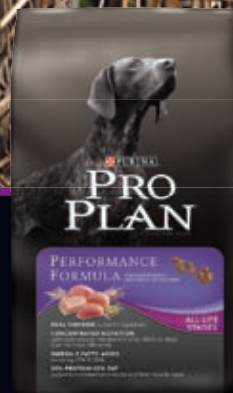

The mystery and excitement of hunting captured my imagination almost as soon as did any other emotion, and held it in their subtle grip through many a season of tramping the woods, cornfields, and wheat stubbles of southern Illinois, and other parts of the continent.

Long before I was sent off to school and reinforced a lifelong case of infatuation with the printed word, contracted even before the first grade, I was gazing with some awe at guns and dogs and shells, dreaming of myself in the role of the hunter, and in general falling captive to what must certainly rank among the most element of urges to pursue and kill and bring to bag a wild game creature.

Over many years my mind goes back and makes as real as yesterday the pungent gunpowder smell, the yelping cries of Tippy, and Sandy, and Prince, the rabbits hung in the smokehouse to cool—the fearful, terrible, wonderful joy of the whole princely sport of the hunt.

Reflections . . . In a Hunter's Eye

Fall is the time of year when the thoughts of many turn to hunting; when the frosts come, summer vegetation dies away, crops are picked, geese fly to the south, and all of the ancient urges to take to the hunting field appear in many of us.

Whether we think of sitting in a blind in the cold dark before sunrise waiting for waterfowl, or of following a bird dog after quail or pheasant, the instinct to hunt is strong in many of us, especially so in the autumn months. That, quite possibly, is a relic of the time when man hunted in the fall to lay in

food stocks for the winter.

In autumn the supplies of game normally are bigger, following the seasons of reproduction in spring and summer. In primitive man the urge to hunt was strong, and I suspect that in modern man, who in reality is not so far removed from his primitive ancestors, that urge continues.

Today in Illinois we have a lot of what might be regarded as specialty hunting. We have large flights of Canada geese; and more than 100,000 hunters take to the field annually to hunt the white-tailed deer. There is pheasant hunting in Illinois. Not nearly so much as we had two decades ago, due to the loss of habitat, but the pheasant is a remarkably resilient and adaptive bird, and given half a chance will again be a highly significant object of the hunt in our state. We hunt turkey now, though the season is principally in the spring.

These are all game creatures that now are hunted in Illinois. But if one goes back half a century we simply did not have them present in huntable numbers. Then there was no hunting for deer and turkey, and very little for the Canada goose. Fifty per cent of the number now present. The mourning dove today is one of the principle objects of the hunt, while 50 years ago there was very little hunting for this species.

It is evident that with the passage of time the picture changes in terms of the game that is sought. There are persons still living in Illinois who recall with clarity that as recently as 1940 prairie chickens could be observed in large numbers. We long ago ceased to hunt the prairie chicken as legal game. We devote a sanctuary to the preservation of this bird, that in our state is very much an endangered species. It is ironic that in the Prairie State we should have so little prairie remaining, and prairie acres are facing extinction.

With changing social and economic times and changing technologies in the way we practice agriculture, in the balance of forest and prairie lands and row-crop acres, varieties of game creatures increase and decrease in number. The hunter inevitably seeks those species that are available.

Even though today the pursuit of the Canada goose, the white-tailed deer, the pheasant, and the wild turkey are popular hunting activities, many of us grew up in a time when hunting in Illinois meant, above all, the cottontail rabbit. I suspect the rabbit still sustains greater hunting pressure and causes more game to be brought to the bag than any other species. It was the rabbit, bob white quail, and grey and fox squirrels that the hunters of half a century ago were seeking.

Certain traditions developed in the hunting of these species. During the great depression of the 1930's many hunted primarily for food. I can remember so well on cool summer mornings when the squirrel season began, listening to the roll of gunfire coming out of the Beaucoup Creek bottoms near my grandfather's farm, as a veritable army of squirrel hunters took to the woods. The reason there were so many of them was that they sought a tasty squirrel dinner. Game creatures, of course, commonly are utilized as food, but I recall an urgency in the 1930's on the part of those who took to the hunting field. They were hunting for the table.

Perhaps that is one reason why doves were not a popular target. It simply took too many shots on the average to bag one; and once bagged the dove was too small to be much of a supplement to the bill of fare.

Rabbits were another matter, as were squirrels. They were large enough to count. Rabbits could be hunted by boys with sticks. The boy and his dog out hunting rabbits on a frosty fall day after school was a common sight. They were often rather successful in their hunts, because they were resourceful and knew the ways of the game creature they sought. Too, they often had the spur of necessity to make them so.

2 females, 3 males whelped August 12, 2011

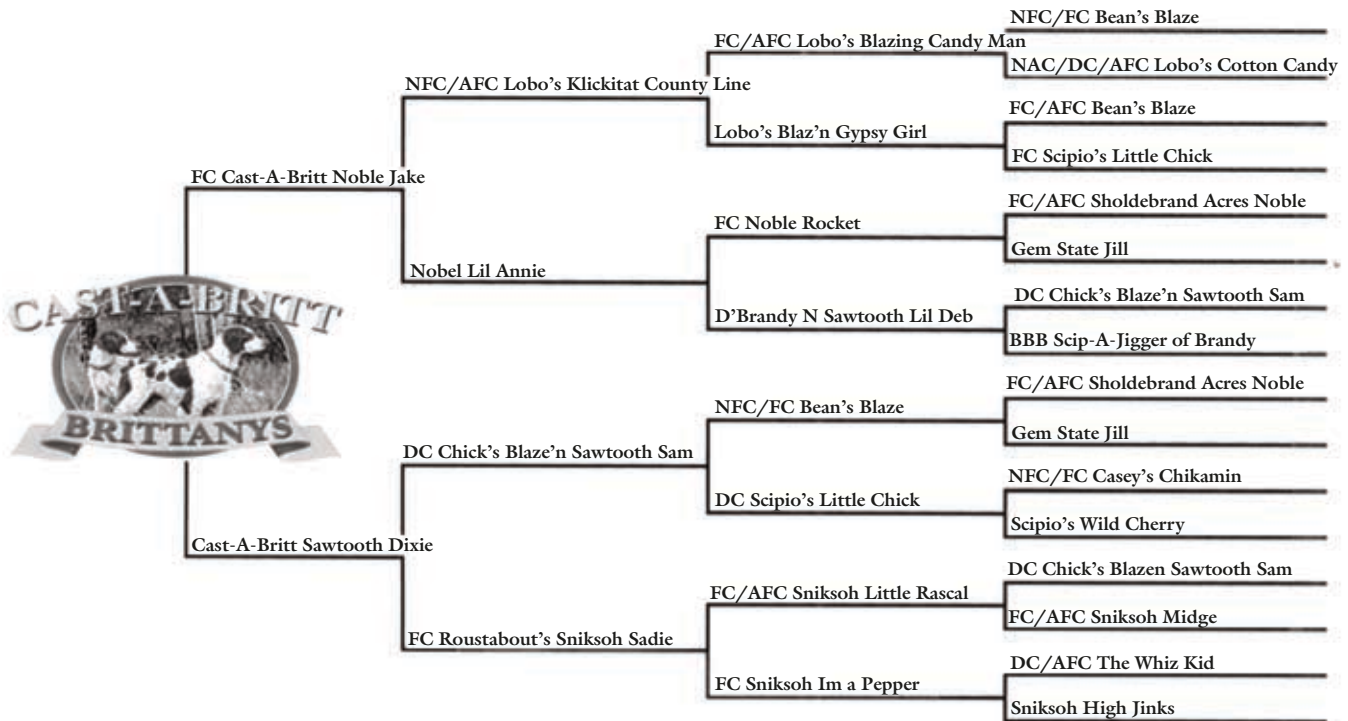

ABC 2011 Chairmen Reports & Agenda Items



2010 REPORT OF THE ABC PRESIDENT – Hank Hartnek September 15, 2011

2010 has been another year of varied challenges. The ABC continues 2011 marks The American Brittany Club's twenty-fifth year at Blue Mountain Wild Life Area. We are very appreciative of the efforts of Larry McAnally and his crew who are able to maintain these excellent facilities. This year most of the efforts have been put into vegetation control and improvements in roads and trails. Be sure to take time to thank Larry for all his efforts as he will be retiring in the middle of December.

2011 was another year of varied challenges.

As in previous years, the future of sporting dog activities is clouded by repeated attempts at constraining legislation that will place unworkable burdens on our activities. For example, the Texas legislature approved a bill which is extremely restrictive when it comes to breeding dogs. The American Brittany Club must continue to oppose each and every one of these pieces of legislation if we want our sport to continue. AKC has established a process regarding disabled handlers in field trials. It allows handlers to use ATV's and/or horses in walking stakes and walking trials. AKC is issuing letters for disabled handlers to give to host clubs. These letters are unique to the individual making the request and outline the procedure to follow for that individual handler based on their limitations with considerations for what is permitted by the state or land owner. It is recommended that any disabled handler seeking an accommodation contact AKC for details.

The magazine is getting back on track with regard to timeliness and content. This is due to the hard work of the Magazine committee under the leadership of Bob Fleury and the continued support from Webster County Printing.

This is our second year having our National Specialty Show at Kay Rodgers Park in Ft. Smith, the site of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair. This move helped reduce the costs of putting on our National show. We have renewed the contract for this show site for 2012 and 2013.

Membership and the Membership Database have become an increasing problem. I would like to discuss this in Executive Session along with recommendations to resolve this situation.

DNA testing became a major topic this year. I received considerable input from the membership on this issue and have submitted an Action Item concerning this issue. With Board consent, wrote a letter to AKC voicing our opposition to their "Q" registration.

Please remember, the ABC continues to function on the consistent efforts of a core of largely volunteers. We need to not lose sight of the fact that ninety-five percent of the clubs work is done by volunteers who have families, jobs and other responsibilities. The directors, officers, and committees at the national level as well as the many regional club officers and workers deserve a pat on the back. We could not maintain a viable level of activity in our shows, field trials, hunt tests, obedience, agility, futurity and other activities without the dedicated efforts of these members. I would urge each of you to say "Thank You" to those in charge of the next event that you attend.

Action Items:

Qualifications for the 2012 Championships.

Continue holding the All Age Championships at Booneville 2012, 2013 and beyond.

Currently there is a recording fee of \$2.00 being charged by ABC for dogs being shown in regional clubs specialty shows and the Summer Specialty. Half of this money is put into General Fund. The other half is split between the Breed Issues Fund and the Future Grounds Fund. I've received considerable input from people participating in these shows and they would like to have the money from these shows currently going to the Future Grounds Fund be put towards the National Specialty Show. There are typically 35 specialty shows a year with an average 30 entries per show with about 125 dogs at the Summer Specialty. This is a total of about 1200 dogs in a typical year. This amounts to about \$600 per year. I would like Board approval to have these funds go to the National Specialty Show.

I would like Board approval to require DNA testing for all dogs two (2) years of age or older participating in all ABC National events beginning in 2013. These events in The National All Age Open and Amateur Championships, the National Gun Dog Open and Amateur Championships, the National Specialty Show including Obedience and Rally and the Summer Specialty Show. The following would be put in the Policy Book.

