The Minnesota Brittany club hosted the 2020 Central Futurity after a postponement from the Spring due to Covid closings. The show was held September 25 at the Fairgrounds in Afton, Iowa. The field events were held September 28 at the grounds in Thayer, Iowa

The weather for our days was pleasant for both people and dogs. The show took place Friday evening after the Iowa Specialty with 26 dogs for our judge, Amy Gau, to evaluate. She has judged all over the world and enjoys watching good dogs. Amy is very thorough and has a soft hand with the dogs. After going over the ten males, she chose for her 1st Money Male, the white and liver Bantam's Bold Vision 'Gus' from the Intermediate Class, owned by the Hedstrom's and Mike Magnuson and handled by Diane. Her 2nd Money Male, Two River's Heart of Gold, came from the same class and is owned by Sadye Cotton and Mathew Dudney who handled him. 3rd Money Male came from the Junior class, Sovereign's Notjustabirdog owned by the Droel's and handled by Dawn.

From the 16 female entrants, Amy's 1st Money came from the senior class - the orange & white Sovereign's Glitter and Grease 'Tinker' owned by Jake Droel and Dawn(handler) and Joe. The next two money winners came from the Junior class and were, 2nd Money Caliah's Katie Crossed the Creek shown by Rose Leale for Jo Zito and Cherie Jones who were there from Texas to watch their girl, and 3rd Money Sovereign's Dark Chocolate owed by the Van Allen's and the Droel's handled by Joe.

The coveted Best in Futurity went to Tinker, with Gus as Best of Opposite.

Monday began with the All Age on the south course with 9 entrants for Bruce Heiter and Cindy Findley to watch; followed by 17 Gun Dogs with Sam Thompson and Kelli Aitken judging. Except for a strong wind, the weather was beautiful.

The event saw some very good dogs that are sure to go on to excellent careers for their owners. Running the event in the fall when many of these dogs are in the process of being broke brought challenges that would not have been seen at the spring event; so we were very pleased so many owners still chose to enter the stake knowing drawbacks in training were a possibility. It's interesting to note that of the fourteen money winners all colors were represented – seven orange, five liver, and two roans.

All six money winners in the show competed in the field. The dog that captured the much sought after Dual Dog Award was Caliah's Katie Crossed The Creek. Congratulations to her owners and show handler who made the long trip from Texas, and to her field handler Jon St Clair.

2020 Central Gun Dog Futurity

Brace 1: Sovereign's Dark Chocolate (Cocoa Bean) - Droel/b Droel, and Two River's Heart of Gold (Charlie) - Cotton/b Herzberg. Broke away at 11:14. Bean had a stop to flush at 7 in the line by the keyhole. They had a divided find at 20 on a small covey, with Charlie the first to establish point. At 25 both dogs went on point and had birds at the draw below the keyhole. Both dogs handled nicely, Charlie was the stronger of the two, staying forward and taking edges.

Brace 2: Red Granite's Bad Moon Rising (Moon) – Boettcher/b Boettcher, and Dr Jac's Sweet As Molasses (Nellie) – Swanson/b Fjeld. Broke away at 11:50. Moon handled kindly, running a short gun dog race, and her application was less consistent. She had a back at 20. Nellie had 4 finds, the first in feed strip after the keyhole, and the rest in the draws after the hay field. She had very nice style on point, hunted

hard, and had a more lateral pattern than the placing dogs.

Brace 3: Bantam's Bold Vision (Gus) – Hedstrom/b Fjeld, and Two River's Lone Ranger (Ranger) – Cotton/b Herzberg. Broke away at 12:32. Both dogs had a strong break away. Ranger had Point at 6 in a draw before the keyhole. He was reluctant to leave the area, and when Sadie finally got him forward, he pointed at the keyhole at 10. Ranger was again hard to get forward, getting stuck in the tree line with multiple bird contacts. Gus continued forward, and had a broke find a 9. He then got hung up for a while in the trees to the left after the keyhole. Diane got him back on track and both dogs pointed at 24. After the find, Gus showed his 'independence' and again decided to go his own way to finish the brace. Both dogs showed potential but weren't able to put it all together today.

Brace 4: Diamond Hill Magnum Martini (Lizzy) – Pollock/b O'Donnell, and Rebel flame Victory Bullet (Tori) – Tyson/b Fjeld. Broke away at 4:30. Tori had a find at 7 at the keyhole, with Lizzy backing. Lisa elected to pick Lizzy up at that point. Tori had finds at 22 in the draw after the hay field, and 26 at the bottom of the keyhole. She ran a moderate forward race, with good application, and handled kindly.

