A TIGER WITH ATTRIBUTES

I'd like to share with some reflections on a Brittany by the name of Tiger, or more properly Flatwood's Tiger. Even more important, I'd like to tell you about attributes and their relationship to Tiger and his progeny.

I really didn't have much association with this orange-and-roan Brittany during the years that Tiger was actively campaigned on the field trial circuit. At just about ten years of age, he was retired by his owner. Seven or eight months later he became the sire of a litter of ten pups from one of my son's Brittanyes. It seems hard to believe that this happened ten years ago, but I have one of the pups from that litter – an orange-and-white male by the name of Dewey – and he turned six this past summer.

I didn't know much about Tiger beyond his reputation. He was a field trial competitor of the highest class, and his accomplishments were well known in both his home stomping grounds – on the Brittany Central East Coast field trial circuit – and at the National level – in the Brittany Open All-Age Classic and Championship events. He pointed his birds with style and intensity. And I heard that Tiger was known for his stamina afield.

He took his first blue ribbon at the tender age of eighteen months, completing his field Championship just eight months later. He went on to win or place in numerous trials. Most Notable was the year 1992, when Tiger placed second in a field of sixty-nine Brittanyes during The National Open All-Age Championship. Of further significance was that one of his get, Field Champion RFS Tiger's Holly placed third in the same event.

Now let's consider the word "attribute." The dictionary defines the noun as:

1. An inherent characteristic,;
2. A word ascribing a quality."

In Brittany circles, it is assumed that when shopping for a new pup one should look for specific characteristics – or attributes, if you will – that are desired in a good bird dog. These include a strong desire to hunt and point birds with intensity. Biddability – the dog's willingness to respond to the trainer/handler – is also a significant attribute. Of equal

importance are endurance and temperament. Plain and simple, these attributes and their "fine tuning" are what Bob Wehle has focused on over the past sixty-odd years with his Elhew line of pointers.

Since it's all but impossible to identify such characteristics in a young pup, one should look for these attributes in the dam and sire of the litter. I see Tiger's qualities every day. They are visible very time Dewey whirls and establishes a point with such intensity that he quivers; whenever he is steady to wing and watches as the bird is taken by the gun; each time he honors another gundog's point; whenever he completes an hour-long field trial stake and still has more run to give; every time he playfully licks and paws at a young Brittany pup; whenever he puts his head on my arm and looks-up as if to say "rub my ears"; and on all those occasions when he follows me from room to room, wanting to be wherever I am.

With most of Dewey's field and show efforts behind him, there will be more time for the two of us to spend afield to pursuit of birds. I will also start thinking about my Brittany's passing along his attributes in the same manner that Tiger gave them to his offspring. Thus, the dam of the future litter will need to be from bloodlines similar to Dewey's

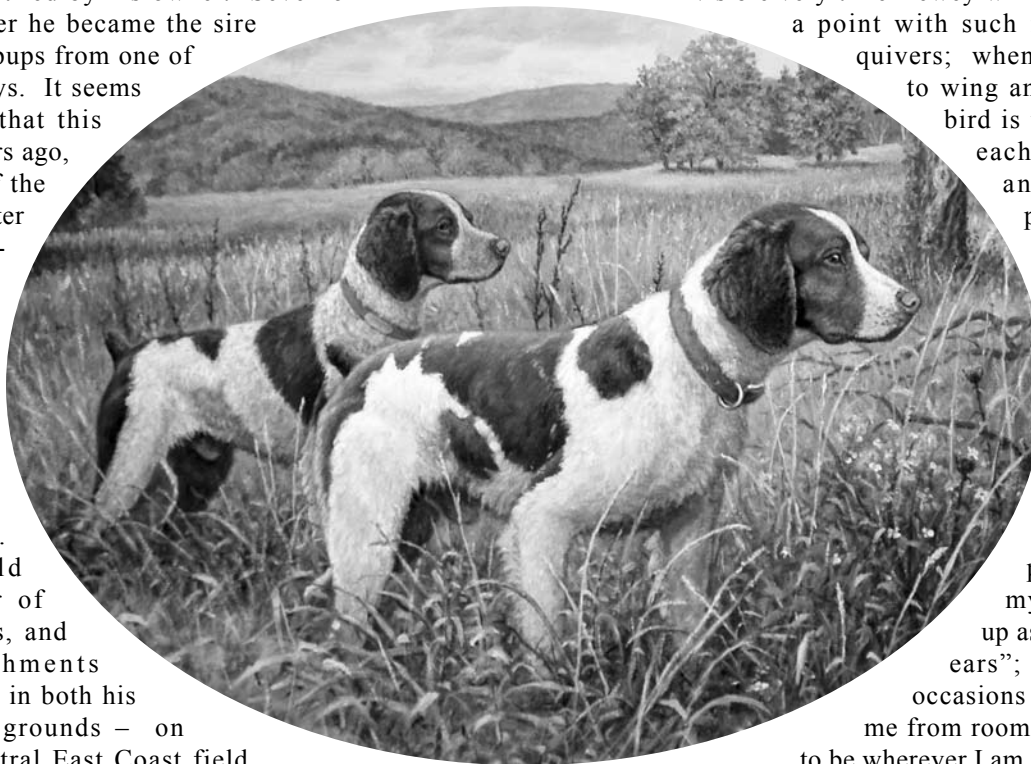
With a little care and good luck, his inherited attributes can even be intensified in the next generation.

Postscript

This story was first published in 2000 in "Feisty Little Pointing Dog" as part of this anthology.

Tiger was owned by Gene and Sherry Stewart; campaigned by Chad Holman. He sired 12 Field Champions and he was inducted into the Brittany Hall of Fame in 2001.

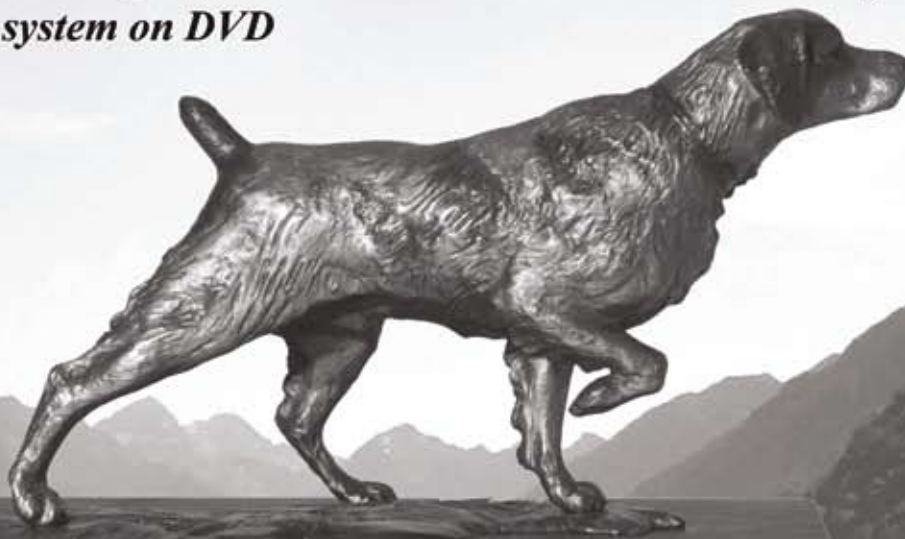
Dewey passed away in September 2006. He attained Field Champion at Kentucky field trial in October 2003 handled by Tom Tracy. With the assistance of frozen semen, he has sired 3 litters – of which several have owners that hunt and field trial.

