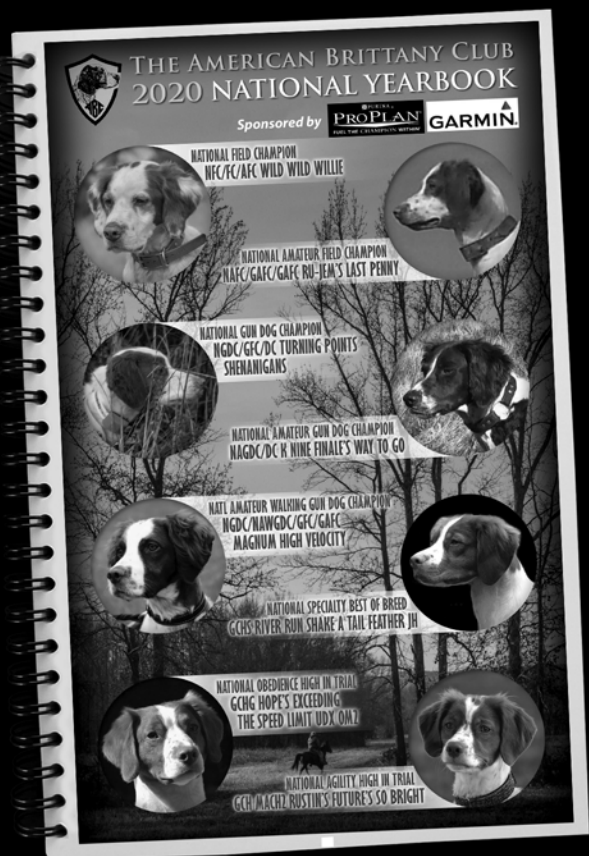

The 2021 American Brittany Club Chukar Classic started with a reminder that spring weather, at 4400' elevation in the Idaho Owyhee Mountains, can be awfully temperamental. All night before the April 27 start, I could hear precipitation hitting the dome vent a couple of feet above my head and wind rocked the trailer. Interpreting the sounds became a mind-game – is that rain, sleet, grapple, or snow? I think I heard all four.

The next morning, daylight showed about an inch of snow on the ground, and mud where there was no snow. But the day dawned clear and calm, and though quite cold, warmth was promised by clear skies and the rising sun. Participants awakened with varying degrees of enthusiasm for what the day might bring.

Judges for the event were Mark Shearman of Gresham, Oregon and Dr. Ray Calkins of Sherwood, Oregon. Both are experienced all age judges and good horsemen. Each watched dogs carefully and allowed handlers sufficient leeway to show their dogs' best attributes.

A big thank you to Tom White and Margaret Horstmeyer, who chaired and secretaried the event. Their energy, enthusiasm, experience, and dedication to the classic is appreciated by all northwest Brittany owners, and especially those of us running all age dogs! Special appreciation goes to Garmin and Purina which generously supported the event, and to the U.S. Bureau of Land Management that provides the permit to use our public land for this purpose. The contribution of the Idaho Brittany Club members was invaluable: Steve Ball and Larry Sandusky for bird planting; Sandy Bright and John Fellon:

avian coordinators; Ron Dunagan: equipment maintenance; Sharon Millsbaugh: bracing and grounds monitor; Casey and Lacie Precht: Razor transportation of dogs between MP 7 & 9 over very muddy roads; Frank Bright: dog wagon driver. In this day and age of dwindling clubs it is heartening and encouraging to see a club's viable membership contribute so generously to the operation of this event even without dogs entered!

In the spring on these grounds, Belding ground squirrels (*Urocitellus beldingi*), commonly known as sage rats or whistle pigs, emerge from their winter slumber and become active. Their scent, squeal, and general scurrying-around can distract the best of dogs and they are particularly tough on younger dogs. Here, experience of the dog and response to its handler come into focus...many a great run on these grounds has been spoiled by a colony of sage rats.

While chukar is the name of the game, wild Hungarian partridge also occur on the grounds and several were found during the event. The explosive flush of these wild birds kept dogs and handlers alike on their toes.

To accommodate the inclement weather, the start of the 2021 Chukar Classic was delayed until 9AM, April 27th.

The running, Day 1:

Brace 1: The weather was still cold, and snow still covered the ground at the initial breakaway. But there was little wind, a blue sky, and bright sunshine. **Blazing Spanish Bella (Bella)** owned and handled by **Gerald Barron** was braced with **SR's Blew By Typhoon (Ty)** owned

by Dan Doiron and handled by Paul Doiron. Both dogs enjoyed the cool air and fresh snow and responded with big powerful runs. Bella made several big lateral casts to the north in the flat, Ty stayed more to the front with several uphill runs. At 21, just past June's Rock, Ty was found standing well up the hill to the south. A bird was produced, and all was in order. At 32, Bella had a find just west of the reservoir, and simultaneously, Ty had a second find uphill from the reservoir. Ty continued to run a strong forward race and finished with four finds. Bella continued to run well, but unfortunately at 57 brought her handler a wet live chukar, ending her run.

