



2017 ABC HALL OF FAME DOG

DC/AFC/NBOB Jayhawker's Tequila With A Twist Owner(s): Jessica Carlson Breeders: David & Annette Barton 2002-2014

Out of NFC DC AFC Tequila's Joker x Princes Haley II, Taryn was owned by Jessica Carlson. With a tremendous career of 47 field trial placements cut short at the age of 7 due to injury, she managed to compile an all-time record for females of 25 All Age hour placements. The quality of her wins was extraordinary. Twice she placed in the National Championship and twice she finished as runner-up in the Purina Dog of the Year Award, holding the lifetime accumulated points honor for a female. In addition to being the 2008 US Open Championship Runner-up, out of only three litters she produced TWO United States Open Championship winners (one of which also placed in the National Field Championship) and one who placed in the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship. She is also the grand dam of the 2015 Victorie Nationale winner.

Futurity Field

The Central Futurity was hosted by the Skyline Brittany Club. Thanks to the hard setup work and relentless diligence of Leslee Masolotte and her side kick Dawn Craig the American Brittany Club entrusted Skyline this important hosting task, which is so important to the future of the Breed. It was held on Monday March 11, 2019 at the picturesque South Republican Wildlife Area (SRWA) on the eastern plains of Colorado. Cold temperatures and snow the weekend before meant ice on the pond and plenty of moisture on the ground. The SRWA provides a great place for the handlers to showcase their young prospects. The All Age and Gun Dog courses are truly that in the way the terrain lays, with water available in most places. The All Age stake was done as an out and back, with timber on the east end and open prairie on the west. The Gun Dog event was a figure eight through the treed creek bottom. The event was held on the heels of the local Skyline clubs spring trial held on Saturday and Sunday. The weather on Monday was perfect. The temperatures were in the upper 20's, under a clear blue sky when the first brace broke away at 7:09. Skyline is fortunate to have many hard working club members. Denise Collins and Dawn Craig handled the secretary duties. Liz and Dave provided their fine field trial cuisine all weekend. Barry Keopke handled most of the dog wagon duties. Jim Austen, Dan Collins, Leslee and Jim Masolotte, Jeff Hoskins handled to host with duties required to make a trial run smoothly. Allen Davis and Kelly Porter marshaled and planted the bobwhites in all the right places.

Every dog had bird contact and many with multiple finds in both the All—Age the Gun Dog stakes. Seasoned and experienced professional trainer/handlers Bob Burchett, Steve Chang, and Rob Rohner were in attendance. Their support and sportsmanship was appreciated. Bob came loaded for bear taking 5 of the 8 placements. The ABC and Skyline appreciate the

several attendees who came from long distances, Julie Nelson Claypool and Mark Claypool came all the way from Illinois to watch their Nike win the Gun Dog. Dawn and Joe Droel from Minnesota watched their Charger get second in the Gun Dog and win the Dual Dog award. Staunch Futurity supporter Arlette Hennessey and Steve Crabb from Arizona won 3rd and 4th with their Blake and Re—Yo respectively.

As usually the case, strong genetics showed in the placements. In the All Age placements 2nd and 4th were littermates, with their half—brother winning 1st. The 3rd placement was from a very successful repeat breeding. In the Gun Dog our hotly contested Dual dog award went to the 2nd place dog pushed hard by the 1st place winner, placements 3rd and 4th were also littermates.

Gun Dog Futurity

Brace 1: Blake and Charger got busy and set the stage for the Gun Dog stake. Charger pointed first at 5 minutes into the brace. Both dogs worked the second bird together at the 9-minute mark. Charger went through the gate and worked around the clearing counterclockwise pointing at 14 minutes and again 3 minutes later. Blake was working and running hard and found another bird at 18 minutes. Two more stylish points were established by Charger before time ran out to make proof positive that he is a bird finding machine.

Brace 2: Charlie and Bobbi went to work in the second brace. Both dogs had 4 bird contacts throughout the brace. Charlie seemed to be a little unsure of the gallery at the breakaway but worked through it as time went on. Bobbi hunted hard and was bold to cross the creek but a little unsure of crossing it a second time to maintain a forward run with her handler.

