Motion: I move that the ABC Board of Directors authorize the expenditure of \$75,000 from Future Grounds Fund to purchase Stock Ownership in the enterprise know as The Union County Bird Dog Ranch LLC.

2008 American Brittany Club Board of Directors' Annual Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Place, Booneville Arkansas • December 1, 2008



The 2008 Annual Meeting of the ABC Board of Directors was called to order at 8:10 A.M by President Hank Hartnek at The Meeting Place, Booneville,

Roll was called by Executive Secretary Mary Jo Trimble, Fourteen Directors were present: D. Smith, B. Sigmund, R. Gorman from the East Coast; K. Patterson, B. Ackerman, M. Stout from the East Central Region. J. Chase, E. Janulis, J. Brigham from the Central Region. M. Karbiner, B. Rankin from the Midwest Region. Gary Smith, Midwest Region, absent throughout the entire meeting. R. Wire, B. Landress, J. Henderson from the West Coast Region.

New Directors were introduced and officially seated on the Board.

Motion #1. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Sigmund. I move to seat 3 new Directors: Mary Karbiner, Midwest Region, Robert Wire, West Coast Region, and Bill Landress, West Coast Region, to the ABC Board of Directors. 14 yes votes, G. Smith absent, Motion Passed.

Motion #2. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Stout. I move to approve the 2007 BOD minutes as published in the ABC Agenda Book and ABC Magazine, 14 yes votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

The BOD discussed location for the next 3 years running of the ABC National Championship. Motion #3. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Ackerman. I move to extend the dates at Blue Mountain, Booneville, Arkansas, for the next three (3) years.

(2009-2011). 14 Yes Votes, O No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion passed. The bird release was discussed. Tom Milam, ABC representative on the Blue Mt. Grounds Committee, said the birds were released somewhat later this year because of the deer hunt on the grounds. The Southland Championship ended 10 days before we start. Directors felt bird work was much better this year but would prefer birds be released 7-10 days ahead of our Nationals or right after the Southland if weather permits.

Hank Hartnek went over his President's report. He reported the Howard Johnson's Motel had comped rooms for National Specialty Show Judges and the Roy Jones Show Superintendent. This was a savings of over \$1000. He discussed his desire to do a complete revamping of the ABC Policy Book during the next year. We should do this a few sections at a time. Each Director and/or Committee Chair was asked to review the pages pertaining to their activity and begin re-formulating the wording to update material and typographical errors. Secretary Trimble explained that dates changes are made should be left in to track how policy has developed. When changes affect more than one category, the same wording is inserted in each section to assure continuity. A schedule should be established for which sections should be redone in which order.

Tom White, 1st Vice President made comments about the All Age Championships and grounds. We need to make it clear that anyone owing money for food or camping fees should pay this before leaving the grounds. We rent the camp grounds across the road and fees need to be paid to Linda Milam before the end of the event. Hank reported that a new stove would be added to the clubhouse kitchen. Tom went on to discuss entries, entry fees, and costs to run a dog. Entry fees do not cover the cost of running the dog. In 2006, the cost was \$239 a dog. The extra has been covered by other things like the auction and raffle. Tom would like to maintain 60 dogs per stake. 72 dogs were qualified in the AAA, 50 were entered, and 46 dogs ran which means 1/3 qualified did not show up. Several factors influenced this. He proposed that entry qualifications be altered to drop the additional placement requirement for the AAA. This could have added around 10 more dogs this year. He also proposed dropping the # for second place to qualify in the Open All Age to 20 instead of 40. Since we had 66 in the OAA some Directors felt that the Open numbers were satisfactory as it is and this year may be an anomaly due to the economic and gas situation. The Secretary read statistics compiled by the Nat. Field Trial Secretary Steve Ralph regarding the number of dogs entered in AAA stakes during the fall trials and told which clubs had or did not have AAA stakes.

Motion #4. Motion by Chase, Seconded by Rankin. I move that the additional placement requirement in the National AAA Championship Qualifications be removed. 8 Yes Votes: Gorman, Sigmund, Brigham, Chase, Rankin, Wire, Landress, Henderson, 6 No Votes: D. Smith, Stout, Ackerman, Patterson, Janulis, Karbiner. G. Smith Absent. Motion Passed.

The BOD discussed the wording in the qualifications regarding that dogs could not run in both the Gun Dog and the All Age Nationals. At this time, a dog that runs in the All Age Nationals would have to wait almost 2 years before it could run in the Gun Dog Nationals. Now that the two nationals are run within a month of each other, it is easier to know if a dog is qualified in one or both stakes. Motion #5. Motion by Brigham, Seconded by Chase. I move that the wording in all Qualifications say that a dog cannot run in both the All Age Nationals and the Gun Dog Nationals in the same calendar year. 12 Yes votes, 2 No Votes: Gorman & Karbiner, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Tom White was told that the contract with the wrangler would be left up to the 1st Vice President to negotiate. Wrangler should have liability insurance and contract should be reviewed by Gene Isaac, ABC Attorney.

Marilynne Little, 2nd Vice President reviewed the paperwork submitted by the Montana Brittany Club who is asking to be accepted as an ABC Club pending AKC approval. They have 42 members and a good treasury. Motion #6. Motion by Sigmund, Seconded by Henderson. I move to accept the Montana Brittany Club as a provisional ABC Club. 14 Yes Votes. G. Smith Absent. Motion Passed. Marilynne reported she had also sent some other individuals information on procedures to form a new club in the Midwest Region. She then turned the floor over to David Smith to discuss his proposal for a puppy program with Breeders to encourage new memberships. Details of the program are outlined in the Agenda Book which can be viewed on the ABC webpage.

David suggested that Hank appoint a committee to work on refining this

Breeders should be at the forefront of bringing in new members to the club. The President asked David Smith to Chair a committee to further work on this breeder Puppy Program.

National Specialty Show: The sudden movement of the National Specialty Show to a different location in the middle of the year was brought before the BOD. It was pointed out that there is no statement in the 3rd Vice President's section of the Policy Book to notify or be approved by the BOD of the show site as there is in the sections for determining the National Field Trial Sites. The Secretary encouraged Directors and Committee Chairs to bring all major changes before the Board and allow time for input from the membership in order to provide for smoother transitions for any major decisions of the Board, Officers, or Committee Chairs. Motion #7. Motion by Gorman, Seconded by Brigham. I move that the 3rd Vice President should present to the Board of Directors as part of their Agenda Report each year the proposed show site for the next 2 years. 14 Yes Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed. Brigham asked if the Directors could get some type of report regarding the outcome of this year's show from the 3rd Vice President.

Secretary/Executive Secretary Action Items: Mary Jo thanked the Board for their nomination and support for the AKC Lifetime Achievement Award for Performance Events which she did receive and will be accepting December 16th in Long Beach, CA. Last year the BOD asked me to come up with a new proposal for individuals requesting the Board to consider their action items. After BOD discussion and suggestions the following motion was accepted. Motion #8. Motion by Gorman, Seconded by Landress. I move that agenda item section of the policy book, page 77 #4 read as follows: Items must be submitted six (6) weeks prior to the Board meeting. Items must be from an ABC officer, committee chair, a Board member, or a Regional Club who has first voted on the item by that club's members. Items from individual members should first be discussed with one or more of that person's Regional Directors before being submitted. The individual's item should be supported by fifteen (15) different actual signatures of ABC members. Since agenda items need to be presented by someone to the board, one of the regional directors shall present the Agenda Item to the Board of Directors. 14 Yes votes, O No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Ed Tillson has asked that the BOD remove the Southern New Mexico Club as an ABC Regional Club due to lack of members. We did discuss keeping them on the books but he and Wade Worrell had both decided this is what they wanted and they would disperse any remaining funds to other Brittany Clubs as per their Constitution mandates.

Motion #9. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Chase. I move to dissolve the Southern New Mexico Club as an ABC Regional Club. 11 Yes Votes, 3 No Votes cast by Gorman, Brigham, and Karbiner. G. Smith Absent. Motion Passed.

Trimble asked that the Board add a Dual Dog Chairman to the list of single appointments made by the President, page 28 of the Policy Book. This person is needed to track the potential recipients and winners of the Dual Dog Award, order

trophies, and maintain records of winner, etc. Motion #10. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Sigmund. I move that the President add a Dual Dog Chairman to the list of single appointments on page 28 of the Policy Book to be made by the President in order track placements of National Field Trial stakes & National Specialty Show, order trophies, and maintain records of winners of the Dual Dog Award. 14 Yes Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Janet Chase gave the Treasurer's report. She asked the BOD to review the contributions made to organizations from the Breed Issues Fund and determine if any changes should be made in 2009. Jim Chase reported on the activities of the Bird Dog Foundation and the Marvin Nelson fund at UC-Davis. Mary Jo reported on activities of the National Animal Interest Alliance. This year Anne Short of the Central Maine Club represented the ABC at N.A.I.A.'s annual conference and her report was distributed to the Directors. This report will also be published in the ABC magazine.

Motion #11. Motion by Jim Chase, Seconded by Rankin. I move that \$1000 be added to the donation to the Bird Dog Foundation and the Marvin Nelson Fund from the Breed Issues Fund. 6 Yes Votes made by Sigmund, Stout, Ackerman, Chase, Rankin, Wire. 8 No Votes made by D. Smith, Gorman, Patterson, Brigham, Janulis, Karbiner, Landress, Henderson. G. Smith Absent. Motion Failed.

David Smith discussed legislation that had been proposed throughout the United States dealing with dog issues. He encouraged all Directors to encourage clubs in theirregions to get involved in legislative issues. The Breed Issues Fund can be used to fight bad legislation as needed as well as promoting the breed at events like the Pheasant Fest.

Janet also reported that we continue to have problems getting proper receipts provided for futurity expenses. She also suggested that the Budget item for the Agenda Book needed to be increased. Motion #12. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Landress. I move that the Agenda Book budget be increased to \$500. 14 Yes Votes, O No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed. Janet also discussed the deficit at the Gun Dog Nationals. Hank said he and others would work with the Treasurer to see how expenses could be cut in order to keep the Gun Dog Nationals in the black. Janet reported she had not paid the Fence Donation to the Ionia Grounds Committee from last year since no construction was slated on the Fence at the present time. Additional funds can be voted on when construction resumes.

Marilynne Little asked that her budget for the All Age National Hospitality be increased from \$500 to \$800 to cover rising costs and unexpected expenses. (last line of Policy Book, page 73) She reported income from the National Open & Amateur Calcuttas. Amounts are listed in Agenda Report. Motion #13. Motion by Landress, Seconded by Sigmund. I move to increase the National's Hospitality Budget from \$500 to \$800. 14 Yes Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

AKC Delegate Report: Mary Jo relayed to the BOD that our new AKC Delegate, Judy Tighe, had hit the ground running. She had attended an AKC open house in NC. She has met with Robin Stancell of the AKC Show Department. She has been working on trying to make AKC aware of how the new requirements to host an AKC Specialty Show have impacted our clubs. The President and Secretary have also written letters and made calls to AKC trying to explain to them that our clubs are regional clubs with territories larger than most AKC All Breed Clubs. Most of our clubs who hold specialty shows outside their home base are required to do twice as many promotional activities as are clubs who have a more closely knit territory. Judy will be working with our clubs to help them work through these new regulations. So far this has not extended to the hosting of field trials.

Judges' Education Committee Report: Hank reported that our judges' education seminar is very good. This committee would like to see AKC require judges to take this seminar every five years. Chairman Diana Kubitz submitted 4 Action Items relating to the Judges' Education Program. Motion #14. Motion by Sigmund, Seconded by Landress. I move to approve Action Item #1: We would like board approval for the new ABC ringside Mentor Criteria as published in the Agenda Book. 1 Yes Vote by Sigmund, 14 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Failed. Directors then worked on revising the Ringside Mentor Criteria. This was tabled until after lunch.

Motion # 15. Motion by Landress, Seconded by Brigham. I move to accept the Ringside Mentor proposal as revised by the Board of Directors. 14 Yes Votes, 0 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed. Revised Ringside Mentor Criteria:

The ABC Breeder Mentor requirements are meant to be a guide in selecting members. The following is the criteria for being an ABC mentor.

- A full member in good standing of the American Brittany Club for the past 12 years.
- 2. A full member of a Regional Brittany Club for the past 12 years.
- Having bred, whelped and raised Brittany litters would be considered helpful.

- Having attended the ABC National Events that include both conformation and performance field trials.
- 5. The applicant, to be effective, should:
 - a. Be well versed in the history of the Brittany,
 - b. Understand the Brittany Performance Standard.
 - c. Have experience with the process of judging in conformation and performance.
 - d. Be willing to have prospective judges come to their home or kennel to observe and discuss Brittanys.
 - e. Attend any classes or meeting for mentors when possible.
 - f. Realize that their conduct reflects on the ABC at all times.
 - g. Should be unbiased.
 - h. Adhere to Brittany standard and its quest to keep the breed "forever dual" in keeping with the ABC Mission Statement.

We thank judges for taking the time to attend Brittany events, judge's education and turning to the American Brittany Club for ringside mentoring. According to AKC anyone having twelve years experience may mentor and sign mentor's slips. AKC's requirements for becoming a judge are lengthy and costly, so we appreciate your efforts on our behalf.

These criteria will be sent back to the Committee and now becomes ABC policy.

Motion #16. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Sigmund. I move to accept Action Item #2 which states: We would like board approval to have ABC's list of Ringside Mentors be by invitation from the judges' education committee. They would be added to the mentors already approved by the committee. O Yes Votes, 14 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion failed. The BOD wanted the Committee to understand that if people meet the criteria as defined, they may be approved as ABC Mentors.

Motion #17. Motion by Wire, Seconded by Sigmund. I move that the ABC recommends that regional clubs hire judges who meet the five year judges' criteria whenever possible. 14 Yes Votes, 0 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Motion #18. Motion by Brigham, Seconded by Henderson. *I move that ABC recommend that judges for the Summer Specialty and National Specialty meet the five year judges' education requirement.* 14 Yes Votes, 0 No votes, G. Smith absent. *Motion passed.* The Board indicated they knew this was not always possible but every effort should be made to hire judges who had attended a breed seminar within the last 5 years.

Legislative Report: Mary Jo once again encouraged every club to appoint one person to help monitor legislation in their area. Anne Short of the Central Maine Club will set up an ABC list of people interested in monitoring legislation. Local information should be passed on to Mary Jo or Anne for dissemination. Mary Jo encouraged all groups to work together to oppose bad legislation rather than taking totally separate courses. Marvin Stout pointed out the outstanding efforts of the Doberman Club in fighting bad legislation particularly in the crop and dock issues.

American Field Liaison Report: Mary Jo reported that in conversations this week with AKC Vice President of Performance Events Doug Ljungren, he had indicated that he would recognize the 45 minute derby stakes run in conjunction with the ABC Classic/Championships and sponsored by the Parent Club as AKC Derby stakes. This would enable these stakes to carry AKC Championship points and qualify dogs for adult limited stakes.

