated and Roger asked to take Rylee on. This was a nice find for Dan and the relocation attempt was successful. Rylee had a stylish find at 10 in the hedgerow to the left before you get to the big field before Sessions Creek crossing. Dan got hung up behind in this same field. Rylee got a little sticky through the creek crossing, but once through hunted the cover hard and was out of pocket for a couple of minutes. You sure could tell he had been in the grouse woods lately because he liked the thick stuff. Dan caught the front hunting with nice range and pattern. Both dogs were found standing on a hedgerow to the front and they were carded with a divided find at 21. After releasing the dogs they both hunted forward. Up ahead Rylee was found standing. Unfortunately, Dan circled Rylee and was up at 24-1/2. Rylee was fine and continued to hunt the cover hard patterning in front of the handler at decent range. He continued to disappear and then reappear. As he was taking a left edge at 58 minutes Roger walked up a bird. As we continued up the hill, Rylee was taking the right edge at time.

Brace 4 - FC/AFC Wrigley's First Dance (Jazz) Gil Hopper and 2x NAGDC/DC/AFC Calistar DelPrado (Star) Les Casselberry. First brace of the afternoon on course one. Windy conditions prevailed. Star broke left only to be called in by Les. She crossed in front and headed out to the right. Scout called point in the second field after the breakaway. Les flushed multiple birds and she handled them beautifully. When released, Star again went far right at the far ranges of the course making a really nice cast. Jazz broke well and worked kindly for her handler patterning back and forth in front of him. Jazz would take a nice casts and at times the swirling wind would cause her to run the blind side of the line. Star did get sticky at the far corner of the field that is the opposite edge to the breakaway fields and it took quite a time for Les to steer her back on course. Star disappeared into the woods before the bridge and took a nice pass to appear in front of the handler. At 53 she was still going strong. Jazz had one find on the 2nd line before the boy scout bridge. The scout found her on point buried in the center with her front feet 12 inches higher than her rear, as she was standing on a log. A 3 bird covey was produced with all in order. At the bottom of cardiac hill Jazz was picked up after failing to stop on a bird that lifted. Judge Wade Haines was waiting to the side of the road for the other dog to catch up. Star came upon him and backed the situation. Once Les reached her and released her there was an unfortunate occurrence. At 57 there was a bird in the road and Star went with it to end this veteran's bid to three-peat. It was a sorry day to hear this would be Star's last field trial.

Brace 5 - FC Peter Gunn (Pete) Jim Carter and Sumac's Blazen Bibi (Bi) Roger McPherson-Breakaway was on the derby course heading towards the creek crossing. At 10-15 seconds into the brace Pete when on point to the left pointing into the hedgerow. Bibi came around and was whoaed into a back by Roger. Pete had very nice style and there were multiple birds with more lifting after the shot. Pete handled them superbly. Both dogs headed across the creek with Bibi breaking left and Peter right. Bibi has a lot of speed on the ground. They got a little erratic by the gun dog parking lot, but settled in before heading into the orchard with Pete making a nice move to the right edge of the orchard while Bibi hunted the orchard hard for Roger. After hunting down the shotgun range field Pete had a stop to flush by the middle island of oaks. It took Jim a while to get to him and he held tight. They worked the right edge of the course to the dyke. When we came out of the dyke crossing, Pete went on point to the right as you would head up the hill in some very thick cover. Bibi came in, but failed to back and was picked up at 39. Pete was relocated, but no birds were flushed resulting in a non-productive. Apparently Pete is a right handed dog because that is the side of the course he liked to hunt. He was rewarded with a find with the bird under his nose. He handled it with grace and was moved on where he had a point on the right halfway up the hill. Jim had to relocate him twice as he could not produce the birds. Unfortunately, none were found and he was moved on. Pete hunted the course until time.

Brace 6 –**DC/AFC Bebops N'Awlins Jazz** (Jazz) H-Sue Lehosky, O-Leslie Hunt and **FC/AFC Bebop Finnegan's Holiday** (Holly) Fran Gorman-These two sisters, liver and white and orange and white respectively, have been competing against each other for the last 9 years. Both dogs broke away nicely and out of sight. At 2 minutes Jazz was found standing halfway down a hedgerow to the left. Holly had not been seen, but was discovered behind some high grass backing. Jazz was absolutely gorgeous on her point with both head and tail high and tight. Unfortunately, she decided to go with the bird after the flush and she was up. Holly handled very smoothly for Fran throughout requiring minimal handling and little scouting. Fran wins my award for the politest handler. She always said please and thank you when asking to send Bill out to scout. Holly was carded with 3 finds with the second one on the outer right side of the course with the scout calling point. She continued hunting the cover and had another find around a small group of trees to the right. She handled the birds well and was moved forward. A bird was seen running in the road and Holly managed to avoid that one, but another one lurked up the road further and she was awarded with a stop to flush.

Dogs Posted—Triumphant's Too Hot to Handle and Sweetwater Billy Tucker

Brace 7 - DC/AFC Bizcuit's Ecko of Dreams JH (Eko) Tom Jagelski and FC Brook's Little Pete (Opie) Jim Carter- Sunday was forecast to have 45-50 mph winds with temperatures dropping and snow mixing with the rain. Fortunately, this did not happen quite as predicted. Both dogs broke away strong to the front with Opie going over the hill. Ecko checked in once and headed back out with a nice snappy run. Opie was seen heading wide to the right and at 11-1/2 minutes scout called point. Jim had to go back a couple of fields and it took him several minutes to get to him to find him standing under an apple tree. He self relocated before Jim got there, but as Jim flushed he stood through the shot. Opie took the same long edge leading to Hire's field and at 20 minutes he was standing pointing into the hedgerow. The bird was walking in the gap of the hedgerow and Jim flushed and fired. At the same time Ecko had a find at 23 in the small grouping of trees to the left in Hire's field. Opie came along and pointed in the same little group of trees. Jim ended up relocating him, but no birds were found, guite possibly because they were all gone from the previous find. Jim elected to move Opie on. Opie took the hedgerow line back to the left and pointed. Birds were found this time and he handled them with style. Meanwhile Ecko was hunting the left edge to the front and was rewarded with a nice find midway up the line. Opie followed in his footsteps and at 33 was carded with a find in the same spot. Opie, was moved forward and worked the hedgerow before the old bard field. Unfortunately, he went with a bird and was picked up. In the meantime Ecko was picked up bringing a bird to Tom from under the apple tree at the end of the right side hedgerow in Hire's field.

Brace 8 – Suemac's Liberty Belle (Libby) Roger McPherson and CH/ AFC Rubyridge's Megadot (Dot) Larry Sandusky-Both dogs scooted away quickly with nice ground speed. Dot is a snappy running dog although she didn't always stay on her edges. Libby was the more forward of the two staying on the left edge. Judge called point for Libby at 9. Dot moved in front of Libby and was ordered up. Roger was able to flush for Libby and all was fine. Libby had nice style on this bird. After the find Libby shortened and worked more closely in front of Roger. As soon as Roger took off his raincoat, the sky opened with the predicted rain pelting us the remainder of the brace. Libby continued to hunt the cover closely until 50 where Roger elected to pick her up before the creek crossing.

Brace 9 – Jer & Ames Sweetwater Express (Guffy) Denny Sullivan and FC/AFC Shady's Be Sumbuddy H-Brian Hendrickson O-Delmar McAllister-As the dogs were released by the gun dog parking lot, the sky cleared and the sun came out. Guffy headed left and at 2 minutes was seen with a bird in his mouth. Oops...Bud had a find shortly thereafter to the left in a grassy area under a tree as you head into the orchard. Brian flushed and fired with Bud minding his manners. Bud worked the orchard and was seen standing way to the right pointing into the last hedge row before the shotgun range field. He self-relocated a bit much and after the flush and shot judges requested that he be picked up.

Brace 10 - DC/AFC Ricochet Maggies Jac JH (Jac) Julie Condron and FC Boudreaux's Hi-Caliber Bullet (Cali) Darlene Dow-Julie had been injured by a horse the night before and taken to the hospital by ambulance. We were all grateful that it was not serious and she was able to run Jac the next day. Judges were hoping to pick up a brace so we wouldn't have to run a single brace on Tuesday morning. Because of early pick-ups, this was it. Breakaway was at the start of the shotgun range field. Both dogs broke away quickly with Cali making a big move to the right and then crossing back in front of the handler. At 4 both dogs were standing in the island of oaks at the end of the field with Jac haven gotten there first and Cali circling in from the opposite side. Judges called it a divided find and Julie went in to flush what turned out to be a large covey. Both dogs worked the cover to the right heading to the dyke. After coming out of the dyke crossing both dogs worked the cover with Jac nicely forward on the edge. At 21 we came through a cut to find Jac pointing to the left off the hedgerow with Cali backing. Julie attempted to flush for 4 minutes after which she elected to

relocate Jac and Darlene asked to move Cali forward. At 30 Cali is found standing in the middle of a hedgerow to the right of a gap with several birds in front of her. Darlene flushed and everything was fine. Jac made his way to the front by himself and entered the area where the birds had just flushed. Judges allowed an alternate handler in Cindy Cropek. Jac was standing on the treeline ahead and to the left at 34 minutes as Cali worked ahead. Cindy flushed the birds for him and all was well. Jac was again pointing at 45 towards the pond. When birds were flushed, he took several steps in the direction of the flight to end his bid. Cali had hunted forward with quick speed. At about the same time Cali was seen standing in the middle of hedgerow. Birds were flushed, shot fired and Cali was moved on across the big field before Sessions Creek bridge. She darted across the field and was seen going into the hedgerow between two dead looking trees. The judge and gallery caught up as Darlene entered the gap before crossing the creek. Cali was standing to the left opposite the direction of the bridge with head and tail high pointing into the thicket. Birds were seen running in front and judge ordered to fire the gun. Cali was sent across the bridge and she hunted the cover to both sides. Cali worked the next couple of fields and then worked the center of a lengthy hedgerow to the left of what would be the upper part of the derby course. Point was called again at 56. After a very lengthy flushing attempt Cali was relocated. She took 2 steps and stopped again. There was a large pile of brush and trees that had been pushed back from the edge. A valiant branch throwing effort was given, but no bird was produced. Darlene elected to take Cali on and time was called.