Brace 3: Jackson and Crush combined for 5 bird contacts during their 30 minutes under judgment. Crush pointed first at 9 minutes again at 19 and 26 minutes. Jackson was busy but it took him until the 23-minute mark to find his first bird and establish point. He put his second bird in the air at 25 minutes.

Brace 4: Kintla and Nike hit the course in brace four and together put up quail 5 minutes into the brace. Both handlers fired, and we continued on. Nike had a nice point at 7 minutes then continued with a nice forward, aggressive race through the middle of the course. She established stylish points 3 more times in the last ten minutes. Kintla worked hard but didn't have the drive of the dogs that placed.

Brace 5: Re-Yo had the course to herself since there was an odd number of entries. Her first find at 6 minutes was impressive, a little off

course and she held it patiently while the handler got in position to flush the bird. Re—Yo hunted forward and did a good job of navigating the course. She established point 3 more time in her 30 minutes.

All Age Futurity

The All-Age was judged by Eldon Hongo and Gary Fromme. They gave their full attention to each brace and commented that there were five entries that could easily win most derby stakes.

Brace 1: Slick was a bird finding machine with 6 stylish well pointed finds. All the bird work kept him from showing the All—Age race the judges required even though his race is a very fast hard charging. Cinch broke away strong and was gone as we crossed through the gate. He came back in sight at the 6 1/2—minute mark. He made a retrieve of a cold quail that was a causality of the overnight temperatures. His next bird contact was another quail that he found but it wasn't fast enough to escape. Third contact was quick and the fourth was a nicely done point at around 15 minutes. Cinch is a nice moving, high on both ends type of dog.


Brace 2: Booster and Cruise broke away at 7:58 from the far end of the course in the open prairie. The stickers were problematic for Booster who had a slow start. He pointed at 16 minutes, had a stop to flush at 18 and a nice point at 19. Cruise liked the open prairie and made a nice first cast from the breakaway. Cruise moved hard, fast and handled well with bird pointed at 16 minutes with very good style.

Brace 3: Jack and Drake were the third pair under judgement with whistles sending them off at 8:40 am. Jack was the first to make bird contact at the 2 ½ minute mark, and another at 3 ½. Drake found his first bird at 6 minutes with a nice point and again at 9, and a third point at 12 ½. Drake went hunting hard after the third find but in the wrong direction. After some work by the handler he came back to the front and finished

forward. Jack made several nice powerful moves and then had a nice find at 27:30 in the small group of cottonwoods between the creek bottom.

Brace 4: A southerly breeze began as we broke away with the fourth brace made up of Spencer and Rebel at 9:25. Spencer was aggressively and smartly covering the open terrain of the west end of the course and pinned his first quail at 6 minutes. Spencer continued to move hard and fast forward. He was spotted well up front, on point along a tree line by judge Hongo at 18 ½ minutes. Spencer had finds three and four at the 24 and 29 minute mark. Looking good with a high head and tail. Rebel had two nicely pointed classy bird contacts during the second half of the brace. His race was consistently forward and hunted the cover well.

Brace 5: Moxie and Spinner were up for the final brace breaking away at 10 am. Moxie was

In the fifty's, sixty's and early seventy's, we were active in the Midwest Brittany Club. I served several years as Secretary, Treasurer and some more as President of the Club. In all this time we have had one or more Brittanys, but only our first one was of field trial caliber. I take some of that back as I had Joshua de Lamont, but lost him as a young all-age, at the St. Louis trial, car hit him out on the highway. He had his Puppy and Derby points so may have been a good one.

We retired in 1972, so last winter I decided to try writing about our first Brittany and some of the experiences we had with her and getting started in field trials. I happened to mention to La Reine Pittman what I was doing and she suggested that I send it to you. She hasn't seen it in fact no one has. It is not finished but if not suitable for the Magazine, not much use in my spending any more time on it. Many things may be wrong, I know it is quite amateurish, may be too long, maybe actual peoples' names should not be mentioned. You will know all these things.

