The tapestry of life continues to be woven, thread by thread, creating different patterns and effects as time goes on.

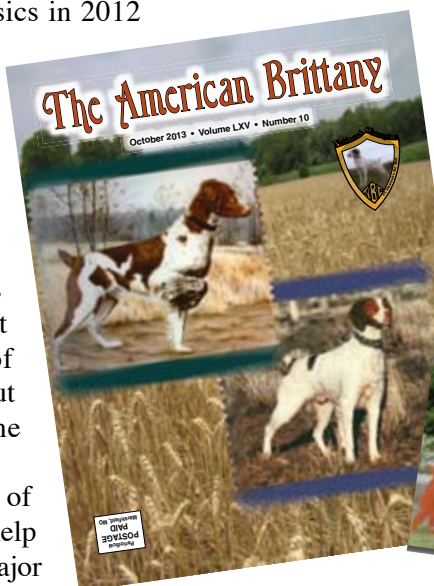
One of the things I have attempted to do during my term has been to improve communications among the members of ABC. Many people have been instrumental in helping to achieve this goal. The magazine committee has done a wonderful job adding new features and broadening the coverage of activities that are reported. I have received many comments from members who tell me how much they enjoy reading it each month. Our website continues to be a source of valuable information for members and is updated on a regular basis. There, one can look up dates of upcoming events, get copies of club premiums, find links to other pertinent web sites, and keep up with the issues being discussed by the Board of Directors. Our Facebook page has grown enormously since its inception and is the place to go for the most up-to-date coverage of ABC events.

In addition to the print and electronic media mentioned above, I have felt a responsibility to attend as many ABC events as logistically possible. I did not get to quite as many as I had hoped for, but did make it to the Summer Specialty last year, the Gun Dog and Pheasant Classics in 2012 and 2013, and the Grouse/Woodcock Classic this year, along with the National Championships, National Specialty, and National Gun Dog Championships both years. area of concern. I have found that attracting and retaining new members is best accomplished by one-on-one interaction between existing and potential members. Providing activities in which new members can participate is done by committees and boards, but getting people to come to their first event and observe or participate requires personal contact, something every member can do. Remaining alert for threats by people and organizations that would do away with human-animal interaction, and in some cases seek to do away with all forms of domesticated animals, is another critical issue that requires action by individual members, not just by the leadership. Indeed, those matters that do fall under the responsibility of committees and officers and directors still rely on the membership because it is the members who take turns filling these positions.

An analogy often used to represent change is a flowing stream. It has been said that you can never step in the same river twice. Some changes are dramatic, others nearly imperceptible, such as the difference in the river from the time you first stepped in it compared to when you take that second step, but even small changes over a long enough period of time produce noticeable results. The rate of such change is very important. To maintain the flow of the river, there must be as much coming in from upstream as leaves going downstream. If change occurs too slowly, the river dries up. If it occurs too rapidly, however, flooding is produced and much of what existed before is destroyed. Maintaining a reasonable rate of change should be our goal so as to keep ABC viable and vital so future generations can continue to enjoy organized activities with the most wonderful breed of dog there is.

TRAININ' DOGS

with Rick Smith

Bootlickers and Shoe-Polishers

What do boots and shoes have to do with training bird dogs? Other than the fact that we like our feet to be comfortable for long hunting and training sessions, boots and shoes aren't a major topic of discussion among bird dog trainers. However, if we use the term "bootlicker" or "shoe-polisher," that opens up a whole new kettle of fish. Both terms mean the same thing, and neither of them is a good thing in a bird dog.

What's a bootlicker or a shoe-polisher? In simple terms, it's a dog that rarely ranges more than a few feet or yards from its handler's side. The dog may switch sides or move from back to front, but doesn't show any drive or desire to leave the owner. A dog with this problem shows no desire to go out and find birds or hunt. The dog is said to be so close underfoot that he is constantly polishing the owner's shoes.

It's important to clarify the difference between a close-working dog and a true bootlicker. Some folks with big-running dogs tend to call any dog that works close a bootlicker, and that brings us to a brief discussion of range.

Breeding and cover dictate the range of a dog, while training merely enhances it. The game and cover being hunted will also dictate the range of the dog, though the dog will adapt to the cover at hand. Which brings us back to the shoe-polisher: Just because a dog shortens its range to under a hundred yards in the thick tag alders

of grouse country or unharvested milo fields of Kansas doesn't automatically label it a shoe-polisher. A close-working dog will still have plenty of drive and desire to hunt. However, if you're trying to walk through that same cover and are constantly tripping over your dog, it's time to use the bootlicker/shoe-polisher label.

Why do some dogs do this? And can it be cured? Again, we'd like to go back to talking about range for a moment. Range is, to some degree, hereditary, and it's enhanced (or ruined) through training. Bootlicking and shoe-polishing, on the other hand, are not hereditary and are entirely man-made. You can only train a dog to 100 percent of its potential, and if the dog doesn't have very much potential, you can only bring out 100 percent of what it does have. Don't make the mistake of confusing "not much potential" with "screwed up the training."

How does it happen? Most often, the answer is too much control on the part of the handler. There are a number of things that can go wrong in training that will leave you with a shoe-polisher.

The first one is too much insistence on heeling and obedience work, especially when the dog is young. There is a time and place for obedience work, but a dog has to have some freedom as well. Too much heeling and coming erodes a dog's confidence and teaches it to totally rely on its handler for direction. If you are constantly on your dog's case about being at heel, after awhile the dog becomes afraid to leave your side for fear of another correction. Heel when you need to and get that control, but balance it with plenty of run time. The amount of time a dog will need to be at heel during hunting is minimal, while the time spent looking for birds is maximum. Work it the same way in your training.

Another factor that turns dogs into bootlickers is over-direction in the field. This is also called "hacking." If the handler is constantly trying to direct the dog via voice, whistle, and especially e-collar, the dog loses its independence and desire to hunt. As long as the dog is working out in front and changes directions when you do, don't try to over-control. The dog is the one with the nose, and the more you allow it to do its job, the better the

dog will work.

Most owners of bootlicking dogs have created the problem because they have a fear of the dog being out of sight. Anytime their dog disappears for more than a few seconds, they are calling and whistling – and zapping with the e-collar, the very worst thing you can do! Never, ever stimulate a dog when you cannot see what it is doing. Suppose your dog is out of your sight and you hit the hot button because you want it to come back, and the dog has just established a point. What have you just done to your dog?

Now that we know what bootlickers/shoe polishers are and how they come to be, let's look at how to fix one. The first thing needed is a large, safe place where the dog can run without fear of roads or cars. A backyard is not big enough, since this training will require the dog to get well away from you and perhaps even out of sight.

The second thing needed is prey-chase drive. This means the dog has to be crazy about birds and want to get them, find them, hunt them, and chase them – a dog with no desire for birds will never make a bird dog. Exposure to birds will make all the difference, and allowing the dog to run, bump, and chase birds with no fear of correction is a good start – the control can come later.

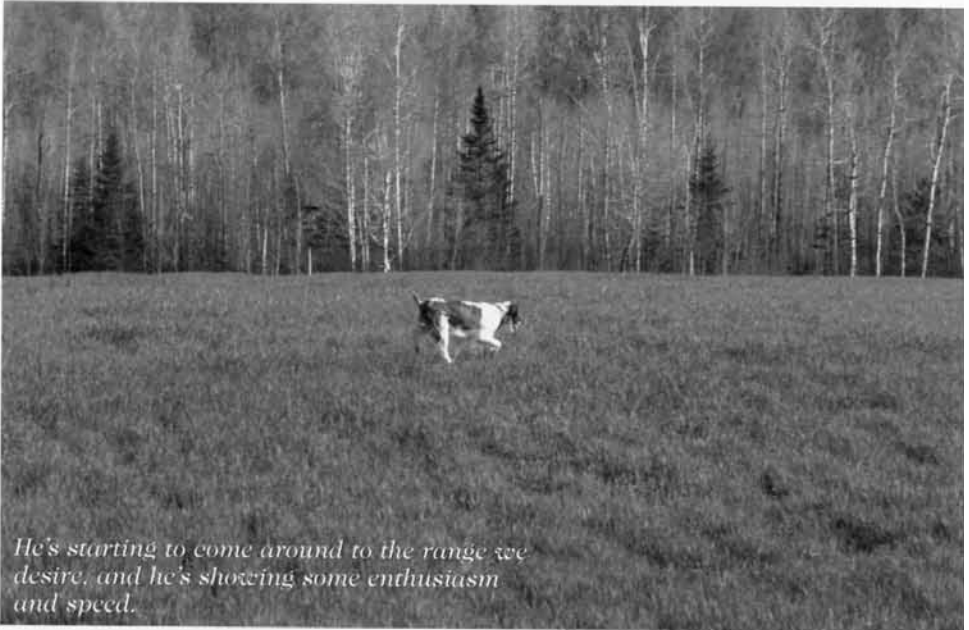
Now we've got to give the dog a reason to go out away from us and hunt. Sometimes running a bootlicker with another dog that will range out and hunt will help. You'll need some birds to use, pigeons being ideal. Plant them close at first – perhaps 20 yards or so. Use the same location several times so the dog forms an association with birds being planted in that spot. Before long, it will be all you can do to let the dog out of the truck because it will want to race to that same place to see if there's a bird. This a good thing and a huge step in the right direction, so let the dog find the bird and chase it, time after time.

Add distance and more birds as the dog's confidence builds. As you add distance, you should see the dog wanting to run out to where it thinks there may be birds. The more successes the dog has, the more it will want to hunt, and you'll see a marked increase in both drive and determination as the dog runs to the cover to look for birds.

Now here's the major hump for the trainer to work on, and it can be difficult to get over. Being a bird dog is a high-risk occupation. It comes with some potential issues, like skunks, porcupines, snakes, and so on. This is all part of the job. But

remember, dogs don't look at this stuff the same way we do. Part of being a good bird dog owner is letting go and allowing the dog to hunt. We can minimize the risks by knowing the area we're hunting and with more training later on. But while trying to cure a bootlicker, it's important to not try to hack on the dog for being out of sight. Let the dog go, and trust it to come back.

The easiest way to cure a bootlicker, of course, is to not have one to start with. This training begins with puppies. Start them on short walks and let them run and play; don't belabor them with commands. The only time a puppy really needs to come to you is when it's time to go home. Resist the temptation to call them in every few minutes, and instead, encourage their exploration. If you stay quiet and change directions often, the puppy will watch and go with you without your having to say anything. This allows a pup to grow into its natural range, which is whatever heredity and terrain dictate. If you feel safe, your dog will feel safe. If you are nervous and apprehensive, you'll pass that on to your dog. Puppies especially will want to stay with you, and at seven weeks, their range may only be a few feet or yards – though range increases with maturity, and it's important to encourage that.

As they say, beauty is in the eye of the beholder, and the range that appeals to one hunter may not appeal to another. Regardless, no one wants a bootlicker or a shoe-polisher; what we want is to hunt birds, and that requires a dog that is willing to leave the apron strings.

