Issues and Opportunities, May, 2013

I am writing this following the 2013 Central Futurity. By the time you read it, the Western Futurity will have been held, completing the three regional futurities for 2013. I attended the Central Futurity and was very excited by the size of the entry this year, both in the field events and in the show. This followed a large entry in the Eastern Futurity, and I expect there will be a sizeable entry at the Western Futurity as well. I am very pleased to see this much interest in the futurities. It is a strong sign that Brittany breeders take pride in the litters they are producing and are willing to nominate them based solely on the breeding, and to the owners who continue this quest and pay both the final forfeit and the entry fees for a chance to let their dogs compete. Clearly, these are serious breeders, not just people looking to make a quick dollar by breeding and selling puppies, and serious owners, people who are willing to put their dogs in front of others to evaluate the quality of these animals in competition with others of similar age. I think this speaks very well for the future of our breed.

One other aspect of the Futurities that pleases me is the number of dogs that were entered in both the field and show events. The Mission Statement of the ABC says we are to strive to keep the breed from splitting into field dogs and show dogs, but to keep the dual aspect in the breed. Both the Eastern and Central Futurities have produced a Dual Award winner from among these entrants, and I am optimistic that one will likewise emerge from the Western Futurity. Clearly, not every Brittany is capable of achieving the title of Dual Champion, but I am encouraged that there are many people who care enough about this to make it a consideration in the litters they breed and nominate for the Futurities.

The Futurity program was something several of our now-departed members believed in strongly. One person who comes to mind is Ned Castillo. Ned was a very active participant; I cannot remember attending a Futurity at which he was not present. I am sure he must have missed some, but I remember how impressed I was to realize that he would travel all the way from California to venues in the Midwest so he could enter his dogs. The last time I saw Ned was at the Central Futurity in 2011, where a dog from his breeding won Best in Futurity. The Central Futurity this year was held at the same location as in 2011 and several people commented on missing him there this year. It was somewhat poignant, then to note that Ned's legacy lives on: Best in Futurity, 2nd Money Male and 2nd Money Female at this year's Central Futurity all trace their pedigrees back to Ned's dogs.

At one time, ABC held a National Futurity Runoff, which consisted of the top placing dogs in each Regional Futurity. That event was held in conjunction with the National Championships each November. I can recall the excitement this generated at the time among the participants in the Runoff itself and others attending Nationals. The Runoff was eventually cancelled, not because of lack of interest, but because of loss of grounds and support staff on the dates the event had historically been held. Based on comments I have received, there appears to be interest in reinstating a runoff program. Before we can consider this, however, I believe there would need to be a study done to gauge interest among the membership and to come up with a plan that would include not just an All Age Runoff, but events for the Gun Dog and Show Futurities as well. I would be very interested in hearing from individuals concerning this topic.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many members who have commented to me, either in person or via email, regarding this monthly column. That includes those people who have sent me correspondence with suggestions about some of the issues I have mentioned and those stating ideas that might be contrary to some things I have written. I believe this is healthy and people need to be able to express their opinions and make suggestions regarding the future of the club. One thing we all know is that change happens and to be successful we have to be aware of factors around us that may have either a positive or negative influence on this and other organizations.

TRAININ' DOGS

with Rick Smith

Effective Handling

By Rick Smith & Sharon Potter

Throughout the basic training of our dogs, we focus on teaching them three things: to go with us, to come to us, and to stand still. We do our best to ingrain these behaviors so that they'll be useful in the field. The problem is that hunting is different from training. There's new ground to cover, wild birds instead of planted, and other hunters and dogs to contend with. All the additional distractions can make a dog that is perfect while training at home look like an untrained novice in a hurry. And it kind of screws up our bragging rights, too: What happened to the pup that was so attentive in training?

The good news is that if we really did our homework and thoroughly trained the dog at home, the trained behavior is still in there. All we have to do now is keep the dog focused and in control, as well as remind him who he's working for. This starts before we ever turn loose. The dog that is running around the truck loose while we get our gear

together is already not thinking about us - he's thinking about hunting for himself. If we can follow a routine similar to training back home, it's easier for our dogs to fall into that same routine when hunting. Instead of opening the crate door and letting the dog run around loose, make him wait at the crate door, put a leash on him, and tie him short to the vehicle (the trailer hitch chain loops work well for this, and you can make a short length of chain - just like the chain gang - kept for this purpose.)

The dog is now thinking about routine, and even with the excitement of a new place, that routine will help. While the dog is chilling out on the chain, we can get our gear together. When ready, put a lead on the dog and take him off the short chain (assuming, of course, that the dog is waiting patiently on the chain and not bouncing all over!). We may only need to walk a few feet on the lead before turning him loose. The purpose is to make sure the dog is paying

attention to us and focused. If the dog "goes with us" on the lead - meaning stopping when we stop, turning when we turn, and standing still in the proper position at our side - we've got control and can turn him loose and go hunting. If not, we will take a few minutes to work a short drill with the lead to get the dog's attention focused back on us. Those five extra minutes taken at the start of the day can make or break the entire day of hunting.

Now that we've turned our dog loose to hunt, we've got to find a balance point between where he wants to go versus where we need to go. That's where some level of handling comes in. First of all, remember that the dog is the one with the nose, which is why we hunt with a dog. What we need to define is where we plan to walk, taking into consideration the wind direction and existing objectives that may hold birds. That's our job. The dog's job is to go with us in that direction, working out to the front and checking those objectives. Ideally, there shouldn't need to be much handling, if we've done our homework.

Here's what we don't want to see: a handler constantly giving hand signals and verbal or whistle commands to every bush and treeline and patch of available cover. The term for is "hacking," and it can either shut a dog down or teach him to ignore the handler. Micromanaging and over-controlling don't make it easy for the dog to do his job. Besides, the dog is the one with the keen sense of smell and can work more efficiently if given some space. Remember, hunting is teamwork. The dog has his job, and we have ours. To be a good handler, learn to let go and allow the dog to hunt and use his nose within the reasonable

parameters we've set within the direction we're going. If we think of our walking path as the face of a clock, with straight ahead being 12 o'clock, the dog should work roughly between 10 and two, give or take a few "minutes" in either direction. What we don't want is for our dog to get past nine o'clock or three o'clock. If he gets past those spots, it's easy for him to hook behind us and go off on his own. That's where a reasonable level of quiet handling comes into play.

Before we get too far into how best to handle, we need to add a few other scenarios to the "why we need to handle" list. If you're hunting in an area with other hunters, you'll need to keep your dog from interfering with the other dogs. One of the simplest examples of this would be at a preserve hunt, where hunters are assigned fields. That makes certain areas out of bounds for your dog. Another situation would be during competition, where you need to keep your dog within a specific perimeter. Handling amounts more to where you don't want your dog to go, rather than where you do. The dog needs to stay with you at whatever range you dictate, rather than trying to extend hunting time by taking off on his own.

Handling makes use of a few different but related cues. And we feel that quiet is best, since you'll spook fewer birds and distract your dog less. If you've laid a proper foundation from lead to checkcord to e-collar, you can give a momentary stimulation to turn your dog and direct his attention back toward you. If you're not using a collar, you'll need a whistle or verbal command. The point of handling is to get the dog to look toward you. When they do that, they should change their direction to go with your new heading.

Two things are very

important when using that cue to handle. First of all, keep moving as you cue. If your dog sees you stopped, he isn't as likely to move with your direction, because when you're stopped, there is no direction of movement. If your dog looks over and sees you moving, that will pull him to move with you.

