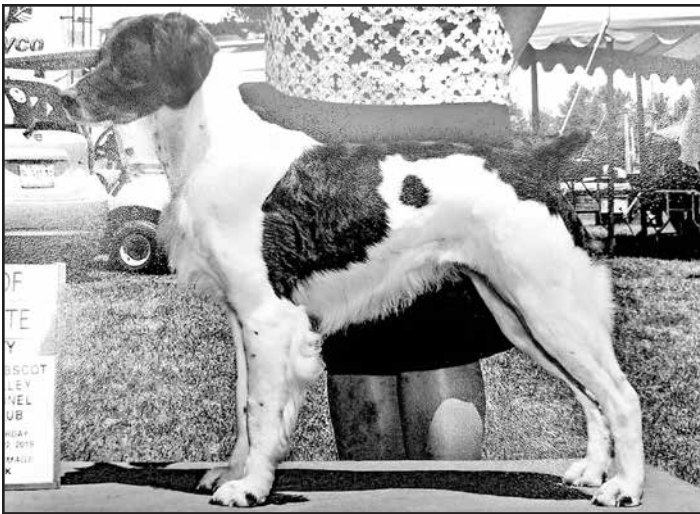

GCH CH MACH Cimmaron's Gold Standard of Marsport MXS MJS XF T2B5 SWN SHDN is the first Grand Champion MACH (Master Agility Champion) Brittany in the country to earn a scent work title.

There are a few Brittany's who have earned AKC scent work titles, but none is a Grand Champion in the breed ring nor a MACH in the agility ring, let alone both. Now that she's 10 and retired from agility, scent work gives her another job. And she LOVES it. I'm looking forward to competing with her in her third career.

The Brittany is a versatile dog. That's why it is my breed of choice. Although my family doesn't hunt, I figured the qualities that make a Brittany an exceptional hunter would transfer to other dog sports. I like its medium size, athleticism, drive, intelligence, and work ethic.

When I switched to pure-bred dogs, I knew I wanted a dog for obedience and perhaps agility. I got Bristol. She wasn't show quality, but she could perform. She ended her career with 52 titles in obedience and agility from four different organizations, including a NATCH

(NADAC Agility Trial Champion) from the North American Dog Agility Council. Plus, you couldn't ask for a better pet.

For dog number three, I wanted a dog that could "do it all." I wasn't interested in just a breed Champion, I wanted a Grand Champion. And I wanted a dog that could get an AKC MACH (Master Agility Champion). Nugget came into my life.

Nugget is the perfect example of, "Be careful what you wish for. You might get it." When she was a puppy, it was a battle to get all four of her feet on the ground at the same time. I thought I would never be able to control her, let alone get her in to an agility ring.

But as we worked, it turned out that Nugget was very receptive to verbal commands. Our instructor said she had never seen a dog that responded better to verbals. So, by the time Nugget finished her GCH and retired from the breed ring, we had started agility competition.

It was slow going at first. "These horse barns are just full of enticing smells! Weave poles? What are they? Certainly there's no point in doing them all. I can get to the tunnel

much faster if I skip the last two poles." But eventually Nugget grew up and both of us started having fun in the agility ring.

In 2017 we achieved our goal amid hugs, kisses, cheers, and tears. Nugget was an efficient agility dog. She finished her 750th point and her 20th Double Q on the same run. Most dogs excel at either speed or consistency. Nugget was well rounded.

So then what? It was nice to stay home and not travel so much for a change. But that soon wore thin for both of us. Nugget was only nine and not ready for retirement. Besides, Brittany's need a job. A friend was taking scent work classes at the time, where dogs are trained to find hidden odors and communicate their locations to their handlers. It sounded interesting. Scent work would most definitely be easier than agility on our aging bodies.

Nugget is a natural at scent work. She has a Brittany nose after all. I still vividly remember her aha moment after just a couple of classes. The object of the game hit her like a flash and she looked at me as if to say, "All these

years you've been trying to keep my nose off the ground in the agility ring. Now you want me to use my nose? All right!!" And it was full speed ahead from then on. She was so enthusiastic she would howl in her crate when other dogs were working. Why did they get all the fun? It took a while for her to realize that she would get her turn.

After a couple months of classes, we entered our first three days of scent work trials. Nugget qualified in Novice Containers all three days to finish her Novice Container title, becoming the first GCH MACH Brittany to earn an AKC scent work title. On the second day she got High-in-Trial Novice, where the dog has to qualify in all scent work elements offered that day with the fastest cumulative time.

So Nugget and I are now looking forward to an exciting scent work career. Fortunately, trials are becoming more numerous here in the heartland. Nugget spent the first nine years of her life excelling at what I wanted her to do. Now she is doing something she loves. Yes, a Brittany can do it all.

A Halloween Spook for Christmas: Part 3

We attended one trial before joining the club, strictly as spectators, and another one after joining before I got up nerve enough to enter my own dog. Spook was of derby age, but through lack of experience, I entered her in the Amateur Handlers Stake. It was a disaster. I soon found out about released birds; most of them could fly very little or not at all. I wore my hunting coat with a large game pocket, and I soon had my limit of quail, shooting a blank gun. Probably the first and last time this ever happened. The judge said, "You sure got a good retriever."

Some of the professional handlers who came to those early trials were Ralph Hesseltine, who started training and handling Brittanys about that time, Delmar Smith, Tom Cox, Lee Homan, Bill Kull, Jess Hayslip, and Harve Butler. There were also some very good amateur handlers who had good, well-trained dogs; Gerald Price with his great line of Way-Kan field trial dogs, as well as Clarence Goering, who was not as active in trials but as a breeder of Champion Brittanys. Both of these gentlemen have been honored by being elected to lifetime membership in The American Brittany Club.