E-Collar Basics

Electronic Collar, e-collar, shock collar...no matter what you call it, the fact remains that its introduction to the world of dog training has made a major impact. While it is probably the greatest advancement in training dogs, it's also often the subject of heated controversy. The term "shock collar" is often used by people who have never tried one, bringing up images of a dog forced to endure a torturous amount of voltage every time it makes a mistake. This could not be further from the truth, and we'll get to the "whys" and "hows" of all that shortly. First, a little history lesson.

E-collars have been around for many years, and they have been part of the Smith training array since 1969. The early collars were pretty primitive and had only one setting: h-o-t. The original e-collars were seriously hot, and the best use for them was in avoidance training, such as breaking a dog from chasing deer, skunks, livestock, snakes, and so on. Some people who used them in the early days often did so in anger and frustration. Unfairly, this gave the early "shock collars" a bad reputation, even though it was not the collar that was the problem but the person pushing the button.

Fast forward to the early '90s: E-collars had evolved to having variable intensities at several levels, plus the stimulation levels were consistent rather than erratic. With the early, more primitive collars, it was not unusual to have a low-flying aircraft's radio system, a police squad car radio, or even nearby power lines inadvertently - and randomly - set off a dog's collar. The new and greatly improved technology changed all that.

Other important improvements were being able to have split-second response time from the transmitter to the collar, and offering numerous levels of stimulation to choose from without having to look at the transmitter. But by far, the biggest improvement came in the form of consistent stimulation levels so low that the average person could not feel the lowest levels. *When a dog is properly and humanely conditioned to the e-collar, 95 percent of its usage will be at the lowest level the dog can feel.*

This e-collar is too loose and too low. Notice how it also interferes with the leather collar. This will give inconsistent and ineffective correction.



Range is another factor that has greatly improved over the past decade. Modern technology has given us collars that can, under ideal conditions, reach out over a mile.

It is important to recognize that "ideal conditions" mean no cover, no trees, no hills, mountains, or terrain of any sort. Think Bonneville Salt Flats. The more terrain and thick cover you add, the shorter the effective range of your collar will be, and this holds true for most consumer electronics, such as two-way radios. When choosing a collar, it makes sense to pick a model that will best suit your type of hunting and the conditions you work in.

So you see, fortunately for our dogs and our sensibilities, the units have come a long way. Our modern e-collars give us a very soft and subtle way to cue our dogs at a distance, and being able to remotely cue a dog has made the whole learning process much easier and less stressful on our dogs - and ourselves.

So what does a collar do? First let's talk about what it doesn't do. It is not a remote control. It is not a quick fix, a shortcut, or a magic wand, and we don't use it to teach a dog a new concept. And, of course, an e-collar should not be used when you are angry and want to punish the dog.

What does an e-collar do? *An e-collar is used to reinforce a skill the dog has already been taught and understands well. It becomes a remote cue for training the dog already knows, and one that can be used at a distance, effectively extending the length of a checkcord to the distance the collar can reach.*

The most common reason people buy a collar is because they are having a problem with their dog coming when called. This is

also the most likely place for first time collar owners to have a major wreck. Here's the normal scenario: Fido looks up at you when you call him, and he ignores you, going about his business. You yell and get mad and finally decide to get one of those shock collars to teach him to listen. The next day, you strap it on him, turn him loose, and when he doesn't come to you, you zap him.

The dog's normal reaction will usually be one of two things. The dog will bolt and run away, or more likely, the dog will run to you. When the dog runs to you, you think, *Wow, this thing is great! Look at how he came to me!* The piece of the puzzle that is missing is that the dog has no association between the "here" command and the e-collar, and ran to you out of fear of the unknown discomfort on its neck. The dog's reaction had nothing to do with "here" and everything to do with "fear".

Over the next few days, the collar is used constantly, and the dog stays closer and closer. You're thinking this is great...at least until you head to the field and want the dog to hunt. Now the dog won't leave your side. Instead of a dog that comes when called, you've trained the dog to not leave your side out of fear. The dog is running to you for rescue and safety, not as a response to a cue.

If the dog had been trained to come with a consistently used checkcord and a light hand, associated that with the "here" command, and then had the e-collar added after it had thoroughly learned what "here" meant, the e-collar transition would have been easy and effective. Again, an e-collar is only used as reinforcement for what the dog already has been trained to do. It is a tool to give a cue, just like your checkcord and lead. The only difference is that the e-collar gives you an invisible checkcord a few hundred yards longer.

To prepare a dog for e-collar use is a simple process. Put the collar on the dog, and allow the dog to just wear it and get used to the feel of the collar. Do this at random times for a few hours a day, and don't even pick up the transmitter or turn the collar on. Let the dog become accustomed to wearing it without forming any kind of association with training. Going straight to stimulation teaches a dog to become collar-wise that much faster, and it's not helpful in the early stages of collar use. The best association to form is a positive one, such as letting your dog wear the collar when going for walks in the field and "happy-timing." That way, they look forward to wearing the collar and know that it is part of having fun.

The size and fit of the collar is critical to proper use. Early receivers were large, heavy, square boxes that literally hung off a collar strap, pulling it away from the very thing it needed to contact.

Today's collars are made of lightweight and durable plastics and are much smaller. Combine this with designs made to keep the contact points in touch with the neck, and now we have collars that are useful in all aspects of training.

A correctly fitted collar will have the metal contact points in touch with the skin at all times. Most collars come with longer sets of contact points for dogs with heavier coats, and shorter points for dogs with less hair. When putting the collar on the dog's neck, be sure to place it up behind the ears, near the base of the skull. Adjust it snugly enough that it can't slip sideways or move, but no so tight as to interfere with the dog's breathing.

The reason we place the collar in this location is this: When the dog lowers its head, the neck gets thinner. A collar placed lower on the neck would be completely ineffective once it slid forward and loosened up, and a collar placed correctly but not snug enough will slide around and lose contact with the skin, rendering it useless.

Water makes a difference as well. A wet dog will usually receive a slightly stronger stimulation than a dry dog. If you have an extremely heavy coated dog and feel the need to increase the level of stimulation, try either wetting the dog's neck or else clip the hair from the area of the neck where the contact points rest. It's far better to try to make better contact than to up the stimulation levels.



During training, being able to use the e-collar to reinforce learned behavior is a big benefit, especially in tempting situations like these.

It's a good idea to always check your collar before putting it on your dog. It's also wise for you to know what the various levels feel like so you understand what your dog is receiving at each level and the difference between levels. If you're not willing to try it on yourself, you should probably not use it on your dog. Again, the lowest levels are hard for most people to feel so don't be afraid to try it in the meat of your hand.

Timing is everything when using the transmitter. Using an e-collar is just like any other part of successful training. You've got to read your dog and pay close attention to its response in order to correctly time your cues. In our system of training, we use both *momentary* and *continuous* stimulation. Momentary is for movement, just like the taps you would use on the checkcord to get the dog to turn, and continuous is for stopping, like the point of contact developed on the whoa post during training. These are all remote cues and are done at the lowest possible setting. If you find yourself having to move well up the levels in order to get any reaction at all, it probably means you need to go back and reinforce that part of training without the collar until the dog learns what that point of contact means. Don't go back to the e-collar until you are certain you have a dog that is showing willing compliance and acceptance to that point of contact and has a learned response to the cue without the collar.