Secondly, the timing of the cue is very important. Let's say your dog just went into some heavy brush, and your course of direction is going to head away from that clump of brush as soon as the dog is finished working it. There may be other interesting

objectives on the other side of that brush but in the wrong direction from where you want to go. Watch your dog carefully, and as soon as his head emerges, keep moving and give your cue. If you allow the dog to get out of one piece of cover and choose the next on his own, you'll have a harder time. And remember, the level of distraction dictates the level of stimulation you'll need.

The key to successful handling – when handling is needed – is to watch your dog. Stay tuned to what the dog is doing, keep moving rather than stopping when you give a cue to change directions, and cue (if needed) before the dog has a chance to make a decision and commit to his next direction without you. Don't over-handle or micromanage to try to tell the dog how to use his nose. Too much noise makes for spooky birds, a distracted dog, and likely a lack of human hunting partners, too. Hunting is a partnership, and while you're still the leader of the excursion, the dog's nose is what makes it possible for you to get shooting opportunities. Trust your dog to do his job and help only when really needed; he'll appreciate your confidence and will trust you in return.

Book Review

BIRD DOGS AND FIELD TRIALS

by JACK HARPER

Cass Hill Publications

John Pelham Harper more familiarly known as "Jack Harper was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1972. Born in Victoria, Texas in 1902 he was a professional bird dog trainer who rose to national fame during the mid 1900's. Winning the National Championship with The Arkansas Ranger in 1958 and with Home Again Hattie in 1962, he was most renowned for training and handling The Texas Ranger who was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1956. Being one of the top trainers of his time, among his peers he was considered to be a master of the art of dog training. Aside from training, developing and handling winning bird dogs he was also a master of expressing himself in literary form. A.F. Hochwalt the famous field trial reporter and author of past, declared that Jack Harper was especially gifted when it



came to writing on any subject but excelled when the subject was about bird dogs. Hochwalt also noted that had Harper chosen to pursue the literary field instead of dog training he would have been most successful. This book covers the entire spectrum of bird dog training and anyone from a beginner to an experienced bird dog person will come away with a better understanding of the process and methods that Harper used. The one area that is not thoroughly covered is the electric collar. During the time of writing this book electronic collars were in their infancy and used mostly as a punishment tool. Bird dogs of that era were broken with a rope, flushing whip, unlimited amount of wild birds along with a lot of shoe leather and horse lather. Being an avid reader and collector of books about bird dogs for over thirty five years, I would rate this book at the top of the several hundred books about training that I have read and collected over that time. This book can be purchased though the Bird Dog Foundation gift shop or online at Amazon books.

Preface: Many of today's current ABC field trialers and members may not remember the man featured in Dr. Kenney's musings on Paul Bone of Illinois which follows. I believe it is good to remember those who pioneered in our breed and hope some of you will send some articles which talk about pioneers in your club and/or region of the country so that their legacy is carried on. In *The Official Book of the Brittany Spaniel* by Nicky Bissell, p. 176, she has this to say about Paul Bone of Illinois.

"Paul Bone brought his Ch Triumph Allamuchy Mike from the show ring into the field in 1957, placing him several times in the next years. Early in the sixties he acquired Woody's Pontiac Dingo who had a placement in the Futurity, one in the Quail Classic and seemed an excellent prospect. He proved to be just that as he finished for his title the next year and went on to make a lifetime record of 43 placements. Paul enjoyed popularity as a judge in the field and ran the National Specialty Show for a few years. He bred under the name of Bureauville producing several winners. His wife, Hazel, continued with the dogs after his death." Lest we forget, MJT

Remembering Paul Bone . . . Illinois Spring Trial, 1973

The dark had come and it was raining, and a dozen men and women were standing on a muddy country lane waiting to learn the name of the dog that had won the Illinois club's amateur all age stake. It was a special stake, for it offered the Paul Bone memorial traveling trophy to the winner.

This renewal had been a hard fought contest over the continuous courses of the Wayne Fitzgerald State Park near Benton, Illinois (Rend Lake Grounds). Twenty good dogs had gone to the line and done their best, and now the stake had ended just as night had fallen-We waited to learn the judges' decision. There were only a few of us still there, for it had been a long two-day trial and most of the crowd had departed. Placements had been announced and trophies given

for the other stakes. Only the amateur all age results were still unknown. The field trial committee had decided that at whatever point on the grounds the stake ended, there the decision would be announced. So when the last brace was picked up we put the trophies on the hood of a car, threw a raincoat over them, and stood by in the near-dark and the cold while judges Trimble and Dudenbostel conferred.

I think Paul Bone would have been glad we did it that way. Since it was Paul's memory we were honoring that was as it should be. Paul was a direct and straightforward man, one who did not care for a great deal of ceremony. For us to announce the results of this stake in the field where it had been won, in the presence of a hardy few who stuck it out to the end, would surely have pleased him.

The stake must have come near to judging itself, for the judges did not linger long in conference. They soon handed their decision to the secretary. At once the trophies were uncovered and the results announced. Robin was fourth and Zipper third. Second went to Don Juan, and then at last the winner was announced. It was Harper of Mt. Tom, owned and handled by Doug Birchfield! Finally, and not too soon, the Illinois club's spring trial for 1973 had ended. . . .

March 2013 AKC Delegate Meeting Report

Newark, NJ

Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee – Karolynne McAteer was voted in to fill the remainder of Nelson Sills’ term. Dave Hopkins reported on “Mean Seeds” where Professor Laurenroth advised he needed more help to complete the proposed survey. Hopefully he will obtain students from Illinois to assist. More funds will be needed for the research. Contributions will be solicited from clubs and individuals along with the Humane Fund. This will be brought up at the September meeting.

The committee discussed breed flyers going out to new owners’ registrations of each sporting breed about the limited information they contained on performance events. A lot of the breed flyers are out of date. It was suggested that a small block in each performance breed flyer be used to promote AKC performance events with the club website listed. Dave Hopkins could not find any good communications regarding AKC events in any existing club flyer.

Doug reported on current statistics for field trials and hunting tests:

Pointing Breed events (about 48,000 entries)	+1%
Retriever events (about 77,000 entries)	+2%
Beagle events (about 56,000 entries)	+1%
Spaniel events (about 11,000 entries)	+5%

The Irish Setter walking Gun Dog Championship was approved. Dachshund field trials want 200 miles between events. It is being recommended that Beagle Two Couple Pack events allow spayed/neutered dogs. Labradors and Golden Retrievers will be able to enter Spaniel hunting tests but regulations will allow Spaniel clubs to prioritize entries to Spaniels and to allow Retriever clubs to do the same. Prioritizing is an option of each club.

Doug Ljungren advised the Government Relations Department is looking out for the Performance Events. The Maryland legislature recently put blank pistols on the same level as other pistols so AKC sent a letter asking for the removal of blank pistols from the list with an explanation as to why.

On Rules and Regulations – the Delegate body changes rules in dog shows and field trials. Obedience and Agility don’t get voted on by the Delegate body. A discussion was held with no action. Also discussed was a possible “Versatility” title.

Canine Health Committee: Discussed possible guidelines for donations by clubs to veterinary medicine, police, etc. They went over plans for the National Parent Club Health Conference to be held in St. Louis in August. Also discussed was the mechanism for verifying health testing for Breeders of Merit and how to help parent clubs monitor this.

Dog Show Rules Committee: Discussed judges’ eligibility and judges’ ability to excuse dogs. They looked into the idea of a pee-wee class as a special attraction at dog shows. Also the committee discussed the possibility of allowing altered veterans at the all-breed shows.

Parent Club Committee: They discussed the Parent Club of Excellence designation and requirements and the new Complete Dog Book project. They also addressed the issue of superintendents publishing addresses.