Brace 5: Sovereign's Glitter and Grease (Tinker) – Burchett/b Droel, and Caliah's Katie Crossed The Creek (Katie) - St Clair/b Stysma. Broke away after lunch break. Both dogs had a find at 7 at the keyhole, with Katie getting there first. Tinker had nice style & good manners on birds, showed fair range, but checked in frequently, and tired at the end. Katie continued with a strong forward race at good range, hitting all the right objectives. She had a second find at 17, the only dog in the stake to point on the line along the draw after the hayfield. Katie looked good on her birds and had a strong finish.

Brace 6: Red Granite's Ramble On Rose (Rosie) – Burg/b Boettcher, and Anna B Rose A Thumb To The Eye (Butch) – Tyson/b Massoglia. Broke away at 1:15. We had the pleasure of watching junior handler Izzy Burg running Rosie. Both dogs started forward at moderate range. While off to a moderate start, Rosie and Izzy had finds at 20 & 29, they improved throughout the brace, and finished as competitors in the stake. Butch had a find in the keyhole at 7, and again at 18 & 20 minutes. He had good application, intensity, and handle, but lacked the style of our placing dogs.

Brace 7: Bantam's Two Rivers Legacy (Dreamer) – Cotton/b Pinkosky, and Frosty Meadows Hightail Golden Nugget (Gypsy) – Summerlin/b Eberhart. Broke away at 2:00. Dreamer put down a nice run, showing good range and going to the right places. Gypsy handled well, at moderate range. Unfortunately, both dogs went birdless.

Brace 8: Sovereign's Notjustabirdog (Champ) – Burchett/b Droel, and American-Soaring-Feather (Feather) – Ross/b Ross. Broke away at 3:52. Feather had finds at 15 & 16 at the draw after the hayfield, and at 22 with Champ at the lower end of the keyhole tree line. She put down a nice moderate race, handled kindly, and had good bird work. Champ had a find at 2, 7 at the keyhole, 22 with Feather and another at 24. Champ showed good independence, had some very strong forward moves, and style on birds. He was hindered by an attraction to his brace mate at various times throughout the brace.

Brace 9: Red Granite's All The Gold In California (Lulu), Asmus/b Boettcher and BYE. Broke away at 5:05. Lulu had bird contact at 1, and then at the keyhole at 6. We found her standing in the draw between the hay field and keyhole at 20, for her third find. She was a lot of fun to watch, very animated, staying forward with good ground speed, range and application, just not quite as much reach as our #1 dog.

Stash made some nice moves exhibiting more of a Gun Dog range and pace with Belle making All-Age type moves working fast and forward; finishing most of what she started. Belle was going away at time earning her 4th place.

Brace 2: Diamond Hill Dangerous Odds (Whit) – Pollock/b Pollock, and Red Granite's Henry Will Be A Star (Henry) – Bakas/b Boettcher. Whit ran well taking a while to get rolling making nice moves once he did. He stood 4 times with beautiful style on his game and maintained a consistent speed and range during his brace. Henry was fast and forward, displaying All-Age range and speed from start to finish. He got right to work and showed forward each time he was out of sight. Henry had 2 nice finds and his efforts earned him 2nd place.

Brace 4: Spanish Dancer (Sassy) – Myers/b Eberhart, and TNT's Nymph in Harem Pants (Jazz) – Burchett/b Thomas. This pair broke away in true All-Age fashion, far flung with speed and purpose. Each dog exhibited nice style on each of their 2 finds, making nice moves to arrive at each. Sassy had a stop to flush and a more finished application by completing almost all the moves she initiated, which earned her 1st place. Jazz went out of pocket after her 2nd find appearing from the cornfield with her scout, placing 3rd for her run.

Brace 5: Turning Points Like A Rock (Seger) – Burchett/b Nelson, and Diamond Hills Dangerous Dark Side (Borden) – Pollock/b O'Donell. Seger and Borden broke away strong

Radio Telemetry In Regards to American Woodcock

A VHF radio telemetry system (Very High Frequency) is made up of three components: a yagi/antenna, a transmitter, and a receiver. There are several variations for this equipment which allow telemetry to be performed for countless different species. The URI American Woodcock study utilized the following system: a three element folding yagi, a R2000 receiver, and transmitters that are attached to each bird.

When conducting radio telemetry, the yagi is used to locate a radio signal. This signal is given off by the transmitter, and comes in the form of an electromagnetic wave. The transmitter can be fixed to an animal using either a collar or backpack. This study in particular uses backpack transmitters for adult male and female woodcock, and collars for chicks. Each transmitter has a unique frequency that allows you to identify and track the location of a specific individual.



To do this, a receiver is

attached to the yagi, and the frequency of the target individual is programmed into the receiver. Once you are in range of the bird, a “beeping” sound will be emitted from the receiver. As you move closer to the bird, the volume of the signal will increase.