Brace 2: With the snow beginning to disappear, melted by the strong April sun, Wild, Wild, Willie (Willie), a national champion, owned and handled by Steve Cosgriff was braced with a second national champion, Blew Me Away (Bud), owned by Norman and Terry Ahl and handled by Paul Doiron. Both dogs charged off the starting line. At 5, Bud had a non-productive in the upper bowl, then both dogs disappeared to the front, Willie down low, Bud higher on the hill. Willie was not seen again, and Steve pulled his tracker at 35. Bud was seen occasionally forward in a strong run and almost finished birdless. However, in a swing south of camp, at 59, Bud encountered a pair of Huns, flushing almost simultaneously with Bud's point. It was a nice forward, strong race, but little was seen of Bud through most of the 60 minutes.

Brace 3: High Lonesome Bowden Hills (Bo) owned and handled by Jim Hammett was braced with MVP Game On (Joe) owned by Karen Nelsen and handled by Paul Doiron. By now, the morning was beginning to warm up and the snow had melted. Both dogs started with good forward casts up the hill. Joe had a short run with his first find of two Huns at 6. He took several forward steps at the flush and was picked up. Bo continued with a strong forward run with finds at 19, 23, and 40. While his bird work was perfect, his run became uncharacteristically more shooting dog than all age with several loops back to his handler.

Brace 4: MTB Louree's Let's Have a FEE-ESTA (Esta) owned by Tom White and Margaret Horstmeyer and handled by Paul Doiron was braced with Spanish Corral's Sonny Patch (Patch), another national champion, owned and handled by Joe Gower. Both dogs broke strongly forward into the top of the bowl. At 3, Patch was seen standing, but it turned out to be a deceased bird or parts thereof. At 10, Patch had a good find in the southwest part of the bowl. All was in order. From this point forward both dogs disappeared to the front, reappearing near the reservoir. At 28, Patch had a second find just up the hill from the reservoir and all was in order. Esta, at this point, decided the northern horizon looked good and even with some strong discouragement from her scout, continued to explore that horizon. At 39, Paul pulled the tracker, ending Esta's run. Patch continued forward but the early afternoon heat took its toll on the senior dog, and he slowed considerably on his last cast uphill from camp.

Day 2:

Brace 5: By now, all the snow had melted, and the morning was clear and cold with temperatures near freezing. Son Yoti's Master of Illusion (Magic) owned and handled by Gerry Gresham was braced with Dynamitemakeit (Dyna) owned by Peggy Doiron and run by Paul Doiron. Both dogs broke to the front but both got lateral as they pushed into a moderate headwind. At 30, Magic made a big move to the north showing well on the big sidehill north of the reservoir. Dyna seemed infatuated with awakening ground squirrels and got a little distracted. At 36, Magic had a find with all in order. Magic had further finds at 40 and 44 with all in order. At 50, Paul found a bird, showed it to Dyna, who pointed very nicely. Dyna finished strong to the front.

Brace 6: Tequila's Tyler on Fire (Tyler) owned and handled by Vic Retherford was braced with JT Copper Buckaroo (Buck) owned by Jeff Minch and handled by Paul Doiron. Tyler warmed up to a nice big run but spent most of his time far north of the course, finishing birdless. Buck had a quick find well up in the bowl at 8, then went forward high and stayed high for the remainder of the brace. He had a second find with all in order at about 38 and finished forward and high in a very polished consistent run.

Brace 7: High Lonesome Sage (Sage) owned and handled by Jim Hammett was braced with HVK's Kid Chance (Chance) owned by Cary Jellison and handled by Joe Gower. Both dogs broke strongly to the front, well out and appearing from time to time as white dots. Both handlers alternately claimed both dots as they appeared and disappeared. At 9, Sage was spotted standing well forward on top of the next ridge. A bird was produced, and all was in order. At 15, Sage found another bird atop another ridge well forward on the course. Chance continued to run forward but pointed two dead birds or parts thereof, finishing birdless. At 54, at the top of the bowl, just west of Black Rock Spring, Sage disappeared to the west over the ridge near the barb wire fence. When his handler and judge topped this ridge, Sage was nowhere to be found. However, eagle-eye Mark Shearman, the judge, soon discerned Sage standing, tucked under a large rock outcrop about 170 yards past the fence line. With the judge holding both horses at the fence, Jim crawled through the barbed wire, trotted to Sage, produced a bird and all was in order. Sage finished forward on the hill opposite the cattle guard.

