

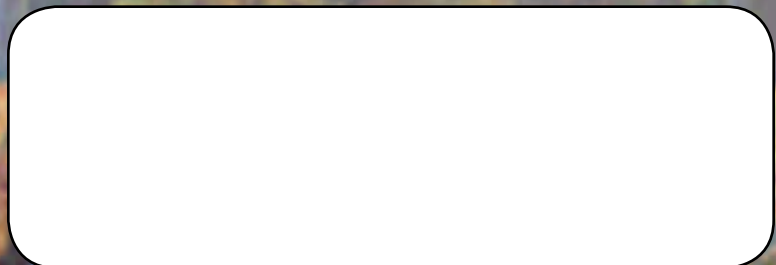

Janet was born on May 4, 1948, in Kingman, Kansas to Clarence and Ellen (Jowett) Lowry, who preceded her in death. Janet passed away Wednesday, October 17, 2012, at the age of 64.

Janet met James O. Chase Jr. while in college in Oklahoma. They were later married and moved to Deerfield, IL. Jim preceded her in death, on April 28, 2012.

She is survived by a sister Brenda (Earl) Weak of Pleasanton, California, a sister-in-law and brother-in-law Julie Ann and Doug Wright of Dallas, Texas, and several nieces and nephews.

Janet was a CPA with Veatch Rich and Nadler Accounting Firm in Deerfield, IL, until her retirement when she & Jim moved to their new home in Red Bud, IL. She was a member of the Illinois CPA Society and the National AICPA Oversight Committee.

I met Janet in the 1980's at Rend Lake. She and Jim became members of several Brittany Clubs: The Illinois Brittany Club, LaSalle, Southern Illinois, The Illinois Championship Association, and Prairie State Championship Association. In most of those clubs they played an active roll. Janet was diligent in her duties as a Road Guard looking for lost or stray dogs from the trials. She served as Field Trial Secretary and helped with every chore imaginable in a trial. From the 80's, she served most capably as Treasurer of the American Brittany Club. Her calm demeanor and efficient abilities earned her the respect of everyone she came in contact with.

At the October 2011 Illinois trial, I found Janet in the middle of the haul road at Pyramid State Park after she had taken a fall from her horse. After being rushed to the hospital in Sparta, she was taken to St. Louis where further tests revealed a tumor on her brain. She fought this dread condition for a little over a year and endured the pain of that as well as losing Jim in April of this year. She was one brave lady.

In reading the comments on the email chat lists, I had to note some of the comments made about Janet. Most people commented that Jim and Janet were always together and now they will be reunited again. Another said, "She

gave of her time and talents in a totally unselfish manner for the American Brittany. Let her life be a guide for others to follow." One lady mentioned how they arrived from Canada with their new 3 month old daughter at a trial in Michigan and Janet made them welcome and presented them a gift for the new baby. Janet always took the kids at trials under her wing and invited them to ride with her as she road guarded.

A Redbud resident said that when they came into their place of business, they were always together and always seemed so happy. They loved their fishing trips to Idaho and Argentina. Their efforts at the Illinois Paw Paw walking trial which help pay for several

American Field Championships was known throughout the land as a major field trial success story.

Many a newcomer to the sport started out at the Paw Paw trial and mentioned how Jim and Janet helped hook them to the sport. When a terrible wind storm hit our home and power was out for weeks, they made the trip to Carterville to take things from our freezer to theirs to preserve things for us.

We can talk about the great dogs they owned such as Trademark. We can talk about Jim and Janet as Brittany Field Trial Hall of Famers and Janet as an ABC Hall of Fame member, we can talk about the financial efforts together they gave to the sport and the new wing at Grand Junction, but the legacy she leaves

is one of a pleasant smile for everyone, her desire to make everyone feel welcome to the sport, and the calm reserve, dignity, and most of all her integrity that she displayed at all times in her unselfish dedication to the sport of field trialing and the love of her Brittany and Brittany family.

God bless you Janet and thank you for being a part of our lives and sport. You will be missed and may your legacy live on as an example we should all follow.

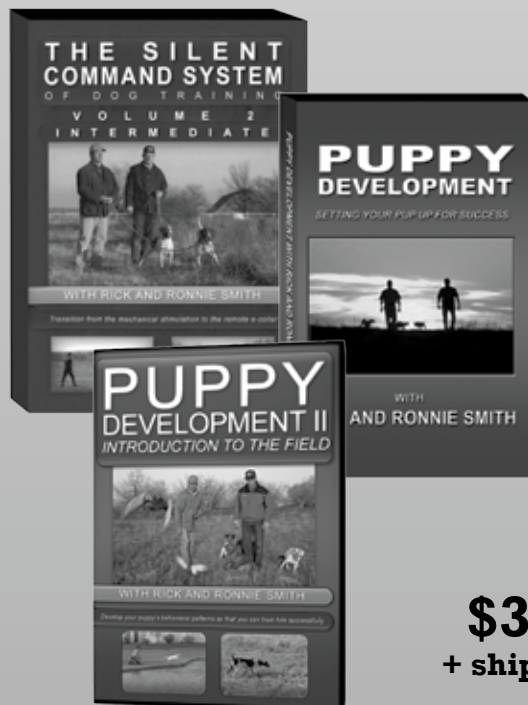

TRAININ' DOGS

with Rick Smith

Developing the Instinctive Retrieve

Bird hunting with a stylish and well-trained pointing dog is a thing of beauty. And if that same dog will also retrieve birds to hand, the picture is complete. Awhile back, we talked about encouraging puppies to retrieve, but what about the adult dog? While many dogs have an innate desire to bring the game to hand, there are dogs that, for a variety of reasons, want nothing to do with a bird once it's dead. They'd rather move on and find more live birds; dead birds hold no interest for them.

If your dog is one that doesn't seem interested in a bird once it's dead or just hasn't been exposed to retrieving, there are ways of encouraging it to want to pick up birds. Before we go further, we'd like to touch on the topic of the trained retrieve,

"Hmm... what's this?" Note how Rick has no tension in the checkcord and is allowing the dog to examine the bird.



also known as force-fetch. This column isn't going to be about that process, although we are strong advocates of it and believe in it for a number of reasons. A force-fetch program is valuable because it develops more than a reliable retrieve; its main value is that it teaches a dog to handle training pressure. The dog learns to deal with pressure and how to turn it off, and this spills over into all the rest of the training we do.

A great trainer, the late Clyde Morton holds the record for winning the National Championship at Ames Plantation in Tennessee, taking home the prize 11 times. That's a record likely to stand forever. These are open to all ages of pointers and setters that are bred to cover ground, run big, and head for the horizon when turned loose.



Rick Smith has spent a lifetime breeding, training, and handling National Championship bird dogs. His highly popular training seminars teach the "Silent Command System" to dog owners world-wide. During hunting season, Rick can be found on the Mariposa Ranch in south Texas.

Sharon Potter has a strong background in animal behavior, and has been training both horses and dogs for many years, with several National titles to her credit. She is an avid hunter and archer, and in her spare time is working on the first of a series of books on bird dog training with Rick Smith.

They are required to be absolutely steady to both wing and shot; but no birds are killed, and because of that, no retrieving is needed or required. Yet Morton took all his winning dogs through a force-fetch program even though they would never be asked to pick up a bird in competition. Why? Because he felt it made them "his" and added a level of control to the handling he did in the field. The retrieving part was just a bonus.

The more we can encourage a dog to retrieve before starting a formal retrieving program, the more easily the dog will learn it. Beginning with puppies makes it even easier because puppies all seem to have that innate desire to chase things and pick them up.

Adult dogs that haven't had any play retrieving encouraged can be more of a challenge, but they'll usually catch on with some help.

The real challenge is an adult dog that's been hunting for a few seasons without doing any retrieving. These are the ones that usually benefit most from a formal force-fetch program. We don't take our pointing dogs through a formal program until they're at least a year old and have one hunting season under their belts. If they show a natural tendency to retrieve, we encourage and develop it; but we like their first season to focus on finding birds.

How do we develop the natural retrieve? By Using prey drive the dog already has. Some dogs will run to a shot bird, sniff it for a second or two, and leave it, looking for something live to point. Other dogs may mouth the bird or pull a few feathers and pick at it. Both behaviors can be built upon to develop a natural retrieve. Usually, the dog hasn't been in many situations where

it's actually "caught" the bird and had time to check it out. They pounce on it and aren't sure what to do next.

This is where we show them their options: Letting a dog mouth a bird in preparation to pick it up is a good thing; letting it bite and rip it to pieces is not. It's important to note the difference because coming down hard with a correction when a dog has never picked up and held a bird can create problems down the road. You don't want the dog to think it isn't supposed to touch a bird, and a harsh correction at the wrong moment tells a dog that picking up birds is bad.