Legislative Caucus: AKC recommends that everyone keep up with your state and local legislation. The big push this year will be “Lemon Laws” being pushed by the animal rights groups. If there is a problem in your area, you should work with other livestock groups. Invariably other groups are experiencing the same type of attacks. So, it is critical to work with others. If you have a “meet your legislator” day, take advantage and reach out to them. Remember, there are more of us than animal rights groups. Be pleasant and explain your area of expertise. Hand them a copy of the AKC Care and Conditions of Dogs Policy which is accepted as an intelligent and fair standard. Careful analysis of these bad bills reveals unreasonable requirements buried in a bill which make it virtually impossible for a legislator’s constituents to be in compliance. Send a follow-up thank you note again offering your assistance. Either donate to your legislator directly when they are up for election or donate to the AKC PAC to support elected officials.

Delegate Meeting:

AKC Board of Directors elections were held with the following being voted into office: Lee Arnold (attended a field trial in Hoffman riding the dog wagon for 2 days); Carl Ashby III, Alan Kalter and Harvey M. Wooding who has worked field trial events and been a hunt test secretary.

A vote was held on the Charter and Bylaws of The American Kennel Club, Inc., which added “to advance canine health and well-being” in Article III: Objects of the Club. The amendment passed.

A vote on a proposed amendment to Article IV, Sections 1 & 3 of the Charter and Bylaws of The AKC will expand the eligibility requirements for AKC membership to permit licensed agility clubs that meet the criteria to apply to become AKC member clubs.

A vote on a proposed amendment which would reduce the number of yearly Delegate meetings from four to three and suggesting that two meetings be expanded from two days to three days in order to enable increased attendance at the various Delegate Committee meetings failed to pass.

Two other amendments were read, 1. precluding any former AKC employee from serving on the Board and 2. allowing the Irish Setter Club of America to hold a Gun Dog Championship open to walking handlers only.

Sam Blessing's Rejoinder



Sam Blessing awoke at 4:30 a.m. to total darkness. For a moment he did not know where he was; then the feel of the cot and the smells of horse feed and neat's-foot registered; he was in the tack room of the horse trailer, parked beside the kennel at the Ames Plantation at Grand Junction, Tennessee.

Sam pulled on his trousers and rubber boots and walked in faint moonlight to the port-a-john, then to the Trapp Memorial Kennel, where his sole charge, Hopkins Mill Flash, was an inmate. Forty-watt bulbs in the gable ends of the shed lit the runs faintly. The dogs, sleeping in plastic barrels, sensed Sam belonged and did not stir. Using his pen light, he aligned the tumblers of the combination lock to the month and year of his birth—6/28. The big pointer emerged from his barrel and approached Sam with tail wagging. He extended his front legs, leaned back to stretch, and yawned. Sam opened the gate, whispered “heel,” and man and dog walked back to the trailer whose sides bore the painted letters:

Hopkins Mill Plantation
Thomasville, Georgia

Hopkins Mill Plantation was owned now by Randolph W. Drinker III—“Trip” to his friends. The seven thousand acres of crop and pine land had been bought, a few acres at a time, by his grandfather, the first Randolph and a Morgan partner, as a reward to himself for a coup on The Street. Until three years ago, Randolph, Jr., affectionately known as Randy, had owned it. In Randy the acquisitive gene, so strong in the Drinker line, had been dormant. Randy had spent much of his boyhood at Hopkins Mill, where he and Sam had discovered the out-of-doors. They had held bird-dog pups on cords while Sam's father had trained derbies, thus in one lesson imparting knowledge to a derby, two pups, and two lads. They had fished the Plantation's famous mill pond, shared coon hounds. Randy had gone off to college, worked a few years on Wall Street, then settled into a quiet life, September through June at Hopkins Mill, the other months on the coast of Maine.

Randy corrected anyone who called him the owner of Hopkins Mill Plantation. “No,” he would say quietly, “steward.” By the time of his death two years ago, he had accomplished the siring and rearing of three bright children (Trip and his two older

sisters); an early divorce from the children's mother who opted for a more worldly mate (one with more “drive,” as she told him); the authorship of three volumes of poetry and two volumes of eclectic short stories (critically well-received but commercially insignificant); the painting of several hundred oils and water colors, mostly scenes of the waters of Maine or the woods of south Georgia, given to friends or to conservation organizations for auction; the receipt of a certificate signed by Governor Jimmie Carter acknowledging twenty years of teaching English at the community college; the friendship of every Master of Hounds east of the Mississippi and in the British Isles; the accumulation of a room full of silver pieces, won by his bird dogs and hounds; the education through anonymous scholarships of sons and daughters of many employees; the consumption of more than his share of the output of the still at Glenlivet; the depletion of much of the first Randolph's capital, mostly through unwise investment at the behest of erstwhile friends (some well-meaning, some not); and finally, the attraction to Hopkins Mill of the largest funeral gathering in the history of the village. They had come from the worlds of farming, literature, art, conservation, fox hunting, bird-dog field trials, eastern high society and international finance, to list them roughly in the order of their importance to Randy, except for the last two, which held no importance for him at all. The crowd was too large for the little Episcopal church, so they held the service graveside under the ancient live oaks draped in gray mourning shawls of Spanish moss. Sam's wife had sung Amazing Grace; Sam had been a pall bearer.

(The second largest funeral at Hopkins Mill had been in another church cemetery fifty years before, for Sam's father. Sam could still see the casket emerging from the boxcar of the train that puffed into Thomasville on his sixteenth birthday, and the American flag on the casket resting on cedar fence posts above the grave in the shadow of the Ebenezer Baptist Church.)

In Randy's years of stewardship, Hopkins Mill had been a place for friends who came year after year to fish and shoot. The days of quail shooting and the bag limits were rationed by Randy according to the year's bird crop. Spring turkey hunting brought another set of friends; Randy and Sam served as their guides and callers, limiting their own shooting to the camera lens. The deer hunting was dedicated to employees and local people who at Randy's suggestion formed clubs to organize their sport. The Plantation's swamps and ponds served as refuge for waterfowl, which were not hunted.

Sam Blessing held many posts at Hopkins Mill Plantation, each earned by demonstrated competence: head kennel man for the bird dogs and the foxhound pack; headman in the walking horse barn and the hunter horse barn; dog handler for quail shooting parties; superintendent of the crew that maintained the lawns and the gardens, flower and vegetable. His proudest post was scout for the field-trial dogs.

The job of the scout is simple enough to describe: he must find the missing dog and return it to the course or signal its position if he finds it on point. The job is far from simple; it requires horsemanship, woodsmanship, total rapport with the dog, stealth

and cunning. The scout must know what the dog is likely to do under any conditions, and must control the dog, once found, by pantomime. In heavy cover, woods and swamps, finding the dog is a needle-in-a-hay-stack proposition. After the dog has been found, the scout's real and paradoxical duties begin.

By the rule book, the scout must return the found dog to the course by the most direct route. To comply literally with the rules, the scout should bring the dog straight to the course even if the dog is found far behind the gallery. In practice the scout instead brings the dog forward parallel to the course, with dog and scout out of sight, and then guides the dog back on course far ahead of the handler—or uses a shortcut to short a circuit a bend in the course. If the maneuver is successful, it will appear to the judges that the dog has never been behind or been handled by the scout at all. While protocol permits the handler to whistle, sing or squall to his dog, the scout must command the dog with a whisper—if he is to remain undetected.

The scout must know the territory and where he is in it. In pinewoods on an overcast day, all directions look the same. While a compass is a comfort to the scholarly woodsman, the good scout's compass is internal.

A handful of men and women in the long history of the field-trial sport have been world-class scouts. A majority of these have been black men like Sam Blessing. The rest have been the sons, daughters or wives of professional handlers.

“Sixty percent dog, thirty percent scout, ten percent handler,” is the phrase often used to describe the successful field-trial race.