National Auction/Raffle Committee Report. Mary Karbiner discussed the difficulties of getting clubs to support the ABC Raffle. Money is now divided between the 5 National events but ticket selling has not reflected an equal amount of effort to support the sale by the various groups. Mary said if these five venues are going to share in the profits there needs to be bigger ticket items offered. Motion #19. Motion by Henderson, Seconded by Sigmund. I move to increase the budget of the raffle committee from \$1500 to \$3000. 14 Yes Votes. 0 No Votes. G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Motion #20. Motion by Henderson, Seconded by Rankin. I move to add to the duties of 1st, 3rd, and 4th Vice Presidents to assign a member of their national event committee to promote the ABC fund raisers including the national auctions and raffle ticket sales to offset expenses of their events. 14 Yes Votes. 0 No Votes. G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Futurity Report. Marvin Stout and his futurity committee have redone the entire Futurity section of the ABC Policy Book. Directors were asked to use the final draft sent out by President Hartnek after the Policy Books were mailed in determining their considerations as some last minute revisions were made. Mary Jo presented an additional proposal from Final Forfeit Futurity Secretary Judy Graves and supported by Futurity Committee Member Mary Jo Trimble to change the wording on when the final forfeit would be accepted from 90 days to 180

days after whelping. A check of some other parent breed clubs indicated some do use 180 days as their cutoff date. She felt we needed to encourage entries, even if late, in order to promote futurity entries as much as possible. This proposal was submitted by Judy Graves but had been left out of the agenda book originally sent out. Motion #21. Motion by Brigham, Seconded by Landress. I move to accept Judy Graves' proposal to change the wording on late litter nominations but change the June 30th date to 180 days after whelping. The proposal as amended would read: Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule: Late fees are \$30 for 31-60 days, \$60 for 61-90 days and \$100 for any nomination received more than 90 days after whelping. No nominations will be accepted past 180 days after whelping. Additional late fees may be imposed from time to time by the ABC Board of Directors. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations. 14 Yes Votes, 1 No Vote by Sigmund, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

Other changes were then discussed. Motion #22. Motion by Sigmund, Seconded by Rankin. I move to accept the changes to the Futurity Policy as proposed with the following amendments in addition to the previous motion:

- Page 44 L, Leave the wording regarding ties in the Futurity Dual Dog award as it was. "If there is a tie, the highest placing field dog shall be declared the winner"
- Page 44 E, Delete the line, "The futurity may be held during the fall or the spring."
- 3. Page 44 N, Remove the words "quartering and" from the line currently reading "Futurity Dogs shall be judged as to their potential for developing into championship gun dog Brittanys. They exhibit a keen desire to hunt, a bold attractive style, intelligence in" quartering and" seeking objectives, eagerness, and desire with the obvious intention of finding birds."14 Yes Votes, 0 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

President Hartnek complimented Marvin and his Committee for the large amount of work that had gone into revising this policy. Some wording conflicts existed on Agenda Book page 44 E & page 44 F regarding billing of expenses, budget, etc. These will be worked out between the ABC Treasurer & Futurity Chair and submitted during the policy book revision this next year.

Magazine Report: Hank complimented Dee Hempfield on the good job she has been doing this year as Managing Editor of the Magazine.

Purina Program. Ray Gorman questioned how the distribution of support money to clubs was figured. The Secretary went over some of the basics of what Purina wanted for supporting the various events and what could be allocated to benefit the most clubs while still working within a set budget.

Statistics Report. The Statistician Mary Karbiner had an action item to reflect what is currently being done in who determines qualified dogs for the 4 national stakes. At the present time the Statistician is determining the All Age Stats and not the Gun Dog stats. She wanted this changed in the policy book. Both the Secretary and the President spoke against this proposal stating that the official Statistician should remain as the person determining qualifications while working in conjunction with the two National Field Trial Secretaries in order to catch errors or omissions that might occur. No changes were made in the official policy.

ABC Yearbook Report. Jessica Carlson, yearbook editor, submitted 4 action items for the Board's consideration. All were adopted.

Motion #23. Motion by Sigmund, Seconded by Karbiner. I move to approve all 4 yearbook action items as outlined on page 57 of the Agenda Book. 14 Yes Votes, 0 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed. They are as follows:

 Amend the line stating "One copy of such program may be forwarded without charge to each advertiser in that year's edition."

Since several advertisers purchase more than one page of advertising, we would like to amend this line to state: "One copy of the Yearbook per full-page ad purchased may be forwarded without charge to each advertiser in that year's edition."

2. Amend the line stating "No unpaid or gratis advertising shall appear in such program, in effect, at the cost of the ABC."

We do allow for full-page ads for the official ABC Sponsors (Purina, Tri-Tronics, Tracker, Christie) as well as for our Wrangler and Cover Artist. We would also like to allow advertising for significant donors to the Nationals, so our suggested amendment would read: "Full-page black & white ads shall be offered to all official Sponsors of the ABC Nationals, the Wrangler, and the Cover Artist for the Yearbook. Companies or individuals donating \$300-499 worth of goods to the National events may be offered a half-page black & white ad in the Yearbook at no cost, and those donating \$500 or more may be offered a full-page black & white ad."

3. Amend the next to last paragraph, regarding distribution and sales, to read: "The distribution and sales shall be as follows: On the first day of the Nationals, prior to commencement of the drawing, if possible, all printed copies (less those to be provided each paid advertiser without charge) shall be delivered to the site headquarters for the National All Age Championships. Sufficient copies shall be made available for sale at the National Specialty Show site where it shall be the responsibility of the Show Chairman, Show Secretary, or their designates to distribute and sell copies of the Yearbook and record the number of sales. All other sales and distribution shall be the responsibility of the Yearbook Chairman, ABC Secretary, or their designates. Appropriate records shall be maintained and all receipts for printing and related expenses delivered to the ABC Treasurer."

 Delete the last line, stating "One copy of the Championship Program Yearbook should be mailed to each club secretary each year. (1992)".

Dual Dog Award. Bob Rankin, Chair of the Committee to review and submit changes to the Dual Dog Award section of the policy book gave the Board a history of the last two years discussion of this award as well as a history of the W.E. Stevenson, Sr. Memorial Dual Dog Award since its inception. The committee gave the Board two options for changing the award. One was to have two awards, one for the All Age Dogs and one for the Gun Dogs. The other was to maintain a single award with a new point distribution for field events. Show points remained basically the same with some clarifications and one addition for points for Judge's Award of Merits. Chairman Rankin asked that Jessica Carlson be kept as the person in charge of the award. The Directors relayed to each other the many comments they had received from constituents. The Single Award proposal was adopted.

Motion #24. Motion by Patterson, Seconded by Wire. I move to adopt the Single Proposal, the W.E. Stevenson Sr. Memorial Award, as written on page 41 C of the Agenda Book. Motion to become effective immediately. 12 Yes Votes, 2 No Votes by Gorman & Chase, Sigmund abstained, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed. This award may also be found in the News Section, 08 Agenda Reports, Dual Dog Award on the ABC Website.

Motion #25. Motion by Brigham, Seconded by Landress. I move to approve all email votes taken since the last annual meeting. 14 Yes Votes, 0 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

The Board went into executive session to discuss People and Dog Hall of Fame Awards and Election of Officers.

After coming out of Executive Session the Board affirmed by a unanimous vote those dogs and people to be inducted in the ABC Hall of Fame and the Officers Elected. Motion by Rankin, Seconded by Landress. I move to elect the people and dog Hall of Fame and officers as follows: People HOF: Rosco Staton; Dog Hall of Fame: 2x NFC/AFC Diamond Hill Dan and GFC/AFC Shady's Chick-N-Little. Officers: 1st Vice President Tom White; 3rd Vice President Chris-Ward Weber; Secretary Mary Jo Trimble. 14 Yes Votes, 0 No Votes, G. Smith absent. Motion Passed.

2008 ABC National Amateur All Age Championship

The American Brittany Club's (ABC) National Amateur All Age Championship started 24 November 2008 for the twenty-first consecutive year at the J. Perry Mikles Blue Mountain Wildlife Demonstration Area (WDA) near Booneville, Arkansas and was completed 28 November 2008.

Forty-six starters from the four corners of America vied for the prestigious wins, and the following rose to the top:

- Named the 2008 National Amateur All-Age Champion was FC MAXWELL'S BLEW BY YOU (Male), bred, owned, and handled by Terry Maxwell. He was whelped 1/2/2004 from sire Maxwell's Maxamillion and dam Chevenne VI. Blew By You appeared in the twenty-first brace on the last day. He displayed a strong and forward effort carding three evenly spaced finds.
- · Runner-up Champion laurels went to MAXWELL'S GUNSMOKE (Male) (Am Field registration - Pistol Pete), bred by Terry Maxwell, and owned and handled by Kent Patterson. Gunsmoke, a half brother to Maxwell's Blew By You was whelped 16 June 2003 from sire Maxwell's Farm Boy and Dam Cheyenne VI. Gunsmoke running in the first brace of day two displayed an outstanding ground effort with a well-mannered limb find at 44.
- Third place winner DC/AFC SHADY'S TIA MARIA (Female) was whelped 7/2/2000, her sire is NFC/DC/AFC Tequilas Joker and dam is FC/AFC Shady's Chik-N-Little with breeding by Marilynne and Clem Little. Included in her wins are the first Runner-up Champion in the 2004 National Amateur All Age Championship and the Champion of the 2006 National Open All Age Championship. She was named Field Champion at eighteen months of age. Tia whelped one litter in 2003 producing eight puppies. Seven of these have multiple puppy and derby wins, most have adult wins, one is an Amateur Field Champion, and another is an American Field Champion. Tia was a Dual Champion at twentythree months of age, the youngest on record. She appeared in the fourth brace of day two.
- . Fourth place winner FC KB'S SHADOW-DANCER (Male), was bred by Ed Tillson, is owned and handled by Herb Rea, and was whelped 5/2/2002 from sire Shambo's Dark Shadow and dam The Prairie Tornado. Shadow-Dancer was braced with Gunsmoke in the first brace of day two and also displayed an outstanding ground effort with a well-mannered limb find at 25.

· All winners came from course one/four

The three judges were quickly harmonious and the picture of professionalism both in and out of the judging saddle. Bob Reynolds stepped in just before the trial to join longtime friend and traveling companion Garvin Collins. As both are from the Kansas City, Missouri area, they have campaigned pointers and judged championships together many times over the years, including several Brittany championships. They certainly lived up to the excellent reputation that preceded them. Tom Hudson from the Houston, Texas area joined Bob and Garvin for the first time in the judging circle and the experience of the three men quickly blended. Tom owns and campaigns Tennessee Walking Horses and German Shorthair Pointers being successful with both through the years. Tom has also judged several major championships and the placement rendered by the judges were well received from everyone.

Trial Chairman Tom White was in the middle of everything lending support. This is his second year to chair the event and he put together an excellent team as support, first and foremost is his wife, Margaret Horstmeyer, DVM who also gave her time to be the on-site Veterinarian.

Stake Manager Tom Robin and his committee consisting of Gallery Marshall Joyce Miley, Head Marshall Bill Landress along with Hank Hartnek, Tom and Linda Milam, Warren Montgomery, and Ray Trimble must receive extra credit for this being a smoothly run trial. They in turn were assisted by a myriad of people whom are the very willing, yet nameless folks doing the grunt work. A well-dissevered pat-on-the-back go to the dog wagon ladies that kept liquids and donuts flowing; Darlene Dow, Diana Kubitz, Donna Pride, and others who pitched in when needed.

A major contribution adding to a well-organized trial is the kickoff meeting conducted by Tom Robin consisting of his committee, the three judges, and the reporter. All details were identified, discussed, and implemented. The judges agreed to name the four top dogs for each day, and the dogs selected were:

His horses and gear remain well cared for and the horses are matched to the experience level of the rider. His support and helpful personality were certainly very appreciated. - Saturday The National Specialty Show continues, and dinner is served at the clubhouse followed by the Purina Award and the highly charged Annual Auction conducted by Marilynn Little and her capable staff.

During the festive week, Russ Dalton set up the Heskett Saddleworks, Inc. display of fine saddles and appurtenant tack related to the field trial world. He also has ample leather repair work equipment and seemed to have a steady flow of folks with scruffy leather needing repair, which he made look like new.

Kent Patterson hosted the 2008 National Amateur party at the clubhouse in honor of his 2007 Championship winner Maxwell's White Spirit (Am Fld) One-N-Only. After dinner, the excellent and plentiful libations flowed, tables were pushed back, and dancers took over to the fine country-western music from the local band. Loud music and laughter vibrated the grounds well into the early morning.

Following the Amateur Championship, Purina presented the Brittany High Point All Age of the Year Award, which they have done for twenty-three years. Dr. Bob Rankin has chaired this event for the last twenty-two years assisted by his long time friend and Purina Representative Roy Pelton. Recipient of this year's award was NFC/FC/AFC LANE'S END WE-BE-CLEAN much to the delight of owners Judy and Tom Robin and trainer Chad Holman.

The award is chosen when at least three women handlers compete in the Amateur All-Age Championship, and is made on the merits of the person handling dogs. Also taking place during the Amateur Championship was the presentation of the 2007 ABC Hall of Fame Inductees. The dogs receiving this prestigious award were: FC/AFC HI SCOR JAC D RUFFIAN bred by Matt Runnels and owned by Jerry Kendrick, and NFC/DC/AFC GAMBLER'S ACE IN THE HOLE bred by Bill & Karen Schreiber and owned by Donna & Ed Janulis. Persons inducted were: Dave Lincoln, Dave Walker, and Ron Zook.

The J. Perry Mikles Blue Mountain Wildlife Demonstration Area (WDA) Manager Larry McAnally assisted by Red Bailey have been here since the area's inception twenty-two years ago (1986). There was a total of five employees then and their initial assignment was to turn 3,500 acres of overgrown field systems and hardwood bottom into three one hour horseback bird dog field courses, and build a headquarters for the user groups to meet and care for their animals. The grounds are along the Petit Jean River that flows between the Ozarks and Blue Ouachita Mountain Range of West Central Arkansas. By the next year, the courses were in place with 12 miles of roads and trails, two bridges, six low water crossings, about 90 culverts, 400 bull-dozed acres, fields cleared, 800 acres of lespedeza planted, 117 food plots, and 4 miles of food strips were planted. Headquarters construction was taking place during this period to include a clubhouse seating 175 people with a full kitchen, fireplace, central heat and air, horse barn with 60 stalls, 12 outside stalls, 105 dog runs, 12 RV pads, 3 parking lots, including one with 12 additional electric RV hookups. In addition to the venue, the State of Arkansas furnishes the truck, dog wagon, and drivers consisting of Larry and Red. How do you say 'thank you' to a State and people that do so much for are beloved sport?

The WDA now contains 4,100 acres and the grounds still consist of three one-hour courses. The grounds were impeccably groomed and 1000 birds were released two days before the trial. Courses #1/4 and #2/5 are fairly equal in open and wooded areas with multiple objectives as is the first half of Course #3/6. The second half appears tight with wooded areas on each side of the horse trail, but this is deceptive as a large open meadow is just to the west of the trail.

Courses 1 and 4 are on the southwest side of the grounds. It starts at the
Rheta and Bill Cartmell property, heads west and passes the Big Oak and
the White Post before turning northerly at the Barking Dog House. Crossing
#1 Lick Creek, a large portion of the course is in the Cotton Fields, passes
the Twin Ponds, turns west near Hayden Camp, and ends at Horse Bridge
that crosses the Petit Jean River.

- Course 2 and 5 are on the north side of the grounds, starts at Horse Bridge, runs counterclockwise, and returns to Horse Bridge. Starting to the east, Ford Bottoms and Riblin Bottoms are negotiated, the river is reached at Third Bridge Ramp and the course heads west, then north past the Pine Tree, circles and heads west into Parish Field. After leaving this area, it meanders southerly past Horton Pond and follows 540 Loop turning north and ends at Horse Bridge.
- Course 3 and 6 is located on the southeast side of the grounds. Starting
 west from Horse Bridge through the Lower Woods Crossing, then east at
 Mario's Hill, crosses #3 Lick Creek Crossing into the walking dog meadow,
 and turns north at the Gas Well. During the remainder of the course, the
 trees are more bountiful along the path, but attractive hedge rows and open
 areas beyond the trees allow a dog to run. The course heads north, then
 easterly passing Lovers Bend and Beaver Slough ending north of
 headquarters.

THE RUNNING

DAY ONE: The first morning is brilliant at 58 degrees after a moderate rain during the night. The dog wagon is full with fourteen people while the riding gallery is forty-three plus.

HAVAPAL'S RENEGADE BILLY BOY (Tommy Thomas) and BLUERIDGE BLAZEN GEM (Janeen Schneider) — The first brace presents a moderate breakaway for both dogs as they adjust to the terrain. They continue this pattern until the Cotton Fields are entered with Billy Boy opening his range heading towards the right edge. Gem has the distinction of the first bird contact of the trial at 36, however she has a bit of trouble, and is leashed. Billy Boy meanwhile has found his stride and finishes the last half of his hour with range and purpose to the front.