Another important thing to keep in mind is that the level of distraction dictates the level of stimulation. There will be times when you need to move up in levels because the dog is saying it is willing to pay that price in order to continue ignoring your cue. When this happens, you can see the dog reacting to the stimulation, while not performing the behavior you are asking for. A dog

that is doing this will show signs to let you know it has felt the stimulations and is choosing to ignore it. Some dogs will turn or twitch their head slightly as stimulation is applied, and others will tense their bodies for a split second or perhaps drop or shake their head. This is a clear sign that they "heard" you but have chosen to pay the price and blow through your command. Up the stimulation level until the dog responds correctly, then immediately go back to the lower level. *Once compliance is achieved, always go back to using the lowest possible level* – the reason we can use the lower levels is because the dog knows there are higher ones.

What about a dog that becomes collar-wise? In other words, the dog knows when the collar is on that it has to obey, and chooses to ignore you when the collar is not being worn. We think collar-wise is a good thing, because a dog that never makes a mistake while wearing the collar is telling us that it knows exactly what it is supposed to do. That means we can physically correct the dog for an infraction made while not wearing the collar, and the dog will understand the correction. If you compete with your dog, you have to go without a collar in competition, so having a dog that knows it has to obey with or without the collar is the end goal. For a hunting dog that does not compete, we never run them without a collar, plain and simple. On a fully trained and finished dog, it is rarely if ever used, but it is still there as a fail safe just in case.

Used wisely and correctly, the modern day e-collar is by far the best tool in a trainer's toolbox, and an extremely humane way to work with our dogs.

H.R. 1518...What does it mean for you?

H.R. 1518 is known as the PAST (Prevent All Soring Tactics) Act. This bill is the revived version of the bill (6388) that I previously wrote about last fall. The bill was presented by Rep. Whitfield of Kentucky and applies to Tennessee Walking Horses, Spotted Saddle Horses and Racking Horses. While this bill will mainly affect the show horse industry, the ramifications could easily be felt by animal owners everywhere as this bill could set a precedent that will remove the rights of animal owners.

Specifically, H.R. 1518 will do three main things.

1. Eliminate the self-policing HIO (Horse Industry Organizations) that currently inspect horses prior to show ring competition and place the inspection burden on the USDA.

-Currently the USDA certifies and supervises the HIO's. The HIO programs were developed by the USDA in 1976 to ease the burden of inspections on the USDA who neither had nor currently have the personnel or funds to perform the task.

2. Eliminate pads, weighted shoes, hoof bands and action devices.

-There is no scientific proof that any of the above listed items are harmful to the horse when used properly. This provision will eliminate approximately 85% of the show horse industry as the different show divisions are separated by different weights of shoes.

3. Strengthen penalties for HPA (Horse Protection Act) violations.

-Currently the inspection process is very subjective and not scientific leaving much room for interpretation and human error.

The Tennessee Walking Horse is known for its versatility, which has made it a popular mount of field trailers. They are also known for their high stepping show ring gait. To achieve this gait the performance horses are trained with shoes that are built up stacks of plastic pads which actually weigh less than some of the flat shod shoes. This shoe allows the horse to perform the exaggerated gait that is desired in the show ring. The horses also wear an action device around their pastern that is not to exceed 60z. All TWH that enter sanctioned competition are subject to a pre-show inspection process that is unprecedented in the horse industry.



According to the last numbers that were released by the USDA the industry is at a 98.5% compliance rate. The inspection process that Tennessee Walking Horses go through is the toughest in the entire horse industry. Before

every class at a sanctioned horse show the horses are led to the inspection area with no saddle. They are required to walk a figure eight around cones for the DQP (Designated Qualified Person) to evaluate the horses locomotion. Then the horse's pastern area is palpated by the DQP to check for sensitivity. Flat shod horses are then hoof tested to check for sensitivity. Other tests that can further be performed are swabbing the pastern area to check for foreign substances, x-rays to check that the horse is shod properly and also thermography can be used to check for any heat in the horse's front limbs.

You may be asking yourself what this bill would have to do with you as an animal owner. The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS), who donates less than 1 % of their revenue to animals shelters, is behind this bill and is responsible for the misinformation that has been circulated regarding the TWH industry. Their CEO, Wayne Pacelle has been quoted to say that he would like to see the end of all animal ownership. Their main expense is for lobbying in Washington against various Agricultural and Animal related issues. If this bill were to pass it will set a precedent for animal ownership where we as owners lose the right to decide what is best for the animals that we own.

On November 13, 2013 there was an informational hearing on H.R.1518 before the House Energy and Commerce Committee. Speakers from both sides of the issue were allowed 2 minutes to present their position. Rep. Ed Whitfield that introduced this bill happens to be married to a top lobbyist for HSUS which many feel is a direct conflict of interest.

The HSUS is taking advantage of the Tennessee Walking Horse industries checkered past and is doing all that it can to ruin the industry. The HSUS will set their sights on another industry if they are successful at pushing this bill through Congress. Could their next target be the competitive dog industry? What if the HSUS decided that they did not agree with the use of training techniques used in field trialing or dog shows? You could be next on their radar.

I would urge you to do some research on H.R. 1518 and the HSUS. This is an issue that could easily set a precedent with regards to controlling competitive animals. It is important that we all stand up for our rights to do what we feel is best for our animals

Winter Nose Work

It's no secret that Brittans enjoy using their noses. Nose Work (aka Scent Work or Odor Detection) is a novel and entertaining sport where dogs use their noses to find a hidden scent.

You can learn and play this winter while you're spending more time indoors. Dogs of any size or age can participate. Older dogs are often excited by the opportunity to use their noses and hunt for their food when they can no longer enjoy longer more physical hunts. Also, it's a good outlet for disabled dogs and dogs recovering from serious injuries. If you are competing in obedience, nose work is a positive introduction to scent discrimination.

In Nose Work, we don't teach dogs how to locate scent. That's natural. In Nose Work we teach dogs to focus on a scent of our choosing and to search efficiently, in increasingly distracting environments. The underlying principles may be similar to some elements of hunting, tracking, search and rescue, narcotics and explosives detection.

Many methods are available to develop a dog's natural search abilities, by using food and/or toys or specific odors (all called "hides"). Some dogs require more encouragement than others. Often the most difficult part for handlers is to stay quiet and trust their dog to do his job.

While each nose work training session is generally only 2-3 minutes, nose work is mentally demanding and dogs are frequently tired afterwards. Nose work can be utilized to build confidence and teamwork. Some instructors even say that when they don't have time to walk their dogs, they provide hides around the home and yard to keep their dogs busy and burn energy.

In competition, dogs are trained to find a hidden odor, and then receive their reward (which could be food or play with a favorite toy). Under the National Association of Canine Scent Work, target odors include birch, anise and clove. United Nose work adds myrrh & vetiver. In Canada, SDDA participants search for wintergreen, pine and/or thyme. At different levels, dogs have a limited time to search a series of containers e.g. 3 minutes to search a set of opaque boxes, interior or exterior areas or vehicles.