Sam Blessing had fifty years' experience as a scout. His eyesight was still keen—he was proud that he did not need eye glasses. While his six-foot frame stooped a little, his life of daily physical labor had kept him fit and supple, one with a horse.

Randy had not campaigned widely on the field-trial circuit, content to enter a dog or two in the stakes of neighboring clubs in Georgia, Alabama and north Florida. He had been valued as a judge or just a guest who could entertain the gallery when the dog work turned dull.

Throughout his life Randy had enjoyed the things he and Sam shared as boys, especially fly fishing for shellcrackers in March on the mill pond, sixty acres of cypress studded water formed by the mill dam Simon Hopkins put on the creek in 1790. It had been on the mill pond at dawn, as the sun's first rays turned the mist silver, that Randy had told Sam he was going to die. He had done it without tears and with a sense of peace that at first frightened Sam; but before they had tied up the boat by the old stone mill house that served as Randy's painting studio, Sam understood his friend's acceptance of on-coming death. It gave Sam strength now to think about that morning.

In Trip Drinker the acquisitive gene had resurfaced with a vengeance. After high school at Woodberry Forest in Virginia, he had gone to Princeton, then to the London School of Economics, then to Wall Street. After two years of apprenticeship, he had gone for his Harvard MBA, then returned to the investment bank and joined the mergers and acquisitions team; he quickly starred.

Trip had spend little time at Hopkins Mill through his school days and his climb in the world of finance. But when Randy died, Trip bought his sister's interest and announced a new regime. The fox hounds and thoroughbred hunters would be dispersed. For half the season he would lease the quail shooting to corporations for executive and customer entertainment. To assure enough shooting (executives liked to shoot more than hunt, Sam had long observed),

liberated quail would be salted on the courses. The deer hunting would be leased for cash to clubs at the going rate.


When he heard the plans, Sam was almost glad Randy was not around. The idea of Hopkins Mill as a released bird place would have depressed Randy, he knew. But it was happening all over the quail belt; most of the old places were using released birds and resorting to pay-to-shoot. The big risk, of course, was disease that could decimate the wild quail and the wild turkey too.

Trip Drinker paid little attention in his youth to the dogs at Hopkins Mill, but since becoming its owner he fancied himself an expert. He had done his literary due diligence on bird dogs and field trials, but his business life left him little time for hands-on experience. This was the first year a Hopkins Mill dog had qualified to run in the National Championship since Trip became the squire.

Bringing home the game... by Harold Biebel.

Closing out the 2005/06 Iowa pheasant season.

On New Year's day, 2006, I was in Iowa with my Brittanys Burney and Sugarbear. We were in north east Iowa hunting with our good friend Don who lives in Cresco, IA. Don has access to land covered in harvested corn and beans and surrounded by CRP grass lands. Don was able to put us onto a few roosters in a year when the pheasant count was way down.

The dogs and pheasants photos are from January 2, 2007. I got my limit of 3 roosters that day. In the photo above that's intense Burney on the left and elegant Sugarbear on the right. Sugar is kinda giving me the squint eye, saying, we are not going to stop with the sun still up are we?!

The day started out slow. Don and I went to several fields that should have held pheasants and came up empty. Don, keeping us moving, moved on to some other great looking land on the other side of the county. We walked way back to a food plot and found pheasant tracks in the snow. Our energy level went way up. As we started into the food plot Sugar immediately went on a hard point at some thick grass that was half knocked down and covered over with snow. I worked my way up to her. Just as I got close a big rooster bolted out the back side of the grass. One shot, one bird on the ground, dead. Sugar was on it in a flash and retrieved it back to my hand. Wow, just wonderful. Classic bird dog work.

The only other rooster in that food plot tried to sneak out the far end. Don found his tracks and Don and Sugar started to track the bird. Those two tracked that bird for a 1/2 mile to the road ditch and then down the ditch for another 1/2 mile. At that point the rooster was out of cover and up against the drive way to the farm house. And, as you would expect, he launched right directly at and over the farm house. Don had to pull his shot and call a safety. No rooster but a lot of great bird dog work.

Then it was off to a new area. Don drove to the start of a long creek ditch through a very large picked corn field. There was a grass buffer about 20 yards wide on both sides of the creek. One field over was prime CRP grass land. The creek line looked birdy for sure. Out came Burney and Sugar and some more number 5's in my coat pocket. Don asked me if I would like him to drop me here and he would drive around to the far end of the creek and block and wait for me there. He didn't have to ask twice. Burney and Sugar got their Tri-Tronics collars turned on and we were off.

We had only gone about 50 yards on the north side of the creek when Burney spun and locked up facing some thick grass on the creek bank. Burney and I have been pheasant hunting together for some 8 years and I know what that means, "bird here boss!" Burney has

a fantastic nose and loves to point. He had the bird pinned. Was it a rooster or a hen? Double time it over to him and find out. Just as I got to Burney the rooster launched. A simple right to left pass shot, well, not so simple in a strong tail wind. My first shot missed, my second shot was closer, but still late, the third #5 hit him. Down he went, on the other side of the creek, bounced once and was off running. And so was Burney. Burney swam the creek; I could tell from his beeper collar that he was on the bird's trail.

Now I had to get across the creek. Back track a 1/4 mile to the bridge and then a 1/4 mile back up to where the bird bounced. By the time I got across the creek I could hear Burney's collar in point mode. Burney had found the rooster about 60 yards from where it had come down. Burney had it pinned again. But that bird was not done flying. As I came up, mostly out of wind, up he went again. This time I had him. One shot (yes, that did make, actually, 4 shots in total), one bird down and Burney was off to get him. And then back to my hand. What a boy that Burney is.

That's two. I was very happy with two. But Sugar was not done rooster hunting.

We were now on the south side of the creek with a south blowing wind. Sugar and I were working slow and close in the thick grass along the creek when Sugar locked up only about 10 yards in front of me. Got's to be a hen. No way. Sugar was frozen, tail up, nose down. That means rooster. I got ready and walked into the grass. Out came the rooster. Yes! One shot, one dead rooster on the ground. Yes! Sugar was on it in a flash and she brought it back to my hand.

Rally Freestyle Elements

There's a new game in town, Rally Freestyle Elements (Rally-FrEe for short), a fun and challenging combination of Rally Obedience and Canine Musical Freestyle developed by Julie Flanery of Philomath, Oregon.

I have been participating in Rally-FrEe with my 2 year old Brittany "Conor" (Knollbrook's Two Jigs and a Reel) from the inception of the sport. At first I thought it would be a great foundation for our future in AKC Obedience and Canine Musical Freestyle, and I was right about that. But the more we participate in Rally-FrEe the more we both love it as a sport of its own. We competed in the second ever video competition and earned 3rd place and a qualifying score, and then competed in the first ever live competition (on Conor's 2nd birthday!) and earned two more qualifying scores to become one of the first five dogs in the world to earn a Novice Rally-FrEe title.

What's it like at a Rally-FrEe competition? At first you think you're at a Rally-Obedience trial, with a numbered course of signs and handlers out doing their "walk-through" without their dog. But then the competition starts and you know it's something different. The first thing you notice is that there's music playing. Many of the handlers are in "festive attire" and the dogs are wearing colorful bandanas or decorative collars. The first dog and handler team takes to the course and you notice that sometimes the dog is heeling on the handler's left side, and sometimes they are heeling on the handler's right side. The signs direct the teams to perform circles, spins and leg weaves, but at the Free Choice signs (four per course) things get interesting. The behaviors performed at the Free Choice signs are up to the handler, and might include a side-pass, rolling over, circling a cane or even pushing a scooter! The spectators' applause at the different signs lets you know your performance is appreciated. The run ends with the dog taking a bow, and an "exercise finished" from the judge.