I have in mind to go into the turning her over to a Professional Trainer and Hander, after she won her first points at the Ringneck Trial without any formal training. Also our experiences at the Nationals, when she placed second in the Amateur, over 50 entries and in a pouring rain. A very funny happening at same trial when Ann White ran her in the Ladies Handler State and won.

Enclosing a copy of her Field Trial Record, not as extensive as many other Brittanys, but she was not campaigned heavily, and I hunted her every hunting season. I have one regret, I didn't want to give up the time for her to have puppies, so did not breed her until almost six years of age, apparently I waited too long.

A Halloween Spook For Christmas

This one was different. I had been watching her form some time and I noticed that she seemed reserved, or aloof may be a better description. She was not shy or timid, but not a pushover, either. She was mixing it up with a wild and woolly crowd. They were all eating and drinking heavily and flights were breaking out among certain individuals. The one I was interested in had a dainty, feminine figure, with dark brown eyes and freckles on her nose. Her coat was dark red, trimmed in white. After a while I decided that I might just as well get to know her better, so I took her in my arms. She resisted at first, but soon relaxed and reached up and kissed me on the cheek. It was real puppy love. Translating the above, I had just picked my first Brittany puppy out of a litter of twelve. This all came about when my

wife, Ruby, innocently asked me what I wanted for Christmas. I have no idea why I wanted a Brittany. I knew nothing of field trials or bench shows, but I liked to hunt quail and pheasants but mostly I was a golfaholic. I had a real nice English Pointer female, and I knew that I had a bad habit of doing weir things when a dog would go on point. I shake, my voice changes, my glasses fog up and I have been known to fire the gun before the birds flush or fail to fire it at all. Funny thing, but I have never completely gotten over it. We knew some people with Brittanys, Neil Kelly, a neighbor and a charger member of the Midwest Brittany Club, but I didn't get charged up about Brittanys until I saw a litter of twelve puppies belonging to Carl and Dorothy Carlson. The dam of these puppies was K-Haven's Daisy May, she was a Bench Champion and looked the part. Clear white and orange and they kept her in show condition most of the time. The puppies received the same care and attention and I made up my mind to have one out of her next litter since these were all spoken for. Daisy May obliged with another litter of twelve, sired by Bill Ackerman's Skippy Allamuchy Luke, who later became a Dual Champion. We soon discovered that our new puppy was quite precocious and staying in the pen with the pointer was not for as she liked being in our house. She became very attached to Ruby and was very protective where Ruby was concerned. House breaking was no problem and she very seldom barked or made a nuisance of herself in any way. However, we were having trouble with a name until Ruby's brother Jim, noting her reluctance to make up with strangers, said, "She is right down spooky." We both said, "That's it." So Spook became her name. The Halloween part was added later when it came time to have her registered with AKC. She was very calm, even as a puppy, lying quietly in the back seat of the car when on a hunting trip or going to a field trial but a bundle of energy once down in the field. I soon found out that she would honor any other dog on point, with intensity, and that she loved to retrieve. She was also very independent in the field, paying no attention to another dog, unless the other dog was on point. I had very little experience with bird dogs and knew nothing about training one. But I recognized that as I said before, this one was different. I had very little time for her that first summer, being in the grain business and big wheat crop in Kansas. Something did happen that summer, however. Some friends and I went out to a farm pond to swim. I took Spook along to get her used to going into the water as she seemed reluctant to go in on her own. We also took along a case of blue rock targets, a hand trap, shotguns and shells. After the swim we started doing some target practice.

Tracking

If the world were perfect an all of us with it, every shot we take would bring down a bird cleanly. Yeah. Not likely. No matter how good a shot we are, there will be birds that come down wounded and far from dead. How many times has a big Kansas rooster folded up and landed in a heap and you know it is without question stone dead, and you get to where it fell only to find it has somehow resurrected itself and disappeared? Or a ruffed grouse that hit the ground hard has somehow gone missing and found a hollow tree stump to hide in?

