



Moraine View State Recreation Area in LeRoy, IL was host to the inaugural Rodger Fiorito Memorial Open Grand Limited Walking Gundog Championship. With fully developed facilities for outdoor activities on its 687-acres, the park is a convenient and accessible locale for a trial of this size. Just minutes outside Bloomington-Normal. The weather for the trial was in the low 30s and overcase each day with winds ranging from 5-15 mph.

3/10/22

Brace 1

Nalko des Sentiers du Ramier II (Jackie Hutwagner) and It's 5 O'Clock Somewhere (Rebecca Walters)

Both dogs covered the ground well in the front of the course. They traveled through the narrow timber path to the first cornfield. Cooper followed the tree line around the field clockwise and found a bird in a brush filled waterway. Nalko followed a similar line and ended up standing between Cooper and the bird. Cooper was steady through the extended period it took for the handlers to reach the dogs and produce a bird. Nalko was picked up by his handler for loss of style during the sequence, and Cooper was moved on. No other birds were produced during this brace.

Brace 2

Atos (Jackie Hutwagner) and Bantam Dr Jac's Shooter (Mike Magnuson)

Two powerful dogs broke away and efficiently covered the front field. They quickly made it the brushy waterway in the first cornfield and Atos found a bird at 9 minutes. Shooter backed and both dogs stood staunchly through the flush/shot. Both dogs continued to make big moves as they made it midway through the hour. Atos had another find at the 37-minute mark with Shooter backing again. Atos's range continued to grow as time passed, while Shooter started to fade. Shooter made a big move to a slough in the front at the 45-minute mark and handled a bird. The dogs were able to cover the entire course within the hour.

Brace 3

Maverick De Sugar Creek (James Lucasey) and Miller's Oakley (Jackie Hutwagner)

Both dogs thoroughly covered the front field and Maverick found a bird at 13 minutes in the brushy waterway. Oakley backed and both dogs successfully moved on. Maverick found another bird at the 30-minute mark along the edge of a bean field. Oakley failed to back and was picked up. Maverick made several nice moves around the next few fields and continued on at a steady pace throughout the rest of the hour.

Brace 4

Newton de la Source d'Hannahatchee (Jackie Hutwagner) and Grand Touch Bourbon (Rebecca Walters)

Touch made some big moves early while Newt covered the ground more thoroughly. They had a divided find on the waterway bird at 10 minutes and both dogs stood through the sequence. Newt found an additional bird at 23 minutes, with Touch backing. Touch found his own bird at 26 minutes and then was hurried back to the front after handling it. He was lost soon after and was picked up upon recovery. Newt went on to find another bird at the 45-minute mark and broke at the shot.

Brace 5

Dogwood's Benelli (Todd Parmenter) and Turning Points Rolling In

the Deep (Julie Nelson)

Two quick dogs that broke away and hunted the entire front course before moving to the first cornfield. Benny established point at 12 minutes and Hannah failed to back. Benny left with the bird and both dogs were picked up.

Brace 6

Waypoint Deacon Of The Hunt (Thom Christnagel) and Beans Blazing Ghost (Michael Stevens)

The brace made it cleanly through the front of the course, with both dogs making nice moves as they traveled to the first field. Ghost found the first bird and chased. Deke continued on and had a great find on woodcock in thick brush along a trail. Deke made several more nice moves but also showed up in the rear a couple times. He had a non-productive at 29 minutes, and another find deep in the woods at 48 minutes. A shot was fired, and the dog was steady. Deke finished the hour at a slower, but steady pace.

Day 2

Brace 7

Dogwood's Moose (Chris Logan) and BYE

Moose took off with a big move at the breakaway. He capitalized on the North wind and hugged the South side of the course until the turn through the woods. At the 10-minute mark he was found on point in the cornfield waterway. Moose maintained his stylish point until moved on by his handler after flawless bird work. He continued his strong forward race, out of site on occasion, but was always found in the front. Moose found his 2nd bird at 25 minutes, after running a perfect line around the small beanfield. He continued on to find and handle two more birds during the hour stake. Moose finished the hour as strong as he started.

Brace 8


Nila Sur le Delavan (Joey Clark) and BYE (In Season)


Iris covered the front field thoroughly and punched through the timber to the first cornfield. She used the wind and covered likely objectives until finding her first bird at 17 minutes. She reached the small beanfield at 30 minutes and ran a nice line around the inside edge, finding a bird near the end. At the 45-minute mark, Iris found another bird in a waterway and continued to have perfect bird work. She had a stop to flush soon after and finished the hour at a steady but slower pace.