How do we set up the situation to show the dog the difference? Use a checkcord so you have some control of the dog, and toss a dead bird (with no blood on it, since blood tends to encourage chewing) for the dog to retrieve. Usually, an inexperienced dog will run to it because they're excited but not pick it up. The first time or two, let the dog get a good sniff and maybe even pull a few feathers. Then start throwing the bird and let the dog go to it, but immediately and gently pull the dog back to you. It's important that you don't make a sharp correction with the checkcord, because the dog may relate the correction to the bird.

Try to keep the dog's focus on the bird. The point of this exercise is to tease the dog with the bird and make the dog crazy with wanting it. After a few tosses, the dog realizes you aren't going to let it stay by the bird, and it will start trying to bring the bird along when you use the checkcord to reel the dog in.

Try to make the experience as exciting as you can for the dog, especially if it has shown no real interest before in picking up a bird. You may even want to use a bird with the flight feathers pulled and let the dog chase it a bit. It's important to not overdo this so the dog



loses interest. Always leave 'em wanting more. You may have to repeat this over a few days. Eventually, the dog will start picking up the bird because it wants the bird, and picking it up is the only way to have it.

Now that the dog has started picking up the birds, what happens next? First of all, don't immediately grab at the bird as soon as the dog gets to you. Use your checkcord and gently keep the dog's head up so it can't put the bird on the ground to chew. Pet the dog and let it enjoy its prize for a few seconds. If the dog dropped the bird upon return, that's fine for now; it can be finished up during the trained retrieve. On the other hand, some dogs don't want to give the bird up, and how you handle this sets the tone for future deliveries.

Never pull a bird from a dog's mouth: This encourages a game of tug-of-war and can lead to a hardmouthed dog.

You'll need to teach a release, and there are two easy ways to accomplish this: First, reach under the dog's head to the jaws, with your palm facing up. Using your thumb and middle finger, push the lower lips in over the bottom teeth and pinch them down, opening the dog's mouth. The dog will usually release the bird, although it may take some pressure. Another method is to take your hand, palm down, and touch the dog on the shoulder. Slide your hand down the dog's back toward the flank area. Using your fingers, reach under the flank to the fold of loose skin connecting the belly to the flank, and gently lift the dog's hindquarters by the skin. The dog will drop whatever is in its mouth. Use caution when doing this, as the dog may swing its head around to nip at the flank area. If you repeat this often enough, the touch on the shoulder becomes a cue that tells the dog to release because it knows the flank comes next.

During all of this, never make a harsh correction. That will come back to haunt you later on because the dog will relate anything negative you do to having a bird in its mouth. And that's just like a gunshy dog: It's a man-made problem that is much easier to prevent than to cure. If, after trying all of this your dog isn't willing to pick up birds, you'll need to move ahead into a trained retrieve/force-fetch program. We do it regardless of a dog's natural retrieve desire because it gives us a cue to use for retrieving, just like "here" or "whoa".

None of this training takes the place of a serious trained-retrieve program, but it certainly encourages a dog to start picking up birds, and can be a big step toward a finished bird dog – one you can be proud to hunt over. It's not just the stylish pointing that makes the memories; sometimes it's the retrieve.

CHANGE IN Tri-Tronics AWARD DATES

The TriTronics Shooting Dog Award points year has been changed from May 1 –April 30th to July 1 - June 30th. The TriTronics Award was created at a time when the Nat'l Gun Dog Championship was held in May with the original dates chosen so the winner could be announced and celebrated at that time. The Nat'l Gun Dog Championship has now moved to the fall and, more importantly, there are now 1 hr OGD events that start the last weekend in April and end the first week of May. This creates confusion with contestants as to whether placements go toward current year or following year tabulations. By establishing the new points year from July 1 to June 30th, the award start and end dates move to a time of year where there is no trial activity whereby eliminating any confusion.

NOTE! For the current points year, the dates are May 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. This will be a one-time scenario as we transition to the new dates.

None Held Back and Other Bird Dog Stories

SATIN DOLL Part One

Ed Paine drove the old ford 350 alone through the Thanksgiving night. He pulled two horses and four pointers in the gooseneck trailer. Until he got a phone call a week before, there had been four horses, eleven bird dogs.

“Ed, I’ve quit the game, sold my dogs to Cal Clarke out at Lubbock. He’ll be calling you about shipping them. I’m sorry.”

The message had hit Ed Paine like a sledgehammer. His best customer, owner of the heart of his trial-dog string, had quit him with no warning. In the seconds it took to tell it, he’d destroyed Ed’s livelihood. With just four dogs left, there was no way he could cover the nut, the relentless expenses of “going down the road,” making the field-trials week by week from August through March. It was the only life he’d known since he was twenty-five, and now he was fifty. He’d sold two horses in desperation. Their proceeds would keep him afloat through the Continental in January. Then he’d be through, out of business...unless he could pick up new customers. The chances of that he reckoned as slim; he’d never won any popularity contests. Most folks in the field-trial game would enjoy his misfortune, he figured.

He watched the glowing dials for oil pressure and engine temperature. On the inclines the diesel’s chatter changed to an ominous rattle. He thought of the thin tread on the trailer tires, wondered if they’d pass inspection at the weigh station coming up. Maybe it would be closed, this being Thanksgiving and eighteen-wheelers scarce on the interstate. He pulled off at a truck stop for information and a break from staring down the headlight beams into the mist that ate the light.

He filled the tanks with diesel and his thermos with coffee. To his relief the clerk reported the weigh station closed. He paid from the roll of bills that yesterday had been two horses.

“I wouldn’t show that roll if I was you, pardner,” she said. He thanked her, returned awkwardly her kind smile. On the road again, he reckoned to make Paducah by three the next afternoon, leaving him just enough time to get to the drawing.

His best dog, Satin Doll, stood tenth in the points, earning her a place in the Quail Championship Invitational, the three-day contest for the top twelve. She’d go down an hour on Saturday, another hour Sunday at a different time of day. Then the judges would call back the ones they liked best for two-hour heats on Monday. They’d pick the winner considering all four hours. He’d won it once, his biggest thrill; he might win this year with Doll, but it wasn’t likely, for she was ten, showing her age, and the field was strong, the best of the best. But the chance of winning kept him from total despair.

He listed his worries as he rolled: tires, engine, running lights, the chance that Doll would come in heat and be disqualified (she was way overdue, bust since she was ten, he expected she’d probably ceased to ovulate). Mostly he worried about the horses; he was down to his favorites, the little bay mare, the black gelding; his toughest and best, but not enough to get him comfortably through three days of the Invitational. A fresh handling horse was essential. His scouting deal with fellow pro Billy Kahn meant he must ride two braces a day, and he’d like to ride more. He would try to rent or borrow an extra horse to spell his two.

Friday dawned gloomy. A steady rain kept the wipers clapping. But the traffic was light, the road smooth, the bluegrass farm country inviting. The ugly billboards, truck stops and fast food restaurants angered him. He hated the sprawl some called progress, loved the remote, uncrowded north country where he’d spent every July and August for twenty-five years. He’d miss that most of all.

He came off at a cloverleaf to a McDonald’s for a sausage biscuit and coffee, let the dogs out one by one to stretch and empty in the grass beside the parking lot. The manager came out to confront him, hands on hips, belly over belt, but when he caught the steel in Ed Paine’s eyes, he thought better of it and turned in retreat. Ed checked the truck’s oil, added two quarts from a case in the trailer’s tack room. Then he rolled west again.

He made Paducah at 2:30, took the familiar exit south to the trial grounds. The twin smokestacks of the TVA power station loomed up on the right, their tops shrouded in the hovering clouds; on his left steam spewed from roof vents of the immense nuclear plant and mingled with the mist, reminding him of a dream of hell. Then he saw the familiar old ammo bunkers, leftovers from the days these grounds were the Kentucky Ordnance Works. They served now as stables and kennels. Dozens of truck and trailer rigs sat askew around them, the familiar outfits of his competitors and the customers. His spirits rose, as they always did when he sensed competition.

Doll was as good as any of the twelve, her twenty placements and five championships proved it, but did she have enough left for four hours in three days? She was old, but she was wise and tough too, and she loved this edge-hedge-sedge country, could take the wet and the cold. She still had the heart, if only she still had the physical reserve. He’d know soon.

He found the stalls he’d reserved, marked with his name

scrawled on torn shards of cardboard. He unloaded the horses, walked and watered them, put them in their stalls with fresh bedding and hay. He fed, watered and kenneled the dogs (except Doll which he heeled to the truck cab). Then he walked to the clubhouse.