They can't leave if we don't cut those strings and let them go. Dogs are pack animals, and they don't want to run off. They may not want to handle, they may get lost sometimes, but they always want to go home with you. Trust in that: Let them go and do the job they're bred to do.

Body Language

Most people that have been around horses for a length of time understand that horses read off of body language. When people think of body language with regards to horses they mostly associate that with the handler being on the ground and while that is important, there is a whole other “dance” to be had when the rider gets into the saddle. The body language is a little different, but just as important.

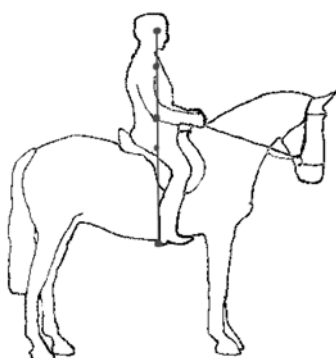
Head: The best place to start is at the top. Your head is heavier than you may think and your horse can feel it move. It is important to hold your head up and look where it is that you want your horse to go. Your horse can feel where you are looking because your body naturally shifts in that direction without you even thinking about it.

Hands: The hands are important while riding but they should not be relied upon as the only form of communication between horse and rider. Hands should be quiet and light, never heavy. The main purpose of hands is to help set the horses head and help regulate speed. Some steering can be done with the hands but that should mostly be left to the lower body.

Seat: Many riders do not realize the importance of using your seat to help direct your horse. The seat can be used to help steer, speed up, slow down and even stop the horse. To use your seat you would mostly need to think about shifting your hips. If you use your eyes to look where you want to go your seat will also shift and help tell your horse what direction to head in. When it is time to speed up you will engage your seat and ask your horse to move forward, to slow down you relax the seat. Stopping can be almost totally done by the seat once the horse has been trained to respond to that cue. To stop the horse with your seat you completely disengage, I tell my students to pretend like they are sitting down a couch and relax when they want the horse to stop. In this picture this horse is working completely off of the riders legs and seat, that is why it is able to compete at a high level with no saddle and bridle. The rider tells the horse everything with her body.



Legs: The legs work with the seat to help guide the horse and regulate speed. The riders lower body is often forgotten but is actually very important. Legs are not just to kick, leg pressure can be used to entirely steer the horse if he has been trained to respond to leg pressure. If your horse has not been trained for leg pressure, you can start helping him yourself by using your legs and eventually he will learn and begin to respond. When using your legs it is important to remember that horses move away from pressure. For example, if you wanted your horse to move to the right then you would push with your left leg and vice versa. The portion of your leg that you want to use on your horse is your calf muscle, not the heel as many riders want to do. I tell my riders to think about making their toe touch their knee. This helps the rider to elongate their calf muscle and therefore increase the area of leg that will push on the horses side. In this photo the rider is asking his horse to keep his body straight and move sideways to the right. The rider does that by pushing with the calf of his left leg.



Correct body position is essential for all of the above listed aids to work. However, if you take some time to become aware of your body your horse will understand you better and you will be more comfortable and better balanced in the saddle. If you can use your legs to help steer your horse, you can pull on his mouth less with your hands. Anytime you can use the reins less and your body more you are doing your horse a favor. This is not something that comes to a rider overnight, it requires practice and muscle memory. The work is worth the reward when a higher level of communication between you and your horse is established. Eyes up, heels down!

The Humane Society of the U.S.: It's Not About Sheltering Animals

If you ask most people what they think about the Humane Society of the United States, they'll probably think well of it just by its name alone. And if they've seen HSUS's ads, which are full of needy dogs and cats, people are likely to have an even more favorable impression of this animal rescue group.

That is what HSUS is all about, right? Rescuing and caring for animals?

Wrong.

Despite its name, the Humane Society of the United States is not affiliated with any local pet shelters that share the "humane society" name. It's not a national office for pet shelters. And it's not a government agency—despite the fact that some of its personnel have worn badges during field work.

So what is HSUS? It is a radical animal liberation group with an agenda similar to PETA's (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals). HSUS is against hunting, against medical research using animals, against the use of animals for food, and against the use of animals for clothing. HSUS's CEO Wayne Pacelle has even made shocking anti-pet comments.

Though HSUS has more money and clout than PETA, there's no reason to think it can't be exposed. To do that, we have to understand the gap between perception and reality—and close it. HSUS's Deceptive Fundraising

According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, 56 percent of households have a pet and the pet industry generates more than \$50 billion annually. Americans love pets—it's no secret.

The pictures of helpless pets scarred by abuse and neglect arouses a strong nurturing instinct in us. And it is no surprise that groups purporting to fight animal cruelty feature these images in the vast majority of commercials soliciting donations. The Humane Society of the United States' annual budget of about \$130 million testifies to the power of this human sentiment—and HSUS's ability to take advantage of it.

HSUS intentionally capitalizes on the confusion it creates about its mission. The vast majority—85 percent in a two-year review conducted by our project, www.HumaneWatch.org—of the animals shown in HSUS commercials are dogs and cats. Those images have helped to shape public opinion about the group. A poll by Opinion Research Corporation found that 71 percent of Americans wrongly believe that HSUS "is an umbrella group that represents thousands of local humane shelters across America." Sixty-eight percent mistakenly believe that HSUS "contributes most of its money to local organizations that care for dogs and cats."

This misperception of HSUS—fueled by HSUS's deceptive advertising—enabled HSUS to raise over \$100 million from the public in 2012.

When fundraising, HSUS advertises the sad fact that millions

of dogs and cats are euthanized in pet shelters every year. Even just spending half of its \$130 million budget could save many of animals from premature death. But HSUS's tax returns show that the group contributes only 1 percent of its budget to pet shelters. It regularly puts more money into its own pension fund than it contributes to shelters.

It's hardly shocking then that the American Institute of Philanthropy gives HSUS a "C-minus" rating for spending fistfuls of cash on fundraising to churn out appeal after appeal for donations. AIP finds that HSUS spends up to 45 percent of its budget on overhead costs. AIP's president has said, "If you like getting those mailings and want to pay for more of them, support the Humane Society [of the U.S.]." (One of the few services that does give HSUS good marks is the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance. However, the WGA is obviously conflicted when it takes money from charities it rates—\$15,000 a year in the case of HSUS.)

Another watchdog, Animal People News, finds that HSUS spends even more of its budget—55 percent—on overhead. Either way, that's a lot of money going to fundraising instead of caring for animals.

Where Does the Money Go?

What programs does HSUS fund with all the money it gets by tugging at heart strings? After the big salaries and pension plan funding the answer is politics. The focus on political activism means that HSUS does far more to keep lobbyists, lawyers, and professional agitators well-housed and fed than it does abandoned dogs. The individual issues can sound obscure and even deliberately boring at first, like HSUS's campaign for elimination of hen cages (which help protect the birds from disease and predation), the banning of lead shot in hunting, or regulations on dog breeding, such as Missouri's Proposition B, a 2010 ballot initiative.

Don't miss the bigger picture. HSUS's strategy is to overthrow humanity's relationship with animals—but in incremental steps. To that end it lobbies to pass laws that make owning and using animals more expensive and difficult.

There's a difference between animal "rights" and animal welfare. Animal welfare is about treating the animals we use well. Animal "rights" (or "liberation") is about stopping people from owning or using animals.

HSUS positions itself as an animal welfare group in its messaging, because that's what Americans support. Americans pet some animals and are OK with eating others. But HSUS's real goal is animal rights, and that is reflected by who runs the show.

HSUS is staffed with veterans of more straightforwardly radical animal liberation groups. HSUS CEO Wayne Pacelle formerly led the Fund for Animals, an anti-hunting group that merged with HSUS in 2005, after Pacelle took the reins the previous year.

Pacelle got started with animal-rights activism by sabotaging hunting. He was arrested in 1986, while still a student at Yale, for harassing hunters. Five years later, as national director for the Fund for Animals, Pacelle conducted a campaign against hunters in the Rocky Mountain west. He told the Associated Press that "...if we could shut down all sport hunting in a moment we would."

HSUS vice president Paul Shapiro began his career in activism by founding Compassion Over Killing (COK), a radical animal rights group in the mold of PETA. Kristie Middleton, who does corporate outreach for HSUS, is a former street theater activist for PETA. Ann Chynoweth, a senior director of HSUS's "End Animal Cruelty" campaign, is a former PETA employee.

So is Matt Prescott, who is the man behind PETA's offensive "Holocaust on Your Plate" campaign. As you can imagine from the title of the project, Prescott compares the food industry to the system of work- and death-camps maintained by the Nazis to exterminate Jews. "We've kept the systems and the attitudes, just changed the victims," said Prescott. Now, at HSUS, he has kept the attitudes, just changed the scenery.

"I don't want to see another cat or dog born"

HSUS says it "works to end the worst abuses in hunting and maintain longstanding protection for animals where they already exist." Similar statements exist in other areas—HSUS is just against "the worst abuses."

HSUS carefully avoids saying what it would do, "if we could."

That's intentional. But the evidence we have is revealing.

HSUS CEO Wayne Pacelle candidly described his vision for animal liberation when he was leading the Fund for Animals. When asked if he envisioned a future without pets, Pacelle said, "If I had my personal view perhaps that might take hold. In fact, I don't want to see another cat or dog born."

Pacelle also admitted, "I don't have a hands-on fondness for animals. I did not grow up bonded to any particular nonhuman animal...there's no special bond between me and other animals." Earlier, Pacelle even wrote in the Yale Daily News that "I don't love animals or think they are cute."

And this guy directs the multi-million dollar "Humane Society"?

The ultimate goal of animal liberation groups is to stop the use of animals by people. HSUS's former vice president Miyun Park admitted as much, saying "we don't want any of these animals to be raised and killed [for food] ... we work on promoting veganism," meaning a diet free of animal products. Shapiro has also added that "nothing is more important than promoting veganism." Wayne Pacelle was the person who implemented a vegan office policy soon after he took over HSUS.

HSUS pursues its vegan strategy with economics. One surefire way to make Tofurky appealing is to make real turkey prohibitively expensive in comparison. And that's just what HSUS has done in states like California, where it successfully pushed Proposition 2 in 2008. The measures are designed to sound moderate, but in reality they force farmers into costly infrastructure changes. Those with less access to capital—smaller farmers—are likely to go out of business. In the case of Proposition 2, UC-Davis experts predicted

it would bankrupt the state egg industry.

Similarly, HSUS's Proposition B ballot initiative in Missouri was designed to target breeder businesses with more than 50 dogs—no matter how humanely the animals were managed. Certainly, that rankled farmers (who often have hundreds or thousands of animals), while providing an arbitrary cap that HSUS could try to lower in the future.

A FUTURE WITH FEWER PETS?

Like its stance on animal products in the human diet or hunting, HSUS's stance on pets may start out as one of targeting specific acute abuse, move on to wide-ranging punitive regulation, and end in a total ban.

The very name Humane Society of the United States implies that this group aims at an improvement of man's relationship with animals. But what these activists want is the radical reform of almost all human society.

They would end the practice of hunting "overnight" if they could. They would put every rancher and dairy farmer in unemployment lines. They would take sausage and eggs off of breakfast plates.