The American Woodcock, whether you hunt them over a gun dog or simply observe their spiraling spring mating rituals, are a fascinating and unique migratory game bird. A study of the woodcock's migration habits and patterns by the University of Maine in Collaboration with some other research organizations, is turning up some useful and interesting data. According to the study's website: "Many species of North American birds (37%) are declining and migratory birds are declining at faster rates than many non-migratory bird species. The American Woodcock is a migratory forest bird that has experienced population-wide long-term declines of 0.8% per year, over the past 50 years. Woodcock are distributed throughout the eastern United States."

Over the years, the diminutive size of these delicate birds have made it difficult to attach telemetry tracking devices. Incredible technological advances, however, in ultra-light satellite transmitters (4-7 grams) have really been a game changer for tracking the woodcock's migratory patterns. Recently, UMO's woodcock study has resulted in the tagging of 568 woodcock with tracking transmitters that have sent back 32,000 locations of these migrating birds. These are the central questions that this study hopes to answer: 1) When do woodcock start their migration? 2) How long does the migration take? 3) What is the survival rate during migration? 4) Where are the stopover sites?

There is some truly revealing behavioral data that is available for popular consumption on the study's website: www.woodcockmigration.org. In their travels southward to warmer climates, woodcock exhibit migratory habits not unlike another much larger migratory critter: the American Snow bird. The study reveals that some woodcock take a longer circuitous route around Scranton, PA and then on down through Harrisburg and points south while others stick closer to I-95 and make rest and refueling stops in the New Jersey Pine Barrens. A number of the study subjects decided to only winter over in the Carolinas, while woodcock from Quebec shot the works and winged their way all the way to the Florida Panhandle and even farther

south. Two Quebecois woodcock, both Kentucky bound, chose different routes to get across the Great Lakes. One bold bird flew right over Lake Huron, while its wing man demurred and stayed over land between Lake Huron and Lake Erie. It is hoped that the data collected from this research project will help wildlife biologists and other professionals perform their work more effectively in efforts to understand the woodcock's migratory behavior and habit preferences.

This study's principal investigators are Dr. Erik Blomberg (erik.blomberg@maine.edu), and Dr. Amber Roth (amber.roth@maine.edu), both from the Wildlife Ecology Department at the University of Maine.

The First Inaugural Annual running of the Jamie-Lynn Haley Memorial Grand Amateur Limited Walking Gun Dog Championship took place Saturday and Sunday, March 11 and 12. It was held at the Moraine View State Park in Leroy Illinois and hosted by Jamie-Lynn's home club, the Heart of Illinois Brittany Club.

Jamie-Lynn is described as an easy going, fun, athletic and friendly young lady who befriended many people along her short pathway. She enjoyed engaging in conversations with everyone and made them feel like they were long-time friends, from her Grandpa's 91-year old neighbor to folks she'd just met at the field trials. Her family are members of the Heart of Illinois Brittany Club and she was a Jr Handler in the field with her Brittanys She was guided along her Brittany journey by her father, Mike Haley, and grandpa, Dean Haley, a longtime charter member of this Club. Both Mike and Dean were there for the running and the presentation of the Traveling Trophy, Garmin tracker, and rosettes, plaques and Purina dog food for the winners.

Jamie-Lynn was gaining momentum in Brittanys when she became ill After a four-year battle with cancer, sadly, Jamie passed at the young age of 15. This Championship is a way to honor her and her strength and her love for the Brittany. The net proceeds from this Championship will go to her chosen charity, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

The honorable judges, Kevin Remmers and Paul Kuipers, watched a field of 14 outstanding dogs and their experienced handlers. Many of which were strong contenders and had some great birdwork over the course of the day and a half of running. Spring field trial season in Illinois brings constantly changing weather conditions to each brace in the form of wind, speed, direction, rain and bird-scenting ability and it was evident in the hunting style and bird finds. Heavy rains in the previous days made the course quite muddy and swampy in places. The approximately three-mile course was a combination of newly run grounds connecting at times with

the regional grounds. It consisted of varying degrees of wooded areas, muddy steep ravines, a chute, both narrow and open 2-track trails, wide open fields and lots of jungly thicket along the edges of a few farmland fields. A true mix of terrains to compliment every type of dog and handler.

Runner-up and 2nd Place: Dogwood's Moose, Moose, handled by Chris Logan

3rd Place: FC/AFC K Del's Eagle Magnum Hotshot JH, Shooter, handled by Ken DeLong

4th Place: ATOS, Atos, handled by Mr Jackie Hutwagner

Honorable Mention: GCH/DC/NGDC/GFC Turning Points Shenanigans, Shandi, handled by Julie Nelson

The first 3 braces of the Championship were run on Saturday beginning at 12:30 p.m. following another Championship.

1st Brace:

Nalko des Sentiers du Ramiea II, Nalko, handled by Mr Jackie Hutwagner

This dog was quickly off and running at the breakaway and was found solidly on point at 13 minutes in the grassy knoll area after the first creek-crossing and over the ridge. A place that proved to be a popular, challenging bird haven for the dogs because of the heavy, bedded down, long grasses; however not a favorite with the handlers. An honest attempt to flush did not produce a bird so the handler elected to take his dog on. Nalko was out of sight for a bit when we came across him coming to the front. He was spotted again pointing staunchly at 35 just after the grove and along the edge of the first open farm field on the south end. This time flushing produced a bird, however Nalko took steps in the direction the bird flew. The dog was picked up by his handler.