STARTING OUT

You don't need any special training to get started. The easiest introduction is asking your dog to find hidden food.

Begin with a hungry dog on a leash in a distraction free area. Throw a visible piece of food a few feet away, and encourage your dog to find it. Repeat a few times. Then place the piece of

food on the floor (no more tossing), and tell the dog to get it. Next put a treat in a plastic cup and place it on the floor. When your dog gets it say "yes" and jackpot by placing a few more pieces of food right on top of the cup. Finally, place the piece of food on the floor and hide it under the cup so the dog can no longer see it. Most dogs eagerly move the cup aside to find their reward. After a few repeats, end the session while your dog wants more.

To increase difficulty for your next training session, place the food in a yogurt container or a small cardboard box with a hole in the top. Rattle the container and place it at your feet. If he reaches into a box to access the food and reward himself, great! But it's not necessary for the dog to break in to access the food. As soon as your dog's nose touches the container with food in it, say yes and rush to open the container to give him the food inside.

INCREASING CHALLENGES

Once your dog is searching eagerly, you can start adding a command such as "find" or "scent".

Progress by inviting a friend to hide the reward for you. Or start adding easy distractions by putting new objects near the scented container. For example, add a pair of shoes, a toilet paper roll or a chair the dog must move past as he hunts for his food.

Alternately, if your dog is toy motivated, you can substitute his favorite toy for the food using the same sequence. Start by throwing the toy close by, then throw it further away, then out of sight, etc.

When starting out, keep it easy. Make sure you put the containers nearby so the dog quickly finds it without a long discouraging search. Be sure the dog can reach the container i.e. don't position the food if taller than the dog, and ensure he's not scared by movement of any containers. As always, keep sessions very short to end on success and keep the dog wanting more.

ON ODORS

You may never have considered teaching your dog to find an odor such as anise, but it's quick and easy.

It's crucially important to make sure that the chosen odor is located inside the container and not anywhere else. Otherwise, you won't be able to tell when the dog has found the scent or not, and timing your rewards will be impossible. Confine your dog while you prepare the odor in your separate area using gloves and/or tweezers. You want the strength to be quite strong to start with, so you may be able to smell it at this stage. If the odor is

a liquid (such as birch essential oil for nose work competition), put a few drops on a cotton swab or cotton ball, then place it inside a container with an opening vent. For example, you can put the swab inside a small tin in a 6" x 6" x 6" cardboard box with a 2 inch vent. This is your "hide". Once done preparing the hide, pull off your gloves so they're inside out. Place them into a garbage bag the dog can't access e.g. outside your house.

Sit down with the dog at your feet and a bowl of food rewards on a table nearby. Show the dog the hide you're holding in your hand. Be ready to reward since most curious dogs will investigate the box the moment you present it. Say "yes" when the dog's nose touches the container. Use your other hand to place a piece of food on top of the box and encourage your dog to get it. Repeat several times.

The next step is to switch hands. The dog needs to learn that if they touch the hand holding the food, they get nothing. But when they put their nose near the scented container, the food magically appears there. Wait until the dog puts his nose on the hide. Say "yes" and place a piece of food on the hide. Deliver several pieces of food for touching the hide, switching hands, then repeating. Don't forget to end your session after 2-3 minutes. Limit yourself to a certain number of pieces of food or by setting an egg timer to remind you when time's up.

Do not be concerned in the beginning that the dog may have no idea what you are rewarding. They may think the reward is for touching (aka targeting) the container, without realizing the scent is the key. But as you progress, the light will eventually go on. With daily repetition, most Brittanys will happily stay at the hide, bopping the hide with their nose while you reward them.

It's very important to put the reward "at the source": ideally you should place the food reward right on the hide, not just somewhere nearby. For the dog, this transfers the value to the hide, making it increasingly attractive and magnetizing the dog to stay there so it's very obvious when they have found the scent. He should stay at the hide waiting for the reward to appear there, even if it takes you a few seconds to get there. (Eventually fully trained dogs will learn to offer a clear indication that they found the scent e.g. sit and stay or bark and stay once they find the hide. With gradual progression, you are on your way!)

Once your dog is rapidly going to the box, and neither investigating the other hand holding food nor offering other obedience behaviors, it's time to progress to putting the container on the ground instead of holding it in your hand. Start this session by showing the dog the container in your hand and rewarding for success as you have been. Then instead of moving the box to your other hand, place it on the floor and wait. When your dog puts his nose on or near the box to investigate, say "yes" and place several rewards on the container. Repeat several times.

As your dog's confidence continues to rise in your short daily sessions, gradually move the hide further away from you. Eventually you'll add a second (unscented) box as a distraction, continuing to wait until the dog moves his nose to the box and placing his reward at the source.

If you have a chance to try nose work this winter, I hope you and your dog will both enjoy searching. Let me know how it goes. Pictures are always welcome!

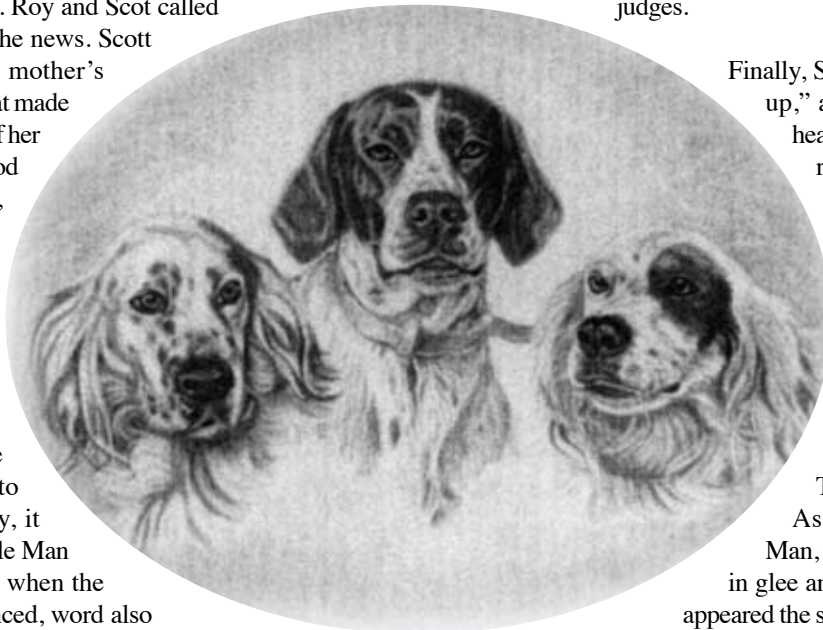

The other dog in the brace was led up, and Scott and the opposing handler sat their horses in front beside the judges and waited, with thirty gallery riders behind them, all eager to watch Man's race.