DNA Testing

Each dog entered in an American Brittany Club National Event (field and non-field) must have a DNA number. This includes the Open All Age Championship, Amateur All Age Championship, Open Gun Dog Championship, Amateur Gun Dog Championship, National Specialty Show, Summer Specialty Show, National

Obedience Trial and National Rally Trial.

The DNA number may be obtained only thru the American Kennel Club.

The process is as follows:

E-mail, call, fax or write to the American Kennel Club to obtain a DNA kit. This kit consists of a cotton swab and instructions on the preparation of the swab for submission to AKC along with the required paperwork.

It is best to begin this process NO LATER THAN six weeks before the closing date of the event you plan to enter.

If you do not receive your number within a couple of weeks of the sample's submission, contact AKC to see if they have assigned a number to the sample. That is the number you will enter on the entry form.

It is not necessary to submit the results of the DNA test with your entry.

AKC has two types of kits. The regular kit is available at no charge, and the \$40 processing fee (per dog) is due when the sample is returned to the AKC. AKC also offers a Prepaid Test Kit for only \$35 (per dog). You can save \$5 per dog by paying in advance.

AKC DNA testing is available for purebred AKC registered breeds only.

Review Membership situation (Executive Session) and approve new "Duties of the ABC Membership Chairperson" to be included in the Policy Book.

Duties of Membership Chairperson

1. The ABC Membership Chairperson is appointed by and reports to the President. Any salary and expenses are approved by the ABC Board of Directors.

2. The ABC Membership Chairperson is solely responsible for receiving membership dues and creating and maintaining the membership list of the ABC.

3. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall receive all membership dues from either the individual members or from the regional club secretaries and maintain an up-to-date membership list.

4. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall maintain an Excel or Access Data Base of the membership. This includes:

- Personal information name, address, phone number and email addresses
- Membership status, full, associate, complimentary, life, and hall of fame members.
- Region and regional Club or member-at-large.
- Membership initiated by club, member other and expiration date
- Areas of interest (field trials, show, hunt test, hunting, obedience, agility, other)

5. The Membership Chairperson shall keep copies of all membership letters sent to the ABC as a record to double check which members are paid.

6. The ABC Membership Chairperson must receive membership dues by the 10th of the month if club members are to receive the next month's issue of "The American Brittany" (For example: Renewal dues must reach the ABC Membership Chairperson by January 10th if club members are to receive the February issue.)

7. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall be allowed to accept payment for memberships by accepting credit cards (2004) or by mail and through Pay Pal. Pay Pal receipts are sent directly to the Treasurer.

8. Regional club members may send their annual dues directly to the ABC Membership Chairperson instead of their club secretary. Dues may be paid for a multiple of years, up to three (3) years, and may be paid by check or credit card. (2005) or Pay Pal.

9. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall receive inquiries by phone/email/mail as to missing magazines and or membership subscriptions and questions.

10. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall post a monthly membership list for regional club access to their clubs data. Certain officers may have password and access to whole list. The distribution of the whole list is subject to Ex. Secretary's approval including the Purina annual survey.

11. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall provide labels to publisher of the American Brittany magazine on a monthly basis the first of each month.

12. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall submit a report of activities and recommendations to the Agenda Chairman in advance of the annual Board Meeting. This must be done far enough in advance so the Agenda Chairman can have the Agenda in the hands of the Directors six (6) weeks prior to the Annual Board Meeting.

13. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall provide the Executive Secretary with a count of full members to receive ballots the first of July for the purpose of ordering envelopes.

14. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall provide the Executive Secretary with current full members list and count by region for printing Directors' Election ballot labels for use the first of August.

15. The ABC Membership Chairperson shall compile a quarterly report (March, June, Sept., Dec.) of memberships to be paid to regional clubs to the ABC Treasurer for distribution. (\$10 of each full membership goes to regional club, \$1 of each associate membership goes to regional club.)

16. Some people are members of more than one club. They may elect to receive a magazine for each membership or only one mailing. This should be reflected in the membership list as "No Mail" on those particular subscriptions but will be included in number of ballots provided during the election.

17. If someone indicates they wish to be a member of a regional club but does not specify a choice, the Membership Chairperson will assign them to a club (subject to clubs' prior acceptance of such members). This is based on a regional map as described in Section 2 of the Policy Book "Designation of Regions".

The following does not need to be on Agenda; however, you might like to know prior to Board meeting....

AKC approved Grand Canyon Brittany Club and they have a hunt test scheduled in October and field trial in January 2012. They are currently being mentored. Also, their membership has increased.

Jeri Conklin, previous editor of ABC magazine, is now on the Magazine Committee and is working with Bob Fleury to increase membership and interest in the ABC. I have been in email correspondence with her and Bob will probably have a "blurb" to add about her.

THIRD VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT – Christine Ward-Weber.

The 2010 show again showed a profit. Please see Janet's report for the exact numbers, this did not include the grant which will be applied toward the 2011 budget. I have again secured a \$750.00 grant for the 2011 show with the city of Fort Smith which has been very helpful in the past years (this is quite a feat as they only have a total grant budget of 10,000 for the entire year). The 2010 ABC National Specialty was held in its new location in Fort Smith, Arkansas at the State Fairground Park. Currently I am looking into adding Agility in 2012 – solely dependent on a local agility club running the event. Details will be available if we can pull this together.

At the conclusion of my current term I will be resigning. Judges have been hired thru 2014 and I will hire 2015 next year. The show site has been signed thru 2014.

Agenda Items for the National Specialty Show: Address items 13 & 16

In 2010 there were 158 Dogs entered in this show with a total of 242 entries.

There are 12 Dogs entered in Obedience with a total of 17 entries.

There were 4 Dogs entered in Rally with a total of 6 entries.

Currently:

Specialty Shows must also pay \$2.00 per dog entered in the show. The show results must be sent to ABC within ten (10) days after the show or there will be a \$25.00 fine levied with a \$1.00 a day charged thereafter until results are received. (1995) (2001) I would like to recommend that the 50 cents going to the field trial grounds be redirected to the National Specialty to be in a fund for the show grounds. 19 Specialty shows held by Regional Clubs shall pay a \$2.00 per dog recording fee to the ABC. Clubs holding Hunting Tests will also pay the \$2.00 per dog recording fee to the ABC if they want the results published in the magazine.

Under 3rd VP responsibilities items 14 & 15

This should be one action item:

I believe that the ONLY required class should be field trial class...

The reasoning is NOT to slight either of the two additional classes BUT it is a redundant class...i.e. both are qualified for Field trial dog class. The two additional classes should be up to the chairperson of the event.

We DO NOT offer classes for other dogs with exceptional titles, such as MACH (a master Agility Championship, or Obedience Champions or Best in Show dogs, --all who have performed at the top of their levels, nor do we allow for a versatility class, a dog with performance titles in multiple venues. We do have a Dual sweeps, which is a great place to promote your duals. I do believe that both these classes are acknowledging dogs that have made exceptional achievements but so have many others NOT recognized.

I think this decision should be at the discretion of the show chair, not as part of the policy manual.

14. At the National Specialty Show and the Summer Specialty show the following classes are Required: Field Trial Class, Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class and Veterans Class. (11/93)

Additional Classes to be considered are Best Junior, High Scoring Brittany (when Obedience Classes are offered) and Hunt Test Classes at the Summer Specialty. (2010)

15. At the National Specialty Show and the Summer Specialty Show, the following classes are required: Field Trial Classes (dogs and bitches), Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class, Veterans classes (dogs and bitches). (deleted as redundant) (2010). At the National Specialty Show ONLY the following classes are required: Dual Champion Classes and National Qualifier classes. Qualifications for Field Trial classes shall be one field trial placement during the immediate past year (from the date of closing of the specialty year prior to the current National Specialty Show (2010) or be a Field Champion, an Amateur Field Champion or Dual Champion of record with AKC. Show, Field or Amateur Champion date must be included on the premium.

2011 Executive Secretary/Secretary Agenda Report

I believe this has been the busiest year I've ever had as ABC Secretary. I would like to report on some of the topics I mentioned in last year's report.

Magazine: The transitions at the magazine have taken a lot of time to help work with new staff at Marshfield as well as new contributing editors for the AKC New Titles and Agility/Obedience sections of the magazine. I do feel the effort has been worthwhile as Chairman Fleury has been getting a variety of new types of articles and formats which have enhanced meaningfulness of the magazine to more of our members. He will outline much of the progress in his report to the BOD.

Report Distribution: The FTP site has worked well for distributing reports. Fewer files turn up missing and it makes it easier to track events on an ongoing basis as needed by the statistician, the magazine, and myself. We are now uploading the magazine each month for the magazine committee to proof. Extra eyes certainly help and Steve Ralph compiles all corrections and relays to Marshfield.

Dog Database: If progress on this has been made, I am unaware of it. A couple of people are compiling their own databases for their use, but up to this point, we have no program that is made available to the magazine that could be used in setting up type for reporting results thereby reducing errors in spelling of names, owners, etc. This is still needed, IMO.

Membership Data: The FTP site does now have a master list that clubs can access to check current membership data for their club. Until this site is updated on a monthly basis, it is still not up to what I feel is needed to be of use by regional clubs. At this writing, it was only updated twice in 2011: May & September. We have no program for welcoming new members by anyone at the national or local level. I have notified clubs of new members which come through Pay Pal as I have time but this is lacking due to my other duties and time available, and I do not have access to members who join by check, mail, or fax. If new members are not made to feel involved, they will not stay with us for long. We also need current lists for Futurity Membership verification, sending entries for National Championships, and issuing of Championship pins to members.

3 Point Major Rule: Of utmost concern to me is the movement to remove the ABC/ AKC Rule requiring a 3 point major be obtained in a trial sponsored by a Brittany Club. This rule was put in place to support regional clubs and keep them viable. I've seen many clubs over the years I've been secretary that would have folded had this rule not been in place. People will attend trials put on by other breed clubs that are closer to home and bypass Brittany trials at greater distances. Who loses?: The Breed when clubs are not there. The ABC is in the business of promoting the Brittany Breed in all aspects and not just make it easier for people to put titles on their dogs. I would suggest that Brittany Clubs put more effort into supporting each other in putting on trials and take advantage of AKC's new program to permit 4 trials per year instead of 3. Many of the clubs are only holding one or two trials on a consistent basis. Petty differences need to be put aside and recognize the need to help each other stay alive. I urge the Board to reject this suggested change.

2011 Executive Secretary's Action Items

1. I support the Dog HOF Committee Chair to remove Section 9 of the Dog HOF section of the policy book. I believe when this rule was enacted, the Board felt that dogs inducted into the ABC HOF would also be inducted into the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame in Grand Junction. This has not been the case and the two Hall of Fames are separate entities. The BFTHOF does not necessarily recognize all ABC HOF dogs, particularly those who are mainly conformation selections.
2. The Dog HOF Committee Chair has also suggested requiring only one vote from his committee members for submitting nominations to the BOD for final selection. Based on the reasons he presented to me, I concur.
3. Since I am no longer acting as the corporate agent of the ABC, Line C, page 47, listing the ABC Secretary as being in charge of All corporate filings and associated papers be removed from the list of duties and the section be re-lettered.
4. Remove Section 27, page 53, of the Executive Secretary part of the policy book, requiring the Ex. Sec. to keep a record of the number of litters nominated, etc. At one time this was part of the duties, but it is now handled by the two futurity secretaries and not the Executive Secretary.