At our next trial I wised up and entered Spook in the Derby Stake. We went to the drawing and I was braced with Bill Kull, one of the professional handlers. This bothered me a little as I had tried playing golf a few times with professional golfers, and that was murder.

The trial grounds were just south of Topeka, Kansas. All handlers walked in those days. The back course was negotiated without much excitement. Bill's dog was running wider than Spook, but she was hitting the cover and hunting all the likely places. The bird field was a little short on cover but had a large brush pile in the center of it. Spook made a beeline for this brush pile and styled up on point. I called "Point", and hurried over to her. Looking into the brush pile, I could see that it was full of those before-mentioned, released birds. I started kicking and jumping on the brush and birds started coming out, these birds could fly pretty well and I fired the blank pistol every time a bird came out. Spook never offered to chase any of them but would bounce around to a different location and point again. I would kick out more birds and fire again and again. This went on until the gun was empty. They finally called "Time", and I put on a lead and forced her away from that miserable brush pile.

I was a little dubious about that performance, but when we got up to where the cars were parked several people met us with big smiles, outstretched hands and

congratulations. They were talking, "Steady to wing and shot," and other complimentary statements so I felt a little more optimistic and decided to stay until the stake was finished.

I watched the balance of the running but could see only what happened in the bird field. Only two or three dogs had bird work and they all broke point and chased the birds. The more of this I saw, the more excited I became about my chances of taking one of those big trophies home. After some delay, the judges reached a decision and the placements were announced in reverse order: fourth, then third and on down to first. You guessed it, Spook failed to place. Naturally, I felt let down, but I learned a lesson and that was not to take seriously anything people in the gallery had to say about your chances of winning.

We became active in the Midwest Club and in Brittany field trials and to some extent in bench shows. I did enter in another Derby Stake. It was, as I remember, the Missouri Club's first sanctioned trial and Spook won it but received no points.

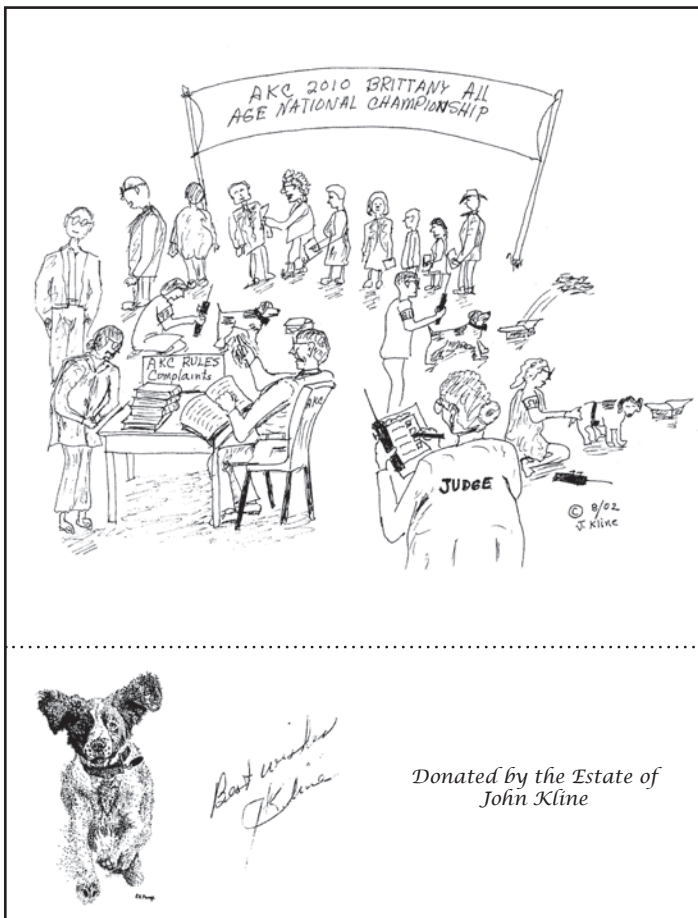

Top 5 Ways to Use Hand Targeting

Hand targeting (when a dog touches a person's hand, usually with their nose or paw) is a simple skill, and that's part of its beauty. It's fast to teach, easy to succeed, and quickly becomes rewarding with repetition. Best of all, it's useful in many scenarios. Even when you have no food or leash, you always have your hands to engage your dog!

How to Teach Hand Targeting

To get the greatest value from hand targeting, start by investing some time in making hand targeting rewarding.

Hand targeting is easy to teach. Start in a distraction free environment, with 10 food rewards ready to deliver. Put your empty hand out, a few inches from your dog's nose. Most dogs will naturally sniff your hand the instant you put it out, so be ready and don't miss the opportunity to reward that quick success. Reward by bringing a treat from your other hand to the hand they touched. Then take both hands away behind your back to reset. (If you just leave your hands out and still, it's less attractive to the dog.) Repeat until your rewards are gone, keeping the session short and fun.

If your dog has trouble, the most common mistake is presenting your hand too far away. Put your hand inches from the dog's nose or try wiggling your fingers.

Gradually increase the distance between your hand and the dog until your dog eagerly moves several feet to touch your hand. Next, add low, and high touches, or between your legs like leg weaving. The more value you build into hand targets, it should eventually become self rewarding. Eventually, you can ask for 2, 3 or more touches to earn one reward.

