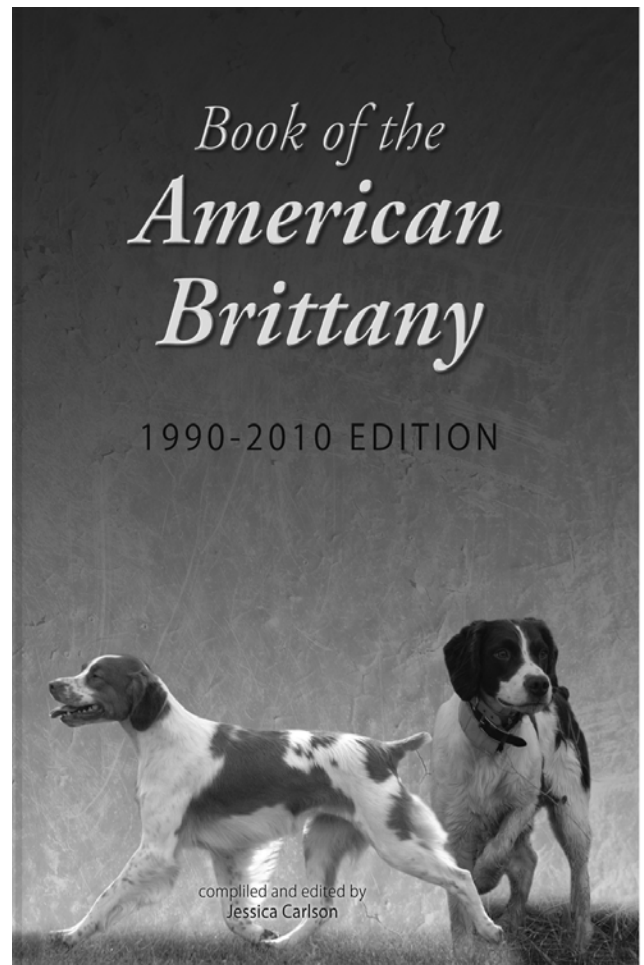

The 2021 National Amateur Gun Dog Championship held in Booneville, Arkansas had a total of 31 dogs entered; a scratch in the running brought it to 30 dogs total in the stake. Sniksoh Little Diamond (Kate), originally 4b was declared in season. She moved down to run in the last brace which was a bitch running as a bye dog. A scratch from 14b, Diamond Hill Sonshine and Whiskey (Dani) moved Sniksoh Hank's Hatch (Hatch) from the original 4b down to run in 14b. With these changes, brace five became four and the remaining braces followed suit.

Our esteemed judges for the 2021 National Amateur Championship were Kelli Aitken from Manhattan, Kansas and Stan Williamson from Lewiston, Missouri. These reputable judges have overseen many significant championships and titled numerous dogs from various breeds.

The winner's dinner was provided by Roger Fiorito in honor of last year's champion, Hurricane Banjo. On the menu were catfish, chicken and jambalaya. The food and camaraderie were enjoyed by all, especially combined with the theme of Christmas.

Thank you to our sponsors Purina and Garmin. Purina fuels

many of the competitors, providing financial support for the event and complimentary bags of dog food for each entry. The winners received Pro-Plan dog food, an electronic training collar and a trooper saddle that was hand-tooled and crafted by Kevin Parish, The Saddle Guy. Trophies and plaques awarded to the placing dogs.

Thank you also to the Field Trial Chairman, Lisa Pollock, and Darlene Dow for serving as the Field Trial Secretary. The reporter was Joanne Perry. Stakes manager John Perry led members of the Field Trial Committee; Vince Anderson, Roger Fiorito, Tommy Thomas and Teresa Richmond. Thank you to all the marshals who volunteered. The winners: The Champion, Sniksoh Hank's Hatch and third place finisher, Hurricane Banjo from brace 14 Hurricane Banjo (Banjo) – Roger Fiorito and Sniksoh Hank's Hatch (Hatch) – Adam Freeman. Banjo disappeared for a few minutes before showing to the front, while Hatch ran strong and wide. Adam called point at 19 as Hatch stood very stylish with good manners. At 25 point was called at the island for Banjo with a nice covey find. Both dogs ran strong. We were coming out of the Fish Hook when Banjo scored with another big covey on the left side, scoring again as we headed down the strip. Hatch was out of sight for a few minutes; then as we headed towards old 109, point was being called for Hatch back in the corner and for Banjo at the cross-hedge row by old 109. With a shot fired from beyond, Hatch came to the front with Adam directly behind. Roger took a nonproductive for Banjo. Both dogs took to the front, Banjo scoring one more time at 59 and Hatch still forward when time was called.