When PETA believes that seeing eye dogs have been enslaved, it isn't a great leap to hear these elitists declaring that most people aren't suitable as pet owners?

We hopefully will never get to the point where HSUS has the power to realize their dreams—but it will take a lot of grassroots work. People need to be educated about HSUS, and informed about what they don't know.

There are a few events that may help crack the façade. HSUS is a defendant in federal racketeering litigation which alleges that HSUS and two of its in-house attorneys took part in a witness bribery scheme. Several members of Congress sent a letter to the IRS Inspector General asking for an investigation into whether the group has violated its tax-exempt status by getting involved in excessive lobbying.

Political alliances have also beat back HSUS at the ballot box—traditionally its strong suit. In 2011, the dog breeding community and the agriculture community were able to roll back many parts of HSUS's Proposition B victory the year before. And last year, an alliance of sportsmen and agriculture beat an HSUS ballot initiative in North Dakota by a 2-to-1 margin.

HSUS may have a lot of money, but the American people don't like to be misled, swindled, or cheated. HSUS's weak spot is the major gap between how it holds itself out to the public and how it uses its money. Spreading the word any way you can about the real HSUS is the key to closing the gap—and reducing HSUS's support.

September 2013 Delegates Report

Newark, NJ

Summary of Monday Delegates Committees:

Dog Show Rules Committee:

- a. Finalize the working on Chapter 7 Section 1 which deals with judges' eligibility and judges' conflict.
- b. Discussed the territory issue (Chapter 2 Section 3) and forwarded the committees comments, which would be the elimination of territories, to the board of directors.
- c. Discussed the inclusion of an altered veteran champion class at all breed shows. (Chapter 11 Section 8)
- d. Discussed the response of the committee to AKC staff concerns regarding our concept of a PeeWee Junior Showmanship Special Attraction.
- e. AKC Staff presented a white paper with a summary of the rules and board policies regarding Specialties (Independent and Evening), Supported Entries, Concurrent Specialties and Group Shows.
- f. Discussed the dog reinstatement procedure with committee members and AKC staff to review the current forms and to address the issue of permanent identity of the dogs in question.

Field Trial and Hunting Test Clubs Committee:

- a. Field Spaniel Society of America wants AKC field trial titles for the four spaniel "minor" breeds.
- b. Entry trends to July, 2013: Pointing breeds down 1%, balance flat.
- c. Crossover program which allows breeds to participate in two different hunting tests is successful.
- d. A questionnaire is being developed by the committee to send to all performance clubs about their events, what they do and how they publicize.
- e. Mean seeds: proposal to Illinois Bar, Animal Law Council that they consider seeking a statutory ban on mean seeds.
- f. The Canine Health Foundation has given a grant to study tick diseases.

Parent Clubs Committee:

- a. Noted that the Humane Fund has money available for parent club rescue. The parent club/rescue must apply for it.

The Forum held on Tuesday was an overall review of Herding, Earthdog and Coursing Events presented by members of the Herding, Earthdog, and Coursing Committee. It showed videos of dogs running the various events.

At the General Meeting, the first order of business was the election of committee members. Dallas Harsa and Tom Sharp presented the name and logo of AKC Companion Animal Recovery (AKC CAR) will now be known as AKC ReUnite. The Trailer Task Force announced the result of their 3 month study. AKC Pet Disaster Relief, "Help us Roll Out Help" was announced. The disaster trailer was on display at the June Meeting and will be on display at the AKC National Show in Orlando in December. More information can be obtained at www.akcreunite.org/relief.

The delegates passed the proposed amendment to Chapter 4 (Approval of Judges Panels and Premium Lists of the Rules applying to Dog shows) which would eliminate the different time frames for sending premium lists to perspective exhibitors based on the delivery method.

FC The Crash Scene, a 5 year-old white and orange male Brittany, is the ABC Pheasant Champion for 2013. Crash ran in the 22nd brace on the last day of the trial and impressed the judges with a strong forward race, 2 pheasant finds and a single quail find, all handled with immaculate manners. Crash is owned by Paul Rosevear of Peterburg, KY and was ably handled by Tom Tracy, Jr. of Burchard, NE. Runner-Up Champion was awarded to FC Uncle Kracker, 6 year-old white and orange male Brittany, owned by Bo and Renae Ackerman of Clermont, GA and also handled by Tom Tracy, Jr. Kracker ran in the 13th brace on Wednesday morning, filling up the course and scoring 3 quail finds during his hour. Third place went to a youngster, 18-month old KJ's Irish Whizky, a white and orange male owned by Ken and Jane Windom of Cambridge, IA and handled by Bob Burchett of Argyle, IA. Mickey, as he is called, ran a strong race from the 4th brace on the first day and carded a single quail find. Fourth place was awarded to FC The Ace Of Spade, 7 year-old white and liver male Brittany, owned by Dave Capstick and handled by Tim Self, both of Jonesburg, MO, running in the 8th brace. Spade scored finds on a rooster pheasant and a covey of quail, and honored his bracemate twice, all with great style and manners.

Judges were well-known bird dog men Skip Wonnell of McLouth, KS and Bruce Bryant of Silver Lake, IA. Each man gave his utmost attention to the dogs as they looked for independence, intelligence, stamina, and style required to be named Champion of this prestigious event.

THE RUNNING:

BRACE 1: TNT'S SHOSHONI SHAKE N' BAKE (BUBBA) – THOMAS AND CRESCENT CITY GIRL (NOLA) – BURCHETT. The first brace left from north of camp at 8:00. Temperatures were in the low 50s with high, wispy clouds and a slight breeze from the south. Both dogs broke away to the front. Bubba suffered an indiscretion at 17 along the fence line west of the alfalfa field. Nola had a stop-to-flush for a quail at 29 south of the orchard feeder. She scored a find on a quail at 37 just north of the road crossing, but moved a quail in the bean field past on the south course at 41, ending her bid early.

BRACE 2: RU-JEM'S "LAST" PENNY (PENNY) – TRACY AND KINWASHKLY DIRTY NED PEPPER (NED) – JOHNSON. This brace was loosed from the ridgetop north of the hedgerow. Ned was found standing by scout at 3 along the tree-lined draw west of the hedgerow. Scott's initial flushing attempt was unsuccessful, but a pheasant lifted in front of the dog during the relocation. Penny continued around the south course, rimming the edges and staying generally forward. She had a brief absence after crossing over to the north course but reappeared in the orchard. She moved a quail east of the old barn site and was up at 47.

BRACE 3: WAYSIDE'S BLUERIDGE RUNNER (BLUE) – JOHNSON AND BRISCO'S MR. STUB (STUB) – TRIMBLE. The dogs broke away from the old barn site at 9:40, headed west. Blue was seen under a bird at 4 along the fence west of the alfalfa field. Stub had a stop-to-flush on a quail at 7 by the

pond in the northwest corner of the course. He scored a nice find on a quail at 11 in the fence row south of the alfalfa field, with all in order. Stub seemed to be hunting mode today, inspecting all areas that might be holding a bird. He stopped at 18 along the south edge of the CRP field near the west crossing, but no bird was produced. He stopped again at the feeder on the south end of the orchard but was sent on after no bird was found. He moved east about 150 yards and stopped along the west extension of that fence line. After an extensive relocation attempt, it appeared he might be trailing a running pheasant along but no bird was ever produced and Ray picked him up at 36.

BRACE 4: SHADY WAY RED TAIL HAWK (BEAU) – JOHN AND KJ'S IRISH WHIZKY (MICKEY) – BURCHETT. The first brace of the afternoon was turned loose at the normal breakaway point on the south course, heading south. The dogs were away to the front and were soon seen at the hedgerow. They came around and across the front, then took the middle ridgeline to the south. Both dogs were running big and wide. Beau came across the bottom but was out of pocket for a time. Mickey came around and across the bottom portion of the course before pointing at 17 along the terrace south of the hedgerow. A single quail was produced with all in order. Mickey continued around showing good range and application. Beau suffered an extended absence after crossing to the north course, but showed at 43 in the alfalfa field on the far north end. He pointed at 53 along ditch north of camp but the initial flushing attempt produced no birds. An extended relocation effort culminated in a quail being flushed at time. Meanwhile, Mickey continued on across the road and finished his hour on the south course.

BRACE 5: GEORGIA'S TEXAS TWO STEP (GEORGIA) – TRACY AND TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD (BLIZZARD) – TILLSON. The dogs were released at the regular all age breakaway point on the south course and proceeded forward through the hedgerow. Blizzard pointed at 4 along the terrace south of the hedgerow. A covey of 6 to 8 quail was flushed with all in order. Both dogs were found standing at 10 adjacent to the fence along the road on the far south end of the course. Tommy crossed the fence and attempted to flush but his initial effort produced no bird. Both dogs were then lifted over the fence for their relocation attempts. Georgia headed east and Blizzard headed west, then found a low spot along the fence and crossed back onto the course. Ed then elected to proceed onward while Tommy continued his flushing attempts. Georgia moved along the ditch, stopping periodically, over a period of some 7 minutes before Tommy was able to coax two hen pheasants to fly. All was in order and dog and handler crossed back onto the course and proceeded westward. Meanwhile, Blizzard pointed along the ditch south of the pond, but suffered a style faux pas during the flushing attempt and was picked up. Georgia continued around the course at good range, around the north course and back through the orchard where she finished her hour to the front.

BRACE 6: WIMBERLEY ROWDY BO-DANDY (ROWDY) – JOHNSON AND AUGUST RUSH (AUGUST) – TRACY. The last brace of the afternoon broke away from the normal all age start point and ran hard down the left side of the course before going through the hedgerow. August stopped at 5 along the edge of a patch of CRP cover, but an extended flushing effort and relocation yielded no birds. Meanwhile, Rowdy disappeared in the cover somewhere west of the hedgerow and was not returned to judgment. (He was later found buried in heavy cover on point.) August was sent on around the south course and pointed at 18 in the church corner. A single quail was produced with all in order. At 21, August put a bird in the air along the terrace south of the hedgerow, ending his bid. Meanwhile, Scott pulled his tracking device to locate Rowdy, ending the first day's running.

BRACE 7: BLUERIDGE HUNTER GONE WILD (HUNTER) – JOHNSON AND CEDAR VALLEY BANDIT (BANDIT) – TRACY. The first brace Tuesday morning broke away north of camp at 8:00 under clear skies, with mild

temperatures and a slight breeze. Both dogs were away to the front and through the orchard, with Hunter having the wider range of the two. At 12, a pheasant flushed near the old barn site. Bandit was whoa'd to a stop in time, but Hunter went with the bird and was up. Bandit continued on and pointed at 19 in the fence line along the west edge of the alfalfa field but no bird could be produced. He moved on some 75 yards and pointed again along the same fence line. A small covey was produced with all in order. He scored a second quail find at 27 by the fence along the south edge of the alfalfa field. He was found on point by scout at 37 near a ravine at the woods edge on the east side of the field south of the orchard. A quail was produced and the dog sent on. He crossed the ridge, then pointed again at 41 in the next ravine. No bird was produced and the relocation attempt was unsuccessful. He came around the corner of the dog-leg in the southeast corner of the north field and had a pheasant fly as he ran past it. He stopped and was credited with a stop to flush. After crossing the road, he pointed again at 51 near the all age breakaway point. No bird was produced and he was asked to relocate, but disappeared in the heavy cover to the east and time expired. He was seen moving about 4 minutes later.

