Nebraska Brittany All Age Championship

The championship is one of the older brittany championships. It is believed that its initial running was in the late 1970's or early 1980's. Loyd Budd, Lyle Johnson, Roscoe Station, Marc Appleton and the Smiths are only a few of the folks that have saddled their horses to compete on the very picturesque grounds of branched oak.

The Nebraska Brittany Club does an extremely commendable job in putting on the championship. The backbone of the current individuals is Stan & Claudia Truska. Claudia had an unfortunate accident the day before the championship. She was attempting to break ice in a water tub when she fell and fractured her wrist. This hindered her supervision of Stan. However, he and the crew of Wes Felt, Tom Maneely and Jerry McGee endeavored to preserve.

The championship was sponsored by Purina. The very best in dog food and horse feed is produced by this company. We deeply appreciate their support.

We were blessed with two competent judges, Don Kimble and Jim Douglas. They paid attention to the dogs. In the writer's opinion and that of the majority of the competitors, the placements were "right on" with forty-three going to the line, several of which are in the

current standings for the Purina Dog of the Year award; the judges were up to the challenge.

The champion came out of the 20th brace. Firestarter Crossed The Line was the bottom dog in the brace and the blue-ribbon winner. He is a good-looking liver and white eight-year-old owned by Andi Christanson and Vickie Rankin. He is trained and handled by Ed Tillson. The brace broke away across the bridge. Ty headed toward the north gap in the treeline and was quickly out of sight. He carded his first find there. When he was released, his next cast was to the cover along the lake edge. He next showed on the line before the last east meadow and scored again with perfect manners through the flush and shot. He made another beautiful cast up the hill in the far east meadow and shortly caught the front in the next meadow. His third find was in the treeline where his first find had occurred. Ty was rock steady on his three finds, a picture of style and composure. He was forward through the west course and was quickly shown to the judges when time was called.

The runner up was Mk's My Lil Ammo (BB). She is a white and orange five-year-old. The owner is Nick Blasi and under the tutelage of Scott Johnson. She carded three finds and two stopped to flushes to go along with a terrific race. Shortly before time, the course turned up hill into a strong westerly wind. She was close for a few minutes and this may have been the difference between the two placements. She did recuperate and was out of sight when time was called.

Brace 1: Roll On Miss Bella–Tracy & Captain Finn–Burchett. The first brace lasted 13 minutes. Bella brought a bird in and Finn chalked up one find and he chased at New Rock Crossing.

Brace 2: Driving Miss Daisy–Tracy & Tequila Scorcher (Lincoln)–Tillson. Daisy chased early. Scorcher, call name Lincoln, had finds at 3,12,26,35 and 46 with a forward race.

Brace 3: Touch Of Bourbon Little Chug–Johnson & TLM Tall Tale (Sam)–Tracy. Both dogs had one find but were erratic in their application. Sam didn't make it to the bridge and Chug was up in the second meadow.

Brace 4: Ocaje (Grace)–Gowin & Jagoub's Bizz'n Boyou (skeeter)–Tracy. Grace, a previous two-time winner of this championship, suffered two unproductives. This occurred in the first 25 minutes and ended her bid. Skeeter was off and running early. His casts were forward and at all age range. This caught the judges' eyes. He was found by the scout buried up in brush near the west crossing of the west course. This was his only birdwork. A second find may certainly have made him a contender. Skeeter is a stout built orange roan. He is owned by Tom Jagielski and tom can be proud of his work today.

Brace 5: Almaden's Under Lock And Key

(Oudi)–Tillson & Carpe Diem (Carp)–Johnson. Oudi had a modest race and was not pleasing his handler. Carp had a bigger more forward race but suffered two unproductives.

Brace 6: Shady Way's Joker's Hill Country (Stan)–Tracy & Piney Run Jake–Patterson. Stan and Jake both had competitive races going. Tracy threw in the towel at 45 after having no birdwork. Jake slammed on point in the far east meadow. He was standing on the side of the hill with his back legs crossed. When asked to relocate, he bumped a bird.

Brace 7: Hope's Chief Of Crosscreek (Chief)–Burchett & Jocoub's Spell Caster–Tracy. Both dogs made good opening casts. Chief's move carried to the pocket on the far east side of the camp meadow. This resulted in a great opening find. Taby had established point on the ridge but took steps after the flush. Chief had an infraction after new rock crossing.

Brace 8: CVR Spartan King (Leo)–Tracy & Just Call Me Lucky Ned Pepper–Campbell. Both dogs broke sharply from the fish camp. As they topped the hill to the west, Leo points and leaves after Ned arrives. Campbell fires and takes his dog on as Tracy picks up. Ned has five more finds with good style on each. With more race this dog could have been in contention.

Brace 9: Crescent City Girl (Nola)–Tillson & Lambchi (Blue)–Tracy. Breakaway was from the gates on the north side. Good forward casts by both dogs. Blue points a hawk kill and fails to back Nola at 20. Nola takes steps on the flush and both dogs are up.

Brace 10: Whiskey's Little Tip–Burchett & Maxwell's Prickley Pete–Tracy. Tip had one find and mostly a good run but came from behind a few times. Pete was picked up early.

Brace 11: Kinwashkly Fat Bastard–Tracy & Sniksoh Little Diamond–Johnson. Fatz left point and was up. Diamond had two unproductives ending the brace.

Brace 12: Sparky's Prairie Wind Gypsy–Johnson & Maxwell's Heavy Hitter (Gabe)–Tracy. Both dogs broke smartly along the left treeline in camp meadow. Gabe rolled out of sight and was gone too long. Gypsy had a very competitive race and scored twice with nice finds. With only a few minutes left, she rooted out a bird ending a good challenge.

Brace 13: S S Rig's Colorado Gunrunner–Milam & Kinwashkly Tempo–Tillson. First brace of the third day found two running dogs. The brace started in camp meadow with far opening casts. Rig's had an unproductive early and then carded three finds on the west course, two of which the scout found him standing. Milam had trouble locating and putting the quail to flight. He had his final find across the bridge on the backside of the first treeline. Due to extending

flushing experienced by the handler, Rig's never could catch the front. Rig's is a five-year-old white and liver well-made male. He is owned by Linda and Tom Milam. I believe Tempo had two finds and a good job on the ground. Unfortunately, he lost the front late in the brace and was in the rear with Rig's judge at time.

Brace 14: Anj's Ohio Hellion–Burchett & Ru–Jem's "Last" Penny–Tracy. Penny was lost off the breakaway and her bracemate was up shortly after crossing the new rock crossing.

Brace 15: Arrow's Tequila Rusty–Milam & Alar's Dirty Dancer–Tillson. Breakaway was at the fish camp. Both dogs hit the ground running. After crossing the west crossing, Dani establishes point and rusty fails to back. Tillson flushes a fluttering quail and Dani took steps.

Brace 16: Mk's My Lil Ammo (BB)–Johnson & Romence's Texas Two Step (Tess)–Burchett. BB's race was previously reported. Breakaway was at fish camp. Tess danced out of sight and was not returned to judgement.

Brace 17: Glade Run Irish–Tracy & Turning Points Shenanigns's–Burchett. Breakaway from green gates saw Shenanigan's and Irish having a good break. They make quick work of the east course. After a find by Irish on the ridge, Shenangan's makes new rock crossing and establishes point. Irish backs and then wants a closer look. He is up. Burchett flushed a bird and a chase ends the brace.

Brace 18: Castaway Wilson–Tracy & Mk's Magnificent Bandito–Lincoln. Breakaway is at the fish camp. Chico goes to the left and Wilson took the right line. Wilson is found standing over the hill for a good find but chased after the flush. On the south side of the west course, after some big forward casts, is found standing by his scout. Lincoln cannot produce a bird. Chico is asked to relocate. After several yards points again. During the flushing attempt Chico takes off.

Brace 19: Remchester's Premium White Lightning–Johnson & Kashmir–Tracy. Back to the fish camp. Both dogs break hard and fast to the front. At the west crossing they went under the water crossing off the grounds. Dogs gone.

Brace 20: Wichita Wild Woman–Tracy & Firestarter's Crossed The Line–Tillson. Ty's performance earning the championship was previously reported. Mickey had a fast and forward race but was not rewarded with birds.