TREASURER'S REPORT

September 10, 2011

(To be updated for BOD meeting)

TO ALL DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS 5-YEAR COMPARATIVE INCOME STATEMENT

A 5-year comparison of income and expense is included for your information. The year 2010 resulted in a small profit, primarily because the BOD voted to suspend the transfer of \$25/dog from the

all-age and gun dog national entry fees to the future grounds fund. Thus, the entire \$175 entry fee is now available to cover the expenses of running those national events.

Significant variances for 2010 compared to 2009:

Yearbook ads and sales increased in 2010, and net of costs, resulted in a profit of approximately \$3500.

In 2010, the membership data chairman returned 1/2 of her compensation to ABC.

Magazine printing costs decreased in 2010; fewer pages were printed in the last few months of the year as ABC worked to catch up on issue dates.

The larger GD profit in 2009 resulted mainly from no wrangler at the 2009 GD nationals.

The loss from the running of the all age nationals was less in 2010 than in 2009, due mainly to the reporters for both the open and amateur declining most of their expenses in 2010. The need remains to either increase revenues or reduce expenses.

Comments on 5-year trends:

Dues income continues to decline as membership declines (however, the magazine committee has taken action in 2011 to diversify and add magazine content with the goal of increasing membership) From 2006 to 2010, dues income decreased by approximately 10% (\$4000).

Magazine advertising income has declined significantly (magazine committee has also addressed this in 2011)

The national raffle and auction provided significant revenue for the running of the nationals; this has declined significantly and is a major reason (although not the only one) the nationals are showing a loss in the last couple of years.

The national specialty show has greatly improved its financial results in the last two years.

Details of the 2010 nationals were included with my report for the year 2010, which was previously provided to the Board and is available on the ABC website. More detailed information has been provided to the respective vice presidents for their review and to assist them in making adjustments where necessary.

2010 OPERATING RESULTS

Information through 6/30/11 is included with this report; updated information through 10/31/11 will be provided for the Board meeting in November. Based on the increased magazine printing costs as the magazine committee reworks the magazine to include more articles with the goal of increasing membership and the anticipated financial results of the 2011 all age nationals, I anticipate a loss of \$5000-\$10000 for the year. (see action items below)

FUTURE GROUNDS AND BREED ISSUES FUNDS

Detail of transactions in each of these funds for the past two years is included with this report.

At the November 2011 Board meeting, I'll present a schedule of the estimated additional amount available for disbursement from the Breed Issues fund for the Board's consideration (will be \$2000-\$3000).

2012 BUDGET

My updated report for the Board meeting will include a proposed budget for 2012.

ACTION ITEMS

Consideration of any requests for revisions in budget amounts for 2012, if any, based on reports from other officers/committee chairs. At this time, I'm requesting the Board to not approve further increases in expenditures without identifying the revenues to cover such expenditures.

Review current financial status and determine what guidelines or changes need to be made, which could include raising entry fees for the national AA and GD events, revamp the annual auction event, actively solicit trophy donations for the AA and GD events, etc. My recommendation is that each event (AA nationals, GD nationals and specialty show) should operate at a breakeven and that we look for ways to increase revenues rather than cut expenses.

Review the current level of disbursements being made from the breed issues fund to determine if any changes are to be made in 2011. Details will be included in my updated report for the meeting.

Review financial results of the 2011 Gun Dog National Championships.

Administrative matter—at the 2010 BOD meeting it was agreed that dues checks should be forwarded to me at least every 2 weeks for deposit; to date that has not happened and we continue to be late in getting these checks deposited.

I encourage the BOD to address the purpose of the future grounds fund and the level as to which it should be funded.

At the BOD meeting in November, I will update the Board on the formation of a foundation to receive tax deductible contributions and bequests from estates. Respectfully submitted

I get several requests off the ABC website myself. We are now exchanging ads in several national magazines and hopefully this will generate some new interests.

Unfortunately with the evolution of computers and electrical communication, in the past year there have been about an average of one or two contacts a week. Most breeders now have their own web sites as well as Facebook pages and people find puppies just by doing a Google Search for Brittany Breeders.

The majority of the telephone calls/e-mail inquiries that I receive are people wanting to know more about the breed. Almost 100% are looking for "just pets" and maybe a pet/hunting dog. They also call to specifically inquire about the reputation of a breeder advertised in the AKC Classifieds. Others call for a variety of reasons. In response to your inquiry, I do not envision the ABC Membership Referral as a panacea to increase the dwindling membership of the ABC.

There are other avenues that I feel might help the ABC in increasing memberships. Over the past year the AKC started an incentive program called "AKC Breeders of Merritt". They're attempting to find ways to increase dog/puppy registrations and have moved towards giving recognition to breeders that meet a high criteria standard. They encourage "Breeders of Merritt" to register complete litters for a substantial registration price break. They give recognition to the breeders in a number of ways as they have realized that the future of our sport depends upon proven breeders.

If the ABC would/could also give recognition and support to their "Breeders of Merritt" it could go a long way to help increase the dwindling membership. As part of ABC recognition, breeders would be required to purchase an introductory one year membership, for all new puppy buyers. Those new puppy owners might not be a member for more than the first year, but it is a great way to reach out to folks who have a vested interest in our breed. This could also be an incentive for more breeders to futurity nominate their litters. The Breeders of Merritt could be listed on the ABC Website and/or the magazine. The AKC has already screened breeders and recognizes that most are the ones who work long and hard mentoring future dog enthusiasts.

**AKC DELEGATE REPORT FROM THE
SEPTEMBER 12-13, 2011 MEETING**

This was a very special meeting as we remembered the events of September 11th that unfolded the day of the Delegate Meeting 10 years ago. AKC joined forces with search and rescue organizations throughout the country along with individual dog clubs and veterinarians to provide equipment, medical supplies and personnel to assist at Ground Zero. A special ceremony was held at Liberty State Park this year honoring those rescue dogs that are still alive and those new ones ready to step up and meet the challenge.

The Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee put on a one hour slide and video presentation to the Delegate body on all types of Performance events emphasizing the traits of a working dog – instincts, desire and drive, intelligence, trainability, temperament, physical ability (built correctly for the job), courage and toughness, willingness to work with other dogs, sustained concentration and cooperation/independence (a delicate balance). It was explained that the performance events are a test for the dog's working skills. After an overview by Doug Ljungren, VP Performance Events, individual committee members gave a short explanation in their field of expertise for retrievers, pointing breeds, spaniel events and hound events. The program was well received with quite a number of people not realizing how much work goes into field competitions.

In the Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee, Dave Hopkins gave an update on the "Mean Seeds" project. It has been found that some of these seeds have been incorporated into seed mixes that are used on CRP (Conservation Reserve Program) lands as they are good cover plants that allow the other seeds to grow and mature. But, there are other inexpensive seeds that can be used for cover planting that would not cause the harm. The two "bad seeds" are Canada

2) The BOD voted in November, 2010, to suspend transfers of \$25 per dog from entry fees at the GD and AA nationals. Entire \$175 entry fee will be used to cover

wildrye and Virginia wildrye as they produce awns that are inhaled or ingested and cause nasty infections and death in many animals. What are needed now are case studies of animals that have had these infections with veterinarian provided information. I may need to put into the ABC Magazine an article requesting such information. In the meantime, I would like to request the ABC donate to the AKC Humane Fund, Mean Seeds project, which is a 501c3 entity, the amount of \$500 or any amount the Board decides, to continue the research. This is a benefit to all field dogs and pets.

A short discussion was held on mentoring at field trials but the discussion was put off until the December Delegate meeting. If there is another Parent Club Conference, the Committee would like to have a seminar on sporting dog performance events. This is another avenue to educate other breeds on what we do.

Information on the AKC National Gun Dog Championship to start February 27th, 2012, is now posted on the AKC website. Ken Marden stated that if people attend, make sure they visit the Bird Dog Museum as AKC has also donated monies to it.

One problem discussed by the FT&HT Committee was the AKC Board of Director's decision to eliminate the attending AKC Liaison for each committee. The Committee felt that if it was a financial decision that we would all give up \$50 of our \$200 stipend that AKC gives to elected committee members for travel expenses. The Committee unanimously agreed to the reduction so that Doug Ljungren, VP Performance Events, could come to the meetings. All of the 10 committees agreed to the same and a letter was sent to the AKC Board requesting they reconsider their decision. We all felt that face to face discussions were much more productive than going through an AKC Board member to the Committee Liaison and then back to the committee.

At the Legislative Caucus, there was a discussion about the Humane Society running out of shelter dogs and importing them from other countries. The problem is that they are bringing in new diseases as the imported dogs do not have anything except minimal health screening.

At the General Caucus, it was announced that AKC is working to break the breeds at shows into 11 groups. This is to be posted on the AKC website. The AKC Board will place the dogs into the different groups but parent clubs may make recommendations to the Board. Brittanys will be in the "Pointing Breeds" Group.

For Junior Showmanship, it is in the works to create a Reserve Junior award. Until it passes through the Delegate body for a final vote, clubs are recommended to award an "Honorable Mention" award to the runner-up. Robin Stansell may be contacted at AKC for the correct wording to go into a premium.

At the actual Delegate Meeting two measures regarding a Delegate who misappropriates funds from AKC or an AKC subsidiary or affiliated organizations being suspended and clarifying that the Delegate's club may appeal to the Delegate Body was passed.

Also passed was the establishment of a Reserve Best In Show Award. Passed were housekeeping changes to Rules Applying to Dog Shows. Read to the Delegate Body was a proposed amendment to Chapter 7, Section 1 of the Dog Show Rules which would eliminate the prohibition of a person connected with dog food, dog remedy or kennel supply companies in the capacity of solicitor or salesman, from becoming an AKC judge.

Lastly, we have several people and clubs that have stepped up to the plate to assist with the AKC Meet the Breeds in New York – Terry Hilliard, Nancy Morabito and Deb Rudert. In Florida, the Mid-Florida Brittany Club, Jay Hallaron, is doing the Meet The Breeds in Orlando in conjunction with the Eukanuba Championship. My thanks to all who are assisting with the events. As AKC monetarily assists the New York Meet The Breeds participants but not Orlando, I request the Board send a check for \$100 to assist Mr. Hallaron and club with their expenses.

Delegate Reports have been sent after every meeting, so please refer to them over the last year for any previous information.

2011 Judge's Education Coordinator Report

Robin Tomasi started off our year by giving a presentation at Fiesta Guadalajara in Meridian Idaho on February 8, 2011. I've been encouraging committee members to get involved and do seminars on their own. Robin has also been working on the technology to include video in the existing presentation, but we are still in early stages.