Brace 11 - Casco By Jasper (Jasper) Peter Mazzaglia and Starlight's Tau Ceti (Tau) Paul Katzel. Breakaway was on course one after one of Kathy's great lunches. Jasper broke up the hill and was out of sight for a couple of minutes. He was found standing by the scout on the far right edge of the course. Peter had to back track a couple of fields. He must be in shape because he did it rather quickly. By the time we approached the dog looked loose on point and the judges stated they had seen birds leaving the area before Peter got to him. Peter fired and collared Jasper on. Unfortunately, at 13 minutes while catching the front a bird popped from under a pine tree and Jasper went with it. Tau broke nicely although the shorter of the two. Because we were separated I missed the first few minutes of the brace. We caught up while Tau had bird contact at 16 and the bird lifted before Paul could get to him. Paul fired and all was in order. Tau handled kindly and patterned at a fairly close range. At 22 minutes Tau came off the right hedgerow towards Hire's field with a bird in his mouth. Judges determined it was a dead bird and a non-event. Tau made a nice move down on the right line. He checked in frequently with the handler. He was not pleasing the handler and at 48 he was picked up.

Brace 12 - Jeter - Mike Blondin and FC/AFC RC's Ruff Ranger (Ruff) Rob Richter - Jeter is an up and coming two year old who had run in the spring at the Eastern Futurity in Medford, NJ. The wind really picked up during this brace, but the rain and snow stayed away. Breakaway was after the hill heading up into the derby course. Jeter was barking and it turned out to be a deer. He couldn't catch it so he elected to return. Ruff had broke forward and worked the clumps heading to the creek. He stopped once, relocated and pointed. Rob fired and all was fine. After the creek crossing Jeter took a nice cast along the left edge. He was out of sight below the hill along the gun dog parking lot. Ruff was more forward and was working nicely in front of the handler upon entering the orchard. Jeter returned from the road to the left where the dog wagon sits, crossed in front and took a nice right edge heading towards the orchard. He crossed back in front and headed way out the left towards the pond. As he came in towards Mike in the orchard he had a tail high find at 20 with Ruff coming in to back. When released, they both patterned through the orchard with Jeter taking the left and Ruff the right. Jeter took the whole left edge along the shotgun range and disappeared over the hill. He was in front of Mike when he spotted a hunter with a GSP on the left edge. He ran all the way across the field to say hi, turned on his heel and came back in. Ruff pointed in the island of oaks, but it turned out to be a dead bird. He was released crossed the gap and was standing again-on another dead bird! Hawks were having a field day apparently. Ruff took the edge up the hill and cut in while Jeter was running the right side. Ruff had yet another dead bird find. After the dyke crossing both dogs worked the right edge. Ruff had been trying to pin some birds for a while and finally pointed them towards the end of a small island of brush. Jeter came down

off the hill and rounded the corner. Unfortunately, he was almost on top of Ruff before he saw him and at 49 he was up for failing to back. Watch out for this up and comer. Ruff stayed put and Rob was able to flush and fire. He finished the hour strong with slightly diminished range.

Brace 13 - FC Suemac's Bodacious Pride (Bo) Roger McPherson and 2x NAGDC/DC/AFC Clyde's Double Trouble (Dub) Kevin Remmers - Both dogs started strong and to the front. They had barely gotten started when at the gap heading into the big field before Sessions Creek Dub went up over the stone wall. Multiple birds lifted and Dub failed to stop. Bo worked the cover hard. You could sure tell he had been in the woods lately. At 18 heading into the derby course on the left Bo was standing with nice style. Roger gave a lengthy flushing attempt before relocating Bo. The wind was blowing very strongly at Bo's back. No birds were located and Roger moved Bo on. Bo has an attractive running style working to objectives. At 31 Bo was standing to left as we crossed the creek. His head was high and tail was the same. Roger flushed and fired. All was in order. After Cardiac Hill Bo jumped in the thick stuff on the right and took the whole edge in a nice far reaching very pretty move. He crossed in front of Roger and worked forward quite wide to the left. He pointed a woodcock, but as the bird lifted Bo went with it.

Dogs Posted--Boudreaux's Hi-Caliber Bullet

Brace 14 - FC/AFC Wrigley's Chip Makin' His Marc (Chip) Mike Poehler and FC/AFC Hy Steppin Maggie SH (Maggie) - Chris Sennott - The was the day of the strangest weather yet; sun, wind, sleet, snow and hail. Monday, 8:15 breakaway on course one was cool and crisp and the wind hadn't showed up yet. Both broke to the front with Chip maintaining the lead while at the top of the breakaway hill Maggie broke to the right. Although not as far reaching as previous braces she was rewarded with a find on the right hedgerow at 4 minutes. She had beautiful staunch style. Chris fired and moved her on. As we broke through the gap, Chip was seen making a huge cast along the right edge, crossed the horse path and went on point much the same as Nitro. It took Mike a LONG time to be able to get to him as he was well out in front. Maggie made game along the same edge, but ended up making a beeline up the edge and came in to back Chip. As Mike approached Chip, a bird got up and Chip went with it so he was up at 14. Maggie took a nice edge along the left side, checking the small mott of trees and moving on. At 17 she pointed further down the left edge. Chris had a little trouble firing, but all ended well. After Maggie's find, judge rode up more birds. At 22 she disappeared to the right and was found standing by the scout. The birds were running away from her. Chris fired and all was well. Even though Maggie was not quite as far reaching as others, she held her edges and worked very well with her handler's directions. At 28 she was found standing again in the hedgerow before the old barn field. All was in order. Dog and handler were watered at this time. She took the left edge coming to the lone tree and came in on the road in front of Chris for a bit before she took back off on nice edge to the left and took it to the end and worked the hedgerow in front. She crossed the gap and pointed at 32. She self relocated as Chris approached, but stopped before he committed to the flush. Birds flushed and all was in order. Coming down the hill before you get to the boy scout bridge she took a left edge and pointed at 44 minutes. She was well off of these birds. She is a consistently forward running dog, at nice gun dog range. She had another find at 51 minutes at the top of the hill to the left of the tractor path. Birds were in the path and she had them pointed. She finished the hour a little tired but still hunting and working forward. This pair worked as a real team.

Brace 15 – FC/AFC Red Haired Mary (Mary) Bill Gorman and Dick Tracy III (Bo) Jim Carter – Dogs broke heading away towards the derby course heading towards the creek. Mary made a nice lick to the left. Bo and Mary both worked the area to the left in the clumps of thicket before the creek crossing. Mary went on point and then Bo went on point in the next little clump. Both had a lengthy flushing attempt, with Jim winning the battle to fire his gun first. He moved Bo on towards the creek crossing while Bill relocated Mary. She worked the area and pointed at a different clump. Bill was able to put birds up this time and fire. Mary quickly went on point again which turned out to be a pile of feathers. She was still heading to the creek crossing when she took the left side of a fairly long island of low brush. She was intensely pointing into the cover and was rewarded with a nice find on a single quail. Finally, Mary made it across the creek. She took

the left edge and then she became a bit erratic by the gun dog parking lot, but settled down as she headed towards the orchard. She is very quick on the ground. At 20 Mary went on point to the left of the horse path pointing into a clump of thicket. Bill flushed and all was in order. At 25 minutes we headed into the orchard. Shortly thereafter Mary was seen under birds and was ordered up by the judges. I did get guite a ways behind Bo, but at 22 minutes a shot was heard in the orchard and he remained on the ground. As we caught up, Bo had a find in the island of oaks after the shotgun range field. He has a pleasant hunting style with moderate range handling very kindly for Jim. After crossing the dyke Bo worked the left edge. After the first couple of fields, he was found on point to the left of a gap standing in the field pointing into the hedgerow. Jim went in to flush and Bo was steady. At 50 minutes he was pointing into a hedgerow to the right where birds had been encountered before. All was in order. At 59 Bo was again standing. pointing to the left of the tractor path around a small clump of trees. He was quite a ways from the birds. Jim was able to reach him for the flush and all was in order.