Brace 21: Heli's Slim Chipley–Burchett & J R's Cool Hand Luck–Johnson. Slim had a find at five with all in order and a divided find at 40. This was Luke's second piece of bird work also. He had an earlier find at 2. However, after having early success both dogs seemed to tire and were up at 50.

Brace 22: Starlight's Mecury Out Ryder–Burchett Bye. Ryder failed to fire and was up early.

MICHIGAN BRITTANY CHAMPIONSHIP

The 41st running of the Michigan Brittany Championship was held on April 2-5, 2018. Michigan's Ionia Recreation Area served as the Championship venue. Although weather was bitter cold with snow, and 40-hour wind gusts on Wednesday, the venue continues to be some of the premier grounds in this part of the country. This is due in large part to the cooperation between the State of Michigan, Ionia Parks staff, and the Ionia Field Trial Grounds Committee comprised of representatives of all the breed clubs who run there.

The one-hour Open All Age Championship drew 20 entrants and the Open Shooting Dog Championship, also an hour stake, ran with 22 dogs. The Amateur Walking Shooting Dog Championship, which was cancelled due to low entries the last time the championship was held, attracted 10 participants. Unfortunately, the shortage of young dogs this year resulted in a cancellation of the derby classic.

The Championship Association is extremely grateful to the support provided by Purina for this event. We appreciate both the financial support and high-quality dog food provided to the winners. Our dogs' health is one of the most important factors in preparing a competitive bird dog. We also appreciate our Purina Coordinator, Kent Patterson, for organizing the feed and shipping.

A big thank you goes to all of the hard-working members of the Michigan Brittany Championship Association. Morning bird planting for the OAA and OSD was handled Dick Lipski who also replaced birds through the day as needed. Birds were planted in small coveys with whole corn scattered at numerous strategic locations on the course. Bird work was abundant with almost all the dogs having multiple finds. The AWSO course was seeded in the morning by Chuck Langstaff and Diana Kubitz using Diana's mule (gas powered) that she graciously provided to the Association for Dick's use during the rest of the week. Ron Auten planted birds during the walking stake.

Hap Harrison once again also served as our chef for the Monday night championship dinner of pasta and meatballs and a variety of desserts from Sharon. John Hall smoked a brisket to the anticipation of everyone for the Tuesday evening dinner. Food for lunches were prepared and served with the help of Theda Langstaff, Kathy Gulembo, Donna Janulis, and Judy Graves. Tom Kuzcak was the "official" crock pot stirrer in between his dog wagon services for the week.

We would like to thank the professional and amateur handlers who came this year and supported this championship. Without the support of professionals, Chad Holman from Illinois and Bob Burchett from Missouri, we would not have had enough entries to run any of the stakes. Amateur handlers in the three championship stakes included Hap Harrison, Julie Romance, Chris Sennett, Bert McCandless, Vince Anderson, Ken DeLong, Richard Ross, Matt Healey, Jeff Stanton, John Hall, Ray Trimble, Rebecca Walters, and Tommy Thomas.

The Association would also like to express its appreciation to Will Langley for providing horses and transport. His valuable wrangling service provided horses for some judges and amateur handlers who may otherwise not have been able to participate. Without Will's dedication, it would be even more difficult than already is to find quality judges able to officiate.

Open All-Age Championship

As with all Championships, one of the most important components is hiring great judges. We did it right again this year by asking experienced judges from Michigan, Jim Cipponeri who competes with setters and Duane Yoder who

runs Weimaraners, to officiate the Open All Age Championship. Both of these gentlemen gave the dogs their full attention and were a pleasure to have at the trial. Their decisions, both during the running and at its conclusion, were well received by all the participants.

Standing out from a field of quality contenders, Black Creek Blaze emerged as winner of the Open All-Age Championship. Proudly owned by Ron Harling Sr and Ron Harling Jr, Blaze was handled by Chad Holman. Starting from the oak tree Blaze handled well to the front maneuvering far forward as guided by Chad. He scored three well-spaced finds exhibiting excellent bird manners on each encounter and ended with an extended forward cast securing his first-place placement.

The Runner up title was awarded to Hehi's Slim Chipley owned by Matt Healey and skillfully handled by Bob Burchett. Slim, who ran in the last brace, was released from the oak tree with a nice opening cast and continued to run consistently to the front scoring two nice finds, one along a tree line on the derby course and the second along Hire's field last tree line. He showed style and discipline on both finds allowing Bob to successfully flush the game. He also finished the hour with stamina and range.

The third and fourth place finishes were a contest between two mature Brittanys balancing all age run with multiple bird fines.

Third place was awarded to Hopes Chief of Crosscreek, handled by Bob Burchett, who scored eight bird finds during the hour course. Chief handled every find with style and impeccable manners and balanced these scores with a forward consistent run throughout the hour.

The judges selected CrossCreek Argus Early Christmas, handled by Chad Holman, as the fourth-place competitor in this event. Again, a seasoned competitor Gus handled six spaced bird finds within the hour, while attacking the course in an all age manner reaching the forward objectives and handling for Chad as needed. He finished the hour in a consistent manner showing forward on the course.

Open Shooting Dog Championship

The OSD was judged by Blake Rizzo who runs German Shorthairs from Michigan, and is a well-respected and sought-after judge. Joining Blake in the judicial saddle was Rob Buchholz for the 1st four braces of the stake. Unfortunately, Rob, a long-time Brittany competitor from Michigan, was injured in a head to head collision with his horse. Since the first four braces of the stake were run in slightly over an hour total with no successful finishes, the transition to a replacement judge was fairly straightforward. We were lucky to have experienced championship judge, John Hall, on hand to take over the reins. John has served as one of the members of the Michigan Brittany Championship Association for many years.

The Open Shooting Dog Champion title was awarded to FC Shot of Whizki handled by Chad Holman and owned by Pam Baird of Illinois. Shot old bested a field of twenty two with a stellar performance to take the championship. Breaking away from the headquarters in the fifth brace and in some of the worst weather of week, he scored the first of his seven finds in the tree-line by the ponds. The style on all of Shot's finds was impressive with a high head and tail, never softening, and was remarked on by all in the gallery. His second find was on the far outside edge of Hires' field. Moving forward with nice ground speed, Shot was next found standing at the end of the hedgerow in the orchard field on course 1. Hunting the course handling kindly, Shot had his next two finds on the derby section of the course in two different tree-line edges. Just before the creek crossing, he pointed again with his brace mate honoring, but it proved to be a non-productive. The gun dog section of the course was fruitful with two more finds, one in the stonewall just past the Riverside parking lot and the second at the end of the orchard just before the woods as time was called.

Starlight's Mercury Out Ryder was awarded the runner-up title. Owned by Teresa Richmond of Illinois and handled by Bob Burchett, Ryder had an outstanding performance and challenged the winner. The judges noted his bird work was excellent with superb style. Breaking away from the headquarters in brace nine, he had the first of his eleven finds at the cattails on course 1. He was next found standing on the tree-line by the ponds. Finds 3, 4, and 5 were minutes apart in lines entering, on the west edge, and in the island of Hires' field. Moving forward toward the old barn, Ryder found #6 in the small apple tree area. Before turning to the championship course, finds #7 and #8 were in the books. On the way down to the Boy Scout bridge, he logged his 9th find. Ryder made an all-age move to the front from the bridge, next being seen on point again on the derby course in the Christmas tree field. His final find was in the apple orchard just before pickup.

Ammo's The Show That Never Ends, owned by Julie Nelson and Mark Claypool, and handled by Bob Burchett, earned the 3rd place nod. Braced with the winner in the 5th brace, Emmy had a pleasing forward race resulting in six finds and one back with all in order. Her bird work in order but not up to the caliber of the champion or runner-up.

Fourth place was garnered by FC Magnum High Velocity owned by Denise and Vince Anderson. Gauge was handled by Vince in the seventh brace with wind gusts that may have been at their fiercest. Also having a nice forward performance hunting the objectives, he carded seven finds with good manners.

