

2020 ABC National Amateur Walking Gun Dog Championship

October 24 - 26, 2020

We'd like to thank our judges, Paul Renius and Rich Pristov for their time in the saddle observing each and every dog with an attentive and positive eye to select the National Amateur Walking Gun Dog Champion. Several people gave of their time and talents to assist in making this a quality National event. Thanks to Chairman Al Cropek and Secretary Sue Lehosky and their committee for all their work putting on this event. Dick Lipsky planted birds on each course the night before as well as replanting daily during the mornings for our afternoon braces as well as feeding them on course.



We'd like to thank our corporate sponsors, Purina and Garmin for providing financial support as well as their fine products for participants, winners and placing dogs. Purina Pro Plan food will feed our winning dogs for months to come and a Garmin Pro 550 Plus collar will help track and train well into the future. The ABC provided a Montana Silversmiths custom buckle for the Champion as well.

Thanks to Sue Lehosky and Al Cropek for facilitating our Calcutta; handling the records and money for those bidding on dogs. Eileen Gust put together a raffle of several dog related items as well as people

centered items for everyone to purchase tickets for. Multiple winners made for a lively event – thanks for all your hard work Eileen! Carlos Gust served as our Judges Marshall for the event – thank you for your time in the saddle every day Carlos. Chuck Langstaff drove the dog wagon for a full load of passengers each day. Will Langley was there to provide horses for rent for those desiring to ride and watch.

The Ionia Grounds Committee did a wonderful job preparing the courses by mowing and clearing brush so that handlers were afforded a stellar canvas upon which to showcase their dog's performance in each and every brace; the grounds were in great shape thanks to all their efforts during the year.

We had handlers from across the country this year, with New York, Georgia, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, Michigan, California, New Jersey, and Ohio being represented, providing an excellent cross-section and representation of the American Brittany Club. We hope to broaden and grow this representation going forward!



This year's Champion was NGDC/NAWGDC/GFC/GAFC Magnum High Velocity, running in the 4th brace, first brace of the afternoon on



our first day of running. This was his 2nd year in a row winning this Championship and Gauge's run was characterized by consistent pattern and run with 7 evenly placed finds; the nicest being his last near the Boy Scout Bridge on the corner of the woods there, far off his birds with nice style and intensity for his handler/owner Vince Anderson.



This year's Runner-Up Champion was Romence's Life of Riley, running in the 10th brace, first brace of the afternoon on our second day of running. Riley's run was fast and snappy the entire hour, with her only mar being a deer chase, which she returned from to point a large covey, buried in the cover while her handler was calling and searching for her. Riley withstood great pressure from her brace mate on her 3rd of 6 finds, all with incredible style and intensity. This placement is special in that Julie Romence has been taking beautiful photographs of everyone's dogs competing in the Gun Dog Nationals since 2005, with this being her



FIRST time running a dog in the Nationals!

Third place was awarded to Spring Hill's Red Hot Performance running in the 7th brace, first brace of the second day of running. John Bell piloted his dog to 7 evenly spaced finds, highlighted by his 6th find on the downhill tree line in the field prior to the Boy Scout Bridge. He located this large covey with beautiful style and far off the line. He had a consistent pattern, mostly forward and some nicely extended casts.

Fourth place was awarded to Kip's Bay Dark N' Stormy Miss Maddie running in the 9th brace, last brace of the second day of running. John Kipp guided his charge to 7 finds, 3 of which came in the last 12 minutes of the hour. Maddie made some very nice moves and ran the entire hour in a fast and snappy manner.



The Running:

Brace 1: Kip's Bay Flat Out Ridge Run-N Annie (Annie) – John Kipp and Atos – Jackie Hutwagner. Annie made some really nice moves with an attractive manner of going, carding 5 finds with her 4th find demonstrating very nice style. She worked well for her handler at moderate range and a smooth gait to finish the hour. Atos put down a hard charging run, remaining forward and on the edges for his handler. He carded 4 beautiful finds with great intensity and style; his 5th find exhibited a bit too much enthusiasm, ending his day at the 33 min. mark.



Brace 2: Palmetto Point's Autumn's Blazing Star (Autie) – Tom Bass and Sundance Kid's Rocky Mountain Renegade (Rocky) – Mike Poehler. Autie made some nice moves, off the edges some, with speed and enthusiasm; he established a beautiful back on his brace mate's 3rd find with an eventual breech of manners ending his day. Rocky was fast and forward running from find to find carding 5 finds, with his most



memorable being when he disappeared before the Gun Dog parking lot, to be found far forward by his handler who didn't see him buried up as said handler walked through a large covey. Rocky's day ended when he bumped birds at the 51 min. mark.

Brace 3: NMR Labyrinth Late Nite Skye (Skye) – Ed Manifold and Bark River Fresh Water Pearl (Pearl) – Jeff Stanton. Skye demonstrated beautiful bird work, thoroughly working the cover for her handler. She started to card her first of 5 finds at the 2 min. mark. She also had a stop-to-flush and one non-productive during the hour. Her most memorable bird work was her last find, requiring a beautiful relocation on a covey. Pearl broke away with enthusiasm; too much to stand bird contact at the 2 mins. ending her day with exuberance.

Brace 4: Magnum High Velocity (Gauge) – Vince Anderson and KDel's Eagle's Chance to Soar (Chancy) – Kendrick DeLong. Gauge's winning performance is noted above; Chancy ran with speed




and enthusiasm making memorable moves in Hire's field and the Dog Leg field, while carding 3 finds. Her sadly day ended on a flawed relocation at 55 mins.