Brace 16 - FC/AFC Gamblers Eye of The Storm JH (Stormy) Mike Mikoff and Matrix Grand Illusion (Rex) Roger Fiorito - Breakaway was along the hedgerow where one would turn turning left at the red tree going into the big field before Session Creek. Rex took a nice wide right edge while Stormy went more forward. Stormy was on point some 20 feet down the hedgerow from the gap. Mike attempted to flush birds in front of him, but the bird lifted from a different direction than he was flushing. Mike fired with all in order. Stormy was guite a ways from the birds. In the meantime, Rex had come in from the right, circled behind the gallery and backed from across the tractor path. It was one of the most beautiful backs I have ever seen. At 8-1/2 minutes Stormy cut into the hedgerow to the left of the tractor path at the end of the big field before Sessions Creek bridge. He went on point at the edge. Rex had been working to the right edge of the field. It looked like he would make the creek crossing without seeing Stormy, but that was not the case. Rex came in and backed from a loooong way. Another beautiful back by Rex that impressed everyone and Stormy was credited with a find. Both dogs worked the cover and took edges making their way along the derby course. Stormy went on point in a left hedgerow. Mike flushed a bird for him and all was in order. Both dogs moved forward and went through the next gap in the hedgerow. Rex was seen under birds. Stormy kept going down the same hedgerow. He pointed then went with the birds. What a shame. These dogs were doing a nice job.

Brace 17 - FC/AFC Pale Rider (Duke) John Sala and Bullochs First in Line Alvin JH (Alvin) John Bulloch - Breakaway on course 1 after lunch. Both dogs broke up the hill. Alvin was out of touch with John almost immediately, but came back in from the left to make contact. He cut across and headed right. Both dogs were out of sight and scouts were out. Alvin was spotted smoking along the far right edge two fields over. John Sala's scout called point and both dogs were found to the far right edge standing at opposite sides of the hedgerow. John Sala attempted to flush, but after quite a while no birds were produced and both handlers elected to move their dogs on. About this time the blue sky disappeared and the gray cloud pelted us with sleet. Duke took the same long edge that borders Hire's field. Alvin followed the same path moments behind Duke. Both dogs got erratic at the end of the hedgerow and it took a few minutes to get them moving forward. Alvin worked to the left and made game around the small stand of trees to the left. He had a stop to flush, but took a few steps and was up. At 34 Duke was standing to the far right where he had worked the hedgerow. John was able to flush and Duke was steady. John took him quite a ways across the field before releasing him towards the gap. Once Duke hit the hedgerow in front he followed it back around to the right which would have lead him back. John got him straightened around and heading in the right direction, however, Duke ran across some birds and failed to stop and at 40 ended this brace.

Brace 18 – High Hopes Tiger Jac (Jac) Cindy Cropek and FC/AFC Far Sides Lucky Gun Runner (Lucky) Al Regelbrugge – Both dogs broke away nicely with Jac taking a nice edge. At 3 Jac was running along a hedgerow and birds lifted and Jac kept going with them. Lucky had broke forward and out of sight. He proceeded to run independently of his handler. At 17 ½ the dog was standing at the top a hill to the left pointing over his shoulder. He did turn himself around as handler approached. Al could not find the birds so relocated Lucky. As Lucky hunted into the wooded area Al walked up the bird. The dog was moved forward. He made an awesome move up over a hill to the left before the boy scout bridge. Unseen he must have dropped down the opposite side, crossed the road and was found standing way to the right. Al was able to flush multiple birds , but he couldn't get his gun to fire so the scout fired his gun. All was deemed in order and Al now had the scout's gun in his possession. After crossing the boy scout bridge he made a nice move down the left edge. The scout called point way to the left which was off course. By the time handler got to him the dog was moving. It was now snowing and dog and handler were both directionally challenged and the course marshal got them both on track. After we crossed the creek, Lucky took the left edge heading towards the gun dog parking lot. He ended his hour heading into the orchard.

Brace 19 - DC Hi Point's Taking the Plunge (Splash) Pat Koczenasz and NGDC/FC/AFC High Hopes Fly By Nite (Zoey) Al Cropek - The final brace broke away into the orchard under blue skies. A far cry from the snow of a few minutes prior. Both dogs were similar in appearance making it difficult for judges and this reporter to tell them apart. At 2 Splash established point to the right side of the orchard. Handler shot and the dog was sent forward. Both dogs hunted hard through the orchard. Zoey took the left edge through the shot gun range field. Splash had caught up and was following suit with nice ground speed. Both dogs hunted the island of oaks and then the hedgerow line to the left of the island. Both dogs were found standing on the far side. Without having seen what happened the judges called it a divided find. Al attempted to flush. When no birds were produced, he elected to move his dog forward. Pat relocated Splash and birds got up and so did she. Zoey worked the hedgerow forward and headed up the hill. She worked the cover to the right as we approached the dyke crossing. After the crossing she worked to the right and then crossed in front to take the left side. A bird lifted and Zoey failed to stop bringing to close the 2008 NAGDC.

Bill Cartmell Elected to Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame

The Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame board of directors, acting as the Old Timer's Committee, recently by unanimous vote elected Bill Cartmell of Booneville, Arkansas as the newest member of the BFTHF. The official induction ceremony will be held in February during the annual Hall of Fame activities in Grand Junction, Tennessee.

Most people are aware of Bill's longtime association with Brittanys and the sport of pointing dog field trials, but I would like to point out some of the highlights of that longtime involvement. Bill's association with the Brittany began back in 1962 when he was living in up state New York. He was involved in many of the activities and held several offices in the Upper New York Brittany Club and other regional Brittany clubs. He served on the board of directors of the US Open Brittany Championship, the first of the hour endurance events. He also served on the board of the International Brittany Championship, along with Bill McClure and Frank Ash, when it started on Dr. Walker Heap's Sno Fun Farm in Watertown, NY. Over the years he has served in many offices and capacities at the Brittany National Championship events. He was also a member of the Chemung Bird Dog Club and spent several years as a director of the New York State "Bird Dog Association. During his involvement in all these activities he was training and running his own dogs along with judging, reporting, working on statistics and filling in with

any job that needed to be done. His participation in all these activities over such a long period, is in itself extremely commendable, but there are two things that Bill spearheaded that stand out over and above all of them. He was the driving force in the founding and formation of the BFTHF and was the strongest promoter of the hour Championships for Brittanys. Without his tenacious, unwavering efforts there might not be a BFTHF today. Bill was promoting and pushing the Brittany Hall of Fame idea years ago when a lot of people thought it was a pipe dream that would never come to fruition. "Look at it now"! The same thing occurred with the one hour Championship events. For years, Bill pushed for hour stakes by tracking pedigrees of dogs that won in hour stakes, compiling and studying statistics, writing articles and encouraging breeders to think about breeding for dogs that could run the hour events. Today we have over forty one hour Brittany Championships.

Bill Cartmell being inducted into the BFTHF is an honor he richly deserves for forty six years of dedication to the Brittany breed and the sport of field trialing.

Bill has recently decided to step aside as chairman of the BFTHF and the board of directors have voted for Rick Smith to fill that position and lead the organization into the future.

Pointing Breed Field Trials Tracking Collars at AKC Pointing Breed Field Events

Garmin DC 30 Collar Not Allowed in AKC Field Events


Only AKC approved tracking collars are allowed in AKC Field Trials. The use of tracking collars is left to the discretion of the host club.

Pointing Breed Field Trials — Tracking collars are allowed unless the host club specifies on the premium list they are not allowed.

Pointing Breed Hunting Tests — Tracking collars are allowed <u>only if</u> the host club specifies on the premium list they are allowed. (If the premium list does not mention tracking collars, tracking collars are not allowed.)

AKC Approved Tracking Collars

The following makes / models of tracking collars are AKC approved for pointing breed field events provided they are unmodified from the manufacturer and the transmitter is mounted on the manufacturer's collar —





If the unit is not one of the above makes/models or it is mounted on something other than the manufacturer's collar, then the following specifications must be met for the tracking collar to be approved for use in AKC events —

• Excluding the weight of the collar itself, the unit shall weigh no more than five (5) ounces. The transmitter shall be mounted on a one-inch (or less) wide collar. A regular ID plate may be affixed to the collar. The collar surface adjacent to the dog shall have no protrusions.

Use of Tracking Collars at AKC Pointing Dog Events

- 1. A dog while under judgment may wear no more than two collars. This may be any combination of one tracking collar, an ID collar or a flash collar. All collars must be worn on the dog's neck. The tracking collar shall remain on the dog during the entire brace. If a handler elects to remove the tracking collar, the dog shall be considered out of judgment.
- 2. The handheld receiver shall be kept in the possession of the Judges or the Marshall.
- 3. The handheld receiver can only be used after the dog is determined to be out of judgment.
- 4. The use of a tracking collar is an elective and the running of the stake shall not be held up due to lack of available equipment.
- 5. Tracking collars are not allowed in a callback for a retrieve or honor.
- 6. Any person using a receiver to locate a dog currently under judgment and prior to official authorization of its use by one of the Judges shall disqualify the dog in that stake and the offender shall be disqualified from that field trial.
- Note Electronic flashing collars are not allowed in AKC Pointing Breed field events.