Brace 8. Spanish Corral's Big Iron (Colt) owned and handled by Joe Gower ran as a bye dog. Colt started well and ran well up the hill but began to loop back. This did not please his handler and he was picked up at 22.

Congratulations to Ken Jacobson, Charles "Bernie" Crain and Bourbon XIII, owned by Joe Jung, for being elected to the Hall of Fame.

The 2021 running of the MID AMERICA BRITTANY CHAMPIONSHIP was held April 22-24, 2021 at the Branched Oak Field Trial Area near Raymond, Nebraska. The Mid American Brittany Championship was hosted by the Missouri Valley Brittany Club and followed the regional club event held April 19-21.

There are some fine folks we need to mention for their contribution to the success of this Championship event. First and foremost, Bill and Julie Cockrum along with Bruce Heiter who are club members of the Missouri Valley Brittany Club. Wesley Felt was there to report and Marshall the running. Bruce and Bill planted birds and did the dog wagon. Steve Ralf helped out with dog wagon duties. Missouri Valley Brittany Club long time member John Savicky is remembered for all he did for the club and especially for this Championship, rest in peace John, you are missed.

The Branched Oak Field Trial Area has a large lodge but with the Covid Virus still present the caterer did not staff the diner. Bill and Julie provided lunch for the participants and we sat outside.

The sponsor for the Mid America Brittany Championship is Nestle Purina. Nestle Purina gives both money toward the running of this event and Pro Plan products for the winners. Purina is fed to several dogs running in this event as testimony to the quality of feed used in the Pro Plan dog products. We thank our sponsor for their continued support.

The judges for this year's event were Howard Burbach from Missouri and Justin Hess from Iowa. These two judges were up to the

task of three days of riding to select the true all age competitors. The judges had a number of good dogs to choose from with training to run an hour with all-age range, and intensity on birds pointed to be named as the Champion and Runner-up Champion.

Branched Oak Field Trial Area provides ample space to show a true all age bird dog. We had 39 dogs go to the line in this year Championship. The Championship is a one-hour continuous course with seven braces the first two days.

The 2021 Champion for the Mid America Brittany Championship was JUST CALL ME LUCKY NED PEPPER owned and handled by Frank Campbell. His Sire is KINWASHKLY DIRTY NED PEPPER and Dam is CANEY RIVER TNT'S SPECIAL BUDGET. The Runner-up Champion was GEORGIA WHITE LIGHTENING owned by Travis and Clayton Tangen and handled by Tom Tracy Jr. His Sire is UNCLE KRACKER and Dam is GEORGIA TEXAS TWO STEP.

The third place was awarded to RU-JEM'S 'LAST' PENNY owned by Jerry McGee and handled by Tom Tracy Jr. Her Sire is TRADESMARK'S ATM and Dam is RED BUD ZIPPER. The fourth place was awarded to ALMADEN'S UNDER LOCK AND KEY owned by Emmy & Noah Wollenburg and handled by Ed Tillson. His sire is MASKED JACK OF DIAMONDS and dam is ALAMADEN'S LONE SHADOW DANCER.

The Championship Running:

Weather on Monday was 57 on first brace, with a breeze and by noon it was 80 and ended the day at 92. This truly was unseasonal as the week before it was in the high 30's to 40's.

Brace 1: KASHMIR- Tracy and WILLIE MAKIT- Johnson. KASHMIR was lost at mid hour. WILLIE MAKIT was hunting well to the front and went on point but had a breach of manners and was put in the dog wagon.

Brace 2: HOOCHIE COOCHIE MAN-Tillson and DOGWOOD'S FIREBALL WHISKI-Burchett. HOOCHIE COOCHIE MAN was hunting hard to the front he had a good find at 2, 12, and 16. He was shortening some and was picked up before the hour. DOGWOOD'S FIREBALL WHISKI first find at 4 was not acceptable and was sent to the dog wagon.

Brace 3: SNIKSOH WORTHY EXPENSE-Hoskins and KID'S ROYAL CASEY- Heiter. SNIKSOH WORTHY EXPENSE had a good turkey find at 9. He was forward at 35 and bumped a quail to end his day. KID'S ROYAL CASEY had a bird at 7 with good manners. His second find at 30 was not as successful and was picked up.

Sunday Morning

For this author the “affair” with the Brittany all started in 1972. Work necessitated that travel be a part of the job. With three young boys, my wife had “her hands-full” when travel requirements made it so I was away from home. Living in a development with close neighbors on a half-acre lot made it so the boys during the day were outside playing ball, in the sandbox, on the swings, or elsewhere.