They were not to be disappointed. As Scott blew his whistle to start Man, the lithe pointer yipped three times in glee and made for the horizon. Soon he appeared the size of an aspirin tablet in the green of the huge alfalfa field—but when Scott called, he looked over his shoulder to get the direction of Scott's horse—his turn signal. 2012 ABC National Open Gun Dog Championship

Ionia, MI • October 24-, 2012 • Reported by Helen Riggle

The 2013 running of this prestigious National Open Gun Dog Championship was held in Ionia, Michigan under the direction of Chairman Jeff Currier, Secretary Darlene Dow, and Stakes Manager Mike Wilshire. We wish to extend a great big thank you to our Sponsors; Purina, Garmin/Tri Tronics and the Saddle Guy for helping to make this a successful national championship with their generous support. A great big thank you also needs to go Will & Kathi Langley of Bottom Creek Farm for supplying the horses for the judges, Kurt Pitsh for keeping the kitchen running and Bobbie Sigmund for her work as the hospitality chairman. The trial was blessed with cold, but dry weather every day, with temps just perfect for running dogs. The original forecast had promised freezing rain, yet somehow the weather Gods smiled upon us all week long.

Judges Jonathan Peck, Tim Carwile and Butch Nelson gave each dog that came to the line their complete attention and they missed nothing. This trio had keen eyes, good humor and were an absolute pleasure to ride with. The pace was kept to a true gun dog pace, which made the 5 days in the saddle quite pleasurable. They were looking for a forward running dog with enough independence to reach, that also exhibited championship quality high style and excellent manners on their birds. This year's stake did not disappoint. Each of the 50 dogs that came to the line was a contender and each of these dogs absolutely deserved to be there. The bird work was plentiful and at times surprising us with more than just quail on the course.

BRACE 1: HIT'S ALL JACK'D UP-SIKORSKI & SIGBRIT'S CATCH ME NOW- SIGMUND: The first brace of any national championship is always filled with excitement. The air and general atmosphere within the gallery is electrically charged with anticipation and the dogs seem to feed off of this stimulation. Both dogs broke away hard making a forward launch and taking the first edge to the right. Catcher would come to a stylish point at the 3 minute mark, showing the judges his impeccable manners. He was released to roll and he held a nice pace for nearly half of the hour. Catcher's handler elected to pick him up at the 26 mark when it was apparent that he was suddenly struggling. Cruise maintained his usual forward race with finds at 12, 34, 38, and a stop to flush at 52. He showed the judges the performance of an experienced hour stakes champion,

ending his hour well to the front.

BRACE 2: THIS GAMBLER'S FLY'N – CURRIER & SNIKSOH SALLY- BURCHETT: Sally gave us a veteran performance, as only she can do. She ran well staying forward and always hunting She had her first and only find at the 10 minute mark in Shangri-La. Ryder too would have a smooth performance with 4 solid finds at 10, 20, 33, 53, with all of his manners in order.

BRACE 3: BEAVER'S STRAIGHT ARROW-BEAVER &MR. P'S D'EVIL DOG OF COOS – POLAND: Arrow and Devil would show us a strong break away with both dogs seemingly well matched in speed. Arrow ran a nice forward race, taking his edges and hunting hard. At the 8 minute mark he and Devil would be credited with a divided find which resulted in the first of 2 non-productives for Devil. Arrow would run well for a total of 24 minutes until he failed to honor and was picked up by the judges. Devil had positive bird work at 24, but when point was called at 44 the handler was unable to produce the bird. Owner elected to pick up at that point.

BRACE 4: STARLIGHTS A BILLION TIMES BRIGHTER-BURCHETT & SCIROCCO DEL PRADO-CASSELBERRY: Not much to write about this brace. Both dogs rocket launched off the break away, only to leave the handler's company soon thereafter. Both dogs were declared out of judgment by the 15 minute mark.

BRACE 5 : HIGH HOPE'S DARK NITE- AL CROPEK & SWEETWATER'S MURPH'S A GAMBLER – LARRY BATES: Joey and Murphy hit the break away with purpose and the determination to go hunting. Both dogs would be seen to go on point at the 4 minute mark, with distinctly separate birds



on the same tree line. Joey's bird was easily put to flight and he was sent on. Murph's bird, however, proved to be hunkered down a tad tighter and the dog was relocated with positive results. Murphy would have his second bird at the 20 minute mark which he did not handle as well as the first find. Joey and Al seemed to have a good grasp of the meaning of teamwork in the rest of their run. The 2nd find was at 13 and the two would go on to show the judges 3 more pieces of solid work at 20, a pair at 41, with the final find at 57, all with good manners and high style from Joey.

BRACE 6: HIGH HOPE BIG GAMBLE- RIEDL & WILD MTN'S SHAKE YA TAILFEATHER – RIGGLE: The brace would conclude day 1 on an early note. Both dogs took a hard fast breakaway to the extreme, Soldier leaving his handler's company in favor of a romp and run with the birds at 10 and Riley, who was looking well in his handle and application would part company with his handler at the 33 mark.

BRACE 7: EMMA TAYSHON – CARTER & WOODLAND'S MONEY PIT – SCHRAMM: Emma and Chloe took off from the break away with gusto. After the first pass through the first field and treeline, Chloe was not seen again. The handler pulled the Garmin at the 15. Emma on the other hand sailed the course like she owned it. The rapport with her handler was smooth and her run was quietly impressive with finds at 5, 12, and a final bird at 52. She hit all of her objectives with confidence and in turn her handler was just as confident in trusting her which was a pleasure to watch.

BRACE 8: ROCKHARD'S WALKING ON THE MOON- JOHNSON & COUNTRY ROADS INDY SPEEDWAY RACER- JIM AUSTIN: Both Indy and Nealy broke away clean at the bottom of Shangri-la. Nealy went to hunting almost immediately, and Indy took a forward launch which would result in his reverting back to his derby days at the 11 mark. Nealy took to the wood line and hunted her way up through Shangri-la just out of sight of her handler. He pulled the Garmin at the 15.

BRACE 9: RICCHOCHET GUNSMOKES MR. DILLION- BURCHETT & OAKHILL'S MOON-DOG-E – LEWANDOWSKI: Dillon showed the judges his eagerness to run and showed a pretty forward pattern. He did find digging into the woods to be a way to slip out and do things his way, but he stayed out of trouble. At 52 minutes point would be called. He was relocated and the bird was finally produced with all manners in order. Red was a little more lateral then Dillion, but he made some nice moves in his quest for birds. His search was rewarded at the 51 where the bird was produced and all was well.

BRACE 10: WILD MTN'S ALL THAT – RIGGLE & HIGH HOPE'S LITTLE ANN – RIEDL: All that and a bag of chips they say. Tucker and Annie were well matched for speed as well as the desire to grab the front. The two dogs would swap the lead position many times in their race together. First bird contact for both dogs would be at the 5 minute mark behind a line of hay bales. Each dog had their own find, Annie's would be a feather pile and Tucker's would be a dead bird. The race was on after that. Tucker had a stop to flush at 35, a bird at 45 and a final stop to flush at 59. Annie had an honor to Tucker's stop to flush at 35, but would be picked up at the 45 for a small handler error.

BRACE 11: CHANCE'S FROZEN ASSET- ALEXANDER & ANJ'S AMAZING GRACE-BURCHETT: Maggie would be the hard luck dog of the championship. She had a pheasant at the break away and she would be credited with too many steps on the flush to stay in contention; which in turn left Maisy to run alone. Maisy had a nice forward run leaving little uncovered in her path. She had solid bird work at 20,28,41, and 55 all with perfect manners.