BRACE 8: SNIKSOH SALLY (SALLY) – BURCHETT AND THE ACE OF SPADE (SPADE) – SELF. The pair was released at the normal all age breakaway point. A bird was seen in the air at 1 in Sally's vicinity but it was not determined what caused it to fly so both dogs were left down. They continued through the keyhole in the hedgerow, with Spade taking the left edge and Sally going right. Sally went on a short excursion while Spade was found standing in the bean field at 5. Tim flushed a cock pheasant and fired, with all in order. Spade looked solid as a rock on point and maintained this posture through the flush and flight of the bird. He was sent on toward the church corner, where Sally caught up to the front at 10. Sally pointed, with Spade backing, at 10 in the feed strip along the south side of the course. Both dogs stood mannerly throughout the flush. After being sent on, Spade pointed again at 13 along the edge of the ditch coming down from the pond. He again showed great intensity on point throughout the flush and flight of the birds. Sally scored her second pheasant find at 19 in an un-mowed strip of CRP cover north of the rock crossing with all in order. She pointed again at 22 on the far side of a crossing through the tree-lined draw west of the hedgerow. Spade was whoa'd to a stop on the near side while Bob attempted to flush. Sally was asked to relocate and Spade was taken on. During her relocation attempt, Sally bumped a small covey of quail ending her bid early. Meanwhile, Spade continued on to the north course. He made some very nice moves during his hour, especially early in the brace, but shortened up during the last 15 or 20 minutes. He finished his hour at the gate west of the alfalfa field.

BRACE 9: MCCHESEY'S I GOT MY MOJO WORKING (MOJO) – JOHN AND CAROLINA SEA BISCUIT (BISCUIT) – JOHNSON. This brace left from the northwest gate and across the CRP field heading southeast. Biscuit required quite a bit of handling to get him through the orchard. Meanwhile, Mojo pointed at 9 along the bean field south of the orchard. Jim flushed a pheasant and the dog turned to mark the bird's flight. He was taken on and both dogs crossed over to the south side. Mojo was standing at 18 by a dogwood thicket north of the hedgerow, but no bird was produced. Biscuit pointed at 28 along a mowed strip on the south side of the course but Scott was unable to produce a bird. Both dogs continued on around the south course, crossing back over to the north course toward the old barn site. At 56, a pheasant flushed in front of Mojo, who leapt into the air after the bird, ending what was looking like a strong bid for the championship. Biscuit ended his hour east of the old barn site without bird contact.

BRACE 10: CAST-A-BRITT MICRO SAMMIE (SAMMIE) – BURCHETT AND ROUSTABOUT'S WHITE KNIGHT (LANCE) – TRACY. The temperature had risen to the high 80s by the time the first brace after lunch was loosed at the normal all age breakaway point on the south course. Both dogs made good opening casts, but the brace ended early when Sammie did not stop for a pheasant hen that flushed a few feet in front of her at 8 and Lance encountered a similar situation approximately 2 minutes later.

BRACE 11: SNIKSOH WINDTUCK WILLY (WILLY) – BURCHETT AND TRUCKER'S WILD RIDE (RIDER) – TRIMBLE. The dogs were turned loose on

the far south side of the course, headed west. The heat was becoming a factor and both dogs seemed to be affected by it. Neither dog was putting down the race they are capable of having and Ray elected to pick up Rider after crossing over on to the north course at 20. Willy was left down to the north end of the course at the old barn site, where he too was picked up by his handler at 33.

BRACE 12: JAGOUB'S BUZZ'N BAYOU (SKEETER) – TRACY. Skeeter ran as a bye dog due to his brace mate being scratched. Tommy called point at 8 in the ash tree motte southwest of the alfalfa field. A trio of quail was produced with all in order. Skeeter was taken on, but seemed to have difficulty finding his way through the orchard. He was finally returned to judgment and continued on across the road to the south course. He was out of pocket again, being spotted only briefly in the bottoms at the west edge of the course, but not returned to judgment within the allowable period of time.

BRACE 13: UNCLE KRACKER (KRACKER) – TRACY AND BRUSHBUSTER LAKOTA JILL (JILL) – JOHN. The first brace Wednesday morning broke away north of camp under a mostly cloudy sky, temperatures in the low 60s, high humidity, and very little wind. Both dogs filled the course as they went around, showing great independence. Coming out of the orchard, Kracker pointed at 35 but Jill came through and took out the bird so was up. Tom fired and took Kracker on. He crossed on to the south course at 39 and pointed at 43 along the feed strip south of the hedge row. A single quail was produced with all in order. Kracker pointed again at 44 along the woods edge south and east of the hedge row, but no bird was produced. He pointed at 58 along the tree-lined ditch south of the pond and a small covey of quail was flushed. Again, all was in order. Time expired during the flushing attempt, so he was released then called back to finish his hour.

BRACE 14: KD'S SLIP AND SLIDE (SPLASH) – TILLSON AND RICOCHET GUNSMOKES MR. DILLION (DILLION) – BURCHETT. This brace was loosed from the far southwest corner of the course, heading north. Both dogs broke away hard to the front. Splash pointed at 32 under a cedar along the fence by the pond in the northwest corner of the north course. A cock pheasant was flushed with Splash exhibiting good manners throughout. Dillon pointed at 42 along the head of the north-south ditch between camp and the red cedar forest. Splash moved in front of the standing dog and was up. The initial flushing attempt was not successful so Dillon was asked to relocate. Meanwhile, Ed was going in the opposite direction taking Splash back to his horse and walked up a pair of quail. Dillon was taken on, but his range and pattern were not championship caliber on this day and Bob elected to pick him up when he reached camp at 48.

BRACE 15: RUSTY'S ROYAL RUN (RUSTY) – JOHN AND SNIKSOH LITTLE DIAMOND (KATE) – BURCHETT. The last brace of the morning left from the normal all age breakaway point. Cloud cover from earlier in the morning had disappeared and the sky was mostly clear with the temperature rising. Both dogs moved around the south course at good range and a forward pattern, but had no bird contact until after crossing over to the north course. Rusty pointed at 40 east of the old barn site. Two quail were produced with all in order. Meanwhile, Kate went on point on the west side of the old barn site but no bird was produced. Kate pointed at 47, with Rusty backing, along the fence near the pond in the northwest corner. A quail was produced with both dogs showing good manners. Kate pointed again at 50 in a grassy strip west of the alfalfa field. A hen pheasant rose when Bob began his flushing attempt and Kate again stood very mannerly as the bird took flight. Rusty scored another quail find at 51 in the ash-tree motte south of the alfalfa field, with Kate backing. All was in order as the birds lifted. Both dogs finished the hour on the south end of the orchard.

BRACE 16: TLM COPILOT (HANK) – TRACY AND WIMBERLEY JIMDANDY (DANDY) – JOHNSON. The first brace of the afternoon left the all age breakaway point at 1:15 PM. Dandy had stops-to-flush on pheasants at 7 and 15 and a small covey find at 12, but suffered a severe lapse of style on a second quail find at 22 and was up. Meanwhile, Hank disappeared and Tom called for the tracking device, thus ending this brace early.

BRACE 17: ALAR'S TANGO BAR (TANGO) – TILLSON AND RU-JEM'S A TOUCH OF BOURBON (CHUG) – TRACY. Chug's owner and normal handler, Jerry McGee, blew out his knee two days prior to the running of this Championship

and Tom Tracy, Jr. ran the dog instead. The strength of the bond between Chug and Jerry was evident, however, as this former National Champion and 3-time Purina Award Winner was not able to find Jerry and essentially refused to run for anyone else. He was taken back to camp at 5. Tango continued on alone, but was not having her best run today and Ed elected to pick up at 22 at the end of the alfalfa field.

BRACE 18: TOUCH OF BOURBON LITTLE CHUG (CARSON) – BURCHETT AND LAMB’S JUST REWARD (JUNIOR) – JOHN. The final brace of the day left from the gate west of the alfalfa field. Both dogs were forward and crossed over to the south course. A bird popped in the air at the head of the big ditch east of the rock crossing as the two dogs went past. Carson stopped but Junior went after the bird, ending his bid early. Carson continued on and scored a pheasant find at 32 at the head of the tree-lined draw southwest of the hedge row. He continued on across the road, where he had an unfortunate encounter with a second pheasant, ending his hour early.

BRACE 19: SHADOW ATTACK (TACK) – TILLSON AND EARLY TIMES (EARL) – TRACY. This brace broke away at 8:00 AM Thursday morning behind camp. Earl pointed at 3 and a pheasant was seen running. A shot was fired with all in order. Tack scored on a quail at 10 along the draw southeast of the old barn site. Earl made several nice casts on the north course near the old barn site and again south of the orchard. Scout called point for Earl at 46 along east draw north of the hedgerow. No bird was produced and the dog was taken on. Neither dog had further bird contact and finished the hour on the south side of the course.

BRACE 20: SPARKY’S PRAIRIE WIND GYPSY (GYPSY) – JOHN AND SHADOW’S TEQUILA TRYST (TRYSTAN) – TILLSON. The dogs were released on the south side of the south course heading west. Trystan went on point at 2 along the first draw. Neither the initial flushing attempt nor an extensive relocation effort produced a bird and she was sent on but suffered a second non-productive later and was picked up. Gypsy pointed at 45 in a feed strip atop a ridge south of the alfalfa field. Jim could not initially produce a bird and sent her on and she pointed again another 50 yards further down. A quail was produced with all in order. Gypsy disappeared at 52 approaching the orchard and was not returned to judgment.

BRACE 21: JOKER’S JACKPOT (JACK) – JOHN AND SHADY’S DESERT KNIGHT (KNIGHT) – JOHNSON. The dogs were loosed from the all age breakaway point on the south course. Jack pointed at 8 and a quail was produced with all in order. Knight pointed at 13 southwest of the pond and a cock pheasant was flushed with Knight showing good manners throughout. Both dogs were seen standing at 18 along the east edge south of the keyhole but neither handler could produce a bird and dogs were taken on. Knight finished the hour without further bird contact. Jack scored a quail find at 59.

BRACE 22: THE CRASH SCENE (CRASH) – TRACY AND OCAJE (GRACE) –GOWIN. The brace was turned loose from all age breakaway at 1:00 PM. Both dogs were away to the left with nice opening moves. Crash was spotted by scout at 5 below the terrace feeder. A

rooster was seen leaving but the judge did not actually see the dog pointing it so Crash was credited with a stop-to-flush. Grace was found standing at 22 along the north edge of draw west of the hedgerow but no bird was produced. Grace appeared to be in hunting mode today, checking out all likely objectives as she made her way back to the front. She caught the front at 41 past the double crossing on the north side. Crash pointed along the feed strip east of the old barn site and a rooster pheasant was flushed with all in order. He was credited for a stop-to-flush on a quail at 48 in the path going up the steep crossing west of the old barn site. Crash pointed again at 55 in the ash tree motte southwest of the alfalfa field. He stood very mannerly as a small covey of quail was flushed. Meanwhile, Grace was pointing at 56 along the fence south of the alfalfa field. A single quail was produced and she was sent on. She finished her hour at the deer stand north of the west crossing. Meanwhile, Crash made it to the orchard where he pointed again at 59 and another cock pheasant was put to flight as time expired. During his hour Crash was forward, showing mostly between 10 and 2 and on the edges, with only one brief period when he was out of pocket.