An oft-neglected part of a dog's training is learning how to deal with finding cripples and dead birds. This includes tracking them down and hopefully retrieving them to hand. Whether or not you want your dog to retrieve to hand is a choice only you can make. We prefer it for several reasons. First, especially with a crippled bird, you stand a better chance of recovery if your dog is on the bird fast rather than your having to walk out to the area of the fall and search for it. Second, a dog that doesn't retrieve will usually find the bird and point it again, sometimes over and over as the bird keeps moving. This can have the effect of pushing the bird to move again if it able, meaning it takes longer to end up in our game bag, which delays the hunt. Third, a dog that's not trained to retrieve to hand will sometimes get so excited by a fluttering, downed bird that he will grab at it, chomp on it, and play with it rather than picking it up and bringing it to hand. That's one bird that won't be fit for the table.

If we encourage the dog to retrieve at a young age, it sure makes working crippled birds easier. A dog that has been taught to never touch a bird will have a harder time because he believes the only thing he is allowed to do with birds is find and point them, alive or dead. Taking advantage of a puppy's desire to chase and retrieve pays big benefits down the road.

One thing that's a huge benefit for young dogs is to make one of the first birds you shoot for them in a controlled training environment be a "cripple." That's hard to replicate if you're trying to handle the dog and shoot the bird without killing it, even if you're a great shot. What works well is setting up a simulated cripple situation by using a remote launcher loaded with a bird with the flight feathers pulled on one wing. The dog gets to work the field and point the bird while you control the situation, preferably on a checkcord. That means making sure the dog isn't standing right over the bird or too close to the launcher.

When you've got the dog where you want him, launch the bird and shoot at the top of the flight arc. The bird can only fly a short distance and will hit the ground. Release the dog and let him go to the bird, which will hopefully

flutter and try to escape. This creates excitement for the dog, and the best thing you can do is be quiet. If the dog already likes birds, he doesn't need a cheerleader to encourage him, and often your voice is more of a distraction than a help anyway. With any luck, the dog will pick up the bird, and you can reel the checkcord in for a retrieve.

At this point, take the bird and put the dog up for a few minutes. Now you can take advantage of that same bird to lay a bit of a track while the dog is resting in his crate or on the chain, where he can't see the field. Dispatch the bird quickly, snap the checkcord around two legs, and walk to a different area of the field (your dog is likely to return to the recent fun spot and that's counterproductive). Place the bird on the ground and drag it through the cover making sure it's not heavy brush or too difficult; tall grass is ideal. What we want is to leave a scent trail for the dog to follow, since a dead bird will have a different smell than a live one. Starting without about a 30-yard track is good. Unsnap your checkcord, leave the bird, and go get your dog and shotgun.

The plan is to pretend you're hunting for a new bird. If you know with certainty that your dog will make a retrieve and won't maul or grab the bird and run off with it, you don't need the checkcord. If you're not sure, leave it on and let the dog drag it. The last thing you want is for the excitement to turn into a game of keepaway. Don't walk your dog directly to the area where you left the planted bird. Instead, work the field in a different direction – you want to set up a shot situation where the dog is, say, hunting to our left and we pretend an imaginary bird just flushed to our right and the is shot while the dog isn't looking. This is, of course, assuming your dog is well-accustomed to gunfire.

When the shot is fired, make sure the barrel is pointing in the general direction of your planted bird.

Dogs tend to learn pretty quickly to cue off the direction your shotgun is pointing, so help them out from the start by holding the barrel steady and pointing toward the area where the bird is for a few seconds after the shot. Most dogs are going to look up and head toward you. When your dog does, move slightly in the direction of the bird but again, don't lead him into it. It's important to give him a chance to use his nose and figure out there's a bird in there.