A half dozen club members he'd known for years greeted him. With a cup of coffee in hand, he scanned the photos beside the flickering fireplace: the winning dogs and their handlers since 1963. Photos like these in clubhouses around the country always gave him a sense of passing time, evoked memories of the quarter century of his career...fading images of dogs, handlers, scouts, judges, in proud moments of obscure glory, dim history to all but a few like the faithful who gathered here each Thanksgiving weekend. His people. Maybe, with luck, he could find customers to re-fill his string...and then he knew he was kidding himself. No-way could he get enough new dogs in time to save his business. He would not be the first to go out of the game from too much reliance on one customer. But, by damn, he would go out fighting. He and Doll would give the boys a run for their money in the three days ahead.

Driving back into town, he checked into the Days Inn, down at the heels but reasonable and clean. He showered, shaved, donned fresh jeans and a western shirt, walked to the dining room, filled his plate at the buffet, and took a seat with Billy Kahn, his scouting partner.

"How's the bird crop?" He asked Billy.

"Not many they say," Billy Answered.

The quail population had plummeted all along the circuit; most of the clubs were supplementing with released birds, but not yet at Paducah. He was glad of that; Doll could dig up wild coveys if any dog could.

With supper over, the braces were quickly drawn from the hat in the little room across the hall. Doll would go in the opening brace next morning, again in the fifth brace on Sunday. He knew the habits of her brace mates and their handlers; he was well-pleased with the draw.

Fifty riders sat their mounts at the breakaway as he rode up next morning, Doll pulling ahead anxiously on the check cord. Billy Kahn stood by his horse to release her. Ed greeted the three judges, exchanged "good luck" with the opposing handler; the senior judge said "Let 'em go."

He was oblivious now to all except Doll, the small white form streaking ahead through the sedge grass, disappearing after the two quick turns at the head of the course. The sucking sound of

hooves in deep mud came from the gallery following as he entered the first big bottom, where Doll reappeared, a white dot on a far edge beyond the green clover. She raced to the front, graceful as a ballerina.

Then he heard "Pick 'em up"; he couldn't believe an hour passed. Doll had scored one solid find far to the front. Billy Kahn had found her buried in sereca. She'd run big enough, finished strong. He towed the mud from her forty-pound frame, felt her brave heart beating, the trembling of her taut muscles.

"Good job, girl," he said. She licked his face in appreciation. He put her in the dog trailer.

Now he must scout Billy's dog in the next brace.

When the second hour ended, his mare was blowing. He was thankful he would not have to ride in the afternoon; he could save the gelding for Doll's heat Sunday afternoon. But when he returned to the stable, his heart sank. The gelding's head was down, its eyes dull. A cold, he suspected; he prayed nothing worse.

At lunch in the clubhouse, he sought out Doc Harris, a veterinarian who followed the trial game. Doc confirmed his diagnosis, gave the gelding an injection, recommended rest. He spent the afternoon waiting impatiently in the clubhouse. He cursed the shortage of rental mounts—he should ride all the braces, get a feel for conditions and covey haunts.

The reports at day's end were of more good races, but none better than Doll's. If only she hunted and handled as well tomorrow. He would take her to the motel for the night. The room's warmth and an aspirin should keep her from stiffening up.

At the night's cocktail party, he heard compliments on Doll's race. He went up to bed early. Doll's tail thumped the carpet in greeting when he opened the door. He took her out at heel to relieve herself, and soon they were both sleeping soundly. She had eaten well, a good sign. At five the shrill ring of the telephone woke them—the wake-up call he had asked for at the front desk.

The gelding had not improved despite Doc Harris's injection. He would have to ride the mare again. She seemed fit enough, though a little stiff, as he turned her into the paddock after she finished her morning grain.

Lunchtime reports on the morning braces were contradictory. He sought out a retire handler who'd ridden and got his approval.

"I didn't see nothing I liked as good as your Doll's race yesterday," was his taciturn assessment. Ed's spirits lifted a little, and he put out of mind again the specter of having to quit the game.

THE FALCONER AND THE HIGGINS REMOTE RELEASER

An Interview with Brad Higgins

Brad Higgins is a falconer. He is also a professional dog trainer who resides in Newcastle, CA. He trapped his first hawk at sixteen years old and acquired his first pointing dog shortly after. Somewhere along the way he became interested in training pointing dogs, and his approach to pointing dog training was influenced by what he learned from falconry. For twenty-two years, he has worked dogs and hunted wild birds in the Sierra Nevada foothills near Sacramento, but as wild bird populations declined, he was challenged to look

The Higgins remote releaser allows the bird to do the training. It is a metal cage made of laser cut steel with a lid that opens slowly and silently so it does not scare the bird or get the dog's attention. The bird is free to go when it feels pressure from the dog.

This past spring Brad was invited to help put on a dog training seminar at my kennel in Virginia and talk about his releasers. I had purchased three of them and wanted to understand how to use them. Following the seminar, we sat down at the kitchen table and discussed how he came up with the idea for them. Brad explained that the best training he had ever done was when he trained on wild birds. He said, "Wild birds teach a dog how to point naturally. The dog runs the birds up. The birds fly away, so the dog can't catch them. The dog starts to pause before he pounces, and finally he starts to point."

Brad said that he was looking for a device to use with pen-raised birds that would give him a natural release. He needed some kind of container that was open enough to allow the bird's scent to flow naturally. The lid had to open slowly, so the bird was not flushed, and it had to be quiet, so the dog did not hear it. There was a lot of experimenting with three years spent making prototypes before he finally came up with the Higgins remote releaser.

"The releaser is so simple," Brad explained. "I put one in the field and open it when I get the dog in the area. If the bird leaves early, I get a stop-to-flush. If the bird holds, I get a point. Anytime the dog pressures the bird, the bird flushes. The releaser allows the dog to relate to the bird just like it was a wild bird."

Brad explained that his background in falconry and those experiences as a falconer helped him understand the nature of dogs. "Hawks and dogs are both predators. They think alike," Brad said. "If I hunt a hawk with a dog, they learn to hunt together very quickly. The hawk does a lot to train the dog because the dog watches the hawk, and when they get successful, they do it again. Predators don't have a lot of time to learn things. They only have a few opportunities, so they need to be successful or they die. That's why dogs have the ability to put things together so quickly. They are predators, so it's in their nature to do that."

Brad gave an example of how quickly dogs learn from their prey. "You take an experienced dog that's been hunted on a preserve where they plant and shoot. He's learned he can get relatively close to those pen-raised birds, and he knows at what distance he's going to work them. You take him late season hunting on wild pheasants. What does he know? He knows pen-raised pheasant, and he knows how close he can get. So he gets half-way to where he wants to be and boom the birds are gone. Dog says, 'Man that's not going to work.' The second time he finds a pheasant, he points it from way back. That's how quick he learns. He doesn't continue to go in and flush those birds. He learned from the bird. That bird said, 'No, not me. I'm not going to hold.' From that moment on, that dog pointed those birds way back."

Brad wanted to train dogs the same way, so the dog learned from the bird and not the trainer. He wanted the dog focused on the bird not focused on him. "Birds are valuable things to dogs, and the releaser allows dogs to relate to them. The releaser is open, and the bird can leave anytime. The bird is aware of the dog, and the dog is



paying attention to the bird. He knows the bird is loose. He's going to be very careful what he does."

Brad went on to explain how to use releasers and gave me some tips. I told him that I had figured out how to control the bird's behavior to some degree by using different types of cover to plant the releasers. For instance, birds seemed to flush earlier when the cover was more open. "Think wild birds," Brad said. "In light cover, the bird won't let the dog get as close. In heavy cover, the bird lets the dog get closer." He said releasers worked the same way, and how fast birds flushed could be manipulated by the type of cover in which the releasers were placed. "You really do have some control, but it's still all about the bird. The bird leaves when it feels pressured."

I was curious about timing and how long Brad waited to open the lid. He explained that the cover and type of training he was doing determined when he opened the lid. He gave an example. "If I want to work a dog on stop-to-flush, I bring the dog into the area of the releaser and open it. I continue working the dog. Now, the bird is free, and he's out there like a wild bird in the field, and the dog hasn't scented it. When the dog gets close enough, the bird is going to feel pressure, and he's going to leave."

Brad gave another example. "If I want the dog to point, I'll take him across the scent cone. I try to open the lid just before he first shows interest. I don't wait until the dog is roading in and then open it. I always want the releaser open when the bird decides it is time to go. The bird is teaching the dog how close he can get. The bird is awake. He has not been spun, and he is not dizzy. He is ready to go, and he knows the dog is there."