BRACE 12: WILD MTN'S MIDNIGHT RENDEZVOUS – RIGGLE & TNT'S BLAZIN SHOSHONI SHAKE N BAKE- THOMAS: Josey and Bubba had what can only be described as a fun run. Both dogs went straight to hunting off the break away with Josey being the more forward of the two most of the time. Bubba was easily drawn to distraction in his quest to follow his nose, but he was hunting nicely. Bubba's handler elected to pick up at the 40 minute mark. This was Josey's first appearance in an hour stake and she took the challenge to heart. She ran a pretty gun dog race, staying to the front whenever possible and was rewarded with her one and only find at 17 minutes. She pointed and held with picture perfect high style.

BRACE 13: HIT'S RED ROCK GIRL!- RUPNOW & PETER GUNN- CARTER: Ruby and Pete both put down real nice runs. Pete showed the judges his trademark reach and drive, rimming all of his fields in the same beautiful manner that won him his





previous National Champion titles. He had 5 opportunities to show off his bird manners and did so well. His first find was at 10, which resulted in a fresh hawk kill. He was sent on and would have finds at 15, 32, a non-productive at 41 and a final piece of bird work as a divided find with Ruby at 58. Ruby had a stop to flush at 5, a non-productive at 14 and 32, showed impeccable manners on a 25 yard honor to Pete at 41 and finished her brace clean with the divided find at 58 .

BRACE 14: SNIKSOH LITTLE DIAMOND-BURCHETT & ST CLAIR'S PRINCE ROCCO VULCANO LEO- ST CLAIR: Kate would show her forward inclination early, launching from the breakaway and taking the judges for a ride around the course. Unfortunately, Kate had no bird work to speak of. Rocco took to his first GDN challenge with gusto and hunted very hard for his entire hour. Ultimately, this would not be the day that he would show off his reputed good manners and style on his birds since he found none.

BRACE 15: TOUCH OF BOURBON LITTLE CHUG- BURCHETT & DIAMOND HILL DANGEROUS MAN-POLLOCK: Carson and Trace left the line in a hurry, each with his own mission. Both hunted hard, Carson taking the front and never relinquishing it for the entire hour. Bird work was a tad hard to come by for both boys, but their perseverance paid off, each finding and standing a bird at the 20 minute mark with all manners and good style on point .

BRACE 16: DIAMOND HILL SHE'S GONE-POLLOCK & BRETON'S GOLDEN HEART OF PEPPER SUN- AZEVEDO: Cleo and Cookie were a well matched pair both on the ground in race as well as on point with their high style. These two girls showed the judges some serious girl power as they took to the course and their jobs with gusto. Each of them would put down an excellent race, with Cookie having the opportunity to show the judges everything they might be looking for, giving them a nice find at 2 minutes, a beautiful honor at 29 and intensity on the final find at 52 which turned out to be a dead bird find. Cleo showed the judges excellent application, great ground speed and her exceptional style on her one find at 29.

BRACE 17: HY STEPPIN SUZEE "Q"- SENNOTT & TNT'S RENEGADE GAL PAL-THOMAS: Addie would set off with determination from the start, hunting hard for her handler and taking some lines to the front. Her handler elected to pick her up at the 20 minute mark, when she came in to him bearing a bird at the top of Shangri-la. This left Suzee down to run alone and she hunted all of the available cover with little reward. At 44 point was called, however, the bird was deeply buried within the dense thicket and the decision to take a non-productive and go on was made by her handler. Suzee finished her hour with no other bird contact.

BRACE 18: FINN MACUHAL-GORMAN & JD'S FEARLESS PRINCESS-CURRIER: Mac and Maggie each had a good foot race. Maggie would come to a point at the 15, which Mac was asked to honor, that resulted in no birds produced. Mac was taken on as Maggie was relocated (to no avail) and came upon his own bird at the 30. A very hard mark took Mac out of the money. Maggie sailed the course alone from then on and did so with ease. She hung her edges nicely, disappearing at the 44 mark. The scout was dispatched and after a few minutes point was called with Maggie standing buried in the tall switch grass, a quail under her nose. The handler was disappointed, when upon the flush Maggie decided that she needed to go with it, ending her hour early.

BRACE 19: BARK RIVER QUEEN OF DIAMONDS- STANTON & TNT'S RAISE N A RUCKUS – THOMAS: To say that Daisy is the

“real deal” is putting things mildly. She had an incredible ground race, always to the front and doing things her way for the entire hour. It was all that her handler could do to keep up with her and try to make himself look like he was in attendance for the performance for the entire hour. Her first find was at 7, which she held and handled with all manners in order. There would be a divided find at 15, and then again at the 35, where an alternate handler was appointed to stand by her until her partner showed up. She had bird work again at 39, another honor at 48 and a final find at 59, finishing her hour well. Rae too gave a lovely performance, with her first bird at the 12, the two divided finds at 15 & 35, another nice find at 48, 53 and again at 59. Rae would raise a ruckus at 59.5 when she took a big hop at the flush taking her out of the running.

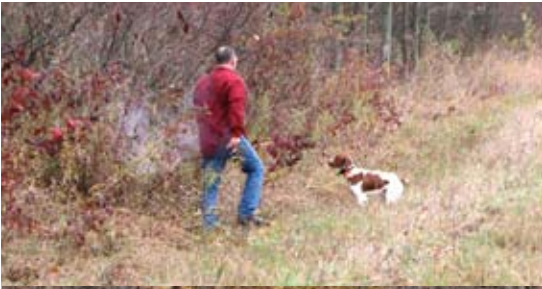
BRACE 20: GLADE RUN NUTMEG-THOMAS & CAST A BRITT RIP II- JOHNSON: Getting lucky enough to pull second brace this year meant that the dogs needed to truly be hunters in order to shine with their performances. The cover on course 2 is always dense, tight in places and thick to negotiate. Meg and Rip both put their best efforts forward for this and both hunted their hearts out for the hour. Meg would only have one piece of work as she came to honor Rip at 16, but Rip was fired up and showing well. His first bird was at 8 when he was found standing buried in a mott across the levee after he was not seen past the break away field. He was high and tight in his style and caught the attention of all 3 judges early on after this. At 16 he had a hawk kill (where Meg honored) and was sent on. Rip’s handler sent him on an edge, where he disappeared from sight until the scout called point at 35. So buried in the cover was he, that the judge was compelled to dismount to view the bird work from his knees, half buried in the cover himself! Rip’s final find was at 44, where all was A-ok . Both dogs finished the hour with lots left in the gas tank.

BRACE 21: CARBIDE CHIP-JOHNSON & BLUE ROCK’S DIAMOND GIRL- PERRY; Diamond and Chip took the launch off the breakaway together, but they did not stay together long. Chip would run a nice forward race, coming to a point on a stop to flush at 11 minutes which Diamond failed to acknowledge, ending her brace much earlier than planned. Chip would continue his quest alone and finish his hour well, with no other bird work to speak of.

BRACE 22: DERAILED-CROPEK & SUEMAC’S SKY KING-MCPHERSON: Teddy and Sky are two true bird dogs who take their jobs very seriously. Both exploded off the line and went straight to work. The first point was called for Teddy at 9 with Sky on the honor with all manners in order. Ted struck point again at 13, where Sky honored again, even though the bird produced was nothing short of deader than a doornail. The two would then split the work up, with Ted’s next find at 32, and Sky’s at 30 on the derby course. Sky would be released only to stick it again at 34, where it took a relocation to pin the bird, another at 37 before he would break out of the derby field and show the judges his desire to run. Sky’s final find was at 48 and he finished his hour still rolling out hard to the front. At 55 point would be called one last time for Ted, which would turn out to be a wily pheasant hen, which he stood with all manners in place even when the hen flew past his head in her desire to escape.