Garmin DC 30 Collar Not Allowed in AKC Field Events

The AKC specification concerning tracking collars that are allowed to be used at pointing breed field events is –

Excluding the weight of the collar itself, the unit shall weigh no more than five (5) ounces. The transmitter shall be mounted on a one-inch (or less) wide collar. A regular ID plate may be affixed to the collar. The collar surface adjacent to the dog shall have no protrusions.

The AKC Performance Events Department has examined and field tested the Garmin DC 30 collar. The weight for all the pieces of the unit that can be removed from the collar exceeds the allowable weight.

AKC acknowledges the outstanding technology incorporated into the DC 30 collar. There has been a great deal of interest. However, the DC 30 collar does not meet the long standing specifications and will not be allowed in Pointing Breed Field Trials or Hunting Tests at this time.

It was once again the Ringneck Brittany Club's turn to host the Pheasant Championship for the American Brittany Club. This prestigious event took place on the Dave Tech ranch, beginning on Monday, September 22 and concluding Friday, September 26. Located four miles from the small friendly town of Bonesteel, South Dakota, the grounds are vast prairie landscapes, with ideal habitat for the ringneck pheasant that reside there. There are also sharptail grouse, prairie chicken, and quail on the grounds. The hills are steep, with treed draws, plum thickets, and planted feedstrips which hold birds, but are also hard to pin the birds as they have so many escape routes. It amounts to a tough challenge to all that come here, dogs, handlers and horses. The grounds were in excellent shape this year, but the birds were down somewhat in number.

As it usually is, the weather becomes a factor here. Once again we had hot, dry weather with a high wind most of the time. There have been hotter years, and windier years, but this was still a brick wall for many of the dogs.

Our judges were Wes Felt, (with addresses in both Nebraska and Texas) and Todd Williams, from Clarinda, Iowa. Both men gave of their time and knowledge in the many hours in the saddle that it takes to judge a big hour stake. They remained in good humour throughout the week. We owe them a big thank you for their efforts.

The winner came from the 18th brace, the last one run on Wednesday afternoon. EARLY TIMES is owned by Bo Ackerman and trained and handled with expertise by Tom Tracy, Jr. Earl put together all the elements that the judges were looking for, style and intelligence on his birds, all age range and willingness to handle. Earl has been on a winning streak lately, and his performance here proved it is no fluke. Runner up honours went to DAKOTA ALLEY CAT, also owned by Bo Ackerman and again handled by Tom Tracy, Jr. Tiger ran in the 26th brace on Friday morning and had three crisp finds, two on chicken and one on a covey of quail. Third place went to the consistent winner TEQUILA WITH A TWIST, owned by Jessica Carlson and handled by Ed Tillson. Taryn ran in the 22nd brace, Thursday afternoon, and put down a gutsy all age race in tough condidtions. Her finish was one of the strongest

in the stake. 4th place went to TRADEMARK'S ATM, owned by Jim and Janet Chase, and handled by Chad Holman. Cash had a smart race, with two finds. The second one was a knock your socks off pretty find on a covey of sharptail.

(This was a banner week for Tommy Tracy, not just in the winners circle, but he had become a father a few days before the championship began and had just arrived here just in time to run his string of dogs. Congratulations to Carla and Tommy on the birth of their son.)

Purina once again was generous in the support of our trial, with dog food for the winners, and a cash donation that our club uses to sponser a steak dinner at the local Fairfax Bar and Grill. Without the sponsership they give, we would not be able to hold the high standards in the important hour stakes across the nation, and the debt we owe them is countless.

Our club is small in number and counts on all members to pitch in and help. Ken Seivert, Randy Walth, Ronnie Walth, and myself, were on hand to do the paper work, marshall, release birds, fill water tubs, report, dog wagon, bring coffee and sweet rolls to all who rode. It was nice to see Rob Rohner, a member now living in Nebraska, who came and drove the dog wagon for the weekend trial, but had to return home and work during the week and so was not able to attend the Pheasant Championship. We had trialers from all over, as usual. The economy and the high fuel prices might have affected the entries to this out of the way trial, yet we drew a healthy entry of 58 dogs, all of which went to the line. We also had young Justin Kolinas to entertain us. He is quite a versatile guy, dog handler, horse trainer, farrier and very innovative when it comes to transporting himself to the trial grounds. I would say he is a field trialer we will see for years to come!

Brace 1# KB'S SHADOW DANCER - Jim John & MAXWELL'S CHARISMATIC-("Jack")- Terry Maxwell. We broke away above the first dam, into a brisk wind. The sky was hazy, temperatures moderate for the morning, but would rise to the mid 80's later in the day. The winds, too, rose through the day and presented challenging conditions for most competitors. Dancer and Jack started well. Jack was seen sparingly in the early portions of the course, as he charged forward through feed strips, showing again at the large pond. He began to tire and Terry picked him up at 42 minutes. Dancer ran an erratic race, making some smart all age casts, interspersed with some flat spots. No birds were seen this brace, and Dancer was up a few minutes short of the hour.

Brace 2# ODESSEY'S ACE OF HEARTS-Chad Holman & TJ'S THUNDER-Jim John. Ace is a young dog of great promise. He went to hunting right away and at 31, he scored the first find of the championship, showing proper manners. He began to stretch out after that, at times challenging Chad's handling in the wind. Thunder rimmed the edges through the artesian wells area, shot forward to hit the distant grassy fingers in the hay meadow. It was here that he had a non-productive at 33. Thunder continued to be strong on the ground making a pleasing big move down the treeline past the dam to finish with power to spare, but birdless.

Brace 3# GLADIATOR'S ARCTIC EXPRESS (Rebel)-Tom Tracy & HARLING'S BRETON SMITH -Chad Holman. Rebel made a big cast over the hill at breakaway to the front, not to be seen again under judgement. Bret started slowly, going to the right places, getting stronger as he warmed up. He had a non-productive at 15. At 30, he pointed with nice intensity. A relocation was required, but did not end as desired-as birds rose with dog still moving.

Brace 4#-LE GRAND TANK DU FAYETTE-AI Garrow & TRADEMARK'S ICE MAN "Timmy"-Chad Holman. Tank was not feeling well, and Al picked him up early. Timmy, who had put in a very memorable performance on this same course last year, was not up to the task today. Chad picked him up early.

Brace 5# MODAN'S BELIEVER ("Buddy") John Cross & GAMBLER'S GOOD DEAL ("Billi") Chad Holman. Breakway took place on the last third of course !#. This pair struggled with the brutal wind and heat. They tried--at one point, we crested a hill to spot both dogs far to the front, as we approached the heavily wooded creek crossing to the artisian wells. Billi got overheated, and Chad picked him up at the wells. Buddy had a stop to flush on chicken as we rode down the shale canyon. At 53, Buddy went on point. With John making a flushing attempt, a tired Buddy sat. He was picked up.

Brace 6# ELEET'S COLORADO BLUE -Tom Tracy & KD'S SLIP N SLIDE ("Splash") -Ed Tillson. A good breakaway, Blue made a few impressive casts before he was lost from sight and not returned to judgement. Splash continued his good pace, going to the right places, and maintaining his momentum for the whole hour. He had a stop to flush at 43 on a pheasant. He met the challenge of the heat, showing good conditioning.

No dogs posted.

Tuesday, weather improved, still hot but no wind.

Brace 7# SMARTEYES JOKER ("Jordan") Jim John & WOODY-Chad Holman. Chad rode up a bird at 4 that flew over Woody's head, and he didn't get stopped fast enough. Jordan was on point at the end of the first feed strip. Jimmy had seen a bird depart, but it was not observed by the judges. Turned loose, Jordan continued to hunt the feed strips, and had non-productive stands at 11 and 15, to be picked up.

Brace 8# RU JEM'S A TOUCH OF BOURBON -("Chug") Jerry McGee & BRITTMONT THE HAWK-("Hogan") Al Garrow. Hogan and Bourbon were both off to the races right away, two good front running dogs topping the hills and flying down the valleys. As we approached the beehives, Hogan was seen going over a hill, not to be seen for a considerable time. Once Al had pulled out the tracker, he reappeared. Chug was putting on a show. He is a fast, smooth running all age who handles kindly. He continued in strong fashion, except for a brief spot when he balked at charging through a herd of cattle. The brace ended with Chug birdless at the artisian wells.

Brace 9# TRADEMARK'S ATM-Chad Holman & CEDAR VALLEY BANDIT-Tom Tracy. Cash went to hunting right away seeking out objectives that would hold birds. Bandit is a young dog who just didn't get untracked with handler removing him from competition at 20. Cash took the edges of cover well through the shale canyon and traced the grassy fingers in the hay meadows to the left, crossed in front to the right edge of the field, then on his return back to the left, in the fringe of grass by the road, he whirled to an intense stand at 26. A pheasant got up as Chad arrived. Released, Cash sought the front, and at 33, was spotted standing tall, proud, high chin and tail on a well located covey of sharptail, silhouetted against a scenic background near the cedar trees. Cash continued to hunt intelligently for the rest of the hour.