Ways to Use Hand Targeting

Once your dog enjoys hand targeting, you can use it in many different environments. Here are some of my favorites:

- 1) Hand targeting is a fun game for puppies, and you can teach it as soon as puppies are taking solid food. Once the puppy has the basics, try playing "patty cake": by clapping your hands twice, then presenting either your left or your right hand for targeting. Many dogs get excited by anticipating which hand you'll offer, jumping up in excitement.
- 2) While you can't use food rewards in the ring during obedience, you can use hand targeting as a rewarding game to play with your dog between exercises to energize and keep the connection going. In agility competitions, you can use hand touches in your warmup to get the dog focussed on following your motion, or place your hand in the right position to set up at the start of your agility run so your dog is facing exactly where you want them.

- 3) Use 2 hand touches in a row to speed up finishes into heel position for rally or obedience. Many dogs are quick to start the finish motion, but then get distracted behind the handler, especially if the judge arranges for the finish to happen at a ring entrance. Many dogs speed up their finishes when you use one touch to initiate the finish and a second touch in heel position. Once you practice fast finishes many times, your default speed is more likely to be fast in the ring too.
- 4) Use hand targeting to gesture towards areas you want your dog to search in scent detection. In most types of scent detection competition, handlers are faulted or failed when they touch anything in the search environment (known as “contaminating the search environment”). In practice, start by tapping your hand to make a noise that catches the dog’s attention, so they move where you touched. Once your dog understands this gesture, you don’t have to tap audibly anymore, and your dog will follow your hand when you gesture near the objects without touching.
- 5) Hand targeting can be used for shy dogs to opt into greeting strangers, when they are ready. Avoidance when approached by a stranger is a common cause of failures in Canine Good Citizen testing, therapy dog evaluations, obedience competition, and being examined by the judge at conformation shows. For some dogs, hand targeting can help.

Many dogs who would shy away when approached will relax after a few minutes observing the stranger, and then the dog will offer approaching the stranger, even touching their stationary hand. It gives the dog a choice to opt into greetings with strangers and can increase the dog’s comfort level with interacting. At first, teach the dog to touch their owner’s hand. When they get good at it, warmup a few times with the owner’s hand, and then have a family member present their hand close to the dog. When the dog touches the hand, their owner gives the reward. Then set up situations where the stranger ignores the dog and waits for the dog to touch their hand.

There are so many uses for hand targeting; this article is only the beginning. I hope you find some of them useful and fun. Let us know how you make out.

Pheasant Sweet-Potato Pie

- 1 pound de-boned pheasant breast (cubed and tenderized)
- 4 strips bacon (cut into ½ inch pieces)
- 1 white onion (diced)
- 2 large carrots (grated)
- 2 large stalks celery (thinly sliced)
- ½ cup green peas
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 2 tbs butter
- 2 tbs spoons flour
- 2 large sweet potatoes
- 2 cups grated cheddar cheese

Preheat oven to 375°. In a 2 quart sauce pan, boil potatoes. Mash the potatoes and return into warm pan. At the same time, in a large dutch oven over high heat. Fry the bacon pieces, remove the bacon and set aside. Place pheasant cubes into the pot and brown, salt and pepper to taste stir in onion, carrots, & celery while vegetables are cooking, melt the butter and whisk in the flour & broth, boil to thicken add broth mix into pheasant and vegetables, add green peas and bacon bits being careful not to mash the peas while mixing cover pheasant mix with mashed potatoes cover with cheddar cheese bake in oven uncovered for 15 to 20 minutes.

Creamy White Chili

- 1 lb boneless skinless chicken breast, cut into ½" cubes
- 1 med onion, chopped
- 1-1 ½ tsp garlic powder
- 1TBL canola oil
- 2 cans (15.5 oz each) great northern beans rinse & drained
- 1 can (14 oz) chicken broth
- 2 cans (4 oz) chopped green chiles
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- ½ tsp pepper
- ¼ tsp cayenne pepper
- 1 cup sour cream

Toppings: tortilla chips/strips, shredded cheddar cheese, sliced jalapeño peppers

2019 AKC Canine Health Foundation National Parent Club Canine Health Conference

The bi annual AKC CHF Canine Health Conference presentations were divided into diseases attributed to nutrition, infectious disease and cancer, autoimmunity and genetics.

The intestinal microbiota/microbiome (bacteria, fungi, protozoa and viruses) was a major topic of discussion and research. Imbalance in the gut microbiome, known as dysbiosis, can cause acute and chronic intestinal disease. Research has shown that using antibiotics (Clavamox vs metronidazole vs placebo) in acute diarrhea showed no difference in fecal consistency. The undesirable side effects of the antibiotics can cause dysbiosis, antibiotic resistance, and allow *Clostridium difficile* to grow. Fecal microbiota transplantation is being used in human gastroenterology to treat chronic intestinal disease. Some veterinarians have also used this but there is not a ton of research to describe the most successful methods and outcomes. Each individual has their own highly individual microbiota so what works for one, may not work for another.

Probiotics have been shown to support the intestinal microbiome but we need to make sure the ingredients consistently meet the label and that the product is well researched for safety and efficacy. Some products that contain good strains of bacteria are Fortiflora^R, Proviabio^R, Visbiome^R and Vetri probiotics^R. It is still unclear exactly how beneficial probiotics are- it depends on the individual and the condition for which they are being treated. A suggestion was made to NOT use metronidazole for acute diarrhea or *Giardia* in that it may damage the gut microbiota irreversibly. Fendbendazole is the recommended treatment for *Giardia*.

Another impact of the gut microbiota is on the brain. There is mounting evidence that manipulation of the gut microbiota can influence anxious behavior, specifically the gut-brain axis. A positive impact on mediating anxious behavior and stress responses in anxiety-prone dogs was shown by supplementing with the probiotic PL 999 marketed by Purina as "Calming Care^R". The dogs showed reductions in barking jumping, spinning and pacing.