BRACE 23: HIT’S SHOWTIME- PERRY & JAZZ’S SWEETEST LITTLE SECRET-HOPPER: Brandy gave her handler a valiant effort for 42 minutes of her hour. She hunted very hard, taking advantage of all the available cover yet the birds eluded her on this day. Karo, on the other hand, took her handler for an exciting ride. She ran a nice forward race using the available cover to the best of her abilities. She put on a nice show for the judges. She would have one piece of bird





work at 21, holding and pointing with style. Several attempts to find birds in the wood line failed her, but she did a nice job and showed her experience for the game well.

BRACE 24: TWIST'N TEQUILA'S SHADOW-CARTER & HIT'S FOR PETE'S

SAKE-KIRACOFE: Lila and Petey were two very nice dogs that proved quite fun to watch go to work. Petey would show the judges a well-seasoned veteran run which would be rewarded with his first find, deep in some thick, tall switch grass at the 2 minute mark, a non-productive at 14, into a pair of fresh hawk kills at 16 & 17, and at last a live survivor of the hawk's holocaust at 18. He would be sent on to roll out, which he did, taking his edges in a pretty fashion where he would have another find at 37. He was released to roll again where he would dig in a bit to the woods and the scout would call a final find at 47 inside the wood line that pulled handler and judges off their horses to witness Petey's high impeccable style only to be disappointed with a dead bird. Lila honored Petey's hawk kills at 14, 16 and at 18 would prove her youth by moving in on the live bird resulting in her pick up.

BRACE 25: HAP'S SPICE RUM BECKHAM-MERRYMAN & SANBAR

CROSSCREEK REPETE CALL-PEPIN: Becks and Pete launched off the breakaway looking like they meant business. At 11, both dogs would be standing birds on the same line at the top of Cardiac Hill about 50 yards or so apart. Pete's handler elected for a relocation attempt when he could not produce the bird on his flushing attempt and made a grave handler error when Pete pinned it and the handler set it to flight. This ended Pete's quest for the title early when the judge ordered the dog up. The crisp cool morning had put rocket fuel in Beck's tank. He would sail out, running well, with his find at 11 being A-ok, another find at 14 looking good. At 21 however, he was feeling a little too good and was caught scooping his third bird and was also ordered up.

In the end 50 dogs had come to line. There were moments of brilliance, moments that took your breath away and moments of astonishment that are what championships are made of. There were several dogs that could have been crowned the Champion on any given day. The decision came down to 4 performances that to the judge's eyes out shined all the others and it was with careful deliberation that they crowned NEW FC* High Hopes Dark Nite the 2013 winner, this prestigious win crowning him as a new title holder DC/AFC Cast-A Britt-Rip II the Runner-Up, NGDC/FC/AFC Hit's For Pete's Sake for third, FC Diamond Hill She's Gone for fourth place. Cleo was also the winner of the Misty Sky Award for being the highest placing bitch of the event.

Special recognition in the form of the Judge's Award of Merit was also given to four more dogs;

- Emma Tayshon
- Breton's Golden Heart of Pepper Sun
- Derailed
- Suemac's Sky King for their performances that could not be ignored.

The 5 days in the saddle went by very quickly with good weather, good judging, lots of giggles and good humor, and of course good dogs to watch. Also, a "thank you" goes out to Julie Romence and John Perry for helping out with pictures at the last minute. It was very much appreciated.

CEDAR CREEK SURGEON, WAITMAN AND MCCHESENEY'S I GOT MY MOJO WORKING, JOHN. Cutter had a good solid race with a find at three and everything in order. At 30 he swapped ends but went with the bird before the handler could get there. Mojo had a non-productive at four with a nice race underway until 25 when he joyously followed a deer and was not returned to judgment to end the first day of running.

DAY 2: Weather windy and colder, but at least no rain. Torrential downpours Tuesday night had added a lot of water to the creeks and grounds.

SHADY'S DESERT KNIGHT, JOHNSON AND SHADY WAY RED TAIL HAWK, JOHN. Breakaway at the East gate. Knight had solid performance with three finds during his hour. At 15 he stood high and tight for the flush, at 33 he had a covey find in the bowl with good manners. At 47 he stood on a divided find with good intensity at the covey flush in the watershed draw. He had a nice race, being inconsistent in application early in the hour. Beau had a nice covey find at 46 with the birds well out in front of him. He stood nicely as the birds were flushed. He had a good race, but was out of pocket at time and not returned to judgment during the grace period.

BLUERIDGE HUNTER GONNA FLY, JOHNSON AND OCAJE, GOWIN. Breakaway at the South Gate. Hunter was out of pocket at 30 and not returned to judgment. Deer were suspected. Grace also enjoyed the deer chase, but returned to judgment for a period before disappearing again. The tracker was called for at 33.

TEQUILA SCORCHER, TILLSON AND GUNRUNNER'S BOOKIN' AND COOKIN', HANCOCK. Race was on a roll with three covey finds at 6, 14, and 23. He was fast and stylish. He happened on to a single bird, which became his undoing. Lincoln had a divided find at 14. He had a forward searching race.

BANDIT'S CINDERELLA MAN, RETHERFORD AND SPANISH CORRAL'S SONNY PATCH, WHITE. Patch made some nice moves but was a bit inconsistent in his race. He didn't have any bird contact. Bandit had a find at 11 and stood high and tight for the flush. Not long after which he was lost and the handler called for the tracker.

Chip ran with extreme range, hitting the edges and handling kindly.

DAY 3 dawned cool and with a lot of sun and light breeze. A beautiful day to field trial.

MTB SCIPIO HOT SHOT OF WHIZKI, WHITE AND JOKER'S JACKPOT, JOHN. Judges didn't get to see much of Cali as he was lost shortly after breakaway. Jack started a little slow and was push and pull for a bit before reaching out and putting down a strong overall race. He carded a small covey find above the watershed at 46 with nice style and excellent manners. He finished very strong.

WIMBERLEY JIMDANDY, JOHNSON AND SHADOW ATTACK, TILLSON. Breakaway at the South gate. Dandy made some very wide moves on the west loop but was out of pocket and the tracker was called for at 50. Tack had a good strong forward application scoring three nice finds with good manners. At 22 he had a find at a feeder in the water shed draw, at 38 he had a large covey on the west fence in the bowl and at 47 he had another covey coming out of the bowl to the puppy course. He finished going away through the red gate.

RED SKY RILEY, KIRK AND TJ'S PRAIRIE BLIZZARD, TILLSON. Riley pinned a large covey at 28 with Blizzard backing. The birds seemed intent to crash the dogs as they got up one after another and repeatedly flew about a foot over the dogs heads. Both dogs stood throughout the erratic flush with impressive manners. He had some of the biggest moves of the trial and was mounting a serious challenge for the top spot until he dropped into hunt mode the last few minutes of the brace.