I mentioned to Brad that my dogs ignored releasers when they were empty, and I really liked that. If a dog was brought in on a check-cord to point a releaser and he started to creep or wanted to move up, I could let him. The bird flushed, and the releaser did not have enough scent to attract the dog's interest. Brad explained that he designed Higgins remote releasers so there was nothing to hold scent once the bird was gone. "I've had situations where I take a young dog to the field, open the releaser, and the bird gets up. The dog runs in where the bird came from, and the releaser is right there, and he's sniffing the ground all around it, and then he goes on. He doesn't relate the bird to the releaser."

Brad talked about the size of the releaser and said that he made it big enough to hold a couple of pigeons or chukar, a hen pheasant, or four quail, and he described how he planted coveys

by putting four quail in the releaser. "I'll leave them in the releaser for a few minutes before I remotely open it. Then it may be fifteen minutes before I get back with a dog. When I get there, the birds have become a covey. They have left the releaser, and they're in the weeds somewhere. It's a very natural way to get a covey."

Brad had to catch a plane and return to California—our time was up. After he left, I found myself sitting at the kitchen table again going over my notes. Releasers were so different from launchers. Was my previous experience with launchers necessary



to truly appreciate releasers? My first experience with releasers was still clear in my mind. I closed my eyes and replayed it.

A white and orange dog turned into the wind, her tail drawing circles in the air, nose expanding and contracting, feet touching the ground in light ballerina steps. Her pace slowed and then stopped. She stood frozen except for her tail which now moved in short rapid beats. Right then a pigeon took flight maybe twenty feet in front of her. My first reaction was the bird got up too soon. Her tail was still flagging. I would have waited a moment to give her a chance to become more confident before launching the bird, but I was using a releaser not a launcher. Once the releaser opened, the training was between the dog and the bird. It had nothing to do with me or my timing. The releaser was all natural. Predator and prey—the dog and the bird already knew what to do.

PYRAMID BARN DEDICATION

FIELD TRIAL CLUBS OF ILLINOIS DONATED A NEW HORSE BARN AT PYRAMID STATE PARK, IL AND DEDICATED AND NAMED IT THE RAY TRIMBLE BARN

On Sunday afternoon August 19, 2012, two groups celebrated a ribbon cutting ceremony for an all new horse barn on the Captain Unit of the Pyramid State Park. Through a “donor agreement” between THE FIELD TRIAL CLUBS OF ILLINOIS INC. and the ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, this new facility will house up to 36 horses and will serve as a staging area for both bird dog field trials and other equestrian oriented activities. Using focused fund raising programs the officers and the board of directors of the FTCI raised monies to fund the structure and construction of this barn at a predetermined site on the Pyramid

park lands. The IDNR completed necessary impact analysis and site preparation prior to the construction phase.

IDNR Director Marc Miller along with site manager Cha Hill joined Field Trial Clubs of Illinois members and several FTCI officers and directors for the gathering. Several local businesses and the Friends of Pyramid group were also on hand in recognition of the additional commerce that will come from the people who will now visit the area.

“The Pyramid Field Trial site with the addition of a horse barn and shelter from the elements is an extremely attractive venue to run our dogs. We also would like to recognize the Friends of Pyramid Group whose cooperation and financial contribution has provided the running of water lines to both the barn and the Denmark staging area , We thank IDNR Director Miller and the FTCI President Mark Johnson and his officers and directors for their leadership in seeing that this barn project took place,” said Master of Ceremonies Ed Graves of Friedheim, MO. Director Miller has noted that this type of public – private partnerships are the kind of thing his agency views as progressive and positive for all.

This donor’s agreement covers the construction of two (2) barns by the FTCI: the first of which was dedicated in ceremonies on July 14th and named after pointer field trialer Pat Sheehan of Jacksonville, IL. Sheehan spearheaded the fund raising for the two facilities .The Sheehan Barn is located at Jim Edgar Panther Creek State Fish and Wildlife Area near Chandlerville and Ashland, IL. .

“We are excited about the additional interest in the sport of bird



dog field trialing these two new barns will stimulate and have great appreciation for the level of cooperation and collaboration the IDNR and Director Miller's office has extended to us" said Graves.

Joining Director Miller and FTCI Directors in the ribbon cutting ceremony was veteran Brittany field trialer Ray Trimble of Carterville, IL, for whom the barn will be named. Trimble, representing FTCI, worked with IDNR on the original management plan for the land after it was purchased by the State and helped to lay out the field trial courses as well as working with other field trialers to help with the construction of the barn. Trimble has been involved in the sport since the mid-1950's and is still active today on the field trial circuit. He is a recipient of the AKC Lifetime Achievement Award for Performance Events, a member of the American Brittany Club Hall of Fame and the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame, and has been recognized by FTCI with the Senior Service Award. Trimble expressed his gratitude to FTCI for the honor and indicated that the sport of field trialing, working with good bird dogs and riding horses, is part of what has kept him young with a purpose and enthusiasm for life.

The Field Trial Clubs of Illinois is a not for profit organization chartered in the state of Illinois. They represent 41 separate sporting dog organizations in the State of Illinois and will celebrate 50 years in existence next year. Over the years the organization has contributed thousands of dollars for site improvements at various State Fish and Wildlife Areas. Field Trialing in Illinois is very popular, has a rich heritage and generates hundreds of thousands of dollars of revenue annually for supporting businesses and industry.

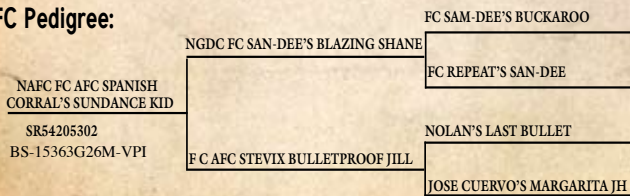

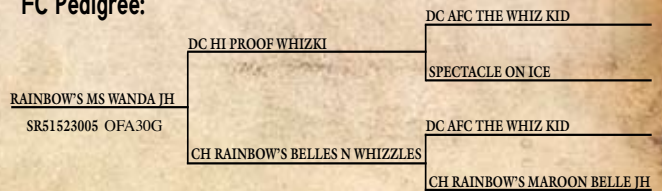

Not wind, nor rain, nor snow...

Fall is here and winter is fast approaching. The days are getting shorter and the nights are getting colder. Now is the time to think about whether or not you plan on blanketing your horse this winter and if you do what kind of blanket you need to buy.

There has always been great debate over blanketing horses. It is true that horses have a natural system for keeping themselves warm. However, this system will not work as well during wind and precipitation. It is during these types of conditions that it becomes important to protect your horse. When deciding if you want to blanket or not there are several different factors to weigh.

Does your horse have a shelter in the pasture or a stall for inclement weather?



If you have a shelter in your pasture that will block wind and precipitation that your horse uses during bad weather then blanketing may not be necessary. Also, ideally shelters should face away from prevailing winds of the area.

What is your typical climate?

Evaluate the typical climate for your area. Areas with moderate climates often will not require blanketing whereas in an area with harder winters blanketing would be beneficial.

Will you be traveling with your horse to areas that may not have shelter?



Often in fall there are a lot of field trials and many grounds do not offer shelter for the horses. If there is inclement weather such as rain and wind it would be beneficial to have a blanket for your horse even if they do not wear one at home all the time. I highly recommend having a blanket for your horse when traveling even if he does not always wear one at home.

The next decision you need to make is what kind of blanket you need for your horse. There are many different kinds on the market today. For the winter I would recommend a waterproof and insulated turn-out blanket that can come with or without a neck

attachment. These will be tougher material blankets that horses can wear out in the pasture that will keep them dry and warm. These blankets come in different "Denier" or fabric strengths. 1200D will be the strongest fabric and the higher quality blankets. These will not rip as easily and will last longer. The blankets will also come with different levels of insulation. Your climate will dictate what level of insulation you need.

If you live in a moderate climate and would still like to blanket your horse, a simple waterproof turn-out sheet with no insulation will often suffice. This will keep the horse dry and will also block the wind while not overheating the horse. Another benefit to keeping your horse blanketed is that he will stay much cleaner while in the pasture. This can be helpful in easing the grooming of that winter coat.

A common misconception about blankets is that it will hinder the horse from growing a full winter coat. This is simply not true. The growth of winter coat is regulated by the length of daylight the horse is exposed



to and melatonin levels in the body. If your horse wears a blanket it will also put on a full winter coat with no problems. I usually blanket my horses when the temperature stays around or below 45-50°.



Be sure not to leave your horse blanketed if the temperature rises during the day. There are often days where blankets are not needed during the day but are necessary at night.