DC/AFC Waypoint Deacon of the Hunt MH, Deke, handled by Tom Christnagel

Deke broke away heading to the wooded side of the course. He was digging into the woods, hunting forward through the thicket and popped out in front of us a few times. It was apparent that Deke is experienced in heavily wooded areas and has hunted wild woodcock and grouse. Although all the finds during the championship were quail. He covered a good amount of ground while seeking out wooded areas. In his first find at 25, on a corner just before the first open farm field, two birds took flight on the flush. His style was nice and very mannerly. Deke again pointed birds at 37, handler flushed and all was well in order. Again pointing in the next open field at 45, he expressed the most desire and looked the most stylish on this 3rd find. He stood steady through the flush and shot. He continued to hunt forward and used the wind to his advantage. As the hour wore on, he became more stalwart with each find.

2nd Brace:

Newton de la Source d'Humahatohee, Newt, handled by Jackie Hutwagner

Newt had an enthusiastic breakaway heading around the beginning of the course. As was quickly becoming evident in the running, it was no surprise that the dog went on point at 12 in the same mound of grass past the first creek-crossing and over the ridge. The handler was able to flush a bird out of this grassy knoll and fired the shot. This was early in the course when the dog still had plenty of energy, and he took steps with the bird. The handler picked up his dog.

Beans Blaze Ghost, Ghost, handled by Michael Stevens

He put down a very nice, forward running race having two bird finds. The course turned south and was narrower at the creek-crossing which made it hard to know where the dogs would come through. After coming out of this area, Ghost was barely a white speck on the horizon to the east and was seen standing on the far reaches of the course. He re-established his point to pin the running birds well before we got to him. Once pointing at 21, he had great manners all throughout the flush and fire. His point was the furthest away that we saw during the entire event. Ghost was seen again at 30 on point but not as solid as the previous find. He unfortunately took some steps, relocated himself, finally releasing himself to help look for the bird. The handler picked up his dog on this 2nd find.

3rd Brace:

GCH/DC/NGDC/GFC Turning Points Shenanigans, Shandi, handled by Julie Nelson

She had a strong, consistent, forward run with two very solid bird finds. Shandi appeared to be out of sight a few times only until the handler could come over the ridge to see her working the fields. Shandi had a nice mix of covering the woods and hitting the edges. The dog had a stylish, intense point at 31 as you entered the farm field. The handler went to look for the bird that was deep in the woods, with the judge off his horse to watch, and the dog standing steady through the flush and the fire. Shandi handled through the chute and was again found on a solid point at 41 when the handler, the dog remained steady, and her manners were exceptionally clean. She finished strong in the bowl of the last open field where only the dogs who finished the course and were still clean, were granted to run.

NWGDC/DC/AFC It's 5 O'Clock Somewhere, Cooper, handled by Rebecca Walters

Cooper was off at the breakaway and then seen standing nicely on

point at about 12 when we came up over that first ridge after the first creek-crossing. The handler tried everything to flush a bird from the grassy knoll, even on hands and knees, leaving no cover unturned. Unfortunately, a bird was not produced and the handler elected to send the dog on. Cooper was again found standing on an edge of the thicket at 25, handler spent some time attempting to flush in the thorns and heavy cover, but was not able to produce a bird. Where the dog was running, the birds were burrowing deeper into the cover to escape the late afternoon chill. The handler chose to pick up the dog at 31.

We began the next day an hour earlier due to the daylight savings time change That proved to be a good thing because it began raining at the conclusion of the event. We started the day at 8:30 a.m. CDT

4th Brace:

"Atos," Atos, handled by Jackie Hutwagner

The breakaway was forward and after the creek-crossing around the bend, we spotted Atos on point at 12. He remained stylish throughout a lengthy flushing attempt and relocation in the grassy knoll area. Handler was able to flush the bird and fire with the dog standing steady. From there Atos had a nice forward reaching run. The wind picked up, changed directions, and wasn't working in the dog's favor so he had a hard time hearing his handler giving directions around the course. Atos ran an excellent gun dog range, hitting the objectives and using the wind the best he could. All his finds were very stylish with good intensity. We were enroute down past the 2-track runway when we came upon Atos standing on point at 27. Handler flushed effortlessly and the dog remained intense through the shot. On the 3rd find at 35 on the edge of an open field just before the narrowing of the course, Atos withstood the pressure of his bracemate challenging him to stay steady. The handler flushed a bird, shot, and all was very good. At the bird find at 41, he ran up to the line, and was working his way back to the handler, again using the wind appropriately. Atos solidly established point, after turning the corner across from the Missouri-shaped field showing good manners through the flush and fire.