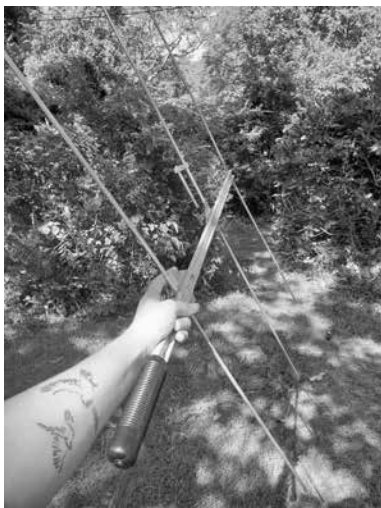
In this URI study, birds were tracked until spotted to confirm an accurate point. Coordinates (latitude and longitude), time, date, and site are all recorded for further analysis. In instances where the bird is inaccessible (i.e. deep in a swamp with high water) triangulation can be used. Triangulation is a method used to estimate the location of a transmitted woodcock. To do this, you take a bearing using a compass in the direction where the signal sounds the loudest as well as a GPS location of where you are standing. This is done in three different locations, and then drawn on a map or entered into a software such as



Program R, which will show where the three bearings intersect. This point of intersection determines the estimated coordinates of the bird.

Radio telemetry helps collect valuable data, however, there are some drawbacks. Because the basic function of the transmitter is to send electromagnetic waves to the receiver, many things can block the signal's course and in turn make it difficult to

find. This is commonly referred to as ‘bounce’. Things like rocks, water, trees, hills, and valleys can alter the direction of the signal and make it tricky to pinpoint the correct direction to follow. One easy way to combat bounce is to listen for a signal from a higher vantage point or an area clear of vegetation to avoid obstruction. Interference is another issue that can be difficult to resolve. Interference is when the receiver picks up another signal that causes lots of static and makes the beep difficult to hear. Things that can cause interference include telephone wires, cars, and personal wireless devices. Sometimes moving your position can help reduce static until you are able to determine the correct direction of/to travel.



Radio Telemetry is a lot of hard work. It can be a time-consuming process to locate each bird, however, it is worth the effort to get accurate location and survival information. The goal outcome of this project is to provide reliable data that will best inform where to create and manage suitable habitat in the state of RI that will sustain and encourage the native population of woodcock to grow.

The Western Brittany Shooting Dog Championship is normally held in the spring when temperatures are cool and scenting conditions are best. However, this year the Covid 19 pandemic resulted in its cancellation. Rather than give up on a 2020 championship, the Oregon Brittany Club decided to run it in conjunction with our regularly scheduled Labor Day trial.

As expected, the temperatures were high, and the grounds were crispy-dry. Thus, scenting conditions were far from ideal. With an entry of 13 dogs, we decided to take advantage of the cooler morning air and run four braces on Monday and three on Tuesday -- each day finishing by noon. This proved very fortuitous, as a strong east wind with gusts approaching 60 mph came through on Monday afternoon. Had we been running; this would have stopped us. This was the same wind event that blew up all the fires on the west side of the Cascades in Oregon and resulted in historic loss of life and property to west-side communities.

In Madras, the winds died overnight, and Tuesday's running was with clear skies, cool

Brace 1. We kicked off Monday morning at 7:30 AM. Christie's I'm a Jakester (Jake), handled by Steve Ball was braced with Leona Valley's Sonny Red Side Up (Red), handled by Paul Doiron. Both dogs started by quartering into a north breeze, staying forward with good ground speed. Red had a nonproductive at 12. Jake was standing at 19 and Red came in upwind and pointed the same bird. Red was picked up for a failure to honor. Jake went on with a nice forward run and four finds, all of which he handled well.

Brace 2. Zip's Moondance Kid (Skeeter), handled by Larry Sandusky was braced with Quail Rock Too Tough (Duke II), handled by Paul Doiron. Both dogs broke to the front strongly but began quartering into the north wind. Duke II appeared overly cautious, inspecting closely every bitterbrush clump. He finished with one bird at time but with two non-productives. Skeeter had a moment of indiscretion at 30, chased a bird and ended her run.

At about 35, Breezy pointed a bird in a juniper and Letti had a gorgeous medium-distance honor. At 48, Letti unfortunately laid down when a bird was flushed over her, ending her run. At time, Breezy had one find too many and aggressively marked, taking several steps forward. Breezy finished strong to the front but she did not need that last bird, which proved to be her undoing.

Brace 5 started Tuesday morning after the very windy Monday afternoon. High Lonesome Bowden Hills (Bo), handled by Jim Hammett was braced with Blazing Spanish Bella (Bella), handled by Gerald Barron. Both dogs had aggressive runs to the front until about 28 when Bo ran over a bird and gave chase. At approximately the same time, Bella had a find but self-relocated four or five steps forward while her handler attempted to find the bird.

a great forward race clocking 5 finds each with great style. She finished almost as strongly as she started and was a pleasure to watch. Allie also had a very forward race but became looser with each flush and on the last flush moved forward several steps before being picked up and growled at by Paul.