"Predicting Disease Stage and Diuretic Responsiveness with Acquired Heart Disease" is the title of cardiologist Dr Darcy Adin's study grant.

While Dilated Cardiomyopathy (DCM) has a genetic basis for many dogs, nutrition can play a role in the development of DCM as well as in the progression and control of congestive heart failure (CHF). The relationship between dietary intake and heart disease is being actively investigated but there are many unanswered questions. End stage CHF is characterized by poor diuretic response and recurrent or refractory congestion. This study has used torsemide with success in the CHF dogs who are refractory to high doses of furosemide (Lasix).

Researchers at Colorado State University have performed a safety and pharmacokinetic study to assess the measurability and tolerability of cannabidiol (CBD) in healthy dogs. This study provided a framework for their clinical trials in canine epilepsy which showed that cannabidiol seemed to be well tolerated and exposure was dose proportional. The oil form had the greatest duration of action and had no negative effects on phenobarbital levels. About 20-30% of seizure dogs on standard antiepileptic drugs are not controlled leading to increased rates of euthanasia. If CBD is effective in decreasing seizure frequency, it has the potential to improve the quality and length of life for dogs with uncontrolled epilepsy and a much needed tool for veterinarians in the treatment of canine epilepsy.

The Canine Health Information Center (CHIC) DNA repository stores over 27,000 samples representing many different breeds. While all samples may be of use, the majority of the bank's samples represent young healthy dogs at the time of collection. However, the most valuable samples are from affected dogs. For this reason the CHIC program is asking that members update the bank with any health issues of significance that may increase the value of the sample and the likelihood of its use. An update can be done at OFA@OFFA.org.

Addison's disease is an autoimmune endocrine disorder of the adrenal gland. The disease is believed to be inherited in several dog breeds especially Standard Poodles, Portuguese Water Dogs and Cocker Spaniels. 5-7% of Standard Poodles will develop Addison's before 4 years of age. Treatment is with hormone replacement: prednisone and fludrocortisone. Recent Addison's Disease research is being directed

three fold: 1) Be able to predict which dogs will be affected, 2) Develop new ways of prevention and treatment and 3) Discover if there are any environmental triggers and, if so, what are they?

Steroid responsive meningitis-arteritis (SRMA) is an inflammatory disease of the nervous system of dogs characterized by involvement of membranes that cover the brain and spinal cord and associated blood vessels. The cause of SMRA is not fully understood but believed to be immune mediated in origin. It typically affects dogs 6-18 months of age of any breed but there have been some breeds that appear to be predisposed. Young dogs present acutely with fever, neck pain and lethargy. Diagnosis is based on the presence of increased numbers of white blood cells in the cerebrospinal fluid of affected dogs and exclusion of any underlying infectious cause. Most dogs respond well to treatment with corticosteroids. However, relapses are common as treatment is tapered or discontinued.

Vector-borne infections are commonly associated with immune mediated disease (IMHA) in dogs. There is a high level of evidence that *Babesia gibsoni* causes IMHA in dogs. Combined testing with serology and polymerase chain reaction (PCR) should be used for diagnosing infection with *Babesia*.

Over recent years *Leptospirosis* has received increased attention regarding its emergence and spread in dogs throughout North America. It causes a multisystemic disease affecting the kidneys and lungs. Clinical signs include vomiting and diarrhea, anorexia, depression, and icterus. The disease is zoonotic which means that humans can also get it from either the wildlife reservoirs or from an infected dog. Raccoons, skunks, rats, mice and opossums are known carriers of the disease but they do not get sick from it. The bacteria are shed in their urine and are able to survive a long time in wet environments: stagnant water sources such as lakes, ponds and puddles and in urine soaked bedding from infected dogs. *Leptospirosis* is best diagnosed with PCR testing. Occurrence is high in the Midwest also in the Southwest. Most commonly diagnosed were young males less than five years old in urban environments. Toy dogs less than 14 pounds were at greater risk than sporting dogs! Recommendations are to vaccinate your dog early (less than 6 months), yearly boosters and reduce exposure by staying away from slow moving water and puddles in endemic areas.

Ongoing research is comparing DNA from the bacteria

Bartonella in tumor and blood samples from both splenic and cardiac hemangiosarcoma cases to see if there is an association between *Bartonella* infection and the development of hemangiosarcoma within and between geographic locations.

Propranolol is a drug used to treat heart disease in humans and dogs. Recently, it has been shown that propranolol sensitized hemangiosarcoma cells to the chemotherapeutic drug doxorubicin, providing a more effective way to kill tumor cells. A clinical trial is underway to evaluate the use of propranolol, in combination with surgery and chemotherapy, to treat canine hemangiosarcoma.

A review of canine hemangiosarcoma research confirms that there is no correlation between genetic mutations and dog breed or tumor location. Hemangiosarcoma is an indiscriminate cancer of concern for all dogs.