Cedar Glen Disruptin' the Peace, Colt, handled by Billy Jones

Colt had a very attractive back at 12 in the grassy knoll, holding nicely with good style and manners. When his bracemate chose to relocate the dog, the handler opted to move on with his dog The wind was out of the north at this time and at his back which forced the dog to hunt the edges laterally back to his handler. On the find at 35, both dogs were working the same farm field. The bracemate was working it counter-clockwise and Colt worked it clockwise. Atos reached the bird first. Unfortunately, Colt didn't get shutdown in time to be rewarded a second back and was picked up.

5th Brace:

Bantam's Dr Jac's Shooter, Shooter, handled by Mike Magnuson

Both dogs ran forward and were out of sight for a bit. Shooter hunted the course with eager intent. When we came to the orchard, point was called for the bracemate at 11. As we approached the dog on point, we spotted Shooter backing not far away and behind the tall cover. He stood very nicely for the other handler to flush the bird and fire. Shooter had his second find soon afterward at 16 on a new bird, however, he stepped forward through the cover a few too many steps to mark the flight of the bird and was picked up.

FC Ru-Jem's Grand Touch Bourbon, Touch, handled by Rebecca Walters

Touch and his bracemate both broke away with gusto and were out ahead of us. When we came to the favorite grassy knoll, we found him on point at 11. It was a lengthy attempt at flushing while the dog exhibited great style. After the flush and fire, he was sent on ahead. Touch was on point and handler had a second lengthy attempt to flush at 25, then elected to take an unproductive due to the very heavy, thorny cover. He was turned loose and independently hunted the far reaches of the course and showing himself to the front multiple times without much handler direction. Touch was gone to the front when found standing at 33 at the next farm field where birds had been worked in an earlier brace. The dog exhibited consistent high and tight manners through the flush and fire. When Touch was released after the find, he showed endurance by reaching the far edges of the course, going to places other dogs had not reached. He rimmed the field, went through the chute, and disappeared to the front. As we got to the top of the hill, we found Touch standing at 46 and he held for the flush and fire. He was released and as we came around the bend, we found him standing again at 51. Again, with all in order for the flush and shot. The final time Touch was turned loose, he took off through the last field giving us a suspenseful finish and showing plenty of stamina. Touch was gone at time, but the scout returned him within a few minutes.

6th Brace:

Maverick de Sugar Creek, Mav, handled by Jim Lucasey

Mav worked the course well and went over the creek-crossing and was found at the familiar grassy knoll backing his bracemate at 12. He held his manners while the other handler flushed and fired. Both dogs were sent forward and they covered objectives on both sides of the course independently. Mav handled nicely along the 2-track runway. As we came to the corner just after the first farm field, Mav was backing his bracemate at 28, holding steady through the flush and shot. His bracemate was once again found standing on point at the swampy swale below the orchard at 39 while Mav was nearby still moving along and was picked up.

Dogwood's Moose, Moose, handled by Chris Logan

His first find was at 10 in the grassy knoll area which he held well while his handler flushed and shot. His race was forward and his attack of the course was pleasing. All of his finds were very stylish. Moose was one of the dogs that went to places most others hadn't gone. He was a handsome dog on point with great style. Moose effortlessly covered the field with little direction from the handler reaching far objectives. Moose was on point at 28 and marked the bird in flight after his handler flushed and shot. Yet again on point at 37 just after the chute, he stood through the flush and fire. He was seen on point again at 41 but because of the very thick and heavy cover, the handler elected to move the dog on for better opportunities. Moose disappeared to the front and as we came around the corner, we saw him standing on point at 52 across the corn field ahead of us with great style and manners and held steady through the flush and shot. He was the only dog to rim the entire field in the bowl at the end of the course and still have time to check the edges of the next field. Moose finished the hour strong and to the front.

7th Brace:

CH Dogwood's Benelli, Benny, handled by Todd Parmenter

Benny hunted the objectives popping in and out of the woods along the tree edge to the creek. He exhibited bold moves to the front. We rode up past the creek-crossing over the ridge and around the bend to find both dogs standing at 12. The wind was swirling and it was tabulated as a divided find at 12. Unfortunately, Benny a few too many steps after the flush and Todd picked him up.