From brace 7 came the runner-up ATOS. ATOS (ATOS) – Jackie Hutwagner and Romence's Life of Riley (Riley) – Julie Romence. ATOS had nice range and a good motor, while Riley worked closely and was attentive. At 18 both dogs were standing and a divided find was awarded. ATOS scored again at 26 on a nice covey with good intensity and Riley backed. At the Big Oak, Riley had a good covey find with plenty of style at 33. ATOS was seen standing at 46 with Riley coming towards the find; Riley did not back and was thus out of the running. ATOS scored and was sent forward. As we rode towards the cross hedgerow, ATOS had another intense find. Time was called as we headed towards the double red gates.

Fourth place from brace 4 was Copley-Shelttany Echo of Angels.



Copley-Shelttany Echo of Angels (Zoie) – John St. Clair and Sigbrit's Not a Trace of Rust (Rusty) – Bobbie Sigmund.

At 8 Bobbie called point on the left side. Judges called it a stop to flush. Zoie also had a stop to flush by the Big Oak, and her scout called point at 42 at the pond on the right. The shot was fired for Zoie and the game was to the front where she was headed. Rusty looked a bit tired at 48, but then after the red gate, made a nice cast all the way down the left side of the field. Zoie caught the front and both dogs completed the hour.

Day 1 – Friday, December 10, 2021

Warm humid weather in the morning 65°. The afternoon reaching 80°.

Brace 1: Pretty Blue Eyes a Sweet Touch of Charlie B (Charlie) – Robert Bakas and Jazz Em Up Arrow (Arrow) – Rick Hastings. Both dogs took to the front then disappeared for a bit. As the dogs came to the front, they took turns getting forward. At 30, Charlie went through a big covey that ended his run. Tucked back on the right at 38, point was called for Arrow. After multiple relocations, Rick moved Arrow on. On the treeline at 50, Arrow was seen standing. The bird took flight and Arrow finished the hour.

Brace 2: Knine's Finale's Way to Go (Allie) – Tommy Thomas Dogwood's Benelli (Benny) – Tod Parmenter. Allie went straight to work with power and range. Benny was forward with a closer range. At 23, Allie was found on point. As the covey lifted, Allie stood high and tight. In the Fish Hook at 41, Allie scored another stylish find with Benny backing. Allie continued strong and both dogs finished the hour.

Brace 3: High Velocity Copper Magnum (Colt) – Vince Anderson and Marjo's Fille De La Bretagne (Brie) – Bob Goldman. The dogs went forward working the right side of the field. Colt's range became very close, working with a mind of his own. Brie was crossing from side to side with her handler keeping her in range. At 21, Brie had a stylish covey find. At the split in the road point was called again for Brie, back off the road for another small covey find; her third find was in cornstalks off to the right. At 56 she had a non-productive. Colt continued on to finish in close range, while Brie finished to the front on the right edge.

Brace 4: described in the winners.

Brace 5: B&T's Sundance Kid Rock (Rocky) – Trasa Fowler and Miss Behavin' (Ivy) – Jon St. Clair. The afternoon temperature was nearing 80° with a very warm wind. At 21 Ivy had a non-productive. Rocky's run was a bit erratic at times. Point was called for Rocky at 26 before the Fish Hook with Ivy backing. Trasa relocated Rocky, who had a pile of feathers, and Ivy was moved on. As Ivy came out of the Fish Hook, she decided to lift a covey of birds and was thus out of contention. Rocky scored a find in the trees on the right edge and hit the wild covey at old 109 at time.

Brace 6: Starlight's Mercury Out Ryder (Ryder) – Teresa





Richmond and Just Call Me Lucky Ned Pepper (Ned) – Frank Campbell. Both dogs had a good strong breakaway to start the brace. Frank called point for Ned 10 minutes in, and Ryder's run ended early as he didn't back Ned and thought he should help flush the nice covey of birds. Ned stopped initially then took a couple steps so that his run was also over. That ended the afternoon early.

Day 2 – Saturday, December 11, 2021

The morning was chilly, but the high temperature was in the mid 50's.

Brace 7: described in the winners.

