## *Update* – Marvin D. Nelson, Jr. Memorial Fund is Now Endowed

Very good news, the goal of \$10,000 has been met to endow the Marvin D. Nelson Jr. Memorial Fund. This was achieved by the dedicated forward looking approach by the American Brittany Club Board of Directors which voted to donate \$5,000 initially and give \$1,000 annually until the BOD would vote differently to the Memorial Fund. It is also noteworthy that at the National Show on November 27th, 2004 one half of the proceeds raised from the annual auction went to the Memorial Fund. Many members were responsible for this support and most noteworthy was the guidance given by Nancy Clendenen, Judy Tighe and the auctioneer Tony Morabito. Tony was superb in support of the Memorial Fund and the amount raised was \$325.

Several ABC members gave graciously and some in living memory of their outstanding Amateur and National Field Champions. These dogs along with individual donors giving \$500 or more will have name plates placed on the large Marvin D Nelson Jr. Endowed Memorial Fund Plaque that will be placed in the CCAH for those bringing their dogs to the Clinic or visiting to see.

The money raised beyond \$10,000 will not be spent on research until a sizeable amount of money is given to enable meaningful investigation to be accomplished. When that figure is determined, an announcement will be made. This does not mean research will not be done on the Brittany until more money is raised. On the contrary, there is ongoing research involving the Brittany and future investigators will attract matching funds from the AKC Health Foundation, which supports the CCAH presently, and other granting agencies to do Brittany research. One scientific paper has been published entitled "Analysis of Genetic Variation in 28 Breed Populations With 100 Microsatellite Markers", in Journal of Heredity 2003:94 (1):81-87 by D.N. Irion, et al from the Veterinary Genetics Laboratory, CCAH, UCD, Sch. of Vet. Med. This study was made possible by the collection of samples several years ago from Brittanys, many collected at the Nationals in Booneville and Fort Smith by Gordon Theilen DVM. In summary from that publication, "While the set of autosomal microsatellites was useful in describ-

Renewals may be sent directly to the Membership Data Chairman, the information is on page 3. ing genetic variation within breeds, establishing the genetic relatedness between breeds was less conclusive. A more accurate determination of breed phylogeny will likely require the use of single-nucleotide polymorphisms (SNP's)". In less technical terms, more studies will be conducted using recently developed techniques to look at breed differences. Some aspects will be done in the next few months comparing the gene profile of the French Brittany and the American Brittany in comparison with other believed closely related breeds. The Brittany DNA samples previously collected has initially made it possible to study and expand upon future Brittany DNA research at UCD, CCAH.

The ABC/BOD in 2004 voted, in addition, to pursue establishment of a Brittany DNA Library at the CCAH, Division of Veterinary Genetics in conjunction with AKC Health Foundation. If this is approved by AKC, BOD, the Brittany along with two to three other breeds will be in a pilot project to collect DNA samples from as many dogs as voluntarily made available including litters to study, genetic defects, cancer, health and traits. It is hoped around a 50 percent compliance from Brittany breeders and owners will be accomplished. What a wonderful potential benefit for our breed. This opportunity was made possible because of establishment of the Marvin D. Nelson Jr. Memorial Fund as the personnel in CCAH recognized the dedication by ABC for implementing Brittany DNA research.

Northern California Brittany Club held its annual membership meeting at the CCAH on December 11th. Members and guests attended a seminar on dog genetics and tour of the CCAH. All in attendance were impressed with the research being done and potential for the future and the work place where research is conducted. In support of suggestion made by the ABCBOD meeting on November 27th, that each regional club that has the resources donate \$500 to the Marvin Nelson Memorial Fund, NCBC graciously met that goal and more. Northern Oklahoma BC and The United States Open Championship Association has also met this goal. Many other regional club members have indicated a desire to give in the near future as well as several individual members.It was by divine providence that the Nelson family had the foresight to set up a memorial fund in memory of three generations of Nelsons to study health, cancer and genetic defects of the Brittany. Through ABC member efforts their memories will live forever in dedication to improving the health of the Brittany.

One study is presently in progress, the comparison of the Brittany DNA profile to that of other breeds.

The benefits from this research would improve the strength of our breed. What a wonderful way for us to help our beloved Brittany with studies done at a leading animal health center, internationally known for its dedication to research excellence.