TLM COMANCHE CHIEF (Tom Milam) and MTB CABO RITA DE SCIPIO (Tom White) - This pair left quickly reaching the far gap in a hurry. De Scipio turned to check the left edge, then the right edge before going through the gap while Chief has gone on checking further edges. Ford Bottom is covered and he is seen to the front in the Riblin Bottoms as we pass the Gas Well gap at 6. Turning near the Third Bridge at 15, Chief is shown on the front, right edge, then crosses to head along the left edge. De Scipio is maintaining a forward effort when he freezes near brush on the left side of the trail. Birds are flushed, keep getting up all around him, and he remains steady throughout. Passing the Pine Tree, the tight area is entered at 25 with both dogs taking the front edges. Entering Parish Field at 40, De Scipio is pointing in a small mott just across the trail, birds are flushed and come up around him from the rear, he turns his head, and stands for his handler to get him. Chief is blistering the right wood line edge when he slams into point at 42, birds are flushed rising all around the dog and he displays good manners. De Scipio had come up after his release, backs before the flushing attempt is started, and is taken on. Chief charges along the edge after his release, points at 47, is relocated, and birds are not produced. De Scipio has made the front edge at 48, and has a contact miscue ending his day. Chief continues his fast and forward pace, loses contact with his handler at 58 along the 540 Loop, and is shown before his grace period ends.

TSUNAMI (Francis Clasen) and TC'S MATCH BOKS RACER (Laura Wilder) - It is a nice start for both leaving the Horse Bridge on a course that will allow them to show good. They take the left Petit Jean River edge while scooting forward. Continuing through the Lower Woods Crossing, they maintain a competitive and forward effort when Tsunami slams into point near a brushy area along the left side at 11. A dozen or more birds rise and the dog never wiggled during the flush and shot. Coming into the open field past Mario's Hill at 21, Racer has an unfortunate time with birds and has been leashed. Tsunami has taken the right edge and comes around to the front as #3 Lick Creek Crossing is gone through and the walking dog meadow is entered at 34. Going through this meadow, Tsunami establishes a solid point at the edge of a large mott to the right of the Gas Well at 43. An extended relocation is made with the birds finally being nailed at 49, everything in order. Moving into the tight area of Course #3, he has an unproductive at 51 before pointing between two brushy clumps at 56. Birds are not produced in the clump he is looking at; he is tapped for relocation, wheels 180 degrees without moving forward, and freezes again. A large group of birds are seen not five yards from him and he is perfection to flush and shot showing intelligence by stopping at the first scent. Released, he finishes to the front near Lovers Bend.

WW'S BOY WONDER (Burton Wice) and WINDTUCK ROCKETS RED GLARE (Tom Milam) — It is a pleasant 54 degrees for the afternoon start with forty plus riders and ten souls on the dog wagon. This pair establishes a moderate hunting range while moving forward. The turn after the White Post is passed at 12, Wonder comes off the right side along the road to catch his turning handler, and bumps birds to be picked up. Rocket continues his pattern and is picked up by his handler after passing #1 Lick Creek Crossing.

SMARTEYES-JOKER (Steve Ralph) and LANE'S END WE-BE-CLEAN (Tom Robin) – This competitive pair left the starting blocks with each going to show

the other how fast they are. They roar along the road, Joker having a slight lead, and are seen going over the distant rise. Moving ahead, Joker is being picked up at 11 having a large gash in his chest, being later determined to have run into a jagged end of a metal culvert. Margaret Horstmeyer, DVM treated and stapled the wound, and full recovery is expected. Clean has continued to the front establishing point at 25 near the double gate. A single is flushed and he remained steady to flush and shot. From this point, he sets a rather modest ground effort, crossing Horse Bridge at 38, and enters the Ford Bottoms. The dog Wagon gallery calls point along the left of Riblin Knoll Road at 52, and he remains motionless to flush and shot. His hour ends after the Third Bridge turn.

MO-DAN'S BELIEVER (John Cross) and KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER (Ken Seivert) - MO-DAN'S BELIEVER is scratched and KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER is moved to Brace 9a.

STARLIGHT'S BLAZING SIRIUS (Tommy Thomas) and ORION'S FLOJO (Gary Smith) – Sirius makes a fast start and is lost almost from the starting whistle. Flojo, a very winning veteran, has been placed on the ground for her last major competition. She is all heart setting a moderate and hunting effort with contacts at 15 and 23 before an unproductive at 25. Her handler picks the aging warrior up at this point to place her in the retirement she has worked for.

DAY TWO: A brilliant day greets everyone with a twenty-four degree start. Eleven bundled up folks are on the dog wagon with thirty plus riders.

KB'S SHADOW-DANCER (Herb Rea) and MAXWELL'S GUN SMOKE (Kent Patterson) - This pair came to the starting line with winning on their mind and an excellent hour is in store for handlers, judges, and spectators. Leaving independently, they are next seen to the front as the first curve comes up at 5. The White Post curve is passed at 11 with Smoke out of pocket on the right edge. Dancer takes the left edge to the front, crosses over in the distance, and pops up from a nice right cast as the Barking Dog House is neared at 17. Going through #1 Lick Creek Crossing at 20, Dancer charges along the left edge with Smoke being seen taking the front, right edge. Crossing over at 25, point is called by the scout for Dancer along the right edge, and the dog is very mannerly to flush and shot. Entering the Cotton Fields at 30, Smoke has taken the left edge all the way to the front and Dancer claims the right edge taking it all the way and showing in front. The edges vibrate as this pair roar by with one each side, always moving forward, and point is called at 44 for Smoke who is buried in brush nearing the Twin Ponds. Birds are produced and he stands ridged throughout. Hayden Camp is approached at 53; Dancer takes the river edge going to the front, and pulls off to cross over to the wood line in front of the trail. Smoke has also taken the river and stays with it charging towards the distant Horse Bridge. They finish to the front and both are strong in a soggy area that should have pulled them down.

SAINT JOSEPH ORI (Joe Ori) is scratched and replaced with KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER (Ken Seivert) now running with LINVEL'S ACE OF DIAMONDS (Paul Pollock) - Very nice start for both as they take edges towards the front, quickly popping up in the far front as the Riblin Bottoms are entered at 5, and point is called at 8 on the left for Molester. Several birds leave at flush and the dog stands taut throughout. The turn at the Third Bridge is made at 14 and both move quickly into the east Riblin Bottoms with gusto taking the right wooded edge. Molester comes off the right side as it narrows in the front, crosses to the left edge moving forward and points at 22. This dug-up find produces many birds; some still rising after the shot, with Molester displaying excellent manners. The tight area is entered near the Pine Tree at 25, Molester checks edges as the opportunity presents itself, and Diamond is out of pocket. Parish Field is entered at 40, Molester takes the right wood line edge and the receiver is requested for Diamonds. Staying on the edge, Molester goes into the far, front woods, and comes out in front as Horton Pond is passed at 50. Moving ahead, he becomes tangled up in the far turn of the 540 Loop, finishing near the Horse Bridge during his grace period.

MAXWELL'S WHITE SPIRIT (Kent Patterson) and RU-JEM'S A TOUCH OF BOURBON (Jerry McGee) — This is a very eye-appealing start for both dogs as they go into Course #3 checking the edges. Spirit shows experience as he comes to perpendicular hedgerows at road gaps, takes a right or left turn to the end of the row, then moves forward to the next hedgerow repeating the performance. Moving ahead, Bourbon has a productive contact at 15 along the right edge. Released, he passes Mario's Hill and has another contact to the left at 19 when the meadow is entered. #3 Lick Creek Crossing is crossed at 22 when Spirit barrels to the front from the right side, takes the left side as the walking dog meadow is entered, and points at 23. He is relocated but cannot produce birds. Both dogs are under control when the tight part of Course #3 is entered at 30, and remain in front as Lovers Bend nears. Moving towards Beaver Slough, Spirit cards another unproductive at 40 and is leashed. Bourbon continues his hunting effort, has another contact at 49 but has trouble handling them and is picked up.

SHADY'S TIA MARIA (Marilynne Little) and MEGASMOKE LIMITED EDITION (Tom White) — Sixty four degrees for the afternoon braces, eleven boisterous and well stocked folks on the dog wagon with forty plus riders greet the starters. The pair make the crowd watch them as the quickly establish hunting patterns to the front. They occasionally check in letting their handlers know they are in

the area and turn with the road curve at 15 when point is called for Maria along the road hedgerow. Several birds rise with the flush and keep getting up as the dog stands with good composure. Crossing #1 Lick Creek Crossing at 21, both dogs are in the front speeding away. Moving along the right edge, Maria points at 21, relocates own her own as the handler dismounts, then freezes in the middle of the brush. Birds are moved with everything mannerly. Galloping to catch the front, the Cotton Fields are entered at 27, Edition is seen on the left edge, goes to the right edge, and has a disappointing bird mishap at 34. Maria continues on the right edge, turns towards the trial with the edge line, and scoots through the gap near the Twin Ponds at 41. She crosses to Hayden Camp, turns right with the river edge, charges to the front, then turns towards the wooded area as the river bends at 48. A breeze finally comes up and she finishes her hour taking advantage of the wind checking distant edges.

JUST CALL ME ROY (Kent Patterson) and WHITE MOUNTAIN SMOKE (Dale Pool) - Leaving the start of Course #2, these dogs are gone, blowing through the first gap in less than a minute. They take the right edge of Ford Bottoms including the distant horseshoe and enter the Riblin Bottoms at 5. The turn is made at 14 near the Third Bridge with Roy being called out in the far horseshoe along the rivers edge before turning with the wood line to the front. He goes across to the left edge when the wood line he is on narrows in front of him at 20. This ground near the river is saturated with water and starts taking it's toll on Smoke who is plowing through it on the right side, and points at 22. The handler flushes without success and heads towards his dog when several birds rise with Smoke remaining steady. The tight area of this course is entered near the Pine Tree at 30, Roy on the left and Smoke in the right woods. Roy is shown on the far right edge as Parish Field is entered at 36 with Smoke pointing just in front of the opening along the road edge. He is relocated and taken on with an unproductive. Released, he takes the right edge to be rewarded with birds at 42, all in order, and finishes near the Horse Bridge. Roy is moving on, passes Horton Pond, and negotiates the 540 Loop bend at 52. Finishing strong, point is called for him near the edge of a wood line just before time is called. An extended flushing and relocation attempt is unsuccessful.

JAZE HOWLALEWYA AMEN (Jake Schroder) and TUB 0 TEE (David Lincoln) — This brace turns out to be the brace all handlers want to start over, and is the one every Reporter looks for. They mill around a bit when started, then Amen leaves not to be seen under contention again. Tee is a bit ragged and his handler elects to pick him up near Mario's Hill at 16.

DAY THREE: A pleasant 34 degrees with no wind greets the morning crowd. The clouds are puffy and scalloped across the entire sky. Eleven folks on the dog wagon with thirty plus riders share a gorgeous morning.

DAKOTA LUKE (Dick Mantler) and THE ROCK II (Paul Pollock) — The dogs are gone passing the first corner in less than a minute. Crossing the first road at 3, both are seen along the far front edge driving hard with the bottom dog crossing to the left edge as the first turn is passed at 6. Both charge to the front as the White Post is passed at 11. Rounding the curve near the road at 16, Luke is seen passing the Barking Dog House and ignoring deer in the area. The scout is dispatched for Rock and calls point at 17 along the road hedgerow. Birds are produced and he stands staunch to flush and shot. #1 Lick Creek is crossed at 22 and the Cotton Fields are entered at 28 with both dogs strong. Rock's scout calls point for him along the far right edge at 38, birds are produced, and he helps send them on their way to be leashed. Judge Collins asked the scout (Lisa Pollock) why she did not get in front of the moving dog to stop him, and she replied 'my job ends when the handler gets here'. Luke continues on finishing north of the Horse Bridge without contacting birds.

TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD (Jessica Carlson) and MARJO'S RED RUM (Joe Luisi) — A very nice start for both dogs from the beginning of Course #2, Blizzard guides along the right edge and horseshoe of Ford Bottoms while Rum is seen going through the gap from his cast along the horseshoe as Riblin Bottoms is entered at 4. Moving on, the Third Bridge is passed at 16, Blizzard takes the right, wooded edge to the front while Rum is out of pocket, with the receiver requested at 28. Blizzard goes through the heavy woods as the Pine Tree is passed, does a nice job in this heavier cover and enters Parish Field at 45. He is seen pointing on the right edge at 46, but relocates on his own, and continues. His hour is ended near Horse Bridge without bird work.

SHAMROCK'S SIRIUS (Wade Haines) and CLYDE'S MICRO BREEZE (Lisa Pollock) — Another nice start for both dogs as they take the right edge and continue forward through the Lower Woods Crossing. They stay on edges to the front as the Old Corral is passed and the curve heading towards Mario's Hill is negotiated at 14. The pair are brought through the walking dog meadow, the Gas Well is passed, and the tight area of Course #3 is entered at 28. The dogs have been out of pocket at this point when Breeze is seen in front and Sirius shows up on the right side. Breeze continues his front running effort while Sirius has a miscue at 42, and ends his hour. Passing Lovers Bend at 45, Breeze is seen along the far right edge, pulls off to search a front edge leading him to the middle of the course, and continues to the front. Beaver Slough is passed at 52 with Breeze continuing his front, edge running effort by taking the left edge of the Big Sandy

meadow. He points along the edge at 59 and closes an excellent ground effort after an unsuccessful relocation.

TJ'S SINGLE SHOT OF SCIPIO (Tom White) and JAYHAWKER TEQUILA WITH A TWIST (Jessica Carlson) - The afternoon running greets thirty-five riders and ten folks on the dog wagon with no wind and 64 degree weather. Both dogs are quick and snappy during the first few minutes, but are a bit moderate in race and have a tendency to pull off of casts before completing them. The White Post is passed at 8, and both dogs settle down to intelligent ground efforts with guick moving and far-reaching casts. Passing the road bend, Twist is seen pointing along the road hedge, is relocated, but cannot produce birds. Scipio is along the right side when the dog wagon gallery yells point, then say birds have left, which are not seen by the judges. Neither dog is seen when the Cotton Fields are entered at 26 nor scouts are dispatched to the right edge when Scipio is seen along the front right edge. He continues far-reaching front casts and is watered at 40 before the Twin Ponds at 40. Twist has not been seen and the receiver is requested at 45. Scipio comes to the open, crosses to Hayden Camp, turns right with the river wood line and speeds along the edge. He turns in the distant front to check a small mott, then comes across running the edge of the woods the course will go through. Moving with the edge to the front, he points at 52 about seventy yards to the left along a short line. Standing tight with good tail, he remains motionless to flush and shot. Released, he finishes his hour strong, snappy, and to the front edges as the Horse Bridge is neared.

TRUCKER'S WILD RIDE (Ray Trimble) and LANE'S END HAVE MERCY (Tom Robin) — The dogs seine the first part of Course #3 entering Riblin Bottoms at 5. Mercy cards an unproductive on the left along Riblin Knoll Road at 8 with the judge seeing a bird rise on its own in the brush long after the dog leaves the area. Rounding the Third Bridge turn, Ride points at 19, birds are seen leaving before the handler arrives, more birds are flushed and the dog remains motionless to flush and shot. Mercy points along a brushy mott on the left side, is charged with an unproductive, and is leashed at 32. Ride continues through the tight area and is leashed when he comes to the Parish Field at 39.

CHEYENNE WIND DANCER (John Cross) is scratched and MTB EMME'S CABO DE SCIPIO (Tom White) is moved to Brace 21A.