FC/AFC KDel's Eagle Magnum Hotshot JH, Shooter, handled by Ken DeLong

Shooter exhibited a strong forward race with bold moves to the front, covering many areas of the course. As we came over the ridge, both dogs

were standing at 12 in a beautiful truly divided find. Handler flushed the bird and fired, as Shooter stood steady when the bracemate took steps. With all in order, the dog was sent forward. Shooter was one of the few dogs that reached the far corners of the course, similar to other top placing dogs. As we crossed the steep ravine, we found him standing again to the right at 38 just before entering the small field. Handler made a charge in the thick, heavy cover, to flush the bird and fired with the dog well mannered. Shooter was sent on and again found on point down the line on another bird with all in order from the flush to the fire. After a few more yards, he stopped on point but neither judge saw a bird. The judges were off their horses in the cover, and after a lengthy flushing attempt in the thorny cover, the handler elected to fire his gun to reward the dog at 43 and moved Shooter on forward. The dog was found on point just before the narrowing of the gap. Shooter was staunch and pointing nicely through the flush and fire. The dog made great time on the course with time to spare and entered the field to the north. Shooter was spotted through the woods and on the other side of the cornfield and on point at 55, holding strong through the flush and fire.

8th Brace:

The single dog brace came into season and the handler scratched their entry.

Kudos and thank you to The Heart of Illinois Brittany Club who managed to run TWO Memorial Championships back-to-back in the same weekend, along with a walking field trial and still complete it all by 4:00 p.m. Sunday afternoon.

Jamie-Lynn Haley's Memorial GALWGD Championship followed the First Inaugural Annual Memorial Grand Open Limited Walking Gun Dog Championship held for beloved late Club member, Roger Fiorito.

These combined field events brought experienced competitors from as far away as Connecticut, Arizona, Georgia, Missouri and Minnesota, as well as Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana and Illinois.

I'm certain that both Roger and Jamie-Lynn would be proud that their Club chose to honor their memory with these esteemed Championships. Thank you to the Chairperson and Secretary, Committee, Club, Judges, Reporters, bird-planters, dog wagon drivers, lunch preparers, and especially the handlers and their dogs who made these Championships very memorable in their own rights. We hope to see all of you next year, meet some new handlers and dogs, and to continue to keep the memory of both Jamie-Lynn and Roger alive.

Adventures in Agility - Novice

In my last article, I wrote about the beginning of my journey into agility with my Brittany, Phoebe, describing the AKC's ACT (Agility Course Test) program and our first ever agility competition. Phoebe is currently competing at the Open level in the regular classes but let me digress a little and talk about Novice, because that's where we all begin. (There are two more levels after that, Excellent and Master, before the coveted MACH).

Novice consists of standard and jumpers, each requiring three qualifying (Q) scores to earn the titles NA and NAJ. Standard includes obstacles such as the dogwalk, seesaw, tire jump, A-Frame, and tunnel, plus an assortment of jumps. Courses for both classes include minimally 14-16 obstacles and a score of at least 85. Faults such as a refusal or wrong course, are 5 points each and time faults are 1 point each. Jumpers, on the other hand is all about speed and is a course of jumps and tunnels. No wrong courses are allowed in Jumpers and a knocked bar is an NQ in both classes.

Novice was a challenge for my spirited, young Phoebe. She regularly had a case of the zoomies during her runs and I often struggled to connect with her and get her back on course. One of the venues where many of the trials are held has turf, which always seemed to launch her into hyperdrive. Phoebe would make up her own course, taking jumps and tunnels, of which she is particularly fond, and received applause from those watching. She is fast, with enviable drive, and despite the craziness, is fun to run because she is so

happy to be out there and always has a smile on her face.

I must say, though, this whole experience has been humbling. So much training goes into agility and nothing I had done previously comes close to it. The dogs learn verbal cues...in class one night we came up with about 10 or so cues just for jumping...plus physical cues. They learn to read arm and hand signals, speed changes such as deceleration, and the direction the handler's feet or shoulders are facing, for example. And of course, they conquer the movement of a seesaw and the height and narrowness of the dogwalk. They must have trust in you, the handler, and you, in turn, must have trust in them. With that comes connection and dog and handler become a team, reading each other so the two get around the course clean. Oh, and it helps if you are somewhat coordinated and have a decent memory to remember courses. And at my age and with my make-up, both have been additional challenges.

But, on April 8 of this year, Phoebe finished her NA title at the Central New England Brittany Club agility trial which I thought was very fitting. We earned our NAJ title earlier in the year having begun competing in regular trials in October of 2022. At this writing, I am thrilled to say we are more connected and working more consistently as a team AND our Q rate has gone up! So, till next time, happy training!

Diamond in the Rough

As this piece is being written, it's a day after a trip was made to an animal clinic in a suburb of Cleveland, Ohio. The trip was to pick-up a special Brittany, who had two weeks previously given birth to ten puppies via a C-section, which was not a normal one.

A special lady (Whelperhelper2006@yah00.com), who performs this service for clients of giving birth to new pups, was monitoring a Brittany named Cloud, whose temperature had just drop below 100 degrees F. indicating on-set of labor for birth of pups. Next move was to take her to the clinic, which was only 10 minutes away. Just before the Doctor started the C-section the uterus ruptured; the procedure was done as quickly as possible yielding ultimately ten pups. Positive side of all this was, although the uterus ruptured, it was along the line of a normal C-section; with the stitching and gluing the uterus back together, Cloud will be able sometime in the future to carry another litter.