A family decision was made; it was time for a “puppy dog”. A co-worker had a terrier-beagle mix ten weeks old pup. Maggie bonded with the boys and was a great “little watch dog” when I was away traveling. Later a situation occurred that was not good for Maggie. One of the neighbors had an English sheep dog, who did not like our little beagle mix. Long story “cut” short, Maggie spent the rest of her ten year life on my uncle’s farm in Ohio.

Time for another pup to enter our household; it was some type of terrier mix from another neighbor, who had a litter of “cute looking pups”. Over the next year Charley Brown proved to be a disaster. He was just that on four legs; fifty pounds of “all-wired-up”. The dog soon found another home.

Time was right for a pure-bred breed, the Brittany to enter our household. We look thru the AKC Breed Book for a pointing gundog. It was decided size of the Brittany would be “just-right” for our home. The boys were excited as we all looked at a litter of orange/white AKC registered pups. GDJ’s Tiffany was the first of many Brittans to be part of our family. She bonded with the boys. She was the family pet with a good personality; however, due to certain circumstances, we did not hunt her.

The next Brittany was Spike; the boys were now old enough to hunt. We also moved out of the housing development onto twenty-five acres where the dogs could “run”. As the years past several other Brittans became members of our household; along came my interest in training and developing the natural ability of the breed to hunt upland birds. In addition an interest developed in field trials and showing the dogs.

For several years almost every Sunday morning – very early

– I would travel about an hour with at least one Brittany, to run and train the dog, talk Brittans with the Keenans (more about these folks later) and return home in time for the family to attend church. Just to clarify these trips occurred only on Sunday’s during those days of spring, late summer, and the fall bird hunting season.



One of their dogs, Beau’Pere was one of the first AKC recorded Amateur Field Champion (AFC).

Those Sunday mornings with the Keenans were memorable. I was attempting to be a “sponge” soaking-up as much knowledge about training as possible. One time Dick wrote a few “words-of-wisdom” about the Brittany and some are as follows:

- ▶ I have been asked many times how long does it take to train a dog? I say all of its life – repetition, repetition, repetition.
- ▶ Sometimes trainers’ have to adjust their methods to the dog, not the dog to his method. Each dog has its own ability.
- ▶ Gun shy dogs are made by humans; just dumb stupid mistakes. For example taking a pup to a shooting range to see if he is gun shy.
- ▶ Most often given half a chance dogs will make pets of their owners.

Those Sunday mornings were important from point of learning about the Brittany, training, competition – both field trialing and the show ring, and hunting upland birds; memories never to be forgotten.

The ability to run dogs on the grounds of the Bird Dog Ranch in Thayer, IA is a privilege and a pleasure, thanks to the efforts and generosity of Linda Thomas and her son Tommy. Their ongoing efforts towards continued improvements were evidenced by installation of new woven wire fencing and the set-back and widening of the eastern entrance to improve access for large rigs and increasing the safety while running our dogs.

We'd like to thank our judges for their adjudication of this event and for spending three long days in the saddle. Jeff Wallace and Brent Hoehns were a pleasure to have on hand to evaluate each dog's performance in a positive and attentive fashion; we thank them for their willingness to give back to the sport. We'd also like to thank our sponsor Purina for the financial support and generous supply of quality food for each participant and the placing dogs; quality feed and company that make it possible for our canine athletes to compete at their highest levels!

Coffee breaks, dog wagon and road guard duties were skillfully handled by Valerie Burchett, son Hyatt and Linda Thomas each day with the importance of road crossing and safety demonstrated multiple times during each day. The big takeaway is don't ever assume drivers will happily comply or drive cautiously and DON'T mess with Valerie! Many thanks to Bruce Heiter and Bill Cockrum who worked their tails off making sure the oft overlooked details, especially bird planting was skillfully taken care of each day – resulting in a seamless event!

This year's renewal saw 35 dogs come to the line vying for the title, with multiple finds by each dog who made the hour; bird availability and flight quality was excellent!

Our winner was Sniksoh Hank's Hatch, handled by Bob Burchett running in the 17th brace. Hatch displayed his backing abilities at the 7 minute mark after a bull-headed beginning; his staunchness while backing set the stage for the rest of his performance. Hatch carded finds at the 15, 28, 38 and 46 minute marks with the last two requiring lengthy flushing and

beautifully executed relocations to pin the running birds. Hatch displayed lofty style and intensity on each find and his run displayed multiple large, forward sweeping moves with the most memorable being his last. Heading north, after crossing the road east of camp, hatch swung the entire eastern edge along the woods, ditches and feed strips to the old orchard are then brought the east/west orchard fence line, drifting towards Bob who was riding along the western fence line past Charlie's place. Hatch then dropped down to the tree lined draw at the end of the orchard fence line, taking it to meet Bob at the steep rock crossing by the short cut to the weekend Gun Dog pick up point as time was called for the hour.