BRACE 23: KINWASHKLY FAT BASTARD (FATZ) – TRACY AND TEQUILA SCORCHER (LINCOLN) – TILLSON. The final brace broke away under mostly cloudy skies at the normal all age breakaway point at about 2:30. Fatz was seen moving under a flushing rooster at 9 near the terrace feeder below the hedgerow so was picked up. Lincoln continued on alone but his race today was not strong enough to push the winners so Ed elected to pick up when he crossed the road at 28.

The Brittany Bites Recipe Collection

BAKING POWDER BISCUITS

2 cups all-purpose flour
1 tablespoon sugar, if desired
3 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
½ cup shortening
¾ cup milk

Heat oven to 450°F. In large bowl, mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening, using pastry blender (or pulling 2 table knives through ingredients in opposite directions), until mixture looks like fine crumbs. Stir in milk until dough leaves side of bowl (dough will be soft and sticky).

On lightly floured surface, gently roll dough in flour to coat. Knead lightly 10 times. Roll or pat ½ inch thick. Cut with floured 2 1/2-inch biscuit cutter. On ungreased cookie sheet, place biscuits about 1 inch apart for crusty sides, touching for soft sides. Bake 10 to 12 minutes or until golden brown. Immediately remove from cookie sheet to wire rack. Serve warm.

BRISKET CARBONNADE

1 - 3lb to 4lb fresh beef brisket
3 medium onions, sliced
1- 12-oz can of beer (1 1/2 cups)
1 Tbl of brown sugar
2 tsp instant beef bouillon granules
4 whole black peppercorns or 1/8 tsp cracked pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
1 bay leaf
1/4 tsp dried thyme, crushed
1/4 cup flour

Preheat oven to 350

Trim excess fat from brisket. season meat with a little salt and pepper. place in a 13x9x2 baking pan; cover with the sliced onions. Sprinkle lightly with salt. reserve 1/3 cup beer. combine remaining beer and next ingredients; pour over meat. Cover with foil. Bake in oven for 3 to 3 1/2 hours or until tender. remove meat to a platter; keep warm. skim off excess fat from pan juices; remove bay leaf.

In a saucepan cook juices down to 2 cups. combine reserved beer and flour; stir into pan juices. cook and stir until thickened and bubbly.

Cook and stir 1 to 2 minutes longer. Season. Slice meat across grain; pass gravy. Serves 10

* Note: This can also be done in the crock pot. Cook on low all day.

WARM CHOCOLATE PUDDING

In a saucepan, combine 1/2 cup sugar, 1/4 cup cornstarch and a pinch of salt. Whisk in 3 cups milk and 2 eggs yolks over medium heat. Stir in 6 oz. of chocolate until melted. Divide pudding among ramekins; let cool slightly. Serve plain or with whipped cream.





AMERICAN BRITTANY CLUB QUAIL CLASSIC/CHAMPIONSHIP

The 50th running of the ABC Quail Classic/Championship commenced Monday, October 14, 2013 at Eureka, Kansas. The Bill & Mary Lynn Oliver ranch has been the venue three times, 1993, 2003 and now in 2013. Since its inaugural running in 1962 at Pinehurst, N.C. there have been only two years when it wasn't held- 1997-98. Eleven states have been past locations from Munson, Florida to Waco, Texas and north to Kansas and points in between.

Sparky's Prairie Wind Gypsy was the winner from a field of 62 starters. She was handled by Jim John of Kansas. Berry Koepke & Karen Fujikawa of Colorado are her proud owners. Gypsy is a four year old, orange and white female out of Jim De Bob's Sparks A Dan D X Two Rivers Skyhawk. She is fast and snappy on the ground and points with style.

The Runner-up was Black Creek Deacon owned by Ron Harling, Jr. of New York and handled by Chad Holman of Illinois. Dee is a six year old male, white and orange out of Perfect Timing X Rebel Jac's Hankerin Jill. He handled the heavy cover well.

The yellow went to The Crash Scene handled by Tom Tracy of Kentucky and is owned by Paul Rosevear also of Kentucky. Crash is also six years old. He is out of Rocklan Red River Runner X Walker's Flash Dancer. He scored with a single find in the buck brush.

Fourth place was awarded to Ocaje (oh-ka-hay) owned, trained and handled by Terry Gowin of Kansas. Grace is a white and orange four year old female that likes to find birds and can use the country. She is out of Just Call Me Roy X Nnhela.

The judges for this event are no strangers to hour competitions being long time pointer competitors and much sought after for their knowledge in the judicial saddle. Dr Gary Cowell of Lancaster, MO and George Hill of Wentzville, Mo worked well together. They were observant to each dog's performance. Both of these gentlemen have donated their time and efforts competing and organizing field trial events.

The ranch has grown in area from 3,500 acres to close to 6,000 acres over the years. We travel across the prairie grasses and along the brushy draws giving dogs opportunity to find birds. Even an occasional prairie chicken can be seen.

All events need planners and executioners to pull off the smooth running. Larry Hagedorn, Herb Rea and Secretary Terry Gowin and water man Francis Clasen were the chiefs along with other volunteers that jumped

in to help them. They held a quail feed on Tuesday evening. Marge Johnson's cream quail was a big hit along with the grilled quail and trimmings. Saturday evening meal was a steak feed, again, with all the delicious accompaniments that make the meal special. Many stories were told and maybe some even enhanced a bit by time gone by.

Steve and Sharon Heineman supply the birds to supplement the native population. Sharon also makes the goodies for the breaks and desserts- that disappear quickly.

There were attendees and handlers from Minnesota, Mississippi, Texas, Illinois, Iowa, Missouri, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Idaho, Kentucky and Colorado. The weather was pleasant fall temps to rain, sleet and snow by the end of the week.

THE RUNNING:

ALAR'S TANGO BAR, TILLSON AND CAROLINA SEA BISCUIT, JOHNSON. It was 58 degrees with rain in the forecast which started later in the morning. Tango had a searching race going to some likely places but was not rewarded with game. Biscuit was the wider of the pair. He covered some ground. He was out of pocket at 45' and last seen at the north end of the lake. He was not returned to judgment.

WAYSIDE'S BLUERIDGE RUNNER, JOHNSON AND TEQUILA'S SCORCHER, TILLSON. Blue moved out across the terrain being wide and forward in the heavy cover. Lincoln has an easy way of going. He worked the draws and at 26' he had bird contact, was fired over and taken on. At 55' point was called, birds left, fired over, he was sent on. At 57' Blue pointed farther up the draw. Birds were flushed with all in order.

WHIZKI'S STING, HOLMAN AND HI PROOF BOOTLEGGER, BURCHETT, Holly ran the plateau then hit the draws. She was out of pocket at 37' atop the plateau at the high post gate, returning, she caught the front at 50'. She had no bird contact in the hour. Mason hunted the cover at moderate range. At 57' he pointed near an osage orange tree cluster. Birds were flushed with good manners. We headed up to the top of the ridge as the hour ended.

Overcast with light misty rain, turning to blowing rain sporadically in the afternoon.

DAKOTA GUNRUNNERS BUCKSHOT, TRACY AND JOKER'S JACKPOT, JOHN. Buck hunted the cover with a few nice casts. He generally ran at moderate range. His hour ended without bird contact. Jack made some nice moves across the hay meadows. He reached to the next objectives but was not rewarded with game.

KJ'S DARLING DARCY, BURCHETT AND GAMBLER'S DOUBLE DOWN, HOLMAN. Darcy was erratic in application and then out of pocket. The locator was called for at 25'. Wilson wanted a closer look at the birds that flushed and was up midway in the hour.

SNIKSOH WIRTDUCK WILLY, BURCHETT AND TLM COPILOT, TRACY. Both dogs were off like a flash. At 21' Willy pointed into a fence line, relocated but nothing could be produced_ Meantime, Hank went east and was out of pocket not being returned to judgment by the middle of the hour.

SHADOW ATTACK, TILLSON AND WIMBERLEY JIMDANDY, JOHNSON. Cool temperatures in the mid 40's at dawn and windy. Both of these dogs started strong with reaching casts. Point was called for Dandy at 29'in the draw. As we rode to him, Tack was coming across the field and

pointed in a low place. A single was flushed over the knoll with all in order. Dandy had single flushed for him with all in order. He had an unproductive at 37'. At 57' point was called for Dandy and he had to be ridden back to. Birds were flushed as he stood nicely. Tack continued to be forward moving in his application when the hour ended.

SHADY WAY RED TAIL HAWK, JOHN AND OCAJE, GOWIN. We left from the south gate with the sun shining and the wind blowing. Bo took the low side and Grace went high. Mo dug into the brushy draw and was out of pocket and not returned to judgment midway in the hour. At 38' point was called for Grace in the creek bottom where she had a nice covey pinned. At 48' she had an unproductive on the plateau.

Judges called time/scout called point. We rode to her across the draw. She again stood with classy manners as the covey was flushed for her.

ROUSTABOUTS WHITE KNIGHT, TRACY AND JAC'S OVER ACES, HOLMAN. Lance Started toward the bottom. Dan started slow and then stretched out. At 39' Dan had an unproductive. Lance had been a pull & tug and was not pleasing the handler and was leashed at 49'. Dan finished at moderate range in the heavy cover.

CAST-A-BRITT MICRO SAMMIE, BURCHETT AND SHADOWS TEQUILA TRYST, CARLSON. After lunch the sky is partly cloudy and windy. Sammie started slow then was out of pocket and not returned to judgment midway in the brace. Tristyn ran to the likely places for birds. At 25' point was called up from a pond dam. Nothing could be produced. She finished the hour at moderate range.

SNIKSOH SALLY, BURCHETT AND UNCLE KRACKER, TRACY. Sally ran lateral early in the hour. Kracker was digging in the brushy draw on our left. He was erratic in application. At 47' point was called for Sammie in the draw. She was relocated, handler called that the birds had left before the judge could get through the brush. Handler fired and took Sally on. She was leashed before the end of the hour. Kracker had made a cast to the far right of our line of travel being hard to get back on track he also was leashed.

RUSTY'S ROYAL RUN, JOHN ran as a bye. **BRITTMONT THE HAWK WITH GORROW** was a no show. Rusty's race was forward and flowing, handling kindly. He covered a lot of country. Rusty had two unproductives at 48' and 56' both places seemed likely to hold game.

It was in the mid 30's at daylight with the wind out of the northwest 5-15 mph. **BLUERIDGE HUNTER GONNA FLY, JOHNSON AND TI'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD, TILLSON.** Both dogs made wide moves early covering some country. At 16' Blizzard was buried in the creek bottom. He stood staunchly as one bird left then another. Hunter was forward in his application. Handler picked up Blizzard at 45'. Hunter had a find in the runoff ditch at the flush and shot he took steps forward and was leashed.