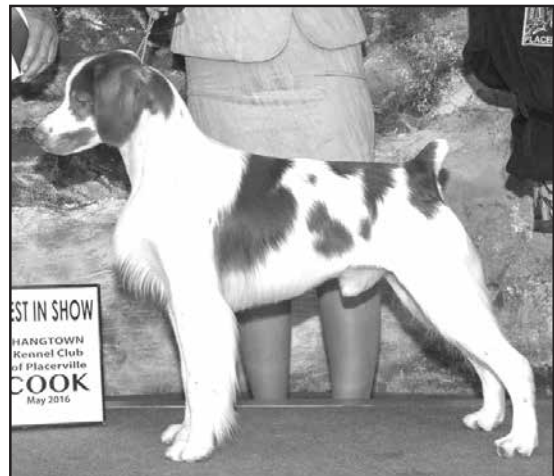

ABC 2018 CHAIRMAN REPORTS & AGENDA ITEMS

2nd VICE PRESIDENT END OF YEAR REPORT TO BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Jeri Conklin

In January 2018 I was appointed 2nd VP of ABC, charged with management of membership. The ABC Board of Directors provided me clear instructions and three clear objectives; Increase Membership, Increase Membership and Increase Membership.

Current ABC membership nears just over 2,000 full & associate members. Data shows this as a static trend. Back in the early 1990s the ABC had a vibrant membership of over 4,000. So the challenge is to better understand the dynamics behind today's membership statistics and what the ABC can do to encourage and influence increased membership.

Key Elements to Research:

- * What does the data tell us about the current membership health of the ABC?

- * What is the culture of strong/successful clubs and what key elements can be replicated in other regions/clubs?

- * What role does or should ABC/regional clubs play in developing a comprehensive recruiting program?

Specific Action:

Action 1 – Administrative starting point with numbers

Action 2 – Establish Email Correspondence with membership

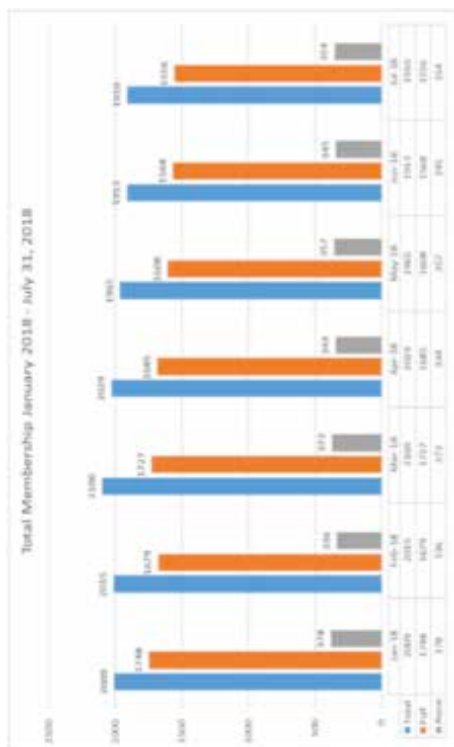
Action 3 – Institute a Breeders Directory (past 2nd V.P. action item)

Action 4 - Membership building articles are part of the plan to highlight and hopefully to encourage other regional clubs to work toward that goal.

OBSERVATION AND OUTCOMES:

Action 1 – Breakdown of baseline membership numbers: (See chart below)

Observation: More time is required to validate the impact recent changes have on the overall membership numbers. While the challenges to improve membership are many and monumental, small positive steps will have the greatest impact early on as we look at more substantive actions that can be institutionalized in the near future. Not having had access to past year's accurate membership numbers require use of current numbers only.



Action 2 – Establish Email Correspondence with membership/club secretaries/directors

Observation Communication between club/parent club/member – an amazing number of responses involved a simple “Thank You for reaching out to me, you are the first.” The second largest response was “I just forgot – some say they got postcard notices, some not.” They all appreciated receiving the email notice however and most quickly renewed. Most all asked for email notification to continue. Roughly 429 members have renewed via the email campaign I started in Feb/ March of 2018. These members had expired during 2017 and early 2018. Roughly 131 members that expired sometime prior to 2017 renewed in 2018 as a result of the email campaign. In the first 7 months of the year we saw our new membership numbers grow by 180 (140 Full and 40 Associates) members.

Club secretary Questionnaire #1 - Observation – Out of 85 regional clubs I have sent questionnaires to, less than 10 have responded. Those that did respond want communication at the parent club level. Lack of volunteers is the #1 issue that plagues most clubs across all 5 regions. Without volunteers it is hard to put on events, even the required two events a year. Only a few regional clubs are actually reaching out to their club members with various types of notices, newsletters, etc.

Club secretary Questionnaire #2 –

Observation – Out of 83 regional clubs I have sent questionnaires, 4 have responded. Those that did respond wanted assistance from their directors. Membership rosters were checked “occasionally.” One club secretary had no clue they had access to their roster.

Director Questionnaire #1 - Observation – Out of 15 Directors, 3 responded. Assistance in accessing membership database. Would like to have their individual regions separated out each month so they didn't have to go through and do a sort and filter themselves.

Director Questionnaire #2 – Observation – Out of 15 Directors, 4 responded. Same as above regarding membership roster being split out for their region only. Of interest, one director said they checked their roster annually.

- * Track responses, monthly transactions (Renewals/New/Gifted) and email contact

Observation/Outcome – As indicated in the below chart comparing 2017 to 2018 transactions, data suggests that the email campaign of reaching out to expired and expiring members is working. More time is needed to see the trends of same.

- * Track corrections discovered during email campaign (mostly incorrect email addresses)

Observation & Outcome: Each time I would send out a batch of emails, I would get a few back as mailer daemon – undeliverable for various reasons. Once I got the mailer daemon notice I would look at the emails rejected and look for obvious errors – most times I found a misspelling of either the name portion or the back portion. For those I could not find obvious errors in, I called the people asking for the correct email addresses. Only one or two called back with corrections. I don't have time to keep chasing same. Some of the same errors come out monthly on the membership roster. Not sure why changes are not being made.

- * Track and target MALs - Observation & Outcome: After 7 months of the email campaign, we are just now seeing our MAL numbers start to level out and stop the bleed.

Action 3 - Breeders Directory

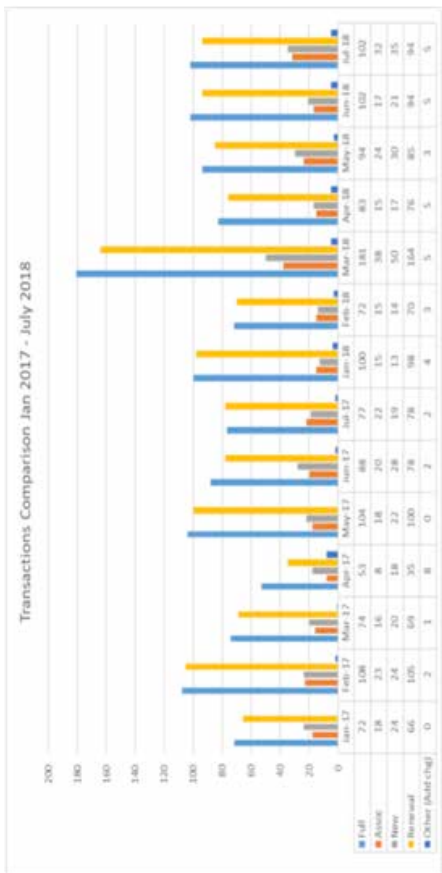
Observation/Outcome: After several discussions with BOD and magazine chair, said availability was announced in the February 2018 Magazine. Breeders were invited who were actively breeding, or occasionally breeding litters of puppies to provide their contact information for the same fee structure that we are already using for Kennel/At Stud/Trainer ads - \$60

per year for a standard ad (6 lines); \$10 each additional line. "Listings: Breeders – Kennels – At Stud – Trainers

1. To date no one has taken advantage of said opportunity. Once I get a handle on Membership I will be developing a breeder's directory list and sending out information and emails letting them know of the advantages of listing in the magazine. There are quite a few kennels that advertise Brittany's but are not current Brittany club members. New Puppy packets will be built and made available to new owners with ABC and AKC information available.

Action 4 - Membership building articles are part of the plan to highlight and hopefully to encourage other regional clubs to work toward that goal.