Brace 5: Renegade's Pancho (Pancho) – Louis Schmitz and Diamond Hill Stormcat (Storm) – Mike String (Elected to drop and run at the end). Poncho demonstrated picturesque style on each of his 4 finds and was fast and forward in his pattern and application. His run required minimal handling except for an encounter with 5 deer early in the brace. Poncho responded crisply to Lou's commands and was a pleasure to watch; unfortunately, his day ended at the 45 min. mark when he was found standing after we'd passed him, and he succumbed to the pressure

before Lou could arrive to handle the situation.

Brace 6: Clarice Havapal's Pocket Pistol (Clare) – Bill Holtz and Alder Whiskey Rebellion (Whiskey) – Dennis Sloan. Clare was fun to watch and her first 2 of 6 finds were handled with nice style and intensity. She made some nice moves and displayed a busy way of going at moderate range. On her 6th stand, she encouraged her handler to hurry up and flush the bird by cheering him on. On her 7th stand, she decided he was taking too long and ended her day at the 40 min. mark. Whiskey made big, sweeping moves and carded 2 finds with style and intensity. His range and speed grew over the brace to the point that he went missing with the tracker being requested at the 42 min. mark.

Brace 7: Spring Hill's Red Hot Performance (Red) – John Bell and



Sigbrit's Evil Side of the Road (Ren) – Ed Manifold. Red's performance is noted above; Ren took a while to get rolling, then worked nicely for Ed at a moderate pace and range. She established point at 7 min. on the left edge bordering the dogleg field with beautiful style and intensity. Moving on she did a nice job hunting but fell victim to temptation on a bird in the cut leading to Hire's Field, ending her day at the 17 min. mark.

Brace 8: Dogwood's Benelli (Benny) – Todd Parmenter and Walker's Prairie Bandit (Ringo) – Dan Dodson. This pair broke away fast downhill towards the Derby course where Ringo was standing early. He withstood great pressure when Benny went with the bird while backing. Ringo continued on alone, standing again on the edge of the Derby woodlot where a hawk kill was sighted after a lengthy flush. Ringo ran with speed and purpose standing for his 2nd find past the Gun Dog parking lot with birds landing near him after the flush. He stood a 3rd time on a frozen bird, then continued forward making a nice move along





the wood's edge and around the corner approaching the Shotgun Range where he ended his day under a bird at 46 mins. on what was shaping up to be a placement worthy run.

Brace 9: Spring Hill's Hail To Pitt Roxee (Roxee) – Ed Kennah (In Season- Dropped to the bottom) and Kip's Bay Dark N' Stormy Miss Maddie (Maddie) – John Kipp. Maddie's placing performance is noted above; Roxce ran as a bye in brace 15a.

Brace 10: Jolly's Christmas Holly (Holly) – Dan Jolly and Romence's Life of Riley (Riley) – Julie Romence. Riley's R/U Champion performance is noted above; Holly was hesitant early, then stretched to take the line on the right, not to be seen again until her scout called point along the Dogleg Field edge where she stood with nice style and intensity. Holly took the center line of Hire's field during Riley's 2nd find and was found standing high and tight in the low area of the line with Riley backing. Holly's day ended when she failed to back Riley's 3rd find earning an unfortunately early ride on the dog wagon.

Brace 11: Palmetto Pointe's Starship Trooper – Tiffany Bass and Shiloh's Sailing the West Wind (Zephyrus) – Ted Foster. Both dogs broke away running hard downhill towards the Derby course, covering a lot of the available objectives and competing with each other to see who could get there first. On the first line of the Derby course at 13 mins., both dogs were under a covey and unfortunately on their way to the penalty box.

Brace 12: Spring Hill's Fancy Wheels (Mags) – John Bell and Waypoint Deacon of the Hunt (Deke) – Thom Christnagel. Both dogs had finds during their time on the ground, with Deke standing 1st at the Derby woodlot. Mags stood at the Sumac line before the creek crossing. Both dogs shared a stop to flush at a cut on the Gun Dog course; each dog running opposite sides of the line. They continued sharing with each



having separate finds at the end of the Gun Dog Orchard on opposite sides of the path. Mags day ended with a breach of manners on Deke's 3rd find, after which Deke ended his bid while enjoying a covey under the Oaks of the Shotgun Range.

Brace 13: Hope's Chief of Crosscreek (Chief) – Mike Poehler and Detroit Rascal's Son of a Gun (Cobo) – Burton McCandless. At the 6 min. mark, after a distracted breakaway, Chief disappeared rapidly forward to be found standing opposite the Horseman's Staging area where he'd been for some time. Cobo backed beautifully on his own. As both handlers arrived, Chief decided to flush on his own, ending his bid at 13 mins. Cobo went on to have 5 finds during his hour, with a nice, consistently forward pattern. His most memorable find being his last, at the woods corner near the Boy Scout bridge standing way off the covey. An early indiscretion kept him out of the placements.

Brace 14: Diamond Hill Stormcat (Storm) – Mike String, Bye. Storm broke away downhill towards the Derby course and had the first of 4 finds before the creek crossing. Storm's run was at moderate speed with a consistent pattern. The nicest of Storms finds came at the 40 min. mark with nice style under the mature trees of the 1st line of the weekend Gun Dog course with multiple birds being flushed. Moving on from the find, a bird popped in the path and Storm unfortunately elected to go with it.