June found us once again at Hunter Creek Ranch in Metamora, Michigan doing our 3rd annual hands on presentation and field demos. Once again our Brittany folks came through with demo dogs and we had a very successful weekend. Mike Poehler, Teresa Richmond, Dick Lipski and his granddaughter, Dawn Whitcomb, Paul Renius, Ron Auten and the crew brought a good representation of the breed. Mike even brought us an oversize dog so the judges would have a dog to measure. We were the only breed presenting that weekend that had a wicket. We gave all the judges the opportunity to learn how to wicket properly. Our field demonstrations were great and everyone told me that Mike's Gus' water retrieve was better than any that the retrievers did! This continues to be one of our best sources of turning out good judges. Each session lasts an hour and a half with 3 - 4 judges per session, and 4 sessions per day or a total of 8 for the weekend. They get much more time to ask questions and we are able to demonstrate on an actual dog when answering their questions. I think they pay more attention at this type of seminar and come away with a better understanding of a Brittany. We look forward to doing this seminar for a long time to come.

I was unable to attend the summer specialty due my mother's illness and my own. I got the materials to Terry Hilliard and Deb Rudert who volunteered to step in for me. I had a judge signed up for the seminar and two for mentoring, but no one showed up. More disconcerting is the fact that they set up to do a breeder's seminar and not one Brittany person showed up for that either. Deb and Terry were very disappointed to go to all that work for nothing.

In August we were again invited to do the IUP Advanced Institute at Indiana University in Indiana, Pennsylvania. Sue Lehosky was the scheduled presenter, but changed jobs and was unable to get the time off. I put out a plea on the Brittany lists to see if anyone in that area could help out. Once again, Deb Rudert stepped up to the plate. She was assisted by Gina Currier; Gina brought dogs for the hands on portion of the presentation. I very much appreciate Deb and Gina jumping in at the last minute for this seminar, which was well attended. Doug Tighe also did a presentation on August 12th. Their program included field demonstrations, hands on and mentoring at their specialty on the 13th. Doug had contacted me earlier in the year wanting to know what format we used for Metamora in our Sporting Group program. I hope more committee members and mentors will start these types of programs in their areas.

I have had several judges requesting mentoring and some of these signed up to come to Ft. Smith in November because they can get judge's education and the required mentoring. I encourage judge's to do their mentoring at a regional specialty, the summer specialty or the National Specialty where they can see enough dogs to develop an eye for the breed and also be sure that there will be enough dogs entered to qualify under AKC's judging requirement rules.

In 2012 we hope to finally have an updated presentation with video. 2011 has been a tough year for me personally and for some of my committee members. I think we are all ready to say goodbye to 2011. We plan to charge into 2012 with major overhauls of the program while maintaining its present message.

2011 AKC LEGISLATIVE LIAISON AGENDA REPORT MARY JO TRIMBLE

2011 has been a repeat of the last several years with Animal Rights groups pushing legislation in several states. Having met defeat in Illinois two years ago, the HSUS major push this year centered in Missouri and Texas. They were successful in getting a voter referendum passed in Missouri which pitted big cities like St. Louis and Kansas City areas vs the rural areas. The Referendum passed in the cities and failed in the rural areas.

Fortunately, anti-AR groups have been able to get legislators to repeal some of the more restrictive parts of the legislation which would have

been detrimental to responsible breeders. The city vs rural areas will be a continuing theme throughout the US in the years to come. Now HSUS has a move on in Missouri to increase the per cent of the legislative vote to overturn voter referendums. Please be aware of these moves and contact your legislators. We can not sit by and allow them to take away our ability to enjoy, breed, and compete with our dogs and other animals.

I have already outlined the ABC's connection with efforts on our behalf by the US Sportsmen's Alliance. We have also worked closely with Susan Wolf the Sportsmen and Animal Owners Voting Alliance. We have presented Legislator of the Year Awards in Illinois before the Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus for the last two years on their behalf. This gives recognition not only to the Voting Alliance but to the legislators who support us in our respective states. SAVOA also worked tirelessly in the Texas area and got many groups to write letters and call legislators. I appreciate the work and website that SAVOA and Susan do and will continue to work closely with her.

In addition to working with national organizations like USSA, SAVOA, and NAIA who supplies excellent reference material for combating bad legislation, I have been serving as a Director of the Federation for Dog Clubs and Owners in Illinois and the Illinois Federation for Outdoor Recreation. Both of these groups have lobbyists who work to support our interests. I can't tell you strongly enough that every state needs people to serve in similar capacities in their respective states. We must work hand in hand with both state and federal organizations to preserve our future with dogs. I am asking each club to make sure someone is appointed to monitor legislation in your state.

We have a few individuals in the ABC who do this and their information, contacts, and legislative work is certainly appreciated. Keep spreading the word.

I am including the same links that I put in my report last year. Please take the time to visit these sites and find out what is happening in your state. Things happen quickly and you can't let down your guard if we are to succeed.

2011 American Field Liaison Agenda Report

The American Brittany Club has been trying to increase the number of regional trials that advertise their events in the American Field in order to make sure that dogs running in the ABC National Championships and Classics are qualified to receive the title of Champion or Runner-Up Champion if they would win one of our national stakes. A derby placement in an American Field sponsored event qualifies a dog for life as does an adult placement. Regional Clubs that are members of the AFTCA will have win certificates issued to their Amateur handled winners which qualifies them to receive AFTCA Championship titles.

The ABC Secretary has asked clubs to indicate if their regional trials are also American Field sponsored on the ABC Field Trial application blank. The ABC trial reporting form has a place to check if results are also being sent to the AFTCA as well as the AF and AKC. Not as many clubs are members of AFTCA as are now running their trials under the American Field.

A larger proportion of the events NOT run under the AF are Walking trials which does hurt people trying to get win certificates or placements that would make the dog eligible to receive an AF/AFTCA Gun Dog National Champion Title. They still get the AKC National title but not the American Field or AFTCA ones.

For more information on running trials under both the American Field and AFTCA, contact Mary Jo Trimble, ABC Secretary.

Of special note is the new American Field Field Trial Ad Policy which is now in effect. The information shown below was pulled directly from the American Field Publication and is included for all participating clubs' information:

"NEW FIELD TRIAL AD POLICY IN EFFECT" : In an effort to reduce paper usage and maintain current ad rates, we ask that you please remit payment with your ad copy. An additional fee will be assessed to a field trial ad which is not prepaid.

Trial dates that have been scheduled and confirmed for the season may be submitted for inclusion in the Fixture's column to provide an early notice of the club's trial before the formal announcement appears. To comply with the minimum ad requirements, copy should be submitted to the American Field at least 45 days before the start of a trial. "

ABC REGIONAL AKC CLASSICS/ AF CHAMPIONSHIPS

In addition to the regular ABC Classic/Championships, the ABC also sponsors Regional

AKC Classics/ AF Championships in conjunction with several clubs.

Clubs running these events need to follow the guidelines as posted on the ABC Website or contact the ABC Secretary for a copy. Please indicate on the result form that the trial is both an ABC Classic and an American Field Championship. There is a space provided on the ABC/AKC/AF/AFTCA result form. Please use this form to report results. Prior to the event, the current insurance certificate and completed AKC Field Trial application should be sent to the ABC Secretary who will sign and send to the AKC for their approval.

Bird Dog Museum

The new addition to the Bird Dog Museum is under construction and the ribbon cutting is scheduled to take place as part of the Hall of Fame Presentations on Saturday, February 11, 2012.

Brittany contributions are \$137,791.28 as of this writing and are steadily gaining. We should be very proud of this. The top four contributing breeds are German Shorthaired Pointers with \$152,308, Brittanys with \$137,791.28, Springer Spaniels with \$88,207 and Cocker Spaniels with \$42,200. These four breeds far exceed the rest. The total contribution of all the Continental Breeds is \$451,837.86. The total cost of the construction is \$383,482.00 for the entire 6,000 square feet space. So \$451,837.86 minus \$766,964.00 (double the cost of construction for endowment) leaves \$315,126.14 to be collected from the participating breeds to cover endowment. The space occupied by each breed and resulting construction cost has not been computed yet. Brittanys are positioned to get a large portion of the space and a resulting large part of the endowment so we cannot let up on fund raising.

2011 FUTURITY OVERVIEW by Judy Graves, Futurity Secretary

By all measurements, 2011 was a very successful year for the futurity program. At a time when we have seen the economy take its toll on our regional trials, entries and the number of dogs in the program increased over the last two years. Even though total numbers of litters and breeders has declined from the 2006/2008 levels, we can say this past year has seen a marked increase in the number of forfeits paid as well as actual entries. Our participation levels of forfeits paid to pups produced was 45% - up from 37% in years past. Actual entries were a whopping 71% of forfeits paid. Annual averages have been running in the 60% range since I have been keeping records.

Excellence breeds excellence has never been more evident than in this year's breeders program. There were 27 different breeders whose pups captured the 45 placements offered in the three sections. Leading the top of the list was Al & Cindy Cropek from Commeautville, PA. Their breeding of NAGD/DC/AFC High Hopes Fly By Nite x NFC/DC/AFC Gambler's Ace In The Hole produced three winners garnering a total of six placements in the Central & Eastern Regions. The next closest breeder was Tana Kradolier of Belgrade, MT. Two dogs from her litter of Trugritz Sagacious Brier x DC/AFC J.C. Brett Jared O'Dee brought home four placements won at the Central and Western Regions. Tana was the Central Dual Dog breeder and Al and Cindy took the Eastern Dual Dog breeder award home.

An addition to this year's Futurity was the logo hats and shirts that Helen Riggle was responsible for setting up. All regions were offered to pre-purchase very attractive hats and shirts. This was at no cost to the ABC and they went over very well with all the competitors. Helen has agreed to continue to handle the orders in the future.

As we look to next year, we have 86 breeders whelping 102 litters which produced 627 pups. Host clubs and their section managers for next year's program are: Eastern: Maryland Brittany Club, Lou Palazzolo, Central: LaSalle Brittany Club, Paul Katzell and Western: Oregon Brittany Club, Jim House. We wish to thank everyone who expressed an interest in hosting and hope they will continue to come forward.

Changes to the ABC Policy Book Futurity Section Submitted by Futurity Chairman Lisa Pollock

Page 98, 5th paragraph under "Litter Forfeits", change to read:
Late litter nominations will be accepted as late as 180 days from whelping. Late fees are \$30 for 31-60 days, and additional \$30 for 61-90 days, and additional \$100 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be at the discretion of the Futurity Committee. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time. The postmark will determine the fee for late nomination.

Reason: This change will make the policy book consistent with the ABC Host Club Guide and the form in the ABC Magazine. I believe it may have been added by past Chairman Marvin Stout, and never updated.

Page 100, 2nd paragraph under "Dates"

Remove the sentence: "The futurity may be held during the fall or the spring"

Move the other sentence in that paragraph to the end of the first paragraph.

Reason: The first paragraph in that section states that the futurity is to be held during the spring season.

Page 101, 1st paragraph under "Budget"

Change "September 15" to "final forfeit".

Reason: The September 15th deadline was changed last year to Oct. 1st, or final forfeit.

Page 102, 4th paragraph

Remove: "and patches"

Reason: We not long use patches

Page 108, second paragraph, change to read:

The dog must hunt for its handler at all times, at a suitable gun dog range. It must cover adequate ground, but not range out of sight for a length of time that would detract from its usefulness as a class Gun Dog.

Reason: This paragraph appears in 3 places; The Policy Book, The Host Club Guide, and the letter sent to breeders with the Final Forfeit form. All 3 are slightly different. The committee feels this is the way it should be written in all three places.