Observation/Outcome: To date the magazine has published and highlighted 3 clubs, their events and model of success. I hope to highlight at least one club from each region as often as possible. Getting clubs to submit their information/story is the hardest part. I am beginning to see some sharing of event models that have been successful.



CONCLUSIONS:

The focus of my predecessor's term was on securing a new membership database and the quality of the magazine. All numbers used in her calculations came from monthly magazine run numbers which are not the same as the

true/actual membership counts as they don't count associate members and members who choose not to receive a magazine or duplicate magazines. I have used actual current/full/ associate numbers in all of my calculations. Last year's numbers represent the inflated number of magazines printed, not the true membership numbers.

New Membership Database - As for the need for a new Membership Database – a database is only as good as the human that sits behind it. After talking to Deb Rudert, it appears our current database is sufficient for her use and it does what needs to be done. I'm not advocating the change to a new data base at this time. By simply sending out monthly emails to expired and expiring members, our numbers suggest that emails are working. Not only have we received numerous emails saying "Thank you for the email notice" but some members did not realize their memberships had expired for whatever reason and as such were appreciative of the Expired and Expiring emails notices. It will take more than a few months to realize the successfulness of our campaign. My responses after 7 months of data don't sustain my predecessor's conclusions that we need to purchase a new Membership Database in order to make a difference in our membership numbers. A simple email reminder sent 30 days is obviously working at this time.

Magazine Content - What members want to see in the magazine is more of a variety of articles. This new generation of Brittany owners are participating differently with their Brittany's. They are doing things like Barn Hunts, Dock Diving, running marathons, Trick Dog, you name it, someone is doing it. Our Brittany hasn't changed, it's the owners and availability of new opportunities for a new generation of Brittany owners that has changed. We can change with it and grow, or not. Having said that – to everyone I got that response from, I emailed them and asked them to be that change, to write that article, to share their experiences. Out of roughly 25 complaints, only one stepped forward with their story. There appears to be a lack desire on anyone's part to present articles and be part of the solution. I still believe it is a valid complaint and would definitely bring back to reading the magazine a generation or two that do things other than Field and Show. This is a magazine committee issue, not a membership issue to solve.

Membership Promotion Committee - The Membership Promotion Committee meets via email and texts monthly. As Chair of this committee I have advocated for and see great benefit in sending out emails to new members, expiring and expired members. Each month, the members of the committee have been asked

to send out emails to new members and club secretaries asking as to what they can do to assist them. I am appreciative of their efforts as another layer of communication and contact.

My observations after seven months of data research is that there is large field of apathy running rampant throughout the organization at all levels. My recommendations at this time is:

(1) The regional club secretaries make a greater effort to actively pursue the expired/ expiring members in their club and send a personal welcome letter to new members. The postcards notifying members of their upcoming expirations are not all getting through, so unless they receive an email from the club, many let their memberships lapse unaware. MEMBERSHIP RETENTION STARTS AT THE CLUB LEVEL.

(2) The regional clubs develop some sort of monthly communication (a quick newsletter, an email blast...) Some clubs with membership spread throughout the state, few meetings or events, this is an easy way to reach out to your members.

(3) Membership rosters be checked monthly for new members, changes of address and status. This can't hurt the retention of your members. It will take time, it is worth it.

I see the beginning of change and reaching out to members and clubs has been encouraging. I thank all involved these past seven months. I am looking forward to the next few months to confirm my observations and outcomes. I will have at least 3 more months of data by Nationals time.

The scope of the National Specialty has increased for the past several years. We continue to offer more opportunities for performance events as part of our National Specialty lineup. David Jackson, one of WMBC's newer members brought the Gust's Liver dog so we could be sure to show the judges more than one color of Brittany. A huge

thanks to everyone who helped to make this years' experience memorable for the judges. Thanks to Jessica for always supplying that last-minute information on # of duals to wow everyone!

Many thanks to Judy Tighe and Dianne Kroll for presenting the other two seminars this year. These gals both step up whenever I send out a call to committee members and mentors for a presenter for a seminar. Thanks also to all of my committee members who helped with input to AKC on their video about Brittanys that they were trying to put together. The Judge's Education Committee is made up of dedicated individuals that are committed to the ABC Mission Statement of keeping our breed "forever a dual dog."

At the MSDA seminar our Chair Kathy Wiecha gave us the bad news that AKC had downgraded our MSDA seminars to 2 points for the judges participating. She told us also that national specialties JE seminars that previously gave the judges 3 pts also had been downgraded to 2 pts. AKC has "Proclaimed" that the only seminars judges will get 3 pts for is the AKC seminars run by people who are not involved in the breed of the seminar they are presenting. Does that make any sense to you? It makes no sense that a seminar that presents not only breed standards, but also field & water demos should get less credit than an AKC seminar. It really is insane to think that judges could learn more from an AKC seminar than they could at our National Specialty Show, where they not only get a JE seminar and a Hands-on Workshop, but they have breed mentors sitting with them outside the ring while some of the best Brittanys in the country are being shown in larger quantities than they would ever find elsewhere. The judges also watch our Top 20 competition and are invited to participate in any activities that are held at the National Specialty. They are always invited to visit the field trial the following Monday to ride the wagon or a horse. I can tell you that it doesn't make sense to any of the JEC's I've been in contact with and everyone is quite upset. I will work on this by contacting as many JEC's as possible so that we can present a united front to AKC on this matter.

Note: I looked up every judge any exhibitor contacted me to complain about their judging of our breed this year. All of them had taken an AKC seminar and NONE of them had taken the ABC seminar. Regional specialties and the 3rd VP need to contact me for the list of individuals who have taken our seminar.

RE: Separation of Epagneul Breton from
American Brittany

Dear Ed Janulis/Board of Directors:

I am writing on behalf of the emerging AKC Epagneul Breton Club of America (EBCA) to formally request the American Brittany Club's cooperation in separation of the Epagneul Breton as a distinct and separate breed from the American Brittany. To begin this process, we ask that the ABC first agree to this long overdue split into two separate breeds; and secondly, to permit owners of Epagneul Bretons to remove their dogs that are improperly registered as Brittanies from the ABC studbook. This letter contains two parts: first we will present the historical and morphological evidence of the distinction between the two breeds and second we will provide our proposal for how this process of separation should work.

Historical and morphological differences

When researching American Brittany (AB) pedigrees, one must understand all AB originated from Epagneul Bretons (EB). The history of the breed goes back to the repopulation of the peninsular region of Brittany after the fall of the Roman Empire by Celts, who came from Wales when the Saxons invaded Great Britain. These peasants & poachers brought with them a small spaniel dog, which was found in Brittany many years later. Just prior to the turn of the 20th century, English hunters would leave their setters & pointers in France with gamekeepers during the winter. Those setters & pointers crossed with the region's native spaniels & the Epagneul Breton was born.

The Club of the Breton Spaniel (CEB-France) was formed in 1907. However, representatives of the breed club competed in field trials & shows as early as the late 1800's. In 1896, at the Paris Dog Exposition, a dog named Pincon Royale was exhibited - a male tri-color, owned by Viscount de Combourg of Bretagne Province. Pincon Royale was exhibited in the "epagneul" or "spaniel with wavy coat" variety of "any variety" in the 1896 Paris Dog Exposition. It is unknown whether Pincon was a black or liver tri-color. Two years later in 1898, a liver & white

EB female, named Myrrha d'Amorique won a first place in a French field trial. The first official registration in France of an EB was an Orange and white male, named Boy-Sec Reg #LOF 11 609 with a DOB of 03/8/1905. Marpha, a liver and white female was next registered under sec Reg#LOF 11 610 with a DOB of 3/24/1903. Among the first 300 registrations of EB's with the sec, the liver & white coat was far more popular than the orange & white

(Willems, article Norwegian Brittany Club, 2007).

When we look back to those dogs registered in 1907, we see many dogs were orange/white, liver/white, chestnut/white, & also black. The initial standard put forth by the club to the French Kennel Club (SCC) was rejected since it included the color black. In 1908, the standard was revised to exclude black. Later multiple genetic studies provide factual data that black existed in the original dogs. This was even confirmed again by Pierre Willems in the 1990's in his research. In a desire to largest registry in the US, has a long-established official split between the two breeds. Canadian Kennel Club has a split between the two breeds forthcoming. North American Versatile Hunting Dog Association considered a proposal to split the two breeds and has tabled it pending more information and awaiting an official divide under AKC. Finally, OFA and PennHip both already distinguish between the two breeds in order to have accurate statistics in their health data.