Brace 15: Spring Hill's Hail To Pitt Roxee (Roxee) [In Season] – Ed Kennah, Bye. Roxee broke away just before the Gun Dog Orchard area with a pleasing pace and pattern. Approaching the far edge of the Orchard, she unfortunately put a bird to flight and ended her bid as she was making a very nice move.

Bill Norvell, A Brittany Lover to be Remembered

On Tuesday March 2, I received a call from Rick Smith telling me my longtime friend Bill Norvell of Red Oak, Texas had passed. He was 85, born June 16, 1937 in San Angelo, Texas. It is with a sad heart I pen this text for one of the greatest men I have ever known. Bill died in a hospital in the greater Dallas area. He attended North Dallas High School graduating in 1955, active in ROTC and band, and graduated in 1960 from Southern Methodist University with a degree in Electrical Engineering. He was employed by Martin Marietta in Orlando, Florida from 1960 to 1967, then by Texas Instruments in Dallas from 1967 to 1995 after that a Defense and Space Consultant Contractor from 1996 to the finish of his career. His specialty I always thought was mathematics, especially during conversations I had with him at Brittany events where he and Bill Cartmell who was a mathematician with IBM in Upper New York, were competing with their Britts. Their conversations were away over our heads when technical topics between the two came up. Bill Norvell's specialty was AESA Military Radar design. Bill was very adept at skeet shooting and was a nationally ranked water skier.

I invited Bill to hunt Grouse and Woodcock with me in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, and I asked if a south Texan knew how to get to Michigan. He said he was in Michigan many times troubleshooting at a Chrysler tank plant in Detroit where he solved radar problems. We had great hunts on the plentiful Ruffed Grouse and Woodcock of the era. Bill enjoyed hunting just about any kind of bird and hunted with his friends all over the country. He spent time with his family and friends discussing everything from radar to politics to sports. It is amazing to me, after talking to a host of Bill's longtime friends, in assembling the details for this article, how many of them regarded him as a genius. I would be the first one to jump into that group with an affirmative. Bill's surviving immediate family consists of two daughters, Lora and Linda, his wife Susan, and a host of grandchildren.

Old issues of the American Brittany Magazine looked into by Mary Crawford of Houston, Texas tell us likely the first time Bill Norvell ran a dog in a field trial was in 1969 at a trial of the Texas Coastal Brittany Club where Bill's youngster Brandy's Bullet won first in the Open Puppy stake handled by Rick Smith. Bullet was whelped February 8, 1968. From that point on Bullet was a consistent field trial winner. Thanks to another of my helpers in gathering data for this article, I thank Mary Karbiner for records she forwarded to me, some of which were from Nicky Bissell's charts. Mary Karbiner is a great field trial reporter, club executive and devotes a great portion of her time to Brittany trials. Brandy's Bullet, unquestionably Bill Norvell's greatest Brittany, was inducted into the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame in 2000. He won in his career 42 Brittany Field Trial placements, 29 in adult stakes, of which 17 were firsts, and 8 in juvenile stakes. One of his placements was in a 54 dog stake. He won the National Amateur Brittany Ch. in 1973, also in other years 4th place twice and 3rd place once in that Ch. He also gained a 3rd in the Brittany Quail Classic and a 1st and a 3rd in the Brittany Pheasant Classic. He sired 21 Field Trial winners, 10 of them from one bitch Pollyandra. From my own bookshelves in the Book of the American Brittany, Eighties Edition, written by Rheta Cartmell, a book I printed for Rheta, I found a chart which lists from the 1970's showing Puppy and Derby winners in the East Central, Central and Midwest region. Bullet was the sire of 10 of those winners. Bill Norvell also campaigned and won heavily with Bullet's Buckshot.

I first met Bill Norvell in the early seventies when he entered Bullet in the International Brittany Championship held near Watertown, N.Y. on old, grown up dairy farms which Dr. Walker Heap had purchased to create a hunting preserve and a Brittany field trial area. Club member Bill McClure had invited me to judge that renewal and the Conables and Cartmells were there...strong members of that club. Bullet ran a great hunting race and I simply fell in love with the way he looked for birds but the Texas Quail dog had not been around Running Pheasants long enough to learn their wily running tactics. He learned, and later placed twice in the ABC Pheasant Classic.

In purchasing Bullet from what I call Delmar Smith's Bazooka line, Bill Norvell became a firm believer in that line of breeding and continued with it the rest of his life. Before I go any further let me explain my term "the Bazooka line". It all started many years back when the young trainer Delmar Smith had two Brittanys in training -and running in trials - Buddington Prince and Towsey. Down through the years that line had many field trial wins and many strong dogs in the Smith kennel and the youngster Rick Smith came up with them to his role as a Brittany trainer/handler. Some of the dogs in my "Bazooka line" include Holliday Britt, Holliday Britt's Bazooka, Bazooka's Brandy, Way Kan Jill, Ferdinand of Leeway, Holliday Doc, and many, many more.