Brace 19# LINVEL'S ACE OF HEARTS-Tom Tracy & SHADOW ATTACK-Ed Tillson. A pair of nice running dogs stretched out from the beginning on course 1#, Ace taking the treed coulees to the left and Tack flying along the feed strips up top. Ace was putting on a performance that had the judges hoping to see him on birds. Hung up by turning right in the hay meadows, he eventually was back on course and hitting every draw, taking them to the limits of visablity, with no slacking of pace, it was unfortunate that he ended up birdless. Tack displayed a competitive race for the first 45 minutes, then began to check back frequently to his handler. Ed picked him up for doing so.

Brace 11# PJ'S OZZIE-Ed Tillson & SHAMROCK SIRIUS-Chad Holman. Ozzie put in a solid hour, going well with no slackening of pace, but ended up birdless. Sy was somewhat erractic, at times reaching and at other times a bit flat. Sy performed a good find on a pheasant at 43, in a grassy swale on the right hand side of the hay meadows. He had a non-productive a few minutes later.

Brace 12# REBEL JAC'S A HAMMERIN DANDY- Chad Holman & WOLF RIVER'S WINNING TICKET-AI Garrow. Off to a slow start, Ticket looped in the left field, while Jac hunted the treeline to the right. We met up with an angry Angus cow, who chased after the judges party for a considerable distance, insisting they must have done away with her calf. The handlers took the dogs to water at the artisian wells, with Ticket much improved after getting wet down. Jac had a mannerly find at 23 on a pheasant and began reaching outeventually out of pocket-then hanging up behind and not handling. Ticket had a non-productive in the sumac as we climbed a hill above the dam. Once we hit the feed strips he had another n.p. at 55.

Posted Dogs, TRADEMARK'S ATM, SHAMROCK SIRIUS, REBEL JAC'S A HAMMERIN DANDY

Wednesday turned out to be the most pleasant weather of the week, mid 70's and light breezes .

Brace 13# CEDAR VALLEY AYSA-Tom Tracy & TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD- Ed Tillson. Aysa swung through the east side of the pond at breakaway, and got sticky in the feed strips above it, making getting her back on course a problem. Tommy picked her up. Blizzard on the other hand, went to the front with purpose. He was seen to duck down to the draw leading to the big pond. He was not found again in time to remain in competition.

Brace 14# MAXWELL'S BLEW BY YOU ("Chuck") Terry Maxwell & LANE'S END WE BE CLEAN-Chad Holman. Chuck ran a very wide race, topping hills and effortlessly holding the front for the whole hour. He had a very strong finish. WeBe also moved out well, applied himself to finding birds. He went from objective to objective in the hay meadow, hitting the edge of the cornfield above. As we dropped across the road in the Seale's bullfield, dogs were over the hills in the draws to the front. At 23 Chad lifted his hat, and we rode over a hill to see WeBe intently pointing with Chuck lower down the draw standing looking away from WeBe. Sharptail were flushed in front of WeBe, with Terry also firing. WeBe continued to apply himself at good range, still punching hard in the right places at the end of the hour.

Brace 15# BRETON'S GOLD RUN RUFFIAN-"Runner"- Ed Tillson & TRACE OF TIME-Chad Holman. Runner began to the right, while Trace hit the left side of the hight hay meadow, crossing to the front and covering ground. As we dropped down to turn to the left, Trace got hung up to the right and quit handling. Chad picked him up. A few minutes later, Runner was losing his momentum and suffered the same fate.

Brace 16# SHAQ ATTACK-Tom Tracy & TUCALOTA'S RUNNING REVA- Ed Mayhew. At 5 minutes Reva pointed with style. She showed great control as a hen pheasant hit her in the face while exiting the feed strip, only turning to face where it flew. Shaq had dived down to the right at breakaway. A pheasant was seen leaving the area with no clear explanantion for its flight. Shaq came on, had a find on a running bird at 11 minutes, taking a step during flushing. Deer were seen with Shaq close behind once he caught the front, and he was not seen again until he showed up front in the hay meadows. He was picked up. Reva explored the course. heading to the left in the hay meadows. She continued to hunt until she was seen under a flying pheasant to end the brace.

Brace 17# HI PROOF WHIZKI-AI Garrow & MIGHT AS WELL BE THE GUNNER-

Justin Kolina. Breakaway was in Seale's bullfield. Gunner had a handsome find at 13 on a covey of sharptail, with birds rising all around him. On this piece Whizki had backed on his own, released himseilf and had to be whoaed to stop again. Gunner had a non-productive at 20 minutes. Both dogs continued to run the hillsides, as we dropped over one hill, a bird flew from a plum thicket, followed a short while later by both dogs, who were ordered up. Gunner managed to root up a pheasant and chase it before Justin could collect him.

Brace 18# EARLY TIMES-Tom Tracy & GRAND JUNCTION JAKE-Chad Holman. Earl and Jake broke away from the artisian wells, Jake rimming the first treeline while Earl took to the rough hill country to the left. Earl continued wide and strong while Jake stayed to the front. As we hit the deep canyon, Earl dived in, getting left behind as Jake and Chad forged forward. Once Earl was gathered he showed good casts, handling easily, while hitting all the right places. He scored a beautiful find on a pair of pheasants, one of each sex at the small pond on the right hand side of the hay meadow. He caught up with us at the big pond, and regained the front. Chad was taking Jake bird hunting in the feed stips in the final minutes and ended up with a couple non-productives. Earl finished up near the breakaway pond, showing going forward out of a feed strip just as time was called.

Thursday, another hot and windy day...

Brace 19# BRISCO'S MR. STUB-Ray Trimble & BRETON'S CASTLE ROCKET-Jim John. Rocket was quickly out of sight. Stub pointed at the edge of the last feedstrip before the first gate on course one. This was a non-productive stand. Before he went 200 yards he added a good find, a stop to flush and then another non-productive. On this last stand, Rocket appeared out of a feed strip and failed to back. Stub went on for a few minutes, but he had gotten so indoctrinated that there were birds in every strip that he would not run an all age race. He was picked up.

Brace 20# RHETT-Tom Tracy & HANGING JAZE HOWLELEWYA AMEN-("Slick") Ed Tillson. At 30 minutes, Rhett was involved with putting a couple birds in the air. Slick had a non-productive stand at 27, and was lost before the hour ended.

Brace 21# KT'S ARTIC GLADIATOR ("Max") Holman & ACE'S DI. Max was slow to start and when he did not improve, Chad picked him up. Di showed great speed and enthusaism but some immaturity. Getting her to go forward became difficult and she was ordered up.

Brace 22# JAYHAWK'S GEORGIA GIRL (GiGi) Tom Tracy & TEQUILA WITH A TWIST ("Taryn") Ed Tillson. Two quick moving bitches broke away on course one. At 19 Taryn had point called for her, but moved on, and the point was waved off. Moments later GiGi pointed with high style in the same area, and got a non-productive for her effort. Tommy picked her up, as she was not impressing him. Taryn was putting down a good race, really impressing in the hay meadows, where she took the two islands right side of the wind and then headed to the cornfield edge above, and took it all the way down. As we dropped in to the bull pasture, Taryn acted birdy at the top of the hill, worked her way down and around a grassy edge, took it down to the low point in the draw, stopping just as a big rooster flew out. She was to have a strong gutsy finish moving strongly along the wooded creek edge where we cross to the artisian wells. It was about as hot and windy as it would be all week.

Brace 23# RUJEM'S STOP N WATCH ("Quill") Jerry McGee & FARTHER OUT PATCH-Chad Holman. Patch started out his brace with exciting speed and pattern. A young dog, Patch spent himself in the heat, and would be picked up halfway through the hour. Quill started more slowly, building to a mature and smart hunt. At 16, as we rode the rocky road past the shale canyon, Quill was stopped and Jerry asked judges if they had seen the bird leave. The answer was no, and Quill put in a good hour without any further bird contact.

Brace 24# CLYDE'S MICRO BREEZE ("Mike") Tom Tracy & CHEYENNE WIND DANCER ("Dan") John Cross. Mike began with some very wide moves. He was out of pocket for a bit, and when he returned, he was intrigued with the bull frogs in the pond. That was the end of his bid. Dan, too started out well, going to the right places. At 36, he had a non-productive along a grassy finger, with a long effort to relocate that did not work out. Dan was tiring as we hit the feed strips, but he continued to try. Right at time, he bumped a couple birds.

Posted Dog-TEQUILA WITH A TWIST

Friday's weather was mild to start, but soon rose to as hot and windy as it was the other days.

Brace 25# PERFECT TIMING ("Ty") Chad Holman & JAKE ACRE'S IN DISGUISH-AI Garrow. Ty was only seen once as he went over the rise the other side of the dam from breakaway on course one. Chad pulled out his tracker before we hit the second gate. Jake went the hour, trying to find a bird with no success.