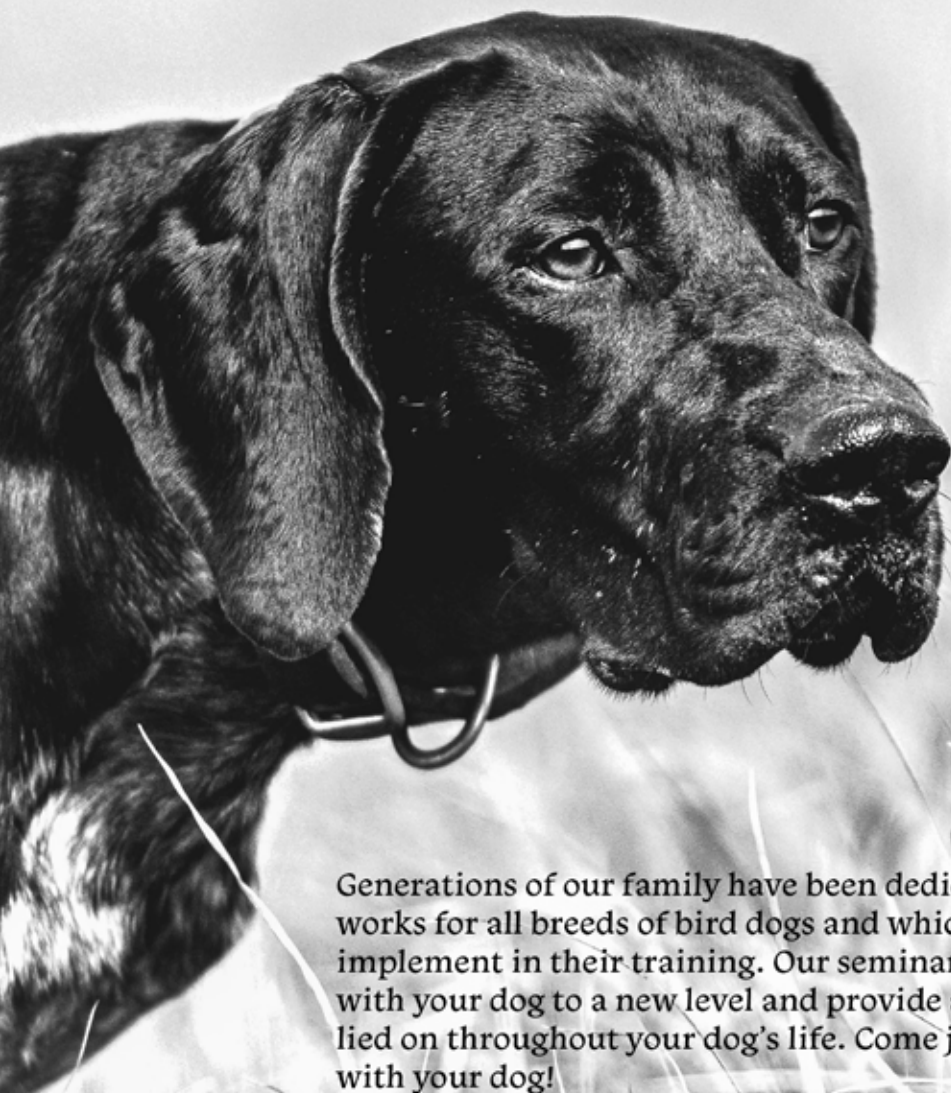

His word carries a lot of weight and in this case proved to be a prophesy.

This rental horse I was riding all day long, had me "brain washed"—almost to the point of robbing banks in California. I named him Pile Driver for that's the way he insisted in putting each foot down. The wrangler had been truthful when he told me, "He ain't no Tennessee Walker". Fort Carson, by the same token, is no southern plantation. The grounds here are not comparable to the Delta, but they will sure try a bird dog. Trying bird dogs is what this story is all about.

Silence, and then the breakaway. Sally running in a frenzy to find birds couldn't resist the temptation, she cast far to the left side over to the area of the previous all-age call back. She worked through this objective and then returned to the front. She seemed apologetic and although running at good speed, her head was turned back looking to Samuels, he bellowed, "Alright, Sally" and from this simple gruff command Sally understood forgiveness, encouragement, and affection. Sally took three big jumps to show her sheer joy, plus four more to gain ground speed, Then she planed out over the grassland, spellbinding all and leaving them breathless.

The gallery was bunched up close for the thrills were running up their back and the hair was standing on their heads. Some of the older trailers were holding out for more. They had seen dogs give everything in five or ten minutes and then burn out like a spent rocket. Apparently Sally was not burning out for the pitch of her wild search was getting

higher and higher.