What Bill Norvell should be credited for, and heavily credited for in my estimation, is what he did to continue the Bazooka Line. Brandy's Bullet had a full brother, Scipio Spinks, a legendary winning Brittany from the west coast. They were products of the same mating, Bazooka's Brandy to W-Hume's Holliday Cindy, just a few months apart. Bill Norvell had a west coast friend, Ken Jacobson, of Mercer Island, Washington. Ken owned and campaigned a truly great Brittany male, Pacolet's Cheyenne Sam. Sam had a host of field trial placements. To mention just two of his wins, he won the Brittany National All Age Ch. and amazingly the three-hour International Endurance Shooting Dog Championship, handled by Rick Smith, which featured all breeds and there were many well known Pointers and Setters entered in that great Championship, handled by the likes of Ronnie Smith, Sr., Billy Martin, Delbert Clancy, Tom Smith and Dean Lord. I was proud to have judged and reported that fixture on several occasions at Ardmore and Edmond, Oklahoma venues. Bill Norvell and Ken Jacobson teamed up, embarking on a breeding program using the progeny of Bullet, Scipio Spinks and Cheyenne Sam. They produced field

trial winners including Champions. Ken Jacobson in a very pleasurable phone conversation helped me with details for this article.

Bill Norvell also teamed up with Nolan Huffman, a Montana field trialer who owned and campaigned a truly wonderful male Brittany named Nolan's Last Bullet. Bullet had an incredible win record mainly in National Shoot to Retrieve events competing against all breeds. Nolan's Last Bullet also came from the "Bazooka line" and again Bill Norvell and Nolan Huffman teamed up to breed Field Trial Britts. They were successful and the two friends hunted together with Brittanys they had bred on many occasions, all across America. I thank Nolan for our phone conversation to help me with this article.

Unquestionably the most memorable conversation I had with Bill Norvell came about a puppy. It is a bit of a story, but I would like to tell it here. Rick Smith stayed at my home for a week a couple of decades ago between the Eastern and Central Brittany Futurities. He had access to my horse and my next door farmer's extensive land, and worked some of his dogs and some of my dogs. He took home with him on consignment a male Britt sired by Tondee's Valley Duke, a great New England Brittany and my Bazooka's Brandy bitch which Delmar had given me. Rick thought he would be ideal for a Texas Quail lease person. He never got the dog sold, giving him to a kennel helper in lieu of wages, and he and Delmar just said to me, "we owe you a dog. Over the next couple of years each time

I came to Oklahoma, on judging or reporting assignments for the International Endurance Ch. or the US Open, they brought out a dog for me to try out. Very diplomatically I turned down those dogs and finally Delmar said, "just pick a pup out of a Brittany magazine litter and send the bill to me". I found a litter advertised by Bill Norvell sired by Brandy's Bullet out of the dam Pollyandra. I called Bill. He said there were two females left, one was a natural bobtail and the other had a tail. I told him I had to have a tail, because a point without a rigid, erect tail was not really a proper point to me. Bill shipped me the pup which I named Shiawassee Showtime Babe. Several years later, I drove to Crescent Iowa, stayed with Lloyd Budd a couple of days and bred her to the dog of my choice named The Real Thing. One of the pups in my litter was Hall of Fame Rimarda's Trademark.

Gathering all the information for this obit gave me an entirely pleasurable week contacting old friends for information. I spoke on the phone with Mary Crawford, Rick Smith, Bill Norvell's daughter Lora, John and Judy Webb, Mary Karbiner, Ken Jacobson, Nolan Huffman, Bob Fleury and Bernie Matthys and other American Field people. I treasure my time with Bill Norvell, my time hunting with him on his Texas Quail leases, the times he came to Michigan and hunted with me on Grouse and Woodcock. and above all his attention to Brittanys and his lifetime work of loving and helping the breed.

We'd like to thank our judges, Bobby Youngs and Meredith Mays for their time in the saddle observing each and every dog with an attentive and positive eye to select the National Walking Gun Dog Champion. Several people gave of their time and talents to assist in making this a quality National event. Thanks to Chairman Al Cropek and Secretary Sue Lehosky and their committee for all their work putting on this event. Dick Lipsky planted birds on each course the night before as well as replanting daily during the mornings for our afternoon braces as well as feeding them on course.



Thanks to Sue Lehosky and Al Cropek for facilitating our Calcutta; handling the records and money for those bidding on dogs. Kathy Gulembo ran a raffle of a pair of saddle bags or a custom sign provided by Cimarron Designs. Chuck Langstaff drove the dog wagon for a full load of passengers each day. Will Langley served as Judge's Marshall and was there to provide horses for rent for those desiring to ride and watch.

We also thank our corporate sponsors, Purina and Garmin for providing financial support as well as their fine products for participants, winners and placing dogs. Purina Pro Plan food will feed our winning dogs for months to come and a Garmin Pro 550 Plus collar will help track and

train well into the future.

The Ionia Grounds Committee did a wonderful job preparing the courses by mowing and clearing brush so that handlers were afforded a stellar canvas upon which to showcase their dog's performance in each and every brace; the grounds were in great shape thanks to all their efforts during the year.

What is expected of a National Gun Dog Champion? The dog should run with speed and purpose in a manner that it attacks the course before it. Economy of motion and a pattern that takes and keeps an edge while effectively hunting the terrain in front of the dog's handler is preferred to a quartering or yo-yoing pattern. A dog should establish a crisp and deliberate point when locating game, with staunch style and intensity and remain so through the flush and shot making no movement except that necessary to watch the flight of game with the purpose of making a retrieve; a slight turning of the head or body without moving from its location being acceptable. Should a relocation be necessary by the dog to enable its handler to produce a bird during a find, the dog should be deliberate and controlled in its efforts, to not cause the birds to take flight; only the handler should flush the birds. When encountering a brace mate on point, the dog should honor the stand by backing with purpose and style.