Be sure to pay attention to the weather forecasts so that you can be sure that your horse will be comfortable. Whether you

choose to use a blanket or not, keep your horse dry and protected from the wind and they will thank you this fall and winter.

Making it look easy: How to Develop Your Handling Skills

The dilemma most field dog people face is how to get their dogs from place to place in a hunting cover or field trial ground with ease and consistency. How many times have you heard a hunter say, "I need my dog to hunt with me"? A field trialer will say, "I turned him loose and he disappeared over the hill," or "I just can't keep my dog steady!" In this article, I will discuss how to avoid these problems, and how to address them when they occur.

Controlling any dog is a matter of developing a set of skills that can be applied when necessary to hunt or field trial with success. When all is working smoothly, the idea is that you are controlling your dog without he or she looking controlled. It simply looks "right." Like many things that appear skillful and effortless, preparation is involved. This is the key to getting good results as a handler while guiding, competing, or hunting.

Controlling a dog is a matter of self-discipline on the handler's part, as well as a timely and effective process of evaluation that encompasses changes in the environment and the dog. The system works best when the dog understands your commands and expectations, and trusts that you as his handler are monitoring him. We begin by building on some early training skills we established when our prospect was a pup.



In all training there has to be a foundation, a base line established from the beginning of the dog's training, and engrained continuously as we develop our prospect. In previous articles, I explained how this is done. We now go on to apply our early learning to get the most out of our dogs. If you did not have your dog from puppyhood, you must backtrack and improvise on what he has learned in his life and work from there.

From the beginning we always started our pup with a two blast whistle signal. This teaches our dog to go on any whistle (move forward on the whistle). This is the first step to control, and the easiest. Practice a two blast whistle signal when you release the dog.

Remember we are now working with an older dog, and a

specific situation. Some people would think that if you make a dog go forward on a whistle, another handler can control your dog around birds by using his whistle to push your dog into the birds. When your dog learns to work with your commands in certain situations, even with whistle signals, you will not have problems with another handler's whistle.

Next, you remember our voice command to turn is whup. In basic training, we used a check cord to teach inside turns (right turns on left hand casts, left hand turns on right hand casts), always making our student turn towards the inside. All one needs to do is say the word whup when the dog turns inside, and he will pick it up quickly. To advance his training, use the E-collar to enforce the turn at longer range. I work on these skills in an open field at first, than advance to cover when my prospect masters the lesson.

Now we have two great tools to work with. We can make him go when we say, and make him turn whenever we want him to. The concept here is to control your dog's direction to a reasonable extent, and keep him to the front, whether in open areas or in cover.

Speed and distance will be up to you. At what distance do you feel comfortable handling your dog? If you are field trialer, speed and distance should be as fast and forward as possible, still maintaining control. A hunter may not need the distance but speed is good to locate game. I just use my voice to control turns to keep him in the cover with me when hunting. In a field trial, I like to push my dog with the whistle if necessary, then turn him with my voice. Let him go the distance he needs, and turn him when needed. That makes it look easy, but we know it all started with basics from puppyhood.

The next step is the finished performance on game. Before you picture the dog on point, let me say that the way a dog goes to his birds is the important part of judging the excellence of an individual. Specifically, how he or she finds the birds and tells you exactly where they are located is the essence of all bird dog work. The finished product, after point is established, is purely a matter of genetics, how much homework you have done, and the way you have carried all of this to its fruition.

In the field trial works, style and intensity on point will get you a long way. I enjoy a very stylish hunting dog as well. Therefore, finish work is important. I call it polish.

In all our basic work we taught the word whoa, concentrating on keeping our dog stationary on the word. We used pigeons to teach steady to wing, always thinking to maintain the dog's integrity around birds. Now in the polishing process we use all the tools we established earlier to complete a finished find with style, and adding one more word: heel.

Most handlers forget about how important the heel command is. I use the word heel after I say whoa always, approaching the standing dog and brining him to a heel position as I pass him closely. I then release him with that two blast whistle command, sending him in an opposite direction every time. The dog moves straight away with speed. After a few sessions of whoa with heel then quick breakaway, your prospect learns to enjoy his yard training (the key to style).

Now let's add this work to the dog standing on point. When we find our dog standing, walk past him while giving him space to maintain point, saying whoa in a low tone, flush the bird, walk back to the dog; say heel. He is waiting to get each command, and will stand better to wing and shot. Collar him if you want, reverse direction, and give a two blast whistle to send him straight away. No delayed chase, and a finished find, made to look easy because you have done your homework.

When hunting, a retrieve is wanted. In this situation you just flush and shoot. You have taught him to expect a command after



every shot. Go to him and tell him to heel briefly in the opposite direction before you give the fetch command. You will have finished, stylish finds when hunting as well.

If you are a field trialer you will need to have a dog that will back (honor another dog's point). It is also mannerly to have a dog that backs if you hunt with a friend and his/her dog. There are a number of ways to get a dog backing with style and consistency. If you have a natural backer you should teach him backing anyway, because control is the key to consistency. I always start with a backing silhouette, (a wooden cutout of a dog). Place a release trap with a pigeon in it behind the wooden dog. Bring your dog up with a check cord, let him suddenly see the dog. I try to avoid letting

the dog smell the bird in the trap, so I work against the wind, I want this lesson to be strictly a sight thing. Then I say the word, "Look." Release the pigeon from behind the silhouette. Each time you show your dog the backing silhouette, show him a pigeon, then say, "Look." Most all dogs will sight point a pigeon on open ground. All I am doing is transferring his natural instincts to the backing dummy. With repetition, your dog will no longer think the silhouette is a dog. He will see it as a pigeon, and will sight point it with style every time. Once the silhouette training is mastered, show your dog other dogs on point, saying the word "look" each time and showing him a bird each time. Use the word "Look" every time. Do not say whoa. I want the dog to associate the word "look" with another dog on point, and he must honor that dog. After several sessions, when you say, "Look," he or she will look for a dog on point, and back with style. When in a trial you can use the word look and most judges will not associate it with anything. Say whoa and the judge thinks your dog is not a good backer. This technique is just a tool to help your dog work better, and make it easier for you to control the situation, without you looking like a controller.

Whether handling your dog in a hunting situation or in a field trial, control is the secret to being consistent. Yard training and keeping your dog up on basic skills is the way to establish and maintain control, therefore making it look easy.

So what's the Breed worth to you?

I hear \$250, \$500, \$1000 and more thrown around for a puppy. I hear the same costs for stud service. We have all willingly thrown \$1000's at a Vet bill, trying to pull one of our dogs through. So what is the Breed worth to YOU?

For the record, I don't have a dog in this hunt, I'm not much of a hunter. In fact, I have owned AKC registered Pure Breeds for more than 30 years of my life. That doesn't however, make a mutt any less desirable, it is just my preference to know the back ground of my dogs.

I like to feel like I'm helping out the blood line (even if I'm not).

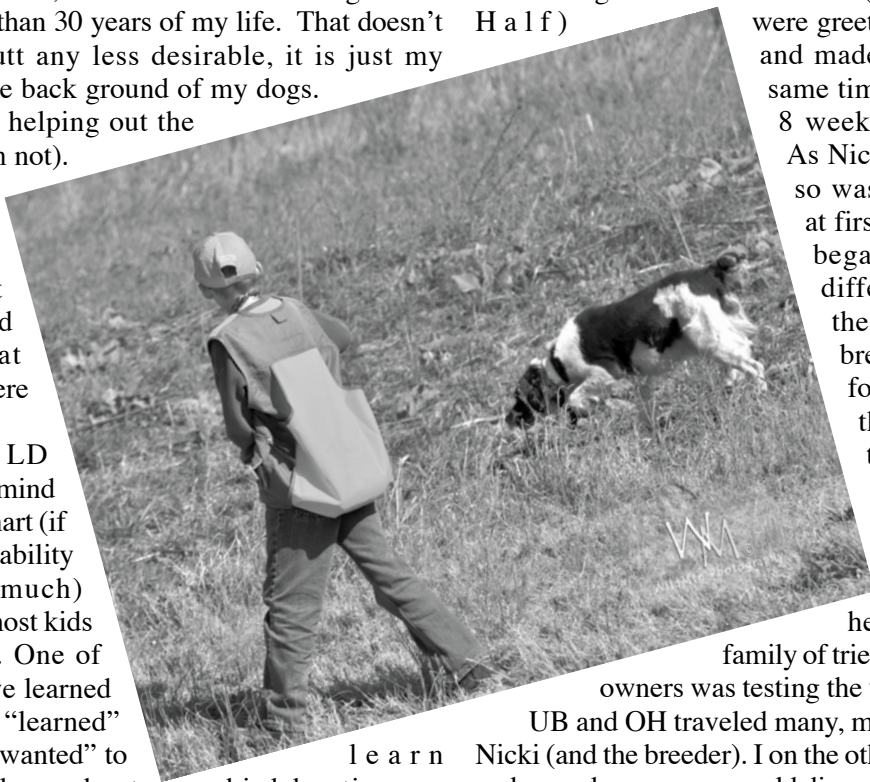
I have never owned a Brittany. But I have shared my home with a Brittany for the last 16 months or so, and frankly prior to that only knew that they were dogs.