MAGAZINE COMMITTEE REPORT 2011

The magazine committee assumed the management role for the American Brittany in the latter months of 2010. The first several months were spent enacting a transition to committee management and identifying different issues that needed to be addressed. The main issues that were identified during that period were:

1. Producing the magazine on a regular production schedule.
2. Creating diversity in the content of the magazine to provide interesting articles for all the varied interests of ABC members.
3. Evaluating and monitoring income and expenses involved in producing the magazine.
4. Addressing the issue of our low membership numbers.
5. Review and align the ABC magazine policy with any updated procedures.

1. The magazine presently is on a schedule of being printed by the tenth of the month. The crew at Webster County Printers worked hard with the committee to get us caught up. (We did have a problem with a delay of getting the May issue out on time because of personnel health issues at WCP but that is no longer an issue.) There are still problems with members getting their magazine weeks after they are mailed but almost all of these problems trace back to the U.S. Postal Service and their procedures for mailing under a Periodical Permit.

2. Working towards providing diversity in the content of the magazine the following changes have been introduced.

a. We have an agreement with Rick Smith to reprint articles that he and Sharon Potter write on dog training for other publications for no charge to the ABC.

b. Professional trainer Dave Marshall is writing a series of articles on training cover dogs and hunting dogs in exchange for a quarter page ad for each article submitted.

c. Jessica Hebak a professional walking horse trainer has volunteered to do a series of articles on field trial horses.

We had a change at two positions of contributing editors.

d. Kristi Anglen, after years of service has decided to step down from producing the Action at AKC column. We have a new person Peg Wier who will take over that column starting with the October issue.

e. Wendy Archinal, after years of service had also decided to step down from the Agility, Obedience and Rally column. Carla Simon has taken over that position. Carla is a licensed judge of Agility events and will bring new insight to familiarize members about these events and the training techniques used to prepare for them.

We will be making changes to the old method of listing a lot of statistics that most members did not understand.

f. We have made several attempts to begin a regular veterinary column, but up to this point have not been successful in finding a vet to do it. We will continue to work to achieve that goal.

3. Included in this report is a copy of the financial status report that was prepared in March 2011. This report will be used as a baseline report to track progress on a periodic basis.

a. The numbers that we are concerned with are the cost per member and the advertising income.

b. The cost to supply each member with a magazine for the year is \$19. The ABC receives \$20 per year for dues from a regional club member.

c. The advertising income has decreased ten thousand dollars over the past five years.

d. In order to address these two areas of concern we need to increase the number of ABC members from the all time low of 1800. Increasing the number of members will lower the cost per member expense.

E. To increase the advertising income the magazine has to be published in a timely manner (already accomplished) and the circulation numbers has to be built up to attract commercial advertisers.

4. Several changes have been instituted to work toward increasing the membership rolls of ABC members. Prior to 2011, it had been almost two years since the program that sent information about the ABC along with a membership application to new AKC registered Brittanys was in effect. The ABC had the brochures printed and sent them to a mailing service in Phoenix, Arizona who after obtaining the list of names from AKC and mailed them to potential members. This had cost the ABC a couple of thousand dollars a year. The following are the programs presently in effect.

a. We have signed on a program with AKC called the Parent Club Flier Program. We have an 8x11 flier printed both sides describing the ABC and all of it's activities and a membership application form. The AKC sends this flier out to all Brittanys being registered. The cost of this program was a one time sign up fee of \$150 and a cost of .03 three cents per flier. This price includes printing, handling and postage. In 2010 AKC Brittany registrations numbered 4,834.

b. We have agreements with four publications for reciprocal quarter page ads soliciting membership.

American Field circulation 7,000

Front and Finish circulation 5,000

Pointing Dog Journal circulation 20,000

Field Trial Magazine circulation 7,000

c. Using the above described items that are now in place should create interest in joining the club, but there are other membership issues involving processing, communications, monitoring and retention that need to be addressed in order for this to work.

5. A job that is still on the back burner is the review and updating of the magazine policy to be in synch with the present procedures. We will tackle this task in the coming months and present it to the board for approval.

The members of the magazine committee along with and in cooperation with Robert Gordon and the crew at Webster County Printers have worked long and hard this past year on the magazine and I want to thank them for all their efforts.

2011 National Championship Grounds Liaison (Booneville) For Tom Milam

- The annual financial report was received and approved. In addition, the per-entry charge for the upcoming field trial season is increased by \$1.00 to \$8.00 per entry. Please notify your club treasurers so that they pay accordingly.
- The horse pen problem was discussed. Larry will pursue the cost of repairs to the horse pens with his department and use his best efforts to obtain funds to pay for these repairs. If the State of Arkansas comes up with funds for this project, The BMCA will match the State of Arkansas funds in an amount not to exceed \$3,000.00 for this work. In particular, it is hoped that the BMCA funds can be used to pay for hay and grain racks used in these repairs.
Cleaning out all 22 of the corrals (22hrs) @ \$60.00 per hour = \$1,320.00
Hauling 22 loads of shale (11hrs) @ \$60.00 per hour = \$ 660.00

- Larry reported on other items taking place at the Booneville grounds. Larry also announced that he plans to retire after the Brittany Championship. Larry's replacement is not yet been chosen. The bird release will take place this year as it has in recent years. 2,000 birds will be released on Sept. 19 - 23. However, in addition to the birds released by the State of Arkansas, The Irish Setter Club is paying for an additional release of 600 birds prior to their championship (Oct. 28 - 29), and the Brittany Club will pay for an additional release of 1,000 birds prior to their championship (Nov. 17 - 18). Larry also discussed the field trial calendar which he had forwarded to everyone earlier. No one had any changes or corrections to the calendar. There have been no costs for the birds as yet.
- Unfortunately, it is unusually hot and dry at Booneville. There was some flooding in the early spring and by the time that dried the weather turned hot. As a result, feed strips have not been planted yet. Larry said there should be no problems if they get some rain and cooler temperatures before the first part of Aug.

The fence was finished last week and now course #1 and course #2 are fenced to better keep our dogs safe.

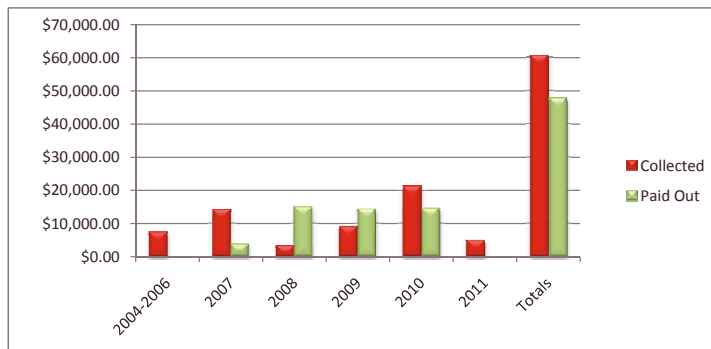

**2011 US SPORTSMEN'S ALLIANCE AGENDA REPORT
LIAISON MARY JO TRIMBLE**

One of ABC's major legislative forces dealing mainly with federal legislation affecting our members is the United States Sportsmen's Alliance based in Ohio. Members may remember their efforts to help preserve field trials on lands purchased with Pittman-Robertson Funds several years ago.

This year, I worked with USSA to help fight bad dog legislation in Texas. I was asked by them to write letters to Texas state legislators and Governor Perry to oppose stringent legislation affecting dog owners. I also supplied them with names of Texas field trialers and dog people that I thought would help with their movement in Texas. They overnighted my letter to the Committee Chair hearing the legislation as his fax machine was evidently turned off, I would suspect due to the overwhelming opposition to the legislation. The bill was defeated in committee only to reappear a few hours later in a hastily called committee meeting in which it was passed. I understand some of the big monied people in Texas poured millions into support of this legislation which was eventually passed and signed by Governor Perry. This is very similar to legislation defeated in Illinois two years ago. While we were not successful this time around, we need to stay vigilant and continue to work with legislative partners nationwide to keep dog breeder legislation from being so restrictive in kennel requirements that home breeder will be unable to continue raising quality animals.

We will stay in contact with the Sportsmen's Alliance and work with them on the federal Pup's Bill whose primary sponsor is Senator Durbin of Illinois. They have helped twice in the past to keep this bill in committee but added sponsors this year increase the danger of passage. Hopefully, the Sportsmen's Alliance will be our voice in Washington looking after our interests. I appreciate all the support from our members in the Postcard campaign sponsored by the Alliance.

**Proposal for the ABC Board of Director's Consideration
Respectfully submitted by Darlene Dow**

I am proposing a yearly trophy for the best lady handler at the ABC National Amateur Gun Dog Championship. The awarding of the trophy will be modeled after the requirements for the best lady handler at the ABC National Amateur All Age Championship.

The following is directly credited to the ABC Policy Book and is the criteria for the lady handler award for the Amateur All Age Nationals established in 1966. **see page 74 of the ABC Policy Book.

The Trophy shall be awarded for participation as a handler in the Amateur Championship. At least three women must participate or the award will not be offered.

It shall be awarded to the woman who does the best job of handling her dog. The dog does not have to place in the stake as the award is made on the merits of the person handling the dog. The original rules for the Best Lady Handlers' trophy appear in Fred White's book. They are the rules for the "Ginger Trophy" that was donated by Mr. & Mrs. Bell who set the requirements for the award.

The present trophy was originally funded by donations from persons at the Nationals with the balance paid by the ABC. The above criteria was established by the Board at the time the trophy was accepted.

Adaptation of the current system is reflected in the rule changes for the women's handler award for the ABC National Amateur Gun Dog Championship, as indicated in BOLD:

The trophy shall be awarded for participation as a handler in the Amateur Gun Dog Championship. At least three women must participate or the award will not be offered.

It shall be awarded to the woman who does the best job of handling her dog. The dog does not have to place in the stake as the award is made on the merits of the person handling the dog. The original rules for the Best Lady Handlers' trophy appear in Fred White's book. The trophy is to be donated in honor of Marge Fitzpatrick a long time Eastern New England Brittany Club member. It shall be called the "Finest Kind" trophy after Marge's Kennel. Marge was a strong and vocal advocate of the Amateur Walking Gun Dog and women handlers. Marge was also the long time keeper of the statistics for the Northeast Gun Dog award.

The present trophy was originally funded by donations from persons at the Nationals with the balance paid by the ABC. The above criteria was established by the Board at the time the trophy was accepted.

Funding for a permanent non-retireable rotating trophy will be solicited from the ABC membership with the keeper trophy to be supplied by the ABC on a yearly basis.

Proposal 2

Highest Placing Bitch at the Gun Dog Nationals.

This trophy shall be called the (open to suggestions) and shall be a non-retireable rotating trophy. The owner of the winner shall receive a keeper plaque or trophy similar to those awarded with other non-retireable trophies.

This award will be made to the owner of the highest placing bitch in the National Gun Dog Championships with any Open placement taking precedence over any Amateur placement.