BRISCO'S MR. STUB (Ray Trimble) and DAKOTA ALLEY CAT (Bo Ackerman) — The third afternoon brace is released into the open Parish Field. Taking the right edge, Stub points at 3 remaining solid to flush and shot, is released carding a non-productive at 5, and has a miscue at 11 to be leashed. Cat meanwhile has run the meadow edge and passes Horton Pond heading towards the 540 Loop. The Horse Bridge is crossed at 21 with Cat taking the left edge along the river, then moves to the right side. His pace becomes moderate and the handler elects to leash him at 38.

DAY FOUR is a beautiful morning, 34 degrees with frost on the ground, zero wind, and clear skies. There are twenty-seven riders and eleven folks on the dog wagon.

CHEYENNE WIND DANCER (John Cross) is scratched and replaced by MTB EMME'S CABO DE SCIPIO (Tom White) now running with MAXWELL'S BLEW BY YOU (Terry Maxwell) - A nice start is shown as the dogs leave near the Cartmell Place, they move towards the right side and head towards the front. Coming across at 8, a bird is seen getting up on it's own on the edge of the trial with Scipio slamming into point as he nears the area. Additional birds are produced and the dog remains motionless to flush and shot. Blew By You is seen on the right edge going towards the front as Scipio is released. Moving on, the White Post is passed at 11 with Scipio seen pointing. The flushing attempt is futile, he is relocated moving into the brush and freezes with birds being produced. Nice job. Rounding the corner near the road, Blew By You is seen taking the left edge, passing the Barking Dog House at 18, crossing the road in front of the handler, and slamming into point before #1 Lick Creek Crossing. He is tight with a good tail as a large covey rises around him, and turns his head slightly during the commotion. Zipping across the creek and moving on, the Cotton Fields are entered at 26 with Scipio taking the left edge and Blew By You taking the right edge to be seen pointing at 27. The flushing attempt and shot are in order. Moving through a front gap at 30, Scipio points near a mott on the right side, birds are quickly put in the air and the dog remains tight to flush and shot. The dogs devour the Cotton Fields during this fast-paced brace, Scipio on the left and Blew By You taking the right edge of the Upper Woods Crossing turning with the course to the front and passing the double gates at 45. They cross the meadow towards Hayden Camp, take the river edge to the front, and turn towards the wooded edge in front of their handlers. Heading to the Horse Bridge, Blew By You crosses the front meadow to the tree line, turns towards the front as the course turns, follows the small ridge towards his handler and points along a feed plot at 56. A covey is produced, the shot fired, and the dog remains tight. Both dogs are strong as their hour ends.

RU-JEM'S STOP "N" WATCH (Jerry McGee) and JO-LOCKAPEX DARK ROUX GUMBO (David Lincoln) – This pair came to run as they roared through the first gap into Ford Bottoms at 1, keep up this pace as they enter west Riblin Bottoms at 8 and continue ahead. They turn at the Third Bridge at 13 with Gumbo taking

the left edge of the east Riblin Bottoms while Watch is seen on the right side of the meadow, and takes the left side of the meadow. Gumbo meanwhile goes right into the woods. Passing the Pine Tree at 20, Watch does a nice job of checking edges to the front in this tight corridor while the bottom dog is out of sight, popping up on the left side at 33 just before entering Parish Field. Watch disappears and the receiver is requested for him at 43. Gumbo continues past Horton Pond and becomes tangled up at the end of the 540 Loop with the scout calling him out just at pickup.

JAKE THE BLUE COLLAR GIANT (Chad Connor) and TERRAS CABO WABO (Tom White) — A nice start as both dogs go to the front towards the Lower Woods Crossing with a purpose. Giant takes a front hedgerow from right to left pointing at the end at 3. Birds rise spasmodically, shot is fired, and the dog remains motionless with a good tail. Passing the Old corral at 8, both are moving ahead with the top dog on the right side and the bottom dog on the left side. Mario's Hill and #3 Lick Creek Crossing are negotiated at 18, the walking dog meadow is crossed, and Wabo is seen pointing at 25 near the Gas Well to be charged with an error. Moving into the second half of Course #3 that is tight, Giant's handler moves him slowly through the many objectives. Rounding Lovers Bend he points at 43, relocated on his own while his handler rides towards him, and ends up pushing the birds.

BOUNCIN BETTY (Bill Burton) and EARLY TIMES (Bo Ackerman) — There is a good afternoon crowd, twenty-eight plus riders with eleven folks on the dog wagon. This pair enjoyed each others company at the beginning, taking the right part of the course, then left, and again the right side as the first road is crossed at 3. They separate at this point with Betty taking the edges and passing the White Post at 12 along the right edge with Times last seen on the front, right edge. Continuing past the Barking Dog House at 21, Times comes in from far, right cast at 21. Entering the Cotton Fields, Betty takes the left edge while Times is running the right edge when point is called at 30. On arrival, the handler elects to take the dog on without a flushing attempt. Moving on, both dogs extend their effort along the right edge with Times being seen standing along a front feed strip at 41. He is tight during the flushing attempt, leans towards the flight of the birds after the shot, and takes five or six jumps before being stopped by the handler. Betty has been absent and the receiver is asked for at 47.

THE FAR SIDE'S KID AMEE and BLUERIDGE MAJOR ADVENTURE (Laura Wilder) — This veteran pair, the two oldest dogs in the stake are released at the beginning of Course Two. Very fast start as both dogs jump ahead, go to each edge of Ford Bottoms, take the cut into the west Riblin Bottoms in stride and pass the Third Bridge at 15. They are strong going into the east Riblin Bottoms and hunt this part of the course with maturity. Parish Field is entered at 38 with Amee seen pointing in a feed strip on the right wood line. Major passes just to his rear without seeing him, runs about 30 yards, and pushes birds before stopping. This is a very disappointing finish to an excellent career. Birds are not produced for Amee and he is taken on. Staying on the right edges, he freezes at 43, birds are not produced, he is relocated, and does a fine job nailing the running birds about 100 yards away. They are flushed and the dog remains tight. Amee is taken on, negotiates the 540 Loop, and finishes strong near the Horse Bridge.

Dog Contacts With Birds
Twenty-Seven of the forty-six (58.8%) dogs started had bird contact.

AKC DELEGATE REPORT

The December Delegate's meeting was held in Long Beach, California, in conjunction with the AKC/Eukanuba Championship. AKC also encouraged all the breeds to have a "Meet the Breed" booth for the two days of the show. I have to thank Linda McDonald who set up and organized a booth along with all the others that brought dogs representing show, field, obedience and rescue. There was a laptop that showed the field trial aspect of the dogs which was provided by the ABC Judges Education committee. They also had information pamphlets on "Choosing A Brittany", rescue, the different competitions and pictures galore. I want to take this opportunity to thank all that assisted Linda. The booth was impressive and received a 3rd place in the sporting breeds. Well done. Linda recommended ABC make up a portable screen for any "Meet The Breed" booth - 6' x 3". It would have the name of the breed on top with photos of all aspects of the breed - field, show, obedience, rally, hunting, family, children and CGC. The rollup could easily be sent to any club all over the country.

This year, 2009, the AKC/Eukanuba Championship will be open to all, offer breed classes with points and will not be by invitation only. There will be a competition for Best Bred-By-Exhibitor in the show.

Also discussed was rotating the Meet the Breeds around the country.

The Treasurer advised that the economy has had an impact on AKC's bottom line. There was an 11% drop in litters registered and registrations were down 12%. Part of this problem is that there are now some 30 different registries competing with AKC. The competitors give litter registrations to commercial breeders "free of charge" and the new owners then pay to register. AKC's expenses remained about the same. The one area that is doing well is the selling of merchandise and books.

AKC is actively promoting itself in recent dog films with a small clip about responsible ownership and registering with AKC.

AKC was blindsided by the AVMA press release on the subject of Cropping and Docking which stated: "In recommending this policy revision, the committee was careful to distinguish ear cropping and tail docking performed for cosmetic reasons from procedures performed for therapeutic or preventive purposes. This is a "recommended" policy. They do not say that veterinarians cannot perform docking and cropping procedures but that it must be done with adequate anesthesia. We must be more pro-active in establishing with AMVA the purpose of our written standards. Each breed involved has to define within themselves the approach they are going to take and how they are going to defend the practice. The only breed known to get a ban reversed was the Springer Spaniel in Sweden. In 1988, data on tail damage to the breed was collected over two years and the breed was subsequently excluded from the docking ban.

The Group Realignment Committee reported that information regarding this procedure was contained in the minutes and published in the AKC Gazette and is on the AKC website. It will be 2011 before the realignment will be in effect. Once the groups are established, the Board has the authority to switch, add or delete breeds.

Parent Club Codes of Ethics and By-Laws Updating Project: An e-mail from Mike Liosis' office is being sent to every parent club asking for copies of their Codes of Ethics and Mission Statements and how they are implemented. After the information is coordinated, it will be accessible on the AKC website. There has been a lot of

discussion on the delegate list as how a Code of Ethics can be enforced

Ringside mentoring update: Peter Gaeta thanked the parent clubs for their involvement and support of AKC's endeavors to educate judges. They have had great response with respect to programs at advanced judges' institutes and in submitting lists of mentors for ring-side mentoring. When they revised the judging approval process, they were having a lot of difficulties with the old in-ring observation program. They were receiving complaints from show chairpersons, exhibitors, mentor judges and judges who wanted to be mentored. AKC had to re-think the whole concept. Now the ring-side mentors must be exhibitors who have at least 12 years of experience in the breed or judges who have regular status for at least 12 years. Diana Kubitz, ABC Education Chairman, has been doing an excellent job of coordinating the new regulations to the ABC mentoring program.

At the Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee, it was reported that at the September, 2008, meeting Doug Ljungren, AKC Performance Events Vice-President, advised that NAHVDA clubs have been approved to hold AKC pointing breed hunt tests. Wirehaired Vizslas will be allowed to enter AKC hunt tests starting in January, 2009. There was also further discussion on the use of the AKC Humane Fund for land donations focusing on how it might be able to own and administrate land for field events. At the end of this discussion it was noted that they needed a "pioneer donor".

At the December meeting of the Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee, there was no quorum. An informal discussion was held on several topics and I asked about the Garmin tracking device being approved by AKC. I was informed that it was ½ ounce over the limit and that perhaps all the trialers should contact Garmin requesting the collar be made lighter. In the meantime, AKC has received a bundle of requests for the use of this collar and several petitions have been signed and sent to both American Field and AKC. In response, AKC has sent letters to Parent Clubs or the individual club's field trial committee asking for input.

At the Legislative Caucus, it was agreed that all states are fighting some type of "animal rights" activity. It was recommended that experienced breeders and exhibitors contact their local state legislators and offer their input on any dog legislation. Instead of complaining, take a pro-active stance and offer, by letter, to help the legislator understand the impact on the dog community. ABC is fortunate to have Mary Jo Trimble keeping a watch on the Legislative front but local state help is needed as some of these bills are not known about or understood until it is too late.

I met with Robin Stansell, VP, in October on the Compliances for specialty shows. He assured me that he would not deny any club a specialty as long as they showed that they were trying to meet the compliances. We discussed easy ways this could be accomplished. I have a separate article on "compliances made easy" and will post them on the Brittany lists.

At lunch on the second day, AKC presented it's Lifetime Achievement Awards for Conformation, Companion Events and Performance. Our own Mary Jo Trimble was presented the award for Performance. With Ray winning the award in 2000, this makes the Trimbles the first couple to both win this prestigious award. The American Brittany Club is proud (and lucky) to have two such fine people working for us.

Our next meeting will be in March in Newark, NJ.

COMPLIANCES MADE EASY

We all reacted the same way when first confronted with the AKC Compliances for Specialty Shows. Although ABC has argued with AKC on the 10 mile status, AKC still feels that the home base, is the home base and we are required to do double the requirements. So in an effort to assist the already overworked show chairmen and club members, here are some suggestions to make it easier on you.

The Major Activities are difficult unless you hold an AKC licensed Match Show or go in with other clubs to hold one. The CGC can only be accomplished by some club member that is AKC approved to give the test, is willing to train and then to test. So those compliances are out for most of us. Where we can pick them up is under Additional Activities.

- 1. Training classes conformation
 - a. This can be done an hour before the show and publicized in the premium. Have a club member or outside person assist. Take a picture!
 - b. Have a fun match at a summer picnic and assist in training new folks. Make sure this is a listed activity on your flyer. Take a picture!
- Breeder referral Appoint someone in your club (usually the club secretary).
- Educational programs This can be done at a meeting and/or club picnic.
 - a. You can contact AKC for videos, have a local vet speak about vaccinations, feeding, etc., at a meeting.
 - b. AKC also has lots of free pamphlets that can be handed out. Have the handouts on the secretary's table at the dog show. Take a photo. For handouts, contact AKC Order Desk at 919-233-9767.
 - c. Have a club member meet with new members and explain dog shows, hunt tests, field trials, obedience trials, rally. This can be done at the club picnic, before each function or a club meeting. Document in a flyer.
- 4. New Exhibitor Briefing. This can be done before the show begins. I am working on a diagram to hand out that explains the progression of classes. Make sure this is listed with a time in your show premium and/or judges program with a listed time.
- 5. If anyone is active with Brittany Rescue, does transport, or houses a rescue dog another criteria is met. Just document.
- If any member goes to their child's school, scouts or 4-H club and has a discussion on responsible pet ownership during the year, another criteria is met. Information and handouts available from AKC for free.
- 7. Put an ad in a local paper directing people to demand AKC Papers. This initiative is to inform puppy buyers that they should seek an AKC dog when purchasing a family pet in order to receive the healthiest, happiest dog possible and to connect people with the information they need to make smart decisions throughout the process. For more information and assistance, contact AKC at 212-696-8360 or e-mail lxp@akc.org.
- 8. Disaster planning. Here is another easy compliance. Just pull off www.weather.com information for disaster planning for people and pets and hand out at a meeting, show, trial, hunt test, picnic, etc.

You can do many of the above multiple times and each time counts. Just document. Sometimes multiple clubs get together and put on seminars, training, grooming, etc. The event counts for all clubs involved. If you have any problems or questions, just call or e-mail me.

In Slemoriam

Clifton R. Boggs 1923 – 2009

One of the first people I met when I started field trialing back in the late 60's in Arizona was Cliff Boggs. He used to come to our Arizona trials and often stayed over and trained between the Sahuaro & Phoenix Club trials. We often renewed our friendship when he would come to Booneville. We have certainly missed seeing him the last few years as his health declined. Cliff was a vibrant individual who always greeted folks with that huge smile. When they were drawing up the information for his Patron Plaque for the Bird Dog Museum, he talked about his proudest moment was winning the 105 dog Futurity with Marmalade Sara at Ardmore. Those were the days. I wish my friend a well deserved rest and happy hunting with the many fine Brits he raised and trained. The inscription on his Patron Plaque follows.

Mary Jo Trimble.

Cliff Boggs was born in Antlers, Okla, in 1923, his father a farmer, rancher and cattle buyer. Cliff worked in construction, in Yuma, Ariz. For 22 years. He was a patron of Carl Purcell, who trained near Woodland, Cal. In 1965, Cliff moved his business from Yuma to Sacramento/Woodland, Cal.

Marmalade Sarah was a Purcell product. With Cliff at the controls, she prevailed over a field of 105 in the 1968 Brittany Futurity at Ardmore, Okla. Cliff also won the National Amateur Brittany All Age Championship with Country Cousin Lost Rivers, who is not enshrined in the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame. Country Cousin Lost Rivers was Cliff's all time winning Brittany.

In 1974, Cliff built Country Cousin Kennels near Davis, Cal. and began training for the public. During the next 14 years, he campaigned extensively on the Brittany circuit. He won the National Open Brittany All Age Championship at Booneville, Ark., with County Cousin Long River. He also won the Brittany Futurity two more times.

In 1968, Cliff relocated to Safford, Ariz., continuing to campaign a few pointers and setters. Stronghold's Anchor Gal won three Runner-up Championships in shooting dog events. Cliff won the prestigious Western Open Shooting Dog Championship three times with his own dogs: Country Cousin Kelly (1987), Country Cousin Kate (1991), and Country Cousin Ranger (1995).

