Beginning November 1, 2012, All dogs entered in any of the following American Brittany Club Sponsored Events must have a DNA profile on record with the AKC. Dogs who only have DNA profiles with the American Field will need to have that information transferred to the AKC by this date. This information must be included on all entry forms.

1. All American Brittany Club National Championship field events; NFC, NAFC, NGDC, and NAGDC

2. The American Brittany Club National Specialty Show, and National Summer Specialty Show; with the exception of dogs registered with an ILP/PAL number, and dogs under the age of 2 years at the start of the event.

3. All American Brittany Club "Original Classics": to include the Chukar Classic, Prairie Chicken Classic, Pheasant Classic, Quail Classic, Grouse/Woodcock Classic, and Gun Dog Classic

This is the first phase of DNA Policy that the American Brittany Club Board of Directors endorse in an effort to keep our Breed purebred. Further steps will be outlined by a future committee. These future steps may include permanent identification through microchip, or tattoo, and DNA testing on all sires and dams.

Rational: Due to the out cries from the General membership asking for the ABC to set up a DNA testing policy, this will be our start. If this proposal passes the ABC Board, the President will form a committee to implement further regulations to insure that our Breed remain purebred. Similar DNA requirements are already approved by the AKC and in place for the Gordon Setter Club of America, The Vizsla Club of America, and The German Shorthair Pointer Club of America.