PROPOSAL TO ELIMINATE THE BRITTANY MAJOR REQUIREMENT FOR FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS


**Petition to Change AKC Qualifications for
Brittany Championships at the
2011 ABC Board of Directors Meeting**

The AKC requirement to gain FC/AFC by earning a 3 point major in a Brittany sponsored regional club AKC trial has been an issue of fairness concern by many loyal ABC members for well over a decade. A committee consisting of Ray Gorman, Gordon Theilen and Tom Burroughs, Chair, was appointed by President Zook on 11/23/2002 to determine whether the ABC requirement handicapped dogs trialing in several areas. Results from every regional club was tabulated by averaging events held in fall of 2001, Spring and Fall of 2002 showed that competing dogs in the entire Western Region and several other areas in the nation were handicapped by the AKC requirement to gain a FC/AFC. It was concluded, the matter should be considered again in the future if it was perceived that the rule led to unfairness to gain championships.

The situation has worsened and has become critical in many areas, particularly the entire Western Region. It is now time for the BOD of the ABC at the 2011 meeting to vote in favor of the needed change due to the unfairness in the AKC rule to gain Brittany championships because:

1. Dramatic reduction in number of Brittany Regional Clubs holding trials. See Appendix
2. The ABC recognizes championships and RU in trials sanctioned by American Field at Brittany Regional Trials. Recognition of gaining majors in other breed AKC pointing trial events should be equally recognized. In many of these other breed events all adult dog stakes require retrieving for a placement which adds additional challenges to gain a major for a Brittany in another breed sponsored trial.
3. Reduction in number of majors. See Appendix
4. Frequent need to open trials to all pointing breeds to gain majors. See Appendix
5. The concentration of hour stakes in the Central/Midwestern parts of the country, decreases entries to hold majors in several regional trials. See Appendix
6. Sky rocketing costs to trial especially for transportation fuel.

7. Number of workers have diminished whereby in some areas two and three clubs join together to put on trial(s) on the same grounds over a week period, in some instances, utilizing the same two or three workers. If death or retirement occurs with so few workers, clubs will no longer be able to function in trialing. See Appendix
8. Because of the AKC restrictive requirement, several have left trialing Brittanyans and gone to other pointing breeds in order to continue a trialing hobby with ability to compete in their local area and gain FC/AFC for their dogs. Others have simply quite trialing. Predictably, others will follow, if this limiting rule to obtain a FC/AFC is not removed for fairness in all regions. See list of names
9. The argument that this would lead to cheap championships is simply not true. See Appendix
10. Other requirements to obtain championships for pointing breed dogs given in the AKC policy handbook remain as written.
11. Time for change is unquestionably now to establish AKC nationwide trialing equality for the Brittany among all pointing breeds and maintain a strong interest in our breed.

SPEARGRASS

By Dr. Pat McInteer

When I graduated from veterinary school at Kansas State University in 1968, I had never heard of speargrass or its effect on dogs. Even a few years after I graduated I talked to a professor of surgery at KSU and he had never heard of it.

Professional dog trainers Roy Jines and Loyd Budd first introduced me to speargrass and its perils while visiting their summer camps near Emmett, Neb. Since that time I have come to know quite a bit about this grass seed and its potentially fatal effect on both hunting and field trial dogs.

Speargrass (or needlegrass) is one of the genus *Stipa* with four species in the continental United States. (1) Porcupine grass and (2) "needle and thread" are found in Canada and south into the central plains, including Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois and Ohio, and south into the plains of Oklahoma, Texas, and throughout the western states. (3) Blackseed needlegrass occurs on the eastern seaboard into the southeast United States, including the major field trial areas. (4) Green needlegrass occurs in the northern plains and southwest to the edge of the Rocky Mountains.

These grasses are native to the prairies of the Midwest and are not found in cultivated pastures; therefore, this grass is only common in areas that have never been plowed.

I sent spears (seeds) from speargrass that I found in native pastures in southeast Nebraska and northeast Kansas to John Rex Gates and Bud Daugherty. John Rex told me they were exactly the same as the speargrass he found in Canada. Bud told me they were different. Since there are three different needlegrasses in Canada and the Midwest, there can be variation on different grounds.

In Nebraska and Kansas, *Stipa* is an early maturing grass that flourishes during wet, cool springs. The grass is a tall whitish-yellow plant that stands out amidst the green of the later developing native grasses. The spears usually fall off during the first two weeks in July in Nebraska, but may fall later. Depending on spring weather patterns, the spears might fall as early as the first of July or as late as the end of July.

Some trainers have been known to advertise that there is no speargrass in the Nebraska sandhills. A few years ago when I asked one of the newer trainers about speargrass he stated that there was none on his grounds. Then he asked me what it looked like. A few years later he told me that he had to postpone training due to the spears. Some trainers are very aware of this noxious grass. Roy Jines, who trained in Canada with his uncle, Tom Lunsford, regards the speargrass as highly dangerous to his dogs, as do the Canadian trainers.

In the chapter entitled "Poisoning and Injury by Plants" in Kirk's Current Veterinary Therapy it is stated that "perhaps the most frequent injuries are those produced from penetration of mucous membranes by grass awns and other floral parts. Members of the genus *Stipa* are most notable among this group owing to the extensive migration of its floral parts in animal tissues following penetration. The awn (seed) and anterior floret of some species possess retrose (posteriorly directed) barbs which prevent backward movement and easy removal from the tissues. These foreign bodies have been removed from abscesses of the mouth, nasum, orbit, post orbitum, mediastinum, pericardium, spinal canal, bursae of joints, and elsewhere."

Since symptoms may not develop for several

months after exposure, it is possible that many dog owners may not be aware of the source of their dog's problem. Every owner and trainer must decide for himself or herself if this is serious enough to consider during training periods.

Gerald DeGroff, founder of the DeGroff Ranch in Brewster, Neb., told me that if hay is cut while the spears are still on the needlegrass that cows will develop sore mouths. The veterinarians of the Sandhills do not report abscess problems in cows. This is probably because the cows do not readily consume the grass except when baled with other grasses. Haying is usually started after the spears have dropped because the other native grasses mature later in the summer.

It is evident that the needlegrass species grow in nearly all regions of field trial activity in the United States. It should be remembered that this is a native species of grass, thus it does not occur in cultivated fields and pastures that have been converted to tame grasses such as fescue, brome and Bermuda. Dangers of exposure are therefore highest in the range land of the Northern, Midwestern and Southwestern prairies.

It should be noted that many other plants have barbed seeds that can produce similar lesions. Foxtail and cheatgrass are two that commonly cause problems in our area of the Midwest. When any of these awns enter through a dog's oral cavity or skin, often an Actinomyces, or nocardia, infection is introduced. Also, other bacterial or fungal infections may be introduced via these foreign bodies. When an infection, either bacterial or fungal, is introduced via these or other foreign bodies, (dust, pollen, other plant material), the disease is far more serious.

(Effective at close of entries for the 2008 National Amateur Gun Dog Championship)

The National Amateur Gun Dog Championship

1. Open to any Brittany six (6) months of age or over which in any preceding year, placed first in the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship for Brittanys or
2. which in the preceding year placed second, third or fourth in the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship for Brittanys, or
3. which during the period from previous years close of entries and the close of entries for the stake in the current year has placed first in an Amateur Gun Dog Stake or Amateur Limited Gun Dog Stake in which at least 13 dogs started in an AKC Licensed Trial held by a Brittany Club, or
4. has placed second in an Amateur Gun Dog or an Amateur Limited Gun Dog Stake or an Open Gun Dog Stake, or Open Limited Gun Dog Stake, when handled by an Amateur in which at least 20 or more dogs started in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club, or,
5. has placed in any hour Gun Dog or Limited Gun Dog Stake in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club and handled by an Amateur in which the following dogs started: 1st place with 13 starters, or 2nd place with 15 starters, or 3rd place with 17 starters, or 4th place with 20 starters, or
6. has qualified for the current year National Open Gun Dog Championship for Brittanys when handled by an Amateur, or
7. A dog winning first place in the National Open Gun Dog Championship when handled by an Amateur will also be qualified for life in the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship.

No dog may run in both the National All Age Championships and the National Gun Dog Championships in the same calendar year.

Any dog trained on the grounds chosen for the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship within 30 days of the start of the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship will be ineligible to compete.

Only persons who, in the judgment of the Field Trial Committee, are qualified as amateurs as defined in Chapter 17, Section 2, of the AKC Field Trial Rules and Standard Procedures for Pointing Breeds, may serve as scouts in the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship Stake.

The National Open Gun Dog Championship

(Effective at close of entries for the 2008 National Open Gun Dog Championships)

1. Open to any Brittany six (six) months of age or over which in any preceding year, placed first in the National Open Gun Dog Championship for Brittanys or
2. which in the preceding year placed second, third or fourth in the National Open Gun Dog Championship for Brittanys, or
3. which during the period from the previous years close of entries to the current year's closing of entries has placed first in an Open Gun Dog or Open Limited Gun Dog Stake in which at least 13 dogs started in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club, or
4. has placed first or second in an Open or Limited Gun Dog Stake in which 20 or more dogs started in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club, or
5. has placed in an Open Gun Dog or Open Limited Gun Dog Stake of one hour or more in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club in which the following dogs started: 1st place with 13 starters, 2nd place with 15 starters, 3rd place with 17 starters, or 4th place with 20 starters.

No dog may run in both the National All Age Championships and the National Gun Dog Championships in the same calendar year.

Any dog trained on the grounds chosen for the National Open Gun Dog Championship within 30 days of the start of the National Open Gun Dog Championship will be ineligible to compete.

3. which during the period from the previous years close of entries to the current year's closing of entries has placed in an All Age or Limited All Age Stake of 30 minutes in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club, when handled by an Amateur, in which the following (or more) dogs started: 1st place with 13 starters, 2nd place with 20 starters, 3rd place with 30 starters, or 4th place with 35 starters, or
4. has placed in any hour All Age or Limited All Age Stake in an AKC Licensed trial held by a Brittany Club and handled by an Amateur in which the following dogs started: 1st place with 13 starters, or 2nd place with 15 starters, or 3rd place with 17 starters, or 4th place with 20 starters, or
5. has qualified for the current year National Open All Age Championship for Brittanys when handled by an Amateur, or
6. A dog winning first place in the National Open All Age Championship when handled by an Amateur will also be qualified for life in the National Amateur All Age Championship.

No dog may run in both the National All Age Championships and the National Gun Dog Championships in the same calendar year.

Any dog trained on the grounds chosen for the National Amateur All Age Championship within 30 days of the start of the National Amateur All Age Championship will be ineligible to compete.

I am the Chairman of the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame since 2009, was a Board of Director of the Brittany Field Trial hall of Fame from 1996 to 2008, Competitor, Director, Contributing Director to the United States Open Brittany Championship Association since 1970, Awarded a Founders Perpetual Membership to the National Bird Dog Foundation, Awarded a Life Patron Membership to the National Bird Dog Foundation, and Gold Level Contributor to the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame Building Fund.

John is the recipient of the NGSPA's prestigious McGinnis Award, was awarded an Honorary Life Membership in the German Shorthaired Pointer Club of America, and was the 2005 recipient of the AKC Lifetime Achievement Award which honors those individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the sport of purebred dogs on a national level.



TRAININ' DOGS

with Rick Smith

A DIFFERENT KIND OF FIX

If there were a way to improve your bird dog's focus and concentration, would you do it? Assuming the dog's training has been solid and the foundation to be a good bird dog has been provided, there is a very simple way to take all your dog's attention and focus it where it does you the most good – on hunting for birds. Sound good so far? What if this fix also came with substantial health benefits, a potentially longer life span, and lower feed costs, plus potentially giving you more hunting time with your dog?