In 2001, Cliff retired, continuing to live on the outskirts of Safford with Ruth Ann, and enjoying an enviable reputation among his peers as a tough, hard-working, reliable and highly professional competitor, but fair and honest ...and fun to be around.

The Future of the Futurities

Breeders' Classics Play Vital Role in Breed Improvement

I write to the field trial community hopefully to bring everyone's attention to the importance of identifying the best quality bird dogs for breeding. Every one of us now enjoying a good bird dog is beholden to the men and women who, generations earlier, selected the dogs to be bred. In most cases their eye for a good one and studied review of the pedigrees in each selected animal's past meant that the characteristics we now enjoy were found and attempted to be preserved into the future.

Make no mistake about it: the dogs of today are not the same dogs of the 1940s, 1960s or even the 1980s. Some may lament this observation but even you should recognize that breeders, owners and judges selected what we have today. I for one think most of the dogs today are superior to when I first started field trialing, although a few qualities from past champions I wouldn't mind seeing reconcentrated.

This brings me to the Futurities, of which there is a wide variety of options - enough for any thoughtful breeder to direct his dogs' offspring.

The Futurities are a long and important tradition of identifying well bred field trial bloodlines. In the past, placement in these events was a nearly sure fire predictor of a dog to watch as their abilities and training were polished as well as an endorsement of the sire and dam from which they came. There were fewer championships contested back then and a win at the Futurity was a signal event in a dog's early field trial career.

As I speak to breeders and owners developing young dogs, I'm observing a possible lack of understanding of the purpose and rationale of Futurity stakes. There are more championships available today with seemingly plenty of dogs competing. Those attempting to select parentage from the various bird dog bloodlines see these stakes' results and see the winners' names and judge their pedigrees and potential suitability based on these mostly adult records. With the cost of fuel and sheer numbers of trials available, it is not hard to imagine that many breeders have

never seen the stud dogs they select or the sire of their own female in competition at a trial or workout. The danger in this in my mind is twofold. Many dogs with superior characteristics do not have the luxury of supportive ownership, time and quality training to prove their mettle. The second is that some dogs with fewer great traits have the opportunity of lengthy training programs and an extensive competitive career because ownership is able to foot the bill until they do win.

Not every champion or multiple winning bird dog is a breedable animal and too many champions of some reputation could produce few if anything from multiple matings to different dams.

Robust and well functioning Futurity programs identify superior genes and breed-through characteristics by providing national level proving grounds at a critical time for evaluating a dog's natural characteristics. I and many others believe this ideal evaluation period is the Derby year and in particular the spring of that year. A Derby displaying his natural abilities including great desire to find and point game with style and fire, willingness to demonstrate training in the service to his handler and displaying the intelligence to rapidly head to likely cover is a beautiful thing and what any breeder should want to observe or understand.

Futurity competitors aren't dogs subjected to many months and years of constant repetition, inventive training and multiple trial opportunities to "get it right" but are dogs that have the raw talent to be developed early and the physical and mental characteristics breeders and owners should seek. The Futurities bring an opportunty to identify this natural talent by providing a national level venue during this key period.

To all my friends and readers, please continue to nominate your selective breeding to the Futurity stake that best fits your type of dog and support competition at this critical time in identifying superior bloodlines within the individual dogs available. Not only will you benefit in the immediate but owners of future field trial and hunting dogs will one day appreciate your efforts.

Nestled in the rolling hills of south-central lowa, the Union County Bird Dog Ranch just south of Thayer, lowa was home to the 44th running of the American Brittany Club Quail Classic/Championship. Heavy rains this spring and summer fed the cover well, but care was taken to mow strips throughout the 1000 acre ranch. With the autumn leaves beginning to turn color above the green pastures, a promising setting was laid out for this prestigious championship.

Judging the 53 dogs vying for the title were Rob Martin, experienced judge of many a fine stake and a long-time fancier of the All Age Brittany; and Mike Voshell, another well-respected and knowledgeable Brittany man who saved the day by stepping in at the last moment in place of a judge who was not able to make it. We owe gratitude to the continuing sponsorship of Purina and Tri-Tronics, and we enjoy the benefits of their products during the powerful hours taken in during our championship stakes.

The winner emerged from the very first brace in EARLY TIMEs, a strongly built white & orange male coming 6 years old this fall, trained and handled by Tom Tracy Jr. for owner Bo Ackerman of Georgia. "Earl" was fresh off a win at the ABC Pheasant Classic/Championship not two weeks earlier to take his second major win of the season here. He was pressed for the win by a dog off the same string, THE ROCK II, a sturdy orange roan just turned 6, also trained and handled by Tommy for owners Paul & Lisa Pollock of New Jersey. Also having a successful start to his season, "Rock" had a win at the Region 19 Amateur All Age Championship just prior to coming here. The account of each dog's race follows:

BRACE 1. EARLY TIMES (Earl) — Tracy & JUSTAS WELL BE THE GUNNER (Gunner) — Truksa. The first brace broke away under cool but humid conditions. Earl went hard right into the cedars at 6 as Gunner continued forward and remained so. Gunner made some promising moves but returned from most of them and proceeded at moderate range for most of this brace. Earl had almost caught up as we turned back towards camp on the All Age course, but a gallery member called out that she had seen him stopped on the treeline at the outside edge of the course. Tommy rode over but could not find Earl, so he went forward and sent his scout who subsequently called point at 22 with Earl buried in the cover not far from where he had been spotted earlier. Birds were flushed with Earl standing tall. He continued on and was seen going forward before disappearing into cover again, then showing forward on course several minutes later. He was close to catching the front again as we passed the keyhole

treeline but he did not come around the turn, and was again found by the scout buried in cover pointing stylishly at 32. Tommy couldn't locate the birds for several minutes, but with relocations deeper into the woods eventually the flush was made and Earl continued on at 40. He went forward and took the edges to the road crossing, found the next available edge and then dug in again. After repeating this process a couple of times, with some delay Earl was forward at the double creek crossings of the Gun Dog course at time. Gunner had finds ahead on course, in a feed strip at 52 and just before time near the barn at 58.

BRACE 2. RICOCHET'S CHANTILLY (Tilly) - Burchett & THE FAR SIDE'S KID AMEE (Amee) - Gorrow. This pair left from the barn with Tilly showing the speed and enthusiasm of her 2 years, Amee the wisdom and experience of her veteran years. Al called point for Amee in the orchard at 14. He could not produce a bird and when prompted, Amee first refused to move. A second attempt sent Amee running back to the cover behind. Tilly had gone forward and was out of pocket as we approached camp, but was spotted by the road guard ahead. At 28 Amee regained the front and took the direct route to the keyhole while Tilly cruised around the right side. Al was able to consistently show Amee to the front always working the edges, while Tilly was fast but less mature in her application. At 45 Amee was seen taking the feed strip edge heading back up to the keyhole, then was out of sight as Bob gathered his charge from the left. Bob brought Tilly up the keyhole treeline and reported that he had seen Amee down on the left side. Al's scout called point, and we rode down to find Amee standing at the end of a hedgerow. Scout called out birds on the ground but they could not be flushed out of high branches and vines, so AI eventually shot and took Amee on. She continued forward and finished working the left side of the course at time. Tilly continued on through the pine forest and finished near the horse pasture without having bird contact during the hour.

BRACE 3. KB'S SHADOW-DANCER (Dancer) — John & ELEET'S COLORADO BLUE (Blue) — Tracy. Heading into the cedars, both dogs showed intermittently up to the creek crossing, where Dancer went out of sight and was not seen again until coming to the gallery at the pond several minutes later. Blue made some nice moves but remained mostly lateral. He rimmed the outer edge of the church corner and came around on the feed strip near the road where Tommy called point at 14. After 6 minutes of attempting relocation and no bird found, he went on forward but after Blue came from behind a couple of times Tommy elected to put him in a harness. Dancer had gone on alone and made strong

forward casts, showing speed and independence but did not always carry his casts to completion and head forward. He scored two very stylish finds and finished going to the front towards the barn.

BRACE 4. THE ROCK II (Rock) - Tracy & TUCALOTA'S RUNNING REVA (Reva) - Mayhew. The last morning brace left from the barn, headed through the creek crossing and up into the alfalfa field. At 4 Rock was standing on the left edge as Reva turned and honored. A covey was put up with both dogs maintaining their manners. Rock continued on well and forward, Reva a bit more erratic. Rock had a non-productive at the beginning of the orchard and then a find in the feed strip at the end of the orchard. He rimmed the outside edge after that, was gathered from the fenceline and taken across the road to be turned loose on the All Age course. Both dogs worked the left side of the All Age course to the keyhole where they turned right. Reva had a find on the treeline there while Rock went forward and had a find at a feed strip at the bottom near the creek bed. Rock continued to take edges, scored another find in the feed strip at the church corner. Both dogs still forward, both working the feed strip on the right side heading back up towards the keyhole, Rock established point ahead while Reva did the same in another spot, and each was credited with another clean find, Rock's requiring relocation once. They finished going up the right side towards the All Age breakaway.

BRACE 5. BRETON'S GOLD RUN RUFFIAN (Runner) — Tillson & KINWASHKLY DAKOTA MOLESTER (Lester) — Seivert. A big white & liver dog and a little orange roan dog broke into the cedars, with the clouds beginning to break up the lunchtime heat wave. Runner attempted some casts, but found himself frustrated when the mowed strips yielded to tall grass and the tall grass didn't lead to a suitable edge to hunt. Lester handled well for the first few minutes but then disappeared at the creek crossing, soon to return and after catching the front he had a nice find at the feeder in the terrace feeder. He continued on and made impressive moves along the outside edges of the course, but was lost to judgment after 25. Runner made a few promising casts after reaching the pond, and stopped to point at 26 but thought better of it as the handler approached, and was retired for the day.

BRACE 6. HAVAPAL'S RENEGADE BILLY BOY (Billy) — Burchett & DAKOTA ALLEY CAT (Tiger) — Tracy. This pair left from camp and headed down the Gun Dog course, both charging out of sight to the front. We had Billy once just before the orchard and Tiger in the orchard, then didn't see either again until they both showed well forward on the fence line at the barn. Tiger made an impressive move along the entire left feed strip edge to the creek crossing, and then again along the entire left edge of the alfalfa field as Billy showed down the hill to the right. As we left the Gun Dog pickup point, Billy made a long cast down the fence line on the right, while Tiger took the left and suffered a breach of manners in a feed strip to end his bid at 22. Billy was seen standing on the edge of a mowed strip at 26; Bob was unsure but decided to attempt a flush, to no avail. He suffered a second non-productive at the end of the orchard and was picked up there.

BRACE 7. KD'S SLIP AND SLIDE (Splash) — Tillson & MUSTANG SALLY VIII (Sally) — Tracy. The last brace of the first day had the All Age course for their start, both showing good early ground speed and range. Sally had increasing difficulty keeping a forward pattern going, and was retired near the pond at 13. Meanwhile Splash increased his forward range and made strong moves along edges reaching to the front. He was gathered from the end of the regular All Age course at 25 to turn down into the pine forest. He handled well through here and stayed mostly forward through the cedars, past the creek crossing where he headed up a hill and was seen under a covey at 36.

DAY 1 POSTINGS: Early Times, The Far Side's Kid Amee, KB's Shadow-Dancer, The Rock II

BRACE 8. ADIOS SHAQ ATTACK (Shag) - Tracy & TJ'S THUNDER (Thunder) John. This morning started off cool, with the ground being soaked from a good rain the previous evening. Both dogs were off to a good start through the cedars, and after crossing the creek point was called for both dogs on a hedgerow running up the right side. Shaq moved after Tommy dismounted and was leashed. Thunder stood in shoulder-high cover and a big covey was flushed from the other side, with Thunder maintaining a high pose. Sent on, Thunder disappeared around the keyhole treeline, where he was found standing by the scout at 12. On relocation Thunder wrestled through the barbed wire and pinpointed the birds on the other side. He was off again and sped to the front, next seen at 19, standing high on both ends at the edge of the woods. A covey was put to flight while Thunder maintained his style. He shot ahead from there, took the outer edge of the church corner, came around and flung out to the right up the big treeline in the middle. He was out of sight for 9 minutes before Jimmy went and gathered him from the opposite end of that line to bring him through the keyhole. Thunder continued powering down edges on either side of the course to and past the road crossing. After completing a long, impressive cast along the entire right edge at the start of the Gun Dog course, he was seen at the corner gate well ahead of us heading into the orchard. He was out of sight after the creek crossings and still when we came up the hill from the big ditch at time. The judges rode forward to the barn where the next brace would break away. After a few anxious minutes, the call of point was heard from vicinity of the big ditch, but as we were riding to him the scout brought Thunder to the judges, not knowing if he could be heard from where he was and wanting to show the dog within his grace period.

BRACE 9. CLYDE'S MICRO BREEZE (Mike) - Tracy & RU-JEM'S DIAMOND JIM (Jem) - McGee. Leaving from the barn, both were seen rimming the alfalfa field before we approached the creek crossing. Jem was standing at 5 on the left edge of the alfalfa field while Mike was seen heading up the next hill to the left. It took Jerry a couple minutes to flush Jem's birds and while that was taking place, Tommy rode forward to find Mike on point at the fenceline heading away from the Gun Dog pickup point. A single was flushed there with Mike standing tall, but Mike was not seen again after we passed the lower woods crossing. Jem had a second find close to where Mike had had his, and regained the front ahead of Jerry in the orchard at 21. The sky darkened, the wind picked up and the rain began to close in on us. Jem went on to the All Age course, and at 30 was standing at the keyhole treeline, with a covey flushed in front of him. He was released and made a hard right to a cedar tree just below his last find, and had a single flushed at 33. He made a nice move down the right line heading towards the dairy farm, was gathered before the next crossing, turned left and at 39 pointed into the ditch, where a single was flushed. Sent on, Jem proceeded around the pond, stopped near the corner of the woods but was taken on by the handler, then took the right line at the woods edge and had a stop to flush at 50. He worked the right side all the way up to the keyhole, stayed mostly forward through the thick pine forest and finished at the horse pasture.

BRACE 10. STARLIGHT'S BLAZING SIRIUS (Sy) — Burchett & HANGING JAZE HOWLALEWYA AMEN (Slick) — Tillson. Both dogs showed early speed that got them turned around in the heavy cedars a couple of times in the first few minutes. After crossing the creek, both dogs showed well to the front. Slick was seen on an impressive cast forward to the keyhole treeline, then on point at the treeline. Sy then came in, circled around him once, stopped and Slick moved forward a bit to re-establish point in front of Sy, who then jumped in and flushed the birds. This proved too much for Slick to take, and both dogs were done early.

BRACE 11. BRITTMONT THE HAWK (Hogan) — Gorrow & CEDAR VALLEY BANDIT (Bandit) — Tracy. While we waited for the dogs and handlers to arrive for this brace, the drizzle became rain and the wind helped it douse us for the remainder of the morning's ride. These dogs left from the keyhole and headed down the normal All Age course. Hogan was seen headed down the big treeline to the right before the pond, where the scout found him standing at 3. The judge spotted the birds on the ground, shot was fired and Hogan was taken on, meeting his bracemate as he came around the pond. Bandit had a non-productive at 5, then continued on to make a nice find at 8 but go with the covey as they flushed before Tommy arrived. Hogan was then seen heading down the hill behind his handler, gathered in a few minutes and taken forward where he pointed, moved, went through, pointed, and went back around a hedgerow. When Al finally got hold of him, enough was enough and we rode back to dry out at 20.