Process of Separation

EBCA estimates the number of dogs to be withdrawn from the studbook to be merely around 200. Most EB's in the US are registered under FCI and/or UKC. The EBCA wishes to make this process of separation as smooth as possible for the ABC, and to that end proposes the following considerations for the process. This process will be 100% voluntary and up to each individual dog owner to ensure proper registration of their dog. Removal of AB registration for a dog will not guarantee designation or registration as an EB. EBCA will create a breed transfer request form for owners to submit to ABC. EB owners will contact ABC via the breed transfer form to request that their dog(s) be removed from the registry as a Brittany to be relisted as an Epagneul Breton. The EBCA will make it clear to interested owners that removal of a dog from ABC does not guarantee future AKC registration as an EB. Return to the original breed origin, the color black was allowed back into the standard in 1956. This effort was led by Mr. Gaston Pouchain, President of the CEB-France from 1956-1982. There are known imports to North

America back to the later 1924 +/- to Mexico by Mr. Pugibets. Later, to the US, Perile de Pradalan, Djin des Vaux, Clap de Callac, Fanche du Cosquerou, & some de L'Argoat dogs were imported in 1931 +/- . There were later dogs imported to the US in the 1930's & 1940's (Willems, email, 8/28/18). The AKC registered the first Brittany Spaniel. Those dogs were later bred and the evolution of the American Brittany commenced & the AB & EB standards (AKC & FCI) began to diverge.

Generally speaking, an EB is a smaller, calmer, closer working, more biddable and more family-oriented dog. Closer working in this instance, indicates a dog that remains in shotgun range most of the time, but can reach out when cover dictates. The AB, throughout the middle of the 20th century & after WWII, were bred for field trials and horseback all age trials where big ground covering dogs were preferred. AB breeders developed a big running dog with speed and field aggression or "reach & drive". This is the key reason for the divergence in the two breeds that we see today & ongoing. EB enthusiasts in the US have continuously imported and bred to the French standard in order to properly preserve the breed separate from the AB.

In addition to this historical difference, attached separately from this letter are several photographic exhibits illustrating the vast and distinct morphological difference between these two breeds. FCI/CEB France have indicated support for this split and AKC recognition of the EB. United Kennel Club, the second

Upon ABC approval to remove a dog from being listed as a Brittany, ABC will send the owner a letter stating official removal, including the dog's registered name and AKC registration number.

ABC shall open the studbooks for removal of EB's for a window of 6 months. Removal of dogs from the studbook shall be limited to current, living dogs. Any AKC titles or points a dog has earned shall transfer with the dog upon successful breed transfer to EB. EBCA does not anticipate removal of EB's affecting AB pedigrees.

The EB and AB are truly two separate breeds and have been maintained as such by enthusiasts of both breeds in the US. It's time to acknowledge and celebrate their differences and keep both breeds true to their distinct breed standards by allowing this separation. It will only serve to benefit both breeds going forward. The EBCA will be available to assist the ABC with whatever is necessary to facilitate the

separation process upon ABC approval.

I look forward to ABC's cooperation.

Re: Effort by group called "Epagneul Breton Club of America" to separate from the AKC Brittany Registry by establishing an AKC Epagneul Breton registry and to qualify as an AKC recognized parent club

Dear Gentlemen and Ladies of the American Brittany Club:

I. A brief history and information about CEB-US.

This is an informational submission to the American Brittany Club (hereafter referenced as "ABC") intended to be shared with the Board of Directors and leadership of the ABC. It is submitted on behalf of the Club De L' Epagneul Breton of the United States, Inc. (hereafter referenced as "CEB-US") which is an organization in the United States made up of approximately 325 dues paying members who own French Brittans or Brittany dogs of recent European origin (which we typically refer to as "Epagneul Bretons" and/or "EBs" for shorthand description). CEB-US has been designated as the parent club of the EB in the United States under the United Kennel Club (hereinafter UKC) registry for the Epagneul Breton and is

properly incorporated and in compliance with the applicable IRS regulations for non-profit dog clubs. CEB-US has a solid membership based throughout the United States and a solvent and stable treasury funded by membership dues, breeder advertising, event entry fees, an annual fundraising auction, and other miscellaneous forms of revenue which combine to support the corporate entity. The organization has existed and been operated and governed by officers and a board of directors since being founded initially as the French Brittany Gw1 Dog Association of America, Inc. (hereafter FBGDA) in 1997. The club name was changed to the present name, around 2007 and this club of EB owners is now typically referred to as "CEB-US" in the EB community in the US and internationally. Most of CEB-US members' EB dogs are dual registered with the AKC as a Brittany and a number of EB owners belong to the ABC and various regional ABC affiliated clubs around the United States. Quite a few CEB-US members participate with their dogs in AKC shows, Hunt Tests, Field Trials, Agility competitions and other activities available to Brittans through the sponsorship of the American Kennel Club and/or various regional affiliates of the ABC.

IV. Concluding thoughts.

On behalf of CEB-US and the EB community in the United States, we appreciate the opportunity to attempt to provide constructive and objective input, in the event that the American Brittany Club decides to revisit the issue of potentially separating the Epagneul Breton from the Brittany in the framework of the American Kennel Club. We also appreciate the thoughtful insight which has been shared by a number of people in the American Brittany Club who have looked objectively at this issue from the Brittany perspective. We request that this communication be promptly forwarded and provided to the Board of Directors and the officers of the American Brittany Club for their consideration. We are also copying Mr. Doug Ljungren whom we are told is the appropriate supervisory official for the American Kennel Club, so that he is properly informed that there is very strong opposition in the EB community at large.

While the possibility of separation has some initial superficial appeal in terms of a basic AKC registration document and would create an AKC show venue for EB's with black in the coat, the complexities, complications and risks of actually accomplishing breed separation in the United States at this point in time are many. CEB-US feels that the present status quo is workable and that both the American Brittany group and the Epagneul Breton group have been able to

find a means to enjoy, promote and perpetuate their dogs in a successful manner within the United States for the last decade and a half. We believe both groups will be able to continue to do so looking prospectively to the future if the status quo is maintained. Therefore, CEB-US does not feel that altering the existing status quo for the Brittany in the framework of the American Kennel Club will have measurable and significant positive benefits for anyone concerned. We also anticipate that breed separation at this point in time would be very complicated, expensive, and difficult to achieve in an orderly manner. For this reason, we hope that the Board members of the American Brittany Club will study this matter carefully and reach the conclusion not to alter the present status quo.

If further information is desired, or we may provide additional information on perspective, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Never the less, we do expect to have our audit report completed and will present it at the annual BOD meeting. We owe our new Treasurer, Keith Wolnewitz, a huge thank you for all the hours spent in getting 2017 completed. Each committee member was assigned an area to review/audit: Lucille Sawicki-National Specialty Show; Kent Patterson – Futurity; Judy Graves, Membership, advertising & recording fees; Bernie Crain, Bank reconciliations; Mary Karbiner, National Gun Dog Championships, and Joe Gower, National Open All Age Championships. This allocation allows us to review over 92% of our revenues.

Because of the delay in reporting, an extension to file the ABC 990 was requested and approved by the IRS. This report is now due in November. As far as our group tax exemption, we started the year with 45 subs. The Washington Brittany Club and Southern San Joaquin Valley Brittany Club were added in 2017 and included in the IRS 990N postcard filing for each club.

At last year's meeting, our committee requested a change to fiscal year from the calendar year we currently report on. The Board approved this request, which would set into motion a required vote of the membership to change the by-laws. Our new Treasurer, however, was not in favor of a change at this time given the legal requirements to make the change as well as this introductory period for him to learn the fiscal needs of the organization. We know we have the approval of the board should we think a change is necessary in the future. This change, however, would still need membership approval to change the by-laws.