PRIMETIME OUTLAW JOHNNY, HAGEDORN AND TLM FREQUENT FLYER, MILAM. Cash was last seen at 5' after leaving the south gate breakaway. Jack came across the plateau at our turn and down in to a canyon. Scout called point at 17'. Jack stood staunchly as judge and handler shimmied down the rocks. A nice sized covey was flushed and he stood mannerly. Jack was last seen headed north up a big canyon. Both dogs were not returned to judgment.

JAGOUBS BUZZ'N BAYOU, TRACY AND CRESCENT CITY GIRL, BURCHETT. Buzz started slow then moved out across the plateau. At 2' Girl knocked a small covey. Buzz had to be gathered to make the turn at the long draw. He finished the hour without bird contact.

WOLF RIVER'S WINNING TICKET, GORROW AND BLACK CREEK DEACON, HOLMAN. After lunch it is partly cloudy, windy with cool temperatures. Both dogs started fast, each with long casts. At 23' Dee had a find on a single with all in order. At 30' handler leashed Cash, he appeared to be injured. Dee went the rest of the hour eating up the country using a forward application.

SNIKSOH LITTLE DIAMOND, BURCHETT AND GEORGIA'S TEXAS TWO STEP, TRACY. Kate didn't get untracked and was up at 15'. Gigi had

a nice covey find at 4'. In the wash bottom she had finds at 25' and 28'. Releasing her, a single popped and she didn't get stopped soon enough.

McChesney's I Got My Mojo Working, John and The Ace of Spade, Self. We left in the meadow down from the old homestead. Mo being the wider of the pair with Ace working at moderate range. Midway in the hour we headed up a rock path to get out of the bowl. Two quail popped in front of Mo and he didn't get stopped in time. The one that flew toward Ace got his attention and he went with it to end this brace.

KD'S SLIP AND SLIDE, TILLSON AND SHADY'S DESERT KNIGHT, JOHNSON. Splash started wide and stayed out there. At 18' he was out of pocket and the locator was called for at 35'. Knight was absent briefly returning in the open field across the long ditch. His application was erratic. At 44' he pointed at the base of the rock outcropping having birds flushed with all in order. He was leashed shortly after.

GRAND JUNCTION JAKE, HOLMAN AND KINWASHKLY DIRTY NED PEPPER, JOHNSON. We left the south gate with both dogs hitting objectives. Midway in the hour they were still reaching with Ned being wider of the pair. Jake had slowed and was leashed at 45'. Ned continued searching for birds but was not rewarded when the hour ended.

RICOCHET GUNSMOKE MR DILLON, BURCHETT AND AUGUST RUSH, TRACY. Out across the plateau from the red gate this pair had the wind in their faces. These dogs made some nice casts then would return to a hunting mode. We traveled along the ditch north of the lake. Dillon Pointed in short cover, moved up, pointed again. Handler elected to take him on. The judge's horse flushed a single and then a pair nearby as we moved on. A single was flushed by a rider. It flew nearby into the cover where Augie was working. He pointed and the handler flushed a bird far to the left of the dog. At 58' Augie pointed in tall grass but nothing could be produced and that ended the hour.

BRISCO'S MR STUBB, TRIMBLE AND HI POINT'S BET'N HE'LL ROCK, HOLMAN. Both dogs started slow in hunting mode in the heavy cover. At 23' point was called for Oz but nothing could be produced. Handlers elected to pick up midway in the hour.

SPARKY'S PRAIRIE WIND GYPSY, JOHN AND WINDTUCK ROCKET'S RED GLARE, MILAM. Both dogs had their running shoes on. Rocket went across the plateau and Gypsy went down in the bowl then forward. At 14' scout called point. Gypsy stood head high and tight. A single was flushed and she turned to mark the flight. Rocket was absent at 35' and the locator was called for. Gypsy continued a forward and snappy race using the country wisely. She came thru the bottom of the canyon, passed the old homestead where she popped out at the road edge. From the lake she went out across the field and forward. Briefly out of pocket she was sighted by the gallery on the side of a far slope. Time was called and she was ridden for well up the canyon.

TOUCH OF BOURBON LITTLE CHUG, BURCHETT AND CEDAR VALLEY BANDIT, TRACY. Bandit didn't want to run today and was up at 17'. Carson had a gyro adjustment and went to hunting the cover. He was leashed midway in the hour.

WIMBERLEY ROWDY BO-DANDY, JOHNSON AND THE CRASH SCENE, TRACY. Rowdy started strong with Crash being slow to start. At our turn Crash went back to the right where point was called at 11' with all in order. Rowdy came thru the big ditch and across the field. At 26' point was called just up from the pond. Birds Flushed as he stood with good manners. Crash continued a moderate range. At 33' scout called point for Rowdy. He stood in tall weeds. Birds were flushed as he stood nicely. He came across the bottom at the turn north of the lake. He was out of pocket briefly and returned in the grace period.

LUTIE'S LEGACY, BERNEATHY AND KJ'S IRISH WHIZKY, BURCHETT. Lutie went to work right off the breakaway. At 2' he pointed a nice sized covey on the side of the hill. At 15' he stood on the upper edge of the canyon. Handler flushed a single with all in order. Mickey was hard to

keep track of, being out of pocket from time to time. He was up at 42'. Lutie continued hunting and had an unproductive along the fence line in the bowl. At 46' in the ditch bottom he found another covey. Birds were flushed as he maintained good manners. He was out of pocket at time and not returned within the grace period.

LAMB'S JUST REWARD, JOHN AND KINWASHKLY FAT BASTARD, TRACY. This pair blasted off the breakaway across the plateau. Down in the brushy draw they went into hunting mode and were leashed midway in the hour.

Day Five after lunch it was overcast, temperatures were in the upper 40's and a light rain falling. There were two scratches this afternoon placing **ODYSSEY'S ACE OF HEARTS, HOLMAN AND DEM BONES, LINCOLN** together. Both dogs started slow. Ace gaining range. At 14' he was credited with a stop to flush. Released he continued up the path through the high cover and another bird popped, again he handled it in good order. Bones has been inconsistent in application, he was leashed midway in the hour. Ace made some good casts across the country. At 46' handler called point, stating that the covey had flushed- though not seen by the judges. After a flushing attempt he was sent on. He finished the hour forward.

It is now raining, sleeting and snowflakes are falling. **BLACK CREEK BLAZE, HOLMAN AND DESERT ROSE IV, BERNEATHY.** We left from the south gate in the snow. Both dogs made a few casts then settled in a hunting mode. They were leashed midway in the hour.

We left from the wire gate with both dogs traveling around the hillside_ Roux was sighted first then the scout pointed out Josey. At 25' Roux pointed into some heavy buck brush and tangles, with extensive flushing nothing could be produced. Handler relocated Roux who went to work in the grove with heavy cover. But it was like magic, he disappeared though the handler searched on foot and then horseback. The locator was then called for. Josey was out of pocket when at 29' was found because birds flushed from heavy cover and he took a leap. We rode to the high post gate.

SANDY PINES CHASE THE WIND, HOLMAN AND EARLY TIMES, TRACY. We traveled down the rock outcropping and across the bowl. At the turn back toward the draw we saw birds flying and Earl was moving. Handler elected to pick up. At 25' Chavy was not getting untracked and was leashed.

BRUSHBUSTER'S LAKOTA JILL, JOHN ran as a bye. We left the south gate and along a rock outcropping. We traveled up the draw headed toward the plateau. Jill with her snappy way of going was hitting all the likely places. She was seen after a bird at 28' to end the brace.

2013 AKC OBEDIENCE CLASSIC WELCOMES ADDITIONAL COMPETITORS WITH NEW MASTERS CLASS

A new Masters Class added to the inaugural AKC Obedience Classic slated for December 2013 in Orlando, Florida, as well as revised eligibility for the Novice, Open and Utility classes, will give more Obedience exhibitors a chance to compete.

"With the eligibility criteria as it was originally established, we determined that there would be a large group of Obedience Trial Champions that would not be eligible to enter the 2013 Obedience Classic, and also would not be ranked high enough within their breed to be invited to the 2013 National Obedience Championship," said Pamela Manaton, Director of Obedience, Rally and Tracking. "As a result, we created a new Masters class that will allow OTCH titled dogs to enter and compete if they meet the eligibility."

The inaugural 2013 AKC Obedience Classic will take place December 14-15, 2013 in Orlando, Florida in conjunction with the 2013 AKC/Eukanuba National Championship and the 2013 AKC Agility Invitational. It will offer four class levels: Novice, Open, Utility and Masters, open to all dogs who meet the qualification criteria in the qualifying period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

The 2013 event eligibility requirements are as follows:

- I. Novice Class Eligibility
 - a. Must have earned a CD title during the qualifying period.
 - b. After earning the CD title, a dog must earn three (3) more qualifying scores in the Novice class (A and/or B), or one (1) HIT award, during the qualifying period.

- II. Open Class Eligibility
 - a. Must have earned a CDX title during the qualifying period.
 - b. After earning the CDX title, a dog must earn three (3) more qualifying scores in the Open class (A and/or B), or one HIT award, during the qualifying period.
- III. Utility Class Eligibility
 - a. Must have earned a minimum of the UD title.
 - b. A dog must earn six (6) qualifying scores in the Utility class (A and/or B) during the qualifying period.
 - c. OTCH titled dogs may not enter this class.
- IV. Masters Class Eligibility (Open and Utility)
 - a. Must have earned a minimum of the UD title.
 - b. A dog must earn six (6) qualifying scores of 193 or better in Open B during the qualifying period; and
 - c. A dog must earn six (6) qualifying scores of 193 or better in Utility B during the qualifying period.
 - d. OTCH titled dogs may enter this class.

Several amendments were made to the Obedience and Rally Regulations, effective January 1, 2014, affecting the size of premium lists, refunds for bitches in season, wait lists to fill openings created by withdrawn entries, and determining the size of Rally rings.

Several amendments were made to the Agility Regulations at the request of the 2013 Agility Advisory Committee. They affect such areas as two trials in a day for breed clubs, refunds for bitches in season, determining overloads, correcting entries after closing, using video to determine the running order, when courses may be built, limits on walk-throughs, and clarifying what identifying information may be worn in the ring.

The complete changes are in the minutes of the October 2013 AKC board meeting.

Brittany Memories

Memories started in the early 1970's – forty some years from this writing – when my family brought into our home the first of twenty-two Brittansys. Then new and different memories began on November 10, 1991 at the field trial competition when Magic Magnum Coco, in her first trial, placed first in the puppy stake during the Anthracite Club's event

The Brittansys during the first twenty some years were family hunting companions and “best of friends” for our three boys as they grew and became young men. Fantastic relationships developed between the boys, me, and the dogs. To this day Joe, our youngest, recalls his first pheasant taken over Spike's point.

As I collect my thoughts to write this piece about those times with the twenty-two Brittansys, I realize how significant the Brittany has been, a most positive influence on my family. So if you as the reader will indulge this author, I will tell you about a few of those recollections.