With this new litter of Brittany pups, everything proceeded normally with Cloud nursing the pups for the next six days. Later during this time, it was discovered that she had swelling around a tit that was hidden beneath her right leg, quickly determine possible beginning of

mastitis. Her temperature was up to 103 degrees (normal for dogs 101 to 102.5). A trip was made to the clinic to make a further assessment of this malady. Her temperature was brought under control and anti-biotics given to hopefully reduce or eliminate the bacteria that was causing the mastitis. That day Cloud was back nursing** her ten pups, all with fat little tummies. Two days later in the morning Cloud had an elevated temperature of 104 degrees and she was lethargic – the anti-biotics given previously were not working; she went back to the clinic. Cloud would not return to nurse the pups. This second intravenous application of the anti-biotics would contaminate the milk for the pups.

At this time in the life of these ten pups, a "Diamond in the Rough" appeared. It was another dog breed the Cane Corso, which are commonly described as noble, intelligent, loyal, and strong. Another client (scandifio@scandifio.com) also had his Corso at the "ladies home" whelping pups, which had been weaned away from their mother. Permission was granted by the owner for his Corso to allow the two week old Brittany pups to nurse, which to start with was a closely supervised process. The mother Corso continued for the next two weeks to nurse and care for the Brittany pups as if they were almost her own.

As the owner of Cloud and the Brittany pups, there was and is on my part a significant amount of gratitude expressed to the owner of the Corso damn. His dogs are breed to have an excellent gentle temperament and it certainly was shown by this Corso, she was a great mother to the Brittany pups. The last several days she even cleaned



them along with nursing the pups.

As written previously at the beginning of this article, the trip to Cleveland was to pick-up Cloud, who beat the infection from the mastitis and has healed to be ready to resume her training for a field trial career; with also the possibility of being a mother to a future second litter.

** The anti-biotics given first time would not have an effect on her milk supply for the pups.

To Kill A Myth By Bill Tarrant

I must harpoon a myth. Run it through and kill it and see it no more. For this myth plagues gun-dog men I especially love: that white haired legion who've lived their three score and ten. Who've worked all their lives to enjoy the sweet leisure of their last steps, their last sightings, their last swing of the gun. To hear the gun's bark and feel its punch and smell its smoke. To watch the sunlit feathers drift to earth, to hear the rustle of leaves, to feel the soft, moist bird in hand as the dog stands to front – smiling.

The myth denies all this. For the myth keeps these men from taking a gun dog to field.

The myth insists the best gun-dog pups come from proven field trial breeding. Which is right. Yet, the myth goes on to say field trial dogs are campaigned from horseback, bred and trained to knock holes in the skyline two miles out. Which is also right. Yet the myth then says the octogenarian must search for the miraculous pup that comes from such racetrack breeding but has a kitsch in its getalong, or the Pygmalion pup that comes from backyard breeding yet rises above its blood. Otherwise, the myth says, the old man won't be able to keep up.

The myth insists the dog any old man must have - never ventures beyond the power of the gun.

Hogwash!

The gun-dog man must always buy the best field trial breeding he can find, then train it. That's all. Just train it. But there's the catch. The myth-mongers either do not know how to train a dog, or they do not know what a trained dog is, or they do not know what a trained dog can do.

The myth-mongers insist the gun-dog man have a dog that will hunt close. Hunt close? I've never heard of such nonsense. Bird dogs are not trained to gauge distance; they're trained to find and point birds. Wherever those birds are. And to hold the birds in place until the hunter arrives. Wherever the hunter is.

Now many trainers, who do not know what they're doing, train pups on pen-raised birds and then let the dog work too close to the birds. Then, when the pup's taken to field, he plunges too far into the life-space of wild birds (which are much more skittish than tame birds) and they flush. Consequently, the trainer should always hold his pup distant from pen-raised birds in training: stopping the pup the moment the pup strikes the birds' scent cone. So trained, the pup will then stop afield when touching the fringe of the wild covey's scent cone. And the birds will be there when the gunner arrives.

Too many pups are taken to field before they're steady to scent and feather, let alone to shot and wing. So they bump birds. The hunt-close group, upon seeing this, figures, "we'd best keep that pup at foot so we can yell at him and intimidate him and keep him from scattering those quail, or grouse, or what-have-you."

So the myth of the close-hunting dog denies many an old man a good dog and a good outing and I continually get letters that ask, "at my age, which is 72 years, I suppose I am looking for the unusual or impossible: a close - and slow-working dog that will be a good house dog and pet, as well as a good hunter. Yes, I suppose I am looking for the impossible. But one never knows... can you direct me?"