Brace 26# DAKOTA ALLEY CAT ("Tiger") Tom Tracy & KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER-(Lester") Ken Seivert. Two roan half brothers cast away from the artesian wells, Lester taking the left rough stuff and Tiger going with power to the front. At 13 as we topped the steepest hill you would ever want to see, near the water pump, Tiger put on the brakes and pointed some sharptails. Three minutes later, Tiger styled up nicely, with Tommy flushing a sharptail in front of him. Tiger really went to work edging the grassy fingers to the left in the high hay meadow. Lester took a big swing on the right side, crossed to the left, and went on point in a grassy finger to take a non-productive. Tiger got the job done on the ground and nailed a large covey of quail at 52 minutes. He finished strongly. As Kenny was catching the front, point was called by his scout, and we had a long ride to see the dog. Anticlimatic, as no birds were produced. We decided that we knew a shortcut to catch the front party. We were wrong! So there was a long break between braces.

Brace 27# BADA BING-AI Garrow & RUJEM'S DIAMOND JIM- ("Gem") Jerry McGee. Bing was lost soon after breakaway. Gem styled up in the valley below the hill, but no birds were produced. He moved out nicely and applied himself to the job at hand. At 38, he pointed and a weak hen pheasant was put into a short flight. All manners were in order. At 44, along a feedstrip, Gem had another non-productive to end his hour.

Brace 28# TRUCKER'S WILD RIDE-Ray Trimble & MUSTANG SALLY II-Tom Tracy. Action was quick in coming at 2 minutes out as this pair stopped prettily to honour the flight of a hen pheasant as they crossed the dam right off of breakaway. All manners were in order, and more birds flew as they were collared out. Rider worked forward at good range. Sally was flying across the country in the fields to the left, somewhat lateral but showing great initiative in checking out likely places. Tommy picked her up in the hay meadows. Rider continued to press to the front, but as we entered the bull field, a sharptail got up, Rider pointed seconds later, and released himself. That was the end of his bid.

Brace 29# THE ROCK II-Tom Tracy & RAMBLING MAN ("Randy") AI Garrow. Breakaway at the pasture gate, mid course one, with both dogs displaying enthusiasm at the breakaway. At 6 minutes, Rock pointed in a grassy draw. No birds were flushed and Tommy elected to pick Rock up. Up ahead Randy had overheated somewhat and was also picked up early in the hour.

After the Trial

The 2008 running of the ABC's Gun Dog Classic was won by FC TM'S TENNESSEE TWISTER, a 5 year old female owned by Brooke Caviness and Lisa Pollock and handled by Tom Tracy, Jr. Sway rimmed the limits of the course and punctuated her performance with 6 well-spaced finds during her hour. Runner-up was awarded to DC COUNTRY ROADS ROUGH RIDER, owned by Karen Stout and handled by Bob Burchett. Cooper also had an excellent ground game with 6 finds and pushed the winner hard for top honors.

Third-place honors went to FC/AFC COVEY RISE'S RAMBO JR, owned by Chuck and Jill Schaefer and handled by Bob Burchett. JR had a consistently forward race and 4 finds. FC TOLKA-BELLE 0 KID RUSTY'S PRO, owned by Andy Kroll and handled by Bob Burchett garnered fourth place.

Judges were well-known dog men Garvin Collins and Bob Reynolds, both from the "Show Me" state of Missouri. They lived up to the billing, giving every dog a full opportunity to show what they were capable of doing. Each of the 33 starters had their total performance evaluated during the allotted hour. The trial was run over 3 days of nearly ideal weather conditions on the 1000 acre Union County Bird Dog Ranch near Thayer, Iowa. Participants came from as far away as California to the west and Upstate New York, New Jersey, and Virginia to the east to compete in this prestigious event.

THE RUNNING:

Day 1. A cold-front with associated thunderstorms passed through on Sunday night and left almost an inch of rain in this part of lowa, making the grounds wet in some places. Temperature was approximately 45 degrees when the first brace broke away under an overcast sky at 8:15 AM.

Brace 1: UPLAND ACRES OVERLAND XPRESS (Zip)/Burchett and BOUDREAUX'S HI CALIBER BULLET (Cali)/Dow. Both dogs broke away

to the front from the Horse Corral and proceeded south, then down and through the Lower Creek Crossing and onto the regular All Age Course. Zip was wide and Bob had to gather him up before moving on. Cali went to the top of the hill, turned left and pointed along the finger west of the Hedge Row at 10. A bird was produced and shot fired, with all in order. Meanwhile, Bob had collected Zip and continued east. Zip scored a find along the east food plot south of the Hedge Row at 12. Dogs continued clockwise around the course. Zip pointed near the Fallen Shed at 20, but no bird was produced. Cali was found on point north of the Hedge Row at 31, with 2 birds flushed. Dogs and handlers crossed the road onto the north course at 39. At 44, Zip pointed by the feeder on the south end of the Hedge Apple Orchard. A bird was produced and Zip was taken on. Meanwhile, Darlene called point at 45 in the orchard. Gallery saw a quail running, but judge did not see the bird. Cali was allowed to relocate and she pinned the bird in a thick growth of brambles beneath a cedar. Judge finally saw the running bird and instructed handler to fire. Zip pointed at 57 on the north end by the feeder at end of east finger but no bird could be produced. We finished the hour at the Old Barn Site.

Brace 2: ROOSTER'S STARDUST (Star)/Tracy and W-HAVEN MOOSE AND DIXIE'S KIM (Kim)/Burchett. Break-away was at 9:20 from Old Barn Site headed west. Bob called point for Kim at 6. Bird was produced, but Kim suffered a severe breach of manners and was up. Star continued on and ran a respectable race, but was unrewarded for her efforts as she finished the hour without bird contact.

Brace 3: SPEEDING TICKET'S RADAR GUN (Radar)/John and TOLKA-BELLE 0 KID RUSTY'S PRO (Rusty)/Burchett. Radar and Rusty broke away from the Keyhole at 10:45 headed north. The course turned west on top of the ridge and continued through the Big Bluestem Field, across the Upper Creek Crossing, and back to the Horse Corral. Both dogs were running well and to the front as we turned south, then southeast to the Lower Creek Crossing. Bob called point for Rusty at 18 at the Finger Feeder. Initial flushing attempt was not successful, but relocation was and a bird was produced with all in order. Bob again called point at 23 at the Terrace Feeder, but a protracted flushing attempt and relocation yielded no bird. Radar had gone ahead and Rusty regained the front at

27 as we headed south on course. Radar disappeared in the Church Corner and scout was dispatched. Radar was found standing at 30. Jim produced a bird and continued on. As they came up to regain the front, scout rode up a bird that flew over Radar's head. She stopped and was credited with a stop-to-flush for her manners. Bob called point at 35 in the field on the west side of the course between the two fingers. A solitary bird was flushed from under a cedar. Radar and Jim caught the front at 37 on the west end of the Hedge Row. Both dogs and handlers continued north and crossed the road onto the north course at 45. Rusty pointed again at 52 at feeder in Hedge Apple Orchard. Initial flushing attempt was unsuccessful and dog was allowed to relocate. During relocation, birds flew and Rusty stopped to the flush. Bob fired and continued on through the Orchard and across the Double Crossing. Time was called as handlers emerged from the Covered Finger Crossing. Bob found Rusty standing as he rode to the top of the ridge and was allowed to attempt to flush a bird. Neither the flushing attempt nor the subsequent relocation effort resulted in a bird and Bob collared the dog. However, scout rode up two birds as she rode to handler and dog

Brace 4: TUCALOTA'S ABBY (Abby)/Mayhew and RU-JEM'S PRAIRIE WIN (Win)/Burchett. Abby and Win broke away from the Horse Corral at 1:45 PM and headed south. They turned east after crossing the Lower Creek Crossing. The brace was short lived, however, as both dogs committed a lapse of manners almost simultaneously in separate incidents at 12.

Brace 5: CEDAR VALLEY BANDIT (Bandit)/Tracy and TEQUILA DYNAMITE (Mike)/Burchett. Break away was at 2:10 PM south of the Hedge Row, heading south. Bandit made a huge cast to the Church Corner. He was spotted by the judge in the extreme far corner. He returned along the south edge and pointed in the south food plot at 8. Tommy was unable to produce a bird and moved on. Meanwhile, Mike took the extension of this feed strip farther to the west, but was unable to stop in time after birds came up in front of him. Bandit was found standing by the feed strip on the west side of the Southwest Rock Crossing at 12. Extensive flushing and subsequent relocation attempts did not produce a bird. Tommy sent him on and he spun hard on a point at 19 by the Finger Feeder, Judge Collins and Tommy disappeared into thick cover and a shot was fired. Bandit crossed the road onto the north course at 29 and proceeded to the far north end of this course. Bandit stopped as two deer ran from cover at the north end of the eastern-most finger. Tommy collared him out and sent him on to the Old Barn Site where he elected to pick up at 48.