This year, we had the vast majority of dogs making an excellent bid for the title of National Walking Gun Dog Champion. Several were flat out getting it done, only to have a breach of manners around birds or a brace mate that ended their bid to become our 2020 Champion. We had dogs who lasted the entire hour, with multiple finds, yet they failed to meet the above criteria in a manner that would conform to the discussed expectations of a National Champion or Runner-up Champion. For these reasons, First and Second placements were withheld; kind of fits with the whole 2020 COVID-19 theme wouldn't you say?



The Running:

Brace 1: Spring Hill's Red Hot Performance (Red) – John Bell and Georgia Drive By (Drive By) – Burton McCandless. Red had a nice run with 6 finds during the hour; his most notable was on a strip of



cover off the tree line near the exit of the Dog-Leg field with excellent style on a covey of birds. Drive By had a beautiful back on Red's first find, ran well making some eye catching moves. At the 30 min. mark he wasn't pleasing his handler and he was put on the dog wagon.

Brace 2: Atos – Jackie Hutwagner and Kip's Bay Dark N' Stormy Miss Maddie (Maddie) – John Kipp – 3rd Place. Atos was flat-out getting it done! He ran hard, taking lines and finishing moves with power and gusto. He had a nice find with style and intensity in the Derby woodlot; his day ended at the 35 min. mark on a perfectly executed stop-to-flush which his handler called him off of being unable to see what had transpired – rotten luck! Maddie had 6 evenly spaced finds during her hour and 1 stop to flush. She displayed a pleasing pattern with a moderate pace and range; her style and intensity improving with each find. Her most memorable find was when she took the line uphill to the lone oak near the NW levy parking lot on a covey of birds where few dogs had hunted. She was awarded 3rd place for her efforts.

Brace 3: KDel's Eagle's Chance to Soar (Chancy) – Kendrick DeLong and Sundance Kid's Rocky Mountain Renegade (Rocky) – Mike Poehler. Chancy had 4 finds, 2 requiring relocation and 2 stop-to-flushes during her hour with a nice pattern at moderate range and speed. Her last find exhibited very nice style and intensity; she was being carried by the judges for a while. Rocky had 1 find with very nice style and intensity and was making some nice moves. He also gave his handler fits at times, especially when he failed to back ending his bid.

Brace 4: High Hopes Jac's Original Spice (Spice) – Cindy Cropek and Shiloh's Sailing the West Wind (Zephyrus) – Ted Foster. Spice and Zephyrus broke away with extreme speed and range flying around the course making nice moves. Zephyrus was out of pocket for a while and reappeared running with Spice down the center line of Hire's field,



where they both elected to end their bid by chasing a covey of birds together near the end of the line.

Brace 5: Magnum High Velocity (Gauge) – Vince Anderson and Hope's Chief of Crosscreek (Chief) – Mike Poehler. This pair broke away heading south into Hire's field with Gauge standing at 2 mins. along the right edge. His day ended when he went with the bird at the flush. Chief was making a serious bid for the Championship. He was running hard, making nice moves and taking the lines, carding 2 finds with style and intensity. He ended his bid when he chased a small covey at 31 mins. entering the Dog Leg field.

Brace 6: Lapat's Cody (Cody) – Al Cropek. Cody ran in place as a bye dog, making nice moves; his most memorable was taking the left edge heading downhill towards the Boy Scout bridge where he dove into the line and came out under birds on the other side, ending his bid.

Brace 7: Kip's Bay Flat Out Ridge Run-N Annie (Annie) – John Kipp and Dogwood's Benelli (Benny) – Todd Parmenter. Annie initiated many nice moves during her hour, having 6 finds with 1 non-productive. Her most memorable find was near the exit of the Dog Leg field, off the line looking into a cover strip with high head and tail where John produced a nice covey for her. Annie earned 4th place for her efforts. Benny ran fast and forward during his time on the ground with a pleasing pattern. He established point near the end of the Hire's field center line, with birds lifting before his handler arrived; he hastened their departure ending his bid at the 20 min. mark.

Brace 8: Miss Behavin' (Ivy) – Al Cropek and Spring Hill's Fancy Wheels (Mags) – John Bell. Ivy had a very exciting run and a pleasing pattern, displaying great style and intensity on her 6 finds. She had 1 non-productive going into her 7th stand on game and after a long flushing attempt and 90 seconds left in the hour, Al elected to relocate her. Ivy bumped birds on relocation, ending a very noteworthy bid for the Championship. Mags put on a very nice show running hard, making nice moves with beautiful style and manners on her divided find. Mags failed to back Ivy's 4th find at the 35 min. mark which ended her bid for the title.

Grovespring, MO January 27-February 2, 2021

Our spring horseback field trial was scheduled to start on Tuesday January 26, 2021 at the Sportsmen's Association Field Trial Grounds in Grovespring, Missouri. The ~10,000 acres of private grounds are groomed and maintained solely for field trial with feed strips lining the edges and thoughtful mowing of the courses. Pre-released and wild coveys of quail are plentiful here; supplemental birds planted during the trial are an added bonus and aid in bringing the resident coveys back on course. Unfortunately, heavy rains inundated the area on Sunday evening and low water bridges from both directions leading to the field trial grounds were under 4 feet of water. Participants were not able to access the grounds until the following day but snow further delayed the start of the trial. The weather was generally cold and rainy for the duration of the event but everyone pitched in to help get the trial completed in spite of the weather-related setbacks.