I sit to type an answer to this man but for a moment my hands close in fists of anger. Here is the myth at its worst. Hunt close! What trained dog won't? Premier bird dogs do not hunt distance. They hunt birds. Plus, they hunt terrain. They hunt cover. And they hunt objectives. They hunt the time of day for they know the quarry's habits: they know where the bird will be. They hunt for the gun: fast gun or slow gun. They get the gun to birds.

So hold this boat steady while I ram this harpoon home. Die, myth, die.

Rick Smith and I head north from Edmond, Oklahoma, toward Harper's Land and Cattle Company. I've called Rick, the professional Brittany trainer, and asked what he has in his kennels. "Something," I insist, "that throws a mighty wide loop? Dogs that traditionally take half-mile casts. I've a mind to go foot-huntin and I want some dogs to point birds. Dogs with jets for legs, afterburners in their tail...all that. I want dogs that leave sizzle trails. But I want em to work off my toe where I can take two steps and kick out a covey. What I want, Rick, is an old man's dog."

The Brittanies Rick decided would fill my bill are in the back. They are:

Senator TJ, 1976 National Open Field Trial Champion;

Perry's Rustic Prince, 1976 National Amateur Champion, 1976 National Dual Dog Award Winner, 1973 and 1974 International Champion. 1976 U.S. Open Champion, 1978 National Open Champion; and

Jacolet Wandering Star, winner of every American field championship for Brittanies but one: an all-time high.

Senator and Prince (both dogs) and Star (a bitch) are class horse-back shooting dogs with forward ground games that near marathon proportions. Not what my 72- year-old letter writer thought he wanted. Remember: his words were, "... A close and slow-working dog..."

Well, this trio will do to hunt at toe today. For me. For my letter writer. For anyone. Even though it was only 21 days ago Rusty won his national open. Won an open championship in an event field trial writer Everett Metzger described in the January, 1979 edition of *The American Brittany* magazine as "... For the true all-age Brittany seeking to glorify the running bird dog, to exalt brains, boldness, birdfinding ability, and endless endurance.'

Rick stops the truck at Harper's ranch. I say, "no prairie today. I want tight, pinched, grouse country. I want sightlines chopped off at 20 feet." Rick nods, moves the truck two more miles. Now he stops and lets Rusty hop from his crate then hands me a one-shot, break-apart. Sears and roebuck beginning- kid's gun, all painted blaze orange so it can be found in the bush. It's Rick's training gun and I'm told, "go get your quail." I defer saying, "no, I'll shoot with film, you shed feather." My reason's simple: I don't have an Oklahoma hunting license.

We walk north through blue stem, sedge, lespedeza, shin oak, little red cedars, blackjack. Sometimes we break into vistas, sometimes we're buried in snarls. Rusty quarters the tangled country, then slithers about the obstacles of deadfall in the creek bottom, scent being denied because of six-inch leaf cover, a dry day, and a heavy wind.

Now Rusty dips back into the dust-bottom creek, twirls, and locks. He bores with his nose, nostrils flaring. Rick walks in. There are no birds. He touches Rusty to relocate. The feisty Brit pogos 12-feet south and locks again. This time Rick lifts the covey. Rusty stands to wing and shot. Rick touches him again to hi-on. No, Rusty doesn't fetch. Rick missed.

And so we go, a half-hour north, a half-hour south. Pecking here and there. Sometimes lifting feather. Always proceeding at leisure, me hanging back to slow the whole operation, me moving at what could be a 72-year-old pace. Yet this 72-year pace is a misconception. My trail buddy, w. T. Yoshimoto is 71. I can't keep up with him.

In it all, Rusty never exceeds the range of our gun nor the range of my pokey step. Yet, Rusty keeps his ground game alive by quartering, never leaving off speed, but stitching the country with six miles of thread on one mile of cloth. Rusty's a master mender.

The "... Endless endurance," noted by Metzger in his field trial report, is vented sideways by Rusty for us foot hunters. But had we been mounted on horseback, the dog's loops would have been a half-mile out and nearly as long coming in.

Back at the truck we stow Rusty and start to release Star when I tell Rick, "just a minute...let's see something." I whirl the tape back in the recorder. Start at the beginning. We listen. Midst the crunching of leaves we can hear Rick's whoop, to Rusty, telling the dog to shorten his distance. I put a clock on the whoops. They run about 3 minutes apart. That's not an awful lot of carrying on to keep a dog in check, is it?

I like what we've done, what Rusty's done for us. I've got my harpoon into flesh and that myth is going to die. We've worked a national champion for an hour, "... A running bird dog," with constant contact and no more than, say 20 whoops. Never was Rusty out of sight, except for timber tangle, and never did he fail to check in with the gun more than one minute after he was called. What's more important, Rusty knows the habits and habitat of bobwhite quail. He hunted the bird, the country, and the time of day – roost time.