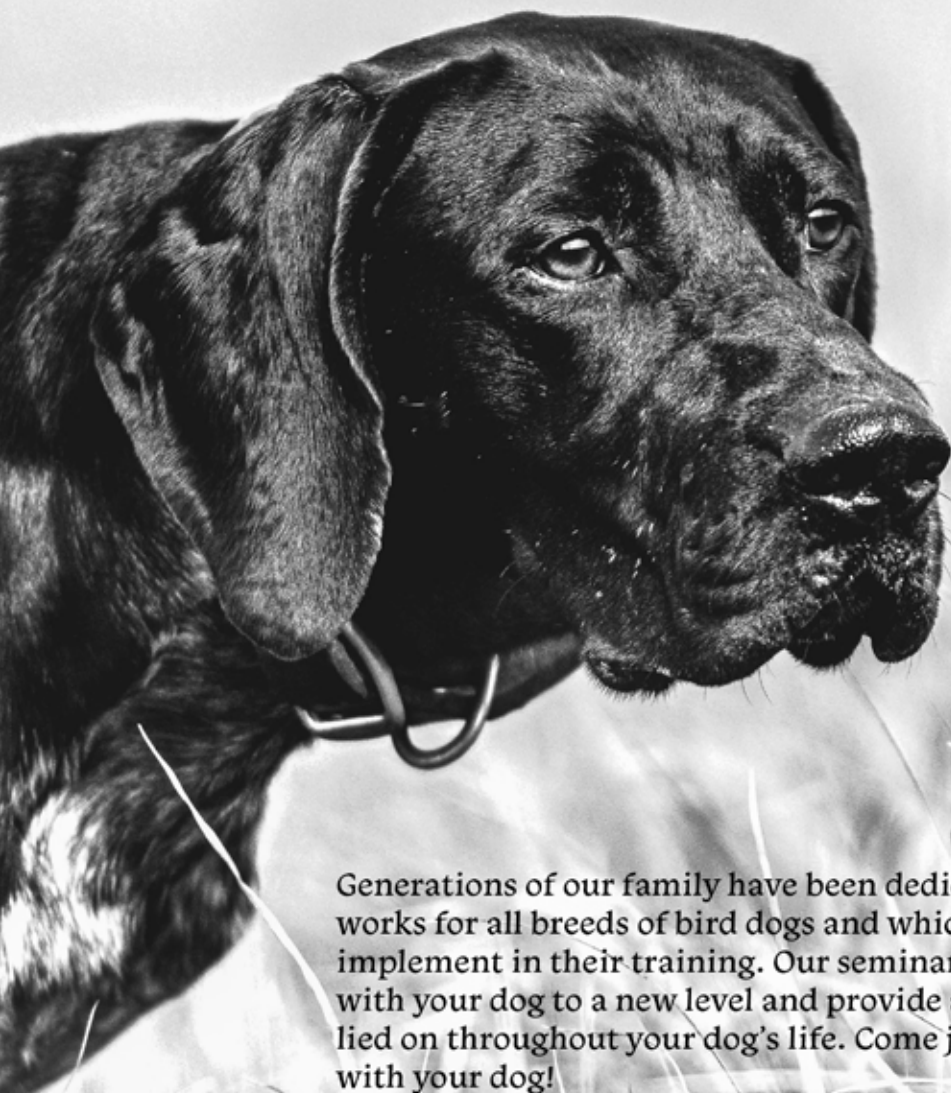
The International Partnership for Dogs Harmonization of Genetic Testing for Dogs project database (www.dogwellnet.com) currently contains information on 69 genetic test providers and more than 300 tests and diseases in over 500 different dog breeds and breed types. It is a valuable resource for veterinarians, breeders, and owners hoping to make sense of the recent surge in canine genetic testing options.

The most common genetic diseases that are seen by veterinarians every day in practice are due to ancient liability genes that originated in ancestors that preceded the separation of breeds. They occur in both purebred and mixed breed dogs. Breed specific genetic disorders are due to more recent mutations. Dog breeding is all about selection. The selection against disease causing genes is the only way to reduce transmission of genetic disease. Smart breeding includes 1) using healthy and diverse breed gene pools that have expanding or large stable populations with many outbred clusters as well as different linebred families, 2) Avoiding the use of popular sires, the single most influential factor in restricting breed gene pool diversity, 3) selecting against recessive disease genes by breeding quality carrier dogs to a tested normal mate. Replacing the carrier parent with a quality tested normal offspring for breeding. This eliminates the defective gene, while maintaining the quality genes of the line.

AMERICAN BRITTANY BREEDERS CLUB CODE OF ETHICS

Adopted November 30, 1996

The following principles are to be used as an educational guide and a tool for Brittany breeders for the purpose to develop more genetic and disease free dogs, while being ethical in all matters with the public and with our peers.

Objective and Purpose

To promote cooperation and friendship among the breeders and owners of Brittanys and to encourage higher standards in breeding, training and showing of Brittanys in the field and in the show ring; to discourage the breed from becoming split into groups of “field dogs” and “show dogs” and to strive to keep it forever a “dual dog”.

Ethical breeders should:

1. Comply with all ABC and AKC rules and regulations.
2. Maintain a high standard of health, care, and cleanliness for dogs under one's care.
3. Truthfully and realistically represent the Brittany being bred and/or sold in terms of quality, health, and genetic history. Refrain from breeding a bitch or using a stud until they are two (2) years old.
4. Consult with your breeder and with knowledgeable, experienced members of the ABC, regional clubs, or local kennel clubs to broaden your understanding and knowledge of the history of the breed BEFORE breeding your Brittany.
5. Breed only stock which are physically and temperamentally sound and in good health. No dog or bitch should be bred that is known to have serious inheritable defects or genetic diseases, such as:
 - canine hip/elbow dysplasia, primary epilepsy, a seizure disorder,
 - eye disorders - retinal atrophy, undescended testicles,
 - heart defects, extreme shyness, viciousness, other inheritable diseases or defects
6. Not attempt breeding without the ability to distinguish between correct and incorrect physical attributes. This ability requires a careful study of the breed standard, principles of genetics, and a study of both the sire and the dam's pedigrees. Breeders should study and learn the good points within our dogs, looking to both field ability and conformation.
7. Have their breeding stock OFA (Orthopedic Foundation for Animals), GDC (Genetic Disease Control) or PennHip certification numbers for hips on, at least, both the sire and the dam; preferably for three (3) generations on both sides of the pedigree. In addition, other tests (brucellosis, eyes, elbows, and other unspecified tests) should be declared in agreement between owners of the sire and the dam prior to breeding.
8. Refuse to sell to commercial wholesalers, retail brokers, or research laboratories.
9. Have tails docked and dew claws removed soon after birth. Prior to the sale of the puppies, initial shots for known infectious diseases should be given and worming administered. A buyer should be supplied with a four- (4) generation pedigree, registration certificate, information on all veterinary care, and instructions for the care, feeding, and training of the Brittany.
10. Remember your responsibility, as a breeder does not end with the sale of the puppy. A breeder should have contact with the buyer of a pup throughout the life of the dog. This information will enhance breeding knowledge and improve the foundation for a good long-term breeding program. This will also help your regional club to grow with new members and possible participants and workers.
11. Use spay/neuter agreements and/or consider limited registration if it is known or believed to manifest hereditary defects detrimental to the breed. THE LONG TERM INTEREST OF THE BRITTANY SHOULD BE THE GOAL OF EVERY BREEDER.
12. Consider DNA finger printing for all dogs in your breeding programs.

Breed Standard for the Brittany

GENERAL APPEARANCE

A compact, closely knit dog of medium size, a leggy dog having the appearance, as well as the agility, of a great ground coverer. Strong, vigorous, energetic and quick of movement. Ruggedness, without clumsiness, is a characteristic of the breed. He can be tailless or has a tail docked to approximately four inches.

SIZE, PROPORTION, SUBSTANCE

Height: 17 1/2 to 20 1/2 inches, measured from the ground to the highest point of the shoulders. Any Brittany measuring under 17 1/2 inches or over 20 1/2 inches shall be disqualified from dog show competition.

Weight: Should weigh between 30 and 40 pounds.

Proportion: So leggy is he that his height at the shoulders is the same as the length of his body.

Body Length: Approximately the same as the height when measured at the shoulders. Body length is measured from the point of the forechest to the rear of the rump. A long body should be heavily penalized.

Substance: Not too light in bone, yet never heavy-boned and cumbersome.

Head

Expression: Alert and eager, but with the soft expression of a bird dog.

Eyes: Well set in head. Well protected from briars by a heavy, expressive eyebrow. A prominent, full or pop eye should be heavily penalized. It is a serious fault in a dog that must face briars. Skull well chiseled under the eyes, so that the lower lid is not pulled back to form a pocket or haw that would catch seeds, dirt and weed dust. Preference should be for the darker colored eyes, though lighter shades of amber should not be penalized. Light and mean-looking eyes should be heavily penalized.

Ears: Set high, above the level of the eyes. Short and triangular, rather than pendulous, reaching about half the length of the muzzle. Should lie flat and close to the head, with the tip rounded very slightly. Ears well covered with dense, but relatively short hair, and with little fringe.

Skull: Medium length, rounded, very slightly wedge-shaped, but evenly made. Width, not quite as wide as the length and never so broad as to appear coarse, or so narrow as to appear racy. Well defined but gently sloping stop. Median line rather indistinct. The occipital only apparent to the touch. Lateral walls well rounded. The Brittany should never be "apple-headed" and he should never have an indented stop.

Muzzle: Medium length, about two-thirds the length of the skull, measuring the muzzle from the tip to the stop, and the skull from the occiput to the stop. Muzzle should taper gradually in both horizontal and vertical dimensions as it approaches the nostrils. Neither a Roman nose nor a dish-face is desirable. Never broad, heavy or snipy.

Nose: Nostrils well open to permit deep breathing of air and adequate scenting. Tight nostrils should be penalized. Never shiny. Color: fawn, tan, shades of brown or deep pink. A black nose is a disqualification. A two-tone or butterfly nose should be penalized.

Lips: Tight, the upper lip overlapping the lower jaw just to cover the lower lip. Lips dry, so that feathers will not stick. Drooling to be heavily penalized. Flews to be penalized.

Bite: A true scissors bite. Overshot or undershot jaw to be heavily penalized.

Neck, Topline, Body

Neck: Medium length. Free from throatiness, though not a serious fault unless accompanied by dewlaps, strong without giving the impression of being over-muscled. Well set into sloping shoulders. Never concave or ewe-necked.

Topline: Slight slope from the highest point of the shoulders to the root of the tail.

Chest: Deep, reaching the level of the elbow. Neither so wide nor so rounded as to disturb the placement of the shoulders and elbows. Ribs well sprung. Adequate heart room provided by depth as well as width. Narrow or slab-sided chests area fault.

Back: Short and straight. Never hollow, saddle, sway or roach backed. Slight drop from the hips to the root of the tail.

Flanks: Rounded. Fairly full. Not extremely tucked up, or flabby and falling. Loins short and strong. Distance from last rib to upper thigh short, about three to four fingers widths. Narrow and weak loins are a fault. In motion, the loin should not sway sideways, giving a zig-zag motion to the back, wasting energy.

Tail: Tailless to approximately four inches, natural or docked. The tail not to be so long as to affect the over-all balance of the dog. Set on high, actually an extension of the spine at about the same level. Any tail substantially more than four inches shall be severely penalized.

Forequarters

Shoulders: Shoulder blades should not protrude too much, not too wide apart, with perhaps two thumbs' width between. Sloping and muscular. Blade and upper arm should form nearly a ninety degree angle. Straight shoulders are a fault. At the shoulders the Brittany is slightly higher than at the rump.