Rally-FrEe is a sport of positives. Most participants are clicker-training the behaviors, although that certainly is not a requirement. The scoring is always positive. You start with no points and earn points at each sign, 1 – 3 points for "attempted with significant deficiencies", 4 – 7 points for "performed adequate to well" and 8 – 10 points for "performed very well to superb". Additional points are awarded overall for Heelwork, Attention, Teamwork, and for Creativity and Difficulty on the Free Choice signs. The maximum possible points are 200, and a qualifying score is 125 points. Titles are awarded at the Novice, Intermediate, Advanced and Championship levels. For both live and video competitions competitors receive the course(s) 7 to 10 days in advance of the competition to allow for practice and planning of Free Choice behaviors.

Currently there are live Rally-FrEe competitions scheduled in Pennsylvania, Washington, Oklahoma and Oregon, or groups of 3 – 10 dog and handler teams can submit a request to hold a video competition. Rally-FrEe has members in the US and Canada, Australia, New Zealand and the Netherlands, and has received inquiries of interest from Germany, England and South Africa, so it is already a world-wide sport.

User Error by Jessica Hlebak



When someone contacts us here at the farm about a problem they are having with their horse I immediately ask them to tell me exactly what they are doing when the particular problem arises. 9 out of 10 times problems with horses are caused by user error. If I've learned anything from horses over the years it's that they will tell on their rider. If you will take the time to look, your horse will show you the root of the problem.

There are several miscommunications that can occur through the rider's hands. There are 3 basic ways to hold the reins; one rein in each hand, both reins in one hand with the pointer finger in the middle and both reins in one hand with the entire hand around the reins.

When holding the reins with two hands (one rein in each hand) the rider will be using what is called direct reining. This means that if the rider wants to turn left, he will pull with his left hand and vice versa. When using two hands it is important that the rider is aware that the two hands must work independently from each other. Each hand should stay on its respective side, never crossing the plane of the horse's withers. This is one of the biggest mistakes that I see riders make. With direct reining, the rider will be putting direct pressure on the side of the mouth in the direction that they wish to go. Remember to always use the least amount of pressure required to get the desired response from the horse. In other words, do not pull as hard as you can every time you want to turn or stop the horse. When using direct reining and asking the horse to turn do not pull out to the side, instead pull in the direction of your hip bone. This will result in a much more clear and effective direction for the horse.

When riding with one hand on the reins the rider uses indirect pressure to cue the horse often called neck reining. In neck reining or indirect reining, the horse is responding to opposite pressure on the bit and moving away from pressure on the neck by the reins. For example, if I were to steer my horse to the right I would move my hand (that is holding both reins) to the right. When that happens, the left rein will put pressure on the horses neck (which he is trained to move away from) and some pressure on the bit to the left. This is why horses that have not been trained to neck rein can become easily confused. The main issue with this type of steering that I see is that the rider will have a tendency to pull back and over when asking the horse to turn instead of only moving their hand over.

Keep in mind that the less you can pull on your horse's mouth the better of you will be. The horse will be happier for it also. This leads me into another common mistake I see: failing to loosen reins at the appropriate times. Horses are trained to give to pressure and their reward for giving to pressure should be the release of that pressure. So for example, when you ask your horse



to stop and you pull back and say “Whoa” (always use whoa only for stopping your horse, not slowing down) as soon as that horse comes to a complete stop you should put your hand forward and let off of his mouth.

If you hold too much the horse will often become irritated and frustrated. The same goes for when in motion, be sure that when you can you move your hands forward and let some pressure off of the horse’s mouth. I often see riders asking their horse to move forward while immediately grabbing up on the reins and taking contact with the horse’s mouth. This is the equivalent of having your foot on the gas and breaks at the same time. When asking your horse to move forward you should also move your hand forward and cluck or squeeze with your legs. Once the horse begins moving forward you can then take the necessary contact.

Small little changes can open up the lines of communication between horse and rider. Pay attention to your horse if you are having problems, he will tell you what you might be doing wrong. Changing a few bad habits can make all the difference in the world with your horse. If you think you are having miscommunications with your horse first evaluate your riding, have a friend watch or video tape you. Also be willing to seek out a professional to help. Often they will pick up on small things that will help you and horse improve your lines of communication and help avoid user errors.

JUDGING STANDARDS

Bill Conlin once made the sage observation that field trials are the only sporting event where a group of amateurs pass judgment on the working product of the professional. For the most part this is a truism. Very few field trials are judged by professionals. The wonder of it all is that the system works as well as it does.

A crying need has always seemed to be some type of public forum that young prospective trainers and judges could turn to for guidance. There is no rule book as in baseball, nor any umpire school one can attend. Only through the process of observation and applying the very limited written regulations does one become qualified as a judge. In years gone by there was a sizable cadre of bird hunters to draw on. Today, I would suspect that many a field trial judge has never hunted or shot birds over a dog. It's little wonder that so many young judges are mystified by various situations that develop in the course of a trial. Wouldn't the entire field trial fraternity profit greatly from a question and answer column in *The American Field*, utilizing the knowledge and experience of veteran judges?

The term "judging standards" is a mighty broad subject and deserves some in-depth discussion. Certainly the Minimum Requirements are quite succinct and need little explanation. Once one leaves the "definitive word" of the Minimum Requirements there is very little for a judge to rely on other than written standards that exist for certain particular stakes.

Dealing with the subject of written standards is a most difficult task. Time and again it has been said that what a particular stake needs is a written standard as a criterion of judgment. It is not for want of trying that this process fails, but purely the interpretation of the written word and the meaning of those words to different individuals.

As an example, a standard for one prominent shooting dog stake requires that a dog "reach for promising objectives." On the surface, this seems quite straight forward. Recognizing that the stake is advertised as a shooting dog stake, just how far should a dog reach to an objective? Is one hundred yards or one mile a reasonable distance for a dog to search in quest of game? Personally, I would have little use for a shooting dog that went a full mile to an objective, even though that might be a likely objective and perhaps the only objective in view.

Efforts to define written standards more closely seem only to confuse the matter and



in many instances place undue restrictions on a satisfactory final judgment. "Absence from judgment" is a classic example. Lacking a stated time lapse that a dog may be out of judgment, the accepted practice dictates roughly one third the total running time. What action does a judge take if the finest performer in a 30-minute stake has an absence of 11 minutes? If a rigid requirement of no more than a 10-minute absence is written into the standard, obviously the best overall performance will be eliminated.

My personal vote on the subject of written standards is to paint them with a broad brush, allowing judges to use their discretion with the exception of very specific areas such as backing. I see no problem in requiring a dog to back before he is placed provided this requirement is clearly spelled out. It takes the guess work out of the judgment process.

The subject of pace and range is always a debatable issue. Field trials have undergone a drastic change with the advent and improvement of the Tennessee Walking Horse. Looking back over the span of forty years that I have competed and judged there is no question in my mind that the present-day field trial shooting dog was yesterday's all-age dog. How to cope with this runaway trend is moot. The present wave of shooting dog championships is the outgrowth of those who didn't quite make the grade in the all-age theatre and needed their own stage. Now that the field trial shooting dog is beyond the reach of the average owner-handler a new wave has formed reverting to foot handled dogs. Perhaps this is good for the sport, a balance wheel as Dr. Alvin Nitchman has put it. At any rate, if one is to expect any degree of success in today's competitive circuit, a fast walking horse and wide ranging dog are a necessity.