Many people and Sponsors worked hard to overcome these challenges to make this year's trial a success. Jerry McGee drove the dog wagon. Jim Lowery planted birds for the Open All-Age and Open Gun Dog stakes. Burton Wice and Dave Capstick reseeded the courses during the day because we were forced to re-run over some of the same grounds. Tommy Tracy, Jr, planted and reseeded the course for the amateur stakes. Unfortunately due to COVID-19 restrictions, the club was not able to provide meals to the participants but Burton Wice prepared meals for the judges. Purina donated coupons for large bags of Pro Plan Sport dog food

for the winners of the 1-hour stakes. Collectively, these folks helped make this year's fall horseback field trial a huge success.

WHEN IT ALL STARTED

As I think/contemplate among several ideas to use for the next Brittany Gazette column; it comes to mind that it's been a few years. I looked it up – the writing started second month, February 2014, as Martha Greenlee, who had for several years been writing the column, asked for a "guest columnist" to do the AKC Gazette column. I believe that first column appeared in the July issue of that year. And the writing has continued for these past seven years.

Because of my interest in the breed; focus on the written content of the Brittany columns has been: hunting, field events, the show arena, and training for all those events. An attempt has been made for the column, each quarter, to be somewhat balanced. It has been rather surprising that over these seven years, there has been very limited comment generated by these Brittany columns from the readership. One could speculate that the subject matter just is not of interest; which, as a writer, it is hoped that this has not occurred. Or in this "digital world" we live in, people just do not take or have the time to read the Breed Columns of the Gazette.

Let's go back to the subject "When It All Started". This is a subject that could focus on two areas; personally could be how

our family came to have a Brittany as a family member. Some of that subject has been covered in previous columns. However, the subject selected for this column has to do with the Brittany as a breed.

Often, in this author's opinion there has not been enough emphasis placed on the fact that man developed the different breeds of dogs. For example, it was significant when man began to domesticate the wolf into dogs and use them to help find, trail, and kill game as a food source. Eventually, four separate types of dogs evolved: the guard/protection dog, the herd dog, the sight-hunting dog, and the scent-hunting dog.

With the breeding of these four types, man started to control dog breeding for the purpose for which man specifically intended. Scent-hunting dogs were bred to be of different sizes, to hunt different types of cover, to have keen noses, and to have the ability to retrieve game. Some of these dogs were bred to point upland game birds, while others were bred to flush.


In the province of Brittany, France a dog breed evolved through the breeding by the local farmer/peasant of English and Irish setters with a small local French spaniel. It's the breed today in the United States known as the Brittany. It is recognized in other places of the world, as the Brittany spaniel.

These early breedings, resulted in the Brittany being a small, leggy pointing dog, standing about twenty-inches at the shoulder, and weighing thirty to forty pounds. The Brittany is known for its keen nose and ability to find bird; they are known to be a tough dog with excellent retrieving abilities. It also should be considered, the French farmer/peasant was breeding with a purpose. That purpose was to improve the breed, which needed to be a small hunting dog that could not be found when the Noble's soldiers, who during the early Renaissance years (14th to 17th Century), came to search his home.


Also, consider this breeding was for the benefit of today's sportsmen. The Brittany, which evolved from selectively breeding different pointing and flushing dogs. This produced a dog with outstanding scenting and pointing abilities. It was "man", who, throughout the years has used selective breeding to make those changes to produce the Brittany. This breed has now been standardized and recognized by the American Kennel Club.

When our family started decided to get a dog, there was a search for a relatively small pointing breed of dog with a short tail – tails just do not get along with objects located on top of a coffee table. It was the Brittany. Our family has had the breed for around 55 years and will probably continue to have one as a part of our family. It all starts with a pup!





2020 ABC Prairie Chicken Classic/Championship September 14, 2020

Bassett, NE As observed by Mary Karbiner







The American Brittany Club Prairie Chicken Classic/Championship celebrated its 50th anniversary this year. In September, 1965 the first event was run on Buena Vista Marsh near Stevens Point, WI. Badger Brittany Club petitioned the ABC in the fall of 1962 for establishment of a prairie chicken event. There was skepticism about approval; the classis chair, Ben Heinz, was rather negative about ABC approving. Dr. Fred White, editor of the ABC magazine, had visited the grounds and promoted the venture.

The Buena Vista Marsh is privately owned land that is leased to the State of Wisconsin for propagation of the prairie chicken. Privately funded and with donations of land the area grew to more than 10,000 acres with eight one-hour courses. Rand Constalie, or "Mr. Chicken", was a leader in promoting and organizing this classic for many years. In 1975 and 1976 the classic was held in Nebraska, for the first time being hosted by the Mo Valley Brittany Club. The grounds were 32,000 acres comprising the ranch owned by Jim and Floyd Taylor near Burwell, NE. The terrain has objectives, hills or knobs and almost unlimited visibility across the hay meadows and pastures.

From 1977 through 1982 Badger Brittany Club again hosted the event in Wisconsin. In 1983 a new trend of rotating between these venues began through 2001. It was held in Burwell, NE un 2005 when it was moved northwest to Bassett, NE and had continued on this venue through the current running.

This event is the only all-age stake run on native game birds. The prairie chicken cannot easily be propagated. They require vast acres of grasslands, solitude and lack of human interference. They are not a woodlands dweller but prefer the open meadows where they can see predators.