Runner-up honors went to Woodsong's Honky Tonkin, handled by Scott. Hank ran in the first brace of the second day and was fast, snappy and forward at the start of his hour; his pace mellowed as he settled into a controlled pattern and application which grew during the remaining time. He carded finds at 14, 18 and 36 minutes respectively with style, a through hunting pattern, kindly handle and a nice finish as time expired a little while after the road crossing near camp.

Pushing the winners in third place was Starlight's Mercury Out Ryder, with Bob Burchett guiding his charge to two early finds at 11 and 15 minutes respectively, with style and intensity throughout. He ran in the second brace running fast with a strong patter and application; he suffered a brief flat spot in the middle of the hour, recovering with a strong forward finish to the end of time.

Fourth place honor went to Almaden's Under Lock and Key from the first brace and handled by Ed Tillson. Oudi carded three quality finds coming at the 13, 28 and 58 minute mark during his hour. He laid down a forward run with speed, a pleasing pattern and some beautiful moves at a range that stretched the string at times.

The Running:

Brace 1: Dogwood Benelli-Burchett and Almaden's Under Lock

and **Key-Tillson**. Oudi's fourth place run is detailed above; Benny broke away strong and fast making nice moves throughout his time on the ground. After coming through the double rock crossing, he took the far side of the thick draw using the wind and established point on a small covey opposite of where Oudi was pointed and temptation got the better of him to end his day early.

Brace 2: Starlight's Mercury Out Ryder-Burchett and Sigbrit's Not In Kansas Anymore-Johnson. Ryder's third place run is detailed above; the brace broke away across the road from the western entrance to the grounds with the dogs heading west. Dotti flew forward and headed to the south, last seen near the hedge apple fence line, not to be returned to judgement with the tracker being pulled at the 15-minute mark.

Brace 3: Sniksoh Worthy Expense-Hoskins and Hopes Chief Of Cross Creek-Burchett. Spence and Chief broke away after the road crossing with Spencer making some nice moves early, failing to make the western turn downhill across from camp, diving deep into the wooded ravine near the pond and road across from camp; Jeff pulled the tracker at the 10-minute mark. Chief ran hard and wild at the start, displaying bull headedness at times throughout his hour. He ran hard for the hour with a mostly forward pattern and four finds carded at the 15, 19, 32 and 35 minute mark of the hour. He displayed nice style and intensity on all of his bird work.

Brace 4: Turning Points Shenanigans-Nelson and A Trace Of Bourbon With Diamonds-Hastings. Shandy and Trace broke away at the northern side of the double rock crossing heading forward with speed and purpose. Trace pointed early with a find at the three minute mark displaying nice style and intensity. Shandy went missing around the old barn site, regaining the front as Trace and the handlers were heading towards the crossing to the alfalfa field. Trace carded his second find at the 16 minute mark with Shandy suffering a breach of manners to end her bid. After withstanding said pressure, Trace went on to have another find at 38 minutes with nice style, but having slowed considerably Rick elected to end his run.

Brace 5: Trio's I'm Finn-Tastic At Campbell's-Burchett and Hurricane Banjo-Fiorito. Finn and Banjo broke away from camp with Finn getting lined out right away and Banjo taking some time to settle in. Banjo had a find at 12 minutes and both dogs were pointed separately at the 16 minute mark with Finn's desire getting the best of him, ending his day. Banjo carded two more finds, at 20 and 56 minutes respectively, suffering a breach of manners to end his bid before the hour was up; he made some impressive moves at times.

Brace 6: Sovereign's Judge And Jury-Burchett and Warbonnet & Campbell's Skye's The Limit-Campbell. JJ and Skye broke away fast and forward south of camp heading downhill to be found standing on a divided find at 8 minutes in the Osage fence line. Skye went on the flush ending her and Ben's bid. JJ stood throughout and carded additional finds at 16 and 22 minutes respectively, standing tall on his toes for each one; too tall on the last one with desire getting the better of him. He laid down a strong pattern that was fast, forward and fun to watch!

Brace 7: Detroit Rascal's Son Of a Gun-Burchett and Jazz Em Up Arrow-Hastings. This pair broke away strong near the southern gate with Arrow pointing at four minutes and Cobo backing beautifully at great distance. These dogs made independent moves upon release to arrive at a divided find at the 10 minute mark. Arrow stood through lots of pressure as Cobo ended his day early. Arrow made some nice moves, slowing some after his second find and suffering two non-productives to end his bid at the 32 minute mark.

Brace 8: Cross Creek Sovereign Pop-A-Top-Burchett and Woodson's Honky Tokin-Johnson. Jaxson and Hank started our second day of running; Hank's second place performance being detailed previously. Jaxson was forward and growing during his time on the ground. He stood

tall at the 14 minute mark, but Jaxson suffered a break of manners to end his day early.