Brace 8: Sonny's Hot Summer Breeze (Breezy) – Tommy Thomas and Leona Valley's Sonny Red Side Up (Red) – Lisa Pollock. Breezy hunted forward. Tommy called point for Breezy as Red ran in to steal point; thus Red was up while Breezy went forward, scoring at 26 after the u-turn on course 2, then again at 30 with another nice covey find. She had a non-productive at 48 before ending her brace with a bump at 52.

Brace 9: Magnum High Velocity Top Gun (Gunnar) – Vince Anderson and TJ's Black Diamond (Coal) – John Perry. This brace was cut short for both dogs. At 10 Gunnar had a non-productive and Coal had a feather find. Coal was up at 13 as he bumped a bird; Gunnar was leashed at 25 as he was very close and not pleasing his handler.

Brace 10: It's 5 O'clock Somewhere (Cooper) – Rebecca Walters and TNT's Sirius Renegade Buddy Boy (Buddy) – Tommy Thomas This was also a shorter brace. Cooper had a non-productive at 15 by Lick Creek, while Buddy had not been seen since the breakaway; Tommy pulled the tracker for him. Cooper was working very close and the handler picked him up, saying it just wasn't his day.

Brace 11: Josey's Jazz Em Up Rascal (Rascal) – Rick Hastings and Kid's Royal Casey (Casey) – Bruce Heiter. Rascal's run was close at times; his first score was at 13 with a good find. Casey was ordered up for not backing Rascal at 20. Before entering the Fish Hook at 27 Rascal had his 3rd find, then a non-productive at 36. He had another find coming



out of the Fish Hook and scored again mid-way down the field, finishing his brace with a last find as time was called.

Brace 12: Red Granites Henry Will Be a Star (Henry) – Bob Bakas and Coos Triple Six (Boomer) – Brent Rupnow. Henry's time on the ground was short-lived when he chased. Boomer scored at 33 as the scout found him tucked in the cover pointing a nice covey with style. Brent kept Boomer attentive and in range as Boomer hunted hard and finished the hour.

Day 3 – Sunday, December 12, 2021

There was a heavy frost first thing in the morning with the temperature hovering at 30°.

Brace 14: described in the winners.

Brace 13: Diamond Hill Ain't My Fault (Scout) – Lisa Pollock and Magnum High Velocity (Gauge) – Vince Anderson. Both dogs worked close in range. Point was called for Gauge at 8 on the left in the corn stalks. After 2 relocations Vince took a non-productive and moved forward. Scout made a nice cast at 40. At 46 Gauge was standing on point and when Scout came in for the same bird her time on the ground ended. After relocating Gauge multiple times, he ended with his second non-productive.

Brace 15: Saradac's Dangerous Diamond Caper (Caper) – Lisa Pollock and Sniksoh Little Diamond (Kate) – Bruce Heiter. At 4, Kate's scout was calling point on the right. Kate's bird work was impeccable and stylish! Also on the left, Caper had a flawless find. Kate and Caper both took to the front. After Mario's Hill, Kate went wide and out of sight while Caper worked hard in the cover. At 25, with Kate MIA, Bruce asked for the Garmin. At 31 by the Trap House, Caper's last find was too much to handle. Lisa went in to flush and a few birds started to lift, then the field exploded! With quail flying directly at Caper and multiple birds hitting her face and body she tried to stay steady by shaking her head to dodge them; however, it was like a scene from an Alfred Hitchcock movie and she needed to sit down to protect herself. This ended the day on an unforgettably dramatic note.