To quote a paragraph that Dr. Cloid Grreen wrote in his introduction for the 1988 event, a description of what a dog must show in this event, "He should possess such an intense desire to hunt that he ignores the pain of sand burrs (a synonym for sand hills) and cacti, and the fatigue of a big course. He must have the stamina to surrport this desire, an attribute to which we feel particular attention should be directed in selecting breeding stock. But wide open spaces are exhilarating, and promote uncontrolled behavior. Reasonable compliance to the handler without inhibition of the above qualities must also be seen. We look for style and class in the all-age dog. The frequently underrated and misunderstood requirement that a dog be steady to wing and shot demonstrated the toughness of character required to take training without losing any of the initial desire and intensity."

The 2020 ABC Prairie Chicken Classic commenced running on Monday, September 14. This is the 57th running of this event. The venue of Rock County landowners consisting of Butch Fischer, Curtis Luther, Wade Dearmont and we headquartered at Ted Morton's. They again allowed us to run across their ranches. We are greatly in their debt for their generosity.

From a field of 43 entries only 38 dogs went to the line. A handler needed to scratch due to health issues. The winner who ran in the first brace, Piney Run Jake, held his lead in the stake with many dogs pushing his performance. Jake is owned and handled by Kent Patterson of Tennessee. Jake is a white and orange model born in 2013. His sire

is NFC FC AFC Piney Run Art x Piney Run Gypsy. He had many hour wins and placements to his credit. His brace started slow and continued to build making wider and longer casts. At 56' he pointed a single with all in order and again at 58; scored another fine. He ended his hour with a strong finish. Runner-up was Ru-Jem's "Last" Penny owned by Jerry McGee and handled by Tom Tracy. Penny is no stranger to the winners circle. She was whelped May of 2010. Her sire is FC Trademark's ATM x Red Bud Zipper. Third and fourth places were withheld.

Nestle-Purina has long been a supporter of the performance dog since the early 90's. They provide dog food for the winners and monetary support to aid in running a quality event. Also, thank you Garmin for donating one of their outstanding training collars. We thank these sponsors for their donations and support to the sport.

Our judges were Jeff Schnipkoweit of Tecumshe, Nebraska and Jay Lewis of Ashland, Missouri. Both gentlemen have judged many breeds on various venues and were attentive to their task.

The sand hills are a unique area to the Midwest with rolling hills and tall grass meadows that prairie chicken thrive in. This is the only Brittany All-Age stake with native birds. The prairie chicken cannot be caged and released to supplement the population for an event. The first ABC Prairie Chicken Classic was held at Buena Vista Grasslands Area near Plover, Wisconsin in 1964. In 1975 it began to rotate between there and Nebraska. The last event in Wisconsin was held in 2000. The sand hills have been its home since that time.

The committee would like to thank everyone who participated and helped with the work. Tom Maneely, and AKC Field representative was on hand and did his share of helping with gates. The back-bones of this outfit are Stan and Claudia Truksa. They do all the pre-trial work, take all the guff, marshal, do the secretary job and any other things that need to be finished to put on this event. Ray Trimble brought the coffee and rolls from town. They were provided by Jeanna Harmon of the Corral Bar in Bassett. Ray is one of the longest attending members this even has had the privilege to ride with. He judged this event in 1968. Pssst...he's 94.

This year we had an obstacle to deal with...Covid 19. Being outside was easy to handle the distancing, but the annual steak dinner was canceled and restaurant service was limited. This year we were offered a new food service. Rhonda Houkos supplied us with breakfast and lunch items that were delicious. We thank her for making this service available to us.

Sir Walter Raleigh-Tracy, Piney Run Jake-Patterson. Raleigh and Jake were away to the north making a swing back to the front. Both dogs started slow with Jake opening up as the hour progressed. Raleigh's pattern was somewhat erratic. At 55' Jake pointed a single with all in order and again at 58' pointing with the same intense style. Raleigh continued to be erratic in application to finish the hour without bird contact.

County Line's That Guy-Truksa, Roustabout All In-Tracy. We headed west from a gate with both dogs making some good moves. At 9' Guy swung to the left, working a swale. He pointed, the single flushed and he wanted a better look. Al had a nonproductive at 20' in the big bale meadow. His race shortened and he was up at 45' at the end of the honey hole meadow.

Quanah-Tracy, McChesney's All Down The Line-Johnson.

Quanah had a stop to flush at 20; and again at 30' running at moderate range. Mac kept getting wider till the string broke. Quanah had a find at 33' with all in order. He finished the hour at moderate range. The tracking device was pulled at 40' for Mac.

MK's Magnificent Bandito-Johnson, Kashmir-Tracy. Chico wasn't running and was picked up at 20'. Kash had a find at 21' on a single. From there he went into hunting mode and was up at 40'.

WW's Gin and Tonic-Tracy, Mk's My Little Ammo-Johnson. The wind has become gusty this afternoon. Ginny ran with an erratic patter. Bibi ran a nice prairie race. Neither dog was rewarded with birds.

Sniksoh Little Diamond-Johnson, Molly Mae Alexander-Tracy. Diamond ran a nice race under gusty wind conditions. She made some impressive moves. Molly started confidently handling the wind then things fell apart. She was up at 35'. Diamond continued forward in the gusty winds without bird contact in the hour.

Roustabout's Eustace-Capstick, George's White Lightning-Tracy. The wind was still blowing pretty good from the south. We traveled across the hay meadow into the next pasture. Lightning went forward and Tee swung to the left around the pine tree wind break at the rancher's homestead. Lightning pointed in the east meadow at 28', a long relocation ensued but nothing was produced. Tee appeared to the front after rimming the long wind break. He continued his reaching casts. Lightning pointed at 56' near a fence line. A single lifted, dog hesitated then went to see. Tee had made another cast around the shelterbelt showing into the grace period. He had no bird contact in the hour.