Take your time. There is no rush. Your dog might put his nose o the ground a follow a track slowly and deliberately; or he might keep his head up and use the air more than the ground, not following the exact trail you laid. Either way is fine; the important point is that the dog should show you some excitement and act a bid birdy (we're talking about hunting here, not competition or test venues). If all goes according to plan, your dog will get to the bird and either pick it up or hesitate and point it; and if your dog does retrieve, encourage him to do so.


The last element we have to add is the scent of blood. You can use that same bird along with the same routine as before, with your dog put up for a few minutes (and be sure to give him some water; this tracking business is thirsty work, and dogs can smell better when they're well-hydrated and not dry.) This time, use your pocket knife or similar and slit the bird open in a spot or

two so there can be a blood trail. Drag the bird as before and allow the dog to work the scent. Be careful, as it's not uncommon for dogs to get pretty excited about a bloody bird; you need to have enough control that they don't decide to have a snack!

When this is working well, plan a session or two in heavier cover with longer tracks. And when your dog is getting the hang of it, which usually happens pretty quickly, add a simple, single verbal command to let your dog know there's a bird down. Keep it simple, something like dead or dead bird, and say it once or twice at the start; then be quiet and let your dog work. The more you say, "Dead bird, dead, hunt it up, come on, let's go, find your bird!" over and over, the more you distract your dog from the job at hand.

What we wouldn't give to spend just five minutes with a dog's nose. To know how keen that sense of smell is, and what that is like to our dogs...it would be amazing to understand. They are all born with this wonderful ability to use that nose for us, and we owe it to them to give them every opportunity to develop that talent.

AKC Delegate Report from June 2019 Meeting

My first delegate meeting was held in June in Newark, NJ. Sunday evening I attended a breed and club sustainability meeting. The regular head of this group was not in attendance so the alternate ran the meeting. I took away little from this meeting but will again attend when the regular head of this group is running the meeting. It was discussed that each parent club should have a Breeder Ed group as well as the Judges Ed group. It also discussed that the Parent Clubs reach out to any AKC title holder that is not a current member of a regional club and encourage them to join a club near them.

Monday was all committee meetings throughout the day. I attended the Field Trail/Hunt Test committee as well as the Crop/Dock committee and the Parent Club committee.

The crop and dock committee discussed issues that are being handled by the AKC. As of right now each movement in legislature is handled on a state by state basis. If you have any indication of suggested legislature coming up in your state, contact the AKC Government Relations Department to notify them if they are already not aware. Currently they are actively working in New York State.

There was a very informative presentation by Sheila Goff on legislative issues. In this past fiscal year 2100 pieces of legislation affecting dog ownership was presented with 145 of them implemented by State and Federal government agencies. She said to beware of legislation that defines "Hobby Breeders" which can be regulated on.

The AKC is also very aware of the retaliations against breeders by other organizations. AKC has a task force working on a portal for notifying AKC if you feel you are being retaliated against by the end of the summer.

There was discussion on the importation of dogs for sale by rescue agencies. There are 4 agencies involved in the import process. AKC agrees there needs to be changes in the import process and will be working on that with the other 4 agencies involved.

There are major changes coming to the "Service Dog" rules that will be out around Oct 1. 2019. AKC is working with the hospitality, hotel and airline industries to come up with new rules for Service Dogs so stay tuned.

Tuesday was the general delegate membership meeting. Doug Ljungren presented "The State of the Sport." He outlined the findings of each category and how entries were doing in each. Confirmation is holding steady with some increase in some regions. FT/HT and Obedience entries are down. The highest participation events are now CAT and FAST CAT with Fast CAT being the highest growth area. Tracking events are also high entry events. Rally entries are up slightly.

There were some changes made to the Dog Show Rules as well as Field Trial changes for retrieving dogs and voted in by the membership.

Next AKC Delegate meeting will be held in September.

I was a professional handler from 1979 until 2015 and a member of the Professional Handlers' Association. I was inducted into the Professional Handlers' Association Hall of Fame in 2015. I am proud to say that during that time, I handled many of the top field trial dogs to their conformation championships to become Dual Champions!

In April 2015, I received my AKC judges license. I am currently approved for the Sporting Group, Dachshunds, 21 Herding Breeds, Miscellaneous, Junior Showmanship and Best In Show.