So, my Son is LD (Learning Disability), mind you he is incredibly smart (if I may say so), but his ability to learn is much (much) different than that of most kids 7, 8, 9, 10 years old. One of the very first things we learned from him was that he "learned" about things that he "wanted" to about. He wanted to learn about bird hunting, so he called one of his great uncles (an avid bird hunter) who suggested a Brittany (and here you all thought I was rambling, but wait my rambling gets worse, much worse). When

Uunderboi decides that he is ready to learn ANYTHING, we feed that learning. My Other Half decided to scout around and see about Brittany Clubs local to our home town (well quasi-local anyway). So Uunderboi and Other Half headed for Strawson's Farm and their very first event to attend was a walking Field Trial. UB (Underboi) and OH (Other Half)

were greeted by many friendly folks and made to feel welcome, at the same time UB fell in love with an 8 week old bitch named Nicki. As Nicki was learning the ropes, so was UB. Nicki's owner was at first simply amused, but then began to see something was different between Nicki and the boy. The owner/handler/breeder questioned OH, and for better or worse, OH gave the owner/handler/breeder the entire long drawn out story of what exactly was going on inside of UB's head. What/why and how he needed the things he needed, and just how a family of tried and true, Standard Poodle owners was testing the waters for a Brittany.

UB and OH traveled many, many miles keeping track of Nicki (and the breeder). I on the other hand held down the fort and served many, many cold dinners as the two came dragging in late at night, muddied and exhausted. As Nicki matured she became a beautiful bitch, chestnut (liver) and white. She was always ready to hunt, but when UB approached Nicki seemed



to instinctively know what he needed. UB walked Nicki, UB watered Nicki, UB did just about everything the handler asked him to do. The entire time UB was sharing with OH and me everything the internet could tell him about Brittanys.

Years pass, OH and UB attend as many events as economics allow them to, always several a year. OH mentioned on many occasions that UB was by far the youngest, want to be handler, that attended the events. OH shared with me that many (most) of the handlers were nearing retirement or already in retirement. Both I and OH work, and as a fairly young family, we still have a couple of car payments, a house payment and sundries other payments due every month. I asked OH once how much a pup was going to cost, and was not really surprised with the \$750 to \$1000 figure she quoted to me. Not really sure how we were going to swing that kind of money. Still it all boiled down to the fact that the kid was learning, the kid was interested, and the dog would be a lynch pin to the process. Somehow or the other we would come up with the money.

Not surprisingly a few months later, the breeder called and let us know that Nicki was in heat and had been bred. What seemed like an eternity later we were greeted by a healthy litter of both orange and liver pups. Of course UB and OH had to see the pups, and as soon as the breeder felt comfortable that the pups were holding their own she allowed UB and OH into her home to see the passel. UB bonded quickly with a Liver and White bitch that while smaller than most of the litter, was the most precocious of the bunch. She was the first over the whelping box rail, one of the most vocal, and generally a pest when humans were present. At least once a week UB and OH drove the hour or so South, to spend time with the pups and the breeder, always in her home, always learning.

Several weeks after the pups were born, OH broached the subject of purchasing the smaller Liver pup that was already well bonded with UB. OH called me on the way home that evening, a little upset and said the breeder “was vague and evasive” when asked how much the Liver bitch was going to be. I told her to give the breeder some time and approach her on the next visit. We clearly did not have \$1000 to buy a puppy at the time. By this time the little girl had gained ample weight and while still not pick of the litter, was turning into a fine textbook example of a Brittany. Blocky head, square front end, nice top line and tail set. The little bitch was coming around very nicely. Another week and another visit later my wife called on her way back home and told me she was puzzled by a conversation she had had with the breeder. The dog that would become “JoJo” was for sale, and was for sale to our family. BUT (and this is a huge BUT) the breeder refused to discuss a price for the dog. She simply said, more than once, “when the time comes, we will get together on a price”.

After the approach of three years, the day came that UB got to bring “JoJo” home. I can remember clearly the conversation I had with OH about what the dog cost us, because after almost 2 years with “JoJo” in our home and as of today, I still don’t know what she cost. OH and the breeder came up with a fee, and a contract that UunderBoi could



understand (keep in mind UB is 10 years old) “JoJo” is UB’s dog, and when the breeder wants to borrow her, the breeder asks the 10 year old for permission. JoJo is in the breeder’s and UB’s name with the AKC, but JoJo belongs to UB.

Now I have rambled for the better part of 10 mins of your reading to get you to this point.

What’s in it for UB, he has a dog that is a learning, teaching, discovery aid. The dog is priceless.

What’s in it for the breeder? She made nothing on the sale of the dog (yes money exchanged hands, that’s NOT the point). What the breeder has done is “stored” what has turned out to be one of her best breeding, in a safe place for the future. What the breeder has done has taken more than 4 years to cultivate a lifelong relationship. Perhaps a lifelong passion for the breed. However the single most important thing the breeder has done is to ensure the successful continuation of the breed by putting into a child’s hands the very best dog, the very best knowledge and the very best support she has to offer.

Now my question still stands, what is the breed worth to you? You will willing pay \$1000’s to continue “your” line, but what happens when you are gone?

The day I wrote this, I got the opportunity to walk several miles across hills, fields, woods and mud puddles with the breeder. We watched as 4 different dogs worked the cover for birds. I saw in her eyes a twinkle, that I have only seen when she is working the Brittanys. I see that same twinkle in my son’s eyes, when his dog is working the cover.

This addiction with Brittany’s can only be caught if your willing to share the drug. Your net cost is \$0.00. What are you, willing to pay?

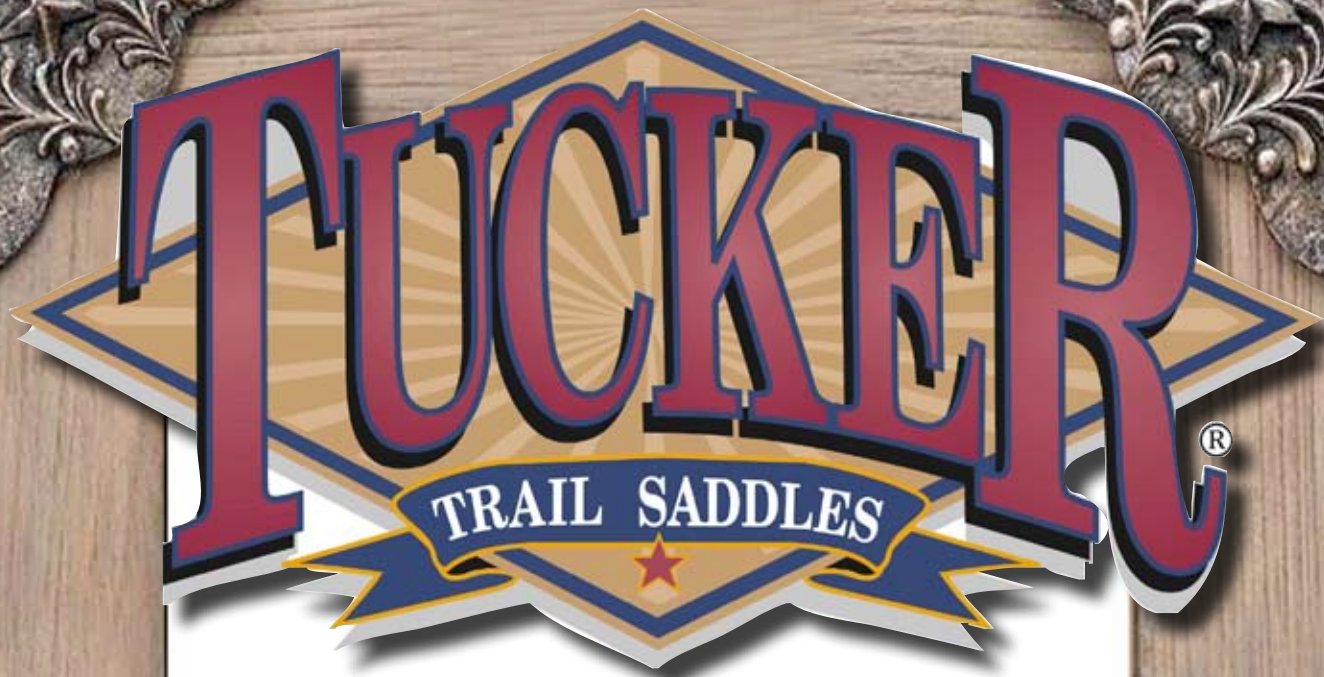

Excerpt from *The Complete Brittany Spaniel* by Maxwell Riddle, 1974

In the previous chapter, we gave the Brittany Spaniel standard as it was first approved by the American Kennel Club. Miss Clara Perry had translated it. Those who read it will recognize that it was virtually unintelligible. Yet at the time, students who wished to understand it had an advantage which is denied to most of us today. Most of the dog shows were benched, and dozens of them were two-day events.