CONDITIONS AND RULES FOR FUTURITY ELIGIBILITY



- The 2023 American Brittany Futurity shall be open to every Brittany bitch and her progeny whelped during the calendar year of **January 1 - December 31, 2021**, who is owned or leased by a member of The American Brittany Club, and whose litters have been Futurity nominated with The American Brittany Club. Sires do not necessarily have to be owned/leased by an American Brittany Club member. All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered with AKC, CKC, or FDSB.
- The **nominating breeder** needs to be a current full member in Good Standing of the ABC when the litter is nominated and the closing dates of the of the Sectional Futurities in which puppies from their nominated litter compete. They must sign the Litter Nomination form, and any breeder purse checks will be paid to this designated nominated breeder. If their membership has lapsed at the time of the Sectional Futurity, the purse will revert back to the ABC Futurity Administrative Fees.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 60 days after a bitch has whelped, and a Nomination Fee of \$40.00 ("First Forfeit") must be paid at this time.** This payment will entitle each puppy of the nominated litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Show) after the puppy has been properly registered with AKC or FDSB. Nomination Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors.
- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** In addition to the Nomination Fee of \$40.00, late fees are \$60.00 (total of \$100) for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 (total of \$140) for 91-180 days. Nominations after 180 days will be accepted at the discretion and decision of the ABC Futurity Committee. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations. The ABC Board of Directors may impose additional late fees from time to time.
- A Final Forfeit Fee, to be eligible to compete in the Sectional Futurities (Western/Central/Eastern), is due by October 1, 2022, and is submitted by the owner of the eligible puppy. Futurity Entry Fees will also be paid prior to 2023 Sectional Futurity events** by the owner of the eligible puppy for each Sectional Futurity event in which the eligible puppy is entered. Final Forfeit Fees as well as Sectional Futurity Entry Fees are set by the ABC Board of Directors and subject to change.
- Beginning 1/1/2020, all litter nominations will be acknowledged via both email and written notification sent**

We appreciate the mowing and upkeep of the grounds by the State of Connecticut DEEP, as well as the dedication and hard work of president, Dick Frawley. Tom and Robin Maule put on a fabulous Italian dinner in honor of last year's champion Shailorville's Gunner. Lunches were provided to all both days.

Also, thanks go to the committee: Chairman: Henry Wierzbicki, Secretary: Leslie Jane Hunt, Reporter: Sarah Conyngham, Bill and Fran Gorman, Rita Poland and a special thank you to bird planter MJ Haesche. Saray Buck, a visitor from Newport, Maine, photographed the winners as well as action photos during the championship.

This year we were fortunate to have two respected judges: Andrew Campbell from Northfield, MA and Sarah Conyngham from Hope Valley, RI. We thank them for their wisdom, judgment, and kind manner.

2021 Open Brittany Shooting Dog Championship

GFC/FC/AFC I'm Your Man owned by Frances Gorman and handled by Ben Lorensen was named the 2021 Open Brittany Shooting Dog Champion. CH Wingra's Indy Go! owned by Patty and Craig Johnston, and Emmy Wollenberg and handled by Kyle Merrill was the runner-up champion. Third

place was Sligo Sam owned by Bill Gorman and handled by Ben Lorensen. Fourth place was GFC/FC/AFC/Kip's Bay Dark 'N Stormy owned by John and Travis Kipp and handled by John Kipp.

Summer and fall were with us in this year's championship. The first morning broke overcast, mild, and humid with an unexpected afternoon thunderstorm crushing the third brace, followed by autumn's cooler and clearer air. With the exception of affected brace, the dogs enjoyed decent conditions with some odd scenting parameters or so it seemed. Fall's heavy cover may have played a role, despite evident and extensive mowing.

Brace 1 - 8:58am Annie/John Kipp and Sammie/Kyle Merrill. Both showed a youthful pattern on the course. Sammie was picked up at 9:15 and Annie completed the hour with four finds, using remarkable groundspeed. The hedgerow that climbs the Tobacco Hill held the first of Annie's finds (9:15). The second occurred on the far side of the Clubhouse Field (9:30) and the third bird finally flew for the handler at the end of Dearborn where she patiently waited. She concluded the hour with a find in the oaks of the derby course's return loop at 9:57 with some lessening of intensity.

Brace 2 - 10:14am Winnie/Mario Maiale and Indy/Kyle Merrill hit the course with clear intentions. At 10:31 Winnie started the ball rolling with a find at pond cover. Indy had negotiated the back stretch like a champion, sliding along edges including the left upper edge of Fox Hill to its conclusion at the culvert. At 10:39, Indy intently pointed in the left hedgerow heading up Tobacco Hill. The walking bird necessitated a relocation which was successfully executed for the find. At 10:41, the same cover yielded a bird to Winnie's experienced sensibilities. The top of the Tobacco Barn

field held another find for Indy (10:42), but Clubhouse Field cost Indy a nonproductive. Winnie dug one out toward the power line (10:49), where few dogs had a find, and both dogs continued to Dearborn. Indy pointed birds at the beginning of Dearborn (10:57), and at the end (11:06). While Winnie closed the gap at the last Dearborn find, no clear opportunity to back was observed. Indy prevailed in this brace in style and application.