Brace 6: COUNTRY ROAD'S BOILERMAKER (Pete)/Burchett and TM'S TENNESSEE TWISTER (Sway)/Tracy. The dogs broke away about 3:10 from the Old Barn Site and headed southwest. Both turned back around the end of the ridge, however, and returned to the barn site and disappeared into the cover. They emerged from the cover and headed back on course. Sway spun to a point as Pete passed by high on the ridge above her and continued on to the front. Tommy's initial flushing attempt was unsuccessful and Sway was asked to relocate. She moved up and a covey rose in front of her. She stopped to the flush and Tommy fired, then took her on. She rimmed the south edge of the alfalfa fields and ran across the CRP field to the west edge of the course where she pointed again at 10. A single bird was flushed, but Tommy's gun was empty, so he reloaded and fired while Sway stood steady. After being released, she ran the entire west edge of the CRP field south to Dwayne's Pasture, then back east. She took most of the south edge of the large field going down to the West Branch Crossing and into the Hedge Orchard where she caught the front. Point was called at 21 along the fence south of the Old Red Cedar Forest. Handler indicated he saw a bird, but could not produce it for the judge, so Sway was sent on. Tommy had barely gotten back on his horse when Sway spun to another hard point about 30 yards to the west. Three birds were produced, with all in order. Sway rimmed the west edge of the field north of The Pines before taking the full extension of the feed strip running east along the Dogleg. She returned to handler and crossed the road at 30. She caught the front again at 33, just as Bob was flushing a bird in the Hedge Row for Pete. Pete seemed invigorated by this find and lengthened his range considerably past the Fallen Shed. Unfortunately, Pete was not seen again on course until the end of the hour. Sway pointed at 38 at the Finger Feeder with all in order. She was found again on point by scout at 49 on the south end of the course in very heavy cover. Bird was spotted by handler and judge, and a shot fired. At 51, she was once again found standing along the feed strip on the east side of the course south of the

Hedge Row. Handler asked her to relocate after initial flushing attempt and she pinned a small covey, which was flushed by Tommy. She was sent on and ended the hour in the Big Bluestem Field.

Dogs posted on Day 1 (in order of running): Boudreaux's Hi Caliber Bullet, Speeding Ticket's Radar Gun, Tolka Belle O'Kid Rusty's Pro, and TM's Tennessee Twister

Day 2: Skies were sunny with a temperature of around 45 degrees F with a light breeze.

Brace 7: GIT-R-DUN (Whiz)/Heiter and RICOCHET HEMI BARACUDA (Buck)/Burchett. The first brace of day 2 broke away at 8:05 by the Horse Corral. Both dogs were running well in the cool morning air. Whiz disappeared briefly as we approached the Lower Rock Crossing, but was spotted by Bob on the other side. Bruce made the front in time to catch a glimpse of his dog, but Whiz disappeared again, returning after a 9:45 hiatus. This absence put him in a hole that would be hard to climb out of. Meanwhile, Buck pointed at 10 in the field between the fingers. A bird was produced, with all in order. He pointed again at 29 north of the Hedge Row, but no bird was produced. He crossed the road onto the north course at 34. He was credited with a stop-to-flush at 52 as birds lifted in front of him as he emerged from the Covered Finger Crossing. Meanwhile, Whiz was returned to judgment and scored finds by the Finger Feeder and again by the feeder in the Hedge Row.

Brace 8: NELSON'S BRAVE HEART (Nelson)/Tracy and CSB JL SULLIVAN (Sully)/Burchett. This brace broke away from the Old Barn Site at 9:15. Nelson indicated game at 12, but no bird was produced. He rimmed the edge of the CRP field going down to the West Branch Crossing, but was not seen as handler emerged into the Hedge Orchard. Scout was dispatched; handler rode on and caught the front at 20. Point was called at 18 for Sully at the Orchard Feeder, but the flush and relocation attempts produced no bird. Sully continued on and spun to a hard point at 22 along the fence near the west feed strip. A small covey was produced with all in order. Nelson emerged from the Orchard at 28 as Sully went forward. Sully crossed onto the south course at 30. Tommy elected to put Nelson on a rope at this point. Sully pointed a small covey at 37 along the south side of the Hedge Row with all in order. He was found standing at 45 in the feed strip east of the Rock Crossing. He lost intensity during the flushing attempt and the judges informed handler that Sully was not moving any dogs, so Bob elected to pick up.

Brace 9: RUFFWOOD'S ALGONQUIN INDIGO (Indigo)/Burchett and RICOCHET MAGGIE'S JAC (Jac)/Condron. Indigo and Jac were loosed by Jimmy's House at 10:20. Breaking away at this location necessitated a sharp right turn to negotiate the Southwest Rock Crossing. Julie managed to get Jac to make the turn, but Indigo shot ahead up the hill toward the Hedge Row. Bob rode hard to collect her. Jac continued on course and Bob came around with Indigo to regain the front at 8. At 9, Indigo had a stop-to-flush as a single quail lifted from a mowed strip on the east side of the course. She was moved on and established point at 10 on a double at the head of the old feed strip east of the pond. Meanwhile, Jac scored a find on a covey in the feed strip at the northwest end of the Church Corner. Jac regained the front at 12. The dogs continued on, with Indigo the wider of the two. At 30, Julie found Jac buried in a plum thicket north of the Finger Feeder, but she was unable to produce a bird from the heavy cover. Indigo pointed a covey at 32 on the east feed strip. Scout found Jac on point at 49 by the feeder in the Hedge Row. Birds were produced with all in order. Jac regained the front at 54 and dogs and handlers all crossed onto the north course at 55. The hour ended north of The Pines.

Brace 10: COVEY RISE'S RAMBO JR (JR)/Burchett and LOKI'S BLIZZARD OF MISCHIEF (Luke)/Mayhew. The first brace after lunch broke away north of The Pines at 1:30. Both dogs were running well through the first field and into the Hedge Apple Orchard. Luke scored a find at 5 by the Orchard Feeder. JR pointed at 20 with Luke backing on the feed strip east of the Old Barn Site with all in order. Handlers took dogs to water before releasing them. JR spun to a point yards away from the water tanks. Luke ran past JR, then moved in front of the pointing dog before stopping. Ed collared Luke and Bob produced a single quail. A shot was fired and JR was sent forward. JR pointed at 28 by the willow tree east of the pond at the edge of the alfalfa fields. Birds were produced and JR continued. He scored again on the feed strip south of the alfalfa field at 28. JR continued his forward race at good range, seeking out objectives. He showed independence in his hunting and required very little direction from the handler. He crossed the road onto the south course at 44. At 56, he pointed along the feed strip southwest of the Fallen Shed, but no bird was produced. The hour ended as JR crossed the field east of the Southwest Rock Crossing.

Brace 11: JAZZ'S SWEETEST LITTLE SECRET (Karo)/Burchett and ALLEY-OOP (Alley)/Tracy. The second brace of the afternoon broke away south of the pond at 2:45. Both dogs headed north along the east side of the course and topped the ridge ahead of the handlers and judges. Birds were seen leaving the feed strip as we approached at 7. Both dogs were found standing and both handlers dismounted and fired, then moved the dogs on. Alley was found on point at 27 in heavy cover at the Finger Feeder. Birds were produced with all in order. Karo was credited with a stop-to-flush at 37 south of the pond. Karo pointed at 42 in feed strip west of the Southwest Rock Crossing. Tommy told judge he had ridden up a bird moments before Karo arrived on site, so Bob elected to collar her out and move on. Both dogs pointed separately at 46 in the field between the fingers. Tommy produced a bird for Alley with all in order. Karo self-released while Bob was attempting to flush and he elected to pick up. Alley moved on alone but her race was uneven, making large moves at times but being very handy at others. She finished her hour north of The Pines.

Brace 12: MAGIC YOU CAN BE MY WINGMAN (Jake)/Burchett and STARS SASSY NATASHA-KAY (Tasha)/Heiter. The dogs were turned loose north of The Pines at 3:50. Jake scored a find at 11 on the west end of the Covered Finger Crossing. Meanwhile, Tasha took a short absence, causing Bruce to search her out while Jake moved on. Tasha was gathered up and proceeded forward, scoring a find southwest of the Old Barn Site at 20. Bob called point at 24 along the feed strip east of the alfalfa fields, but was not able to produce a bird. Jake was unable to relocate successfully and continued forward. Bob then walked up a bird as he headed back to his horse. Two other birds were ridden up by the reporter. Jake was found standing at 33 south of the fence near the Orchard Feeder. Flushing and relocation attempts were unsuccessful. Meanwhile, Tasha went into cover at 34 and a bird popped out, ending her bid. At 39, Jake was credited with a stop-to-flush near the west feed strip. He crossed the road onto the south course at 46 and headed for the Hedge Row. Once through the Keyhole, he made a huge cast to the south along the east side of the course. Scout was dispatched as handler and judges continued west along course. Scout called point at far south end of course at 59. Handler and judge rode to find Jake standing and a bird was produced with all in order as the hour ended.

Posted dogs on day 2: Ruffwood's Algonquin Indigo and Covey Rise's Rambo JR

Day 3: Wednesday morning was a copy of the day before, with temperatures in the 40s under sunny skies.

Brace 13: MARJO'S HERE FOR THE PARTY (Gretchen)/Luisi and BARNEY'S HI-PROOF RONRICO (Rico)/Burchett. The brace broke away at 8:09 by the Horse Corral. Rico made a huge cast to the right after coming through the Lower Creek Crossing and went on point at13 at the Terrace Feeder. Birds were produced, a shot fired and the dog was sent forward. However, he suffered a serious breach of manners at 19 by the Church Corner. Gretchen continued alone at moderate range and pointed in the food plot east of the Southwest Rock Crossing at 23. She spun hard to mark the flight of the bird as it lifted and a shot was fired. She was taken across the rock crossing and released. Scout called point at 31 at feeder in Hedge Row. Judge Reynolds dismounted to observe the flushing attempt and ended up flushing a large covey as handler was dismounting. Gretchen stood steady through the flush and subsequent shot and was taken on. She crossed onto the north course at 40 and pointed again at 53 along a mowed strip west of the Covered Finger Crossing. Joe flushed a bird and fired as Gretchen spun around to watch the bird leave. She continued north, still at moderate range, to the barn where the hour ended.