This meant that one could take the standard and go down the stalls, studying each dog. Arguments, or friendly discussions, would take place. Owners would take their dogs off the benches and pose them for study. Perhaps more important, Brittany Spaniels could be compared to other sporting breeds. Such comparisons could often make points in the Brittany Spaniel standard clearer. A good feature in another breed might be a fault in a Britt, and the student would realize why this was so.

If one reads that first American standard, one can understand why the American Brittany Club was thoroughly dissatisfied with it. So a standards committee was set up. The year was 1946.

[ABC Secretary] Dr. David Ruskin obtained the latest standard from France, and translated it. Much of the information Dr. Ruskin obtained from France was far too technical, and therefore hardly understandable.

As the author remembers it, the main committee consisted of Dr. Ruskin, [ABC President] Jack Whitworth, Jerome N. Halle, Edward Dana Knight, and the author. Knight was a fine sporting dog judge. He was a great student. He exhibited English Springer Spaniels at shows and trained them for field. He also ran English Setters in American Field trials, and he usually had an American Foxhound or two. Jerome Halle had run Pointers in American Field trials while an undergraduate at Cornell University. He, too, was a fine sporting dog judge. His early, and long association with Brittany Spaniels is well known. These two, and the author, were thoroughly familiar with the tragic split of the English Setter into two breeds-bench and field. Knight, and the author, were watching the split of English Springer Spaniels into two breeds. Both fought against this split and lost.

However, Knight felt that, if the Brittany Spaniel was to get anywhere as a bench dog, it would have to develop the heavy coat and feathers of modern sporting bench dogs, and the rounded fatness of so many of them. American Brittany Club officers and members did not want this to happen because the inevitable result would be a split of the breed into two varieties, bench and field.

Halle, and the author, argued that the Brittany standard should be so written that no such split would be possible. One result was that the American Brittany Club began a policy of holding bench shows along with field trials. That meant that field dogs could come out of the field and compete, as they were, for bench championships. It is this factor which caused the standard writers to prescribe a dog without excessive coat and feathering.

Halle and the author also argued that the Brittany Spaniel could compete on equal terms with other breeds in the sporting group at dog shows if sporting dog judges could be properly trained. Judges had to be told that a hard, lean, field conditioned Brittany without


heavy leg feathering, or a fine, silky and long coat, was to be desired.

This policy has, to some extent, failed. One reason is that a new generation of sporting dog show judges has developed, and we have done nothing to educate them as we did an earlier generation. Yet in another sense, the policy has worked well. It is proven in the number of dual champions-bench and field-which the breed has produced. And it remains as an argument for conducting bench and field events at the same meeting.


The first American standard tried to explain the meaning, and the reason for each point. It has survived with but a few changes since. In 1946, it was feared that the breed would grow too large. Dogs from other lands did tend to grow larger. In most cases, this was temporary, and dogs tended to return to their basic size. But in 1946, several champions were larger than the agreed upon height. It is to the credit of the owners of those dogs that they agreed upon a height which would disqualify their dogs.

It is imperative for Brittany Spaniel owners to study the present standard in the light of the past. And they should understand the reasons behind each point in the standard so that a great and unspoiled breed may continue to improve, as it has in the past. [T] he present standard ... represents the thoughts and experiences of Brittany Spaniel people since 1907. But it also is the result of the breeding, training, field trialing, and exhibiting by Brittany owners in America since 1946.

Obedience/Agility/Rally Special Feature: Animal Rehab – More Than Meets the Eye

With the splashy underwater treadmill, the colorful therapy balls, and gadgets that require electrodes, sunglasses, slings, or hypoallergenic gel, it could be easy to believe that ‘rehab’ is all about the toys! But that view-point could not be further from the truth! There is so much more to animal rehab than meets the eye!

Often the most important part of successful rehab is the assessment and diagnosis made by the rehab therapist. Physical therapists already possess unique assessment skills, and vets thoroughly trained in animal rehab may have received additional training in physical therapy assessment skills in order to augment their veterinary diagnostics and create an appropriate rehab plan. The assessment techniques, enhanced deductive reasoning, and overall examination of function are what physical therapy and physical therapists are giving to the veterinary field.

The physical therapy assessment and diagnosis & how it differs from a veterinary assessment and diagnosis

Veterinary medicine tends to rely on what can be called an anatomical diagnosis, whereas physiotherapy and human medicine to a certain extent look at what can be termed a functional assessment. The definitions are below:

Anatomical diagnosis: This perspective relies some on clinical tests, and heavily on diagnostic tests. The primary goal is to ‘name the problem’, with the subsequent thought process being how to fix the problem (usually with a prescription for surgery, medications, or rest).

Functional diagnosis: This perspective not only seeks to find the origin of the ‘problem’ utilizing an assessment formula and the combined results from hands-on tests, but also identifies the functional impairment, inter-relationships with other structures, repercussions, and potential structural or movement origins of the problem. Thus the subsequent goal or thought process is not only how to best fix the problem (perhaps by rehabilitative treatments or by referral for surgery, etc), but also how to improve function.

Thinking outside the box to identify the root of the problem

Several non-traditional sites and structures can result in lameness, poor movement, reduced athletic performance, and postural alterations. Muscles can be the culprit of these ailments. Not only may muscle be directly implicated, as with a muscle strain or tendon injury, but they may create functional impairments and pain when they are weak, tight/shortened, or riddled with myofascial trigger points.

Myofascial trigger points (MFTTrP) have been described (in humans & dogs) as a hyper-irritable nodule in a tight band of muscle. The spot is tender when pressed, and can give rise to referred pain, muscle weakness, and sometime sensations such as nausea, fatigue, dizziness and other symptoms attributable to the autonomic nervous system. Treating MFTTrPs can be difficult at

best, but one cannot even begin if they are not looking for them in the clinical exam!

Weak muscles can create problems on many levels. Weak muscles do not cushion arthritic joints very well. Weak muscles can alter the proper forces around a joint (e.g. weak abdominals can put strain on the lumbar spine). Weak muscles may also be a contributing factor to abnormal joint development, as in hip dysplasia. In many cases, general exercises do not specifically target and train individually weakened muscles. Thus, in order to improve pain and function, the isolated muscle weakness must be identified in order to directly treat it with specific, targeted, guided exercises.

Tight, shortened muscles can impact function as well. Often times upon testing, shortened muscles are also found to be weak. A shortened muscle quite simply has less leverage and ability to create a strong muscle contraction. Short muscles can directly impact mobility within joints. This can then impact stride length and the quality of gait, which can lead to compensatory issues. The spine and axial skeleton is an area often affected by compensatory movement strategies, and therefore are areas in need of evaluation on every animal!

Most of the veterinary industry recognizes the signs and symptoms of disc disease quite readily. Problems in the axial skeleton (relating to the spine, ribs and pelvis) are not so readily acknowledged however. A ‘dysfunction’ in this region is a physical therapy term that implies that a joint is not moving appropriately, and is either termed as hypomobile (not moving enough) or hypermobile (moving too much). Dysfunctions can not only cause localized pain, but in some locations can refer pain down a limb. Not only should the joints of the spine, rib cage and pelvis be assessed, but also the muscles around these areas.

Problems of the axial skeleton can cause lameness or off-loading of a limb, sometimes obvious and sometimes just subtle enough to lose the dog points in the show ring! Postural adaptations, such as a roached back or sway back are often attributable to problems in the spine, ribs, or pelvis. Have you ever had a dog that showed beautifully at a year of age and then at 2 or 3 years of age, seems to have a faulty topline ‘for no good reason’? Chances are that the animal suffered from an axial skeletal dysfunction during the period in-between and may have even grown into that conformational fault!!