2018 Event budgets were approved earlier this year for the All Age & Gun Dog field events

as well as the National Specialty. Between now and the upcoming Board meeting, directors, officers, and committee chairs will be contacted to submit their budget requests for 2019 General & Administrative activity, Magazine, Membership, publications, and the 2019 Futurity. Once again, we recommend that our undesignated reserve fund be built up to two times our operating revenues (\$203,396). We are getting close to that amount and should be there in a few years.

Finally, we have the Central Region representative term ending at year's end. The Committee unanimously voted to recommend to the BOD our Action Item #1: Reappoint Judy Graves to a five year term.

2018 FUTURITY COMMITTEE REPORT LESLEE MASOLOTTE, CHAIRPERSON AND LINDA LANGFORD, SECRETARY

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as chairperson of the American Brittany Club Futurity starting in January 2018. I want to thank the 2018 Futurity Committee that includes Linda Langford as secretary, Leslie Andreas, Darlene Dow, Diane Hedstrom, Sue Lahosky and Michelle Millette. Our committee is comprised of dedicated Brittany owners, breeders and exhibitors from the eastern, central and western sections. Of note is that the committee members are representing their section and our breed with a focus on the future.

As members of the American Brittany Club as well as our regional clubs, our committee has been gathering suggestions for the coming year to increase club member's participation in the futurity. For the many years that I have been personally involved with the futurity, a common goal is to help the futurity to grow both in participation numbers and the amount of purse money awarded to the winners.

We are grateful to our host clubs in 2018: The California Brittany Club hosted the Western Futurity on January 31—February 1, the Iowa Brittany Club and Minnesota Brittany Club co-hosted the Central Futurity on April 5-6 and the Pennsylvania Brittany club hosted the Eastern Futurity on April 30—May 1. We need to continue to look for ways to better support our host clubs by making the entry process less complicated and to give financial suggestions to aid the host clubs in meeting the expenses in conducting their event.

Thanks to the donation by a member, we

presented printed frame worthy certificates of acknowledgement to the host clubs to show the appreciation of the Futurity Committee and the American Brittany Club for the hard work of the host clubs in planning quality futurity events. We would like to add the certificates to the 2019 budget.

We secured the use of the Custom Ink services in fund raising throughout the futurity season. The apparel was printed with the ABC Futurity logo to be used by all three sections. A percentage of the futurity apparel that was sold was added to the purse and distributed to all three sections. I would suggest that we continue with the fundraising with an earlier start and keeping in mind the goal to elevate the amount added to our purses. The amount raised for this last year was \$445.00 I believe we can expect to increase that amount.

There were also trophy donations made to all three regions and I would like to thank those who made those donations. The amounts were \$140.00 for the Eastern, \$20.00 for the Central and \$350.00 for the western. The total donations from members were \$510.00

Catalog sales and advertising generated by the Eastern was \$980.00, \$14.00 by the Central and \$50.00 by the Western sections for a total of \$1044.00 income.

Raffles brought in \$543.00 for the Eastern and \$450.00 for the Western to total \$993.00

Entries income: Eastern were \$2,860.00, Central were \$3,320.00 and Western were \$2,500.00 for a total of \$8,680.00

Thank you to Purina for the donation of \$500.00 per section. Total Revenue was \$13,172.000

The Western Futurity had 5 All Age starters, the Gun Dog had 18 starters and the show had 11 dogs and 14 bitches. The purse awarded was \$685.52 for AA FLO, \$1183.13 for GD FLO and \$1331.90 for Show which was a decrease from 2017.

The Central Futurity had 15 All Age Starters, the Gun Dog had 19 starters and the show had 17 dogs and 13 bitches. The purse awarded was \$1246.57 for AA FLD, \$1378.74 for GD FLO and \$1746.57 for Show which was an increase over 2017.

The Eastern Futurity had 8 All Age starters, The Gun Dog had 21 starters and the show had 12 dogs and 16 bitches. The purse awarded was \$848.67 for AA FLO, \$1383.34 for GS FLD,

\$1635.42 for Show which was a decrease from 2017.

The grand total purse distribution was \$12,041.96. In 2016, there were 109 litters were nominated for the 2018 futurity for a total of 695 puppies to be eligible for individual nominations to compete in the 2018 futurity events. Of those, 122 puppies had paid final forfeits.

Total club outlay was \$7(063.61 which varied somewhat per section.

Looking forward to the year 2019 we have host club designated for the 2017/2019 events. The Western Futurity will be hosted by the Oregon Brittany Club on April 5 and 6, the Central Futurity will be hosted by the Skyline Brittany Club of Colorado on March 10 and 11 and the Eastern Futurity will be hosted by the Mid Florida Brittany Club on January 14 and 15. We are now taking applications for the 2018/2020 host clubs.

Suggestions have been gathered from committee members and participants through the past year:

(1) Rewrite the bitches in season paragraphs in the policy book to help in clarification.

(2) Include photos of all the show winners in a group on the ABC website similar to the field photos rather than just the top show winners. The magazine will continue to show individual money placements.

(3) Encourage regional directors to become more involved in the futurity in their section such as assisting in setting up the photo ops to include the Purina food bags and the futurity trophies

(4) Increase trophy and fundraising activities in each section.

Thank you to the committee members for their help and support this past year. Special thank you to Linda Langford in her position as futurity secretary which is a time-consuming task. With their help we can look forward to an ever-improving futurity. Thank you also to our sponsors Purina, Garmin and Mudd River.

There are frequent remarks from members concerning a lack of diversity in the content of the magazine. Many of the complaints point out that a great part of the content is show and trial results. What has to be realized is that show and trial results with write ups are a major income source for the magazine.

The magazine is attempting to establish regular columns about showing, grooming, veterinary info, youth activities, hunting and companion dogs. If any of the directors know of anyone interested in writing a column on any of these subjects, please have them contact the magazine committee.

The American Brittany Magazine contains the history of the American Brittany Club going back to 1942 when the publication was called Field and Bench. The Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame has purchased a computer program that allows magazines to be scanned and inventoried. These inventoried magazines then can be queried to research a dog or event as needed. The process has now been going on for a couple of years and will be at least a few more until it is finished. They are working backwards and will end up with the 1942 issue. This is time consuming as each page of each magazine has to be scanned. When this project is complete, this information will be accessible on the ABC and the BFTHF website. The BFTHF is funding this program. LIAISON AGENDA REPORT

HSUS continues to fund political campaigns. I have stayed in contact with the US Sportsmen's Alliance, AKC, National Animal Interest Alliance, and other legislative groups and along with Jane Flannigan, our ABC/AKC Delegate during the last year, I do try and notify members when their state has proposed legislation that they need to react to accordingly.

We need all of you to stay focused on dog or animal legislation in your state and work to keep laws that don't kill the sport we love with bad laws. Please let me know if you would like for me to alert other members in your state if good or bad legislation is pending.

Current HSUS efforts have been directed toward Hot Car and temperature bills. Be alert for these as some of these do not afford any Due Process or protection for car owners or when temperature extremes do not come into play according to some attorneys consulted.

For those of you unfamiliar with the US Sportsmen's Alliance, I offer the following. They like most of these types of groups serve two purposes. They have a not-for profit 501-C3 arm which promotes hunting, fishing, trapping, for the sportsmen and women as well as their promotion of involving youth in the outdoors. Their other arm represents those same interests on legislative matters mainly on a national level. I often get contact from them asking our opinion on different legislative issues and what can they do to promote or work against some major legislative issues in the various states as I work with a group in Illinois dealing with Outdoor Recreation as well as U.S.S.A.'s contact at the ABC

From their website: About the Sportsmen's Alliance: The Sportsmen's Alliance protects and defends America's wildlife conservation programs and the pursuits – hunting, fishing and trapping – that generate the money to pay for them. Sportsmen's Alliance Foundation is responsible for public education, legal defense and research. Its mission is accomplished through several distinct programs coordinated to provide the most complete defense capability possible. Stay connected to Sportsmen's Alliance: Online, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.

For the past forty years the Sportsmen's Alliance has protected hunters, anglers and trappers from attacks by the anti-hunting movement. Sportsmen have a long tradition of fighting for what they believe in, and so it should come as no surprise that they are politically involved when it comes to protecting our natural resources, access to public land, wildlife management practices and our second amendment rights," said Sportsmen's Alliance President and CEO, Evan Heusinkveld.