Now, the gallery had become one. Gone were all thoughts of competition. Each was identifying with Sally and her race had become a drama. A drama of courage against time, space, heat, cactus, inertia in general. There was a general feeling of closeness and comradeship among the gallery. I wondered if the quail feel this when they covey or wild geese when they fly in formation through the sky.

Sally froze, at the deep ditch bank facing a heavy thicket, a long way ahead. We rode toward her as a tall grey form emerged from the ditch and a warning was shouted "Deer." Closer observation proved it to be a large coyote, walking stiff legged. Samuels called, "Come" and Sally came directly to heel. He kept her at heel a moment as we circled the dam then sent her straight west.

By the time we cleared the dam, Sally was rolling way out to the front. As we rode from the shadows of the dam into the setting sun we were blinded and each in his own way—some hold up hats and arms tried to look under to see her. No one could locate Sally as we rode on until Hobby, with a big smile of satisfaction yelled "I've got her!" His word on bird dogs on the western plains is gospel but no one would consider asking "Where?" Finally one asked and Hobby said, "Look out by the old fence line about one o'clock." We rode a few moments, it seemed like ages, then he added, "Don't look for a dog, the land drops off there, look for a small cloud of dust."

Now the whole gallery came in like coon dogs opening on a trail. "Got her", "That's Her", Yes, I see her now", "She's crossing from one o'clock to eleven," Yes, siree!", "Look at her go!" I saw her also, and now with a simple black silhouette against the red sun. I discovered what I thought to be the key to Sally's great achievements. Which each jump she bent into a perfect small circle and when she landed her hind legs were reaching far out in front of her head. Jump, coil, land, uncoil. Jump, coil, land, uncoil. Jump, coil, land, uncoil. A mumble started among the gallery bringing me out of the hypnosis of rhythm. Why is she line running? Why isn't she working the wind? Then came the answer. "Sally's out twice that far, checking the plum trees on the southeast edge of the course." All eyes flashed to Hobby. His smile was as big as before. "Just a big Colorado Jack – I was fooling

you dudes.”

Some great handlers now in the field trial Hall of Fame had the ability to “wish” a dog around the course. May be Samuels was doing some of this as he piloted Sally and if I know him, praying a little, and once in a while just hanging in there.

We approached the bird field with apprehension. Would a for-real bird dog driven by such desire and keyed up to the point of no return be able to control herself when at last faced with an abundance of birds? Our anxieties were not justified for Sally worked the bird field to perfection. On her third find over in the corner near the gallery, the silver haired judge, leaning over to look under Samuels’ western hat as he was trying to produce the bird, said, “Reckon she’s part bird dog?” Samuels booted out the bird and fired.

All during this performance a question of what drives Sally? What is her “pay off?” ran through my mind. On this third bird I found the answer. When Samuels flushed the bird it flew toward the gallery. Sally’s eyes were ablaze as she watched it fly away. No desire to chase, just pure ecstasy in watching, smelling and hearing the bird fly. For that suspended moment in time, all things faded and vanished, gone was the gallery, the handler, the judge, only two things remained in the universe, the bird and Sally’s eyes. Somehow you knew that many generations of bird dogs were peering out through her eyes, her sire and dam and their sires and dams – going way back – all were thrilling to the sight, the smell and the sound of the bird.

Time was called and Samuels and Sally came to the gallery to pick up his horse. We congratulated him on the great performance and five finds. He simply wiped his brow with a red bandana and asked “Was it really five?”

Samuels was the picture of contentment as he unsaddled his horse. I seized this opportunity to seriously ask him what makes Sally so outstanding? Is it her training? Her condition? her diet? What is it? After a thoughtful pause he answered, “It’s all those things you mentioned, all are important but it is also something more important, it is the insatiable desire to find birds.”

Dale came by and asked “Wasn’t that worth watching?” Understatement is an art and I know of only one man who could top this, his name was Elmer. When I was a boy hunting coons in the river bottoms with my dad and his friends, they had a ritual, though they were temperate men, if you had tasted their beverage, you would have understood their confirmed belief in the philosophy of moderation. Just before dawn when the woods are real cold and the hunt is over, they would pass around a jug of someone’s homemade

corn juice. Each, in turn, was expected to take a drink and make a comment on its quality. Like, “Ain’t it sweet”, “Sure is fine” or “Mighty tasty.” Some of the younger men would just cough and say, “Thanks.” Elmer never failed, he had his ritual down pat and it never changed. He would wait until everyone else had finished and then – He would brace his feet wide apart – throw the jug up on his shoulder and take four big “pulls”. You could hear the air whistle, hiss and gurgle into the jug on each pull. After each, he would look around frowning and questioning as if something wasn’t quite right with the product. After the fourth, he would smile, looking away out over the valley and make his comment after wiping his mouth with the back of his hand, “Tolerable!”