A Typical Rehab Assessment

One of the differences you might notice between a traditional veterinary exam and a rehab exam would be the time it takes to conduct. Every rehab exam should include an evaluation of the whole body: looking for primary problems, secondary problems, and concurrent problems (i.e. think of the latter as ‘bonus’ problems). The whole animal is looked at to understand not only the root of the problem, but how that problem is impacting or impacted by other problems. Thus, a ‘scanning’ examination is first

conducted, looking at active movements (e.g. the dog does them on his/her own, such as by following a cookie when testing neck range of motion) and passive movements (e.g. the examiner moves the dog's body to test the amount of motion, quality of movement, and discomfort associated with any particular movements) of the spine and limbs. Testing may also look at correlating sensory changes, perhaps manifested as lick and chew marks, and isolated muscle group weaknesses associated with specific spinal nerves. A pinched nerve in the back or neck for example may cause pins and needles sensations in a limb or a mild to moderate weakness of muscles supplied by that nerve.

Once the scanning examination is conducted of the whole body, the rehab therapist will make an educated guess as to whether the root of the problem is in the spine or in a limb and then do a more detailed evaluation of one of the other. Again, movement is tested, and additionally special tests are employed, such as the tests used to detect a cruciate tear, hip or elbow dysplasia, or shoulder joint instability. Muscle stretching is also a physiotherapy-concept. Specific muscle stretches are known and utilized in order to identify muscles and tendons that are painful or simply shortened. Palpation is the ability to use the fingers to pinpoint areas of problems. Palpation is a crucial skill that is refined in the rehab vet or physio. He or she should be able to isolate all of the muscle groups, tendons, and ligaments that are within reach from the surface (i.e. those that are not within a joint or underlying a large muscle), and feel joints for any signs of swelling. Lastly, is 'joint play'. This is definitely a term that comes from human physical therapy practice! What it implies, is an evaluation of how much movement is available within a joint in any and all directions. It is the evaluation of how the joint glides back and forth, side to side, etc – by just moving the ends of the bones that make up the joint. Physiotherapists go through years of training to perfect this skill, and it has been recognized in human studies that physiotherapists can detect changes in a joint indicative of early osteoarthritis long before x-rays will show degeneration in the same joint. If we can detect it early, we can treat it early, and slow down its progression. Physiotherapists have taught this skill to rehab veterinarians, and it is an immensely valuable skill in making a functional diagnosis.

By combining all of the information from the scanning exam and targeted exam, a functional diagnosis is made and a treatment plan can be created. Treatments may very well be physical therapy based (manual therapy, modalities, or exercise prescription) but may also include consultation with the referring veterinarian about the need for pharmaceutical interventions such as pain medication, or that a surgical approach to addressing the problem would be in the patient's best interest. Even though the exam may act as a second opinion, it is not exclusive of traditional vet medicine, and a good rehab practitioner always keeps the referring veterinarian 'in the loop'.

A Functional Diagnostic Example

Take, for example, the case of a chronic partial cruciate ligament tear of the stifle. We all understand that the joint is likely to be somewhat thickened and arthritic. There will be tests and clinical signs that would lead both a regular veterinary practitioner and a rehab practitioner to make such a diagnosis. Regardless of how the dog's owner might decide to proceed with treatment (e.g. surgical or conservative management), one needs to think about and address of the compensations throughout the body that can impact function as well. With a long-standing joint issue of the stifle, the animal is not likely to fully straighten or bend that joint. The animal is likely

to 'side-sit' to avoid compressing the joint. Over time, without regular positioning into a proper sit, the Achilles tendon can become shortened to a point as to disallow full stifle and hock flexion. The side-sitting posture does not allow for symmetric use of the rear limbs when getting up from a sitting position or down to a sitting position. This may create an over dependence on the 'good' rear leg and both front legs in order to maneuver in and out of sitting. In this scenario, the animal could develop myofascial trigger points in his shoulder muscles and dysfunctions in his mid back because of the awkward movement strategy. As well, the unaffected limb may be at risk of injury due to perpetual overloading. On the other side of the issue, lack of full stifle extension can shorten the end stance phase of gait. In order to compensate, the animal may try to gain some additional extension by hyper-extending at the hock or through the back, pelvis and hip region (e.g. as seen with dogs that rotate their limb outwards as they walk). While walking may be affected, often stance is as well, and even slight off-loading of the rear limb can result in a crooked spine with subsequent back pain, or a roach-backed posture if the animal compensates by weight shifting forwards onto the front limbs. Furthermore, the off-loading requires overuse of the hip flexor muscles of the affected limb in order to maintain the posture, which often results in the formation of painful myofascial trigger points and shortened muscles in this location. Lastly, so as not to avoid the obvious, but in the case of the chronic partial cruciate tear, the musculature of the entire affected limb is likely to be atrophied and weaker, which can perpetuate the functional impairments brought about with this scenario, and potentially exacerbate additional areas of dysfunction, such as arthritic elbow joints. It can best be summed up with 'if an animal is lame somewhere, he is lame everywhere.' And as such, it is 'everywhere' that needs to be addressed!

Conclusion

Physical therapy in human medicine is a full process of both evaluation and treatment. It is not just a summation of techniques and tools, but rather a professional discipline that utilizes problem solving skills, advanced manual skills, and a comprehensive functional physical examination in order to create a functional diagnosis. Perhaps the next time you have a dog that is not moving right, not performing well, or whose symptoms are perplexing your veterinarian, ask for a referral to a physical therapist or vet with animal rehab training to get a second diagnostic opinion, as well as to provide a therapeutic treatment option to complement your traditional veterinary plan.

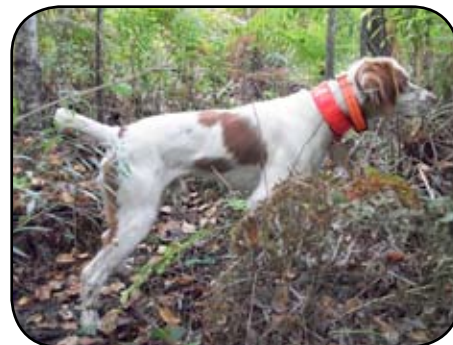

"MUSINGS . . . OF A FIELD TRIAL JUDGE"

One of the fringe benefits of being a field trial judge is that one can take the book home and live the stake over in days that follow. If the judge is fortunate his review of his notes leads him to the same conclusion as before.

But that is not what these musings are about. This sometime judge has just gone over the results of all stakes in a recent trial in which he judged two. He was struck by the dominance of certain lines of breeding in five stakes with large entries, judged by two pairs of arbiters.

Field trials, we have agreed, take place in part to improve the breed. That suggests a close attention to the breeding of winners. Consider this: in last weekend's trial three of the four winners, two of them littermates, in an amateur all age stake with 24 starters, were sired by the dog that won the 40-entry all age stake. The two stakes were judged by different sets of arbiters. The same dog sired the third place derby.

Another dog, one that gained an important win earlier this year on the grounds used last weekend, was in this trial and was the sire of the third place puppy, second place derby, and third place limited all age. Again, two sets of judges shared in awarding these placements.

The juveniles that won first and second in the puppy stake were fourth and first, respectively, in the derby. Again the two stakes were judged by different sets of judges. The sires of these dogs can be credited with each siring two winners in this trial.

Thus we find that of 20 placements awarded in five stakes, eleven of the winners were sired by four dogs, and one of the four was himself the first-place dog in the largest of the stakes. Surely this is evidence of the prepotency that through field trialing we seek.

What qualities did we see in the dogs that we placed? In the puppy stake the winners ran boldly forward, showed a willingness to handle, went to birdy objectives,

applied themselves to the task of hunting, sustained their effort throughout the heat, and finished strongly.

In the amateur all age stake the winners were bold to the point of being headstrong, chose for themselves their objectives while responding to their handlers' general direction, pointed birds intently and with good location, and hunted a scent-filled bird field aggressively without pottering or losing character. There is little doubt that the other set of judges sought similar qualities in the stakes they judged.

Thus we can conclude that the sires and dams whose sons and daughters were repeatedly recognized with placements in this trial are capable of transmitting the qualities we seek. If you wish to know their names, study the reports of this spring's trials and you will find that in every part of the continent most of our consistent winners are the progeny of a small group of producers. It is important that judges look for quality, so that dogs of both sexes capable of transmitting it may be identified.

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped.** A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.

- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** Late litter nominations will be accepted as late as 180 days from whelping. In addition to the Nomination fee of \$30.00 the late fees are \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be at the discretion of the Futurity Committee. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
- Dogs will be eligible to run in the designated futurity to be held in the Spring of the second year following the year of whelping.
- A final nomination fee will be due by October 1st of the year following whelping. Entry fees will be paid by the owner of the puppy for each Sectional Futurity field or bench event the dog enters.