Thank you all so much for the opportunity to judge the 2019 ABC National....it is an honor and a privilege!

I've been in love with dogs and horses as long as I can remember, and when I saw Junior Showmanship at my first dog show in 1986, I decided I wanted to do that! My first dog was a Rottweiler that was a wonderful pet, got me from Novice to Open in juniors and earned her CD in obedience. I got my first Brittany from Naomi Rigas in 1988. "Chelsea" became my first show champion, the first dog I earned a Best Junior Handler award with, and my foundation dam.

DC/AFC Jayhawker Tequila With A Twist took me full-bore into the field trial game, and through her I met her sire's owner Ed Tillson, who is now a professional field trainer and in 2017 also became my husband. "Taryn" accomplished more than I could have dreamed for her, proving herself a national-level contender in both field and show, winning the ABC National Dual Award twice and becoming the only Dual Champion bitch to ever win the ABC National Specialty Show. Above all, she was my "heart dog", the best and brightest I have ever had the privilege to call my own.

Amateur Walking Shooting Championship

The Amateur Walking Shooting Dog Championship, which has found difficulty attracting participants, was held with eight entries due to some last—minute withdrawals. The AWSD Championship was judged by long—time Brittany competitor and experienced judge Paul Renius and sought—after judge Will Langley, both from Michigan. It was run on the south side of Course 2 rather than Course 3 due to mowing constraints last fall. While the stake was small, the quality of the champion's performance was exceptional. However, due to persistently low entries, this stake will not be offered in 2020.

FC AFC KDel's Eagle's Chance to Soar, owned and handled by Ken Delong from Michigan, resoundingly won the stake. Coming off her recent win at the New England Brittany Grouse and Woodcock Championship, Chancey broke away hard to the front and moved through the thick bottom objectives for the first 15 minutes. When the course opened up, so did she. Carding six finds, she even remained staunch in one case as her brace mate moved in front of her and was leashed. Another of her finds was intently handled with her front legs up on a log while the handler flushed both a cottontail and a subsequent quail. Finishing to the front, it was clear she had a championship hour.

FC AFC Hy Steppin Libby's Liebling owned and handled by Chris Sennott garnered the runner—up spot. Breaking away in the second brace, she ran a consistently forward race at a range pleasing for a foot handler. Her efforts were rewarded with woodcock find for her first bird encounter. Finds two and third were single quail, and she finished the hour with a covey find. Both judges commented that the quality of Libby's bird work was exceptional.

Once again, FC AFC Bark River Queen of Diamond, Daisy, run by Jeff Stanton, was a strong contender but unfortunately got out of pocket near the end after carding clean finds. None of the other dogs in the stake had successful bird work outcomes.



Introduction to the Brittany: CONDITIONING YOUR BRITTANY

The Brittany is a bird dog and an athlete. In order to perform in the field—hunting or field trials—a Brittany must be in excellent physical shape. Too often people expect their dogs to hunt half a day in temperatures that exceed 70° F. Do not hunt your dog in such weather unless he has been conditioned. If your dog is out of shape, begin gradually to condition him and don't have unrealistic expectations for an older dog.

In conditioning your dog, you must learn to "read" him—be sensitive to his needs. Being aware of your dog's needs is most important during hot weather. Be sure that you water him early and often. Depending on the weather conditions of your area, you may want to use electric clippers to shave his coat, or you may take him to a dog grooming shop and ask them to give him a "field cut"—a short cut appropriate to the weather conditions of the area.

To hunt birds, a hunting dog needs to be able to work in the uplands for several hours at a time. During the summer months before the fall bird season, the best way to condition a dog is to "road" him—letting him pull in a harness, which is attached, to a moving vehicle (such as an ATV, bicycle, sled, and so forth) or to a horse. Start the dog with ten to fifteen minute sessions twice a week. Then at regular intervals increase the conditioning sessions to every other day. Follow with a gradual increase in the amount of time for each session to thirty or forty minutes.