CHEESY SPINACH AND BACON DIP

1 - 10 oz pkg. frozen chopped
spinach, thawed and squeezed dry
1 - 16 oz pkg. Velveeta, cubed
1 - 3 oz pkg. cream cheese, softened
1 - 14 1/2 oz can of tomatoes with
chilies, not drained
8 slices bacon, cooked & crumbled

Combine all ingredients except
bacon in slow cooker. Cover and
cook on low 1 hour or until cheeses
have melted and dip is heated
through. Stir occasionally. Just
before serving, stir in crumbled
bacon. Serve with crackers or tortilla
chips. Makes 3.5 cups.

GRILLED MARINATED QUAIL

12 Quail - Semi-boneless, Whole,
Boneless Breasts, or Breast Split

Marinade: 2 cups white wine vinegar
1 cup vegetable oil 4 tbsp lemon
juice 4 whole lemon rinds 3 cloves
garlic, crushed 2 bay leaves, 1 tbsp
soy sauce, 1 tbsp A-1 sauce, 1 tbsp
vermouth, and fresh ground pepper,
to taste

Combine all ingredients and
marinate quail for at least 8 hours.
Grill over a medium hot fire about
12-14 minutes, basting often. Quail
is done when plump and firm to the
touch.

2 slices bacon, diced
1 clove garlic, minced
1 medium onion, diced
1/2 green bell pepper, diced
(optional)
2 tablespoons butter
2 cups leftover baked beans, or one
16-ounce can Bush's Baked Beans
1 1/2 cups half-and-half

Sauté sausage, bacon, garlic,
onion, and pepper (if desired) in
butter until bacon is cooked. Add
beans and simmer for a few minutes
over medium to low heat. Add half-
and-half. Increase or decrease half-
and-half for preferred thickness.

Serve with piping-hot corn bread.

ITALIAN STYLE WINGS

12 chicken wings, tips discarded
and wings separated at the joint
8 ounces cheese, cut into 24 cubes
1 large egg
1 cup unseasoned bread crumbs
1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese
Salt
2 cups tomato puree
1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.
Cut a slit into the meatiest part of
each wing. Stuff each wing with a
mozzarella cube and pull the meat
and skin back over the cheese.

In a shallow bowl, beat the egg;
in another shallow bowl, combine
the bread crumbs and parmesan
and season with salt. Working with
1 wing at a time, coat each with the
egg, then the bread crumb mixture
and place on a greased rack set on
a foil-lined baking sheet. Bake until
golden, about 40 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small saucepan,
heat the tomato puree and cayenne
over medium heat; season with salt.
Serve with the wings.

For spicy wings, use Pepper Jack
cheese.

CONDITIONS AND RULES • NOMINATING FEE: \$30.00 • Nomination must be made within 30 days of whelping or subject to a late penalty fees. For all purebred Brittany bitches whelping a litter on January 1 thru December 31st, 2014, who are owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club.

- American Brittany Futurities shall be open to every purebred Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 - December 31 and whose litters have been enrolled with The American Brittany Club.
- Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- **Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped. A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time.** This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.

- **Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** Late litter nominations will be accepted as late as 180 days from whelping. In addition to the Nomination fee of \$30.00 the late fees are \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be at the discretion of the Futurity Committee. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
- Dogs will be eligible to run in the designated futurity to be held in the Spring of the second year following the year of whelping.
- A final nomination fee will be due by October 1st of the year following whelping. Entry fees will be paid by the owner of the puppy for each Sectional Futurity field or bench event the dog enters.

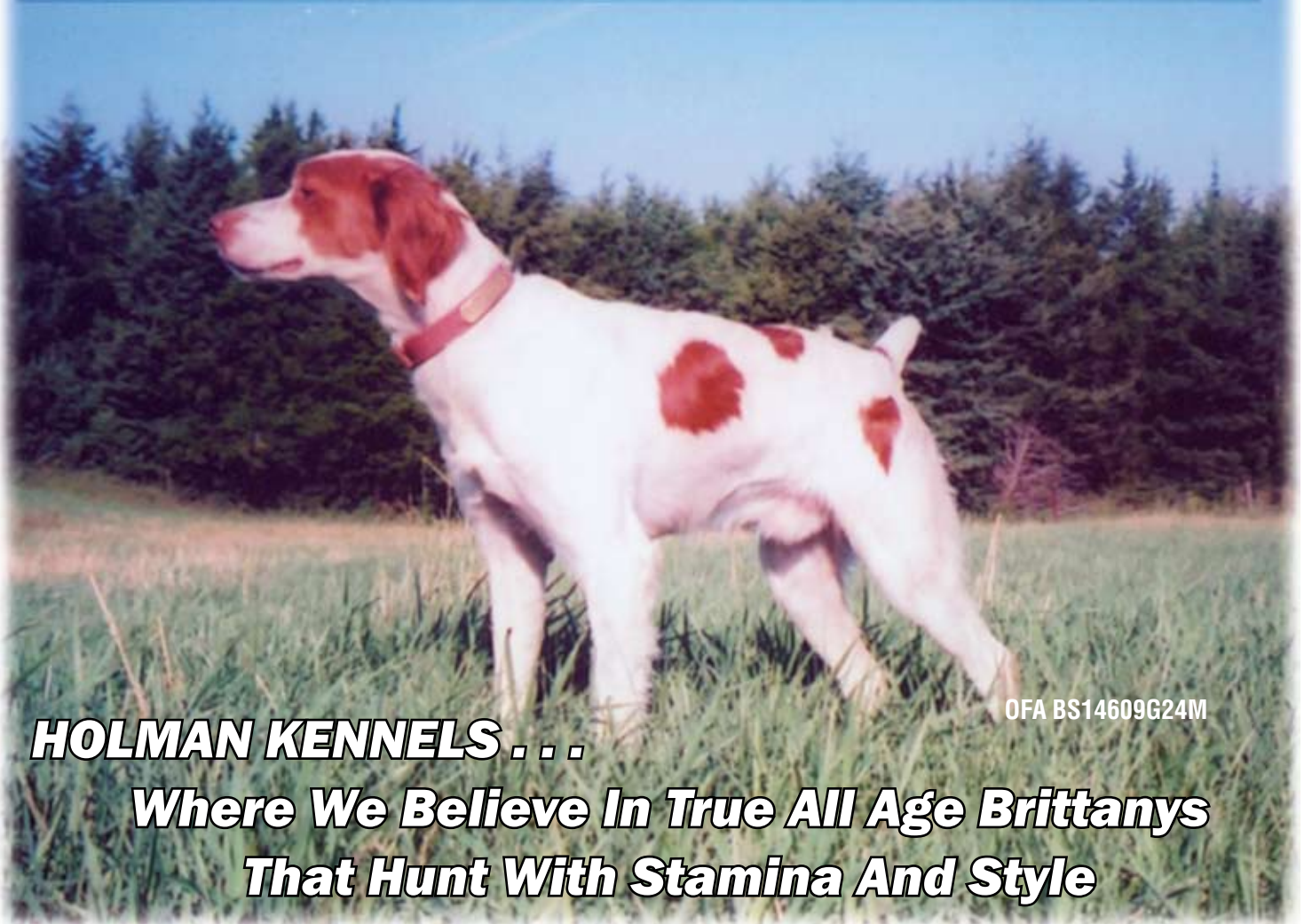