Brace 3 - 11:45am Eli/Kyle Merrill and Sam/Ben Lorensen Storm clouds had threatened earlier and rain required appropriate gear, but hard rain, thunder, and lightning had us wondering about our future. The braced mates looked promising in pattern and speed, on the lower side of the Tobacco Barn Field showcasing beautiful edge runs. Due to the weather conditions with flashes of lightning, Kyle headed in with Eli at 12:15. However, Sam was doing such a fine job for Ben that the team was encouraged to continue despite conditions. Sam was strong and forward, finding his bird in the Clubhouse Field at 12:18pm. The remainder of the brace proved challenging for all, and Sam was credited with good effort.

Brace 4 - 4:14pm Maddie/John Kipp and Cody/Kyle Merrill After a delay anticipating more bad weather which never arrived, the trial recommenced and so did the rain. Maddie took off with gusto, but Cody was taken up after a reluctance to back at the top of the hill past the Pines and culvert. Maddie's find was clean notwithstanding interference (4:20). Maddie's animated run was a pleasure to watch as she sagely coursed through likely objectives. At 4:34, Maddie had a find in the perpendicular hedgerow past the large culvert on the back stretch. She seems unsure but continued to stand through the flush of the birds and gunfire. At the end of Dearborn at 5pm, she added to her tally with a covey find, her style somewhat understated.

Brace 5 - 8:03am Major/Kyle Merrill and Cody/Ben Lorensen cut loose on Wednesday morning under sunny skies with heavy dew. Both dogs were on fire, not easily seen. The uphill side of the Tobacco Barn Field carried Major on the lower side and Cody on the upper edge in an impressive run to the far end. Both dogs were seen heading to the Clubhouse Field and again on the other side. Kyle picked up his charge at 8:37am with some pattern problems, and Ben continued with Cody on his strong bid. At 9:00am, Cody bumped into a bird on the return loop at the shooting fields and unfortunately took additional steps (9:00am).

Brace 6 - 9:17am Gracie/Kyle Merrill exploded from the start line as a bye. Kyle called for the tracker after Gracie failed to join us on the course after due consideration (9:33).

Brace 7 - 9:57am Parker/Kyle Merrill and Gunnar/Vince Anderson took off beginning a very attractive brace with the dogs athletically threading in and out of the cover, Parker with a stronger range. At 10:09, Parker stood in the Islands past the Pond for a series of flushed birds that flew past and over him. At 10:14, in the perpendicular hedgerow past the culvert, Parker nailed several more birds for a clean find. At the top of Tobacco Barn Hill (10:19), Parker missed his opportunity to back and concluded his day. Gunnar's find was good. Gunnar searched the near side of the end of Dearborn and was inspired to hunt the other side where he added to his total finds (10:41). Past the Pines, Gunnar pointed in the low wetland swale. Exceptionally heavy cover probably contributed to the decision to take a nonproductive (10:51).

Brace 8 - 11:55am Gus/Ben Lorensen and Rusty/Kyle Merrill began their bid with determination. They appeared to be familiar veterans as they worked the course, at times together. Rusty's run closed out with an indiscretion at 12:19 while Gus's wheels were just warming up. He would disappear, and as we would begin to worry, reappear. As he figured out the mown pattern of Dearborn, we admired his aspect swinging around corners to find the edge. Again we wondered where or if we would see him again only to find him standing at the end of Dearborn (12:32pm). He stood high as the birds flew past him and shots were fired, then he became even stronger

and more forward. Near the end of the course he was skillfully discovered standing in cover near a sheltered pond in the woods close to the shooting fields. Some time passed before the bird was located running away at a distance, all of which had no effect on Gus (12:51). He was loosed, now having run farther faster than any other dog in the competition. Continuing down Truman's Crossing aka The Goat Path, Gus was again out of sight. Soon time was called and the game of producing the dog was on. Ben rode forward to locate his dog at some distance to the front, to our collective relief.

Brace 9 - 1:19pm Gunner/ Ben Lorensen and Ringer/Matt Basilone concluded the trial with a couple of hot ones. Gunner's first bird presented in an unlikely spot, unmoving in a mown strip on the side opposite the Islands. Gunner proved steady at close quarters and we moved on to Gunner's second find the top of the Tobacco Barn field (1:37). Ringer disappeared despite Matt's resounding efforts to summon his charge. His tracker was pulled at 1:40 and Gunner's followed at 2:06.