Brace 14: COUNTRY ROAD'S ROUGH RIDER (Cooper)/Burchett and MAJESTIC'S SASSY LADY (Sassy)/Heiter. This brace started at the Old Barn Site at 9:15 and headed west. Cooper was forward and Sassy wide as we crossed the field west of the barn site. Both dogs were forward as we continued across the alfalfa fields and into the CRP fields north of Dwayne's Pasture, then down to the West Branch Crossing. Neither dog was seen as we entered the Orchard, but scout glimpsed Sassy at the far south end. Bruce went in search of her and found Cooper buried in the cedars. Sassy emerged from the woods as Bob attempted to flush in the dense brambles. No bird was produced and he elected to move on. Meanwhile, Sassy exited the Orchard and entered cover along the fence south of the Old Red Cedar Forest at 20, flushing birds in front of her and ending her bid. Cooper rimmed the west edge of the field along Charlie's Pasture, then continued to cover the course with huge casts into the Dogleg and again after crossing the road onto the south course. He was spotted by the scout just north of the Keyhole as we topped the first ridge. Judge Collins spotted him going away down the east side of the course as we emerged from the Keyhole. Bob rode to collect him and brought him back on course. Cooper was found on point at 45 by scout along the south feed strip. Initial flushing attempt was unsuccessful, but a long relocation effort resulted in Cooper pinning three birds some distance from where he initially established point. Cooper scored another find at 52 in the ditch along the Church Corner, and again at 55 along the edge of the woods near the south end of the east feed strip. He had another find at 56 about a hundred yards north, and ended his hour with a covey find at the Hedge Row feeder at 59.

Brace 15: DOUBLE UP'S TNT TORI (Tori)/Burchett and TUCALOTA'S BLAZN SMOKE (Smoke)/Mayhew. The last brace of the morning broke away at 10:35 north of the Keyhole. Both dogs were very handy as we moved around the course past the Horse Corral and through the Lower Creek Crossing. Smoke pointed at 15 with Tori backing west of the Hedge Row. Ed attempted to flush in thick brambles, but elected to move ahead when no bird could be produced. Smoke pointed again at 20 on the west end of the Hedge Row. Birds were produced with all in order. Ed called point at 27 along a mowed strip by the south feeder strip, where a single quail was produced. Tori pointed at 29 along a mowed strip south and west of the pond. Initial flushing attempt was unsuccessful and she was asked to relocate. She advanced and froze on point, but moved up several steps during the flushing attempt and Bob elected to pick up. Scout found Smoke standing at the bottom of the ditch by the Southwest Rock Crossing at 33. He moved forward as handler rode up and birds flushed in front of the moving dog, ending his bid.

Brace 16: SNIKSOH SALLY (Sally)/Burchett and CHESTERFIELD'S MOLLY (Molly)/Tracy. The brace broke away at 1:30 behind The Pines. Both dogs were in season and their run was not necessarily typical of their normal performance. Molly stopped at 9 and Tommy elected to pick up at that point. Sally pointed at 9 near the Covered Finger Crossing and a bird was produced with all in order. Sally's run was not impressing Bob however, and he elected to pick up at the Old Barn Site at 14.

Brace 17: DIAMOND HILL SHE'S GONE (Cleo)/Pollock. Cleo was turned loose at the Old Barn Site at 1:55 and proceeded west at moderate range through the alfalfa field and into the CRP. She pointed at 11 along the feed strip south of the alfalfa fields. A bird was produced with all in order. Cleo's run was also affected by being in season; Lisa recognized that she was not performing up to the standards set by earlier dogs and elected to pick up, ending the ABC Gun Dog Classic for 2008.

Judges for this years running were Scott Chaffee and William Wendt both of these gentlemen bring vast knowledge of Grouse dogs and the Gladwin Field Trial area both having won championships as well as judging them. Rhonda Engelhardt served lunch which was appreciated by everyone. We would also like to thank Nestle Purina for their continued support of food and financially which is very much appreciated and helpful. Tri-Tronics is a supporter this year and the winner appreciated the collar they sent. The weather reports called for morning showers, but the weather gods held them off until the last brace. The Grouse were seen on all the courses during the work day and were in good numbers in the trial the week before as well as this event. Thanks to Ken DeLong for his work in organizing things and getting the very nice hand made trophies ordered and to the grounds. Theda Langstaff and Tom Kuszak for getting the road gallery and handlers to the courses they needed to be and everyone that helped move vehicles. At the conclusion of the running everyone was invited to Booners Food Plot and Watering Hole for Dinner.

The Running

Brace 1 K-DEL'S WANBLI OWANKIYE handled by owner Ken DeLong and SUMAC'S BLAZEN BIBI handled by owner Roger McPherson. Away on cour e one at 8:27 both dogs dug into the cutting. At 2 minutes Libby's bell went silent in the very bottom of the cutting Roger and judge Wendt to Libby who we could see was high and tight, Roger flushed without results judge Wendt suggested he go deeper in the pines with the result being a Grouse flushed with Libby looking like a statue at the shot. Wanbli had continued forward making deep casts. Both dogs together again continued through course one with the only other bird seen flushed wild with no dogs involved. Crossing on to course 2 both dogs continuing to cover a lot of course both dogs hunted the cutting at the end of course 2 without results the only bird seen was a Woodcock flushed by the reporter next to the path just before time.

Brace 2 COOS RYLEE handled by Roger McPherson and AUTEN'S MEG-NETIC FIELD handled by owner Ron Auten. Running on courses 3 & 4 released at 9:37 both dogs swung into the cutting reaching to the front with the wind picking up. Rylee being more lateral through the cutting, with Meg more forward. At 27 a Grouse got up wild no dogs involved, Rylee came in and pointed where the Grouse had gotten up with Meg coming in for a back both dogs were taken on. With the wind picking up handler were having difficulty hearing their bells as we crossed onto course 4. Meg took a swing to the right of the course at 45 she hadn't been seen or heard at 46 Ron threw in the towel and went looking for Meg. Rylee continued up the course and shortly he had an encounter with a brood Grouse ending his bid.

After a break for coffee and donuts brace 3 WRIGLEY'S REVED UP CUB

handled by Gil Hopper and SUMAC'S BODACIOUS PRIDE handled by owner Roger McPherson on courses 5 & 6 with both dogs hunting the cutting on the right a at 9 a Woodcock got up with no dogs involved. Both dogs were hunting deep and forward when a Grouse got up wild at 18. At 21 Turbo's bell went silent found on point Gil flushed a Woodcock Turbo was high and tight at the shot. Bo had taken the right side of course 5 hunting the cutting to show in the front. As Turbo came through the cut a Woodcock flushed and Turbo continued in the direction of the bird ending his bid. As we got into course 6 things got fast and furious for Roger and Bo. At 42 Bo's bell went silent found standing as Roger went in 3 Grouse flushed right in front of Bo, Roger sent him on and at 46 Bo's bell went silent on the left side of the path Roger made an extensive flushing effort getting another Grouse in the air with everything fine at he flush and shot. At 49 as Bo was crossing the path a flushed wild with Bo stopping to the flush. The brace ended without further bird work.

The 4th brace AUTEN'S GENTLEMAN KANE handled by owner Ron Auten and WRIGLEY'S FIRST DANCE handled by owner Gil Hopper got ready for the 12:30 breakaway on courses 7 & 8 the wind was still blowing with the sky looking like something was blowing up. Both dogs were away crisscrossing through the cover on course 7. As we came up over the top of heartbreak hill catching up, Gil had Jazz leashed after an incident with a brood of Grouse. Ron was down on the left side of the course looking for Kane he came up and asked me to help him look, both judges said they would go with him shortly we heard a judge spotted the dog in the heavy cover. Ron went in and Grouse flushed right in front of Kane with everything fine at the shot. Kane was sent on and he continued covering the scrub Oak cover. A Grouse flushed wild out of a tree as we went forward. Kane's bell went silent up the course and he had another Grouse with everything in order at the flush and shot. The brace ended with no further bird work. Everyone went to Alibi Hall for lunch.

The 5th brace SUEMAC'S BLAZEN BIBI handled by owner Roger McPherson as a bye on courses 9 & 10. The rain that was predicted for the morning started as I waited for everyone to come back out. Bea broke away hunting the cover to the front. Having stayed with the horses during lunch, I ate my lunch and moved the horse trailer to the pick up. As I went in to the half I heard a shot Bea had a Grouse find. I joined the brace at the half way as Bea continued hunting the cover, at 50 2 Grouse flushed with Bea being forward. At 57 another Grouse flushed wild with Bea still ahead. The brace ended with no further bird work ending the stake. We retired to Alibi Hall for the judges decision.