One of the major problems that face judges at the present time is differentiating between shooting dogs and all-age dogs. Certain aspects of a dog's performance in either stake are or should be identical. Finish on game, style on point and manner of moving would be the clearest examples of common desirable qualities a judge seeks. There should be little difference between the shooting dog or all-age dog on point. It's in the ground heat that a separation occurs. In judging an all-age stake proper judgment requires a major emphasis on the ground heat, not the number of finds which properly should have the emphasis in shooting dog stakes. Because few present day judges have actually seen a true all-age performance there is a tendency on the part of many to eliminate the best all-age performances on technical grounds, preferring to select their winners from the ranks of a flawless or clean performers on game. As a rule, this boils down to shooting dogs being run in all-age competition.

"Balance wheel" stakes certainly have a place in my book. The New England Championship is a classic example and in passing it should be stated that one of the few meaningful standards and performance guidelines was written by William Harnden Foster for this stake. It goes about as far as a standard can without being over restrictive. This masterpiece appears in *Field Trials*, by William F. Brown, editor of *The American Field*.

(Anyone with judging aspirations should read this book thoroughly, and club officials should have a copy for ready for reference.)

When the New England Championship Connecticut in 1967 the handlers walked in the tradition of the stake since its inception back in 1929. As the grounds were opened up, pressure built to allow horseback handling which was instituted. The three one-hour courses that had been too long for a normal walking heat became too short, requiring lengthening. Then came the problem of controlling the handler's pace.

For a solution I had only to think back to a situation at Grand Junction where Dr. T. Benton King was officiating.

One of the excited young handlers galloped up to Dr. King and announced that his dog was "on point about a half mile to the left rear" of the gallery. Dr. King replied: "Flush your birds and bring your dog to the front where we can see him. You know you have to show him to us, we don't have to go looking of your dog."

What wonderful advice that was! It set matters straight. There wasn't the slightest doubt in anyone's mind who was judging and who had to be pleased. The handlers were there to win and the only way thou could win was to please the judges with their performance.

From this bit of wisdom coming from one of the great judges in field trial history, came the seed of an idea to control handler speed at the New England Championship. Why not let the handlers ride just as fast as they wished, no warning, no arguments? Just let them go, but make the judges stay back. If a handler couldn't see his judge behind him he obviously wasn't pleasing the judge. It worked.

Of recent years there has been a decided change in judging standards for derby stakes. Complete finish on game is almost a requirement. Just what effect this practice will have on the competitor's later performances once they reach all-age classification is only conjecture on my part, but there are enough noted winners that have folded their tents at six and seven years of age to lead me to question the practice.

In my early competitive years a fall Derby was only expected to establish a point. Under present standards complete finish with polished form are looked for at most trials. In spring Derbies, it is a waste of time to run a dog that cannot be relied on to have multiple finds of sterling quality. Gone are the slashing carefree races that marked promising young dogs of yesteryear. Setters in particular are not geared for this time table. Something has to give under the pressure. Several noted champions come to mind that are washed up at six years of age when they should be entering the very zenith of their careers.

There is no denying the fact that the general level of excellence in present-day competition is far above the competition of two decades ago. A dog that was steady to shot and wing was almost assured of some placements back in the 1950s without regard for pointing style or composure after the flush. Judges were lucky to have three steady dogs to place. In the most recent running of the Orange County

Shooting Dog Stake, eleven of the 45 starters had four or more finds pointed with exquisite style and finish! Winning isn't easy, nor is the task of judging these worthy competitors. The dividing line between winners and losers can be a flick of the tail or one step at flush. Admittedly there were dogs just as polished in years gone by, but their numbers were not as great. A handler knew which dogs he had to beat before the trial started. Today you have to beat every entry.

One lamentable modern practice that is on the increase is that of griping and complaining after judgment has been rendered. There is no place for this in field trials. For the most part stakes are conscientiously judged. Complaining handlers cannot change the decision. The judges see every brace. The complainers usually see only their own. Intimidation of judges is deplorable and should not be tolerated. After all, a handler doesn't have to run under a judge he dislikes; he does it by choice.

In some of the larger stakes in recent years there has been a tendency to "spread the jam," as it were, for financial as well as ego reasons. Keep everyone happy is the motto. I disagree. Should one handler show three dogs that deliver the three best performances, he should first, second, and third.

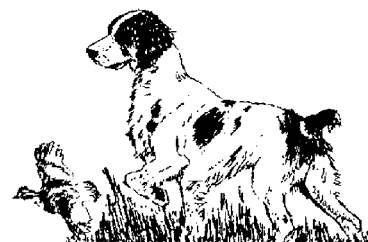

2013 ABC EASTERN GUN DOG FUTURITY

Judges for the Gun Dog Futurity were Ronnie Clark from New Jersey and Tommy Thomas from Illinois. These two judges came looking forward to, and thoroughly enjoyed watching 26 young derby age Brittanys come to the line ready to run. Both of the judges were very positive and made every effort to give every dog their full attention to its performance in the field.

After watching a full thirteen braces, the judges were very impressed with the quality of these young dogs and mentioned that the winner, and all the placing dogs, should be field champions in their lifetime. Without hesitation, the judges awarded the 2013 Eastern Gun Dog Futurity win to Sigbrit's She's A Lady JH (Cricket), handled by breeder/owner Bobbie L. Sigmund. Second place was Diamond Hill Storm Cat (Storm) handled by owner/breeder Lisa Pollock. Third was Alder GT Lucifer (Lucy) handled by owner/breeder Dan Riedl, and fourth went to CH KJ's Masked Man (Ranger) handled by Bob Burchett, owned by Ken & Jane Windom.

Brace 1: ILLUSION N' GINJAC ABOVE THE CLOUDS (ZIGGY) Jamie Morgan and HILL'S FLASH FIRED SPARKLIN GEM (GEM) Dawn Hill. Both dogs broke away quickly going to the front. Gem got caught up during the brace making sure her handler was coming along with her on the course. At 18 Ziggy went wide, scented, and then came back to a covey find. Ziggy then made sure everyone saw the birds when he went in to flush on his own. Gem watched the birds fly by and became a little more animated in the field. Ziggy picked up the pace after his find, but had an unproductive at the 25 minute mark. Each dog ran at their own pace, and finished with having fun in the field.

Brace 2: DIAMOND HILL STORM CAT (STORM) Lisa Pollock and PALMETTO POINT'S AUTUMNS BLAZING STAR (AUTIE) Dr. Tom Bass. Ready to run both dogs broke away at the Slamming Sammy Road going to the front quickly. Each of the dogs was hitting objectives and handling well on the course. At 15 Storm had an unproductive, and when released ran back to the front fast to catch up with his brace mate. Autie had a find at 21 near the General Sherman Hill, but before Dr. Bass could get to her, Autie flushed her covey and a shot was fired. Storm was seen running the edges and at the 27 minute mark, he was standing tall and showing us a very stylish point. Lisa flushed the birds with Storm staying through the flush and fire. Storm was then released and ran quickly to the front finishing his edges on some nice moves. Autie had a quick gun dog ground race through the brace. Tim ended with Autie close and Storm up front and still hunting hard going way.

Brace 3: ALDER HOLY TERROR (KIRBY) Dan Riedl and TURNINGPTS LANDSLIDE (MACK) Julie Nelson. Breaking away at the H Barrel Road, both dogs started off well. Each were covering ground and hitting objectives on the course. Mack had a find at 12 and held his classy point while his handler Julie flushed and fired. Mack was then sent on and caught up with his brace mate quickly. Kirby was running a slower pace than his handler was expecting and was picked up at 19. Mack continued on the course alone

until time was called handling well for his owner.

Brace 4: CH HILL'S MID-NIGHT EXPRESS (ALEX) Dawn Hill and WRIGLEY'S BODEMEISTER (BODE) Bob Burchett. Brace started with Bode running wide and hitting the edges hard. Alex ran a slower pace but kept hunting with the intent of finding a bird on the course. Both dogs were responding well for their handlers during the brace. Bode kept busy hitting the edges and staying out wide on the course. Time was called at the end of the brace with neither dog finding game but still enjoying their time in the field.