Breed Standard for the Brittany

General Appearance

A compact, closely knit dog of medium size, a leggy dog having the appearance, as well as the agility, of a great ground coverer. Strong, vigorous, energetic and quick of movement. Ruggedness, without clumsiness, is a characteristic of the breed. He can be tailless or has a tail docked to approximately four inches.

Size, Proportion, Substance

Height: 17 1/2 to 20 1/2 inches, measured from the ground to the highest point of the shoulders. Any Brittany measuring under 17 1/2 inches or over 20 1/2 inches shall be disqualified from dog show competition.

Weight: Should weigh between 30 and 40 pounds.

Proportion: So leggy is he that his height at the shoulders is the same as the length of his body.

Body Length: Approximately the same as the height when measured at the shoulders. Body length is measured from the point of the forechest to the rear of the rump. A long body should be heavily penalized.

Substance: Not too light in bone, yet never heavy-boned and cumbersome.

Head

Expression: Alert and eager, but with the soft expression of a bird dog.

Eyes: Well set in head. Well protected from briars by a heavy, expressive eyebrow. A prominent, full or pop eye should be heavily penalized. It is a serious fault in a dog that must face briars. Skull well chiseled under the eyes, so that the lower lid is not pulled back to form a pocket or haw that would catch seeds, dirt and weed dust. Preference should be for the darker colored eyes, though lighter shades of amber should not be penalized. Light and mean-looking eyes should be heavily penalized.

Ears: Set high, above the level of the eyes. Short and triangular, rather than pendulous, reaching about half the length of the muzzle. Should lie flat and close to the head, with the tip rounded very slightly. Ears well covered with dense, but relatively short hair, and with little fringe.

Skull: Medium length, rounded, very slightly wedge-shaped, but evenly made. Width, not quite as wide as the length and never so broad as to appear coarse, or so narrow as to appear racy. Well defined but gently sloping stop. Median line rather indistinct. The occiput only apparent to the touch. Lateral walls well rounded. The Brittany should never be "apple-headed" and he should never have an indented stop.

Muzzle: Medium length, about two-thirds the length of the skull, measuring the muzzle from the tip to the stop, and the skull from the occiput to the stop. Muzzle should taper gradually in both horizontal and vertical dimensions as it approaches the nostrils. Neither a Roman nose nor a dish-face is desirable. Never broad, heavy or snipy.

Nose: Nostrils well open to permit deep breathing of air and adequate scenting. Tight nostrils should be penalized. Never shiny. Color: fawn, tan, shades of brown or deep pink. A black nose is a disqualification. A two-tone or butterfly nose should be penalized.

Lips: Tight, the upper lip overlapping the lower jaw just to cover the lower lip. Lips dry, so that feathers will not stick. Drooling to be heavily penalized. Flews to be penalized.

Bite: A true scissors bite. Overshot or undershot jaw to be heavily penalized.

Neck, Topline, Body

Neck: Medium length. Free from throatiness, though not a serious fault unless accompanied by dewlaps, strong without giving the impression of being over-muscled. Well set into sloping shoulders. Never concave or ewe-necked.

Topline: Slight slope from the highest point of the shoulders to the root of the tail.

Chest: Deep, reaching the level of the elbow. Neither so wide nor so rounded as to disturb the placement of the shoulders and elbows. Ribs well sprung. Adequate heart room provided by depth as well as width. Narrow or slab-sided chests area fault.

Back: Short and straight. Never hollow, saddle, sway or roach backed. Slight drop from the hips to the root of the tail.

Flanks: Rounded. Fairly full. Not extremely tucked up, or flabby and falling. Loins short and strong. Distance from last rib to upper thigh short, about three to four fingers widths. Narrow and weak loins are a fault. In motion, the loin should not sway sideways, giving a zig-zag motion to the back, wasting energy.

Tail: Tailless to approximately four inches, natural or docked. The tail not to be so long as to affect the over-all balance of the dog. Set on high, actually an extension of the spine at about the same level. Any tail substantially more than four inches shall be severely penalized.

Forequarters

Shoulders: Shoulder blades should not protrude too much, not too wide apart, with perhaps two thumbs' width between. Sloping and muscular. Blade and upper arm should form nearly a ninety degree angle. Straight shoulders are a fault. At the shoulders the Brittany is slightly higher than at the rump.

Front Legs: Viewed from the front, perpendicular, but not set too wide. Elbows and feet turning neither in nor out. Pasterns slightly sloped. Down in pasterns is a serious fault. Leg bones clean, graceful, but not too fine. Extremely heavy bone is as much a fault as spindly legs. One must look for substance and suppleness. Height at elbows should approximately equal distance from elbow to withers.

Feet: Should be strong, proportionately smaller than the spaniels', with close fitting, well arched toes and thick pads. The Brittany is "not up on his toes." Toes not heavily feathered. Flat feet, splayed feet, paper feet, etc., are to be heavily penalized. An ideal foot is halfway between the hare and the cat foot. Dewclaws may be removed.

Hindquarters

Broad strong and muscular, with powerful thighs and well bent stifles, giving the angulation necessary for powerful drive.

Hind Legs: Stifles well bent. The stifle should not be so angulated as to place the hock joint far out

Feet: Same as front feet.

Coat

Dense, flat or wavy, never curly. Texture neither wiry nor silky. Ears should carry little fringe. The front and hind legs should have some feathering, but too little is definitely preferable to too much. Dogs with long or profuse feathering or furnishings shall be so severely penalized as to effectively eliminate them from

competition.

Skin: Fine and fairly loose. A loose skin rolls with briars and sticks, thus diminishing punctures or tearing. A skin so loose as to form pouches is undesirable.

Color

Orange and white or liver and white in either clear or roan patterns. Some ticking is desirable. The orange or liver is found in the standard parti-color or piebald patterns. Washed out colors are not desirable. Tri-colors are allowed but not preferred. A tri-color is a liver and white dog with classic orange markings on eyebrows, muzzle and cheeks, inside the ears and under the tail, freckles on the lower legs are orange. Anything exceeding the limits of these marking shall be severely penalized. Black is a disqualification.

Gait

When at a trot the Brittany's hind foot should step into or beyond the print left by the front foot. Clean movement, coming and going, is very important, but most important is side gait, which is smooth, efficient and ground covering.

Temperament

A happy, alert dog, neither mean nor shy.
Disqualifications

Any Brittany measuring under 17 1/2 inches or over 20 1/2 inches. Black in the coat. A black nose.

The above Standard was approved by the AKC on April 9, 1990 and went into effect May 29, 1990.

American Brittany

Breeders Club Code Of Ethics

Adopted November 30, 1996

The following principles are to be used as an educational guide and a tool for Brittany breeders for the purpose to develop more genetic and disease free dogs, while being ethical in all matters with the public and with our peers.

Objective and Purpose

To promote cooperation and friendship among the breeders and owners of Brittanys and to encourage higher standards in breeding, training and showing of Brittanys in the field and in the show ring; to discourage the breed from becoming split into groups of "field dogs" and "show dogs" and to strive to keep it forever a "dual dog".

Ethical breeders should:

1. Comply with all ABC and AKC rules and regulations.
2. Maintain a high standard of health, care, and cleanliness for dogs under one's care.
3. Truthfully and realistically represent the Brittany being bred and/or sold in terms of quality, health, and genetic history. Refrain from breeding a bitch or using a stud until they are two (2) years old.
4. Consult with your breeder and with knowledgeable, experienced members of the ABC, regional clubs, or local kennel clubs to broaden your understanding and knowledge of the history of the breed BEFORE breeding your Brittany.
5. Breed only stock which are physically and temperamentally sound and in good health. No dog or bitch should be bred that is known to have serious inheritable defects or genetic diseases, such as: canine hip/elbow dysplasia, primary epilepsy, a seizure disorder, eye disorders - retinal atrophy, undescended testicles, heart defects, extreme shyness, viciousness, other inheritable diseases or defects
6. Not attempt breeding without the ability to distinguish between

correct and incorrect physical attributes. This ability requires a careful study of the breed standard, principles of genetics, and a study of both the sire and the dam's pedigrees. Breeders should study and learn the good points within our dogs, looking to both field ability and conformation.