BRACE 12, ROCKLAN'S KID ROWDY (Rip) - Burchett & KT'S ARCTIC BLAST (Rebel) - Tracy. The rain had let up but the wind remained, and the temperature dropped to a wintry sensation. We left from camp and headed down the regular Gun Dog course. Both dogs worked the course well to and through the orchard. Rebel was out of sight as we crossed the big ditch and came up to see Rip point and move forward a few times before stopping for good, then Bob dismounted to flush a single from under a cedar. Tommy had regathered Rebel before the barn and caught up at the next crossing. As we entered the alfalfa field Rebel crossed it from left to right, while Rip was seen on the left edge ahead of us working back towards us, then out into the adjacent field. He worked his way around this area and up to the fence line where he had a breach of manners on a bird. Rebel continued on, disappeared from sight again and reappeared well to the front on the outer rim of the course, in an impressive move that made it seem as if this "newbie" had been running these grounds all his life. Tommy gathered him and heeled him through the lower woods crossing, then released him into the orchard. Rebel continued to build his race, charging forward out of sight and next being seen far to the front on course. He was again gathered to cross the road and released onto the All Age course, where he shot forward on the left side, carried the cast through the cover and across the ditch to appear again headed to the keyhole far ahead of us. He was seen as a white dot turning right at the keyhole treeline, and when we arrived at the turn Tommy called point at 42, with Rebel pointing into the treeline. A single was flushed with Rebel taking a small hop. Released, he tore forward again and cruised the course as if it were mapped out for him, taking all the edges to their completion and always turning to the front. At about 50 the judges were trying to tell Tommy something was wrong. Tommy stopped the dog to find a wet but definitely live bird in Rebel's possession, and a thrilling race came to an abrupt end.

BRACE 13. ROCKLAN RED RIVER RUNNER (Rhett) - Tracy (bye). His bracemate

scratched, Rhett was released from the crossing by Jimmy's house. He worked the course with gusto, but had difficulty maintaining a forward pattern and was eventually retired after we went through the pine forest, cedars, and back across the creek to the All Age course again.

BRACE 14. LINVEL'S ACE OF DIAMONDS (Ace) - Tracy & WOLF RIVER'S WINNING TICKET (Cash) - Gorrow. The day's final brace left from the keyhole to head down the regular All Age course. Cash interspersed strong moves with more moderate ones, while Ace cruised forward and showed far ahead at the fence line by the road before we approached the pond. He checked back with Tommy from a distance, was sent left and then spent some time being regathered from that line and the road. While Ace was catching up, Cash had a find to the right of a crossing at 10. Both dogs continued on course with Ace making wide moves, Cash staying more conservatively forward. At 13 Ace was standing on a treeline pointing towards a feeder, and Tommy flushed a huge covey that flew in every direction. At 27 point was called for both dogs in the cedars and pines on the right before the orchard. A single was flushed behind Ace who stood with style, and in front of Cash who seemed unsure of the situation. Both dogs were through the creek crossings at 33, then Ace had a non-productive just up the hill on the left. He was taken on and caught the front only to find that Cash had been leashed at the barn. Ace swung wide right before we turned to the barn, and was found on point by his scout at the cedars in the far right corner at 42. A single was flushed with Ace solid. He continued on, took the left line after the barn but didn't complete the cast and had a little difficulty coming forward with Tommy to the creek crossing. He went through the alfalfa field and as we started to turn left, Ace went hard right and spent some time running there before finally being wrangled back on course. He finished out of sight on forward cast, heading away from the Gun Dog pickup point.

DAY 2 ADDITIONAL POSTING: TJ's Thunder

BRACE 15. ROCKLAN'S WHIZZLE STOP (Whiz) - Burchett & RU-JEM'S A TOUCH OF BOURBON (Chug) - McGee. Both dogs started well through the cedars on a cool morning, everything wet from dew overnight with a little frost in the shaded areas. At 8, Chug had a non-productive in a tall hedgerow on the right as we came up from the creek crossing. He continued around to the pond, and at 23 Bob's scout called point on the hill above the pond. A covey was flushed in front of Whiz who stood tall. Both dogs now at the front, Chug began making nice forward moves along edges while Whiz sped along parts of edges and also through the fields on either side. At 28, Chug went up the same line he had pointed in earlier, disappeared into it, judge saw birds leaving as we came through the crossing and we rode up to find Chug standing buried in the cover. He was credited with a stop to flush while from the other side, Whiz came over the hill and pointed at the end of the same hedgerow. Unsure of what had transpired when he was called over, Bob fired and took Whiz on. Both dogs headed up to the keyhole treeline and when we came around the corner, both were standing. A bird was flushed and both handlers fired. As we picked up the Gun Dog course, Chug made a beautiful move way to the front along the entire fence line to the corner of the orchard. He left the far right corner to meet Jerry at the entrance to the orchard, and both dogs were through the creek crossings at 42. As we rode up the hill from the big ditch, we found Chug standing just above the treeline. With relocation two birds were flushed from a cedar in front of him. Bob rode just up the hill from there and found Whiz standing in the feed strip, for another good find. Chug had slowed so Jerry elected to pick him up at the barn. Whiz continued on, taking the left side line after the barn and pointing at the start of the feed strip. Another covey was put to flight with Whiz standing high and tight. He continued on through the alfalfa field having slowed some, and finished at the Gun Dog pickup point.

BRACE 16. BRETON'S CASTLE ROCKET (Rocket) — John & SHADY'S COUNT KID (Kid) — Heiter. Kid disappeared into the cover at the start, later reappearing as we left the orchard. Rocket worked well through the orchard and past camp, then taking the left edge heading down the All Age course, soon followed by Kid who took the feed strip all the way down to the ditch and then crossed well to our front headed for the keyhole. Rocket emerged from the left edge, then as we emerged from the keyhole he showed well forward, then turned right to the terrace feeder where he pointed at 22. Birds were flushed there, then as Heiter's scout was gathering Kid from the hill above, Kid turned down and pointed at the same feeder, as Rocket was being sent forward. Bruce was called over and flushed more birds for Kid at 26. Both dogs alternated big casts with some slower times, then Kid was out of pocket as we came back around course to the keyhole again at 42. Rocket had a stop to flush on the left side after that, and remained forward for the rest of his time down. Kid was eventually regathered and finished in the cedars at time.

BRACE 17. TM'S TENNESSEE TWISTER (Sway) — Pollock & TOLKA-BELLE O KID RUSTY'S PRO (Rusty) — Burchett. This brace was turned loose at the keyhole to head down the regular All Age course. Rusty started with vigor, showing extended forward casts as Sway started at closer range. Sway settled into wider but more lateral casts, while Rusty shortened but remained forward. Rusty pointed on the edge of a feed strip at 10, but only a rabbit was flushed. At 13 Rusty was heading

up the hedgerow to the keyhole treeline and pointed with style. Bob flushed a single, then the rest of the covey came up in waves. Just up the hill, Rusty pointed again, and relocation did not produce any birds. Sway had been out of pocket for several minutes at this point and was eventually found on point, with all in order. Rusty continued forward and pointed a single where Rocket had a stop to flush in the previous brace. Sway caught the front again by the time we reached the orchard, but got hung up there and fell behind once more. Rusty remained at moderate range, though with a nice long stride. Bob sent him down to the left side after passing the barn and Rusty scored another nice find there at 42. Both dogs took the left edge of the alfalfa field, Sway sticking the edge to its completion, then being accidentally sent to the right, getting caught up on that side and out on the road, causing her to fall behind again. She was gathered, then took the fence line all the way down from the Gun Dog pickup point, out of sight for several minutes, then eventually brought to the lower woods crossing and up into the orchard to finish her hour, while Rusty neared camp at time.

BRACE 18. TRUCKER'S WILD RIDE (Rider) — Trimble & CHEYENNE WIND DANCER (Dan) — Tillson. We left the All Age breakaway for the last morning brace. At 4, Rider was standing in the keyhole treeline, moved as Ray approached, stood again and had at find at 5. Released, he went down the same treeline to the end and carded a second find. Shortly thereafter he had a stop to flush at a hedgerow just below. Dan was standing along a hedgerow at 6 but Ed found only a pile of feathers. Rider caught the front by 14 and both dogs took edges at fair range as we proceeded around the back part of the All Age course. At 21 Dan stood at the terrace feeder but looked unsure, and released himself during the flushing attempt to end his day. Rider had lost his momentum as we passed back through the keyhole and was retired at 25.

BRACE 19. CEDAR VALLEY ASYA (Asya) - Tracy & COUNTRY ROAD'S ROUGH RIDER (Cooper) - Burchett. The first afternoon brace left from camp, headed down the Gun Dog course. Cooper scored his first find at the orchard fence line at 5, standing nicely as birds flushed while we rode up. After the creek crossings Cooper was found pointing stylishly just to the right of the path, with a small covey flushed for him there. Asya bumped a covey at 11 to end her bid. At 17 Cooper was spotted at the gate at the far end of the alfalfa field, then turning left and working back down the line to the feeder where he had another find. He maintained a smooth, forward pattern, checking back on occasion. At 26 he carded another solid find on the orchard fence line. Cooper quartered across the next field before taking the right side edge all the way around to the next crossing where he met with Bob, and then was pulled left to pass camp. At this point he charged forward to the road crossing, past the All Age breakaway and out of sight down the runway, then was next seen working in the cover on the right side as we topped the hill. He slowed a bit after 45, requiring more direction to take the course's lines and edges. He finished, still forward, at the fence line headed down to the pine forest.

BRACE 20. JAYHAWK'S GEORGIA GIRL (Gigi) — Tracy & PJ OZZY (Ozzy) — Tillson. Ozzy was gone into the cedars immediately after breakaway, while Gigi was seen intermittently. Ozzy showed up again up the hill past the creek crossing, headed to a hedgerow where he had a good find at 9. Gigi showed up after the shot, well behind her handler. She caught up and was found pointing with style in the ditch at the back side of the All Age course at 17. Ozzy was in the area and passed her as he ran the top of the ditch, was believed to have seen her standing and was picked up. Birds were flushed for Gigi as she maintained her manners. However, after coming from behind again at 25, Tommy called it quits for the day.

BRACE 21. SMARTEYES-JOKER (Jordan) – John & HI PROOF WHIZKI (Whizki) – Gorrow. This brace left the keyhole towards the All Age breakaway, Whizki disappearing while Jordan was seeing making big strong casts along forward edges. Gathered at the road crossing, Whizki began making straightaway casts while Jordan worked well along numerous lines and edges. Just before 10, Jordan is to the front and found standing on the right side in the cedars before the orchard. A pair was flushed while Jordan stood well throughout. Scout called point for Whizki at the corner of the orchard at 12. He was standing on the other side of the fence in the tall weeds, but no birds could be produced and Al elected to go on rather than try to work into extremely thick brush ahead. Both dogs were seen well ahead going towards the barn at 20, but at 23 Whizki pushed up a covey and was leashed. Jordan continued on making nice moves, and after coming back to the orchard at 30 he had a nice find at the corner. Sent on, he had another find before his scout could re-mount, under the cedar tree next to the feeder. He slowed as we approached camp, and was picked up at 50.

DAY 3 ADDITIONAL POSTING: Country Road's Rough Rider

BRACE 22. TEQUILA WITH A TWIST (Taryn) — Tillson & BADA-BING (Bada) — Heiter. Thursday's first brace broke away into the cedars on a mild and pleasant morning. Both dogs got through the creek crossing and as Bada went up to the left and had a find, Taryn was out of sight when a rooster pheasant was seen lifting to the right front, and the judge spotted Taryn standing there. Shot was fired and Taryn taken on, then Bada had two more finds at terrace feeders while catching up. Taryn went around the pond, took the left edge

and pointed head-high in a feed strip for a covey find at 18. As we turned back towards the keyhole treeline, Taryn took the right line up the hedgerow and spun on point facing out into the grass. Upon relocation Taryn tracked the scent forward and into the hedgerow, pointing staunchly at the feeder and Ed flushed a hen pheasant. Bada regained the front during this work, and both continued up toward the keyhole treeline where Taryn pointed and another covey was flushed. Both dogs crossed the road and at the orchard fence line, Bada pointed with Taryn coming in to honor. A covey was flushed there, then both dogs went on and took the lower woods crossing. Bruce rode to bring Bada back on course, and Ed's scout returned to report that Taryn could hear him and had cut through the woods to the front. Bada had a sixth find in the first draw after the creek crossings, Taryn returned from the woods and Bada scored two more finds after the big ditch for a total of 8 before finishing forward at the barn. Tarvn pointed in a feed strip above the big ditch, but Ed could not locate any birds. With his scout still out, Ed turned back to regather his horse while Taryn exited the feed strip and ran over a single in the horse path. She didn't get stopped in time, and ended her bid at 55.

BRACE 23. BRISCO'S MR. STUB (Stub) — Trimble & RU-JEM'S STOP'N'WATCH (Quill) — McGee. Leaving from the barn, both dogs started conservatively with Stub scoring a stylish point at 9 on the left fence line leaving the Gun Dog pickup point. His second find was under a pine tree in the orchard, and upon relocation a covey was flushed there. At the same time Quill was found standing at the end of the orchard, but no birds could be produced with an extended relocation effort. Sent on, he made nice moves forward along good edges, pointed at the feed strip beside the keyhole treeline but released himself during the relocation attempt and was picked up. Stub had a non-productive just down the hill, then a find on the other side of a tall hedgerow at 43 with birds leaving as we approached. Going on, Stub scored another nice find just inside the woods edge a couple minutes later, but had a second non-productive at 52 to end this brace.

BRACE 24. TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD (Blizzard) — Tillson & MAGIC YOU CAN BE MY WINGMAN (Jake) — Burchett. Breaking away at the road on the All Age course, Blizzard shot to the front out of sight, and was next seen standing in the keyhole treeline, with Jake coming in to honor at 5. Jake got hung up heading to the All Age breakaway when we were turning down to the pine forest, but caught the front again at the cedars. Blizzard carded a second find at 22 with birds flushing as we arrived. He continued with big forward moves until going out of sight at the gate in the church corner. He was next called out by the other scout and both dogs continued back up to the keyhole treeline, where Jake went down the hill to the right, pushed up a covey and as Blizzard headed down, he stopped to the flush before Ed arrived. Blizzard made more strong moves until getting hung up as we passed camp, but was sent on down the Gun Dog course, checking back in once before continuing well forward. He was out of sight for a period prior to the end of his hour, but then showed up just before the gallery reached the barn.

BRACE 25. SHADOW ATTACK (Tack) - Tillson & TEQUILA DYNAMITE (Mike) - Burchett. Heading away from the barn, both dogs took a few minutes to warm up with Mike then showing well ahead at the gate leaving the alfalfa field. Both got out on the road, Tack taking an extra minute to come back on course but then he had a find on the left fence line at 10. Upon relocation he nailed the covey on the other side of the fence, they took flight and he stood solid. Mike had a find ahead in the orchard with all in order. Both dogs cooled off at the All Age breakaway at 17, and were re-energized, showing well forward going to the keyhole. At 28 Tack had a find on the other side of the keyhole treeline, while Mike took the left line to a turn ahead and was found standing. This proved non-productive and as his pace had slowed, Mike was retired for the day. Tack powered forward with some big moves heading down the hill towards the dairy farm. He disappeared from sight and was found standing at a feed strip at 34. Tack stood tall as the birds were flushed for a very impressive piece of bird work. Sent on, he took a left edge out of sight and the scout called point at 43 next to the big treeline in the middle. Ed arrived to find only a quail roost in the feed strip. Tack continued well as he finished the All Age course, with another good find on the right edge as we headed back up to the keyhole. His range suffering a bit in the last few minutes, Tack finished at the All Age breakaway.