If you do not have a vehicle or horse for roading your dog, you can condition him by walking him in a roading

harness on a check-cord and attaching a length of chain or cable to the roading harness. Use a chain only when you are roading on a smooth surface, such as level ground or a

paved area. The chain should weigh about 5 lbs., and the cable should weight about 3 lbs. and be 8 to 10 ft. long. Because this additional weight increases the stress on your dog, you should reduce the time of the workout

When preparing for a field trial—depending on weather conditions—it is suggested that the following conditioning process be used:

- Road from one to one-and-a-half hours every other day
- Vary the time of day for roading
- Lay-up (stop conditioning) two days before the trial
- When conditioning in the summer, do not overdue it—varying the conditioning to the temperature, doing less conditioning during extremely hot weather.





Versatile Brittanys in Action

Ever seen a new agility dog run around the ring with the zoomies, instead of taking the obstacles directed? Or suffered through constant barking at dog events? Across dogsports disciplines, many dogs struggle to disengage from the environment, unable to work in the presence of distractions like traffic, and loud noises.



Stress and Stressors

Stress is the body's reaction to changes, and it's a normal part of daily life. Our bodies react to changes with physical, mental and emotional adjustments. Stressors (aka triggers) are the things in the environment that cause stress. Stress can be positive (eustress) or negative (distress), depending on the subjective experience of the individual. For example, challenging scent detection searches can be stressful and motivational, requiring sustained effort to get past unproductive areas to find the source of target odor. But if you take a dog who is scared of traffic and ask him to search next to a highway, the distress he experiences may be demotivational.

To quote Roger Abrantes, "there is a difference between being stressed and stressed out. When we experience far too much stress, our body goes into an alarm mode where survival has the first and sole priority, and memory formation decreases". You're the only one who can set your dog up for success by controlling the environments where you train and compete, so pay concerted attention when you notice stressors.

- Common triggers in search environments frequently cause stress for dogs:
- traffic (movement and noises, such as backfiring or sirens)
- shiny floors e.g. school gyms or community centers
- small, enclosed, crowded spaces e.g. public washrooms
- unfamiliar people
- other dogs e.g. barking or playing with squeakers
- loud, unexpected noises such as gunfire
- unstable surfaces, e.g. slippery vinyl tent fabric
- extreme weather including wet/dry, and cold/hot, and
- heights and elevation, e.g. mesh stairs

Over time, some dogs build so much value for working with their handlers, their drive can overcome mild anxiety about the environment. At home, your dog may bark at every stranger in the street. But if he loves searching, he may not bark at strangers as often during searches. Dogs with even greater levels of anxiety and fear may not be able to search at all, demonstrating more severe signs of stress. Repeated exposures provoke fear and anxiety, and your dog won't be looking forward to searching as much as he could be.

How to Recognize When Your Dog is Stressed

So, how will you recognize when your dog is stressed? Some common signs of stress and anxiety you may observe include:

- Won't accept high value food or toy rewards
- No response or slow response to well-trained cues e.g. sit
- Avoids, backs away, leans, jumps, startles
- Stares at trigger with intense focus
- Sniffs the ground in the absence of scent
- Lip licking, repeated stretching, yawning, lifting a paw
- Taking treats harder than usual (nipping fingers or mouthing)
- Barking/wining and lunging
- Tail low, clamped between legs, touching abdomen
- Shaking, trembling, teeth chattering
- Scratching when not itchy
- Shaking body when not wet
- Rolls over and shows belly
- Flinches or skin crawls when touched
- Urinates or releases anal glands
- Freezes
- Loose diarrhea, or even
- Aggression such as snapping, growling, attempting to bite, or biting



Good judgment is required to determine when you observe those behaviors what underlying emotions may be present. For example, barking may be a happy, excited greeting of a loved one, not only a sign of anxiety or fear. (Note that physical illness may present early on as stress. If your dog has unexplained stress signs, visit your vet to rule out physical illness first.) But the more behaviors you see from this list, the greater the likelihood that the dog is experiencing stress.