Front Legs: Viewed from the front, perpendicular, but not set too wide. Elbows and feet turning neither in nor out. Pasterns slightly sloped. Down in pasterns is a serious fault. Leg bones clean, graceful, but not too fine. Extremely heavy bone is as much a fault as spindly legs. One must look for substance and suppleness. Height at elbows should approximately equal distance from elbow to withers.

Feet: Should be strong, proportionately smaller than the spaniels', with close fitting, well arched toes and thick pads. The Brittany is "not up on his toes." Toes not heavily feathered. Flat feet, splayed feet, paper feet, etc., are to be heavily penalized. An ideal foot is halfway between the hare and the cat foot. Dewclaws may be removed.

Hindquarters

Broad strong and muscular, with powerful thighs and well bent stifles, giving the angulation necessary for powerful drive.

Hind Legs: Stifles well bent. The stifle should not be so angulated as to place the hock joint far out

Feet: Same as front feet.

Coat

Dense, flat or wavy, never curly. Texture neither wiry nor silky. Ears should carry little fringe. The front and hind legs should have some feathering, but too little is definitely preferable to too much. Dogs with long or profuse feathering or furnishings shall be so severely penalized as to effectively eliminate them from competition.

Skin: Fine and fairly loose. A loose skin rolls with briars and sticks, thus diminishing punctures or tearing. A skin so loose as to form pouches is undesirable.

Color

Orange and white or liver and white in either clear or roan patterns. Some ticking is desirable. The orange or liver is found in the standard parti-color or piebald patterns. Washed out colors are not desirable. Tri-colors are allowed but not preferred. A tri-color is a liver and white dog with classic orange markings on eyebrows, muzzle and cheeks, inside the ears and under the tail, freckles on the lower legs are orange. Anything exceeding the limits of these marking shall be severely penalized. Black is a disqualification.

Gait

When at a trot the Brittany's hind foot should step into or beyond the print left by the front foot. Clean movement, coming and going, is very important, but most important is side gait, which is smooth, efficient and ground covering.

Temperament

A happy, alert dog, neither mean nor shy.

Disqualifications

Any Brittany measuring under 17 1/2 inches or over 20 1/2 inches. Black in the coat. A black nose.

The above Standard was approved by the AKC on April 9, 1990 and went into effect May 29, 1990.

The Little Brown Book

At the time this short piece is being written, the little brown book is on a shelf above the desk in my office. Its pages are nothing fancy—lined yellow paper; the cover being an alligator surface, colored brown—almost the liver color of a Brittany. Maybe the color of the cover is the reason the book was chosen for purchase.

The first written entry was made during the second week of January 2001. The last entry was made on July 31, 2013. There are a total of 60 pages of written material in the little brown book. For the most part, the pages are about a liver and white female Brittany, with the AKC and FDSB registered name of Flying Feather Cocobean—her call name was Coco.

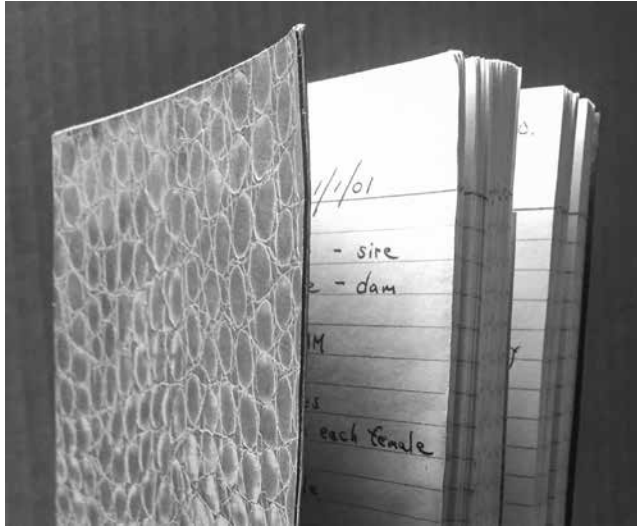
The written content also focused on the four litters she whelped. The breeding was all with the same male, Ortho Acres Booker T; the first being natural, while the remaining three were artificial. Coco was my hunting partner, although we did not hunt as many times as we should have. There was just not enough time in the days during the hunting seasons. Too many other demands on my time!

Because of my interest in both the Brittany show and field events, as a young dog, Coco was evaluated as a possible show contestant.

A knowledgeable show handler was consulted as to her possible participation in show events. Candid comment was, “Coco, although not too tall, is probably too long in the body and it would be difficult to finish her as a show champion.”

So I turned to field trials, and Coco ran in both puppy and derby stakes, where she had several placements. In one of those derby stakes, an unusual situation occurred on a rainy, cold, December day during a derby stake held in Michigan. She pointed a wet quail, which when flushed, flew maybe ten feet before landing. (Note: in a derby, the dog does not need to be steady to the flush.)

Coco was not steady; she jumped in, grabbed, and quickly ate the bird. With that, the surprised handler exclaimed, “Coco, what have you done?” Those five words had a lasting effect. Probably as Coco perceived, she had been “harshly” disciplined. This



fact was manifested over the next several months as she “blinked” each and every bird she pointed.

In the bird training arena, “blinking” is generally defined as when the dog points the bird and then moves away. The dog does this because it has associated previous discipline with scenting of the bird. To correct this bad habit, Coco was put in a small kennel runway with two quail. Her desire to get the birds cured the “blinking” situation.