Brace 9: Sniksoh Little Diamond-Johnson and Blaze Away Bonita-Burchett. Kate was an injury scratch with Boo running in place. She broke away strong and fast south west of camp making nice moves as she went, especially her last one through the keyhole, taking the entire left edge forward to the crossing and picking up the right edge to be found standing at 14 minutes near the head of the draw before the terraces. Upon relocation, Boo's enthusiasm got the better of her sending her to the dog wagon early.

Brace 10: Kid's Royal Casey-Heiter and Shiloh's Sailing The West Wind-Burchett. The first 20 minutes of this brace were action-packed to say the least! Both dogs had strong runs and clean finds within the first seven minutes and beautiful style on each. They shared a divided find at 11 minutes ending in a non-productive. They stood together again at 16 minutes on a small covey and each dog exhibiting beautiful style and intensity. Upon release, Zee with Bob handling carded his third beautiful find at the 19 minute mark. Casey and Bruce suffered a second non-productive ending their promising run at the 20 minute mark. Zee continued to lay down a strong performance with great application and a powerful run; a bird popped wild at 45 minutes with Zee not realizing what was happening until it was unfortunately too late!

Brace 11: Sovereign's Legendary Cowboy-Burchett and Simon's Standing Stone-Tillson. Breaking away near the old barn site, Duke and Gus encountered deer at the two minute mark with Duke failing to return in a timely fashion to end his day. Gus recovered to have two nice finds at the 8 and 15 minute marks. He made some very nice moves early though suffered another absence after the road crossing and failed to please Ed upon his return to end his day around the 50 minute mark.

Brace 12: JB's Hankerin For A Bird-Johnson and Crosscreek Sanbar Windrider-Burchett. Hank broke away on a mission forward and fast to be found by Scott pointed at the feeder in the draw near the road before the old barn site with nice style at the 12 minute mark. Upon release Hank continued forward to stand again at 22 minutes where a breach of manners ended his bid. Rider ran strong and fast in multiple directions early, before ling out heading to the double rock crossings where he went missing; his bid ended when Bob called for the tracker at the 15 minute mark.

Brace 13: Bamma Jama Willy's Sassie Sadie-Burchett and Copley-Sheltany Echo Of Angels-Johnson. Sadie and Zoey broke away near the north western gate with speed and purpose to share a divided find at the two minute mark with both dogs standing with style and intensity. Upon release, Zoey made multiple moves with nice application until reaching the old orchard area where she disappeared and required Scott to call for the tracker at the 18 minute mark. Sadie took off from the divided find with speed and beautiful application, making huge move, usually hugging the field edge. Her most memorable was a continuous move taking the left edge from the old orchard area all the way around past camp, deep into the left corner before the road crossing, across the road, still on the left to the rock crossing and after the crossing, unto the All-Age course to point in the draw west of the trail at the 23 minute mark. When Bob flushed the birds, Sadie decided they needed an escort, ending an incredibly strong bid.

Brace 14: Starlight's Callisto Moon-Burchett and Montana Big Sky's Belle-Tillson. Cal and Belle both broke away fast and disappeared as they both turned south after the crossing opposite camp. Both handler and scout searched high and low for Cal to no avail, requiring the tracker at the 15 minute mark. Belle appeared bringing the Osage fence line up from the bottom, across the front and along the western edge of the course to point stylishly at the intersection of the fence and the woods before the western most rock crossing for Ed. A breach of manners on the covey ended a strong bid at the 15 minute mark to the dismay of everyone.

Brace 15: Sanbar's Legendary Black Tie Affair-Burchett and

Hoochie Coochie Man-Tilson. Jaxson and Karl were the first brace of the final day of running, deciding to enjoy each other's company initially, then separating with Karl stretching to the eastern corner of the orchard fence line where he carded his first find at the seven minute mark with great style. After the double rock crossing, Jaxson had a stop to flush at 12 minutes with all in order. Karl pointed at the 16 minute mark with Jaxson backing the stand. When Ed relocated Karl, Bob elected to escort Jaxson to the dog wagon as his performance wasn't pleasing him and Karl carded a non-productive. After a very nice string of moves, Ed called point again for Karl at the 18 minute mark and a breach of manners ended his day.

Brace 16: TNT's Nymph In Hareem Pants-Burchett and B&T Sundance Kid Rock-Johnson. Jazz and Rocky broke away near the old barn running similar lines with Rocky pointing at the 8 minute mark with Jazz missing the opportunity to back end her day. The stand resulted in a non-productive with Rocky moving on making some nice moves to the eastern ed of the old orchard area fence line to point at the 15 minute mark. The stand required Rocky to relocate which he did twice, beautifully, allowing Scott to produce the bird for his charge. Rocky's pattern continued to display some immaturity as well as brilliance up to his second find at the 37 minute mark, requiring his relocation skills again. Unfortunately, this covey didn't play nice, which ended his bid.