How to Deal with Stressors

Having noticed a problem, intervene at the earliest signs of stress (higher up on the list) before behaviors escalate and dog is unable to cope. Move away from the trigger until distance is great enough that the dog is no longer stressed. If that's impossible, put a barrier between your dog and the stressor e.g. stand behind a wall or a car, where the dog feels safe.

Do not force your dog closer to the stressor. Do not correct your dog for barking or displaying other signs of stress. Corrections will backfire, because this increases the stress levels and anxiety. You want your dog to feel less stressed and more comfortable, not exacerbate an already difficult situation.

Once you're away from the situation, figure out which triggers are causing the stress, and make a plan for how to desensitize and counter condition your dog so you can change how the dog feels about the trigger. You may need help from a trainer who's experienced in applying those techniques effectively, especially if the stress is severe, you expect to encounter it again or aggression was present. To work through it, you'll need a systematic plan, patience, and time. You have to go at the dog's pace of learning to achieve lasting improvements. After all, dogsports are supposed to be fun.

In an upcoming article, we'll cover the basics of helping dogs who are mildly distracted when approached by a strange person during Canine Good Citizen (or Canine Good Neighbour) testing.

Slow-Cooker Beef Sliders with **Pickled Peppers**

- 1 (3 ¼- to 3 ¾-lb.) boneless chuck roast, trimmed
- 2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 ½ teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 medium-size sweet onion, coarsely chopped
- 2 carrots, coarsely chopped
- 4 celery ribs, coarsely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves
- 2 cups beef broth
- ½ cup dry red wine
- 4 fresh thyme sprigs
- 2 tablespoons prepared horseradish
- 1/4 cup loosely packed fresh flatleaf

parsley leaves, chopped ½ cup chopped fresh chives 16 hearty dinner rolls, split Pickled Peppers

Rub roast with salt and pepper. Cook in hot oil in a Dutch oven or large cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat 2 to 3 minutes on all sides until browned. Place roast, onion, and next 6 ingredients in a 6-qt. slow cooker. Cover and cook on HIGH 6 to

8 hours or until meat is tender. Remove roast and vegetables; discard vegetables. Shred meat. Pour liquid from slow cooker through a fine wire-mesh strainer into a 4-cup measuring

cup, and let stand about 15 minutes. Remove fat from cooking liquid, and discard. Stir together shredded meat, horseradish, next 2 ingredients, and 1 cup reserved cooking liquid; discard remaining liquid. Add salt and pepper to taste. Serve on rolls with Pickled Peppers.

French Onion Soup Casserole

¼ cup unsalted butter

- 5 medium Vidalia onions, thinly sliced (about 3 lb.)
- 2 teaspoons kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 3 thyme sprigs
- 2 flat-leaf parsley sprigs
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 (16-oz.) baguette, thinly sliced
- ¹/₃ cup all-purpose flour
- 3 cups reduced-sodium beef broth ½ cup sherry
- 8 ounces Gruyère cheese, shredded (about 2 cups)
- 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves

Melt butter in a Dutch oven over mediumlow; add onions, salt, pepper, thyme and parsley sprigs, and bay leaves; cook, stirring often, until onions are golden brown, about 1 hour. Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350°F. Arrange baguette slices in a single layer on a baking sheet. Bake in preheated oven until lightly toasted, 12 minutes. Set aside. Remove and discard thyme and parsley sprigs and bay leaves from onion mixture. Add flour, and cook, stirring constantly, 2 minutes. Add broth and sherry; bring to a boil over high. Boil, stirring constantly, until slightly thickened, 2 to 3 minutes. Layer half of the toasted baguette slices in a 13- x 9- inch baking dish. Spoon onion mixture evenly over bread. Top evenly with remaining baguette slices. Sprinkle with cheese; cover with aluminum foil. Bake in preheated oven 30 minutes. Increase heat to broil.



Remove foil; broil until cheese is

bubbly, about 3 minutes. Sprinkle

with thyme leaves. Serves 6