This fix is often a rather hot topic. People view it as black or white and rarely leave any room for gray area. It brings out strong emotions in people both for and against it.

Of course we're talking about having your dog neutered. A bit of vocabulary first: The proper term is castrate for males and spay for females. Neuter refers to, according to Merriam-Webster's, the "neuter gender; one that is neutral a spayed or castrated animal" – castration removes the male's testes, and spaying (or ovariectomy) removes the female's ovaries and uterus; both processes are an act of "neutering" and animal. (By the way, it is "spayed," not "spaded" – spaded is what the backyard gets when you fill in the holes your dog dug trying to get under the fence.) Most people use "neuter" to refer to only the male, but, properly, the act of "neutering" can apply to either sex. From now on, that's how we'll refer to it, instead of saying "neutering or spaying."

Before we go into the reasoning behind this fix, we'd like to address the major issue that seems to come up whenever neutering is mentioned. In order to do that, we've got to do something we normally try not to do, and that's throw a ten dollar word at you: anthropomorphism. It means attributing human emotions, feelings, and thoughts to animals, and it really fits this scenario. Animals have a completely different moral code than humans. While many folks cringe at the mere thought of depriving their dog of his "family jewels," the dog really doesn't care one way or the other. The dog has no emotional attachment to his testicles, and the bitch won't miss her ovaries. We find that the human is much more attached to them than the dog is.

The number one fallacy we hear when neutering is suggested is this: "My dog will get fat/lazy/won't hunt as hard if I have it fixed." This is complete nonsense. A fixed dog will utilize its feed better, since it won't be expending energy focusing on breeding. Too much food and not enough exercise are what make a dog fat and lazy.

The other claim, that a fixed dog won't have as much drive to hunt, is also untrue. A neutered or spayed dog will be able to focus 100 percent of its energy on finding birds, rather than 75 percent on birds and 25 percent marking its territory and looking for a mate. The drive to hunt comes from having their prey chase drive developed during the training process, and from the genetic material given by the parents.

A fixed dog will fight less, handle more easily, and be less territorial than an intact dog. A dog that is looking for fights and marking its territory is wasting hunting time to do it, and that in turn wastes your time.

A major benefit to having your dog fixed is health-related. There are some big health risks that come with intact reproductive organs, such as mammary cancer and pyometria in females, and testicular cancer in males. Additionally, many males have an occasional slight greenish-yellow discharge from the end of the penis, and this usually disappears once the dog is neutered.

A female that has been spayed doesn't require the constant vigilance that an intact female does when she's in season. You also don't have to ban her from the house because she's bleeding on the furniture and the carpet. If she's spayed, she can be hunted all season, giving you almost an extra year of hunting time over the course of her life. A female in season is out of commission for a few weeks to a month. Inevitably, this happens right in the middle of hunting season or, even worse, right before your big bird hunting vacation trip.

There can be no unwanted pregnancies from a spayed female or a neutered male. Dogs aren't selective about what other breeds they mate with, as long as they get to mate. Often, the resulting puppies end up in a shelter somewhere or get dumped along a country road. It is estimated that 90 percent of all dogs that end up in the pound or shelter don't leave there alive. If all dogs were well-trained and the majority of them

were fixed so there would be no unwanted pregnancies, we'd have no need for animal shelters. We can't find a downside to that logic.

Here are a few reasons we hear for keeping a dog or bitch intact: "She's such a good dog, we want a puppy out of her before she gets too old." What happens to the rest of the litter? Do you know the costs and time involved in raising them? Believe us when we say it's much less expensive to go back to the breeder you got her from and get another pup out of similar lines. Let the breeder deal with the headaches – just enjoy your new puppy.

The next best excuse for not spaying the bitch is, "We want our children to experience the miracle of birth." There are much better ways to do this – and it's not always such a miracle when things go wrong (and they do go wrong). How will you explain to a sobbing five-year-old that bitches eat their own pups? Or that the stillborn one is not going to breathe? Or the deformed puppy with the cleft palate has to be put to sleep?

The third and most frustrating excuse is, "I figured I'd make a little money off her by having some pups." Most responsible breeders don't make much, if anything, from a litter. If you figure the expenses involved, including the stud fee (and please don't breed her to just anything with registration papers that say he's the right breed!) plus getting appropriate health clearances such as hip and elbow radiographs to check for canine hip dysplasia and a CERF number to be sure there are no hereditary eye problems, then add the vet bills for dewclaws and vaccinations, plus a brucellosis test for the bitch before she's bred...you see where we're going with all this.

Next, add in all the hours you will spend on the phone and in person with potential

puppy buyers. You'll be lucky to make two or three dollars an hour, if that. And that's also assuming all the pups are sold and gone at seven to eight weeks old. What will you do with the leftovers? And don't forget to add in the feed costs.

Stud dogs are very costly, at least the successful ones are. They have to be out there competing and winning, plus be advertised. All this costs many thousands of dollars and many thousands of hours of time and travel.

Very few people make any money by standing a stud dog. Again, it's cheaper to pay stud fee and let someone else do all the promoting.

Let's turn to reasons to keep a dog or bitch intact. First of all, remember that once a dog or bitch is fixed, there's no turning back. If you've got an exceptional animal, think carefully before making that decision, and get some opinions from other breeders as well. Be objective when evaluating your dog; don't be "kennel blind." All dogs have faults. Be able to see them and then breed to eliminate them in succeeding generations.

If you've got a structurally correct dog or bitch that also has the talent to be better than average, you may want to compete. Most registries do not allow neutered or spayed dogs to show in conformation

classes, so take that into account. Most field events have no restrictions, so you can still participate there, but check with the organization that holds the events you want to compete in just to be sure. If you do plan to breed, do your research and know your dog's pedigree inside and out. Talk to well-respected breeders and get their opinions of your dog. Find out what bloodlines cross best, and prove your dog's worth by putting a title or two on it. That in itself gives greater value to any pups produced.

If you decide to neuter, when should you do it? The earlier in life, the better. This decreases the risk of health issues related to the reproductive system. Your veterinarian will be able to guide you as far as when your individual dog is ready. There's an old wives' tale about letting a female go through one heat cycle before spaying. It's just that – an old wives' tale. There is no valid reason to wait that long and, in fact, the occurrence of the various cancers in bitches is greatly reduced if the neutering is done before the first estrus – heat – cycle.

But a dog can be fixed at any age. Usually, even brood bitches are spayed once they've finished producing, again for health reasons. The recover time is minimal and doesn't hurt the dog other than some localized discomfort. Older dogs may retain

some of the behaviors because they've become habits, such as a male lifting his leg. It's still in the best interest of the dog to neuter.

How do we decide whether or not to neuter our dogs? It's our opinion that fewer than 10 percent of all dogs of all breeds should be bred. Why? Rule number one is this: Is the dog an outstanding representative of its breed, compared to the breed standard and also to working ability? If not, why pass anything less than the best along to future generations? Even big breeders with kennels full of dog have to ask themselves these questions: Is what I'm considering breeding going to be better than what I already have? Will the resulting pups be potentially better than anything I've bred yet? If the answer is no, then that dog should not be bred. A true breeder is constantly trying to improve the breed.

Both of us have good hunting dogs that work for a living – and by far, the majority of these are neutered. Being a good hunting dog is not enough reason to be bred. Breed the best to the best, rather than breeding good to average and hoping for a miracle.

He was smooth when I bought him...

If I had a dollar for every time I heard this phrase, let's just say that I would have a lot of dollars! There is a reason that gaited horses have become the first choice of Field Trialers...they are smooth! When you are going to be in the saddle all day, you want a smooth and comfortable ride. What I have seen time and time again is that people purchase horses that are smooth gaited and after they have had the horse for a while, the gait goes away and I see bodies bouncing up and down in the gallery.

Just like there are some people that are naturally more talented than others, there are some horses that are naturally more talented when it comes to their gaits. There are the horses that will be smooth no matter how they are ridden, bitted, or shod. These are the rare diamonds, if you find one keep it! Then there are the others who can be just as well-gaited, they just need the correct tools. Before you can determine what might help your horse improve his gaits, it is first important to understand the different gaits and identify what gait your horse should be performing.

The Pace: This is the undesired gait that horses often default to when they become lazy, lose collection, or are shod incorrectly.



The pace is a two-beat lateral gait where the front and rear leg on the same side will hit the ground at the exact same time. This gait has a suspension phase where for a moment all four hooves are off the ground at the same time. This suspension phase is what causes the bounce that the rider will feel, similar to the trot which is a two-beat diagonal gait.

have a shorter stride/faster foot fall than a Running Walk and the Rack can be performed correctly at higher speeds. A true Racking horse will have no headshake while in motion.

The Rack: The Rack is a smooth four-beat gait where each hoof will hit the ground at a different time. The legs move in lateral pairs with the rear hoof hitting the ground well before the front hoof. A rack will typically



The Flat Walk and Running Walk: These two gaits are true only to the Tennessee Walking



Horse. The difference from the Flat Walk to the Running Walk is a lengthening of stride and an increase in speed. The Flat Walk is a four-beat gait where each hoof will hit the ground at a different time and only one is off the ground at any given time. The horse should be loose in his motion with the hind foot coming well over front hoof print, this is called overstride. The ideal overstride of the TWH should be 8-15 inches. The horse should shake his head and neck in time with his footfall pattern. If he's not nodding, he's not walking!

Amble/Stepping Pace: The Amble or Stepping Pace is most closely related to a Rack, it is still a four-beat gait, however the foot fall is not as well defined. The rear hoof will hit the ground just before the front hoof. This gait is usually still smooth, however the horse will not have a lot of speed in this gait. Usually these horses will begin to pace if pushed too fast.



Fox Trot: The Fox Trot is unique to the Missouri Fox Trotter and differs from the other gaits as it is a diagonal gait. This means that the opposite legs move together, ie. left front and right rear. It is a four beat gait where the front foot of the diagonal pair lands before the hind foot.

These are the most common gaits, sometimes they go by other names depending on the breed that is performing them. The key to remember is that the goal is a smooth horse. For example, while a Tennessee Walker is most known for the Running Walk they can also perform the Rack or Amble. Outside of the show ring this is perfectly acceptable as long as the rider is comfortable.

Once you have identified what gait your horse should be performing, the next step is to identify what is preventing him from achieving this gait. There are several factors that can affect a horse's way of going. Ask yourself, if he was smooth when I bought him what has changed? Did you change his bit? His shoes? Is your riding style hindering his ability? These can all affect your horse's performance. If he does not like the bit, he won't set his head and he will not gait correctly. If he is not shod properly he will absolutely not be able to perform the correct gait. If you are not sure how to set his head or use your body to aid him, then your horse is at a disadvantage and will not reach his full ability.

Remember, if it ain't broke don't fix it. If your horse is smooth when you buy him, find out what kind of bit is being used. Find out how the horse is shod and instruct your farrier to keep those angles and lengths. Ask the seller how to best ride the horse. Being educated is the key. Find a professional, ask questions, watch videos to learn about the gaits. You can never stop learning!

trial sport as well as trade stories with the "oldtimers".