BRACE 26. BARNEY'S HI PROOF RONRICO (Rico) — Burchett & JAKE ACRES IN DISQUISH (Jake) — Gorrow. This brace broke away into the cedars, with Jake scoring first at the keyhole treeline at 10. Jake caught the front and both dogs proceeded around the pond, Jake making good forward casts while Rico was more conservative and sometimes lateral. Heading back up to the All Age breakaway, Jake made a straight-away cast out of sight and was next seen on the left hill, headed back. He was gathered only to turn back again after the breakaway point, but regathered to cross the road at 30. Rico was found standing on the right side before the orchard, in the cedars with a small covey flushed as he stood high on both ends. Jake was seen just ahead but then disappeared from sight and was out of pocket for several minutes as Rico continued forward, making a nice move up the left hill after the creek crossings

and showing forward as he passed the barn. He had a find at the feeder on the left edge of the alfalfa field at 38, with birds coming out before Bob arrived. Leaving the Gun Dog pickup point, Rico went to the fence line on the left and pushed up a covey to end his day. Jake had a second find about 47 on the left side after the creek crossings, and finished his hour going up the right side of the alfalfa field.

BRACE 27. BOUNCIN BETTY (Betty) — Gorrow & ROCKLAN MISTY'S ALLIET-BEAR (Allie) — Burchett. Heading away from the Gun Dog pickup point, Allie lasted less than a minute before she encountered a covey at the first fence line and chased with gusto. Betty went well forward, showing sparingly before the end of the orchard. She hung the right side line from there all the way around to camp, and continued making strong moves, taking edges well forward for the first part of the All Age course. Al called point at a feed strip as we headed down towards Jimmy's house, with Betty standing head high as the birds flushed. She continued on, being sent down the right side of the course and Al followed, calling point at the feed strip at 33. Betty again stood with head high and birds were flushed. Shortly thereafter she pointed at the ground in the ditch, moved, re-established but without the same intensity, ended up releasing herself when Al went to flush, and we headed back to camp to hear the placements.

The American Brittany Club/New England Brittany Grouse/Woodcock Classic/ Championship was held on September 27-28 2008 in beautiful Coos County N.H. The weekend saw competitors from several northeastern states run their favorite bird dogs on the grounds in the Kilkenny section of the White Mountain National Forest. The American Brittany Club/New England Brittany Championship Association would like to thank all the competitors and several other key players for making this wild bird trial a success again this year. Special thanks should be extended to both Ray Gorman and his wife Martha and also to Roger McPherson and his wife Susie. Both of these couples put in extra work, including supplying a great hot chili lunch in the field on Saturday. This writer had three bowls and says thank you many times over.

Fran and Bill Gorman also took care of all the registrations and paperwork details involved, without them the trial might not have come together. Special thanks also go to Purina for their support of the trial again this year. Purina's contribution to this trial with dog food for all the winners is always appreciated by NEBCA.

The Judges for this prestigious event were Keith Madden and Mitch Swierczynski. These two got their mileage in over the two day event. Their hard work is appreciated by all involved. They kept the event moving at a great pace and gave every handler/dog a careful eye in hard to negotiate cover. My hat is off to them for their efforts plowing through the alder runs and overgrown clear cuts. These hour stakes are challenging in endurance to both handler and dog. Judging eight braces takes good physical endurance on the part of the judges. No horses here as the courses are tight and with the record rain this year, muddy and slippery. Eleven dogs had bird work, ten were usable. This shows the quality of the competition.

There was a great deal of sportsmanship show by all competitors. My notes show numerous times fellow handlers helping bracemates so that no one gets turned around in the big woods of Kilkenny.

On the above basis I wanted to mention Ray Gorman taking the time to walk back to help a fellow handler out of a root hole, while heading to great bird cover. Both dogs going to the front while this occurred. A true reflection of what cover dog people should be all about. With this said the brace summary follows; hope you enjoy the story.

Brace 1- COOS RYLEE/R. Gorman and TONAN'S ALWAYS TIME FOR ME (Sarah)/Garrell. Course: Moose Horn. At the line both dogs headed off down the skidder road towards the Ammonoosuc River half a mile away. Riley made the first big cast to the right heading down the ridge. He was handling at bell

range. Sarah moved nicely although closer in down the route. Sarah moved towards the right down the course and at 7 minutes had a non-productive and was moved forward. Conditions were very wet. Riley's bell was lost at 9 minutes and scout moved out, dog located moving forward. Grouse lifted, but no dog was involved. At 12 minutes Sarah was near by as two grouse lifted and Garrell fired. Sarah was moved forward down course. Both dogs worked towards the old clear cut on valley floor. It was here Garrell got hung up in wet bog crossing with Gorman helping out. Riley made several nice casts to the right in this tight cover. Sarah appeared to lose some spunk at the 20 minute mark as the clear cut had thick cover. Both dogs continued to hunt with Riley making bigger moves. Participants located the new trail and continued to river at the 35 minute mark.

Here small birch islands could be seen within the overgrown clearcut creating great bird cover, but nothing produced. Making the turn at 40 both handlers headed up the ridge towards the beginning of course along the river. Time ran out with no further bird work.

Brace 2- FLASH FIRE'S BANG-A-GONG (Tonka) Bjork and SUEMAC'S BODACIOUS PRIDE (Bo) McPherson. Course: Ammonoosuc. Both dogs broke away enthusiastically and again headed down towards the river. During this breakaway both dogs made nice independent casts, with Bo being the wider of the two. At 8 minutes point called by scout for Bo left side of course Woodcock flushed and McPherson fired and all was in order. A nice walking pace by both handlers with the dogs working cover efficiently was observed as gallery moved down course. We approached the river bank at 20 minutes. The cover here closes up and looks nice and birdy along river. At the 25th minute point was called by Bjork. A Woodcock was produced and all in order. Tonka was released and at 26 minutes point again was called, another woodcock produced. All was in order for Tonka. Just up course a Grouse flushed at 27 minutes and Bo was found standing. McPherson entered the tangles and two more grouse produced. McPherson fires and all remained in order with Bo standing tall. Brace proceeded through beaver slough and climbed ridge into clear cut area. Handlers climbed ridge with no further bird work. The dogs finishing strong and to front handling nicely at all times, Bo having more length in his casts, showing his experience in the grouse woods.

Brace 3- MR. P'S TWINKIE/Poland and GREEN MOUNTAIN BRADY/Blondin. Course: Deer Mtn. The day had warmed up some by the time the dogs went to the line at Deer Mtn. This course takes you up hill into some old logging roads and the winds down back to the Loop road going through Killkenny.

The course is famous with Setter folks who trial here also. Both dogs broke away at a walking pace as we headed into the woods. The dogs worked the cover thoroughly as we made way to logging road, at 8 minutes point called for Brady. Nothing produced and handlers moved forward. Poland could be heard singing heading down the ridge back to the road. At 21 minutes, Brady's bell went silent and Blondin searched for Brady, nothing produced. Poland continued forward on course and could be heard singing through the maples. At the 28 minute mark, a big cast was made by Brady and the dog could not be located. A lengthy search followed throughout the course. At 50 minutes Twinkie became birdy, but no point or bird was produced while walking out the old skidder road to the end of course. During the walk out Brady was located out at the end of course by gallery on the trail of mother moose and her calf. As time was called Poland's scout flushed grouse from tree in Twinkie's area. Twinkie was out of judgment.

Brace 4- BEBOP FINNEGAN'S HOLIDAY (Holly)/F. Gorman and SUEMAC'S BLAZN BIBI (Bea)/McPherson. Course: Lonesome Ridge (revised). The caravan moved over to the revised course at Lonesome Ridge after lunch Saturday afternoon. The rain began to fall as both dogs were released from the line. The breakaway had both dogs working enthusiastically about the log landing area at the 3 minute mark. Upon entering the skidder road to head off towards the back of the course both dogs were making big casts out of sight, but in bell range. Holly was running big and at times had a mind of her own. The course at the far end has a ridge that takes a big fall off to the Ammonoosuc river at this point. Holly went over the ridge and Gorman had to stay on her to pull up back onto the course. At 23 minutes point called by McPherson no bird produced, yet a drumming boulder was noted. Handler moved forward back towards loop road. Holly stopped momentarily at 27 minutes and a grouse was heard to lift by the gallery. Neither the judge nor the handler heard the bird lift Heading out Bea worked professionally handling just at sight/bell range. At 59 minutes near loop road Bea had stop to flush, McPherson fired as grouse lifted

Brace 5- LOCAR'S EVER IN BLUE JEANS/Carney and COOS RIGLEE/Ettinger. Course: Pancake. The gallery took a extend trip over to the Pancake course for a mid afternoon excursion on the famous course. Both dogs hit the cover hard as they made their way up into the west valley. Etttinger and Riglee had their legs today and moved swiftly forward, Carney always keeping her dog forward at a nice cover dog pace. Dogs worked independently on this breakaway, but covered all likely spots. The dogs made nice casts on their way to the first overgrown edge of a clear cut, here the bells went silent at 17 minutes with the rain falling hard. Ettinger found his dog in a large overgrown island of black birch, there was no bird work credited. Just down the course Jeanie was found standing and Carney fired as a Woodcock flushed, all was in order. Ettinger moved forward down the course as Carney's dog worked the edge of the cover with some nice casts. Riglee opened up on the back of the course going to the swamp crossing. Ettinger had to stay on the dog to keep him forward. At 45 minutes working some maples Riglee's bell went silent roughly 60 yards off right side of course. Ettinger and scout went searching. Grouse was produced as Riglee was found standing. At shot temptation overtook him and Riglee was picked up. Before this error, Riglee was putting on a pattern clinic through the woods. Carney kept Jeanie forward on course, but there was no further bird work

Brace 6- SWIFT RIVER'S PIVOTAL MOMENT (Aia)/Bjork and JETER II/Blondin. Course: Ammonoosuc, final brace Saturday sunset. The final brace of the day moved back to the Ammonoosuc on the way out of Killkenny. Both dogs broke away at a nice cover dog pace as the handlers headed down the course towards the river valley. At 7 minute Jeter, making a nice cast into thick cover near the old clear cut was found standing by scout. Blondin produced woodcock and fired all was in order. At 9 minutes Grouse flush off course in front of reporter, but no dog was involved. Around the 16 minute mark Aja was marked standing in birdy cover, but no bird produced. Jeter started to run big from this moment forward with Blondin trying to stay on him going down to the valley floor. The 34th minute found Aja standing just off course Bjork produced woodcock, fired all in order. At 43 minutes Aja had a stop to flush on a woodcock. Aja followed this with another woodcock find with all in order. The 45th minute and again at 47 minutes, Aja pointed different woodcock near beaver swamp on right and left of course, the latter was a relocation where the bird lifted just as Aja stopped. Jeter came hard to the river area during this time with Blondin directing him towards likely cover. At 47 minutes point called for Jeter and Blondin produced woodcock, dog standing nicely right along river.

Jeter kept all in order during the shot and both dogs continued up the course making the turn heading back up the valley. Around the 57 minute mark working the overgrown clear cut back up towards the end of course Aja pointed. Bjork could not produce a bird. Aja was released and as time was called grouse lifted, dog not in judgment.

Brace 7- SUNSHINE'S JOHNNIE WALKER/Mercer and CASCO BAY JASPER/ Mazzaglia. Course: Ammonoosuc. This brace broke away from the line early Sunday morning with rain threatening. The handlers were as eager as their

dogs. This brace had their track shoes on and was quickly heading down the valley to the river. Talk the evening before mentioning plenty of birds had the gallery and judges also eager. Mercer was out front singing the dog forward at a very quick pace, Jasper was not far behind. The brace hit the river valley at 20 minutes. Here Johnny quickly made fast work of the alder cover near the beaver hollow. Johnny made several nice casts to the right side into the alders and swamp. Mazzaglia took the advice of his scout and others in the gallery and slowed things down in the birdy areas in the valley. At 37 minutes point was called for Jasper and Mazzaglia flush and fired as a Woodcock appeared over the course. All was in order for Jasper. Mercer could be heard moving Johnny forward up the ridge. At 40 minutes Jasper was again found standing on the left of the course. Woodcock flushed and Mazzaglia fired all in order and Jasper was moved forward. Further up the course in the clear cut Johnny was found standing tall in the whips thirty yards off the course at 43 minutes. Mercer made good use of the cover and a Grouse was flushed. Johnny kept all in order through the shot and was moved on. Jasper kept his race forward and fast as the gallery approached the skidder road near where Johnny had his productive find. Mercer worked hard on Johnny to pull him up the ridge and was successful after extended singing. Johnny liked that grouse area. The brace reached the loop road at 52 minutes and had to take the extension skidder road due east to run out the hour. At the 60 minute mark grouse flushed wild neither dog was working this bird. Both dogs finished the hour at a strong pace.

Brace 8 LOCAR'S INEVITABLE (Evita)/Carney and SUEMAC'S LIBERTY BELLE/ McPherson. Course: Pancake. The gallery made their way over to the Pancake course for the final brace of the Championship. Rain started to fall again at a steady rate. The judges and gallery were ready to run this one off as the weather was worsening. Both dogs broke away nicely and efficiently worked the cover heading up into the valley clear cut area. Nice casts by both as Carney was front most of the way. As both handlers came into the best cover on the course along the edge of a overgrown clear cut heavy rain started to fall. At 17 minutes McPherson could not find his bell and asked scout to make a wide swing. Also during this time Evita made a cast into the clear near the vicinity of last bell of Libby. McPherson looking found Libby standing with Evita having a lovely back in the overgrown whips. Both handler moved in a McPherson worked cover, but could not produce. Libby was released and Evita moved forward by Carney. Just forward Libby locked up hard. McPherson entered the tangles found chaulk, but could not produce. After a few minutes Libby was released just then woodcock flushed off of Libby's left side. Dog was not faulted as bird had run considerable distance and was not involved in flush. At 23 minutes Evita was found standing about 30 yards to the right of course. Woodcock flushed and all was in order after shot. Both dogs continued working the cover eagerly and with great intensity. At 26 minutes Libby was found standing in the water on the edge of this extended whip section. McPherson produced woodcock shot fired, all in order. Libby then moved up course with McPherson singing at a efficient walking pace. Carney found Evita standing at 29 minutes on the right side just north of where Libby had the find. Carney flushed and fired and a woodcock appeared over the alders. Both dogs moved up the course to the bog crossing at a brisk pace, but continuing to work the cover methodically. No further bird work was accomplished as the dogs continued to cast through the end of the hour, finishing going hard up the steep hill.

This year's winner of the Purina All Age Award was NFC/FC/AFC Lane's End We-Be Clean, owned by Tom and Judy Robin and handled by Chad Holman and Tom. This was We-Be's second win of this prestigious award, having won it two years before. We-Be won or placed in 12 hour stakes starting off the season by winning the National Open Championship and then 7 more hour wins, including 2 Amateur Championships. GREATER ST. LOUIS September 27-28, 2008

The Greater St. Louis Brittany Club Fall 2008 Hunt Test was held on Sept. 27-28 at the Whetstone Creek Conservation Area, Williamsburg, Missouri. There was a total 52 starters consisting of 7 different breeds. Entrants were from AR, CO, IL, LA, MO, NE, and OK. Due to the lower 80 degree temperature with very little wind extra effort was required to provide tubs of water for cooling stations which the dogs really took advantage of. Some handlers even looked tempted. This was our first break from past traditions at the junior level using only a single course with out a bird field. Some of the most recent changes/revisions to the Hunt Test guidelines were made to reflect more realistic actual hunting conditions for testing the dogs. We felt a single seeded course provided that. rather than a short stroll to a bird field which only then sparked the dog's hunting interest as in a training session. It seemed from comments from the handlers and judges that it was well accepted. Also the now mandatory planting of birds on the back course for more hunting like conditions proved to be a better test for over all manners at the Senior and Master level rather than only to be mannerly in a bird field. This reporter's opinion is that these guidelines (IF ADHERED T0) will heighten the quality of dogs receiving titles in these tests.



SUSQUEHANNA York Pointer and Setter Club Rossville, PA October 3-5, 2008

The autumn leaves are turning color, the air is brisk early in the morning with the temperatures almost perfect every brace of the trial. It was truly a great start to fall with help from all of the folks that came and the weatherman.