As mentioned previously Coco's win in the puppy stake was the first of many memorable field trial experiences.

Over forty some years ago as a young pup, Spike was taken to a fun trial event at the local Brittany club. Fifteen minutes or so into his run, Spike pointed a bird, jumped-in, caught the quail, and then returned the bird back to me. A gallery member said, “Not what a ‘broke dog’ is supposed to do, but guess it's o.k. for a pup.”

On a crisp fall late afternoon Molly hunted the creek bottoms. She pointed and I was able to put the shot pattern in the right place for her to retrieve her first woodcock.

My youngest son after completing the college's Officers Candidates Program, spent seven years in the Navy. While Joe was deployed overseas, his Brittany, Sam, remained with our family and me to be trained. No doubt, reports of Sam's accomplishments were an inspiration for Joe during his several six month deployment tours.

My grandson was on his first bird hunt at a local game preserve. We were hunting with Meg, who has developed into an outstanding field trial dog. Meg was at the time only 15 months and not steady to wing. Thus the reason for keeping her on a lead to hold her once on point. She pointed the quail and Ben took his first bird with a clean shot. An event never to be forgotten.

These are five brief glimpses at events we'll remember for each of the Brittansys. For me, this is very important. Many of these Brittansys have passed, but memories of each prevail. All twenty-two have a place in my memory bank. As you read this article, I am sure you recalled a special place in your heart for your Brittansys.

In addition of equal importance is the fact that each of those Brittansys performed a field. Some were and are super hunting and field trial dogs. Others had or have varying degrees of scenting and ability to find birds. Regarding appearance they all were varying in appearance and color – orange/white, white/orange, liver/white, white/liver and even two tri-colors. Pure happenstance, but there have been no roans. Several of those Brittansys performed in the show ring, but their first desire was to be in the field in pursuit of birds.

The Brittany has a temperament that is unique to the breed; it is up to us who own Brittansys to keep that trait strong, including their desire to hunt and scent game birds.





ABC New England Grouse Woodcock Classic

The 2013 renewal of the ABC New England Grouse/Woodcock Classic was held on September 28-29 at the Kilkenny Management Area in Berlin, NH. The entrants this year were treated to outstanding weather over the two-day event. Sixteen dogs were run which worked out perfectly for the four courses that were utilized . . .

Lonesome Ridge, Pancake, Moosehorn and Ammonoosuc. Four braces of dogs were run each day.

For many years now, this event has been hosted by the New England Brittany Championship Association under the auspices of American Field, as well as AKC. The American Brittany Club has also sanctioned this event as a Classic, lending additional prestige to the winners.

Saturday evening, participants, judges and committee gathered at J's Corner Restaurant in Gorham, NH for dinner. It was an evening enjoyed by all in attendance.

Once again, the New England Brittany Championship Assc welcomes and considers itself fortunate to have the support of Purina Pro Plan. This support is crucial to the successful running of the classic and is much appreciated.

Many thanks are in order for the behind the scenes efforts of several people that have given themselves so selflessly for the many years this event has been running . . . most notably Ray Gorman who has spearheaded the running of the championship for too many years to count. Also Bill and Fran Gorman, Dave Hayes, Art Hembrough.

This year's winner, Cisco's Rocky, a brittany male handled by Bill Gorman for his better half Fran ran in the last brace on Sunday.

All braces are reported below.

BRACE 1: CENTERVILLE'S DOT/CONYNGHAM ---- RYLEE'S ROLLING THUNDER OF COOS/GORMAN

Course Lonesome Ridge. Both dogs broke away briskly, but Ray realized immediately he had forgotten to put his bell on Thunder. We had a very short holdup while Ray belled Thunder, and then resumed. At 4 Thunder is out of range with Ray trying to get him back on course. Around 10 Ray had made contact with Thunder again, but he scooted quickly out of bell range once more. At 15 Dot moved out left deep in the cover, looking very birdy and at about 19 we had Dot pointing in cover to our left. As Sara moved towards her, a grouse got up in front of Dot, who turned to mark without forward progress. She looked good on point and all was in order. At about 28, Dot stopped hard on the righthand side of the trail. Sara worked hard to produce a bird, relocating Dot a couple of times, but came up empty-handed. A second non-productive was carded by Dot at 35. Dot was very forward during her hour on the ground, always making the correct turn to the front on both sides of the course. When scent got her attention, she worked the cover with a high head, which was nice to see. Thunder certainly had his running shoes on today, which resulted in several long absences early on during his hour. Unfortunately, around 42, as Dot regained the front with Sara behind trying to catch up, she passed us and stopped to point on the trail ahead of us. As Thunder approached, he failed to back and was ordered up. Dot finished her hour with another non-productive at 58.

BRACE 2: FLASHFIRE'S BANG-A-GONG/BJORK ---- SPRING HILL'S CHICA DEL PRADO/CASSELBERRY

Course Pancake. Both dogs took off to the front. We hit the landing at 2 with

Tonka headed off to the right and he was quickly out of pocket. Jane sent Art out to scout as we continued to move forward. In the meantime, Chica was out front doing a great job for Les with plenty of groundspeed and at the limit of her bell with the two of them putting some distance between themselves and the rest of the gallery. Tonka finally showed from the front at around 8.5, having made a cast wide to the right, forward and well to the front. At 15, as Tonka and Jane regained the front, we had Chica standing deep on the right and Tonka skirted by without getting involved. Les fired as a grouse lifted for Chica, with all in order. After that initial absence, Tonka was handling very well for Jane. Eventually Les and Chica caught up with the front and both dogs were doing a nice job hitting cover, looking for birds. At around 25 Chica moved into cover on her left and we lost her bell. Just as Les was starting to look for her, Tonka came over from the right and moved in to the same area and stopped quickly. Jane headed toward her dog and we were expecting to find both dogs with Tonka backing Chica. Before we could get to the dogs Tonka moved in to take the grouse and Les was unable to convince Chica to hold her ground.

BRACE 3: COOS TIGER LILY/RAY GORMAN ----- ORVIS/ CONYNGHAM. COURSE MOOSEHORN.

At breakaway, Orvis took off headed straight for the front, while Lily dug in on the lefthand side. Both handlers were moving briskly to avoid losing touch with their dogs. At 15, Lily was continuing to pound the cover, with very wide impressive casts and great groundspeed. We headed down to the brook and up the other side and Lily was with us. Sara was hanging back just a bit to make sure she had Orvis down through the brook and up the other side okay. As we gained the top, at 22, Orvis pointed a grouse with Lily coming in to back. Both dogs were buried deep on the right. As Sara moved in front of Orvis, the bird flushed and both dogs were steady throughout. Just after this find Lily moved off deep to the right and got a little sticky, but as the course circled around, she came back to the front with Ray. At 40, with Orvis well away out to the front and Ray and Lily behind, a grouse got up wild immediately behind judge Carney and Sara. Lily would later have a non-productive in this area, when she hit it. Orvis continued a methodical well-paced hour, with Sara making sure he stayed forward. At time, going up the hill at the end, Orvis was out in cover on the right. Lily finished her hour with less reach than she showed at the start.

BRACE 4: SCIROCCO DEL PRADO/CASSELBERRY ---- KIP'S BAY ZAC'S-A-TAC'N ELLIE/ KIPP.

Course Ammonoosuc. Both dogs broke away well, with Rico making impressive moves through the cover . . . the ground race we were looking for. Ellie was busy quartering back and forth along the course at a closer range. She would continue this throughout her hour, needing to reach further in order to contend. In the meantime, Rico was pounding through the cover with wide casts, handling well for Les. At 12, Rico's bell stopped dead deep in cover on the left. As we went to find him, the bell started up and a woodcock was heard leaving from the same area. Rico stopped quickly again, but the damage was done and he was ordered up.

BRACE 5: JETER/BLONDIN ----- COLBYS HOBBO RUN/ CONYNGHAM.

Course Lonesome Ridge. At 5 Jeter was hanging out wide on the left, after which he came back in and was handling at a good distance for Mike. Colby was handling at medium range for Sara. At about 18, Jeter made a cast up the hillside to our right and we lost the bell. Colby continued on and would finish his hour with judge Kostka on him. Judge

Carney stayed with Jeter and spent the next 35 minutes on the hillside with him. With Deb doing a remarkable job finding Jeter on point, we went through a series of several relocations without ever getting a bird produced. After the second relocation, Deb did report that she thought she heard a bird leaving the vicinity, but Mike and myself had heard nothing. We headed back downhill to the course with 2 minutes left on the clock. In the meantime, around 25, Colby started reaching deeper for Sara, working the cover well. At about 30 a grouse flushed wild off to the right of the course and Colby was not involved. At 55, Colby was sent to some cover on the left looking for that hail mary bird, but came up empty.

BRACE 6: THE HOLIDAY KID/FRAN GORMAN ----- MR P'S D EVIL DOG OF COOS/POLAND. Course Pancake. Both Kid and Devil were off to the races at the breakaway. Devil was running wide and out of pocket in the beginning, after which, John had his hands full pulling him around the course. Kid was doing a nice job on the ground and handling well for Fran. At about the halfway point, with Devil on point, Kid failed to back and was ordered up. This find proved to be a non-productive for Devil.

BRACE 7: GREENTOWN'S DUKE OF HAMPSHIRE/HEMBROUGH ----- DOUBLE TRIGGER JOSIE/LEGGIO. Course Moosehorn. Josie was doing a nice job for Jeff on the ground. Judges would like to have seen her run a little wider, but she wasn't given the opportunity to really hit the cover by her handler as Jeff was keeping up a pretty brisk pace along the course, all the while urging Josie to stay with and ahead of him. With a little slower pace, she would have had the opportunity to work the cover more thoroughly and might have come up with the bird that she badly needed. A find would have put her in the placements. In the meantime, Duke needed a little more drive in his ground race. His find came in the first half of his hour. Scout John Kipp found him standing buried in cover off the righthand side of the course and a woodcock was handled with great style.

BRACE 8: KIP'S BAY DARK N' STORMY MISS MADDIE/KIPP ----- CISCO'S ROCKY/BILL GORMAN. Course Ammonoosuc. Rocky was off to the races at the breakaway. He had the ground race we were looking for in our champion . . . wide and forward, at the limit of the bell, at times beyond, all the while staying in touch with Bill. Maddie, an attractive liver

and white bitch was holding her own on the ground, but needed to complete her casts in order to be in consideration for a placement. At 25 with neither dog into birds, judges swapped dogs as we reached the Ammonoosuc bottom. A few minutes later, Maddie hit the cover on the right and judge Kostka and gallery thought they heard a grouse lift, with John reporting that he had seen a bird leaving. Judge Kostka elected to leave Maddie down feeling that she wasn't involved and that the grouse had flushed wild. About halfway along the bottom judge Carney thought she heard a grouse leave the cover on the left, headed out over the river. Nobody else heard it, but it was shortly afterward and 50 yards beyond that Rocky struck gold and was seen pointing with excellent form and style. Bill flushed a grouse and fired with Rocky staunch throughout. No more birds were to be had as we continued along the bottom. Coming out off the bottom, the course runs through a slight uphill field of hellish cover that Rocky had to punch his way through. We reached the other side with Rocky still reaching to the front and with Bill taking care to keep a handle on him. After we negotiated the uphill hairpin turn, Rocky dropped back down to the lower course with the gallery wanting to know if they should gather him up. Gallery was ordered not to touch the dog, and Bill handled him back up and to the front. Rocky was out front going away as he finished his hour.