JB's Full Speed Ahead-Tracy, County Line's Full Throttle-Truksa. JB had a nonproductive at 3'. Mac started fast and strong covering some country. JB had a find at 23' along the fence line to the south of us. He finished the hour at moderate range. Mac had slowed his application and was up at 35'.

Dirty Dingus McGee-Tracy, Arrow's Tequila Rustler-Beaver. Both dog started strong with Rusty settling into hunting mode. Dingus pointed a bird at 24' and at the flush he decided to follow. Rusty was up at 25' not pleasing the handler. Brace ended at the north end of the honey hole meadow.

Jowill's Daniel In The Lion's Den-Tracy, Marjo's Fille De La Bretagne-Perry. Daniel made some nice moves early. Brie started the hour with good casts then shortened and was up at 35'. Daniel had a hard time maintaining the front and was leashed at 40'.

Ru-Jem's "Last" Penny-Tracy, Brigadoons High Proof Moonshine-Perry. The opening casts were at moderate range. At 21' near the lake gate Penny pointed. Hooch ran past as the birds flushed, failing to honor. Penny stood high and tight throughout. She continued the rest of the hour with reaching casts searching for game.

Brendi Brooks Cowboy Up-Tracy, Tj's Black Diamond-Perry. Both dogs were off with gusto. Coal ran a lateral race, hard to keep to the front. Cowboy was fluid in his race. He had an unproductive during the hour. Both dogs finished without any bird contact.

The morning was sunny with temps in the 70's. Big Mac XIV-Tracy, bye. Mac ran at moderate range without any game contact in the hour.

JJ's Levi The Lionheart-Tracy, bye. Levi started strong. At 5' he pointed staunchly though the handler couldn't produce any birds with a relocation. He continued his wide reaching casts but found no game in the hour.

WW's Miss Wendy Pfeffercorn-Tracy, bye. Just past the windmill Wendy pointed at 18'. She was relocated but no game was produced. The course turned into the wind, she shortened and was up at 35'.

This morning the temperature is warmer and windy with full sun. Roustabout Blew By-Tracy, Willie Makeit-Johnson. Blew ran

wide to the east. The course swings around south then back west. He went deep and was out of pocket for a lengthy period. Willie had bird contact and was fired over. However, the judge arrived over the hill too late to see the action. Willie finished the hour with a strong forward race.

Jagoub's Spell caster-Tracy, Second Amendment-Perry. Tabu ran a strong first half hour, shortened and was up before the end of the hour. Remi hunted the cover ending her time on the ground before the end of the hour.

CVK's Ironman-Tracy, bye. We left the high line heading east. Tony pointed, a single flushed, he followed putting another bird in the air to end this brace.

Maxwell's Prickly Pete-Tracy, bye. Sky was overcast and cooler this morning, wind is still blowing. Pete made some good casts. At 48' he pointed, relocated with a very lengthy flushing attempt ensuing. He finished the hour without bird contact.

Driving Miss Daisy-Tracy, bye. We were westbound. Daisy was slow to start then gained momentum. She made the trip around the outside of the honey hold meadow and beyond. She was up near the end of the hour.

Castaway Wilson-Tracy, bye. Wilson was wide and hard to maintain the front. He was up at 20'.

Glade Run Booker's Shadow-Tracy, bye. Booker is fast on the ground, checking out everything. At 13' up in the hills, he had an unproductive. He slowed to run at hunting range and was up at 30'.

CVK Spartan King-Tracy, bye. Leo ran wide to the outer limits. He was out of pocket at the east end of our swing, then was gathered up to be leashed at 35'.

Prairie Wind Pistol Pete-Tracy, bye. Pete pointed at 5' in a swale. Handler briefly flushed and sent him on. He was up at 30' not pleasing the handler.

ABC Futurity Rules can be found on the ABC Website and in the ABC Policy Book CONDITIONS AND RULES FOR FUTURITY ELIGIBILITY

- The 2022 American Brittany Futurity shall be open to every Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of January 1 December 31, 2020, who is owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club, and whose litters have been Futurity nominated with The American Brittany Club. Sires do not necessarily have to be owned/leased by an American Brittany Club member. All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered with AKC, CKC, or FDSB.
- The nominating breeder needs to be a current full member in Good Standing of
 the ABC when the litter is nominated and the closing dates of the of the Sectional
 Futurities in which puppies from their nominated litter compete. They must sign
 the Litter Nomination form, and any breeder purse checks will be paid to this
 designated nominated breeder. If their membership has lapsed at the time of the
 Sectional Futurity, the purse will revert back to the ABC Futurity Administrative
 Fees
- Nominations of dams must be made within 60 days after a bitch has whelped, and a Nomination Fee of \$40.00 ("First Forfeit") must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of the nominated litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Show) after the puppy has been properly registered with AKC or FDSB. Nomination Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors.
- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule: In addition to the Nomination Fee of \$40.00, late fees are \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be accepted at the discretion and decision of the ABC Futurity Committee. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time.
- A Final Forfeit Fee, to be eligible to compete in the Sectional Futurities (Western/Central/Eastern), is due by October 1, 2021, and is submitted by the owner of the eligible puppy. Futurity Entry Fees will also be paid prior to 2022 Sectional Futurity events by the owner of the eligible puppy for each Sectional Futurity event in which the eligible puppy is entered. Final Forfeit Fees as well as Sectional Futurity Entry Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors and subject to change.