My boy came running to me, “Dad, let’s go back to the motel, I’m hungry.” As we walked to the car, my had resting heavy on his small shoulder, “Did you have a good time today, Son?”, “Yes, I’ve been helping the wrangler. You know that little black mare with the stubby ears in his string? Her name is “Croppie” she had her ears frozen off in a Colorado blizzard. I rode her today when we took the horses to water. I kinda like her and I think she likes me too. I’ve got her reserved for the sixth brace tomorrow in the Open Gun Dog. I’m gonna watch Sally – Put the Hammer Down!”

Traveling in Wisconsin, we came over a hill and there were cliffs on one side and a river down below. I said, "Is that not beautiful?" and he said, "What good is it, you cannot grow wheat there!"

Francis was my main scout at all the Nationals and also scouted many National amateur champions for anybody who asked him. He was very good at it. He won the National amateur

3 times with Hello Dolly which was a daughter of his National amateur champion, Char-Lee o Dee. He could have won with Dolly one more time as after having two coveys he moved her on bare leaves and a covey exploded. He has talked about this again and again, even just a few weeks ago.

We will miss his phone conversations we have had in our senior years. The last time he was in the hospital for heart surgery we started a card shower and the nurses wanted to know if he was a celebrity as the whole room had cards everywhere.

We hope you have been fortunate enough to meet him as he was a all around good guy.

The 2020 American Brittany Club (ABC) West Sectional Futurity, hosted by the Oregon Brittany Club (OBC) fell victim to the Covid 19 pandemic in April and had to be canceled. With permission from ABC, we decided to reschedule it in conjunction with our scheduled Fall field trial over Labor Day weekend. This presented a few problems but was still well attended. The conditions were hot and dry, and scenting conditions were poor, but we got it done!

Our judges for were both field events were Carolyn Griffith of Tigard, Oregon, and George Lutz of Stanwood, Washington. As always, there was generous support for the event from Purina.

Field events took place on Friday, September 4th with afternoon temperatures projected into the mid-90s. We started at 7 AM in an attempt to take advantage of the cooler morning air and we finished both all age and gun dog events before it got extremely hot. The running was as follows:

Gun Dog/Shooting Dog

Brace 1: Jalo's Rangle (Rangle) handled by Jim House was braced with PK's Whose Counting? (Kenzi) handled by Patti Van De Coevering. These two nice gundogs ran a nice forward race. At 6, Rangle put up a bird and chased. At 11, Rangle put up a second bird. Rangle took a lot of volume from his handler to get him around. At 20, Kenzi pointed, but it was a non productive. At 22 Rangle pointed a bird at a Juniper and held until flush.

Brace 2: Caliah's Standing at Wallace Creek (Wallace) handled by Mary Brown was braced with CL Spanish Whizki Bender (Ben) handled by Paul Doiron. Both dogs stayed forward and handled easily and quietly. Wallace shortened up and got behind a couple of times. At 22 Wallace brought in a live bird for Mary. Ben finished birdless but was very responsive to his handler and stayed forward the entire race.

Brace 3: Mich's MT Here comes the Son Will (Will) handled by Don Pflister was braced with MTB Calpatch Idaho Gem-A (Gemma) handled by Paul Doiron. Both dogs broke strongly. Gemma ran quite large and showed great ground speed. At 20 Gemma went on point, but it was a nonproductive. At 23 Gemma put a bird up and chased. At 25, Will pointed a bird and all was in order. At 26, Will had a second bird and all was in order.

Brace 4: Shadywood Rising Star (Hallie) was handled by Sheryl Palmer and ran as a bye dog. Hallie handled well and stayed to the front. At this point, the temperature had risen dramatically. At 26, Hallie put a bird up and chased. At 29, Hallie again put a second bird up and chased. Hallie finished without a carded point.

Jax remained birdless but had a nice forward race.

The *Brittany Bites* Recipe Collection

Roast Goose

10- to 12-pound goose

For the Brine:

1 to 1 1/2 gallons cold water

1 cup kosher salt

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon ground cardamom

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 bay leaf

1/2 teaspoon cracked black pepper

Dash of allspice

For the Glaze:

1/2 cup orange juice

1/2 cup orange marmalade

1/2 cup dry white wine or champagne

Wash the goose and trim excess fat.

Place in a large cooking bag in a roasting pan or in a large covered container for brining.

In a saucepan, heat 1 cup of the water with salt, sugar, and spices until salt and sugar are dissolved. Cool slightly and add to 1 gallon of cold water.

Pour over the goose and, if necessary, add more ice cold water to cover the goose. If you use a cooking bag, twist and tie tightly so the goose is covered with the brine. Refrigerate for 12 to 24 hours.

Remove the goose from the brine and discard the brine. Pat the goose dry. Heat the oven to 375 F. Prick the goose all over with a fork to aerate the skin.