The little brown book described many other events, as well as the unbelievable relationship that I had with Coco during her twelve and a half years. Also within the book are discussions about the pups from the four litters Coco whelped. Five of the dogs have placements in field trials, with Cedar Valley Bandit, Cedar Valley Spider, and Glade Run Nutmeg achieving AKC and American Field Championships. Coco’s most celebrated offspring is Glade Run Irish, who in the past two years has been the American Brittany Amateur and Open All-Age National Champion.

On November 1, 2014 a major event occurred. Our home burned (which we have rebuilt). There was significant loss to my library of books—including the “little brown book”, which had water damage. However, a positive point regarding the journal, which was kept about Coco, is that a new one has been started for Shadow, our new pup.



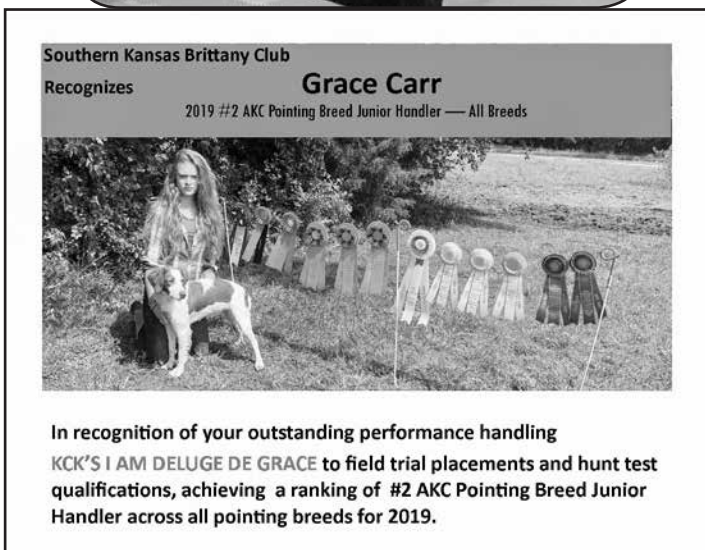

through to that point. The trip was long. Grace appeared to enjoy the numerous stories of Brittany's of the past, what makes the Brittany the best possible breed, how to care for, train, and handle a Brittany. It wasn't until we were almost home that she admitted she was so attentive to my babbling, for fear if she didn't I might fall a sleep at the wheel. Smart girl.

Grace took to caring for Deluge like a fish to water. She has the gift of being a natural trainer. Loving but firm. When Grace spoke, Deluge listened. We spent many days' together running and preparing Deluge in the field. When Deluge was seven months old we ran her in her first Hunt Test. The first two runs Deluge was excellent in her runs. She found a lot of birds and looked good doing it. On Sunday, Grace ran Deluge the first run and she found no birds. Grace was heartbroken. She just knew it was something she did or didn't do that resulted in a birdless run. We had a good talk about handling, bird scent, and wind direction. Deluge was only in the bird field once for about two minutes and spent the rest of her time everywhere but the bird field. Bird scent was just not good for a few hours on that particular field. We talked a lot about the run. After a few tears and lunch Grace ran again and Deluge found lots of birds. We finished with three ribbons towards the Junior Hunter title. Terry Gowin, Southern Kansas Brittany Club Secretary and good friend told us about the AKC Junior Handler Recognition program. We registered Grace in the program. Everyone in the Southern Kansas Brittany Club was supportive of Grace and Deluge. We ran Deluge in a horseback SKBC Trial with Grace handling. Now Grace could combine her two loves, horses and Deluge. We ended up with a Junior Hunter title for Deluge in the fall of 2018.



The odyssey began simple enough. Our oldest Brittany's had passed on. The younger children in the family were hitting the mid teenage years. Our youngest daughter had expressed an interest in caring for and working with a pup. On Thanksgiving Day 2017, Grace Ann and I took off for the middle of Utah from southern Kansas to pick up a pup. We had been on multiple lists for breeding's to a particular stud, but all the litters fell

By the fall of 2018 we added another pup (this time in Kansas, hat tip Steven and Kelly Foster), with my son Justice learning to handle a Brittany. At the SKBC Hunt Test the strangest thing happened. A GSP guy (Tom Wynn) complemented the kids on their dogs and handling ability. He invited us to a walking trial in Oklahoma the next weekend. We went to the trial and the rest is history. The hospitality of the GSP clubs was

G- They gave us good advice, tips, and support.

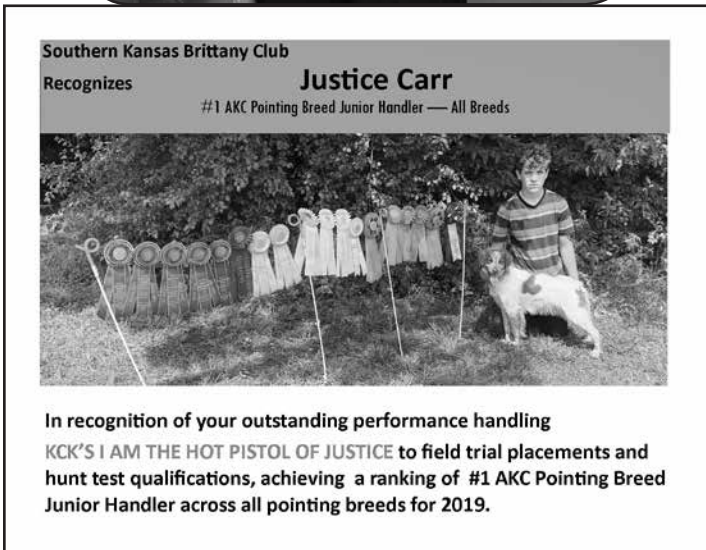
J- The same.