Brace 17: J&M Rodeo Romeo-Tillson and 17 Sniksoh Hank Hatch-Burchett. Tuff and Hatch broke away heading downhill to the rock crossing due south of camp. Hatch's winning run is detailed previously. At the seven minute mark, Tuff was found pointed deep into the Osage fence line after being seen making the move to this find, before handlers had exited the crossing. Upon release, he hugged the right edge to stand again at 11 minutes for his second find with all in order. Tuff drove forward to stand again at the 14 minute mark, after the second crossing on the left line. Tuff felt that Ed was flushing efficiently and elected to assist and ended his day

and what was shaping up to be a strong performance.

Brace 18: Scout Upland Trailblazer-Tillson and Stelar Fifty One-Burchett. Scout and Stella broke away with speed and purpose, working the objectives independently. At the 13 minute mark, Scout pointed with Stella backing nicely at the feeder south of the west gate. Ed relocated Scout who worked west to the ditch near the road resulting in a non-productive. Scout and Stella continued to make strong bids, with multiple, nice moves and a steadily fast race. At the 37 minute mark, Scout pointed again after the road crossing and first rock crossing, in the draw running north and south. He stood with nice style with a covey produced and all in order. Stella stood across the draw, on a find of her own, but a breach of manners ended her strong bid at 38 minutes. Scout continued to run hard and pointed in the Osage line at the 47 minute mark, but a slight infraction sadly knocked him out of contention for a placement.

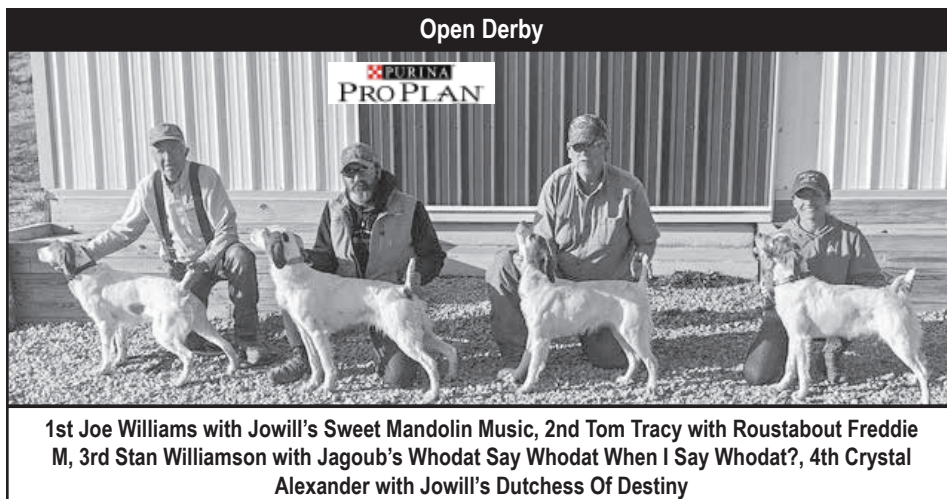

Biting: Puppy vs. Adult

Puppies bite. It's part of their learning process and, within their litter, establishing the pecking order of who's in charge. They play-bite with one another, wrestle, and sound like they're on the attack when they're really just doing what puppies do to sort who's the top dog. Additionally, a puppy's mouth is his hands as far as learning what things are. Everything – and I mean pretty much everything within reach – goes in their mouth. That's how they learn what it is and whether or not they should mess with it in the future.

At that cute seven-or-eight-week-old stage, that adorable pup turns into a needle-toothed little velociraptor. Your hands, clothes, nose, shoelaces...anything's a target. Understand, there is nothing vicious or malicious about this. It's puppies doing what puppies do to find out where they fit into the social structure of their new world. However, just because it's normal puppy behavior does not mean it should be allowed. They can have safe toys to chew on, but biting people needs to be stopped, and immediately. How exactly can we do this?

What I usually hear when I ask what a puppy buyer has tried so far is: "I said, 'No bite!' and tapped him on the nose, but he didn't stop." Okay, problem number one: Puppies don't speak English, and that tap on the nose was an invitation to continue to play. When you say "No bite," you're talking to yourself – those words will have no effect on your pup.

If you watch a litter of pups playing, you'll often hear growling and biting, and it may sound like there's a fight going on. Again, pretty normal stuff. They are sorting out who is the top dog and who the underlings will be. When it gets too rough, the losing puppy will often cry out, and the biting puppy will stop. That's canine language for, "I give up, you win," and the biting and fighting stops. It's sort of pre-programmed into them, and we can use this to communicate the same thing.