ABC GROUSE WOOSCOCK DERBY CLASSIC

BRACE 1. MR P'S LITTLE TWINK/POLAND ----- MT. VIEW'S NIGHT AT THE COPA/CASSELBERRY. Mandy was busy, forward and animated in her application, never letting down and always seeking likely cover. LT was similar but at closer range and a more moderate application. Neither of these charges knew the word "path". At about 20 minutes, both were in thick, likely cover off to the right of the path when a grouse flushed. Bells then stopped briefly with both handlers firing. Dogs were in hot pursuit, with LT returning quickly and Mandy returning after a longer absence. Both dogs knew something very special had happened, but neither were observed nor had establishing point. At 25 a woodcock was walked up. Both dogs finished strong, with Mandy the wider of the two, requiring minimal direction.

BRACE 2. GREEN MOUNTAIN RUSTY GUNN/DEB BLONDIN — CENTERVILLE'S SONNY/CONYNGHAM. Sonny started with a big charge, a significant absence and then when reunited, appeared to be put off by it. He would make an effort, then come in to heel position. New to the grouse woods, he had a hard time negotiating his way around. This powerful dog just lacked familiarity with the venue. Rusty wanted to hunt the front, and that was that. During the first portion of the brace, his handler got behind, and the judge who remained with her asked if she could try getting him back, but Rusty would have none of it, remaining up with the other judge and handler, pushing hard. Handlers and judges were reunited for the second half and both dogs were hunting hard, Sonny getting his wheels back and Rusty continuing his blast of the woods.

BRACE 3. MT VIEW'S BJ MAJOR WILKES/CASSELBERRY — SHAILORVILLE'S GUNNER/CONYNGHAM. Gunner made a very big first cast and was found to the front, and would check in, shorten up, then make another cast. Big efforts followed by closer working made his effort inconsistent, yet showing much promise. Willie dove deep and lateral and required handling and direction to stay forward. Nicely gaited and strong, once these youngsters understand the thin connection made by singing and not by visual contact, each will have a bright future.

BRACE 4. GREEN MOUNTAIN LOUIE GUNN/MIKE BLONDIN — CENTERVILLE'S MAD AFFAIR/CONYNGHAM. These two youngsters took off like a shot, both immediately off the path hunting hard. Maggie would not be seen nor bell heard for 9 minutes, but when first contact was made, she was found to the front. Maggie would make large casts which often got her to the rear. Her last cast as time was called was dazzling, but not enough to knock anyone off the placements due to her inconsistency. Louie ran the course showing great potential as a cover dog with a consistent forward race. He hit likely areas and was in the zone between 10 and 2. When the course changed direction (as this course does frequently), he would quickly reestablish his forward pattern with

very little handling or evidence from his handler, who just gave him regular singing (but never directing him) to keep in touch. Clearly they worked as a team. Louie finished strong.

Generation to Generation *Millennium Man Part Two*

July 15—the first day for lawful prairie training—finally arrived. After inspections to be sure the spears were all off the speargrass, they began to test the young dogs from horseback in short heats. Some pups that had run big in Alabama immediately shortened, seemingly intimidated by the limitless country, unwilling to reach for the bluffs, or scattered stands of poplar saplings, that dotted the unplowed prairie and held congregations of sharptail grouse and prairie chicken. Scott prayed Man would not be a shortener, that the prairie would make him bolder, encourage him to extend his range. His father had said not to worry about Man's range, that with his breeding and his love of the scent of birds, already evident, he would reach once he understood that the bluffs held birds.

His father was right. Soon Man was swinging boldly, approaching the bluffs always down wind, circling the edges and, if bird scent did not reach his nostrils, striking out for the next bluff a half-mile distant.

"He's got good eyesight and hearing I think," Roy said. "He picks up the location of bluffs quick, recognizes your horse from way off, hears your voice way off in spite of the wind."

Before their departure from Alabama, Roy had divided up the canine pupils among the four men, each given responsibility for his own "string" of pups and derbies. About a third were candidates for the shooting string Roy and Booty managed for the investment bank, another third were gun-dog prospects for bird hunters from all over the country, and the final third were field-trial prospects. Of the trial prospects, perhaps a third would merit entry in derby stakes, by Roy as open prospects or by their owners in amateur competition. Also along were a half dozen mature field-trial dogs that Roy ran for owners affiliated with the investment bank; these he and Booty would condition late in the summer and handle in three prairie trials, and then in late fall and winter in trials in Alabama, Florida, Georgia. If any qualified for the National Championship, they'd go to Tennessee in February.

The men worked as a team, one driving the truck that carried the dogs, the other three mounted. The horseback work came in the mornings and late in the afternoons—to take advantage of temperatures and better scenting conditions.

At meals the men's conversation always turned to the dogs in training, their strengths and weaknesses, problems developing, how they might be solved. Occasionally Roy switched a dog from one man's string to another, playing on each man's skills in dealing with a certain type of dog or problem. Randy was good with soft dogs, Booty with high-powered, aggressive ones, Scott with the most immature. Roy saved the self-hunters for himself. Ann listened to their talk and kept a mental chart of the dogs' progress. She knew that as the end of summer approached, some of the problem dogs would have recovered confidence and come on to fulfill their potential, a few would be declared washed up. And one or two would be judged simply too immature for the training routine, and returned to their barrels to "think about it," maybe given another chance a few days or weeks later.

Man had been given his kennel or call name at weaning—Roy had suggested it, because the pup seemed so businesslike and calm, even at seven weeks. Man had as yet no registered name, but he would have to be registered before the Dakota derby. Everyone had suggested names, but none seemed to suit. Finally on a hot day as the men shared a bag

lunch in the meager shade of a bluff, Booty said,

"I believe that Man derby's 'bout good enough to win the National by the time he's five."

"That would be in 2000," Randy said.

"That's it!" said Scott. "We'll name him 'Millennium Man.'"

As the summer wore on, the field-trial prospects got the most conversation. And of them, Man got the most praise. Ann saw Scott's enthusiasm building as the opening trial date approached. He would only have time to handle Man in the one trial before flying south to begin college.

A strange sense of foreboding began to build in Ann as each evening she listened to the two men she loved critique Man's workout of the day and debate their next training move. Until the year before, Roy had always handled the field-trial dogs. Then Roy let Scott handle a derby he'd had primary responsibility for training, and Scott placed him second. Ann had seen the pride in Scott's face, remembered Roy's enthusiasm when she had met him. She'd been an emergency room nurse at the hospital in Union Springs that winter, and Roy had come in with a broken collar bone from a horse fall. Repeatedly he asked the doctor when he could ride again, for he had a special derby that he couldn't bear to see in the kennel while the year's best stakes were run. When he was discharged after an X-ray and application of a sling, he brashly introduced himself and asked her for a date. They married three months later; their first daughter was born a year after that. Ann continued with her nursing career until Scott's birth; then home-making took all her time, with three children under seven.

Through those years, Roy had campaigned full-time on the major circuit, starting at the north-country trials in August, moving down week by week to trials in Kansas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas, Illinois, Kentucky, then in December and January in the Plantation Belt, and by February in Tennessee. He'd been away from home weeks on end, leaving Ann at home with the three young children and little companionship. On top of caring for the children, she'd nursed her mother through a long final illness. The loneliness began to take its toll. She became depressed and suffered a breakdown when Scott was five. Roy abruptly gave up full-time circuit campaigning, made the deal with the investment bank, and limited his field-trial work to trials he could make without spending more than one night at a time away from home. Ann recovered completely from the breakdown, though she remained subject to periods of depression. Roy could sense her spells coming on, but he was powerless to prevent them. At those times, he tried to be extra attentive, and she appreciated it, but she had to work through her bad times on her own.

As mid-August approached, Ann felt a depression coming on. Roy suspected the cause was the prospect of Scott leaving home for college. He took her for a weekend to a fishing resort at Moose Mountain Lake that had for years been a special summer getaway for them. There she broke down and told him of her fear. He vowed that what she feared would not come to pass. After that weekend, Ann rallied, and as the end of summer neared and she spent the long twilights sewing name tags in Scott's college clothes, she found herself in pleasant reveries of her son's growing up, seeing in memory all the stages of his childhood

and adolescence.

Finally the day arrived to call in their entries for the Dakota Derby. It would be run this year at Denbigh, North Dakota, just sixty-five miles south, on grounds where in 1924 Chesley Harris, another young man from Alabama, had won the first of three U.S. Chicken Championships with the fabled setter, Candy Kid. Little had changed since in the vast range country on the arid western edge of the wheat belt, except the hay and crops were made now with tractors instead of teams, and jets from the air base at Minot now filled the big sky with their contrails.

Scott had Man ready—in fact had him dead broke, reliably steady to wing and shot. Roy cautioned not to be too hopeful, reminding that winning a major field-trial stake, particularly in a derby's first outing, was a long shot and largely a matter of luck. But Roy knew that Man was an extraordinary prospect with the athletic ability, desire to please and competitive nature to become a champion. Dogs like Man were a rare commodity; every decade produced only two or three on the continent, sometimes not that many. Roy and his father had each had one, his father's winning the National Championship when Roy was a boy. Now that dog and his father were in the Field Trial Hall of Fame. Roy's great dog had been in his string when Ann had suffered her nervous breakdown. Roy had won the Continental Championship with him, but when the dog's owner learned Roy would no longer campaign the entire circuit, he placed it with another trainer, in whose hands it won the National Championship and the Free-For-All and a place in the Hall of Fame—the only dog save John Gates' War Storm to win all three of the great endurance quail championships. Ann had always felt guilty about Roy's loss of this dog, but Roy never mentioned it, although he often spoke fondly of the dog.

When Roy telephoned in Man's entry for the derby stake, he also entered the dog conditionally in the Dakota Championship that would follow; he did not tell Scott or Ann of this. Man would be eligible to run in the championship only if he placed—a first, second or third—in the derby. It was rare to enter a derby in an all-age championship, especially in the fall. Man drew the seventh brace in the derby stake. With half-hour heats, he would start right after lunch, the worst possible time of day. CONDITIONS AND RULES • NOMINATING FEE: \$30.00 • Nomination must be made within 30 days of whelping or subject to late penalty fees. For all purebred Brittany bitches whelping a litter on January 1 thru December 31st, 2013, who are owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club.

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- **Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped. A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time.** This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.

- **Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** Late litter nominations will be accepted as late as 180 days from whelping. In addition to the Nomination fee of \$30.00 the late fees are \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be at the discretion of the Futurity Committee. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
- Dogs will be eligible to run in the designated futurity to be held in the Spring of the second year following the year of whelping.
- A final nomination fee will be due by October 1st of the year following whelping. Entry fees will be paid by the owner of the puppy for each Sectional Futurity field or bench event the dog enters.