Place goose, breast side down, on a rack in a large roasting pan. (A V-rack is good for this if you have one.)

Roast for 20 minutes. Using tongs, turn the goose breast-side up and roast

for 20 minutes longer.

Meanwhile, make the glaze. Combine orange juice, marmalade, and wine or champagne in a saucepan. Bring to a simmer then remove from heat.

Remove the goose from the oven and carefully pour off the fat. Reduce heat to 325 F and continue roasting the goose for about 20 minutes per pound, brushing lightly with orange-wine mixture about every 30 to 40 minutes. Goose juices should run clear when the thigh is pierced with a sharp knife. A meat thermometer inserted in the meat of the thigh should register about 180 F.

Mulled Wine

2/3 cup vodka

2/3 cup port wine

15 whole cloves

3 cinnamon sticks (3 inches)

2 orange zest strips (1 to 3 inches)

1 orange slice

1 lemon zest strip (1 to 3 inches)

1 lemon slice

1 piece fresh gingerroot (about 2 inches), peeled and thinly sliced

1 teaspoon cardamom pods

3 cups dry red wine

1 cup packed brown sugar

In a large bowl, combine the first 10 ingredients. Refrigerate, covered, overnight.

Transfer to a large saucepan; stir in red wine and brown sugar. Bring just to a simmer (do not boil). Reduce heat; simmer gently, uncovered, until flavors are blended, about 30 minutes, stirring to dissolve sugar. Strain and serve warm. 6 Servings

Versatile Brittanys in Action

DON'T TICK ME OFF

While social distancing, this year we enjoyed a couple of weeks at my family's remote hunting camp in northern Canada, and almost carried home a hitchhiker. Just before the river froze, I was surprised to find a tick on one of my dogs. We are usually well prepared with tick removers in first aid kits at home, work and in our truck. But the cabin is more remote, and after we drive to the end of the road, then we transfer to ATV's, boars or snowmobiles for the final leg to the camp.

So, once we found the tick on one of the dog's withers while sitting near the fire, we had to scrounge up tweezers, flashlights, and even soap. I removed the tick, washed up (there's no running water either), and safely transported the tick home for identification. Luckily, we only found one tick, on my dog, and no human bites. I just received the report (a free service that took about a month), and we're fortunate that the tick did not carry Lyme disease, so we count ourselves lucky. But it was a wakeup call, since we may need to deal with ticks more in future. This inspired me to write this article about the risks of tick-borne diseases, and practical steps you can take when you're hunting in the fall (or even a mild winter).

WHERE YOUR DOG CAN PICK UP TICKS

Tick populations are growing, their geographic range is expanding and diseases transmitted by ticks (like Lyme disease) can have serious effects on humans, dogs, and other animals. Tick bites can make you sick. But while they can cause several diseases that are potentially fatal, there are effective treatments, if you detect them and seek treatment early.

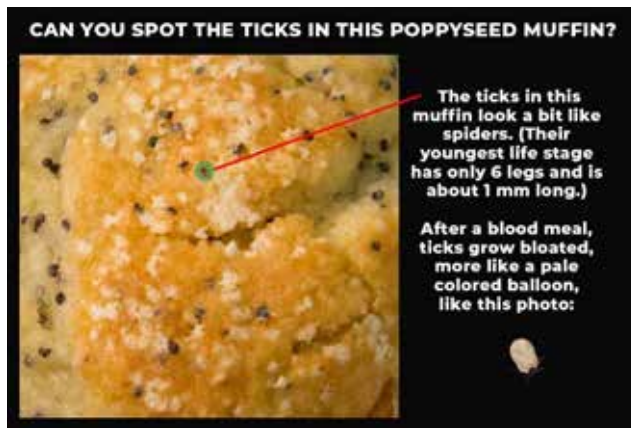


Figure 1. Can you spot the ticks on this muffin? Stock footage from CDC, AdobeStock.

According to the CDC (Centres for Disease Control and Prevention),

"Almost everyone has been bitten by a mosquito, tick, or flea. These can be vectors for spreading pathogens (germs). A person who gets bitten by a vector and gets sick has a vector-borne disease, like dengue, Zika, Lyme, or plague. Between 2004 and 2016, more than 640,000 cases of these diseases were reported, and 9 new germs spread by bites from infected mosquitoes and ticks were discovered or introduced in the US"(1).

While ticks are not as prevalent in Canada, there are confirmed cases of tickborne disease, and the range of provinces is expanding (2).

Ticks attach to your dog's skin to suck blood slowly, over several days. Then they drop off the host animal, carrying any disease pathogens, to move to the next life stage and possibly transmit the disease when they move to their next host. Can you spot the ticks shown in Figure 1?