But if we'd found no birds close and had released Rusty to hunt long, he'd have pinned a covey wherever it was-a mile away?-- And both he and the birds would have been waiting when the gunners arrived.

I mention all this to Rick and he replies, "these dogs show what you get when they're trained right. It's all in the way you break 'em."

He explains, "we always break 'em on foot then condition 'em on horseback. These dogs are bright. Heck, they know the circumstances. They know their job is to get you birds. Whether you're on foot, or in a jeep, or sittin' a horse, they'll accommodate you.

"Now, if you set out to train a dog to hunt close, you'll likely end up with a potterer. Something with no shine, just a mope. Who wants that?

"It's like a golfer," Rick adds, "he don't go driving to the green with his putter. He works to get the ball in the hole. His mind ain't on distance, it's on control. And that's the way with a right-trained gun dog. He'll hunt long or short depending on the terrain, the cover, and the bird you're after. If all he had was a short hunt in him...it'd be like the golfer going around the course with his putter."

Rick releases Star to head north. She strikes a different course than Rusty took, concentrating on sumac and shin oak, working over a lot of sand, staying to the high country. The wind's freshened, gotten so strong, as a matter of fact, I can imagine it smothers scent. But Star hits a point, then another. She's picking up singles Rusty scattered. Rick follows, giving an occasional sharp retort to shorten the gay little bitch's pace. Star is a roller. She wants to let out, but still, she endures the pace I set for her.

We're heading back to the truck when Dail Harper, owner of the spread, tops the hill in a new Chevy suburban, toting two quail shooting guests to new ground. We stop and visit a spell. Then I suggest, "let's stow Star and get out Senator T. J." I turn to Dail and his party, asking, "would you like to gun over a national champion...while I put it on film?"

Dail says back, "that being the case [he's wearing a big smile], let's go to my wife's garden. That's where I plant the birds to keep her enthused. That way she's not too critical when I show up with a new gun...or a new dog." Dail Harper's wife's garden is a bobwhite paradise. Now I'm enthused with my myth-killing expedition. Dail and his party will smoke that ground. We'll see how lots of guns and lots of birds will affect a national champ. Will Senator bolt? Will he take one look at all the commotion, all the piddling, all the bragging over each shot, and take off? Mrs. Harper's garden should prove the ultimate staunching test. The ultimate old-man's gun dog proving grounds.

We're not 200 yards into the bobwhite oasis before Senator strikes a covey of 60 birds. They come up to the battle of Britain. I mean there's smoke to clear and ringing ears. The dog stands steady.

Rick taps the dog's behind to cast on. Senator sweeps the ground for deadfall, bringing each bird to hand. With the harvest bagged, Rick tells Senator to strike out.

We all head south to work the singles. They're encountered just next to the Harper household, just beyond a chain-link fence; behind which the house dogs yip and cavort and leap about. There's birds coming up everywhere. And guns sounding everywhere. Targets of opportunity, get 'em! Senator's trying to mark each fall down. One bird is shot so it's descent lands it just behind Senator... right in front of me. The dog but turns his head. Now he's told to fetch it up.

A second covey is struck within five minutes.

A third covey is encountered as we work singles from the second covey. Yes, bobwhite really grow in Mrs. Harper's garden.

Through it all, Senator never exceeds gun range of 40 yards. He abides all the back slapping. He proves that strangers and strange fields and multiple guns do nothing to shake his composure. He is the national champion out pointing birds for some gunners like he was working for a game preserve– and Rick never yells at him to stay close more than three times.

All the birds and guns and dogs stowed. Rick and I say goodbye to the Harper party and head home. I feel good. It's been done. The myth of the close-hunting dog has been harpooned right through its gullet. It's left to return to dust in the quail fields of Oklahoma and blow north with the spring winds.

What the typical octogenarian needs as a gun dog is merely a well-trained dog. Matters not what the dog was trained to accomplish in the end; win the national open? It matters only how it was trained as a pup in the beginning. That's on foot, with lots of birds, in typical hunting cover. This, of course, requires a trainer who knows what he's doing.

But for the man who wants to start with a pup and train his own dog– all that we saw today is possible. It can be done. It has been done. But never let the amateur trainer think he must start with *HALF A DOG* to obtain half a race. Go only with the beget of performance champions. Why deny blood? Why deny the record book? Why deny what you've seen here today and I've been looking at for years?

In the last analysis, why deny the smarts of a dog? If that dog's been trained to please, he'll size up any hunting situation you place him in and get you into birds.

Putting down three Brits who are all likely candidates for the field trial hall of fame and watching them take walking strangers to birds, when these dogs workaday world has been paced for years by Tennessee walkers, is proof enough for us all.

And what's really beautiful? Those three Brits will be back in training tomorrow, taking half-mile casts. And Rick will be mounted on horseback. Hunt close, bah! Hunt birds, that's what the gun dog's all about.