Problem is, we humans have a hard time doing this in a manner that the dogs understand. Dogs understand clear signals, not subtle hints, because that's the way they communicate with one another. While we certainly don't want to hurt our puppy, we need to send a clear message that biting is not okay. Most people are too soft with this, and the biting and nipping continues and becomes a game. One or two proper corrections, done in a way that makes

sense to our puppy, will stop it.

When the pup bites, make a circle of your thumb and fingers and wrap it around your puppy's nose. Squeeze quickly and hard enough to make the puppy cry out a bit and pull away, while at the same time saying, "Ouch!" in a high-pitched voice. Then immediately go back to petting your puppy and playing – but don't keep playing with their face because that invites more biting and becomes a game of "tag, you're it!" By doing this, you are being the littermate they are play-fighting with, and by making the puppy give up and pull away, you've made an impression that biting you is a bad idea.

Now, here's what not to do. Do not flip the puppy on his back and pin him down, or even worse, choke him while holding him down. Why not do this? Because you just took a puppy that was trying to find his position in the pack by play-biting and you have now forced him to panic and feel like he's fighting for his life. That's a great way to turn play-biting into the real deal by creating fear. Puppies bite. You can fix it, and fast, if you do it right. I've never had to do this more than maybe twice to a puppy, and it was game over, permanently, after that.

What about the adult dog? That is an entirely different ballgame. Adult dogs bite for two main reasons: fear and aggression. The vast majority of those will be out of fear, but because it tends to scare people, they automatically label the dog as aggressive.

What is the difference between fear and aggression? It's important to note the difference and act accordingly. A fearful dog feels frustrated or cornered and tends to snap out of the feeling that he needs to defend himself. For example, you're out walking with your dog and a loose dog comes running toward you. You grab your dog's collar and hold him tightly to you thinking you're being protective. The other dog gets close and starts to sniff and your dog reacts

by growling or snapping at the other dog. That surprises you because he's always been friendly, so why is he acting like this now? By restraining him tightly to your side or between your legs, you've made him feel cornered, and he can't do the stuff dogs normally do when meeting. He feels trapped, and you are wondering why your dog is acting aggressively.

Please understand, he's not being aggressive – he's being defensive and acting out of fear. When a strange dog approaches, you should always be cautious, of course, and read the body language of the strange dog, while at the same time giving your dog enough lead and space so he can act like a dog. If the strange dog has a stiff-legged approach and hackles are up, walk away with your dog. If he has his tail up and wagging slightly, you're probably okay to let them sniff and get to know each other while at the same time watching for signs that may be less friendly so you can react.

Another type of fear or discomfort is seen far too often in those cutesy photos of babies and little kids with dogs (and sometimes adults). The toddler may be sitting on the dog or wrapping their arms around his neck and the adults say, "Awww...how cute!" and snap a picture. The dogs are often showing signs of discomfort such as leaning away slightly, pulling their ears back, eyes bugged wide open; and they are trying very hard to tolerate behavior that shouldn't be allowed. Most don't escalate to a bite but some do, especially when the child keeps pushing and annoying them. The dogs snap at the kid, maybe making contact or just scaring them, and sometimes breaking skin or worse. Suddenly, the dog is at fault for aggressive behavior and gets rehomed or euthanized.

None of that is the dog's fault. They have no other way of communicating their discomfort except through the body language they showed. Dogs can't speak human and say, "Would you please stop doing that? I don't like it." All they can do is use their body language, and if that doesn't work and they can't get up and move away, then growls and bites happen.

A third type of fear-biting happens when a dog is in pain or injured. It's not personal and shouldn't be taken as aggressive. They're saying, I hurt, or, Don't touch that! And they aren't very good at saying please first. Pain can be something as simple as the discomfort of having their nails trimmed when they aren't used to it, or it can be from a cut or broken bone or other injury or disease.

What defines a truly aggressive dog? Those are nowhere near as common as many people think. A truly aggressive dog is

always looking for a fight and will start one every chance he gets. Doesn't matter if it's another dog or a human. They want to push and dominate and will attack hard and fast with very little warning and for no reason. There are some physical causes that can trigger this, such as rage syndrome, brain tumors/issues, and hormonal imbalances; but again, a truly aggressive dog is extremely rare.

The lesson that needs to be learned is one we tend to mention often: Pay attention to your dog's body language. It's all they've got to communicate with us, and they are always communicating whether we realize it or not. Be aware and try to head off bad situations before they escalate into something that could cost your dog his life by being labeled a biter. The more attention you pay to what your dog is telling you, the stronger your bond will be.