The Dog in Front of You

It's a magnificent picture, that dream in your head of your young dog, working perfectly with style and grace and gently retrieving to hand. You revel in the praise and compliments from your hunting friends as they watch him work and in the pride you feel inside. Problem is, your young dog is nowhere close to the image in your mind or what you want him to become. That's okay. You have time. The big question is this: How do you get there?

Your plan for that perfect dog is your end game – it's important to have that goal. It's the dream, the picture in your head you look at every day. And with dedication, hard work, and a little luck, you can get your dog there. For now, though, let's put that picture away and get on with real life. Real life in dog training is about small, often miniscule, goals and successes. Along the way, there will be setbacks and days when you wonder what happened to the do that seemed to be coming along so well and then for whatever reason isn't cooperating today. The key to that is the word today.

It doesn't matter if you're working with a puppy, a started young dog, or your seasoned and mature dog. And it doesn't matter what your plan was for training, because your dog will tell you what he needs to work on that day. Sometimes what the dog needs is in direct opposition to whatever you had planned. When that happens, your job is to recognize that and start from there, often scrapping your original plan. There are times when you'll be able to work through what the dog needs on that day and at that moment, and then ease on into your planned training. There will be other days when the dog just needs to work on what he shows you he needs rather than what you had intended, meaning your original workout may go right out the window for that session.

Train the dog that's in front of you. Not the dog you had yesterday or last week or the dog you plan to have next month. Dogs aren't always the same every day, just like we aren't the same. It's hard to bring you're a-game every single day when maybe you didn't get enough sleep, or you have a lot on your mind, or just don't feel all that well. A dog can have off days, too. And sometimes his off day is a direct result of his human thinking he really knew a particular skill when in actuality the dog was starting to understand but it really wasn't confirmed enough to be solid. None of that is a permanent problem – as long as you train the dog in front of you on that day.

Your job as your dog's trainer and partner is to pay close attention and evaluate. You should already have some sort of routine in place as to how you start a training session. If you start like we do, on the chain gang, look for differences in how your dog is acting. Does he usually settle right in and wait calmly? If that's the usual habit and we hope it is) yet today the dog is anxious and jumping and just won't calm down, he's telling you something about what he needs from you today in order to have a successful session.

The hardest part about this is having the patience to change the plan completely and do what's in the dog's best interest in the long run. For example, let's say you have an outing planned to work on birds with a friend and his dog. Both dogs are well started and mostly steady but need that finishing touch. That's the plan for today – working on steadiness. However, your dog will not settle on the chain because he's so excited, and you're looking forward to some serious bird work.

What is your dog telling you he needs today in order to be successful and learn? He needs to be calm and focused, and right now he's not; but you're anxious to get to the bird work because that's why you set up this session. Plus, the last two weekends when you and your friend trained together, your dog did really well, so he should be in the same mental spot today and ready to continue forward progress, right? Not necessarily. It takes more than a few repetitions for a dog to be solid and develop that positive behavior into a habit. Just because that training skill went well the first few times doesn't mean it will always go that well.

You now have a few choices. First, you can continue with your plan to go straight to bird work and hope the wheels don't fall off, even though your dog is not showing any semblance of control. Or, you can wait to let him settle and then hopefully, after a short time, he will calm down and you can carefully move on with your plan while watching closely for any sign of loss of control

And what if your dog just won't chill out and relax? Then maybe today isn't the best time to reward that behavior with any bird work at all, as disappointing as it may seem. The dog has to earn his way off the chain by being calm and standing still. If you decide to go ahead and take him off the chain and to the field, you've just given him permission to misbehave on the chain – he's learned that he gets to go to the field when he's bouncing and acting wild instead of standing still and focusing on you.

Excitement is good, and you can't fault enthusiasm. However, that enthusiasm has to be under control, because if it's not, what do you think will happen when you put that amped up dog on birds? If he can't stand still before the bird work starts, do you think he will suddenly decide to be still and steady when he gets a bird contact? It's pretty likely the whole exercise you planned so carefully will fall apart and your dog will make mistakes due to lack of control. That wastes a day and, in turn, sets your training expectations back.

Train the dog in front of you. You're probably going

to toss your original training plans for that day right out the window, and you've got to be okay with telling yourself that. If you can work through whatever problem you're having and move back to your initial plan, great. But don't be tempted to rush things if it doesn't feel right. There is always another day. This isn't the dog you had the last two weekends, and if you play your cards right, it won't be the dog you have next weekend. But it's the dog you have today, and your goal should be to do whatever it takes to get back to the calm and focused dog you had last weekend and the weekend before that.