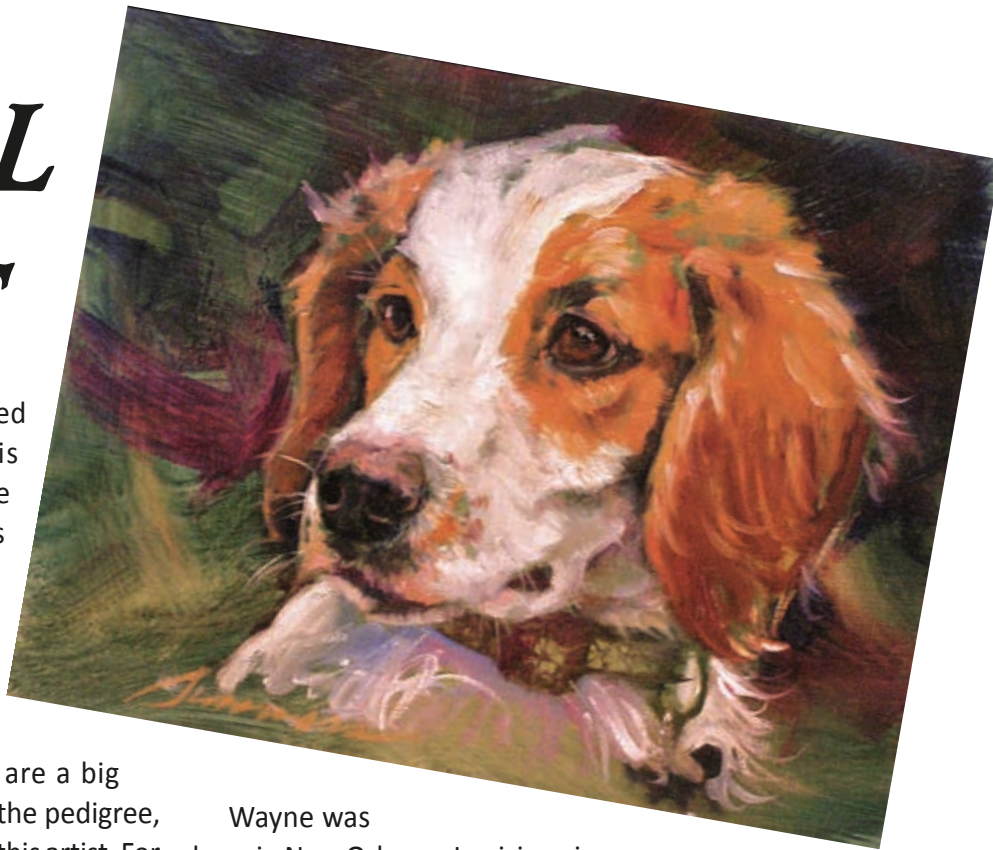
Lloyd is survived by a brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Bob and Patty Vincent of

Perfect Precision: Taking Obedience to a Whole New Level

Obedience trials demonstrate the usefulness of dogs as companions to humans. Developed in the 1930s, it is one of the AKC's oldest events. Obedience trials showcase dogs that have been trained and conditioned to behave well in the home, public places, and in the presence of other dogs. Competing requires control, patience and teamwork.

Teams are evaluated in comparison with the judge's mental Standard of Perfection. This "perfect picture" combines the utmost in willingness, enjoyment and precision on the part of the dog with naturalness, gentleness and smoothness on the part of the handler.

When I watched my obedience teacher, Jackie Hastie, achieve a score of 199 with her Golden Retriever, it was like eye candy. There was no question of whether the dog would perform its job. It was confident and drove into position at every step. Handler and dog were perfectly precise, despite the distractions at the crowded dog show. The dog heeled close to her left side without swinging wide, lagging behind, forging ahead, or crowding which would interfere with her movement, his tail wagging throughout. Every time the judge called "halt", she stopped and her dog sat straight and promptly in the heel position and froze until moving forward again on the judge's order. Teams like that are inspirational.

Every obedience trial venue presents its own challenges. For example, I competed at a trial where the ring was next to the hot dog stand. Additionally, outdoor trials may feature birds and gophers, or even thunder and lightning. I remember watching a great team compete in Utility, with the fire alarm ringing throughout. In all cases, the dog should remain focused on its job.

While Brittanys aren't seen as much as more popular breeds, the sport of obedience shows off Brittanys' focus, training, biddability and teamwork. Competing in AKC obedience and rally offers the unique opportunity to showcase the versatility of Brittanys who title in show, field, agility, rally and obedience, by competing alongside other breeds.

Levels of Obedience Competition

There are 3 main levels of competitive obedience: Novice, Open, and Utility (plus several optional titling classes).

In the obedience results, "A" teams are beginners and "B" teams are experienced and have previous titles. In any class, a perfect score is 200. For each qualifying score (or "leg"), the team must earn at least 50% of the points for each exercise, with a total of at least 170 points. 3 legs completes a title.

1) NOVICE

- Dogs may earn the Companion Dog (CD) title by performing these exercises:
 - Heel On Leash & Figure 8 – shows the dog has learned to watch its handler and adjust its pace to stay with the handler
 - Heel Free – the dog heels off leash (while the handler is silent)
 - Stand For Examination – the dog must stay in the standing position as its handler walks away. The judge lightly touches the dog's head, body and hindquarters (similar to the conformation ring)
 - Recall – the dog comes to the handler on one command
 - Long Sit (1 min.) – the dog must remain sitting in the presence of other dogs while the handler stands across the ring
 - Long Down (3 min.)

2) OPEN

- Dogs may earn the Companion Dog Excellent (CDX) title by performing more complicated exercises, when cued by either voice or hand signal.
- Exercises include:
 - Heel Free & Figure 8 – same as novice, but off leash
 - Drop on Recall – the dog must come to the handler when called from across the ring. On the

handlers command or signal, the dog drops into a down position and then on command or signal, resumes coming to its handler

- Retrieve on Flat – the dog retrieves a dumbbell on command
- Retrieve over High Jump – the dog must jump over the jump, retrieve the dumbbell, jump over the jump again, and return the dumbbell to the handler
- Broad Jump – shows the dog is able to jump over an obstacle that is twice as long as the dog is tall
- Long Sit (3 min.) – similar to novice, but the position must be held longer, and the handler is out of the dog's sight
- Long Down (5 min.) – dog must remain in the down position while the handler is out of sight



3) UTILITY

- The highest level is Utility, where dogs can earn UD (Utility Dog), OTCH (Obedience Trial Championship), UDX (Utility Dog Excellent), OM# (Obedience Master) and OGM (Obedience Grand Master) titles.

- Exercises include:
 - Signal Exercise – shows the dog's ability to understand and respond to the handler's signal to stand, stay, down, sit and come. No voice commands are given; only hand signals are allowed
 - Scent Discrimination – shows the dog's ability to find the handler's scent among a pile of articles
 - Directed Retrieve – proves the dog's ability to follow a directional signal to retrieve a glove and promptly return it to the handler
 - Moving Stand & Exam – the dog must heel, stand and stay as the handler moves away. The dog must stay and accept an examination by the judge and return to the handler on command
 - Directed Jumping – the dog must go away from the handler, turn and sit. Then, the dog must clear whichever jump its handler indicates and promptly return to its handler

To achieve an Obedience Trial Championship (OTCH), dogs must place 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th in Open B or Utility B, earning points according to the AKC schedule. To complete the OTCH, the dog must win:

1. 100 points
2. 1st place in Utility B with at least 3 dogs in competition
3. 1st place in Open B with at least 6 dogs in competition
4. An additional 1st place under the conditions of 2 or 3 above
5. All three 1st placements are under 3 different judges

For the UDX title, the dog must pass both Open and Utility exercises on the same day 10 times.

Master points require a score of 190 or better (in Open B or Utility B), according to the schedule of points. When a dog accumulates 200 points, it earns the OM title. OM titles will be awarded for nine levels and upon completion of the 10th level, the dog will be awarded the OGM (Obedience Grand Master) title.

Translating the Titles

For example, CH OTCH Chilcote's Credit Check UDX14 OM8 JH AX AXJ "Checkers" (CH S Chilcote Creditor's Portfolio ex CH Chilcote Sandic By Design, O: Kathy Sweet) is an Obedience Trial Champion who has met the requirements for the Utility Dog Excellent 14 times AND has met the Obedience Master requirements 8 times, well on his way to becoming an Obedience Grand Master. Incidentally, Checkers has won the ABC National Obedience HIT 3 times.



Rally

Rally is a companion sport to obedience, where the dog and handler complete a course designed by a judge. Once the judge tells the handler to begin, the team moves at its own pace through 10 - 20 stations, depending on the level. Each station has a sign providing instructions.

For example, when the team reaches the sign pictured here, the team heels in a tight 360° turn to the handler's left. At every step, the dog should be perfectly aligned with the handler's direction, requiring the dog to swing its rear quarters to stay in position.

The course is always different, and remembering the course may be a challenge in itself. Rally presents a great opportunity to start competing with young dogs, as scoring is not as rigorous as traditional obedience, competition is more similar to training and the handler can talk to their dog as much as they like.

Rally obedience has 4 levels:

- Novice (RN)
- Advanced (RA)
- Excellent (RE), and
- Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE#).

To earn the RAE title, the dog must pass both Advanced and Excellent exercises on the same day 10 times.

Carol Toms, a CKC Rally Judge, recently won the Rally Prize at the 2011 Canadian National Brittany Specialty, with her 17 month old CH Islandview Holds All the Aces RN "Hunter". She appreciates Rally's friendly approach, which allows extra commands and praise. Her proudest accomplishment was when she and her Cairn Terrier achieved their CDX, which was quite unexpected. She laughs to recount her most embarrassing moment with the same dog, when he failed every exercise, throwing the dumbbell in the air and rolling on it and watching her heel by herself, thereby incurring a perfect score of zero. Carol hopes to train Hunter to Utility level. While he'd prefer birds and gets bored with repetition, Carol keeps training fun. She will ensure he has a solid foundation in obedience before training in the field.

Getting Started in Obedience

If you're interested in trying obedience consider taking a class, or joining a local dog training club. If you don't end up competing, you hopefully had some fun, met some new friends, and strengthened the bond between you and your dog.

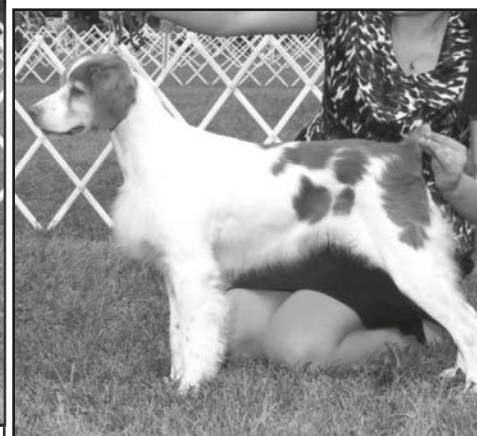

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped.** A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.

- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** Late fees are: \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for any nomination received more than 90 days after whelping. No nominations will be accepted past 180 days of whelping. Additional late fees may be imposed from time to time by the ABC Board of Directors. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