TICKBORNE DISEASE PREVENTION

If you live, travel or hunt in a high-risk areas for ticks, talk to your vet about how to deal with potential exposures. The CDC explains, "Dogs are very susceptible to tick bites and tickborne diseases. Vaccines are not available for most of the tickborne diseases that dogs can get, and they don't keep the dogs from bringing ticks into your home. For these reasons, it's important to use a tick preventive product on your dog". In addition to using preventative medication to protect your dog from ticks, you can lower the risks of catching tickborne disease, by taking a few practical steps:

- You and your dog can get ticks in your own yard and neighborhood. Reduce ticks around your home and yard with landscaping, especially areas where your dog might be pottying after dark e.g. put a 3-ft barrier of wood chips or gravel between your lawn or potty area and nearby woods, remove leaf litter and tall brushes, and keep equipment away from trees at your yard boundaries. Doing this can help minimize the chances a waiting tick can drop from the foliage onto your unsuspecting canine.
- Wear clothing that covers your limbs e.g. long sleeves, when spending time outdoors, like hiking on wooded trails, camping, gardening and hunting.
- Consider applying EPA registered insect repellants containing DEET.
- Consider wearing clothing that has been treated with permethrin (such as WindRiver Mosquito Repellent clothing at Mark's (formerly Mark's Work Warehouse).
- Check your dog for ticks every day (as shown in Figure 2), during hunting and camping trips. Pay special attention in between their toes, where you may also find burrs and spear grass (3). Keep a kit inside your vehicle to remove anything you don't want your dog to carry home.

Remove the tick as soon as possible

1. Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin as you can.
2. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Don't twist or jerk the tick.
3. After removing the tick, clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or soap and water.
4. Dispose of the tick by flushing it down the toilet. If you would like to bring the tick to your healthcare provider for identification, put it in rubbing alcohol or place it in a sealed bag/container.

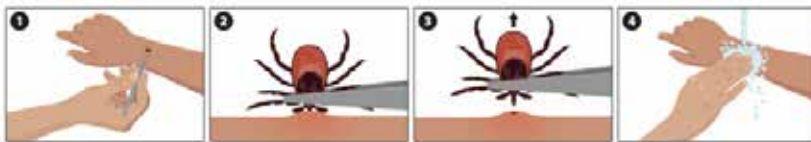


Figure 3. If you find a tick, remove it a tick as soon as possible, as depicted by the CDC. The longer it's attached, the more likely it can transmit disease.

REMOVE TICKS ASAP

So what do you do if you find a tick attached to your dog (or you)? It's important to remove it as soon as possible to minimize the risk of disease transmission.

Basically, use a tick remover or tweezers to pull it out, without tearing off the tick's mouth parts that are burrowed into the skin (4). Unfortunately, ticks secrete a "concrete like substance" to keep them attached during feeding, so it's difficult to remove without tools. After you extract the tick, wash the dog and yourself with soap and water. Then seal it inside a closed ziploc bag, and put it in the freezer to stun the tick before transport. Contact your vet

or local health authority to ask if they recommend treatment such as antibiotics, and/or submit it for identification to confirm if the tick was carrying Lyme disease.

Armed with knowledge of what you can do to prevent tick bites, minimize disease transmission, how to recognize and remove them, you'll be more prepared to minimize the risks while hunting and enjoying the outdoors together with your dog.

CONDITIONS AND RULES FOR FUTURITY ELIGIBILITY



- The 2022 American Brittany Futurity shall be open to every Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of **January 1 - December 31, 2020**, who is owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club, and whose litters have been Futurity nominated with The American Brittany Club. Sires do not necessarily have to be owned/leased by an American Brittany Club member. All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered with AKC, CKC, or FDSB.
- The **nominating breeder** needs to be a current full member in Good Standing of the ABC when the litter is nominated and the closing dates of the of the Sectional Futurities in which puppies from their nominated litter compete. They must sign the Litter Nomination form, and any breeder purse checks will be paid to this designated nominated breeder. If their membership has lapsed at the time of the Sectional Futurity, the purse will revert back to the ABC Futurity Administrative Fees.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 60 days after a bitch has whelped, and a Nomination Fee of \$40.00 ("First Forfeit") must be paid at this time.** This payment will entitle each puppy of the nominated litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Show) after the puppy has been properly registered with AKC or FDSB. Nomination Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors.
- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** In addition to the Nomination Fee of \$40.00, late fees are \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be accepted at the discretion and decision of the ABC Futurity Committee. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time.
- A Final Forfeit Fee, to be eligible to compete in the Sectional Futurities (Western/Central/Eastern), is due by October 1, 2021, and is submitted by the owner of the eligible puppy. Futurity Entry Fees will also be paid prior to 2022 Sectional Futurity events** by the owner of the eligible puppy for each Sectional Futurity event in which the eligible puppy is entered. Final Forfeit Fees as well as Sectional Futurity Entry Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors and subject to change.