Brace 5: AMMO'S RED HOT CHILI PEPPER (PEPPER) Grienhagen and ALDER ALL TUNDRA TUKTU (TUCKER) Dan Riedl. Both dogs were ready to run at the start. After a short playtime with each other, they were off to the front quickly. Pepper kept to the inner course edges with a nice hunting pattern. Tucker went out to the outer edges which rewarded him with a covey find at 17. Dan was able to flush up a covey for his dog just before Tucker was ready to move forward. Tucker stayed out wide but still handled well for Dan. Both dogs then continued on the course ahead of their handlers and finished the brace well.

Brace 6: KIP'S BAY DARK N' STORMY MISS MADDIE (MADDIE) John Kip and DIAMOND HILL GONE WITH THE BREEZE (TONIC) Lisa Pollock. Each dog was ready to roll at the start of the H Barrel Road breakaway. Both dogs ran to the front quickly with Tonic running big and wider of the two. At 16 Tonic was standing tight on his point, and while Lisa flushed a nice covey, Tonic stood watching the birds fly away. Maddie was running smartly over the course and handled kindly for her handler John. Tonic went into the thicker cover during the second half of the brace and was not seen for a few minutes. Tonic then appeared on the left coming out of the woods and went back to running wide and staying up front. Maddie never gave up hunting for a bird of her own and very pleasing to watch in the field. Time ended and the dogs were gathered up.

Brace 7: CH KJ'S MASKED MAN (RANGER) Bob Burchett and BISCUIT'S BUDDA BANSHEE (BUDDA) Tom Jagielski. Ready to roll at the H Barrel Road start, when released each dog ran to the front quickly. Ranger was hitting the edges hard and fast, while Budda took a little more time to get up to speed. At seven Ranger had a nice covey find with a very classy stylish point and stayed while Bob fired. Ranger was then sent on ahead getting to the front quickly. Budda was hitting the road edges and checking back with his handler a few times before getting back to hunting and checking objectives nearby. Ranger was found standing tall at the 16 minute mark with another covey find, and when Bob fired birds were flying everywhere. Ranger aced on ahead with a very nice gun dog race. Budda was found to have a nice companion hunting dog range throughout the brace. Time was called with Ranger out front on the course still working hard on the course.

Brace 8: STARLIGHT'S CANIS MAJOR (MAJOR) Theresa Richmond and BISCUIT'S ME WEARING THE

PANTS (PADDY) Tom Jagielski. Breakaway was at the Slamming Sammy Road with both dogs eager to get started. Each dog ran to the front quickly and started to hit the edges on both sides. The 13 minute mark showed both dogs having a divided find each pointing proudly. While both handlers tried to get to the birds, each of the dogs decided they wanted to flush on their own. Birds went flying in all directions on this nice covey find. Shots were fired by each handler and dogs went on forward. Going through the Less water Creek, Paddy and Major were seen keeping to the front. Time was called with both dogs still working ahead of their handlers.

Brace 9: SIGBRIT'S SHE' SA LADY (CRICKET) Bobbie L. Sigmund and RICOCHET GUNSOMOKES MR. DILLON (DILLION) Bob Burchett. Eager to start and straining to get rolling, these two dogs broke away running to get to the front quickly. Each dog was working the edges hard and staying out front, this was a brace to see. Even while running wide on the outside edges, Dillon and Cricket still handled kindly for their handlers and were pleasing to watch on this part of the course near Sherman Hill. Going through the Less Water Creek, both dogs barely stopped to drink before they were headed forward, with Cricket the quicker of the two, she went running ahead again. At No Man's Corner Cricket was observed hitting the edges up front and hunting hard in the thick cover. At the 22 mark, Cricket was running smartly down a thick edge and then whipped around quickly stopping to a staunch stylish classic point on her birds. Standing until the flush and fire was almost over, Cricket resumed her extremely eye catching ground race on the course, staying to the front through the entire brace. Dillon had no bird contact during his run, but his ground race was very nice to watch. When time ended for this brace, Cricket was seen still running hard up front and hunting hard for that next find.

Brace 10: SWEET GEORGIA BROWN (CHARLIE) Jim Carter and SIGBRIT'S JC'S SOULFUL EYES (HALO) Bobbie L. Sigmund. Though the weather was getting a little warmer, this brace of dogs was ready and willing to get started. At the release, each ran up front running hard and fast. At eight minutes Charlie was found standing tall in a heavy thicket. Halo came over near Charlie, went into the thicket pinpointing the birds, and helped the covey flush up. Charlie stayed while Jim fired and then was sent on forward. Both dogs started to hit the edges a little harder after having bird contact. Each dog went on to the front in different directions with Charlie hitting the edges first. Halo went to the sides more often looking for her own birds. Up front, Charlie was standing a covey at 17 when Halo scented the birds and stopped to point on her own. Birds were flushed and shots were fired. Halo went on, while Charlie stood through flush and fire for the second time with grand style. Time was called with both dogs doing a very nice job, Halo hitting the edges more to the side, while Charlie was having himself a very nice gun dog run of his own.

Brace 11: HARPER'S WINDY CITY HARLEY QUINN (HARLEY) Bob Burchett and AMMO'S PLAY IT AGAIN (MELODY) Sandra Leavens. Ready to start, these two ran

to the front eager to get on the course. Staying ahead of their handler, both dogs worked hard in the heavy cover. Each dog handled well for their handlers during the entire brace. Running the inner edges of the course. Melody showed her handler a very nice companion dog run. Neither Harley nor Melody had bird contact when time was called at the end.

Brace 12: ADLER GT LUCIFER (LUCY) Dan Riedl and GREEN MOUNTAIN SHOTGUN LIZY (LIZY) Mike Blondin. Starting at the H Barrel Road, both dogs were excited to get started. Released to go, Lucy did not waste any time getting up front quickly and working the edges hard. Lizy stood at point around five minutes, but her handler could not produce any birds, so she was sent on. Lucy was seen still working fast and hard in the heavy cover and outside edges. Lizy during the middle of the brace kept checking in with her handler frequently and continued to run a nice companion hunting dog race. Looking for Lucy up front, she was found standing very staunchly on point by Dan at 28 minutes into the brace. Birds were flushed and Lucy did not hesitate to get back up front with a nice forward race on the course. Time was called with Lucy still pushing to get forward on the course working hard and going away strong.

Brace 13: AMMO'S RED HOT CURRY (CURRY) Eva Bailey and ALDER DELANE RED FERN (FERN) Dan Riedl. Last brace of the stake Curry and Fern were eager to get rolling. Both dogs ran to the front quickly then established their own hunting patterns. Curry showed the judges her style of a very methodical hunting dog pattern on the course. Fern was running hard, until she became a little warm, and Dan picked her up at the 12 minute mark. Curry continued on the course, handling well for her owner, and enjoying herself in the field. Time was called and the judges thanked Ms. Bailey for her time.

The AA stake was intense with a brace sheet full of young AA dogs running in the deep south this year. Judges Kent Patterson from Franklin, TN and Alan Powell from Warner Robins, GA saddled up to sit in Judgment of the 15 young dogs in contention for the Blue ribbon. The judges' eye view of the placing dogs at this year's ABC 2013 Eastern All Age Field Futurity stake is noted.

Fourth place: Lil and Mike's Whoa Nellie – Ed Kerr's pair of dogs showed their winning ways with Nellie finishing out the placements. Nellie went birdless during her thirty minutes but had several excellent casts, all to the front. She shortened her race at twenty to twenty-five minutes. Ed called her in for a water break and, with her batteries recharged, she finished ahead.