7. Have their breeding stock OFA (Orthopedic Foundation for Animals), GDC (Genetic Disease Control) or PennHip certification numbers for hips on, at least, both the sire and the dam; preferably for three (3) generations on both sides of the pedigree. In addition, other tests (brucellosis, eyes, elbows, and other unspecified tests) should be declared in agreement between owners of the sire and the dam prior to breeding.
8. Refuse to sell to commercial wholesalers, retail brokers, or research laboratories.
9. Have tails docked and dew claws removed soon after birth. Prior to the sale of the puppies, initial shots for known infectious diseases should be given and worming administered. A buyer should be supplied with a four- (4) generation pedigree, registration certificate, information on all veterinary care, and instructions for the care, feeding, and training of the Brittany.
10. Remember your responsibility, as a breeder does not end with the sale of the puppy. A breeder should have contact with the buyer of a pup throughout the life of the dog. This information will enhance breeding knowledge and improve the foundation for a good long-term breeding program. This will also help your regional club to grow with new members and possible participants and workers.
11. Use spay/neuter agreements and/or consider limited registration if it is known or believed to manifest hereditary defects detrimental to the breed. THE LONG TERM INTEREST OF THE BRITTANY SHOULD BE THE GOAL OF EVERY BREEDER.
12. Consider DNA finger printing for all dogs in your breeding programs.

CONDITIONS AND RULES FOR FUTURITY ELIGIBILITY



- The **2020** American Brittany Futurity shall be open to every Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of **January 1 - December 31, 2018**, who is owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club, and whose litters have been Futurity nominated with The American Brittany Club. Sires do not necessarily have to be owned/leased by an American Brittany Club member. All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered with AKC, CKC, or FDSB.
- The **nominating breeder** needs to be a current full member in Good Standing of the ABC when the litter is nominated and the closing dates of the of the Sectional Futurities in which puppies from their nominated litter compete. They must sign the Litter Nomination form, and any breeder purse checks will be paid to this designated nominated breeder. If their membership has lapsed at the time of the Sectional Futurity, the purse will revert back to the ABC Futurity Administrative Fees.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 60 days after a bitch has whelped, and a Nomination Fee of \$40.00 ("First Forfeit") must be paid at this time.** This payment will entitle each puppy of the nominated litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Show) after the puppy has been properly registered with AKC or FDSB. Nomination Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors.
- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** In addition to the Nomination Fee of \$40.00, late fees are \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be accepted at the discretion and decision of the ABC Futurity Committee. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time.
- A Final Forfeit Fee, to be eligible to compete in the Sectional Futurities (Western/Central/Eastern), is due by October 1, 2019, and is submitted by the owner of the eligible puppy. Futurity Entry Fees will also be paid prior to 2020 Sectional Futurity events** by the owner of the eligible puppy for each Sectional Futurity event in which the eligible puppy is entered. Final Forfeit Fees as well as Sectional Futurity Entry Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors and subject to change.

Top Chew Toys of 2018 – Brittanys' Choice

Brittanys love to chew. It's relaxing, it helps keep their teeth clean, and it keeps them quietly occupied when you're busy.

Many dogs rip their toys to shreds in no time. On the other hand, when you don't offer suitable chew toys, the consequences may be memorable. (Does your dog prefer chomping on slippers or rearranging your upholstery?) Having just returned from a 2500-mile road trip, I can't imagine travelling without investing in some durable and entertaining chew toys.

Whichever toy you choose, never leave your dog unattended. He may ingest pieces that can cause choking, gastro-intestinal obstruction or serious injury. No toy lasts forever. But in this list, we've weeded out many toys that didn't outlast repeated testing.

Here are our chewiest picks:

1. StarMark Everlasting Fun Ball – Our Brittanys enjoy eating dinner or treats from this green ball (shown at right), which has survived strong chewers who previously destroyed Kongs. The openings have rubber pieces you can cut out with scissors if you want the food to come out more easily, but what would be the fun of that?

2. Kong Classic - Kongs are easy to find in most pet stores, economical and clean up conveniently in the dishwasher.

We prefer the stronger varieties: red and black. Get a size bigger than you think you need. Put a plug in the bottom e.g. a chunk of cheese, then stuff the remaining space and freeze. As your dog chews, it will gradually thaw and leisurely release the food.

3. West Paw Zogoflex Qwizl Tough Puzzle Treat Toy for Dogs - Although newer to the scene, Westpaw's high quality toys are durable, albeit expensive. Place a bully stick inside the middle hole and it will take your dog far longer to devour.
4. Bully sticks are 100% digestible, natural parts of bulls (except if you opt for the "odor free" products). Negatives include a strong odor (that dogs enjoy but humans may not), and they are not as long lasting as some of the stuffable toys. Try braided bully sticks to increase the lifespan.
5. Nylabone is one of the most popular toys on amazon, and it certainly works. When it's new, try scratching up the smooth surface and rubbing in some pate or peanut butter and your dog will find it more attractive to lick and chew. Select the flavored options for an added bonus.
6. PetSafe Busy Buddy Squirrel – Similar to Kongs, this durable toy can also be stuffed with kibble, and the adjustable rubber around the exits helps make it adjustable for your dog.
7. Outward Hound Kyjen Hard Boiled Softies Dog Toy – These penguin, hedgehog or bee toys feature a fabric skin around a large, tough, round squeaker in the middle. They make a low-pitched groan, delighting our testers. You may find the noise irritating, and don't expect them to last as long as rubber toys.
8. Tuffy plush toys incorporate industrial luggage material into multiple layers, covered with soft fleece, to produce the longest lasting fabric toys we've found. Our Brittanys enjoy tugging them together and carrying them around. For avid retrievers, try giving your dog one of these toys to carry during a walk, and hopefully less garbage will be returned to you. They also make good pillows. They come in a variety of shapes (e.g. dinosaurs, boomerangs) and each has a chew rating to help you select appropriately for your unique dog.

For the ultimate in chewiness, give one of our top-rated dog chew toys a try, and enjoy a peaceful break with your dog.

Crockpot Apple Crumble

1 cup brown sugar
½ cup granulated sugar
5 large apples, cut into chunks
¼ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon

Topping:

⅔ cup oats
⅔ cup loosely packed brown sugar
¼ cup flour
½ teaspoon cinnamon
3-4 tablespoons softened butter
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Toss apple chunks with salt and cinnamon.

In the bottom of your slow-cooker mix brown and granulated sugars, then spread evenly to cover. Layer apples on top, keeping them in a single layer as much as possible, then add the rest on top.

Mix the crumble topping together in a bowl, using your fingers to distribute the butter evenly and thoroughly and clump it together. Sprinkle it over top of the apples. Cook apples on low for 4 hours, or high for 2 hours. Turn off heat, unplug, and let sit, covered, for one hour. During this time the caramel will thicken a bit more. Serve with vanilla ice cream.



Grilled Partridge with White Barbecue Sauce

12 partridge breasts
1 cup mayonnaise
½ cup plain yogurt
¼ cup Fiore Summer Peach White Balsamic Vinegar
1 TBL fresh garlic, minced
1 TBL whole grain mustard
5 tsp prepared horseradish
2 tsp white pepper, coarsely ground
1 tsp kosher salt
1 tsp cane sugar

Combine all ingredients in bowl, except partridge and whisk. Place partridge in large zip lock bag and add half the sauce. Marinate in fridge, turning once, for 2 hours. Preheat grill to medium high and cook for 2 minutes on each side. Meanwhile, heat the reserved sauce on low. Serve sauce on partridge or on the side.



Grilled Venison Steak

1 LB venison steaks
1 tsp rosemary
1 tsp garlic powder
1 tsp porcini powder
1 tsp Urfa Biber chili pepper
½ tsp pink Himalayan salt
4 tsp Fiore Fig balsamic vinegar

Lay steaks on flat dish. On one side sprinkle the rosemary, garlic, and porcini powder. Turn steaks over and sprinkle with Urfa Biber and salt. Top each steak with fig balsamic vinegar. Let rest for 30 minutes before grilling. Preheat grill on high. Spray racks with cooking spray. Grill 2 minutes on each side - depending on thickness and personal preference.