That means training what you have today, at this moment in time, based on what the dog is showing you. Don't be tempted to just go head and let little things slide, because those little things tend to roll downhill and gather momentum and turn into big things. If you take the time to iron stuff out as it happens rather than being tempted to skip over small infractions, you'll get to your end goal a lot faster. Train the dog that's in front of you right then so you can move forward without carrying mistakes along with you.

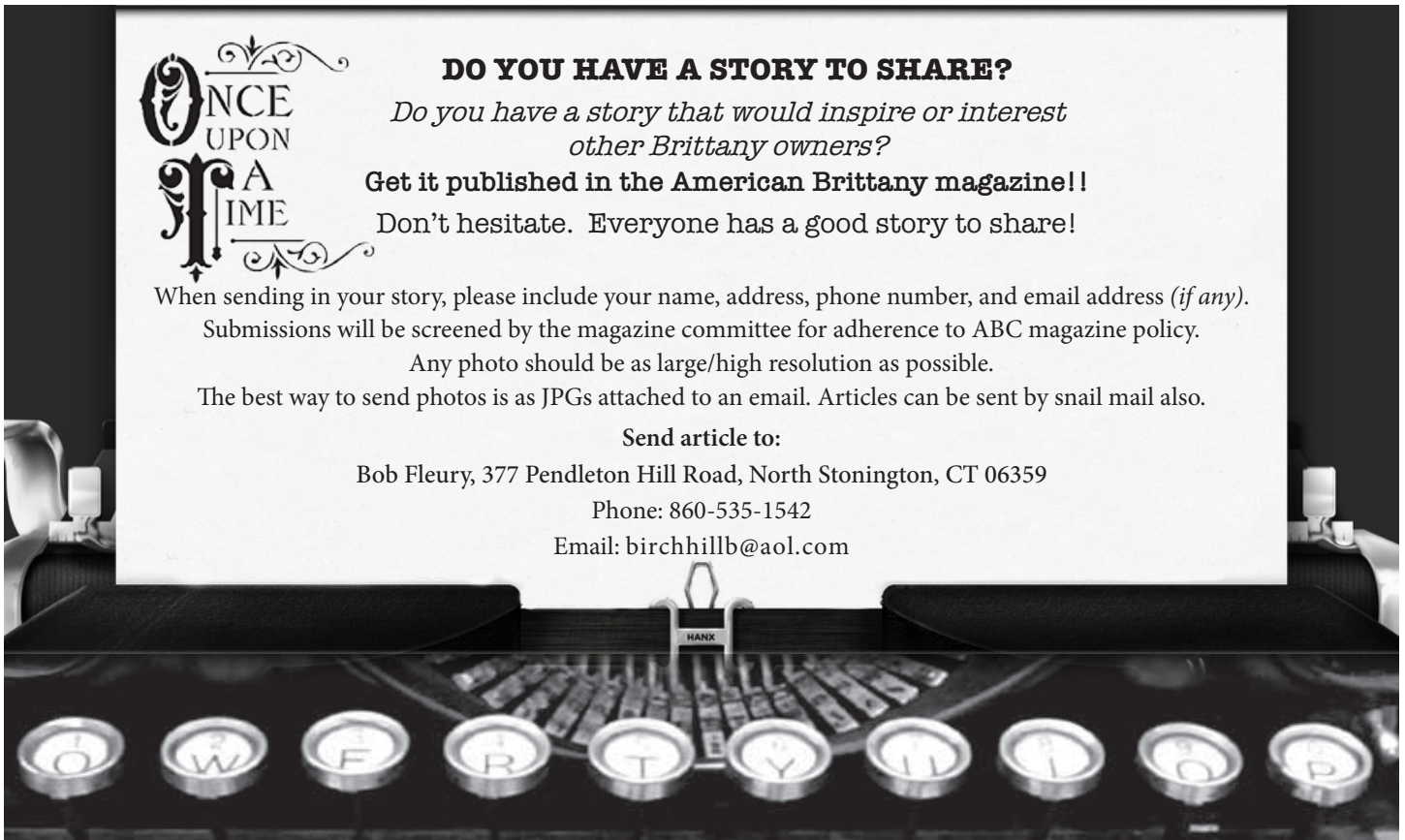