Third place: TORNADO ALLEY RIP – Ben Lorensen handled Rip with Kyle Merrill scouting. Rip had a nice forward race that included some big casts. His finish was strong showing both conditioning and stamina. No birds were pointed by Rip.

Second place: LIL AND MIKE'S SOPHIE TUCKER – Sophie's time down was enjoyable in that she went to birdy areas on her own, with speed. She showed class in her way of going with the type of gait that keeps you watching. At 28, she swapped ends going down a line of pine trees in the center of the wheat field. Standing with style, she demonstrated derby manners.

First place: KINWASHKLY MIDNIGHT RAMBLER – Saving the best for the last brace, "Jack" was turned loose as a bye dog. He headed to the front and continued a strong, forward race that showed very little immaturity. He was rewarded with finds at 14 and 26 minutes. Both finds came while on a logical cast with Jack showing a lot of style plus steady to wing and shot manners at the flush. Each find was at places not visited by other dogs in the stake. Handler Kyle Merrill did an excellent job of showing his dog and scouting by Ben Lorensen was minimal. There was no question which dog was the class of the stake.

Mixed Berry Tart

Crust

2 cups crushed pretzels
3 tablespoons sugar
12 tablespoons (1 - 1/2 sticks) unsalted butter, melted

Filling

8 ounces cream cheese
3/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon sugar
7 ounces plain Greek yogurt (not fat-free)
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
2 3-oz. packages strawberry gelatin
1 16-oz. package frozen unsweetened sliced strawberries
1 16-oz. package frozen unsweetened blueberries
3/4 cup heavy cream

Make crust: Preheat oven to 400°F; mist a 9-by-13-inch baking pan with cooking spray. Place crushed pretzels in bowl of a food processor. Add sugar and melted butter and pulse to combine. Press pretzel mixture into baking dish and bake for 8 minutes.

Transfer to a wire rack and allow to cool completely, about 20 minutes.

Make filling: Using an electric mixer on medium speed, beat cream cheese with 3/4 cup sugar until well blended, about 2 minutes. Fold in yogurt and vanilla. Spread over cooled pretzel crust, cover with plastic wrap and chill for at least 2 hours.

In a large bowl, dissolve both packages of gelatin in 2 cups boiling water. Let cool until mixture begins to get syrupy, about 15 minutes. Stir in strawberries and blueberries and pour over cream cheese layer. Chill until firm, 2 to 3 hours.

Whip cream until soft peaks form. Add remaining 1 Tbsp. sugar and continue whipping until stiff peaks form. Cut tart into squares and serve with whipped cream. Serves 12

Dave's Raspberry Vinaigrette Green Beans

Ingredients

3 1/2 lbs. fresh green beans
1 3/4 cup vegetable oil
1 3/4 cup raspberry vinegar
3/8 cup white sugar
1 3/4 tsp. salt
3/4 tsp. white pepper

Directions: Wash and trim green beans, removing strings. Arrange beans in vegetable steamer; place over boiling water. Cover and steam for 8 min. plunge beans into ice water. Drain well and pat dry with a paper towel. Place in a shallow container. Combine all other ingredients and cook over low heat, stirring constantly until sugar dissolves. Stir briskly with wire whisk; pour over green beans and chill in refrigerator for 5 hours. Serve with slotted spoon.

CONDITIONS AND RULES • NOMINATING FEE: \$30.00 • Nomination must be made within 30 days of whelping or subject to late penalty fees. For all purebred Brittany bitches whelping a litter on January 1 thru December 31st, 2013, who are owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club.

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- **Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped. A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time.** This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.

- **Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** Late litter nominations will be accepted as late as 180 days from whelping. In addition to the Nomination fee of \$30.00 the late fees are \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be at the discretion of the Futurity Committee. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
- Dogs will be eligible to run in the designated futurity to be held in the Spring of the second year following the year of whelping.
- A final nomination fee will be due by October 1st of the year following whelping. Entry fees will be paid by the owner of the puppy for each Sectional Futurity field or bench event the dog enters.

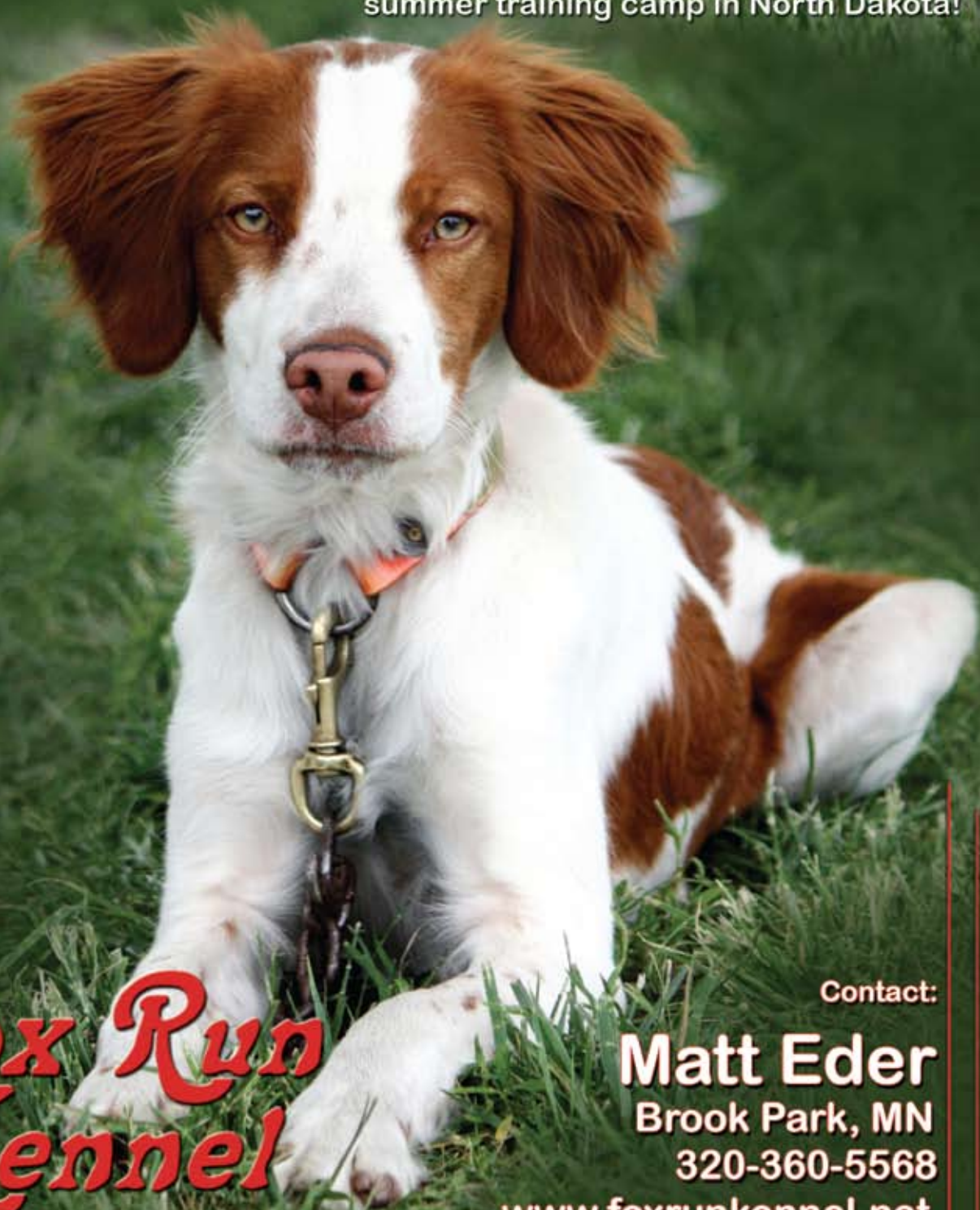