York Pointer and Setter Club, a place where dogs have been tested since the late 1940's, was the location of the Susquehanna Brittany Club's fall field trial. Dogs were tested, not only on how smart they ran to the objectives of long tree lines and brush and grass strips across this farm, but also on how smart they handled the turns and the birds on course. Because of the way the grounds are laid out, a dog will need to handle from four to nine finds in many a half-hour brace. If you were in an airplane looking down on this piece of land, it would have the

appearance of a large tic tac toe board with the tree lines making the lines up and across. The tree lines can be twenty to thirty feet wide, with grasses and brush in them, to more woods then tree line two hundred to three hundred feet wide. We have been known to have deer play with the dogs from time to time but that game is greatly frowned on by most handlers and judges.

We had rain earlier in the week. It was just enough to keep the dust down all weekend but not quite enough to give us perfect scenting conditions all day long on each of the three days we ran. It seems that by about midmorning to around lunch time each day the quail took their smell and hid it someplace as birds got harder and harder to get pointed. However, every dog that I know of had bird contact, some not as good as the handler would have liked and some were better then the handlers had hoped for in the judges books. Some dogs had too many to resist temptation.

On Friday we began the trial with our Open Limited (Winners) Gun Dog Stake with 26 dogs coming to the line. We broke away at 8 a.m. and had the attentive eyes of two well-seasoned judges looking over the dogs. Howard Shultz agreed to help out at the last minute when Ernie Saniga, our scheduled judge, had a business matter come up. Judging with him was Lou Palazzolo who has been into Brittany's for more then 25 years and is always a welcome sight to competitors as he looks over the dogs with a positive eye.

Jim Wilkinson's charge, that he and Paul Snyder coown, had a terrific day and scored 7 or 8 finds in the half hour tour of York Pointer and Setter club. Birds were pointed with style and plenty of zip on the ground which made watching "Itchy" a fun half hour. Delmar McCallister came six and a half hours from Ohio to have the start of an excellent weekend with us today. He and Brian Hendrickson traveled together to save fuel and helped each other out during the weekend. Delmar's Punk dog had a great half hour and showed lots of spark on the ground and good style as well to earn second place today. The first place dog showed just a bit more "handle" to her race. Jason Umberger, our Deputy Police Chief, with his first field trial dog, took third place ribbons with a nice race and multiple finds, all with style and lots of speed on the ground. Rounding out the placements was Jeanne Rozowski with her and Deb Zaktansky's, This Gambler's Fly'n. Ryder had a good half hour with nice bird work and a race that filled most of the course.

Following the Open Limited Gun Dog we ran the Susquehanna Open Memorial Puppy Stake that Brian and Helen Riggle have sponsored for the puppies that come to run. Five puppies showed up to run and Ron Harling Jr. came all the way from Rochester, New York to win the Open Puppy with his Jac's Over Aces. Jac showed much promise and brought smiles to those of us that watched. Pal's Redneck Opie, was bred by the Riggles and was purchased early this year from Helen and Brian. Opie ran a race that was filled with lots of speed, not always directed ahead but speed someplace and lots of point, some of which was directed at grasshoppers, butterflies and we suspect some crickets as well. Lou got his workout as Opie had fun for the second place ribbon. Helen and Brian came with their Wild Mtn. Let Her Rip and showed a nice running puppy that handled well for the third place ribbon. Bruce Conover showed us another one of those "Coveyrise" dogs in his One Tuff Contender that had a lot of fun for his time down on the course.

The Open All Age started the first thing Saturday morning with a field of eight starters. We had fourteen entries up until the hour before the drawing. At the last minute two folks scratched a total of six dogs and we were caught with less than the usual thirteen to fourteen dogs. However, the quality was good with Jogger's Reserve taking first with a very forward race two nice finds with a non productive in between the two finds. The first find according to Judge Boyer was the difference in first and second as the limb quality of the find impressed him as well as the strong forward race. Chris Rider came with his "Tyke" dog that has

won here many times. Today however the judges had a close one and called Cold Mountain the second place dog with two finds and a non productive, same as the first place dog. Calistar Del Prado, owned and run by Les Casselberry took third. Her race was good but on one of her finds she took a rather hard mark of the bird and the judges felt she had earned third place with it. Good ole "Withheld" took fourth place... and still no FC before his name!

The Amateur Gun Dog stake was twenty dogs strong with lots of the great dogs from the east and east central region competing on this warm and sunny Saturday in October. We had a slight breeze and lots of sunshine and lots and lots of birds. Delmar and Brian's long trip together and the ride home was much easier for Delmar as he took the blue ribbon with his "Punk" dog again which, pending AKC, will finish the dog. Look out everybody, Delmar has another good one coming on. Scirocco Del Prado, owned and run by Les Casselberry ran a tough race and lots of good bird work to challenge "Punk" but came up just a bit short today. Coke's Barton Hollow Bear placed third for Chris Rider and his owner, Stanley Thorpe, who was there to watch as Bear ran the wide parts of the course and had some very nice bird work. Sue Lehosky placed her Spring Hill's White Tornado fourth today with a good race and multiple finds

Our Open Derby Stake was a small one filled with lots of fun by all those that entered. Sue Lehosky came away with a large smile on her face as her Spring Hill's High Performance took the first place ribbon with a good race and two really nice pieces of derby bird work. Second place was awarded to Dennis Green's Ice Cold Bud. Bud had the strongest race of the stake but did not handle his birds as well as the first place dog. The excitement of the day had Bud's hair on fire at Mac II most of his time down. We had to look really fast to see his point but he pointed enough for the judges. Brian Riggle handled Sharptail's Alladin's Princess for owner Travis McMunn to third place with multiple finds and a forward race. Deb Zaktansky handled her Patriot Roc-ket to fourth place again with multiple bird contacts and a nice race.

This brought Saturday to an end and we all adjourned for the Pot Luck Dinner that has become a real tradition at Susquehanna Brittany Club's trials. We fed about 60 people at no cost to them with everything from shrimp steamed in beer to fresh baked ham, baked turkey breast, tortellini's in sauce, fried chicken, Chinese salad, and much, much more. Some of the dinner is provided by the club but we have much donated to the dinner by all that come. Hence the word and invite on the premium for a Pot Luck Dinner. Dennis Green, our club Secretary/ Treasurer, brought two fresh homemade cheesecakes that his wife made as well as the home made pulled pork we had for lunch on Friday. We also had a large assortment of pies and cakes. Marilyn Fenicle, our Hospitality Chairperson, along with Barb Youngs and Joan Warshefski put a lot of work into the "Happy Hour, Pot Luck Dinner" and appreciate all those that help and that bring dishes. Placements were given out just prior to dinner and a moment of silence was had by all in the room in memory of a lost friend from this week, Lowell Starner. We took time to say a prayer for Lowell and his wife Linda, both good friends of this club.

Sunday morning came with the same cool temps and sunshine we had all weekend. Not much of a breeze today but the temp was 43 degrees on the way in at 6 a.m. this morning. Twenty-nine dogs came to the line and made this a full day for the judges of the Open Gun

This would be a day to remember for Karen Pillion as she watched John Perry run her Britt Haven's Blaze of Glory for her. Karen is just getting back in the saddle after a year of healing from a broken arm from a bad fall. "Blaze" earned her first place ribbon in this very competitive stake but also, AKC pending, she will be Karen's first Field Champion and Dual Champion if we understand correctly. Way to go Karen and John. Second place went to the other half of the "Team Ohio" pair. Brian Hendrickson's BJ's Blaz'n Daisy took second for

Brian today. Like the first place dog, he had numerous finds and a good forward race. She was scouted just a bit more than the first place dog but still put in an excellent performance. Club member, Will Smeltz, placed his Victor third in the long and competitive stake. Will was very pleased with this ribbon to end the weekend. Sue Lehosky was smilling again with her Spring Hill's Hemi Magnum and the fourth place ribbon today. A placement in this stake was a real acknowledgement of good work.





HEART OF ILLINOIS October 25-26, 2008

Two days of heavy rain before the <u>Heart of Illinois</u> trial raised concerns about the condition of the two courses that we usually use. When we arrived on Friday afternoon, some of our fears were realized. The gun dog course creek crossing was too slick and had some washout on one bank. The field trial committee met and rearranged the location of the gun dog stakes making sure that the running order stayed the same.

All adult stakes ran on what is considered the allage course. This course has several routes and ending points to choose from which made it easy to design a gun dog course. The two juvenile stakes were held on the half of the usual gun dog course that we could get to from the parking lot. One of the great things about the Jim Edgar/Panther Creek field trial grounds are the options that clubs have for picking courses; there are many to choose from.

Saturday was a beautiful day with blue bird skies and moderate temperatures in the 50's. The club got to try out the used outdoor wedding-style tent that we bought last summer. Reno didn't recover the front and was leashed. Lester covered a lot of the country but did not have any game contact in the hour.

MAGIC YOU CAN BE MY WINGMAN, Burchett and KD'S SLIP & SLIDE, Tillson. Magic had a find at 16' with all in order. Splash wasn't pleasing the handler and was leashed. Magic had slowed in his application and was up at 48'.

TEQUILA DYNAMITE, Burchett and MO DAN'S BELIEVER, CROSS. We left from the flat rock creek crossing with both dogs headed atop the plateau. Buddy made a cast across the "battlefield" plateau. Dyna had a stylish find at 19'. Buddy has been absent and the tracking device was called for. Dyna had another find at 50' in the draw with all in order. She ran the hour at moderate range.

A rain delay for the whole of Tuesday. Weather forecast was for heavy showers, flash flood warnings and general nasty conditions so we held up for the day.

BOUDREAUX'S POKI JJ JOHNSON and SMARTEYES-JOKER, John. Wednesday dawned with rain beginning at daylight, delaying the start until 9:00AM. The rain then tapered off to a light mist by 10:00AM. Cool and wet conditions prevailed. Atop the hill from camp this pair hit the ground fast. Each dog went to places to find birds. JJ was fast and hard to keep in sight with the tall cover and reaching moves. Jordan was forward and searching for game. They moved over the terrain taking advantage of the wind and cover. At 59' point was called for JJ. He had made a cast to the left across the field begond the pond dam. He stood near the fence at the gravel road. Game was flushed with all in order. Jordan had no bird contact in his hour.

KB'S SHADOW DANCER, John and BARNEY'S HI PROOF Ronrico, Burchett. This pair of dogs went to work. Dancer leaving little unchecked and Rico searching the cover. Dancer settled into a moderate race with an erratic application. Rico was in a hunting mode but stayed forward. At 32' Rico stopped near a tree, moved up and pointed. The handler flushed a single with Rico standing nicely. At 33' just to the other side of the brush Dancer handled a stop to flush with style. At 49' Rico was making game, birds flushed, he was whoad, standing through the shot. At 56' point is called for Dancer by the scout. He is standing inside the fenced feeder area. Rico enters from the opposite side and is cautioned. A flushing attempt produced nothing so the handler relocated Dancer and Rico was taken on. Dancer searched through the tall cover and as he moved underneath the fence when birds flushed and he stopped. The hour ended shortly.

TOLKA-BELLE O KID RUSTY'S PRO, Burchett and SHADY'S TIA MARIA, Berneanthy. After a coffee break this pair was unleashed. As the handlers ride over the ridge both dogs are standing. Handlers flush birds with all in order for each dog at 15'. The dogs are running the tree filled draws. Tia catching the front from time to time. At 37' both handlers rode over another ridge and called point. Rusty is standing in grass as Tia stands downwind of him. Handlers flush birds from the cover. Both dogs ran moderate races.

TUCALOTA'S RUNNING REVA, Mayhew and HANGING JAZE HOWLALEWYA AMEN, Tillson. After lunch the weather has become dryer. Later the sun comes out. Both dogs began making wide swings into the country with Reva being wider. Slick had birds pop in front of him, taking a few to many steps. Reva continued to make wide casts, going to objectives. She covered a lot of country in her hour but did not have game contact.

GUNRUNNER'S LADY'S MAN, Berneathy and MICRO T, Johnson. Tee had an unproductive at 3'. Lute started to hunt the cover at moderate range with some casts into the country. Tee was not maintaining the front and was leashed at 25'. Lute had a covey find in the bottom of the draw with all in order. At 52' point was called as he stood at the edge of a drop off. The handler stepped down and birds flushed. As he walked to the dog more

birds flushed in front of him. He stood tightly through all. At 56' he had a find near a feeder with all in order. He finished the hour as he started.

TJ'S THUNDER, John and STARLIGHT'S BLAZING SIRUS, Burchett. We turn loose near camp and swing onto number one course. As Sy moves along the fence at the creek he stops. Thunder moved through the cover and stops nearby not able to see the other dog as he stood in a swale. Both handlers flush, game lifts and dogs are shot over at 7'. The handlers ride over a ridge near the bottom of a draw and as point is called by the scout from nearby. Sy's handler flushes as Thunder's calls a back. Nothing can be produced and Sy is relocated. Sy is searching the area as a single comes from behind a tree and he pursues it at 16'. Thunder is released farther down the draw, turns and is making game when a single pops from the grass and he leaves to check it out.

NAHELA, Gowin and RICOCHET'S CHANTILLy, Burchett. Muddy conditions remain after the two days of rain. Temperatures are... This morning was bright with sunshine, crisp temperatures early. This pair was off from atop the hill. Each dog setting it's pace. Over the ridge and down into the bowl Neely pointed, but no game was produced. She was sent on. Tilly was wide and out of pocket. We rode up out of the bowl and both dogs were out of pocket and not returned to judament.

CHEYENNE WIND DANCER, Cross and ROCKLAN'S WHIZZLE STOP, Burchett. This pair ran the country keeping the attention of the judges. Turns in the course were not a challenge for these dogs. Dancer became wider later in the brace and was not returned to judgment. Whiz pointed at 52'. Handler was flushing extensively. Whiz release himself shortly after and was leashed.

TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD, Tillson and WIMBERLY JIM DANDY, Johnson. We broke away just before the flat rock creek crossing. Dandy went to the bottom and started hunting. He found a single and put it to flight. Blizzard went forward for the rest of the hour searching for game. His application and stamina hand the judges attention. He had no game contact in his hour.

BRETON'S GOLD RUN RUFFIAN, Tillson and ROCKLAN'S KID ROWDY, Burchett. This pair started strong on the ground. Runner pointed at 12' with all in order. At 14' Runner pointed in an area where game had been previously found. He was relocated and sent on. Rowdy made some reaching casts over the country. Runner had a find up from the creek bottom. He stood in a deadfall pointing staunchly. Birds were flushed with all in order. He was sent on to finish the hour with nice moves going forward using the terrain. Rowdy did not have game contact during his hour.

KINWASHKLY ROSCUIS ZOOMER, Norman and BRETON'S CASTLE ROCKET, John. We left the back entrance gate with both dogs digging into the country. Zoomer was last seen as we crossed the creek. After the creek crossing Rocket took the draw to the left and around the hill, showing forward on the ridge. At 22' Rocket pointed in the bottom. Handler flushed but could only produce a double deer shed. (an unusual finding for hunters) Zoomer was out of pocket. At 33' near a dead fall Rocket pointed. Handler flushed through the area. He relocated Rocket. Rocket took a few steps to his right and birds flushed from the cover. He was leashed. Zoomer was not returned to judgment.

DESERT ROSE IV, Berneathy and ROCKLAND'S MISS ALLIE-T-BEAR, Burchett. Rosie was scratched and Allie ran as a bye. We broke away just before the flat rock creek crossing. Allie went to the creek bottom, where shortly point was called at 55 seconds. She stood at the base of a Osage orange tree. Birds were flushed with all in order. Apparently that contact got her fired up. She ran the plateau and out to our left across the big draw. Retrieved, sent forward, only to go to the north across the plateau and be retrieved again. She went to the long draw toward camp covering a lot of ground by her own volition. She had no other game contact during the hour.

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- · Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- · All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- · Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped. A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.
- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule: Late fees are: \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for any nomination received more than 90 days after whelping. No nominations will be accepted past 180 days of whelping. Additional late fees may be imposed from time to time by the ABC Board of Directors. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
